





MONTEVERDE

ACE IN THE HOLE

The 25-year-old Monteverde ended May as one of the top three pitchers in all levels of Minor League Baseball. His first seven starts were highlighted by allowing just six runs in 42 innings, equating to a 1.26 earned run average. He began the season as the Southern League Pitcher of the Month for April.

But all of this occurred in the most improbable way.

During the entire spring training period, Monteverde struggled. Badly.

"I wasn't very good. I had about a 50 ERA," he said. "I was getting hit pretty hard. On the last day of spring training I made a little adjustment mechanically that got me to where I need to be."

The adjustment was in delivery and determination.

"He was trying to be a pitcher in spring training that he is not capable of being. He was trying to add velocity," said Blue Wahoos pitching coach Dave Eiland, one of baseball's most esteemed pitching coaches. "He may have been able to add one mile per-hour, maybe two. But he would have sacrificed a lot of command, which is his calling card.

"He was changing some things in his mechanics that he really wasn't aware of in trying to generate a little more power and create some more velocity and it was affecting his command. He was falling behind in counts. And he was getting in disadvantaged counts.

"Somebody had apparently got into his head about adding more velocity and he's not capable of that."

Eiland and Tommy Phelps, the Miami Marlins' minor league pitching coordinator, worked with Monteverde to eliminate a hitch in his front hip during pitch delivery.

"He came (to Pensacola), threw a couple of side sessions (in practice) and it got him back to where he was last year delivery wise. And then off he went," said Eiland, who pitched 10 seasons in the major leagues and was part of two World Series champions as pitching coach with the New York Yankees (2009) and Kansas City Royals (2015).

"He went back to being the Patrick Monteverde that commands his fastball in different quadrants of the strike zone and all three of his off-speed pitches," Eiland said.

In Monteverde's case, his fastball that hits 91 or 92 mph is able to get hitters out. His breaking pitches, which include a slider he developed a year ago, are able to set up to make the fastball he throws even better with good location.

"Patrick is the epitome of a pitcher. That is what he does. And guys like that, when they try and create a little more velocity, it goes the other way for them. They lose their strength."

Monteverde has been a pitcher since he was old enough to pitch in youth baseball. He grew up in Pittsburgh. He can still remember his first T-Ball practice at 6-years-old, amid weather that was not favorable.

"It was raining and everybody was having a miserable time and I was having the time of my life," he said, laughing. "As soon as I was able to start pitching, I think I did. Just being lefthanded. I was one of the few on the team, so I think it was a pretty clear answer I was going to be a pitcher.

"But I also played first base. I loved playing the field. Defense was something I looked forward to, oddly enough. More so than pitching."

His father was a standout high school player, who helped inspire Patrick to pursue baseball and stay with it.

"From what I've heard through his friends, he was quite the ballplayer," said Monteverde, who graduated from Pittsburgh's Fox Chapel High School and was an all-area first team player his junior and senior years. "I have a lot to live up to in terms of that. As soon as I started playing, I knew this is what I wanted to do.





"My sophomore year of high school, I sat down with my pitching coach and we talked about the possibility of me playing pro ball or college. We talked about me being a late bloomer in terms of velocity and development. But I knew how to pitch at a young age.

"So, he told me to be patient, that it will happen, I just have to keep working hard." Monteverde began college at Virginia Wesleyan, an NCAA Division III school. He then played at Seton Hill College, located near Pittsburgh, before making the leap to Division I with Texas Tech.

After bypassing a draft opportunity in 2019, he was chosen in the eighth round by the Marlins in 2021. In three years he climbed three levels in Marlins system, including joining the Blue Wahoos near the end of the 2022 season and being part of the team's championship run with a one-hit start in Game 2 of the Southern League championship series against the Tennessee Smokies.

"I know he doesn't show it, but he is pretty fiery," Eiland said. "But he remains calm on the mound. He has some fire in there, which you need. He just doesn't wear it on his sleeve.

"He is a very hard worker. He pays attention to detail, he does his homework, he studies hitters. He does everything you need to do in order to be a successful pitcher."

When Monteverde was drafted in 2021, one dream was fulfilled. The other one will be a continued pursuit to try and reach the major leagues.

"It is a two-second window that I will never forget," he said. "A lot of emotions. A lot of hard work went into it. Being surrounded by family and loved ones that helped me get to that point, made everything just that much more special.

I love it. I love this game. I want to be around it every day. I owe a lot to my parents. They always told me to work hard and go after what I want to do. And they were always so supportive."

Today, Studer is a best-selling author in both business and health care fields, and continues to invest in Pensacola.

