



Rear Admiral Kyle Cozad graduated from the U.S. Naval Academy in 1985. His Navy career centered around aviation training and operations, and he served extensively as an instructor pilot in numerous operational and training tours around the world. During his career, Cozad commanded at various levels within naval aviation and joint multi-service including five critical Command assignments. Ashore, he served in a variety of diverse leadership positions within the Navy and Department of Defense, including as the 22nd Senior Director in the White House Situation Room, Commander of Joint Task Force Guantanamo Bay, and Commander of the Naval Education and Training Command.

Following a service-connected spinal cord injury in 2018, Cozad recovered and returned to full service, completing his final thirty months of active duty as the Navy's only wheelchair-bound flag officer. During that time, he became an advocate for disability awareness and competed in the 2019 Department of Defense Warrior Games. Prior to his retirement, Cozad was recognized as one of the Department of Defense's top employees with disabilities in 2020. After a thirty-five-year career in the Navy, Cozad joined the Naval Aviation Museum Foundation as the President and Chief Executive Officer in October 2020. Today, he resides in Pensacola, Florida—affectionately known as the "Cradle of Naval Aviation." Since his injury, in addition to devoting countless hours to supporting Naval Aviation history and heritage, Cozad has dedicated countless hours mentoring other spinal cord injury victims through their individual recoveries. Cozad has also written a book titled Relentless Positivity, which details him battling uncommon odds.



during a fun event at Phineas Phogg's a few days before the 2019 season opener.

Arraez was joined on stage by teammates Brusdar Graterol, Jhoan Duran, Jovani Moran, Jorge Alcala and Brian Naverreto.

Incredibly, every one of those players that day on stage at Seville Quarter, singing and entertaining in a medley of Latin dance songs, made it to the big leagues.

Arraez has captivated ever since as one of the biggest hitters in Major League Baseball. He won the 2022 American League batting title with the Twins and is now an instant star with the Miami Marlins, who have been the Blue Wahoos' Double-A affiliate since 2021.

The left-handed second baseman from Venezuela may have traded places, teams and leagues, but the hitting production has only increased.

"He's so routine-oriented," said Marlins first-year manager Skip Shumaker, speaking during an April interview with MLB.com. "What he does with preparation, it just feeds off and everybody watches it and it translates to everybody else and their preparation.

"And I have to be careful when I say this, because I know who (Hall of Fame player) Tony Gwynn is and what he did in the game, but it feels like (Arraez) is the modern-day Tony Gwynn."

Through the first four weeks of the 2023 MLB season, Arraez was batting .438 with



the Marlins. This average included a historic moment on April 11 when he became the Marlins' first player in their 31-year franchise history to hit for the cycle in a game against the Philadelphia Phillies.

The Marlins had played 4,699 previous games in their 31-year history, but never had a player attain one of baseball's rarest feats of producing the four different hits in the same game.

"A special day. It was a regular day, because we play baseball," said Arraez, speaking with his usual humility in a post-game session.

"It's a beautiful sport for me," he said. "And I think for everybody that plays baseball. I just come here to play baseball, and then try to do my best and then help the team win."

Arraez ignited a Marlins clubhouse celebration that included a champagne toast, along with a photograph of Arraez holding the dugout lineup poster and encased baseball of the last hit. His batting gloves worn in the game were shipped for display at the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, New York.

"Pretty special to be part of that," said Marlins first-year manager Skip Schumaker, speaking to media members at the game Tuesday night. "Watching him go about his business, just all over the field the way he's doing it, such a joy to watch."

Arraez's gratitude and joy was always on full display during his tenure with the Blue Wahoos. Arraez kept a smile on his face. He willingly engaged with fans and children near the dugout at Blue Wahoos Stadium. He always obliged for autographs.

In the 38 games Luis Arraez played for the Blue Wahoos in 2019, including 15 times in Pensacola, the short connection offered a glimpse into his future.

