



Our growing relationship with the local military community is an organizational point of pride, and our players jump at the chance to see a spectacle that people travel from all over the country to experience.

Finally, you might see a familiar face around the ballpark this summer. Infielder Cobie Fletcher-Vance, whose go-ahead grand slam in the decisive game of the 2022 Southern League Championship Series helped the Blue Wahoos claim their title, retired over the offseason and is now learning the ropes in our front office. That Cobie has decided to stick around is yet another indication that the environment we create with the Blue Wahoos is something special.

The connection now forged between the Blue Wahoos and the Monterrey Sultanes, the oldest franchise in the Mexican Professional League, began in a unique way.

First, an email was sent nearly two years ago. Then a direct message on the Blue Wahoos' team Twitter account.

"We really thought at first, who is this contacting us from Mexico? Is this real? You're thinking, this is a scam," said Blue Wahoos team president Jonathan Griffith, chuckling at the memory.

Nope. Turns out, it wasn't a scam, it was sincere.

"So, it starts out like this, in an odd way, right? And then I finally got a number for (the Sultanes)," Griffith said. "But now, of course, I've got to call to Mexico. How do you call Mexico when I can't speak Spanish? Fortunately, the person answering was their marketing person who understood me and we finally got in touch."

This led to a visit in early 2023 to Pensacola by Monterrey Sultanes executives, led by Sultanes vice president Guillermo "Willie" Gonzalez, who speaks fluent English.

And then another visit last November for a press conference at Blue Wahoos Stadium to announce the historic two exhibition games that occurred April 2-3 in Pensacola prior to the start of the Blue Wahoos' 2024 season.

At that moment, it was revealed that Sultanes majority owner, Francisco Gonzalez, read Bubba Watson's introspective 2021 book "Up And Down: Victories and Struggles in the Course of Life."

It was a powerful look at Watson's life and how he became a world-renowned professional golfer, along with being a Blue Wahoos partial owner, while dealing with mental health issues.

Francisco Gonzalez was an avid golfer and Bubba



Watson fan. It was arranged for the two to play golf in Mexico. That led to the idea of the Blue Wahoos connecting with the Sultanes.

Following the April 2-3 games, Griffith flew to Monterrey to visit the Sultanes home stadiu in the sprawling city of Monterrey to reconnect and form plans for future events.

"It's now like we're brothers," Griffith said. "We actually call them our 'Brother Team' because we're so close in our visions and values. We've learned things from them, they have learned things from us, so it really has been a great partnership."

The exhibition games at Blue Wahoos Stadium, one of which ended in a tie, the other a Sultanes win, were broadcast back to Monterrey and other locations throughout Mexico through a video feed provided by Blab TV, a long time Blue Wahoos media partner.

The Sultanes have an ownership group which also owns Grupo Multimedios, a company of 9,500 employees that spans 14 radio stations and a television network. It was founded in Monterrey 91 years ago and is similar to an American cable news channel.

The Sultanes' ballpark, Estadio Mobil Super, seats 21,803, making it the largest baseball stadium in Mexico and third largest in Latin America.

Beyond the two baseball games at Blue Wahoos Stadium – believed to be the first time a Mexican League team has played in the eastern half of the U.S. – the three days the Sultanes and their traveling group of front office personnel spent in Pensacola were far-reaching.

The Sultanes were treated April 1 to a joint team dinner at the Hancock Whitney Club. Blue Wahoos executive chef Travis Wilson and sous chef Carl Sackman prepared a five-course buffet meal that included a variety of desserts and delights that he knew would have an appeal to the Sultanes.

"We left [Monterrey] at 8 a.m. (on April 1), layover in Dallas, then landed at 7 (p.m.) or so, and to come here, come to the ballpark and be greeted with a dinner like this is incredible," said Sultanes pitcher Juan Gamez, a Tucson, Arizona native who was drafted by the Minnesota Twins in 2016 out of college at North Dakota State.

"I'm excited to be part of this first group of Mexican League players to play here and hopefully it opens things up for future teams to come here was well," said Gamez, who is on his second stint with Monterrey.

The next morning, prior to practicing at Blue Wahoos Stadium, the Sultanes visited two Pensacola schools, Oakcrest Elementary and Scenic Heights Elementary.

Joined by two Blue Wahoos players and both teams' mascots, Kazoo and Perro Sultan the floppy-eared dog, the group entertained and informed school children.

