
In this month's edition of the Tacklebox program, you'll read two stories helping to illuminate why the Wahoos have done so much winning in recent years.



No player joined the Blue Wahoos in a more bizarre fashion than infielder Nathan Martorella.

On May 3, while playing for the San Antonio Missions, the Double-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres, Martorella had just reached second base in that night's game.

Suddenly, he looked into the dugout and saw the team's manager and coaching staff signaling for him to exit for a pinch runner. Martorella was confused. In a video that became viral that night, he was seen extending his hands with a confused look on his face.

Eventually, as the pinch runner entered the field, Martorella realized the move was not based on lack of performance, but necessity.

He had just been traded to the Blue Wahoos as part of a deal that sent fellow Missions teammate Jakob Marsee and two other Padres minor league prospects to the Miami Marlins organization in exchange for star major leaguer Luis Arraez, who had played in Pensacola in 2019 as a Minnesota Twins prospect.

Martorella was giving a "what, me?" reaction as he looked into the visitor's dugout.

"It was weird, for sure," said Martorella, 23, a Monterey, California native, who was chosen in the fifth round by the Padres in the 2022 Draft out of the University of California-Berkley.

"I was on base and I'm a competitor so when I'm on the field, I want to compete," said Martorella, who climbed to a #13 ranking among the Padres top 30 prospects by MLB Pipeline.

"I was just confused as to why I was getting pulled," he said. "When I got to the dugout, the manager told me and I was just ready for a new opportunity."

The reason for this kind of notification is that once a deal is finalized, a player can no longer play for his now-former team due to injury potential that would void the trade. So a player has to be lifted immediately if it happens during a game.



Martorella and Marsee have since become a regular part of the Blue Wahoos starting lineup. Martorella is now posited as the Marlins' #11 ranked prospect. As is only natural, however, there have been challenges to adjust to a new league and pitchers he had never faced before.

The other two players the Marlins received were Missions pitcher Woo-Suk Go, a South Korea native who is with the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp in Triple-A, and 19-year-old outfielder Dillon Head, the Padres' No. 1 pick in the 2023 Draft [No. 25th overall selection]. He is playing for the Jupiter Hammerheads, the Single-A affiliate of the Marlins.

The Blue Wahoos' Jacob Berry played with Martorella and Marsee in the Arizona Fall League with the Peoria Javelinas.

"They are both great guys," Berry said, immediately following the trade. "We all had a great opportunity to bond. We had a a good team in Arizona and really looking forward to having them out here.

"Marsee spoke for himself in the Fall League when he won the player of the year. Marty is a great player. I played against him when I was in college and now last year (in the Arizona Fall League) and I'm looking forward to playing with him now. Hopefully they will help us win in the future."

Marsee, the Padres' sixth round Draft pick in 2022, earned that Arizona Fall League MVP after a strong fall season in 2023 with the Javelinas, where he led the AFL in runs scored (25), hits (36), doubles (12) and on-base plus slugging (OPS) at 1.215.

The month-long performance earned him the Joe Black Award, annually given to the AFL's most outstanding player. He rose from Central Michigan University into being a sixth-round pick by the Padres.

"It's been a blessing," said Marsee, the Padres' former No. 12 prospect, speaking to MLB.com that day. "I mean, if you would have told me this was where I'd be – I would have dreamed about this, but I never would have believed it. Just being here and being able to compete every single day with these guys, it's a blessing.

"Honestly, without my time at Central, I don't think I'd be doing what I'm doing right now. I pay tribute to all my friends and teammates and coaches there and everyone that's helped me along the way."

Martorella had a great outlook when discussing what has transpired in his career.

Peter Bendix, the Marlins president of baseball operations, who visited Pensacola in April and spent days in town checking out the Blue Wahoos, spoke about the trade as a forward step on a quest for long-term success.

Arraez played six weeks for the Blue Wahoos during the 2019 season, their only one as a Minnesota Twins affiliate. Just as he does now, he was slashing pitches to all fields and wowed as a difficult player to strike out. He has since risen to make MLB history in becoming the American League (2022) and National League (2023) batting champion in consecutive years.

"We got a lot of prospect talent in return (for Arraez), because Luis is the back-to-back batting champion who is a very good player," said Bendix, speaking to Miami area media members on a Zoom call. "And that's something that – given where were are right now with this season – is something we were determined was better to set the franchise up moving forward."

The Marlins - and the Blue Wahoos - hope that Marsee and Martorella can each contribute to a winning team in Pensacola this year, and in Miami for many years to come.