BUBBA WATSON grew up in Bagdad, Florida on his way to becoming a professional golfer and two-time Masters champion. Since returning to Pensacola with his family, Bubba has invested heavily in the community, opening Bubba's Sweet Spot downtown, donating generously to the Studer Family Children's Hospital, and becoming a part-owner of the Blue Wahoos with business partner RANDALL WELLS.

DERRICK BROOKS played youth football in his hometown of Pensacola, Florida before becoming a two-time All-American linebacker at Florida State and an 11-time Pro Bowler in a 14-year NFL career. He led the Tampa Bay Buccaneers to a Super Bowl title in 2003, was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2014, and joined the Blue Wahoos as an owner in 2018.

DANA SUSKIND is a professor of Surgery and Pediatrics at the University of Chicago Medical Center and the co-founder and co-director of the Thirty Million Words Center for Early Learning. She is a popular author and is devoted to treating children born with hearing loss.

JOHN LIST is an economist at the University of Chicago. The author of over 200 academic publications, he was a finalist for the Nobel Prize in economics in 2015 and is co-founder of the Thirty Million Words Center for Early Learning with Dana Suskind.

HOMERUN FORLIFE

His trip around the bases now complete, Cantrell Tyson landed his feet on home plate amid a rush of emotions.

In less than a minute it took to circle, so many memories flashed and tears flowed.

The Pensacola High football coach was honored at the Blue Wahoos game earlier this season with a "Home Run For Life" provided by Ascension Sacred Heart Pensacola, where a team of medical staff eight months ago saved Tyson's life, after he suffered a stroke during a September 10, 2022 game.

With an overflow crowd at Blue Wahoos Stadium reacting, the 30-year-old Tyson embraced the moment. It occurred after the fifth inning was completed in the Blue Wahoos' eventual win that night. He took a deep breath when finished, then leaned into the arms of one of his doctors and began sobbing.

"It was absolutely incredible when we stepped on the field and I saw everybody clapping," said Tyson, after being joined by family, relatives, PHS principal Saraya Miller a medical team of doctors and staff from Ascension Sacred Heart. "That is the biggest crowd I have played in, or coached in, so it was amazing."

As customary with these Home Run For Life experiences, both teams and the umpires lined the baselines and extended support as Tyson took his jog around the basepaths.

Home plate umpire Joe McCarthy hugged him. Blue Wahoos mascot Kazoo had fun with him. His family had cell phones out to record and photograph.

The Blue Wahoos began these Home Run For Life experiences with during their second season in team history. Sacred Heart has been a loyal partner. Each one is different. The ages of honorees has ranged from toddlers to adults.

The first one occurred April 18, 2013 and involved Tristan Laurent, 15, a freshman on the 2013 West Florida High baseball team. He was diagnosed in 2012 with a malignant brain tumor. The cancer had spread and became inoperable.



He passed away in July 2013. But on that April night at Blue Wahoos Stadium, the first Home Run For Life experience and moment became the most unforgettable one. During Pensacola High's third game of the 2022 season, Tyson was set to call a third-quarter play. That's when he remembers being unable to speak. With the Tigers quarterback standing in front of him, Tyson fell to the ground. Assistance instantly arrived, which helped save his life.



He was rushed to Sacred Heart where neurologist doctor Terry Neill and neuroradiologist Nathan Kohler were there. A clot-buster procedure was performed. Just one day after his stroke, he was breathing on his own and on a path to recovery.

"I was in there for 14 days. Five of those days in ICU (intensive care unit)," Tyson said. "I didn't start moving until day five. I was just sitting there and my legs just moved.

"My cousin who was visiting at the time said, "Do you realized your legs just moved?' That was such a big moment."

Incredibly, Tyson has recovered well enough to coach again. He's been helping direct the PHS spring practices and will be at the Tigers' spring game later this month.

"I am out there on the field. They don't really let me do a lot, but I am out there," Tyson said, laughing. "I am walking around. I do have a golf cart I can use."

Tyson has shared his inspirational story

with so many people. His perspective on life has now been even further understood.

"I talk all the time about the second you are born becomes the second you die," Tyson said. "What you do between that first breath and last breath means everything."

His big emphasis? "Love people, man. Love people. Live and laugh," he said.

The entire group of physicians who attended to Tyson were also at home plate during his special night.

"I really owe my life to the doctors. Those guys, wow. They checked up on me outside of everything else I did with hospital care," Tyson said. "After, they still check up on me. They sent a happy birthday message to me. I'm emotional now just talking about it."

