This will be my third year as the broadcast voice of the Blue Wahoos, and it'll be tough to top the last two seasons.

In 2022, the Blue Wahoos won a first half title and, despite losing game one of each of their playoff rounds, rallied with their backs against the wall to claim a Southern League Championship.

Last year, the Blue Wahoos pitched, hit and ran their way to the best regular-season record in franchise history. Another postseason run followed, with a Division Series win over Montgomery followed by a hard-fought loss to a talented Tennessee team in the championship.

Even better, the Blue Wahoos saw eight former players make their MLB debuts and even more make an impact at the big league level. Luis Arraez, who played for the Blue Wahoos as a Twins prospect in 2019, won his second consecutive batting title as our MLB affiliate in Miami reached the playoffs for the first time in a full season since 2003.

What's in store for 2024? The Blue Wahoos will be bringing back most of the team that made so many memories last summer. The Marlins, with more and more Pensacola alumni on their roster with each passing year, hope to return to the playoffs as well.

Capt. Terrence M. “Village” Shashaty is a native of Brooklyn, New York. A 1998 graduate of the U.S. Naval Academy where he earned a Bachelor of Science in Economics, Shashaty also received a Master of Arts in National Security and Strategic Studies and was selected as one of four U.S. officers enrolled in the Naval Staff College, the U.S. Naval War College’s program for mid-grade international naval officers representing 39 countries from across the globe.

His accomplishments include recognition as Commander, Electronic Attack Wing, Pacific’s LSO of the Year for 2005 and Commander, Naval Air Force’s LSO of the Year for 2009.

Shashaty assumed command of NAS Pensacola on January 13, 2022. He has accumulated more than 2,700 total hours flying the EA-6B, F/A-18E/F and EA-18G with more than 400 combat hours in support of Operations Southern Watch, Enduring Freedom, Iraqi Freedom and New Dawn.

Shashaty has totaled more than 500 arrested landings on seven different aircraft carriers and has received multiple individual and campaign awards including the Defense Meritorious Service Medal (2 awards), Meritorious Service Medal and Strike/Flight Air Medal (3 awards).

Throughout Minor League Baseball, the operations staff and coaches of teams are normally in a state of frequent change.

But the guy directing from the dugout for the Pensacola Blue Wahoos is an exception.

Kevin Randel is the rare fixture.

The California native and North Carolina coastal resident has never left the Marlins organization since being drafted in 2002 as a versatile infielder from Long Beach State University.

Best known by his nickname of "Smoke," Randel has spent his entire playing and coaching career for the Marlins. No one within the coaching development side of the organization has been there longer.

"I'm going on my eighth year now (within the Marlins organization) and I thought I've been around for awhile, but then there's Kevin," said Hector Crespo, laughing, the Marlins director of minor league operations. "Smoke is great. Smoke's special.

"But he is a guy who is just an organizational guy who loves this club, and wants to be around it and wants to be part of helping to make us great."

And when it comes to a destination with the Marlins minor league system, there's no place Randel would rather be than in Pensacola.

He has been as comfortable living here as he is competitive when it comes to team performance. He loves all things Pensacola.

"It's one of those things where Pensacola is a real gem," said Randel, taking a break from his 12-hour days during Marlins spring training in March to share thoughts. "Pensacola is a great place to play. The fans are obviously incredible. The field is incredible.

"The town is incredible. Great atmosphere we play in. A great environment. I like coming to the field every day to work."

ON THE WATER

And win.

In the three seasons the Blue Wahoos have been a Miami Marlins affiliate, Randel has taken this team, this franchise, to record heights. The Blue Wahoos won the 2022 Southern League championship, their first outright title, topping the co-championship they won in 2017 while a Cincinnati Reds affiliate.

Randel, 42, then led the Blue Wahoos to their best single-season winning percentage in 2023, which included a runaway first-place finish in the first half of the Southern League South Division and another playoff trip – the Blue Wahoos' seventh in eight seasons across three affiliations.