QUINT AND RISHY STUDER moved to Pensacola in 1996 and have been investing in the city's future since. A titan in the field of healthcare, Quint headquartered Studer Group before devoting his career to philanthropy and community building. The Studers have played an integral role in the reinvigoration of downtown Pensacola, building Blue Wahoos Stadium and Studer Children's Hospital and opening numerous businesses including the Bodacious Shops and Bubba's Sweet Spot on historic Palafox Street. Today, Studer is a best-selling author in both business and health care fields, and continues to invest in Pensacola.

BUBBA WATSON grew up in Bagdad, Florida on his way to becoming a professional golfer and two-time Masters champion. Since returning to Pensacola with his family, Bubba has invested heavily in the community, opening Bubba's Sweet Spot downtown, donating generously to the Studer Family Children's Hospital, and becoming a part-owner of the Blue Wahoos with business partner RANDALL WELLS.

DERRICK BROOKS played youth football in his hometown of Pensacola, Florida before becoming a two-time All-American linebacker at Florida State and an 11-time Pro Bowler in a 14-year NFL career. He led the Tampa Bay Buccaneers to a Super Bowl title in 2003, was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2014, and joined the Blue Wahoos as an owner in 2018.

DANA SUSKIND is a professor of Surgery and Pediatrics at the University of Chicago Medical Center and the co-founder and co-director of the Thirty Million Words Center for Early Learning. She is a popular author and is devoted to treating children born with hearing loss.

JOHN LIST is an economist at the University of Chicago. The author of over 200 academic publications, he was a finalist for the Nobel Prize in economics in 2015 and is co-founder of the Thirty Million Words Center for Early Learning with Dana Suskind.

Over their first 12 years of existence, the Blue Wahoos have forged a dense collection of their own unique history. Two championships and a slew of future Major League talent have helped the Wahoos establish a genuine connection with Pensacola's baseball-hungry community. However, the success of baseball in Pensacola today is mostly owed to the perseverance of trailblazing Negro League teams and Black players during the 20th century.

Before Jackie Robinson broke the color barrier in Major League Baseball in 1947, Negro League Baseball was the only option for professional Black players. Beginning in 1920, the leagues lasted into the late 1940s and produced numerous players now featured in the National Baseball Hall of Fame. In 2020, Major League Baseball moved to recognize Negro League Statistics as Major League in quality, thereby beginning the process to integrate statistical records.

Pensacola's relationship with Negro League Baseball saw several teams play and gain popularity within the city. At different points, the Pensacola Arthur Giants, the Pepsi-Cola Stars and the Pensacola Seagulls called The City of Five Flags home. At the time, the Seagulls used historic Legion Field and Admiral Mason Park to showcase their stars. Former Seagulls great Richard Mobley recently recalled his experience with the team.

"Everybody went to see them play, white and black fans," said Mobley in a 2022 interview with Blue Wahoos staff writer Bill Vilona. "A lot of the guys on those teams back then lived in my neighborhood...those guys [the players] encouraged us to play baseball."



Though the Seagulls weren't Pensacola's only Negro League baseball squad during the mid-20th century, they were the most well-known and longest-lasting professional team of the group. The Seagulls' Legion Field hosted Major League teams during spring training trips back to their home cities and saw multitudes of Negro League talent





One former Kansas City Monarch star eventually came back to Pensacola nearly 60 full years after the end of the Negro League era. Hall of Famer Buck O'Neil visited for a Pensacola Pelicans game while the independent team was the only professional baseball tenant in the city. Current Blue Wahoos owner Quint Studer remembers O'Neil's visit as a highlight of his baseball experience.

"We were fortunate to bring him [O'Neil] here," said Studer. "He shared with the community what it was like as a Black person who played professional baseball before and after the color barrier was broken...it was an educational experience for many."

At present, the Blue Wahoos have

replica Seagulls jerseys for special occasions and will do so again in 2024. During the Wahoos' June 18-23 series versus the Chattanooga Lookouts, Pensacola will don the Seagulls' jerseys on Wednesday, June 19 - otherwise known as Juneteenth, an annual holiday commemorating the end of slavery in the United States - and during the series finale on Sunday, June 23 in "The Nine" Night presented by Cox.

The celebration of the Seagulls holds special meaning for Studer, who observed the occasion back in 2022 during a similar celebration.