Since 2013, the Blue Wahoos have maintained a partnership with Ascension Sacred Heart and the Studer Family Children's Hospital at Ascension Sacred Heart. The quest is to host at least one Home Run For Life experience each month during the season.

Team president Jonathan Griffith came up with the idea of a Home Run For Life as a way of recognizing the medical teams that provide care and emotional warm to patients and families battling a serious illness.

"I wanted to come up with a way to recognize the work they do in saving lives or helping impact the rest of someone's life with a terminal illness," Griffith said.

"Those are impactful moments we are making."

Kevin Randel has coached in the Marlins organization since 2010. A 13th round selection in the 2002 MLB Draft, Randel played eight seasons in the Marlins farm system, reaching the Triple-A level. After retiring following the 2009 season, he guickly transitioned into coaching in the Marlins organization. From 2010-2014, he served as a hitting coach before becoming a manager in 2015. Since, he's racked up over 300 wins managing at the A, A+, and AA levels.



Matt Snyder Hitting Coach

Matt Snyder comes to Pensacola after two successful seasons as the hitting coach in High-A Beloit. A 10th round selection in the 2012 MLB Draft by the New York Yankees, Snyder played professionally through the 2019 season with Triple-A New Orleans in the Marlins organization. The three-time Minor League All-Star was named the Marlins Player Development Staff Member of the Year in 2022.



Dave Eiland Pitching Coach

Dave Eiland brings over two decades of MLB experience to Pensacola in his second season as the Blue Wahoos pitching coach. After pitching in the Major Leagues for 10 seasons with the Yankees, Padres, and Devil Rays, Eiland won World Series rings as a pitching coach with the Yankees (2009) and Royals (2015) during a career as an MI B coach that stretched from 2008-2019.



Danny Black Defensive Coach

Danny Black played six seasons in the Marlins minor league system from 2010 to 2015, including parts of four seasons for Double-A Jacksonville in the Southern League and parts of two seasons with Triple-A New Orleans. He began his coaching career in 2018 and has served in various roles since, including as an assistant coach for Advanced-A Jupiter from 2018-2019 and as a defensive coach for Triple-A Jacksonville in 2021 and the FCL Marlins in 2022.




Seth Gregorich Strength Coach

BLUE WAHOOS STADIUM




Entering its 11th season, Blue Wahoos Stadium is widely considered one of the premier facilities in Minor League Baseball. Recently named the Best Ballpark in Double-A by Ballpark Digest, the stadium has established itself as one of the best places to enjoy a Minor League Baseball game in the country. A three-time recipient of the Southern League Ballpark of the Year, Blue Wahoos Stadium welcomed over two million fans in its first eight seasons, finishing first or second in the league in attendance five times.



With a capacity of 5,038 fans, Blue Wahoos Stadium is the smallest in the Southern League, allowing fans to get closer to the action than any other park in the league. Nestled alongside the water in Pensacola's Community Maritime Park, the field provides unbeatable views of the Pensacola Bay. The playing surface at Blue Wahoos Stadium was officially named Admiral Fetterman Field in 2015 in honor of the late Admiral Jack Fetterman, who was instrumental in the creation of Community Maritime Park for the Pensacola community.



Blue Wahoos Stadium and the surrounding Maritime Community Park were built to be used by the local community throughout the year, not just for Wahoos baseball games. Each year, over 200 events are held at the ballpark throughout the year, making it truly a stadium for the entire community, to enjoy.

Honoring Admiral Fetterman

On September 23, 2015, the field at Blue Wahoos Stadium was officially renamed Admiral Jack Fetterman Field. It honors the memory of Fetterman, a three-star Vice Admiral in the U.S. Navy who retired in Pensacola and became a prominent civic leader, dedicating himself, alongside his wife Nancy, to preserving Pensacola's history.

A strong advocate for the construction of Maritime Community Park and Blue Wahoos Stadium, Fetterman passed away on March 24, 2006 at the age of 74 and was never able to see his vision of a waterfront stadium become reality. Although he never watched the Wahoos play at the ballpark, his memory is honored at each game played on the field bearing his name.

As you enjoy today's game at Blue Wahoos Stadium, please take a moment in your own way to thank Admiral Fetterman for his contributions to the city of Pensacola and the United States military.

A Pennsylvania native, Fetterman graduated from college in 1954 and enlisted in the U.S. Navy. He made his first trip to Pensacola soon after to attend the Aviation Officer Candidate School at Naval Air Station Pensacola.

He rose in rank and was appointed Rear Admiral and then Vice Admiral, assuming command duties of the U.S. Naval Air Force Pacific Fleet in San Diego, a capacity he served in until 1990.

