

Nasim Nuñez tried to stay grounded while floating on Cloud Nine.

He stepped into the batter's box on July 8 at T-Mobile Park in Seattle, one of the Blue Wahoos' two representatives in the 24th annual SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game, trying to keep the magnitude of the moment in check.

"That's why I looked at the dirt," said Nuñez, speaking to media representatives covering the game that day. "So I know where my feet are."

The next thing Nuñez knew, he was standing on second base after rifling a sixthinning pitch from Toronto Blue Jays prospect Yosver Zuelueta down the third base line and into the corner for a three-run double, which helped power the National League stars to a 5-0 win at the home of the Seattle Mariners.

Nuñez followed the double by stealing third base. He then helped turn a gameending double-play for Blue Wahoos teammate Patrick Monteverde, the final pitcher for the National League stars in the game.

It earned Nuñez the Larry Doby Award as the game's most valuable player, highlighting a big weekend for the Blue Wahoos duo, who are two of the Miami Marlins' Top 30 prospects. Nuñez became the first Marlins prospect in team history to win the Futures Game MVP award.

"What a day, what a game, what a moment for him," Monteverde said. "Much deserved."

"MVP never crossed my mind until I got in the dugout and people started talking that talk like, 'You're MVP!" Nuñez said to media members that day in Seattle. "I was like, 'All right, all right, all right. Chill.'

"I wouldn't say it's a shock, but like, wow. Last year I really wanted to come pretty bad (to the Futures Game), but I didn't get selected. This year I (decided) I wasn't

going to focus on it. I am just going to play my game and work on my development.

"When my (Blue Wahoos) coaches told me I was coming, I was like, that's crazy. It's an honor and something I worked for."

Nuñez and Monteverde's participation in the prelude event to the annual MLB All-Star Game continued an impressive connection for the Blue Wahoos.

It was the third time in Blue Wahoos history – twice now in three seasons – the team had two players in the Futures Game. In 2021 it was pitchers Max Meyer and Jake Eder.

A year ago, it was pitcher Eury Pérez, who this season became a overnight sensation in Major League Baseball after his early success with Marlins.

"I took the advice that was given to me before the game and looked around the stadium, looked at the sky, looked at the dirt, looked at everything and I took it all in," Nuñez said. "It was just amazing. Everything you could really dream of.

"When I went up to the plate, it was just a regular at-bat. I did my breathing on deck, focused, picked up the ball out of the hand and was just ready to hit the ball. I think the first pitch he called a strike on me was a ball, but he threw it in the same spot and I swung this time and I got a double."

Nuñez, a native of the Bronx, New York City, was a second-round pick by the Marlins in the 2019 MLB Draft. He's in his fifth season in professional baseball. Monteverde, a Pittsburgh native, was an eighth-round pick by the Marlins in 2021 from Texas Tech, where he transferred to play one season and build his draft status. Monteverde did not have any NCAA Division 1 collegiate offers coming out of high school, but has been on a steady rise in his career since that time.

"It's pretty surreal," Monteverde said that day about playing in the game. "First and foremost, just the opportunity (to play). I am so thankful and blessed to be part of it. Especially to be joined by a teammate like (Nuñez). It's meeting everybody, meeting all the guys, it's special.


"It's been a long ride to get here. But I am very thankful."

Nuñez entered the Futures Game and the MLB All-Star break in mid-July with 33 stolen bases in 36 opportunities and led the Blue Wahoos with 48 walks. He was second in runs scored. He played a big role in the Blue Wahoos' post-season success last year, which resulted in the team's first outright Southern League championship.

Following the game, Nuñez was joined on the field by former Mariners superstar Ken Griffey Jr., who presented him the Larry Doby MVP award.

"It was really cool," Nuñez said. "I met Ken when I was 17 at the MLB Breakthrough Series. "As soon as I saw him I said, 'Do you





remember me?' He made me take off my hat, then he remembered me."

"The bigger the stage, the bigger (Nuñez) gets; he knows how to come up clutch," Monteverde said to media in Seattle after the game. "He plays his game and sticks true to himself. He's as confident in himself without being cocky or in an arrogant way as possible."

Monteverde became one of the Marlins' most pleasing success stories this season. In mid-July, he led the Southern League in wins (eight), ERA (1.93), and batting average against (.185).

