
In the July edition of the Tacklebox program, you'll find a few stories that are written with the perspective gained from getting to know this year's team for a couple months.



# on the ATTACK

When professional baseball scouts trek up to Buffalo, New York, they usually have a good reason.

After all, Western New York isn't a baseball hotbed like the Sun Belt or California. Punishing winters bring enormous blankets of snow that make swings sting in the biting cold and cancel large chunks of games. The city's most prestigious collegiate athletics destination - the University at Buffalo - shuttered its baseball program nearly a decade ago.

However, scouts flocked to Williamsville East High School in East Amherst in 2021 to watch one player swing, catch, and impress: then-senior Joe Mack, whose star has reached a recent pinnacle as the 2024 Pensacola Blue Wahoos' do-it-all backstop. In 2021, Mack's skills dazzled enough to spark chatter that he could be a first-round draft choice - the Buffalo area's first since 1978.

"Look," said one Major League scout to The Athletic after watching Mack in 2021. "It doesn't take an expert to see how good this guy is."

As the 2021 New York Section VI Baseball Player of the Year, Mack followed in the footsteps of his brother Charlie - a 6th-round selection of the Minnesota Twins in 2018 - and signed with the Miami Marlins, who picked him at No. 31 in the 2021 draft's competitive balance Round A.

Blue Wahoos fans have gotten to know Mack well since he became a regular in the Pensacola lineup beginning in late April. Darting throws to gun down opposing baserunners and a slew of home runs paced the 21-year-old's volcanic month of June, but Mack's path from high school standout to Double-A starting catcher wasn't straightforward.

After a short stint with the Marlins' rookie affiliate in 2021, Mack suffered a hamstring injury in early 2022 that shortened an otherwise difficult season. In 2023, a promotion to High-A at 20 years old wasn't conducive to quick success.

"I remember everything, and I got my butt handed to me," Mack said. "I just struggled throughout the entire season, and looking back I'm actually grateful for it. I was able to use it as motivation and not as, 'Oh, I stink, I'm done.' Instead, it was 'I stink, so what am I going to do about it?' That pushed me to be the person I am today."

When the dust settled, Mack's 120 games with the High-A Beloit Sky Carp culminated with a .218 batting average and a .582 OPS, well below average

offensive figures in the Midwest League. MLB Pipeline, an industry-standard prospect ranking site that rated Mack as the Marlins' sixth-best prospect entering the year, dropped him down to 26th following the season. Despite the struggle, Mack zeroed in on his process and ignored the arbitrary rating.

"I don't really look at that stuff, but it's great to know the organization values you," Mack said of his Top 30 prospect ranking. "Just being able to do that and get an opportunity that I have is huge."

Mack attributes his faith in God to his success and perseverance, but tangible adjustments through longtime connections aided his resurgence. Despite a quiet year offensively with Beloit in 2023, all six of Mack's home runs came in the season's final seven weeks. The New York native attributes the late surge to a relationship he made back home with a high school mentor.

"I went back home and sat down with my hitting coach Ronnie Bernick," Mack said. "Not too much physical or mental stuff, but just talked and came up with short-term fixes...it worked for the rest of the season...we knew [those adjustments] weren't going to be the final product. Even this year isn't the final product. I'm always learning, always adapting, and always trying to be better."

Bernick, who owns a training facility in Lancaster, New York, has known Mack since high school, where his brother-in-law Chris Gruarnin served as East Amherst's baseball coach. According to Mack, the two speak almost daily, with Bernick providing a pillar of stability and a reminder of home.



The support has helped Mack weather 4-for-24 and 3-for-19 stretches at the plate that characterize a hitter's first adjustment to Double-A competition.

Following work with Bernick and mental performance coach Alan Jaeger, a rejuvenated Mack ambushed High-A pitching to begin 2024. A promotion to Double-A Pensacola quickly followed, and Mack has since entrenched himself as a potent bat and defensive threat for the Blue Wahoos.