The Blue Wahoos beat the Montgomery Biscuits for a second straight year in the divisional series to advance into the championship round, but were defeated in a rematch with the formidable Tennessee Smokies. The Chicago Cubs affiliate had a lineup featuring six of the game's top 75 rated prospects ranked by MLB.com.

"Last year was great. Coming out of the gate, it took us a little while to settle in, but once we did, that first half club was really good," Randel said. "We took that first half and ran with it. We had a decent second half.

"And taking two games from Montgomery like we did gave us some hope (to repeat as league champs), but that Tennessee club ... they were pretty good and they had our number, but overall it was such a good year. A lot of good things, lot of records set. A lot of special accomplishments by a lot of guys."

Randel was named the Southern League Manager of the Year, his first time receiving that award. He was honored in February at the Pensacola Sports Awards Banquet for a special achievement.

He then was named manager of Miami's team of prospects for the inaugural MLB Spring Breakout game March 15, won by the Marlins 3-2 against the St. Louis Cardinals prospects team. In that game, five Blue Wahoos were in the lineup, including Griffin Conine, the top player in that game.

Just as he did the past two years, however, Randel was most looking forward to being at his clubhouse office on April 1 at Blue Wahoos Stadium in a community and fan base he feels most comfortable connecting with each day.

"It's great, because you get to see the season ticket holders again that I know well," he said. "They are there every day, and over the years, I have gotten to know them.

"It's obviously comfortable coming back, going on four years now. A place where you play that brings great comfort. It's always one of our goals as a staff to win and develop players, and when you can do it year after year, all the better.

"It is really great for our organization, but it's even better for the town. Just knowing (Blue Wahoos fans) have a winning product on the field that they get to watch every night is something we strive for."

While the season can be a grind, Randel said the days in spring training are often longer.



A typical day at the Marlins spring training complex in Jupiter, located just north of West Palm Beach, is described as a 12-hour experience that begins with a 5 or 5:30 a.m. wakeup alarm, then departure from the team's hotel at 6:30 a.m., following by staff and player meetings, pregame workouts on the field, a 1 p.m. game, post-game review and then departure from the stadium in Jupiter between 5 or 6 p.m.

"They are full days," Randel said. "They try to limit the time for the players, because obviously, everyone has a full season of games ahead, but for the staff it's a full day."

It's also a long time each season away from his family. His wife, Lindsey, and 3-year-old son often visit in Pensacola, but his wife maintains the family's home in Carolina Beach, North Carolina, where the Randels have lived for the past several years in the offseason.

Randel uses the five months away from baseball to spend full days with his wife and son and make sure the quality time well-spent not thinking about baseball. He is able to turn off the manager mode during that time and recharge for the long slog of a baseball season.

When he hands in his first Blue Wahoos lineup card of 2024, he will be weeks away from passing Pat Kelly for the most managerial wins in franchise history. It'll be one more accolade for someone who has already won a minor league championship as a player, coach and manager within the Marlins organization.

"He has a lot of attributes that merge well with being a really good manager," Crespo said. "His communication style is really impactful. He holds guys accountable, but he also lets guys be themselves."

"He encourages guys when they are in the clubhouse, when they are on the field to have fun and be themselves. "He makes sure guys putting in their work, but he keeps it light. His communication side is what stands out to me.. The conversations he has with players, he can really relate to them."

He led the Tampa Bay Buccaneers to a Super Bowl title in 2003, was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2014, and joined the Blue Wahoos as an owner in 2018.

DANA SUSKIND is a professor of Surgery and Pediatrics at the University of Chicago Medical Center and the co-founder and co-director of the Thirty Million Words Center for Early Learning. She is a popular author and is devoted to treating children born with hearing loss.

JOHN LIST is an economist at the University of Chicago. The author of over 200 academic publications, he was a finalist for the Nobel Prize in economics in 2015 and is co-founder of the Thirty Million Words Center for Early Learning with Dana Suskind.

KAZOO'S READING PROGRAM

The excited school children at historic Rosinton Elementary School, which opened 105 years ago in Robertsedale, Alabama, didn't need an introduction or explanation of the special guests.

They knew Kazoo. They knew who the Blue Wahoos were.

