

We saw a team-record 18 alumni make their Major League Baseball debuts. We had plenty of wins in the offseason, too. I'm either on the road or at the ballpark for most of the summer, so exploring our local beaches and restaurants was a great way to help pass the time as I waited for baseball to return. I also enjoyed working with the Pensacola Ice Flyers hockey team as we started up a local television broadcast for the first time.

As I settle in for my second season in Pensacola, there are plenty of reasons for excitement. For one, the bulk of last year's championship team should be returning to the Blue Wahoos to start this season. A combination of top Marlins prospects and role-playing fan favorites should bring a fun brand of baseball to the Panhandle. I'm also really looking forward to our jam-packed promotional and giveaway schedule. Keep an eye out for some new jerseys and logos, both on the field and in the GoTeez Bait and Tackle Team Store.

Blue Wahoos Stadium has gone cashless and digital!


In accordance with Major League Baseball facility requirements for Minor League ballparks, Blue Wahoos Stadium is a cashless and digital facility in 2023 and beyond!

To create a more efficient and secure payment environment, the Blue Wahoos box office, concessions, and team store will be cashless in 2023, accepting credit, debit, and gift cards. Select locations will process mobile tap-to-pay payments, and the StadiumDrop app will remain available, allowing fans to order food and beverages directly to their seat!

Got cash? That's okay! Cash can be exchanged at the box office and team store for a reloadable Blue Wahoos Gift Card that you can use all season long and add additional cash to whenever necessary!

With digital ticketing, fans can purchase their tickets, enter the stadium, and transfer their tickets with just a few taps on their cell phone without ever waiting in line or worrying about losing or forgetting their paper tickets.

CHANDS ARE BACK

SOUTHERN LEAGU CHAMPION 2022


The sky had melted into a colorful array, providing the fitting backdrop, as two charter buses with police escort arrived near sunset at Blue Wahoos Stadium.

As the crowd cheered and chanted, doors to the first bus opened. Blue Wahoos manager Kevin Randel popped out, hoisting the Southern League championship trophy.

The hardware was the exclamation on a 2022 season unlike any other in Pensacola's franchise history. The Blue Wahoos' 10th anniversary year ended with a first outright title. On this night, Sept. 29, the team returned from Kodak, Tennessee with the most coveted prize.

"It's almost like a movie script, so awesome," said Cobie Fletcher-Vance, whose go-ahead, grand-slam was the ignition on a 12-4 victory against the Tennessee Smokies in the deciding game of the Southern League championship series. "This is the first championship I've ever won in my life at any level."

A little more than six months later, the Blue Wahoos have embarked on their next decade.



"Excited to get going again," Randel said. "Coming off the year we had, we feel good about some of the guys we know we'll have back."

The Blue Wahoos attained the championship feat a half-year ago in a challenging way.

They won the first-half division race in July to guarantee a spot in the postseason. But by season's end, injuries, call-ups, and trades left the team with a very different lineup and roster than the one that had won the first half.

The team had a losing record in the second half and dropped five of the last six games to end the regular season. Entering the four-team playoffs, they were underdogs.

They lost Game 1 in the Southern League divisional series - a three-game series - against Montgomery. Needing to win Game 2 to stay alive, they fell behind 5-0 early.

But, as they had all season, the Blue Wahoos battled back and tied the game. Tied at 5 in the 8th inning, shortstop Nasim Nuñez, a late-season call-up from High-A Beloit, launched his first ever Double-A home run to give Pensacola 6-5 win and keep the season alive.

The following night, the Wahoos handed the ball to top prospect pitcher Dax Fulton, another late-season arrival, for just his fifth appearance at the Double-A level.

The big lefty was untouchable, throwing 6.0 shutout, one-hit innings and striking out 13.

The Blue Wahoos scored the game's only run in the 8th inning and handed the ball to closer Sean Reynolds, who had thrown 1.2 innings the night before. The first Montgomery batter hit a towering fly to right. J.D. Orr, Pensacola's fan-favorite, base-stealing outfielder,





caught it crashing into the fence. One out.

Reynolds struck out the next batter, but the following two hitters singled.

Montgomery's Jordan Qsar, a power hitter who drilled 17 homers during the season, stepped to the plate, worked the count full, and then drilled a high, arching ball to centerfield.