After being elevated to Triple-A, Arraez learned on May 17, 2019 he was being called up to the big leagues to join the Twins. That launched his MLB career.

When his cell phone rang near midnight that night, former Blue Wahoos manager Ramon Borrego heard an excited voice.

It was Arraez. "Hey Viejo!" said Arraez, which, as





Borrego later explained that day was the Spanish version of calling someone, "old man."

Borrego, now the manager of the Twins' Double-A team in Wichita, Kansas, was laughing, knowing he just turned 40 in 2019, but that's old to current players. "Viejo, Viejo, you know what?..... I'm going to the Big Leagues!"

While Borrego had just been informed by the Twins via text message they were calling up Arraez, he pretended like he didn't know.

And then he started crying.

"It is unbelievable," Borrego said that day in 2019. "I am the first person (Arraez) called. That tells you something special. I feel for this kid with way he worked and the way he's chased his dream.

Arraez lined out to center field in his first MLB at-bat, then doubled in his next atbat, after coming into the game in the sixth inning. He was the first Blue Wahoos player since the affiliation change to the Twins in 2019 to reach the major leagues.

"This is just the beginning for you, I told him," Borrego said that day in 2019. "Now, you have to work even harder. Why? To stay there."

He did. And he stayed.

Arraez, a native of San Felipe, Venezuela, about 100 miles from Borrego's hometown, became the 68th Blue Wahoos player to reach the major leagues since the franchise made its 2012 debut as a Cincinnati Reds affiliate.

A sports writer from a Venezuela newspaper called Borrego when it happened, while writing a story on Arraez, to provide a heartwarming message.

"He told me, 'The first person (Arraez) mentioned was you, because you kept him in the right direction.' That was amazing for me," said Borrego, relaying the conversation with the writer. "I kinda played like he did... with heart and passion. I wanted the best for him."

The two first met in Fort Myers, while Borrego was managing the Twins' Gulf Coast League team, a rookie-level affiliate. Borrego later convinced the Twins farm director to put Arraez in Instructional League with other advance level players, so he could further benefit.



"I started pulling numbers from minor league winter ball and the regular minor league season." said Borrego, relaying his sales pitch.

"In 700 at-bats that year (2015), he was hitting .347. "I saw something.. I knew we had something. (Arraez) can hit lefties and righties. When I gave him the invitation, he was so excited. It was like he was promoted to the big leagues."

The next season, Arraez won the batting title while playing for the Cedar Rapids (Iowa) Kernels in the Midwest League He then overcame a season ending knee injury that wiped out his 2017 season.

A year, Arraez blossomed for the Advance-A Fort Myers Miracle and with the Chattanooga Lookouts. "When you are talking about Luis Arraez, you are talking about a player with intensity, big heart, great passion," Borrego said. "You are talking about a guy who is loved by teammates. You are talking about a special person.

After four seasons with the Twins, Arraez was traded to the Marlins on Jan. 20 in exchange for Marlins starting pitcher Pablo Lopez and minor league prospects.

The Twins needed a dependable, dominating starting pitcher and were willing to take the bold move and part with Arraez. The Marlins needed a bonafide hitter, someone who can bring excitement and interest in Miami.

So far, it's been a win-win. Lopez pitched well in his first month with the Twins, and recently signed a contract extension.

And Arraez? Well, in his first three weeks, he had a .536 average and .596 on-base percentage that led all MLB hitters through that period.

"(Arraez) kinda what we preach in being a good hitter and not just a power slug," said Marlins' first-year manager Skip Shumaker, speaking to media members after the April 11 cycle feat. "He's showing guys how to use the whole field and what the preparation looks like (to do that).

"And just being a good hitter, grinding out at-bats. (Arraez) never takes a pitch off. Just the whole mentality of dayin, day-out defensively as well. It's just been an incredible pickup."

Arraez had 50 hits in 146 at-bats with the Blue Wahoos. He was batting .342 with 14 RBI when elevated to Triple-A in 2019.