The first game was played amid gray skies and windy conditions, but was well-played. The teams had agreed to use a MLB spring training type of format where a lot of pitchers were used and if nine innings ended in a tie, the game would be stopped.

"It was definitely a cool experience, playing a team from Mexico... I have never done that before in my life," said Blue Wahoos second baseman Cody Morissette following the first game. "Obviously, we have international talent here and we become friendly with them, but playing against these guys, being able to share

dinner with them Monday, hearing some of their stories, it's definitely a cool experience."

On Wednesday morning, the Northwest Florida Fellowship of Christian Athletes, led by its long-time executive director Mike Killam, now in his 33rd year with the Pensacola chapter, treated the Sultanes players and staff to a breakfast and fellowship at First Baptist Church.

The church senior pastor Dave Snyder and his wife Brooke greeted the players. Brooke is bilingual and she was able to translate Killam's address to the team as well as other elements of the event that included a video of future Hall of Famer Albert Pujols and his life story and commitment to his faith.

After the second game on April 3, the teams exchanged jerseys and hugs and players remained on the field for several minutes to visit with each other before a post-game fireworks show occurred, which was sponsored by Nationwide Insurance, the presenting sponsor for the two-game exhibition series.

Following the fireworks, a Latino band entertained in front of Bubba's Sand Trap on the concourse and fans danced for nearly an hour before the party was concluded.

Following the second game on April 4, the Sultanes visited Pensacola Beach before departing on a flight back to their home city.





"I love Pensacola. I really love the city and love the people. The weather is amazing. ... Having a chance to play here, it's so amazing for us," Willie Gonzalez said. "It was such a brilliant idea when we called and spoke with Jonathan.

"We're a huge city (in Monterrey) but we're like Pensacola – everybody says hello and smiling faces everywhere. ... This is my fifth time here in Pensacola. I need to buy a house here. I heard there's some cheap ones very close to the beach," Gonzalez said with a laugh.

Sultanes manager Roberto Kelly, a Panama native who enjoyed an extended outielder career in Major League Baseball for 13 years, looked at the trip as a way for his players to get taste of Major League level competition.

"For a lot of our players, they've never played pro ball. To be able to come over here and play in a facility like this – on a nice, beautiful, well-kept field – when they saw this, they were excited about it," Kelly said. "It's a good experience for us."

The Blue Wahoos partnered with Grace Resendez McCafferty, publisher of Pensacola's Latino newspaper, Periodico La Costa Latina, which is now in its 19th year of distribution to Pensacola's growing Latino community. She helped set up entertainment in tune to the culture of Monterrey.

One of the Sultanes players on their current roster is pitcher Keury Mella, who pitched in parts of two seasons for the Blue Wahoos while he was a Cincinnati Reds prospect. Mella was the winning pitcher for the Blue Wahoos in their final regular-season game of 2017.

The Blue Wahoos made the three-day visit from the Sultanes a special experience for fans to learn and embrace something so different from any previous start to a season.

"I have never done anything like this before," said Blue Wahoos manager Randel. "As a player with the Marlins organization, we played the big-league team in an exhibition game in Greensboro (North Carolina) before a season once, then we had the Marlins play against the Greensboro team I managed in another year. But never a game anything like this."

"It was a good way to start the season."





QUINT AND RISHY STUDER moved to Pensacola in 1996 and have been investing in the city's future since. A titan in the field of healthcare, Quint headquartered Studer Group before devoting his career to philanthropy and community building. The Studers have played an integral role in the reinvigoration of downtown Pensacola, building Blue Wahoos Stadium and Studer Children's Hospital and opening numerous businesses including the Bodacious Shops and Bubba's Sweet Spot on historic Palafox Street. Today, Studer is a best-selling author in both business and health care fields, and continues to invest in Pensacola.

BUBBA WATSON grew up in Bagdad, Florida on his way to becoming a professional golfer and two-time Masters champion. Since returning to Pensacola with his family, Bubba has invested heavily in the community, opening Bubba's Sweet Spot downtown, donating generously to the Studer Family Children's Hospital, and becoming a part-owner of the Blue Wahoos with business partner RANDALL WELLS.

DERRICK BROOKS played youth football in his hometown of Pensacola, Florida before becoming a two-time All-American linebacker at Florida State and an 11-time Pro Bowler in a 14-year NFL career. He led the Tampa Bay Buccaneers to a Super Bowl title in 2003, was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2014, and joined the Blue Wahoos as an owner in 2018.