It was among many special moments on the latest edition of Kazoo's Reading Program, which has made whistlestops at 27 schools in four area counties through March and impacted tens of thousands of grade school kids with an incentive to further reading skills.

The one at Rosinton carried its own significance, given the school's legacy.

"It was so cool. We walked in and they knew exactly who it was," said Jessica Voigt, a group sales trainee for the Blue Wahoos who has connected with kids on her stops as the book reader and assembly leader. "The reaction was, 'Oh my gosh! The Blue Wahoos!'"

"They had such great energy. And sometimes you wouldn't think going a distance away like that (Robertsedale is about 40 miles from downtown Pensacola), they would know the Blue Wahoos, but they did."

That aspect is one of several gratifying elements with the reading program. With mascot Kazoo acting out the part,

the children are read a short, illustrated book entitled, "Kazoo Makes The Team." When it's over, the children at each school are informed about their chance to hit a home run. Each child who reads four books at their reading level, and gets the assignment certified by their teacher or principal, receives a free ticket to a Blue Wahoos game.

The four designated home games are April 7, April 28, May 12 and May 26. Each game will feature a pregame parade of students who completed the task. The reading program is presented by Nationwide, one of the corporate partners in Major League Baseball and Minor League Baseball.



"I think when we go into the schools, the kids are always really excited to see Kazoo, obviously, and then to hear about having a chance to come to a Blue Wahoos game for free gets a reaction," said Emily Mann, the Blue Wahoos group sales and community relations

manager, who has coordinated the entire reading program and mapped out the visits.

"Not every child has a chance to do something like that and it really helps meet our mission of improving the quality of life to the families we serve,"



Mann said. "When your child can read four books and get a free ticket, it makes it a lot more comfortable for a lot of families to be on board."

Mann, Voigt and Kazoo have been joined by Blue Wahoos broadcaster and media relations director Erik Bremer on most of these school visits. The program has traveled to schools in Okaloosa, Santa Rosa, Escambia County, as well as Baldwin County across the state line in Alabama.

The team has been able to deliver 30,000 bookmarks to school children and administrators for the program. This is well more than double the amount a year ago.

"It has been super cool, because the kids go crazy, and they are screaming and everything like that, and you have to give them a minute to calm down, so they definitely get excited about it," Mann said. "But I also think encouraging reading in our schools is the main thing."

"Literacy is an initiative that is a big part within our whole company. With the Studer Community Institute, it starts with the early brain initiative when moms are in the hospital. It is a big thing within the Studer Family of Companies."

"The Kazoo Reading Program is able to help and to help kids from all different backgrounds, all different walks of life, get an opportunity to come to a Blue Wahoos game free with their friends."

The first school visit of 2024 was in early January at Ferry Pass Elementary in Pensacola. That trip coincided with the Blue Wahoos' "Fish Fest" preseason event, which included two players – third baseman Jacob Berry and pitcher Ike Buxton. Those two tagged along and helped read to the kids and sign autographs.

At a visit to James E. Plew Elementary School in Niceville, located 70 miles from Blue Wahoos Stadium, there was such adulation for Kazoo that the mascot signed more than 30 autographs for kids.

At A.K. Suter Elementary in Pensacola, it was an outdoor assembly and the entire school emptied to listen to the Kazoo's Reading Program.

When the Blue Wahoos host on April 2-3 the Monterrey Sultanes, a team in the Mexican Professional League, the players on that team will visit a local school and read in Spanish along with an interpretation in English.

"It has been special to see just how well-known the Blue Wahoos are," Mann said. "A lot of these kids do know who we are, regardless of how far we are from downtown Pensacola. And it reiterates to me the good that we are doing within our organization."