"It is unbelievable," said Borrego, reflecting on Arraez' rise in 2019. "I think I am one of the bigger witnesses in his career.

Arraez's career keeps adding more special moments.

The early portion of this season has included the Blue Wahoos providing area schools with an ultimate field trip, complete with an educational component.

In a first for the franchise, the team scheduled a pair of matinee games on April 19 and May 3 - both starting at 11:05 a.m. - and featuring school children from kindergarten through high school attending a Blue Wahoos game.

"Meeting with the new (Escambia County Schools) superintendent (Timothy Smith), that was a big lift," said team president Jonathan Griffith, explaining why this year was right for scheduling two early games. "Because we needed the superintendent's (support) to really see the educational side of baseball and see how this can be used to not only educate kids, but have fun with it."

On April 19, busloads of students began arriving more than an hour before the first pitch. They were all handed a worksheet to fill out and deliver back to their classroom teachers that incorporated elements of a baseball game with teaching.

Each student received a hot dog, chips and soft drink from the Blue Wahoos' storefront concessions. It was part of a \$16 ticket that included the reserved seat and the lunch.

"Unfortunately, we are at the mercy

of our schedule," Griffith said. "And we had to do the first one in April a little bit earlier than we wanted to, and we now know the schools are in a time of testing during that week.

"But for our game on May 3, we had a cutoff (of tickets), which is a great thing. This year has really been a learning process. Next year, I think we may just do one date, because we don't want to interfere with school testing.

"We are also thinking about doing field trips for day care facilities in the summer portion of our home schedule. Because (day care centers) are looking for something to do, so we are thinking about that. We'll see how this goes and see how it works and how we can always improve."



Blue Wahoos group sales executive Steven Unser said when he worked for two other minor league teams, none included a worksheet to have students fill out and gain learning tools. "The others were more of, hey come out, hang out, have fun. It was a field trip, but it wasn't necessarily educational, The ones we scheduled this year were designed for learning elements, and we partnered with some companies in town who have an educational product."



Area teachers explained to the Blue Wahoos sales team that going to a baseball game was a completely different experience from other field trips.

"The impact is that that some of the kids have never been to a Blue Wahoos game or may have never been able to see a Blue Wahoos game without the field trip," Unser said. "And that is one of the big things about working for the Blue Wahoos and the Studer Family of Companies is that we are here to make impact in the community."

For the game on May 3, a group of students at Pensacola High in a sports medicine course were scheduled to attend and meet with Blue Wahoos athletic trainer Melissa Hampton.

That same day, on a different end of spectrum, the entire kindergarten class of 300-plus children from S.S. Dixon Primary School in Pace was set to attend.

Other teams throughout Minor League Baseball have hosted similar games either in the late morning, or with an early afternoon start time, as a way to fill a ballpark with kids or enable fans to have a mid-day experience at the ballpark.

"I think it's exciting to be able to have the kids come out to the ballpark and learn differently," Griffith said. "It's not sitting in the classroom kind of thing.

"It's things like, how much does a hot dog cost? And getting change from an order and those type of things and bringing that into learning.

The Blue Wahoos have been involved with mascot Kazoo's Reading Program since the inaugural season, but a field trip at the stadium incorporates other elements.

"It was like, how can we take what we've been doing to the next step?" Griffith said. "Now we are going to do some math, some science, some fun stuff."

Last season, the Beloit Sky Carp – the Miami Marlins High-A affiliate in Beloit, Wisconsin owned by Blue Wahoos owners Quint and Rishy Studer – held an mid-day, Education Day with significant impact.

"It worked great," Griffith said. "It gave a lot of kids the ability to come to a baseball game, who normally can't come to a game. This will be a learning field trip that is not a classroom style. That is cool and exciting for the kids to be able to do that.