"A number of players from the Seagulls were honored at the game and the wore Seagulls uniforms," Wahoos Studer said. "This leads us to the 2024 season when the Seagulls will again grace the field."

The celebration of Pensacola baseball history at Blue Wahoos Stadium will provide a rare up-close glimpse into a city's past rich with baseball history and lore. The week is set to provide a unique and enjoyable look at the past - all while the current day Wahoos continue to make fresh history of their own.

Kevin Randel has coached in the Marlins organization since 2010 and has managed the Blue Wahoos since 2021. A 13th round selection in the 2002 MLB Draft, Randel played eight seasons in the Marlins farm system, reaching the Triple-A level. From 2010-2014, he served as a hitting coach before becoming a manager in 2015. On May 5, 2024, he secured his 219th victory and became the winningest manager in team history.



Jason Krizan Hitting Coach

Jason Krizan joins the Blue Wahoos for his first season in 2024 after spending 2023 as the hitting coach for High-A Winston-Salem in the Chicago White Sox organization. Selected by the Detroit Tigers in the 8th round of the 2011 Draft out of Dallas Baptist University, he was a First-Team All-American in his senior season. After an 11-year minor league career in the Tigers, Mets and Giants organizations, he made his MLB debut for San Francisco in 2022.

Jerad Eickhoff joins the Blue Wahoos for his first season in 2024 after a seven-year MLB career that included time with the Philadelphia Phillies (2015-19), New York Mets (2021) and Pittsburgh Pirates (2022). Selected in the 15th round of the 2011 Draft by the Texas Rangers, he also spent time in the Padres and Guardians organizations, finishing his career with Triple-A Columbus in 2023.



Danny Black Defensive Coach

Danny Black played six seasons in the Marlins minor league system from 2010 to 2015, including parts of four seasons for Double-A Jacksonville in the Southern League and parts of two seasons with Triple-A New Orleans. He began his coaching career in 2018 and served in various roles for Advanced-A Jupiter, Triple-A Jacksonville and the FCL Marlins before joining the Blue Wahoos coaching staff in 2023.



Brandon Remalia Strength Coach

Brandon Remalia joins the Blue Wahoos for his first season in 2024 after serving in a similar role for High-A Beloit in 2023 and Class-A Jupiter in 2021 and 2022. Prior to joining the Marlins organization, he worked at St. John's College High School in Washington, DC as a sports performance coach. A graduate of Frostburg State University with a bachelor's degree in sports and exercise, he holds his CSCS certification from the National Strength and Conditioning Association.




Shelby Perry Athletic Trainer

BLUE WAHOOS STADIUM




Entering its 13th season, Blue Wahoos Stadium is widely considered one of the premier facilities in Minor League Baseball. Recently named the Best Ballpark in Double-A by Ballpark Digest, the stadium has established itself as one of the best places to enjoy a Minor League Baseball game in the country. A three-time recipient of the Southern League Ballpark of the Year, Blue Wahoos Stadium welcomed over two million fans in its first eight seasons, finishing first or second in the league in attendance five times.



With a capacity of 5,038 fans, Blue Wahoos Stadium is the smallest in the Southern League, allowing fans to get closer to the action than any other park in the league. Nestled alongside the water in Pensacola's Community Maritime Park, the field provides unbeatable views of the Pensacola Bay. The playing surface at Blue Wahoos Stadium was officially named Admiral Fetterman Field in 2015 in honor of the late Admiral Jack Fetterman, who was instrumental in the creation of Community Maritime Park for the Pensacola community.



Blue Wahoos Stadium and the surrounding Maritime Community Park were built to be used by the local community throughout the year, not just for Wahoos baseball games. More than 200 events are held at the ballpark throughout the year, making it truly a stadium for the entire community to enjoy.

Honoring Admiral Fetterman

On September 23, 2015, the field at Blue Wahoos Stadium was officially renamed Admiral Jack Fetterman Field. It honors the memory of Fetterman, a three-star Vice Admiral in the U.S. Navy who retired in Pensacola and became a prominent civic leader, dedicating himself, alongside his wife Nancy, to preserving Pensacola's history.

A strong advocate for the construction of Maritime Community Park and Blue Wahoos Stadium, Fetterman passed away on March 24, 2006 at the age of 74 and was never able to see his vision of a waterfront stadium become reality. Although he never watched the Wahoos play at the ballpark, his memory is honored at each game played on the field bearing his name.

As you enjoy today's game at Blue Wahoos Stadium, please take a moment in your own way to thank Admiral Fetterman for his contributions to the city of Pensacola and the United States military.