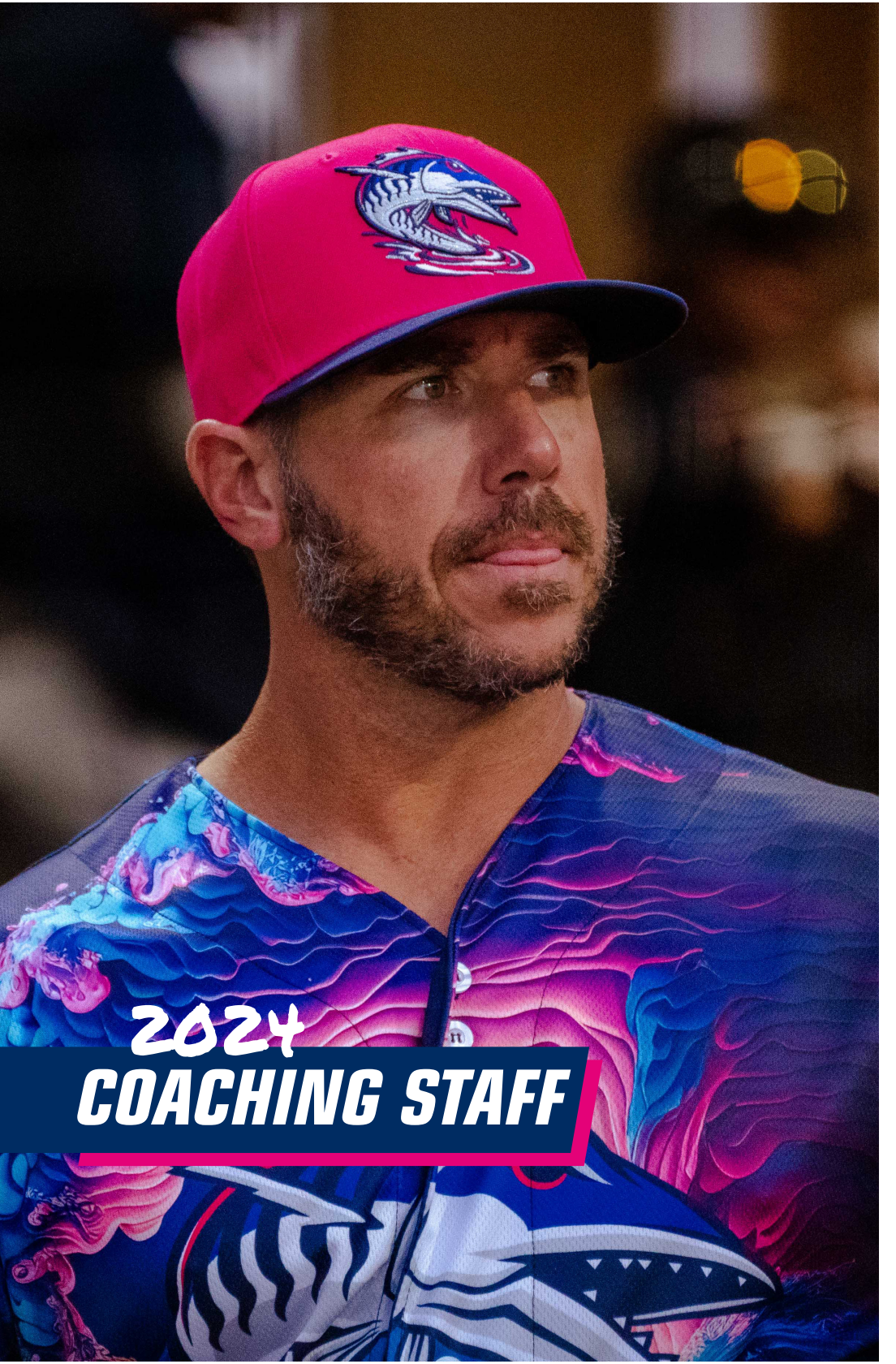

COACHING STAFF



Kevin Randel *Manager*

Kevin Randel has coached in the Marlins organization since 2010. A 13th round selection in the 2002 MLB Draft, Randel played eight seasons in the Marlins farm system, reaching the Triple-A level. From 2010-2014, he served as a hitting coach before becoming a manager in 2015. Since, he's racked up over 300 wins managing at the A, A+, and AA levels. 2024 marks his fourth season managing the Pensacola Blue Wahoos, the most in franchise history.