DANA SUSKIND is a professor of Surgery and Pediatrics at the University of Chicago Medical Center and the co-founder and co-director of the Thirty Million Words Center for Early Learning. She is a popular author and is devoted to treating children born with hearing loss.

JOHN LIST is an economist at the University of Chicago. The author of over 200 academic publications, he was a finalist for the Nobel Prize in economics in 2015 and is co-founder of the Thirty Million Words Center for Early Learning with Dana Suskind.

BLUE WAHOOS

When the United States Navy's Blue Angel pilots overflew Blue Wahoos Stadium on April 7th, 2024, it was a familiar sight for most in attendance. The acrobatic maneuvers and low-flying presence of Pensacola's famed airmen are a welcome sight at the stadium, but some players in the Blue Wahoos' dugout knew they'd soon have a chance to appreciate the Blue Angels up close.

On Tuesday, April 15th, a large group of Blue Wahoo players and coaches visited Naval Air Station (NAS) Pensacola, home to the Blue Angels and the National Naval Aviation Museum. The visit continues a partnership tradition that began several years ago between the Wahoos and NAS.

"I visited last year [in 2023], and I wanted to make sure I woke up just to do it again," said infielder Cody Morissette. "I really appreciate and want to support all those people who fight for our country, so I always make sure I give the time to go and support those causes."

The Wahoos' visits at NAS have included a practice demonstration of the Blue Angels' capabilities and a tour of the National Naval Aviation Museum, which houses some rich Pensacola baseball history. Hall-of-Fame outfielder Ted Williams was part of an all-star team that played at Pensacola's Bronson Field from 1942-45 during World War II. Williams later returned to NAS Pensacola for a separate tour of duty during the Korean War.

"Baseball and the navy base have always gone hand-in-hand here in Pensacola," Morissette said. "It was a lot of fun seeing the history and seeing them [the Blue Angels] do their thing."

For some new Blue Wahoo players, it was their first time taking in the dual-pronged history of NAS Pensacola and the museum. 2024 marks infielder Sean Roby's first year with the Wahoos, and the California native came away impressed from the trip.

"It was beautiful," Roby said. "It was definitely a good experience seeing everything and seeing their [routine] in practice."

The Wahoos have been visiting NAS Pensacola annually since 2022, when only a few players attended a first visit early on in the season. Current Blue Wahoos front office member and former infielder Cobie Fletcher-Vance attended early that year with two other players.



"It was a really fun thing because it was such a small group," Fletcher-Vance said. "The next time we went was a much larger group, it was exciting...l had always heard of the Blue Angels, and being able to go see them practice was really cool."



The visit and building a relationship with NAS Pensacola was important to Fletcher-Vance after an upbringing with active military parents molded an appreciation for servicemen and women.

"[The army] is where my parents met, and I moved around a little bit as a kid," Fletcher-Vance said. "Moving around, I learned little bits about every military town and why I was there...coming here, it felt like I was home."



From former to current and new Blue Wahoos, the visit to NAS Pensacola continues to rank as a favorite for the lasting memories it creates. The partnership is the latest chapter in a wide-ranging effort by the Blue Wahoos to acknowledge and appreciate the city's military history.

The team continues to host Salute To Service nights at the stadium and currently offers ticket packages to active duty military members during weekend games.

Brandon Remalia Strength Coach






Shelby Perry Athletic Trainer

BLUE WAHOOS STADIUM




Entering its 13th season, Blue Wahoos Stadium is widely considered one of the premier facilities in Minor League Baseball. Recently named the Best Ballpark in Double-A by Ballpark Digest, the stadium has established itself as one of the best places to enjoy a Minor League Baseball game in the country. A three-time recipient of the Southern League Ballpark of the Year, Blue Wahoos Stadium welcomed over two million fans in its first eight seasons, finishing first or second in the league in attendance five times.




With a capacity of 5,038 fans, Blue Wahoos Stadium is the smallest in the Southern League, allowing fans to get closer to the action than any other park in the league. Nestled alongside the water in Pensacola's Community Maritime Park, the field provides unbeatable views of the Pensacola Bay. The playing surface at Blue Wahoos Stadium was officially named Admiral Fetterman Field in 2015 in honor of the late Admiral Jack Fetterman, who was instrumental in the creation of Community Maritime Park for the Pensacola community.