A Pennsylvania native, Fetterman graduated from college in 1954 and enlisted in the U.S. Navy. He made his first trip to Pensacola soon after to attend the Aviation Officer Candidate School at Naval Air Station Pensacola.

He rose in rank and was appointed Rear Admiral and then Vice Admiral, assuming command duties of the U.S. Naval Air Force Pacific Fleet in San Diego, a capacity he served in until 1990.

In 1991, Fetterman returned to Pensacola where his Naval career began and assumed duties as Chief of Naval Education and Training before retiring from active duty in 1993. During his illustrius Naval career, he formulated and produced the Core Values Training program, earning him the title of "Father of Navy Ethics."

He then became president and CEO of the National Naval Aviation Museum at NAS-Pensacola. Under his leadership, the museum grew in capacity and scope, making the facility one of the largest air and space museums in the world.

In addition to his work at NAS-Pensacola and with other U.S. Navy roles, Fetterman served his community in roles that included being Chairman of the Pensacola Mayor Community Core Values Board. He was also Chairman of the Pensacola Chamber of Commerce.

The Blue Wahoos are proud to honor Fetterman's service to our nation, along with his legacy and efforts to make Pensacola the greatest place to live on earth.







PENSACOLA'S PITCHING DIDELINE

The Blue Wahoos will finish their first half of the 2024 season this month with a familiar narrative.

Pitching and defense has been the calling card.

Since becoming part of the Miami Marlins organization in 2021, the Blue Wahoos success of three winning seasons, two consecutive trips to the Southern League championship series and their first outright league title can directly be attributed to the position on the mound.

They've been led by a youthful face, red haired, top draft pick in Max Meyer (2021), a precocious teenager in Eury Perez (2022) and a stable of strong relievers in 2023.

There have been 12 pitchers who wore a Blue Wahoos uniform the past three seasons make Major League Baseball debuts, led by Meyer and Perez, of course, with the Marlins.

"When you win championships, or when you win a lot of ballgames, pitching is usually the thing behind it," said Blue Wahoos manager Kevin Randel, who has been Pensacola's manager since the 2021 season. "We've had a strong corps of really good bullpen guys, really good back-end guys (closers) and a really strong rotation.

"This year is no different. The six rotation guys, the bullpen guys, the back-end guys are all performing, they are all executing and they are feeding off each other. When you win these games, win the championships, it all comes down to pitching."

So far this season, pitching has been the backbone.

While the Blue Wahoos have often struggled at the plate, closing the month of May with one of the lower batting averages in the Southern League, they have stayed competitive in the first half divisional race because of the pitching



staff.

When he left spring training, Randel knew this season would be a transitional one. There was not a much-heralded prospect like Meyer or Perez to start the season, but there were proven, returning pitchers like Evan Fitterer, MD Johnson, Luis Palacios and Jonathan Bermudez in the mix.

Through May, they have combined to give the Blue Wahoos an opportunity to win games with some timely hits.

"I wouldn't say I was surprised," Randel said. "But what I've like about them the most is the consistency. You know they can all do it, but now they are stringing their starts together and that's been a big part of our success. It's the consistency that you have to have."

With Fitterer, who started strong last season, Randel has seen the benefits of experience.

"There is a little bit more confidence with him, a little bit more a swagger," he said. "He's throwing more strikes. He is getting pretty much same ground ball numbers as last year. His fastball is cutting well, so there's a lot to it."

In Johnson, one of the most popular players with fans because of his friendly demeanor away from the mound. Randel has seen a more aggressive approach.

"He is starting to attack the (strike) zone a lot more." Randel said. "He's not pitching away from contact as he did in the past. He's shifted to his two seamer (fastball), has developed a sweeping slider, a cutter and he's changed a lot of grips on pitches. He's started tinkering with a sinker and some days it's good, some days it's bad, but that is another pitch. MD has done well."

Bermudez, a lefthander with strong velocity, has shown Randel a more refined version of the way he pitched last year.

"He has shifted away from trying to strike everybody out," Randel said. "He's getting in the (strike) zone a lot more, a lot less non-competitive and that comes from pitches. attacking the strike zone.

"His command is a lot better. He's





under control. He is night and day from last year. He's turned a corner." All of this progression has come under a new pitching coach. After long-time pitching coach Dave Eiland left in 2023, the Marlins hired former MLB pitcher Jerad Eickhoff, 33, who pitched in seven MLB seasons, to become the Blue Wahoos' 2024 pitching coach.