Monteverde has since been promoted to Triple-A Jacksonville, while Nuñez remains in Pensacola for the home stretch of the 2023 season. For both, the future is bright.

He led the Tampa Bay Buccaneers to a Super Bowl title in 2003, was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2014, and joined the Blue Wahoos as an owner in 2018.

DANA SUSKIND is a professor of Surgery and Pediatrics at the University of Chicago Medical Center and the co-founder and co-director of the Thirty Million Words Center for Early Learning. She is a popular author and is devoted to treating children born with hearing loss.

JOHN LIST is an economist at the University of Chicago. The author of over 200 academic publications, he was a finalist for the Nobel Prize in economics in 2015 and is co-founder of the Thirty Million Words Center for Early Learning with Dana Suskind.

SALUTE TUSERVICE

The final two months of the Blue Wahoos home schedule includes some of the most special events in team history.

The grandest is on Friday, August 18, when the Blue Wahoos will make baseball history by honoring legend Ted Williams, his connection with Naval Air Station Pensacola, and his World War II tour of duty to become a U.S. Marine Corps pilot.

As part of Salute To Service Night at Blue Wahoos Stadium, the first 1,000 fans will receive a Ted Williams bobblehead, designed in the Bronson Bombers uniform that Williams wore while stationed at Bronson Field. It was then an auxiliary base to NAS Pensacola where Williams trained to be a Marine pilot.

The bobblehead will be sponsored by the National Naval Aviation Museum, which earlier this year opened back to the public at NAS Pensacola.

The Blue Wahoos players will be wearing specially-created uniforms that night which honor all branches of the U.S. Armed Forces.

Williams was part of an all-star team at Bronson Field which included other Major League Baseball players in the service from 1942-1945 when they paused baseball careers to serve the nation during World War II. Williams then returned to NAS Pensacola for a separate tour of duty as a Navy aviator in 1952-53 during the Korean War.

"We will become the only team to ever

feature Ted Williams in his authentic U.S. Navy uniform on a bobblehead," said Anthony Aspenson, the Blue Wahoos vice president of creative services and communication. "Obviously, the Boston Red Sox have presented a Ted Williams bobblehead, along with the Texas Rangers where he coached a brief time.

"And the Lowell (Mass.) Spinners had a Ted Williams bobblehead in a flight jacket and airplane, but no one has put Ted Williams in his Navy baseball uniform," Aspenson said.

To make this night happen, the Blue Wahoos gained approval from the Ted Williams family, the Ted Williams Foundation, Major League Baseball, NAS Pensacola, the U.S. Navy and the Department of Defense.



It required specific approval from each entity to be able to put together the Aug. 18 night. The Blue Wahoos will be playing the Montgomery Biscuits as part of the homestand.

The Salute To Service Night will honor

each of the branches of the U.S. Armed Forces with connections to Pensacola. The Army, Marines, Air Force and Coast Guard all have a presence in Pensacola, along with the Navy. NAS Pensacola commanding officer Capt. Terry Shashaty will throw out a ceremonial first pitch.



"The Ted Williams family and foundation has been very gracious to allow us to use his name, his likeness," Aspenson said. "They like how it looked when we did a mock-up of the bobblehead. It honors his baseball, his military. And then we made sure we got the approval of the Navy, the DOD (Department of Defense) and MLB before we moved forward."

The Boston Red Sox aided in getting the Blue Wahoos in touch with the Ted Williams Foundation and family.

"We are very thankful for all the help and support we received from everyone involved in this night," Aspenson said. "And everyone has been great in making sure we're doing this the right way."

The special evening on Aug. 18 is part of a final portion of the schedule that begins in August with Star Wars Night on Aug. 4. On that night, the team will wear Star Wars uniforms that will be auctioned to benefit the Studer Community Institute and the center's

Early Brain Development program for infants.

On August 5, the Blue Wahoos will have CivicCon Night to recognize all the work done by CivicCon, which is organized within the SCI in partnership with the Pensacola News Journal.