Blue Wahoos Stadium and the surrounding Maritime Community Park were built to be used by the local community throughout the year, not just for Wahoos baseball games. More than 200 events are held at the ballpark throughout the year, making it truly a stadium for the entire community to enjoy.

Honoring Admiral Fetterman

On September 23, 2015, the field at Blue Wahoos Stadium was officially renamed Admiral Jack Fetterman Field. It honors the memory of Fetterman, a three-star Vice Admiral in the U.S. Navy who retired in Pensacola and became a prominent civic leader, dedicating himself, alongside his wife Nancy, to preserving Pensacola's history.

A strong advocate for the construction of Maritime Community Park and Blue Wahoos Stadium, Fetterman passed away on March 24, 2006 at the age of 74 and was never able to see his vision of a waterfront stadium become reality. Although he never watched the Wahoos play at the ballpark, his memory is honored at each game played on the field bearing his name.

As you enjoy today's game at Blue Wahoos Stadium, please take a moment in your own way to thank Admiral Fetterman for his contributions to the city of Pensacola and the United States military.

A Pennsylvania native, Fetterman graduated from college in 1954 and enlisted in the U.S. Navy. He made his first trip to Pensacola soon after to attend the Aviation Officer Candidate School at Naval Air Station Pensacola.

He rose in rank and was appointed Rear Admiral and then Vice Admiral, assuming command duties of the U.S. Naval Air Force Pacific Fleet in San Diego, a capacity he served in until 1990.

In 1991, Fetterman returned to Pensacola where his Naval career began and assumed duties as Chief of Naval Education and Training before retiring from active duty in 1993. During his illustrius Naval career, he formulated and produced the Core Values Training program, earning him the title of "Father of Navy Ethics."

He then became president and CEO of the National Naval Aviation Museum at NAS-Pensacola. Under his leadership, the museum grew in capacity and scope, making the facility one of the largest air and space museums in the world.

In addition to his work at NAS-Pensacola and with other U.S. Navy roles, Fetterman served his community in roles that included being Chairman of the Pensacola Mayor Community Core Values Board. He was also Chairman of the Pensacola Chamber of Commerce.

The Blue Wahoos are proud to honor Fetterman's service to our nation, along with his legacy and efforts to make Pensacola the greatest place to live on earth.







COBJE FLETCHER-VANCE'S

The National Anthem has just been played and Cobie Fletcher-Vance is ready as the game's first pitch awaits.

Eyes moving, his mind focused. Ready for a split-second movement anywhere he's needed.

Except now, a role has flipped. The team has the same name, but the teammates are not in the Blue Wahoos dugout, but rather across all points at Blue Wahoos Stadium.

Since April 1, Fletcher-Vance has been a member of the Blue Wahoos front office. He wears the same polo shirts and long pants attire as others do on the staff.


But it's so different. And eye-opening. And enlightening as he transitions from player to staffer, helping the Blue Wahoos stay successful on the business side of the scoreboard.

"One big thing that has stood out to me is how the show is run on this side of things," said Fletcher-Vance who played in 147 games for the Blue Wahoos across two seasons in 2022-23. "I have to admit, I never had the appreciation of what everyone does and how hard everyone had to work.

"From Jonathan (Griffith) as the team president to the great interns and trainees that we have here ... just how hard everyone actually had to work. Obviously, I knew (front office roles) came with a lot of hard work, but to see it from this side has really been very intriguing.

"I have a different appreciation for how the game is played now. I see the lights on, you see the players, you see all the people in the stands, but how did they get here?"

And that is now Fletcher-Vance's main objective. To be a power hitter on the business side.



On May 3, he received his degree from the University of Alabama and participated commencement in ceremonies at. the Coleman Coliseum.

He was the first generation in his family to receive a college degree. His father, Phillip, a former collegiate plaver at. Bethune-Cookman University, is a retired U.S. Army Sergeant Major. One of the largest U.S. Army bases is Fort Bragg, located in Fayetteville.

The road to graduation for Cobie took a temporary halt after he played three seasons for the Crimson Tide (2016-18) in a distinguished collegiate career. The versatile infielder started all 168 games in his three seasons for Alabama.

"(A college degree) means the world to me." Fletcher-Vance said. "More than playing ball, more than any of that could have meant. This is amazing for me."





In two seasons with the Blue Wahoos, Fletcher-Vance was a fan favorite. He was always willing to sign autographs. He engaged with fans near the dugout. He tossed baseballs into the crowd after recording a final out.