Mack's faith in his developmental process culminated in a torrid stretch from June 4-9. In six games against the Mississippi Braves, Mack collected ten hits, swatted home runs in four consecutive games, caught three quality starts behind the plate, and threw out two would-be base stealers. Even after dominant performances, Mack was quick to dish credit to his teammates.

"This team is awesome," Mack said in a postgame interview after a 4-3 victory on June 6. "We've got a bunch of great guys, and we're not quitters. If we lose one game or two games, it doesn't matter, we're gonna come back and compete and find a way to win the next game."

The self-effacing Mack consistently strikes the same chord when speaking about his performances - statistically impressive or not. For one of the Blue Wahoos' brightest stars, patience and trust in improvement reigns most important, and that philosophy has guided Mack to excel at his highest level yet.











QUINT AND RISHY STUDER moved to Pensacola in 1996 and have been investing in the city's future since. A titan in the field of healthcare, Quint headquartered Studer Group before devoting his career to philanthropy and community building. The Studers have played an integral role in the reinvigoration of downtown Pensacola, building Blue Wahoos Stadium and Studer Children's Hospital and opening numerous businesses including the Bodacious Shops and Bubba's Sweet Spot on historic Palafox Street. Today, Studer is a best-selling author in both business and health care fields, and continues to invest in Pensacola.

BUBBA WATSON grew up in Bagdad, Florida on his way to becoming a professional golfer and two-time Masters champion. Since returning to Pensacola with his family, Bubba has invested heavily in the community, opening Bubba's Sweet Spot downtown, donating generously to the Studer Family Children's Hospital, and becoming a part-owner of the Blue Wahoos with business partner RANDALL WELLS.

DERRICK BROOKS played youth football in his hometown of Pensacola, Florida before becoming a two-time All-American linebacker at Florida State and an 11-time Pro Bowler in a 14-year NFL career. He led the Tampa Bay Buccaneers to a Super Bowl title in 2003, was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2014, and joined the Blue Wahoos as an owner in 2018.

DANA SUSKIND is a professor of Surgery and Pediatrics at the University of Chicago Medical Center and the co-founder and co-director of the Thirty Million Words Center for Early Learning. She is a popular author and is devoted to treating children born with hearing loss.

JOHN LIST is an economist at the University of Chicago. The author of over 200 academic publications, he was a finalist for the Nobel Prize in economics in 2015 and is co-founder of the Thirty Million Words Center for Early Learning with Dana Suskind.

The post in mid-May on the Blue Wahoos Facebook page about the Fred Waters Baseball Camp caught Teddi Miller's attention.

She immediately signed up her 12-yearold son, Evan, and her 9-year-old daughter, Zoi. They made the 50-mile drive on June 14 from Crestview, along with Zoi's best friend, Reecie, to participate in the special event at Blue Wahoos Stadium.

It featured more than 25 former professional players, three area collegiate coaches and two former star softball players, along with five acclaimed college players from UWF and Pensacola State College. Of the group, 12 of those former Pensacola area players rose all the way to the major leagues.

"This is pretty amazing," Miller said, as she looked out over the field that day. "This is really great. I am so grateful for the Blue Wahoos to put something on like this.

"These kids, if they do continue to play, it's kind of a glimpse in the future that is coming for them, and us as parents. It is pretty awesome to see the kids out there in their smiles, running around, having a good time."

Another youth baseball camp, the Blue Wahoos 2024 Baseball Camp, will be held July 26-27 and feature current Blue Wahoos players helping as instructors for kids ages 6-12, the same age group as the Fred Waters Clinic.

At the urging of Blue Wahoos owner Quint Studer, the Fred Waters Baseball Camp was revived in 2023 after being held from 1990 to 2001 at UWF's Jim Spooner Field.



Some of those kids who were involved as participants, like former pitchers Billy Sadler and Tim Spooneybarger and outfielder Adron Chambers, rose to become MLB players and returned to instruct the next generation.