September will begin with a Eury Pérez Bobblehead Night on Sept. 1 to honor the Miami Marlins rookie phenom pitcher, who spent 2022 and part of the 2023 season wowing Blue Wahoos fans with his wonderous talent. Pérez spent several weeks in July back with the Blue Wahoos to continue training and resting his arm before rejoining the Marlins.

The Blue Wahoos will have their second Women In Sports Night on Sept. 3 featuring University of West Florida, Pensacola State College and Pensacola Christian College female athletes and coaches to discuss the impact women have played in the sports world.

The Salute To Service Night, however, is a special showcase that continues the Blue Wahoos relationship with NAS Pensacola. The team created a large mural honoring the special, wartime baseball history at the base that is visible to fans as they walk up the staircase from the main gate entrance. Images of Ted Williams are part of that mural. A replica plane of the one Williams used while in training during World War II is part of the displays at the National Naval Aviation Museum.

"We're already planning how we are going to celebrate history next year," Aspenson said. "(NAS Pensacola) is so excited. That is the really cool part - how this relationship has developed."

Kevin Randel has coached in the Marlins organization since 2010. A 13th round selection in the 2002 MLB Draft, Randel played eight seasons in the Marlins farm system, reaching the Triple-A level. After retiring following the 2009 season, he quickly transitioned into coaching in the Marlins organization. From 2010-2014, he served as a hitting coach before becoming a manager in 2015. Since, he's racked up over 300 wins managing at the A, A+, and AA levels.



Matt Snyder Hitting Coach

Matt Snyder comes to Pensacola after two successful seasons as the hitting coach in High-A Beloit. A 10th round selection in the 2012 MLB Draft by the New York Yankees, Snyder played professionally through the 2019 season with Triple-A New Orleans in the Marlins organization. The three-time Minor League All-Star was named the Marlins Player Development Staff Member of the Year in 2022.



Dave Eiland Pitching Coach

Dave Eiland brings over two decades of MLB experience to Pensacola in his second season as the Blue Wahoos pitching coach. After pitching in the Major Leagues for 10 seasons with the Yankees, Padres, and Devil Rays, Eiland won World Series rings as a pitching coach with the Yankees (2009) and Royals (2015) during a career as an MLB coach that stretched from 2008-2019.



Danny Black Defensive Coach

Danny Black played six seasons in the Marlins minor league system from 2010 to 2015, including parts of four seasons for Double-A Jacksonville in the Southern League and parts of two seasons with Triple-A New Orleans. He began his coaching career in 2018 and has served in various roles since, including as an assistant coach for Advanced-A Jupiter from 2018-2019 and as a defensive coach for Triple-A Jacksonville in 2021 and the FCL Marlins in 2022.




Seth Gregorich Strength Coach




Melissa Hampton Athletic Trainer

BLUE WAHOOS STADIUM




Entering its 11th season, Blue Wahoos Stadium is widely considered one of the premier facilities in Minor League Baseball. Recently named the Best Ballpark in Double-A by Ballpark Digest, the stadium has established itself as one of the best places to enjoy a Minor League Baseball game in the country. A three-time recipient of the Southern League Ballpark of the Year, Blue Wahoos Stadium welcomed over two million fans in its first eight seasons, finishing first or second in the league in attendance five times.



With a capacity of 5,038 fans, Blue Wahoos Stadium is the smallest in the Southern League, allowing fans to get closer to the action than any other park in the league. Nestled alongside the water in Pensacola's Community Maritime Park, the field provides unbeatable views of the Pensacola Bay. The playing surface at Blue Wahoos Stadium was officially named Admiral Fetterman Field in 2015 in honor of the late Admiral Jack Fetterman, who was instrumental in the creation of Community Maritime Park for the Pensacola community.



Blue Wahoos Stadium and the surrounding Maritime Community Park were built to be used by the local community throughout the year, not just for Wahoos baseball games. Honoring Admiral Fetterman

On September 23, 2015, the field at Blue Wahoos Stadium was officially renamed Admiral Jack Fetterman Field. It honors the memory of Fetterman, a three-star Vice Admiral in the U.S. Navy who retired in Pensacola and became a prominent civic leader, dedicating himself, alongside his wife Nancy, to preserving Pensacola's history.