Jason Krizan *Hitting Coach*

Jason Krizan joins the Blue Wahoos for his first season in 2024 after spending 2023 as the hitting coach for High-A Winston-Salem in the Chicago White Sox organization. Selected by the Detroit Tigers in the 8th round of the 2011 Draft out of Dallas Baptist University, he was a First-Team All-American in his senior season. After an 11-year minor league career in the Tigers, Mets and Giants organizations, he made his MLB debut for San Francisco in 2022.



Jerad Eickhoff *Pitching Coach*

Jerad Eickhoff joins the Blue Wahoos for his first season in 2024 after a seven-year MLB career that included time with the Philadelphia Phillies (2015-19), New York Mets (2021) and Pittsburgh Pirates (2022). Selected in the 15th round of the 2011 Draft by the Texas Rangers, he also spent time in the Padres and Guardians organizations, finishing his career with Triple-A Columbus in 2023.



Danny Black *Defensive Coach*

Entering its 13th season, Blue Wahoos Stadium is widely considered one of the premier facilities in Minor League Baseball. Recently named the Best Ballpark in Double-A by Ballpark Digest, the stadium has established itself as one of the best places to enjoy a Minor League Baseball game in the country. A three-time recipient of the Southern League Ballpark of the Year, Blue Wahoos Stadium welcomed over two million fans in its first eight seasons, finishing first or second in the league in attendance five times.



With a capacity of 5,038 fans, Blue Wahoos Stadium is the smallest in the Southern League, allowing fans to get closer to the action than any other park in the league. Nestled alongside the water in Pensacola's Community Maritime Park, the field provides unbeatable views of the Pensacola Bay. The playing surface at Blue Wahoos Stadium was officially named Admiral Fetterman Field in 2015 in honor of the late Admiral Jack Fetterman, who was instrumental in the creation of Community Maritime Park for the Pensacola community.

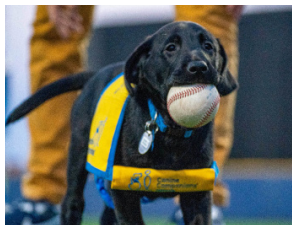

Honoring Admiral Fetterman

On September 23, 2015, the field at Blue Wahoos Stadium was officially renamed Admiral Jack Fetterman Field. It honors the memory of Fetterman, a three-star Vice Admiral in the U.S. Navy who retired in Pensacola and became a prominent civic leader, dedicating himself, alongside his wife Nancy, to preserving Pensacola's history.

A strong advocate for the construction of Maritime Community Park and Blue Wahoos Stadium, Fetterman passed away on March 24, 2006 at the age of 74 and was never able to see his vision of a waterfront stadium become reality. Although he never watched the Wahoos play at the ballpark, his memory is honored at each game played on the field bearing his name.

As you enjoy today's game at Blue Wahoos Stadium, please take a moment in your own way to thank Admiral Fetterman for his contributions to the city of Pensacola and the United States military.

A Pennsylvania native, Fetterman graduated from college in 1954 and enlisted in the U.S. Navy. He made his first trip to Pensacola soon after to attend the Aviation Officer Candidate School at Naval Air Station Pensacola.

He rose in rank and was appointed Rear Admiral and then Vice Admiral, assuming command duties of the U.S. Naval Air Force Pacific Fleet in San Diego, a capacity he served in until 1990.

In 1991, Fetterman returned to Pensacola where his Naval career began and assumed duties as Chief of Naval Education and Training before retiring from active duty in 1993. During his illustrious Naval career, he formulated and produced the Core Values Training program, earning him the title of "Father of Navy Ethics."

He then became president and CEO of the National Naval Aviation Museum at NAS-Pensacola. Under his leadership, the museum grew in capacity and scope, making the facility one of the largest air and space museums in the world.

In addition to his work at NAS-Pensacola and with other U.S. Navy roles, Fetterman served his community in roles that included being Chairman of the Pensacola Mayor Community Core Values Board. He was also Chairman of the Pensacola Chamber of Commerce.