Whenever the Blue Wahoos needed someone to being the catcher for a ceremonial first pitch, he often filled that need. And he was active in all of the team's community service projects.

On the field, he produced one of the most famous moments in Blue Wahoos history. He hit a go-ahead grand slam in the deciding game of the 2022 Southern League Championship Series at Tennessee that propelled the Blue Wahoos to a title. That season in 2022, his 96 hits were tied with Troy Johnston for the most on the team.

His experience playing in Pensacola and connections he made in the community made it an easy decision to start the chapter of his life in the community he has loved.

"There's no better place in Minor League Baseball than Pensacola," Fletcher-Vance said. "I told people that when I was a player. And I tell them that now. There is nothing like Pensacola with the Blue Wahoos fans and this environment, so to be able to transition now on this side has been incredible.

"I've been very blessed everyone has been so welcoming that it has made the transition so easy. I know this, people living here love the city of Pensacola. Obviously, the beach is great, the weather is great. Part of what we do on the field is what they appreciate the most. It's a great place to be."

In his first month on the job in April, Fletcher-Vance saw the parallel between players' daily routine and the front office staff.

"Definitely the timing," he said. "As a player, we get here, we have our own schedule and then around 5:50 or so is when the front office and the players match up.

"Players have to be on the line ready for the National Anthem. And when I was a player, I was like, dang, (the front office staff) have got us doing this, got us doing that. And now I realize, there are 15 things that are going on just to get us to (the first pitch).

"Seeing that has been eye opening. There's a plan, just like there is for players."

Fletcher-Vance is confident his plan will lead to the next level of his life.

BALLPARK RULES

We want every game at Blue Wahoos Stadium to be an enjoyable and memorable experience for every fan. To make that possible, the following rules are enforced.

- Foul/abusive language and/or rowdy behavior will not be tolerated and will be cause for ejection and/or arrest. Violators may also have their season tickets revoked. Notify the nearest guest services or safety/security representative immediately if actions of this type occur near you.
- The use of derogatory language, which is defined as offensive language concerning another
 person's race, ethnicity, gender, religion, disability, age, sexual orientation, or national origin
 is cause for immediate ejection from the stadium without a refund and could result in future
 ticket loss.
- By Major League Baseball rule, bags are not permitted in the stadium. Diaper bags, medical bags, and small purses are allowed.
- Entering the playing field without authorization or throwing objects onto the field is a violation of ballpark rules and may be hazardous. Offenders will be ejected and subject to arrest and prosecution.
- All tobacco and electronic cigarettes are prohibited in Blue Wahoos Stadium which includes the seating sections, concourses, and stairwells.
- Keep aisles clear at all times; emergency situations require that stairways be kept clear. Guests sitting or standing in the ballpark aisles jeopardize the safety of others.
- For your safety and the safety of those around you, please sit in your assigned seat to avoid inconveniencing other guests.
- Drunk and disorderly behavior as well as violation of any alcohol policy will result in ejections from the ballpark without a refund and could result in the loss of season tickets. Underage consumption and the excessive consumption of alcohol is strictly prohibited.
- Umbrellas are allowed in the stadium. Please be courteous of those around you when using an umbrella.
- The Blue Wahoos ask that no one solicit contributions or distribute literature on stadium property without written approval of the team.
- Flags and banners without poles are permitted. Flags must be event related and may not cover any ballpark signage. All flags or banners deemed inappropriate by stadium management are subject to removal.
- Gates will open 60 minutes (1 hour) prior to the start of the game for admission into the stadium. We strongly encourage guests to enter the stadium as early as possible to avoid delays.
- All guests entering the stadium are subject to search. Refusal may be grounds to prohibit admission.
- The following items are prohibited from entering the stadium: bottles, cans, coolers, containers, fireworks, flares, pets or animals of any kind (with the exception of service animals), weapons, water guns, toy/replica weapons, squirt bottles, soap bottles, balloons, brooms, skateboards, roller blades or skates.
- Handheld radios and televisions are allowed as long as guests listen with an earpiece or headphones. Guests should be considerate of their neighbors when using these devices.
- Outside food and beverages are not permitted inside the stadium. Concession stands are conveniently located on both sides of the concourse for your food and beverage needs.
- All fans must comply with requests from stadium staff regarding stadium policies and emergency response procedures. Be safe. Have fun!