A strong advocate for the construction of Maritime Community Park and Blue Wahoos Stadium, Fetterman passed away on March 24, 2006 at the age of 74 and was never able to see his vision of a waterfront stadium become reality. Although he never watched the Wahoos play at the ballpark, his memory is honored at each game played on the field bearing his name.

As you enjoy today's game at Blue Wahoos Stadium, please take a moment in your own way to thank Admiral Fetterman for his contributions to the city of Pensacola and the United States military.

A Pennsylvania native, Fetterman graduated from college in 1954 and enlisted in the U.S. Navy. He made his first trip to Pensacola soon after to attend the Aviation Officer Candidate School at Naval Air Station Pensacola.

He rose in rank and was appointed Rear Admiral and then Vice Admiral, assuming command duties of the U.S. Naval Air Force Pacific Fleet in San Diego, a capacity he served in until 1990.

In 1991, Fetterman returned to Pensacola where his Naval career began and assumed duties as Chief of Naval Education and Training before retiring from active duty in 1993. During his illustrius Naval career, he formulated and produced the Core Values Training program, earning him the title of "Father of Navy Ethics."

He then became president and CEO of the National Naval Aviation Museum at NAS-Pensacola. Under his leadership, the museum grew in capacity and scope, making the facility one of the largest air and space museums in the world.

In addition to his work at NAS-Pensacola and with other U.S. Navy roles, Fetterman served his community in roles that included being Chairman of the Pensacola Mayor Community Core Values Board. He was also Chairman of the Pensacola Chamber of Commerce.

The Blue Wahoos are proud to honor Fetterman's service to our nation, along with his legacy and efforts to make Pensacola the greatest place to live on earth.



JAKE EDER

ROAD TO RECOVERY

Jake Eder had just walked the bases loaded with none out in the second inning of a July 5 start in Pensacola against the Biloxi Shuckers.

This was exactly one of those moments testing a pitcher's resolve. One that provides a gauge on progression from 22 months away from game competition.

"That's the mental game right there," said Eder, recalling the situation. "Being able to just stay relaxed. You just want to go pitch-to-pitch, and have a clear mind on doing one pitch at a time. That is competing."

That is also winning, which is what happened after Eder retired the next three batters in order. The Blue Wahoos went on to a 3-1 win that night. That inning, those pitches, were pivotal in the game.

It became another reflection point on Eder's long road back from two surgeries and different rehab procedures.

"It's been a long time," said Eder, 24, who was the Miami Marlins' fourthround draft pick in 2020 from Vanderbilt and is now the No. 5 prospect in the organization as rated by MLB Pipeline.

"It (had been) 22 months when I made my first rehab start in Jupiter (back in June) and to be able to get back out and feel the fans, feel the energy, get the adrenaline going and compete ... I have been waiting a long time to do that," Eder said.

"I am just going to keep building on it and get better each time."

The arduous path began when Eder injured his elbow during the 2021 season, after 15 starts in his first pro season with the Blue Wahoos. He burst on the scene with a trip to the MLB Futures Game alongside pitching teammate Max Meyer – the Marlins' top pick in 2020.

At that point, he was among the top pitchers in Minor League Baseball across all levels. Eder's 1.77 earned run average with 99 strikeouts against 27 walks created a buzzworthy reaction in baseball circles.



But the elbow injury that shut him down in July 2021 led to Tommy John surgery. About 18 months later, after Eder was healed and throwing again during spring training in March, he sustained a foot injury.

"He was ready to break camp with us and be in our (starting) rotation to start the season," said Blue Wahoos manager Kevin Randel. "And then the foot injury held him back and we had to wait for that to heal up, then have him ramp back up to get here."

Heading into a start on July 22 against the Rocket City Trash Pandas, the progression Eder has sought was noticeable. He was 1-1 in four prior appearances with a combined total of 10 runs allowed. 20 strikeouts and 11 walks.

"There are some things that need to be polished up a little bit," Randel said. "He needs to get the breaking ball going and a little bit better command of his fastball, but other than that, the velocity is there, the presence on the mound is there for sure.

"And he's a trooper out there. I love having him out there every six days. I love how he goes about his business on a daily basis."





Eder grew up in Boynton Beach, located just south of West Palm Beach. He was drafted in the 34th round coming out of high school back when the MLB draft had that many rounds - but made the wise choice to go to college, where he blossomed as a sophomore reliever for the Vanderbilt Commodores.