The Blue Wahoos are proud to honor Fetterman's service to our nation, along with his legacy and efforts to make Pensacola the greatest place to live on earth.

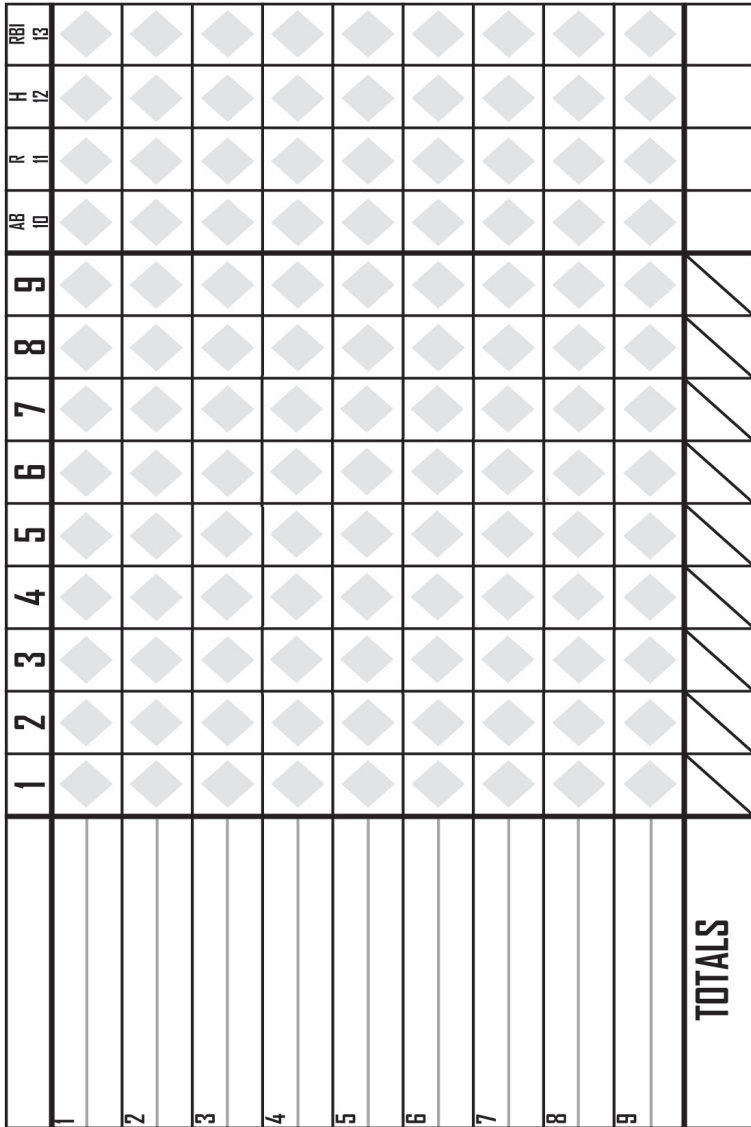

LIVING THE WAHOOS LIFE

In March, Blue Wahoos senior writer Bill Vilona celebrated a major accomplishment: The publication of his first book.

I spent most free moments during the end of the 2022 season, which turned out to be the team’s Southern League Championship run, writing the book. We added a chapter on the 2022 team, so I finished the book in mid-October.

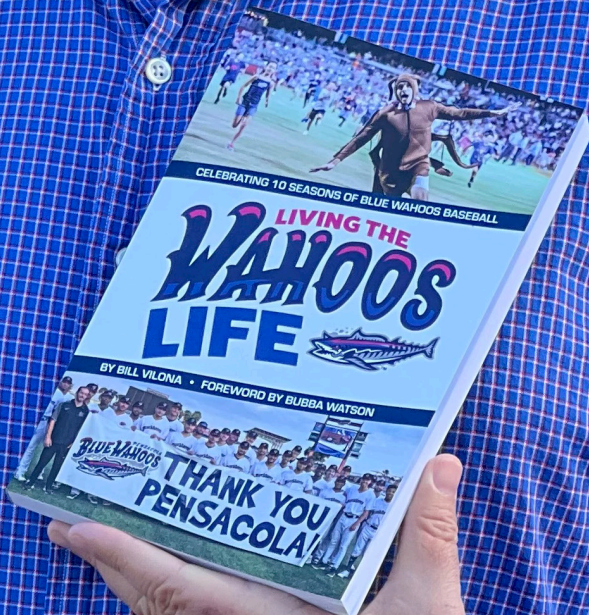

My former colleagues at the Pensacola News Journal, namely Gregg Pachkowski,

Toni Giberson and Lisa Nellesen Savage, were generous in providing photos and story files. Without the PNJ, this book would have been so difficult to produce.