"We are giving every kid a worksheet when they enter and then it's up to the teachers on how to utilize it. They can use results any way they wish. We tried not to give the teachers any more work. Our goal was to be helpful, not more work for the teachers."

#### Kevin Randel Manager

Kevin Randel has coached in the Marlins organization since 2010. A 13th round selection in the 2002 MLB Draft, Randel played eight seasons in the Marlins farm system, reaching the Triple-A level. After retiring following the 2009 season, he quickly transitioned into coaching in the Marlins organization. From 2010-2014, he served as a hitting coach before becoming a manager in 2015. Since, he's racked up over 300 wins managing at the A, A+, and AA levels.



#### Matt Snyder Hitting Coach

Matt Snyder comes to Pensacola after two successful seasons as the hitting coach in High-A Beloit. A 10th round selection in the 2012 MLB Draft by the New York Yankees, Snyder played professionally through the 2019 season with Triple-A New Orleans in the Marlins organization. The three-time Minor League All-Star was named the Marlins Player Development Staff Member of the Year in 2022.



#### Dave Eiland Pitching Coach

Dave Eiland brings over two decades of MLB experience to Pensacola in his second season as the Blue Wahoos pitching coach. After pitching in the Major Leagues for 10 seasons with the Yankees, Padres, and Devil Rays, Eiland won World Series rings as a pitching coach with the Yankees (2009) and Royals (2015) during a career as an MLB coach that stretched from 2008-2019.



#### Danny Black Defensive Coach

Danny Black played six seasons in the Marlins minor league system from 2010 to 2015, including parts of four seasons for Double-A Jacksonville in the Southern League and parts of two seasons with Triple-A New Orleans. He began his coaching career in 2018 and has served in various roles since, including as an assistant coach for Advanced-A Jupiter from 2018-2019 and as a defensive coach for Triple-A Jacksonville in 2021 and the FCL Marlins in 2022.



#### Seth Gregorich Strength Coach

Seth Gregorich joins the Blue Wahoos after serving as the strength coach for the High-A Beloit Sky Carp in 2022. Prior to joining the Marlins organization, he worked in the Detroit Tigers, Philadelphia Phillies, and New York Mets organizations.



#### Melissa Hampton Athletic Trainer

Melissa Hampton returns to the Blue Wahoos coaching staff in 2023 after joining the team for the 2022 season. In 2018, she became the first woman to work on a field staff in the Marlins organization, serving as athletic trainer for the Gulf Coast League Marlins before joining High-A Beloit in 2021.
































#### **BLUE WAHOOS STADIUM**




Entering its 11th season, Blue Wahoos Stadium is widely considered one of the premier facilities in Minor League Baseball. Recently named the Best Ballpark in Double-A by Ballpark Digest, the stadium has established itself as one of the best places to enjoy a Minor League Baseball game in the country. A three-time recipient of the Southern League Ballpark of the Year, Blue Wahoos Stadium welcomed over two million fans in its first eight seasons, finishing first or second in the league in attendance five times.



With a capacity of 5,038 fans, Blue Wahoos Stadium is the smallest in the Southern League, allowing fans to get closer to the action than any other park in the league. Nestled alongside the water in Pensacola's Community Maritime Park, the field provides unbeatable views of the Pensacola Bay. The playing surface at Blue Wahoos Stadium was officially named Admiral Fetterman Field in 2015 in honor of the late Admiral Jack Fetterman. who was instrumental in the creation of Community Maritime Park for the Pensacola community.



Blue Wahoos Stadium and the surrounding Maritime Community Park were built to be used by the local community throughout the year, not just for Wahoos baseball games. Each year, over 200 events are held at the ballpark throughout the year, making it truly a stadium for the entire community.

#### **Honoring Admiral Fetterman**

On September 23, 2015, the field at Blue Wahoos Stadium was officially renamed Admiral Jack Fetterman Field. It honors the memory of Fetterman, a three-star Vice Admiral in the U.S. Navy who retired in Pensacola and became a prominent civic leader, dedicating himself, alongside his wife Nancy, to preserving Pensacola's history.