In his case, the Marlins and other MLB team believed he could be a starter. The 2020 season was suspended due to the initial outbreak of the coronavirus pandemic, so when the Marlins drafted him, it was with intention of being a starting pitcher.

During his time away from pitching in games. Eder said he was able to adjust to focus on injury recovery. He never doubted his array of pitches, his velocity and movement on his pitches would be altered by the twin rehab processes.

"All that time, I was working on the mental game the whole time. And especially to go through all that, the setbacks made me stronger and made me get through it," said Eder.

"I just went about it one day at a time. It was a long process with Tommy John (surgery) and the foot setback. To go through that and knowing where I want to be, taking it day by day, that's the biggest thing. I never had any arm setback during the rehab. My arm always felt good coming back.

"And when I started getting on the mound again, it felt good. I never had any (bad) thoughts like that. I kept visualizing throwing my pitches, executing them the way I wanted. It's a long process, but it's about staying focused and taking things day by day."

Eder credits the training staff in Jupiter at the Marlins Training Complex with helping him through the most difficult part of his rehab during the first six months from elbow surgery.

After four starts with the Blue Wahoos, he could see much of his pitches reacting the way he hoped. It's led to belief that Eder could have a shot to make a major league debut either late in the 2023 season or for the start of 2024.

"I am getting close to being where I thought I would be after spring training," he said. "So it's getting close. It is really building on each time getting the reps.

"It is something that is so drawn out, but I was able to never lose sight of the goal, staying focused and it was a great process for me. I learned a lot about myself."

We want every game at Blue Wahoos Stadium to be BALLDARK RULES an enjoyable and memorable experience for every fan. To make that possible, the following rules are

- Foul/abusive language and/or rowdy behavior will not be tolerated and will be cause for ejection and/or arrest. Violators may also have their season tickets revoked. Notify the nearest guest services or safety/security representative immediately if actions of this type occur near you.
- · The use of derogatory language, which is defined as offensive language concerning another person's race, ethnicity, gender, religion, disability, age, sexual orientation, or national origin is cause for immediate ejection from the stadium without a refund and could result in future ticket loss.
- · By Major League Baseball rule, bags are not permitted in the stadium. Diaper bags, medical bags, and small purses are allowed.
- Entering the playing field without authorization or throwing objects onto the field is a violation of ballpark rules and may be hazardous. Offenders will be ejected and subject to arrest and prosecution.
- All tobacco and electronic cigarettes are prohibited in Blue Wahoos Stadium which includes the seating sections, concourses, and stairwells.
- Keep aisles clear at all times; emergency situations require that stairways be kept clear. Guests sitting or standing in the ballpark aisles jeopardize the safety of others.
- For your safety and the safety of those around you, please sit in your assigned seat to avoid inconveniencing other guests.
- · Drunk and disorderly behavior as well as violation of any alcohol policy will result in ejections from the ballpark without a refund and could result in the loss of season tickets. Underage consumption and the excessive consumption of alcohol is strictly prohibited.
- Umbrellas are allowed in the stadium. Please be courteous of those around you when using an umbrella.
- The Blue Wahoos ask that no one solicit contributions or distribute literature on stadium property without written approval of the team.
- · Flags and banners without poles are permitted. Flags must be event related and may not cover any ballpark signage. All flags or banners deemed inappropriate by stadium management are subject to removal.
- · Gates will open 60 minutes (1 hour) prior to the start of the game for admission into the stadium. We strongly encourage guests to enter the stadium as early as possible to avoid delays.
- All guests entering the stadium are subject to search. Refusal may be grounds to prohibit admission.
- The following items are prohibited from entering the stadium: bottles, cans, coolers, containers, fireworks, flares, pets or animals of any kind (with the exception of service animals), weapons, water guns, toy/replica weapons, squirt bottles, soap bottles, balloons, brooms, skateboards, roller blades or skates.
- Handheld radios and televisions are allowed as long as quests listen with an earpiece or headphones. Guests should be considerate of their neighbors when using these devices.
- · Outside food and beverages are not permitted inside the stadium. Concession stands are conveniently located on both sides of the concourse for your food and beverage needs.