It looked like the season was lost. But, Blue Wahoos centerfielder Thomas Jones never gave up on the ball, making a highlight reel catch while slamming into the fence in straightaway center to send the Blue Wahoos to the championship.

Pandemonium broke loose at Blue Wahoos Stadium as the full team sprinted to the warning track to dogpile on Jones.

Just two days later, the team was in action again to face the North Division champs, the Tennessee Smokies. Tennessee took game one 4-1 at Blue Wahoos Stadium, meaning Pensacola would need to win two straight on the road to win the championship.

Trailing 1-0 late in game two, the game went from shut out to blow out as Pensacola scored seven times in the seventh inning.


The following day, the Blue Wahoos sent #1 Marlins prospect Eury Pérez, the youngest player in team history, to the mound to try and win the first solo championship in franchise history.

Pérez, just 19 years old, responded, striking out the first eight batters of the game.

Even with Pérez, the Wahoos trailed 3-2 in the fifth inning.

All season, the Blue Wahoos had been the kings of comeback victories. This game would be no exception.

Nuñez reached on an error to open the fifth. Catcher Will Banfield worked







a walk. The following batter struck out, but home run champ Griffin Conine worked a walk to load the bases.

In stepped Fletcher-Vance, the Gold Glove-caliber infielder. He'd homered just twice in the second half.

First pitch. Grand slam.

After Cobie's slam, the offense didn't stop. The Wahoos scored five more times and cruised to an 11-4 win. Champagne showers followed.

"Winning a championship is hard at any level," Randel said. "It's never easy. To win the last game of the season is always a great thing to accomplish.

"These guys never gave in. You preach to these guys, hey, 27 outs, play every single out. We had some great at-bats throughout. It was a memorable series."

The entire 2022 season was a celebration at Blue Wahoos Stadium as the team commemorated their 10th in downtown Pensacola.

It ended the best way an anniversary season could: with championship rings.

"It was a full year of winning," Randel said. "And it was great and it was fun to be around."

Randel has distinction of being with the Miami Marlins organization for his entire 21-year professional career.

"I can't say enough good things about Smoke and the way he goes about his business," said Hector Crespo, the Marlins director of minor league operations. "He is truly a luxury we have in the organization."

Randel, who lives in Carolina Beach, N.C. in the off-season has found a second home in Pensacola.

"Pensacola is the place to be," said Randel. "Coming back to Pensacola is going to be great. A lot of guys hope to get promotions after a championship, but for me, there is no place I would rather be than Pensacola. The fans in Pensacola are unbelievable. It is a great place to play."

When first introduced seven years ago as a "Homestand Special," the Cracker Jack Chicken and Waffles dish became uniquely Blue Wahoos.

In fact, just Google the name and it's all Blue Wahoos references.

Well, get ready. It's back. And now as a staple item that will be available for fans every game.

This delectable is part of nine new food items being unveiled at the stadium storefronts in April as the Blue Wahoos begin their next decade with the 2023 season.

From a blast from the past to other new items like an Ahi tuna melt, Cuban tacos, a two-bone ribs dish with fries and cole slaw and a southwest taco bowl salad in a tortilla shell, there are plenty of new items to choose from.

"We have a reputation for being creative, innovative and never sticking with status quo," said Blue Wahoos executive chef Travis Wilson, who returned to the stadium in 2019 and has been conjuring fan-favorite items with his staff each year.

"The flexibility of our menus is one of our biggest strengths, because we can change from homestand to homestand based on the freedom we've been given," Wilson said.

With that in mind, fans should consider these new items divided among the four

different storefronts at Blue Wahoos Stadium.

Cracker Jack Chicken and Waffles When introduced at a home series in 2016, the item won "Best New Concessions Item" from Venues Now. It is a pearl Belgian waffle, topped with fried chicken tenders and topped with honey mustard and Cracker Jack dust.

"We sold it in the stands in 2017 and it kinda took a little vacation and we are bringing it back," Wilson said. "It was very popular. I feel like I invented it and it's close to my heart. It incorporates sweet and spicy all together. We are going to serve at the Wheelhouse Diner, because it is a very dinerish dish."