EB: What were some of the challenges of telling the complete story of the Blue Wahoos in just 200 pages?

BV: There were tough choices of what to include and what to omit. And when I finished the book, some moments or topics came to mind that I wished I could have included. But a 200-page book is a good size for a paperback, so I tried my best to define the signature moments on and off the field for each season. What made this particular year different, or noteworthy?



My experience as a newspaper writer for nearly 40 years was a big factor in being able to narrow the focus. If you only have 500 words to write a newspaper story, then you have to decide the most important parts of the story to tell.

EB: After writing column-length stories in your career as a reporter, how did you enjoy writing longform content?

BV: It's fun. The same enjoyment you get from finishing a story on a great game, or a feature on a great athlete, is the same element that applies in doing a book. Ultimately, you are trying to tell a story. In this case, a story with multiple chapters and scope.

The biggest difference is the time element. You have a hard deadline after a game to get something done as fast as possible, or a feature story completed by a certain time of day. This is so different because of the volume of content you are trying to

create while still doing other things in your job.

EB: Which stories were most fun to rediscover and revisit?

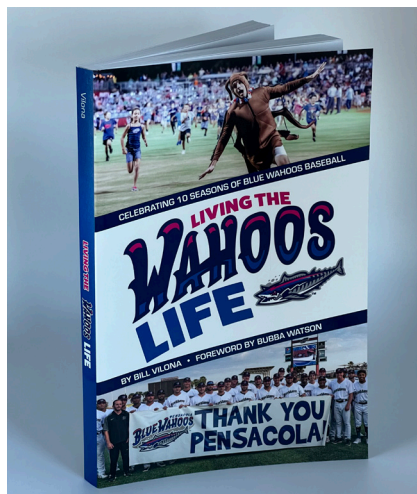
BV: Opening night of the inaugural 2012 season is a moment in my life I will never forget. I remember being in the press box that night and standing on the concourse almost in disbelief that this was happening in Pensacola. And that it was happening on once-abandoned, neglected, much-debated property.

The Olympics, the Masters, a Super Bowl, national championship football games - those are special too, but this is something that happened here in Pensacola where I have spent so much of my life after moving here in 1987. And then that season was filled with special moments, like a combined no-hitter and Billy Hamilton's minor league stolen base record.

The others that stand out were the two championships, especially the 2017 co-championship season that was capped with a series-clinching win at Blue Wahoos Stadium.

EB: The book concludes with a Southern League Championship at the end of the 2022 season, marking the end of the 10th season in team history. What would you have written about the 2023 season if it had been included?

BV: It would have been two-fold. Off the field, we had an awesome season with fan experience and bringing new



promotions to the stadium. We were able to duplicate financial success from the breakthrough season of 2022, which was the first one that truly felt normal after two years dealing with the ongoing issues of COVID.

On the field, the team was special. There was so much roster movement, yet the team set record with winning percentage, homers and run production. They ran away with the first half title, then reached the championship series in a rematch with the Tennessee Smokies. When a team is able to repeat in reaching a championship series, that is a feat to appreciate even though it didn't end with a title.

EB: What has the response been from the season ticket members that received a free advance copy?

BV: Very positive, which is gratifying. There are elements of the team's history I know I may have missed and more stories I would have liked to tell, but I am glad we were able to deliver on our main intention to provide a book on the team's first decade and give season ticket members a special gift. Without our season ticket members and their loyalty, the fan experience at this stadium and success of this franchise would not be possible.