Waters, who passed away in 1989, was a former high school coach in Pensacola and Minor League Baseball manager who had mentored many of Pensacola's former MLB players.

"It shows what kind of impact that Fred had, what kind of impact that clinic had even with those guys," said Kevin Saucier, himself a former MLB player and World Series champion, who is now the lead organizer and director of the camp.



"It was a huge impact on the community for many of those same guys who worked that camp more than 20 years ago to come back and want to help out again," Saucier said.

They helped lead 150 kids for each session through a variety of drills on the field. It was followed by an autograph session and lunch.

"Growing up, I never participated in any of these kind of camps that had professional players," said Blue Wahoos manager Kevin Randel. "I don't even know if they were around. I think it's good for our kids and special for our players as well."

Waters led Pensacola High to state runner-up feats in 1962 and '63. He then went on to coach at Escambia High, and won state Class 4A titles in 1972 and '74 with Saucier and fellow future major leaguer Preston Hanna leading the way.

"(Waters) not only taught you about baseball, he taught you about how to conduct yourself in life," said Dennis Lewallyn, who played for Waters at Escambia before an MLB career.

"I wouldn't have reached the major leagues without Fred Waters," Saucier said.

For the current kids like Teddi Miller's two children, and her daughter's teammate, the recent Fred Waters Baseball Camp left a lasting impact.

"My son and daughter have been to games and been on the field to run the roach run," Miller said. "But for Reecie, this was her first time at the stadium, so that was exciting as we drove up to the stadium and saw her face light up.

"Pretty cool. We're so glad to be part of it."



A 13th round selection in the 2002 MLB Draft, Randel played eight seasons in the Marlins farm system, reaching the Triple-A level. From 2010-2014, he served as a hitting coach before becoming a manager in 2015. On May 5, 2024, he secured his 219th victory and became the winningest manager in team history.



#### Jason Krizan Hitting Coach

Jason Krizan joins the Blue Wahoos for his first season in 2024 after spending 2023 as the hitting coach for High-A Winston-Salem in the Chicago White Sox organization. Selected by the Detroit Tigers in the 8th round of the 2011 Draft out of Dallas Baptist University, he was a First-Team All-American in his senior season. After an 11-year minor league career in the Tigers, Mets and Giants organizations, he made his MLB debut for San Francisco in 2022.

Jerad Eickhoff joins the Blue Wahoos for his first season in 2024 after a seven-year MLB career that included time with the Philadelphia Phillies (2015-19), New York Mets (2021) and Pittsburgh Pirates (2022). Selected in the 15th round of the 2011 Draft by the Texas Rangers, he also spent time in the Padres and Guardians organizations, finishing his career with Triple-A Columbus in 2023.

Danny Black played six seasons in the Marlins minor league system from 2010 to 2015, including parts of four seasons for Double-A Jacksonville in the Southern League and parts of two seasons with Triple-A New Orleans. #### Brandon Remalia Strength Coach






#### Shelby Perry Athletic Trainer

#### **BLUE WAHOOS STADIUM**




Entering its 13th season, Blue Wahoos Stadium is widely considered one of the premier facilities in Minor League Baseball. Recently named the Best Ballpark in Double-A by Ballpark Digest, the stadium has established itself as one of the best places to enjoy a Minor League Baseball game in the country. A three-time recipient of the Southern League Ballpark of the Year, Blue Wahoos Stadium welcomed over two million fans in its first eight seasons, finishing first or second in the league in attendance five times.



With a capacity of 5,038 fans, Blue Wahoos Stadium is the smallest in the Southern League, allowing fans to get closer to the action than any other park in the league. Nestled alongside the water in Pensacola's Community Maritime Park, the field provides unbeatable views of the Pensacola Bay. The playing surface at Blue Wahoos Stadium was officially named Admiral Fetterman Field in 2015 in honor of the late Admiral Jack Fetterman, who was instrumental in the creation of Community Maritime Park for the Pensacola community.