Ahi Tuna Melt

Well-cooked Ahi tuna will become a fresh tuna salad sandwich with some cheese and tomato in a classic style way. This won't be canned tuna. It will be fresh.

Cuban Tacos

The same delicious ingredients in a pressed Cuban sandwich presented as a taco dish. Featuring Cuban mojo pork, crispy ham, Dijon mustard, with pico de gallo and queso on top.



Southwest Taco Bowl



Kevin Randel has coached in the Marlins organization since 2010. A 13th round selection in the 2002 MLB Draft, Randel played eight seasons in the Marlins farm system, reaching the Triple-A level. After retiring following the 2009 season, he quickly transitioned into coaching in the Marlins organization. From 2010-2014, he served as a hitting coach before becoming a manager in 2015. Since, he's racked up over 300 wins managing at the A, A+, and AA levels.

Matt Snyder Hitting Coach

Matt Snyder comes to Pensacola after two successful seasons as the hitting coach in High-A Beloit. A 10th round selection in the 2012 MLB Draft by the New York Yankees, Snyder played professionally through the 2019 season with Triple-A New Orleans in the Marlins organization. The three-time Minor League All-Star was named the Marlins Player Development Staff Member of the Year in 2022.







Dave Eiland Pitching Coach

Dave Eiland brings over two decades of MLB experience to Pensacola in his second season as the Blue Wahoos pitching coach. After pitching in the Major Leagues for 10 seasons with the Yankees, Padres, and Devil Rays, Eiland won World Series rings as a pitching coach with the Yankees (2009) and Royals (2015) during a career as an MLB coach that stretched from 2008-2019.

Danny Black Defensive Coach

Danny Black played six seasons in the Marlins minor league system from 2010 to 2015, including parts of four seasons for Double-A Jacksonville in the Southern League and parts of two seasons with Triple-A New Orleans. He began his coaching career in 2018 and has served in various roles since, including as an assistant coach for Advanced-A Jupiter from 2018-2019 and as a defensive coach for Triple-A Jacksonville in 2021 and the FCL Marlins in 2022.


Seth Gregorich Strength Coach




BLUE WAHOOS STADIUM

Entering its 11th season, Blue Wahoos Stadium is widely considered one of the premier facilities in Minor League Baseball. Recently named the Best Ballpark in Double-A by Ballpark Digest, the stadium has established itself as one of the best places to enjoy a Minor League Baseball game in the country. A three-time recipient of the Southern League Ballpark of the Year, Blue Wahoos Stadium welcomed over two million fans in its first eight seasons, finishing first or second in the league in attendance five times.

With a capacity of 5,038 fans, Blue Wahoos Stadium is the smallest in the Southern League, allowing fans to get closer to the action than any other park in the league. Nestled alongside the water in Pensacola's Community Maritime Park, the field provides unbeatable views of the Pensacola Bay. The playing surface at Blue Wahoos Stadium was officially named Admiral Fetterman Field in 2015 in honor of the late Admiral Jack Fetterman, who was instrumental in the creation of Community Maritime Park for the Pensacola community.

Blue Wahoos Stadium and the surrounding Maritime Community Park were built to be used by the local community throughout the year, not just for Wahoos baseball games. Each year, over 200 events are held at the ballpark throughout the year, making it truly a stadium for the entire community.

Honoring Admiral Fetterman

On September 23, 2015, the field at Blue Wahoos Stadium was officially renamed Admiral Jack Fetterman Field. It honors the memory of Fetterman, a three-star Vice Admiral in the U.S. Navy who retired in Pensacola and became a prominent civic leader, dedicating himself, alongside his wife Nancy, to preserving Pensacola's history.

A strong advocate for the construction of Maritime Community Park and Blue Wahoos Stadium, Fetterman passed away on March 24, 2006 at the age of 74 and was never able to see his vision of a waterfront stadium become reality. Although he never watched the Wahoos play at the ballpark, his memory is honored at each game played on the field bearing his name.

As you enjoy today's game at Blue Wahoos Stadium, please take a moment in your own way to thank Admiral Fetterman for his contributions to the city of Pensacola and the United States military.

A Pennsylvania native, Fetterman graduated from college in 1954 and enlisted in the U.S. Navy. He made his first trip to Pensacola soon after to attend the Aviation Officer Candidate School at Naval Air Station Pensacola.