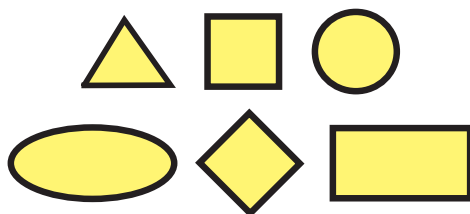

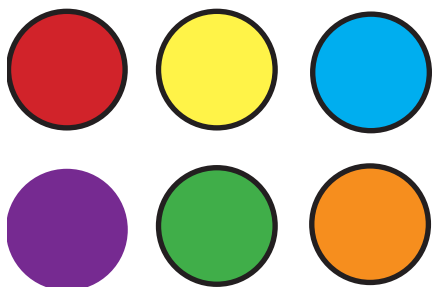

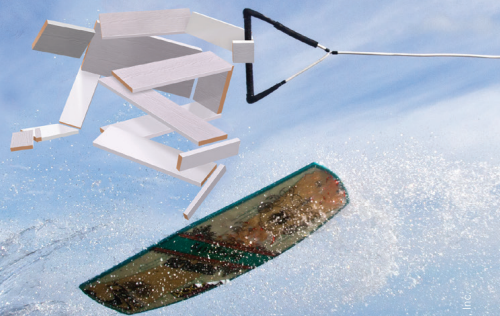

BALLPARK RULES

We want every game at Blue Wahoos Stadium to be an enjoyable and memorable experience for every fan. To make that possible, the following rules are enforced.

- Foul/abusive language and/or rowdy behavior will not be tolerated and will be cause for ejection and/or arrest. Violators may also have their season tickets revoked. Notify the nearest guest services or safety/security representative immediately if actions of this type occur near you.
- The use of derogatory language, which is defined as offensive language concerning another person's race, ethnicity, gender, religion, disability, age, sexual orientation, or national origin is cause for immediate ejection from the stadium without a refund and could result in future ticket loss.
- By Major League Baseball rule, bags are not permitted in the stadium. Diaper bags, medical bags, and small purses are allowed.
- Entering the playing field without authorization or throwing objects onto the field is a violation of ballpark rules and may be hazardous. Offenders will be ejected and subject to arrest and prosecution.
- All tobacco and electronic cigarettes are prohibited in Blue Wahoos Stadium which includes the seating sections, concourses, and stairwells.
- Keep aisles clear at all times; emergency situations require that stairways be kept clear. Guests sitting or standing in the ballpark aisles jeopardize the safety of others.
- For your safety and the safety of those around you, please sit in your assigned seat to avoid inconveniencing other guests.
- Drunk and disorderly behavior as well as violation of any alcohol policy will result in ejections from the ballpark without a refund and could result in the loss of season tickets. Underage consumption and the excessive consumption of alcohol is strictly prohibited.
- Umbrellas are allowed in the stadium. Please be courteous of those around you when using an umbrella.
- The Blue Wahoos ask that no one solicit contributions or distribute literature on stadium property without written approval of the team.
- Flags and banners without poles are permitted. Flags must be event related and may not cover any ballpark signage. All flags or banners deemed inappropriate by stadium management are subject to removal.
- Gates will open 60 minutes (1 hour) prior to the start of the game for admission into the stadium. We strongly encourage guests to enter the stadium as early as possible to avoid delays.
- All guests entering the stadium are subject to search. Refusal may be grounds to prohibit admission.
- The following items are prohibited from entering the stadium: bottles, cans, coolers, containers, fireworks, flares, pets or animals of any kind (with the exception of service animals), weapons, water guns, toy/replica weapons, squirt bottles, soap bottles, balloons, brooms, skateboards, roller blades or skates.
- Handheld radios and televisions are allowed as long as guests listen with an earpiece or headphones. Guests should be considerate of their neighbors when using these devices.
- Outside food and beverages are not permitted inside the stadium. Concession stands are conveniently located on both sides of the concourse for your food and beverage needs.
- All fans must comply with requests from stadium staff regarding stadium policies and emergency response procedures. Be safe. Have fun!