Blue Wahoos Stadium and the surrounding Maritime Community Park were built to be used by the local community throughout the year, not just for Wahoos baseball games. More than 200 events are held at the ballpark throughout the year, making it truly a stadium for the entire community to enjoy.

Service dogs need to be prepared for all sorts of environments, including places with large crowds, loud noises, lights, and lots of stimuli. Founded in 1975, Canine Companions has helped train and provide service dogs for people with physical disabilities for over 45 years. #### **Honoring Admiral Fetterman**

On September 23, 2015, the field at Blue Wahoos Stadium was officially renamed Admiral Jack Fetterman Field. It honors the memory of Fetterman, a three-star Vice Admiral in the U.S. Navy who retired in Pensacola and became a prominent civic leader, dedicating himself, alongside his wife Nancy, to preserving Pensacola's history.

A strong advocate for the construction of Maritime Community Park and Blue Wahoos Stadium, Fetterman passed away on March 24, 2006 at the age of 74 and was never able to see his vision of a waterfront stadium become reality. Although he never watched the Wahoos play at the ballpark, his memory is honored at each game played on the field bearing his name.

As you enjoy today's game at Blue Wahoos Stadium, please take a moment in your own way to thank Admiral Fetterman for his contributions to the city of Pensacola and the United States military.

A Pennsylvania native, Fetterman graduated from college in 1954 and enlisted in the U.S. Navy. He made his first trip to Pensacola soon after to attend the Aviation Officer Candidate School at Naval Air Station Pensacola.

He rose in rank and was appointed Rear Admiral and then Vice Admiral, assuming command duties of the U.S. Naval Air Force Pacific Fleet in San Diego, a capacity he served in until 1990.

In 1991, Fetterman returned to Pensacola where his Naval career began and assumed duties as Chief of Naval Education and Training before retiring from active duty in 1993. During his illustrius Naval career, he formulated and produced the Core Values Training program, earning him the title of "Father of Navy Ethics."

He then became president and CEO of the National Naval Aviation Museum at NAS-Pensacola. Under his leadership, the museum grew in capacity and scope, making the facility one of the largest air and space museums in the world.

In addition to his work at NAS-Pensacola and with other U.S. Navy roles, Fetterman served his community in roles that included being Chairman of the Pensacola Mayor Community Core Values Board. He was also Chairman of the Pensacola Chamber of Commerce.

The Blue Wahoos are proud to honor Fetterman's service to our nation, along with his legacy and efforts to make Pensacola the greatest place to live on earth.

"I think it just speaks to my character as a person. I am going show those pictures to my kids when I'm older, so I can say, 'Hey back in my day, this was my car.' I love it."

His choice of transportation is just one part of what makes Stanavich stand out.

He is the third-oldest of 10 children in his family. Five brothers, five sisters. ranging from 8 to 31. His mother came from a family of 16 children.

Growing up in Amsterdam, New York - a city 34 miles from Albany, the state capital city, Stanavich played three sports - football, basketball and baseball - all the way through high school.

His senior year, as a running back and defensive back, he played every snap of every game. Then, he went into playing basketball.

Though a tad shy of 5-foot-11, Stanavich worked his skills to where he can now dunk a basketball. That, feat. of course. draws attention every time he's in a gym.





"Once I got stronger and understood how to properly jump, I was able to do it. I get a good reaction when I go to the gym and I do it. Because people don't expect that out of me.

"The more you do something, the better you understand how to do it. And it just became something I wanted to perfect in a sense."

Baseball was his summer love until realizing he may have a chance to pursue it full-time. Without a fouryear college offer, he played at two junior colleges in New York before advancing even further.

Stanavich is a perfect example of why young athletes don't need to feel a necessity to focus just on one sport and limit themselves. He played three and is now playing for the Blue Wahoos in one of baseball's highest levels.