He rose in rank and was appointed Rear Admiral and then Vice Admiral, assuming command duties of the U.S. Naval Air Force Pacific Fleet in San Diego, a capacity he served in until 1990.

In 1991, Fetterman returned to Pensacola where his Naval career began and assumed duties as Chief of Naval Education and Training before retiring from active duty in 1993. During his illustrius Naval career, he formulated and produced the Core Values Training program, earning him the title of "Father of Navy Ethics."

He then became president and CEO of the National Naval Aviation Museum at NAS-Pensacola. Under his leadership, the museum grew in capacity and scope, making the facility one of the largest air and space museums in the world.

In addition to his work at NAS-Pensacola and with other U.S. Navy roles, Fetterman served his community in roles that included being Chairman of the Pensacola Mayor Community Core Values Board. He was also Chairman of the Pensacola Chamber of Commerce.

The Blue Wahoos are proud to honor Fetterman's service to our nation, along with his legacy and efforts to make Pensacola the greatest place to live on earth.





The Blue Wahoos will begin a new decade in April with a new look on the field.

In the biggest set of new uniform designs in franchise history, the team will have four new primary uniforms as well as a slew of theme night fits.

It will include introduction of a Hawaiian-style Sunday jersey, brand new additions to the popular Pensacola Mullets collection, and a bold black and silver fit that connects the team to their Major League affiliate in Miami.

"Whenever you make changes, it's all about that fine line of trying to keep things fresh without over-committing too much," said Donna Kirby, the Blue Wahoos vice president. "There is not a set formula per-se, but these are going to be new additions that we're all excited about and we think will really connect with fans."

Let's start with the first change. The Blue Wahoos will revert back into the traditional, classic whites to resemble the uniforms worn in the inaugural 2012 season.

These will be "home whites" with the blue lettering and designed as the staple of the team's home wardrobe. "People love the classics," Kirby said. "One of the big reasons, I think, is people just want to feel when I put on that jersey I am part of the baseball team. I don't think we in Pensacola are unique to that.


"This style is one of top sellers every year. Because people want their name on the back of it and want to feel like they are part of the team."

In a major transformation, the team's past powder blue uniforms - which were introduced to represent Pensacola's past affiliation with the Minnesota Twins - have been retired.

In their place, a sharp black, silver, and pink jersey will be introduced that fits team's affiliation with the Miami Marlins. This will be a home and away jersey for the Blue Wahoos, aligning the team's look on the field with their 10year partnership with the Marlins. On Sundays, the Blue Wahoos are going Hawaiian. The players will wear a beach-themed, pink-dominated style of jersey that resembles the enormously popular Hawaiian Shirts the team has given to fans as a Giveaway Friday giveaway the past two seasons.

"We've hit a home run with these jerseys," Kirby said. "We heard loudly and clearly from the fans that they love Hawaiian. Last season, we had to order additional Hawaiian shirts after our giveaway date for fans because the demand was so strong.

"Our fans have kept telling us they want more Hawaiian and I can't wait to see our players in these for a Sunday game."



Mullet Mania continues this season with two new Pensacola Mullets jerseys. One features flashy sea-blue pinstripes on a lime green uniform. The other adds pink sleeves to a blue patterned jersey. Both have matching mullet haircuts on the back of the jersey and will be paired with a new Mullets hat.

Each Thursday home game, Pensacola plays as the Mullets to recognize the team nickname that finished second in balloting by fans prior to the 2012 inaugural season.

In addition to the new gameday collection jerseys, the Blue Wahoos will also introduce a Copa de la Diversión identity in 2023.

A nationwide initiative to honor players and fans of Latin American heritage, Pensacola will be home to one of the most unique Copa identities this season: the Pensacola Pok-Ta-Pok.

Pok-Ta-Pok, believed by historians to be the first ballgame played in the Americas as early as 3,000 years ago, was a sport played with a heavy rubber ball and competitors would battle to propel the ball through an elevated hoop using only their hips and torsos - similar to basketball today without the use of the hands.

The addition of Pok-Ta-Pok to the Copa universe is an important one. With over 90 teams participating in the program, Pensacola's identity is the first to celebrate indigenous cultures in Latin America.