Eickhoff, nicknamed "Ike," pitched in 2022 for the Pittsburgh Pirates, his third MLB team, then retired after last season in Triple-A with the Cleveland Guardians organization.

He was hired in March by the Marlins and joined the Blue Wahoos spring training camp prior to exiting for Pensacola.

"I had not met lke until the last two weeks of spring training," Randel said. "But he jumped right in. There were a lot of hours (working), a lot of one on one meetings to get know all his players.

"He developed new pitch groups (in spring training workouts), his team shifted certain pitches that will match each pitchers' releases. He watched video after video of hitters' swings to find holes to expose and just get the guys to buy into the approach to throw strikes."

There has been an instant connection, Randel said, between the Blue Wahoos pitching staff and Eickhoff due to closer proximity in ages.

"He's got a lot of feel for it," Randel said. "He is just coming off the field, just finishing his own career himself for a long time, so he know exactly what these guys are doing after a poor outing, a great outing, a mediocre outing.

"He knows it, he's been there. He's not far removed from it. He relates to these players really well. I think that's been huge. Obviously, Dave did it well, too, and the track record with Dave was exceptional, having won a World Series, pitched so long in the big leagues, but I think the youth of lke, the way he speaks about analytics, that holds a lot of weight with these players."

Randel sees the organization's pitching strength continuing. Their No. 1 draft pick from 2023, Noble Meyer, a former high school phenom, is off to a strong start as a rookie and will eventually join the Blue Wahoos in the future.

"You have a lot of great guys on the big league club and I know guys like Eury and Sandy (Alcantara) who are out this season will be back to go with the guys in their rotation now. You've got enough core there. And there are a lot of great young guys coming through the pipeline."

BALLPARK RULES

We want every game at Blue Wahoos Stadium to be an enjoyable and memorable experience for every fan. To make that possible, the following rules are enforced.

- Foul/abusive language and/or rowdy behavior will not be tolerated and will be cause for ejection and/or arrest. Violators may also have their season tickets revoked. Notify the nearest guest services or safety/security representative immediately if actions of this type occur near you.
- The use of derogatory language, which is defined as offensive language concerning another
 person's race, ethnicity, gender, religion, disability, age, sexual orientation, or national origin
 is cause for immediate ejection from the stadium without a refund and could result in future
 ticket loss.
- By Major League Baseball rule, bags are not permitted in the stadium. Diaper bags, medical bags, and small purses are allowed.
- Entering the playing field without authorization or throwing objects onto the field is a violation of ballpark rules and may be hazardous. Offenders will be ejected and subject to arrest and prosecution.
- All tobacco and electronic cigarettes are prohibited in Blue Wahoos Stadium which includes the seating sections, concourses, and stairwells.
- Keep aisles clear at all times; emergency situations require that stairways be kept clear. Guests sitting or standing in the ballpark aisles jeopardize the safety of others.
- For your safety and the safety of those around you, please sit in your assigned seat to avoid inconveniencing other guests.
- Drunk and disorderly behavior as well as violation of any alcohol policy will result in ejections from the ballpark without a refund and could result in the loss of season tickets. Underage consumption and the excessive consumption of alcohol is strictly prohibited.
- Umbrellas are allowed in the stadium. Please be courteous of those around you when using an umbrella.
- The Blue Wahoos ask that no one solicit contributions or distribute literature on stadium property without written approval of the team.
- Flags and banners without poles are permitted. Flags must be event related and may not cover any ballpark signage. All flags or banners deemed inappropriate by stadium management are subject to removal.
- Gates will open 60 minutes (1 hour) prior to the start of the game for admission into the stadium. We strongly encourage guests to enter the stadium as early as possible to avoid delays.
- All guests entering the stadium are subject to search. Refusal may be grounds to prohibit admission.
- The following items are prohibited from entering the stadium: bottles, cans, coolers, containers, fireworks, flares, pets or animals of any kind (with the exception of service animals), weapons, water guns, toy/replica weapons, squirt bottles, soap bottles, balloons, brooms, skateboards, roller blades or skates.
- Handheld radios and televisions are allowed as long as guests listen with an earpiece or headphones. Guests should be considerate of their neighbors when using these devices.
- Outside food and beverages are not permitted inside the stadium. Concession stands are conveniently located on both sides of the concourse for your food and beverage needs.
- All fans must comply with requests from stadium staff regarding stadium policies and emergency response procedures. Be safe. Have fun!