"They all tie in. Any kid that is playing multiple sports, I encourage them to do that. It will only benefit them in the long run."

A season ago, Stanavich helped the Jupiter Hammerheads win their first Florida State League title in franchise history. The team is the Single-A affiliate of the Marlins.

Stanavich allowed only one unearned run and recorded 10 strikeouts in 6.2 innings, and was the winning pitcher in both Championship Series games.

"It took a lot of hard work and practice and I am grateful to be here," Stanavich said. "I just enjoy this job. And it just feels great to be in Pensacola too and this is such a great place. The fans are great, the fans are great and everyone I have come across has been great.

"You cannot take it for granted. You have to enjoy every opportunity and when you have success, you have to be level-headed just as you need when you are throwing. But it is a dream come true. It is just a blessing."

No matter where the next path leads, Stanavich is well-aware of reaching a baseball level in Double-A that few players ever reach.

"There is a lot that goes into this," he said. "The time that it requires. You cannot take it for granted. You have to enjoy every opportunity and when you have success, you have to be level-headed, just as you need to when you are throwing.

"But it is a dream come true. It is just a blessing."

### BALLPARK RULES

We want every game at Blue Wahoos Stadium to be an enjoyable and memorable experience for every fan. To make that possible, the following rules are enforced.

- Foul/abusive language and/or rowdy behavior will not be tolerated and will be cause for ejection and/or arrest. Violators may also have their season tickets revoked. Notify the nearest guest services or safety/security representative immediately if actions of this type occur near you.
- The use of derogatory language, which is defined as offensive language concerning another
  person's race, ethnicity, gender, religion, disability, age, sexual orientation, or national origin
  is cause for immediate ejection from the stadium without a refund and could result in future
  ticket loss.
- By Major League Baseball rule, bags are not permitted in the stadium. Diaper bags, medical bags, and small purses are allowed.
- Entering the playing field without authorization or throwing objects onto the field is a violation of ballpark rules and may be hazardous. Offenders will be ejected and subject to arrest and prosecution.
- All tobacco and electronic cigarettes are prohibited in Blue Wahoos Stadium which includes the seating sections, concourses, and stairwells.
- Keep aisles clear at all times; emergency situations require that stairways be kept clear. Guests sitting or standing in the ballpark aisles jeopardize the safety of others.
- For your safety and the safety of those around you, please sit in your assigned seat to avoid inconveniencing other guests.
- Drunk and disorderly behavior as well as violation of any alcohol policy will result in ejections from the ballpark without a refund and could result in the loss of season tickets. Underage consumption and the excessive consumption of alcohol is strictly prohibited.
- Umbrellas are allowed in the stadium. Please be courteous of those around you when using an umbrella.
- The Blue Wahoos ask that no one solicit contributions or distribute literature on stadium property without written approval of the team.
- Flags and banners without poles are permitted. Flags must be event related and may not cover any ballpark signage. All flags or banners deemed inappropriate by stadium management are subject to removal.
- Gates will open 60 minutes (1 hour) prior to the start of the game for admission into the stadium. We strongly encourage guests to enter the stadium as early as possible to avoid delays.
- All guests entering the stadium are subject to search. Refusal may be grounds to prohibit admission.
- The following items are prohibited from entering the stadium: bottles, cans, coolers, containers, fireworks, flares, pets or animals of any kind (with the exception of service animals), weapons, water guns, toy/replica weapons, squirt bottles, soap bottles, balloons, brooms, skateboards, roller blades or skates.
- Handheld radios and televisions are allowed as long as guests listen with an earpiece or headphones. Guests should be considerate of their neighbors when using these devices.
- Outside food and beverages are not permitted inside the stadium. Concession stands are conveniently located on both sides of the concourse for your food and beverage needs.
- All fans must comply with requests from stadium staff regarding stadium policies and emergency response procedures. Be safe. Have fun!