While many people associate Latin America with the Spanish language, nearly 50 million people today across Latin America are of indigenous her-









itage with millions speaking languages other than Spanish like Mayan, Quechua, and Nahuatl as their first language.

During a trio of Copa games during the season, the Blue Wahoos will play as the Pok-Ta-Pok, donning colorful red uniforms designed by an artist in Mexico City named Jacobo Vidal.

The Pok-Ta-Pok's uniforms feature an ahtlete playing Pok-Ta-Pok set over the El Castillo pyramid at Chichen Itza in Mexico. The chest of the jersey features the name "Pok-Ta-Pok" written in traditional Mayan glyphs scripted by a Mayan linguist.

In addition to the collection of new uniforms, the Blue Wahoos are introducing a new logo in 2023!

The team's new mark features a fierce wahoo fish bursting through a ring buoy, tying the team's identity to Pensacola Beach. The buoy is painted to resemble the state flag of Florida.

As the season progresses, uniforms worn by the players will also be re-

flected by arrival of merchandise apparel offered to match these new looks inside the Bait and Tackle Team Store located on the home plate concourse.

Some of the new items are for sale now. Other items will be arriving soon.

Leading up to the 2023 season, the Blue Wahoos signed a partnership deal with GoTeez Clothing Co. to produce a majority of the team's merchandise.

With GoTeez headquarted in Tennessee, apparel and merchandise will be able to delivered to Blue Wahoos Stadium much more quickly throughout the season. With a Pensacola-based artist on staff at GoTeez, the partnership will bring new, localized designs to fans.







BALLPARK RULES

We want every game at Blue Wahoos Stadium to be an enjoyable and memorable experience for every fan. To make that possible, the following rules are enforced.

• Foul/abusive language and/or rowdy behavior will not be tolerated and will be cause for ejection and/or arrest. Violators may also have their season tickets revoked. Notify the nearest guest services or safety/security representative immediately if actions of this type occur near you.

The use of derogatory language, which is defined as offensive language concerning another
person's race, ethnicity, gender, religion, disability, age, sexual orientation, or national origin
is cause for immediate ejection from the stadium without a refund and could result in future
ticket loss.

• By Major League Baseball rule, bags are not permitted in the stadium. Diaper bags, medical bags, and small purses are allowed.

• Entering the playing field without authorization or throwing objects onto the field is a violation of ballpark rules and may be hazardous. Offenders will be ejected and subject to arrest and prosecution.

• All tobacco and electronic cigarettes are prohibited in Blue Wahoos Stadium which includes the seating sections, concourses, and stairwells.

• Keep aisles clear at all times; emergency situations require that stairways be kept clear. Guests sitting or standing in the ballpark aisles jeopardize the safety of others.

• For your safety and the safety of those around you, please sit in your assigned seat to avoid inconveniencing other guests.

• Drunk and disorderly behavior as well as violation of any alcohol policy will result in ejections from the ballpark without a refund and could result in the loss of season tickets. Underage consumption and the excessive consumption of alcohol is strictly prohibited.

• Umbrellas are allowed in the stadium. Please be courteous of those around you when using an umbrella.

• The Blue Wahoos ask that no one solicit contributions or distribute literature on stadium property without written approval of the team.

 Flags and banners without poles are permitted. Flags must be event related and may not cover any ballpark signage. All flags or banners deemed inappropriate by stadium management are subject to removal.

 Gates will open 60 minutes (1 hour) prior to the start of the game for admission into the stadium. We strongly encourage guests to enter the stadium as early as possible to avoid delays.


 All guests entering the stadium are subject to search. Refusal may be grounds to prohibit admission.

 The following items are prohibited from entering the stadium: bottles, cans, coolers, containers, fireworks, flares, pets or animals of any kind (with the exception of service animals), weapons, water guns, toy/replica weapons, squirt bottles, soap bottles, balloons, brooms, skateboards, roller blades or skates.

• Handheld radios and televisions are allowed as long as guests listen with an earpiece or headphones. Guests should be considerate of their neighbors when using these devices.

• Outside food and beverages are not permitted inside the stadium. Concession stands are conveniently located on both sides of the concourse for your food and beverage needs.

• All fans must comply with requests from stadium staff regarding stadium policies and emergency response procedures. Be safe. Have fun!