A strong advocate for the construction of Maritime Community Park and Blue Wahoos Stadium, Fetterman passed away on March 24, 2006 at the age of 74 and was never able to see his vision of a waterfront stadium become reality. Although he never watched the Wahoos play at the ballpark, his memory is honored at each game played on the field bearing his name.

As you enjoy today's game at Blue Wahoos Stadium, please take a moment in your own way to thank Admiral Fetterman for his contributions to the city of Pensacola and the United States military.

A Pennsylvania native, Fetterman graduated from college in 1954 and enlisted in the U.S. Navy. He made his first trip to Pensacola soon after to attend the Aviation Officer Candidate School at Naval Air Station Pensacola.

He rose in rank and was appointed Rear Admiral and then Vice Admiral, assuming command duties of the U.S. Naval Air Force Pacific Fleet in San Diego, a capacity he served in until 1990.

In 1991, Fetterman returned to Pensacola where his Naval career began and assumed duties as Chief of Naval Education and Training before retiring from active duty in 1993. During his illustrius Naval career, he formulated and produced the Core Values Training program, earning him the title of "Father of Navy Ethics."

He then became president and CEO of the National Naval Aviation Museum at NAS-Pensacola. Under his leadership, the museum grew in capacity and scope, making the facility one of the largest air and space museums in the world.

In addition to his work at NAS-Pensacola and with other U.S. Navy roles, Fetterman served his community in roles that included being Chairman of the Pensacola Mayor Community Core Values Board. He was also Chairman of the Pensacola Chamber of Commerce.

The Blue Wahoos are proud to honor Fetterman's service to our nation, along with his legacy and efforts to make Pensacola the greatest place to live on earth.





# Troy JOHNSTON

## RIDING THE WAVE

Troy Johnston spent spring training getting a first-time look at a potential future.

The experience is something he won't forget.

"It was definitely eye-opening," said Johnston, the Blue Wahoos' first baseman/designated hitter. "Getting to be part of big-league spring training (with the Miami Marlins), that was very, very cool.

"I got to meet most of the Marlins and got to play in games with them. A couple [players] who really stood out to me were [Marlins infielder] Joey Wendle and his work ethic and playing with [Avisail] Garcia and [Jorge] Soler.

Other than that, it was just a fantastic spring training for me. I took it as best as I could. I worked hard every day. But I really enjoyed just trying to get better day in and day out."

Johnston, 25, a Tacoma, Washington native and former Gonzaga University star, was able to raise his profile last season with the Blue Wahoos.



At one point in early June, he had a two-week total of hits (27) that were the most by any player at all levels of professional baseball.

That finish led to an automatic qualifier into the postseason. And we all know what happened then as the Blue Wahoos won both rounds of playoffs to claim their first outright Southern League championship in their 10th anniversary season.

Johnston, a self-admitted streak hitter, called the hot streak like riding a wave as a surfer. He wound up hitting .292, one point shy of winning the batting title.

"You just ride it and hang on as long as you can, because you never know when the next big one is going to happen," he said.

During the first two weeks of his 2023 season, Johnston struggled for hits before heating up in late April.

After one of those games where his bat was evident, Blue Wahoos manager Kevin Randel approached him in the dugout and jokingly said, "Hi, I'm Kevin Randel. Nice to meet you Troy," as he shook his hand.





Johnston then added, "I really haven't been doing what I'm supposed to be doing (as of that point). It's a long season and I'm going to just try and do the best I can every day."

Johnston was a 17th round pick by the Marlins in 2019 out of Gonzaga, the 501st player taken that year. He has exceeded expectations in each of his first two full seasons as a pro.

He entered the 2023 season with the most total hits (302) and most RBI (177) by any player in the Marlins minor league system since mid-season 2019. He became a Midwest League Post-Season All-Star of the Beloit Snappers in 2021, then did the same thing with the Blue Wahoos in 2022 as Southern League All-Star.

"For me, I would love to repeat as an All-Star," Johnston said. "Last year I was very thankful they voted me that honor. I would like to polish my game to the point where I can become more of a big leaguer than I am now.

"I would like to progress my game to the point where I could make the Opening Day roster or even debut this year in 2023. That is up to me and how I well I can perform this year.

"For me one of the things I've been trying to get better is just being better on the bases every single time, versus three out of four times.

"I lost maybe 10 pounds this offseason and I feel like I have not lost any power. I feel like I have gained quite a bit of speed, so I am hoping to utilize that more this year and become more of a threat on the basepaths."

Johnston's efforts in 85 games last season for the Blue Wahoos led to an August promotion to Triple-A, where he finished the season with the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp.


His numbers there fell to a .155 average in 29 games. He was told at the end of last season he would start 2023 back in Pensacola to further hone his batting skills.

"It's business. And I understand," Johnston said. "[The Jumbo Shrimp] have guys up there, it's business. It is out of my control to an extent but that is the way it is.

"But I'm happy to be back in Pensacola. What a great city, what a great place to play. Great people, great coaches, and I just go every day and play my best."

We want every game at Blue Wahoos Stadium to be BALL DARK RULES an enjoyable and memorable experience for every fan. To make that possible, the following rules are

- Foul/abusive language and/or rowdy behavior will not be tolerated and will be cause for ejection and/or arrest. Violators may also have their season tickets revoked. Notify the nearest guest services or safety/security representative immediately if actions of this type occur near you.
- · The use of derogatory language, which is defined as offensive language concerning another person's race, ethnicity, gender, religion, disability, age, sexual orientation, or national origin is cause for immediate ejection from the stadium without a refund and could result in future ticket loss.
- . By Major League Baseball rule, bags are not permitted in the stadium. Diaper bags, medical bags, and small purses are allowed.
- Entering the playing field without authorization or throwing objects onto the field is a violation of ballpark rules and may be hazardous. Offenders will be ejected and subject to arrest and prosecution.
- All tobacco and electronic cigarettes are prohibited in Blue Wahoos Stadium which includes the seating sections, concourses, and stairwells.
- Keep aisles clear at all times; emergency situations require that stairways be kept clear. Guests sitting or standing in the ballpark aisles jeopardize the safety of others.
- For your safety and the safety of those around you, please sit in your assigned seat to avoid inconveniencing other guests.
- · Drunk and disorderly behavior as well as violation of any alcohol policy will result in ejections from the ballpark without a refund and could result in the loss of season tickets. Underage consumption and the excessive consumption of alcohol is strictly prohibited.
- Umbrellas are allowed in the stadium. Please be courteous of those around you when using an umbrella.
- The Blue Wahoos ask that no one solicit contributions or distribute literature on stadium property without written approval of the team.
- · Flags and banners without poles are permitted. Flags must be event related and may not cover any ballpark signage. All flags or banners deemed inappropriate by stadium management are subject to removal.
- · Gates will open 60 minutes (1 hour) prior to the start of the game for admission into the stadium. We strongly encourage guests to enter the stadium as early as possible to avoid delays.
- · All guests entering the stadium are subject to search. Refusal may be grounds to prohibit admission.
- The following items are prohibited from entering the stadium: bottles, cans, coolers, containers, fireworks, flares, pets or animals of any kind (with the exception of service animals), weapons, water guns, toy/replica weapons, squirt bottles, soap bottles, balloons, brooms, skateboards, roller blades or skates.
- Handheld radios and televisions are allowed as long as quests listen with an earpiece or headphones. Guests should be considerate of their neighbors when using these devices.
- · Outside food and beverages are not permitted inside the stadium. Concession stands are conveniently located on both sides of the concourse for your food and beverage needs.