In 1991, Fetterman returned to Pensacola where his Naval career began and assumed duties as Chief of Naval Education and Training before retiring from active duty in 1993. During his illustrius Naval career, he formulated and produced the Core Values Training program, earning him the title of "Father of Navy Ethics."

He then became president and CEO of the National Naval Aviation Museum at NAS-Pensacola. Under his leadership, the museum grew in capacity and scope, making the facility one of the largest air and space museums in the world.

In addition to his work at NAS-Pensacola and with other U.S. Navy roles, Fetterman served his community in roles that included being Chairman of the Pensacola Mayor Community Core Values Board. He was also Chairman of the Pensacola Chamber of Commerce.

The Blue Wahoos are proud to honor Fetterman's service to our nation, along with his legacy and efforts to make Pensacola the greatest place to live on earth.



Anyone who watched Eury Pérez at Blue Wahoos Stadium during the first month of this season knew a grander stage awaited.

It just so happened to be sooner than imagined.

Just five days after he produced a six-inning gem in Pensacola, Pérez commanded attention of the Major League Baseball world in his muchanticipated major league debut May 12 with the Miami Marlins.

The impressions have continued into June.

Pérez, the 20-year-old, 6-foot-8

wunderkind and Marlins' No. 1 prospect, worked into the fifth inning during his MLB debut, allowing just two solo homers against the Cincinnati Reds at Miami's LoanDepot Park. The performance was mindful of what Blue Wahoos fans watched ever since Pérez was part of the starting rotation in Pensacola's 2022 season opener.

"I think you don't know what you are gong to do at the big league level until you actually do it, and he proved to himself that he's more than capable of getting guys out up here (in MLB). And he's ready," said Marlins manager Skip Schumaker in a postgame media interview session.

"That's a good lineup. They've got some real hitters over there. I knew that I was going to be impressed anyways, but watching it live, the future is really bright."

In his second start, he was even better. Pérez earned his first MLB win against the Washington Nationals in Miami when he worked five complete innings, allowing just one run on three hits, a walk, and six strikeouts.

Following that game, teammates playfully pushed him around the clubhouse in a shopping cart while throwing burger condiments at him.



"I told them I have new shoes, so please be careful with my shoes," said Pérez, laughing.


Marlins catcher Nick Fortes, who played for the Blue Wahoos most of the 2021 season, had never caught Pérez until that game on May 18.

Pérez finished his final inning that day by retiring the Nationals in order and striking out the final batter, Luis Garcia, by getting him to chase a rising fastball.

"We preached ... especially with a guy like that who handles fastballs so well ... to be able to throw a fastball. but in the right spot to get him out," Fortes said. "He was able to elevate (fastball) way up above the (strike) zone, so that was a good way to finish it off."

Pérez finished off his Blue Wahoos career by pitching twice in the same homestand at Blue Wahoos Stadium. It was the first time he had ever done that, further convincing the Marlins it was time to bring him up.

He is the youngest Marlins pitcher in team history to reach the big leagues this soon. He surpasses José Fernandez, who was also 20





"Watching Eury over the last year, year and a half, seeing the way he's performed gave us great confidence in his ability to come up here and do well," said Marlins general manager Kim Ng, speaking to media when the decision was made on May 10.

"This is going to be a situation where we are going to be watching him very closely and monitoring everything that goes on in the game."

Pérez began the season rated the No. 11 overall prospect in Minor League Baseball by MLB Pipeline. In his last four starts with the Blue Wahoos. Pérez allowed just three runs with 30 strikeouts and a 1.23 earned run average.

The way Pérez learned he was jumping straight from the Blue Wahoos to the big leagues has now gone viral.

After a Blue Wahoos win in a midday game against the Birmingham Barons, a video was taken showing Pérez meeting with Blue Wahoos manager Kevin Randel and pitching coach Dave Eiland.

Randel first mentions to Pérez about going up to Triple-A with the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp, but flips a laptop computer around and says that someone wanted to talk to him.

That person was Marlins star pitcher Sandy Alcantara, the 2022 National League Cy Young Award winner, who spent the off-season working out with Pérez and becoming friends.

"I'm now going to see your face every day," says Alcantara, speaking in Spanish. Pérez then has an emotional embrace with Eiland and Randel.

Pérez captivated the fans at Blue Wahoos Stadium with his performances and his engagement with fans, especially children, with whom he frequently posed with photos. He wound up making 23 starts for the Blue Wahoos with a 6-4 record and 148 strikeouts.

Miami's pitching staff was hit in early May with injuries, including to starters Johnny Cueto and Trevor Rogers, who did an injury rehab assignment last year in Pensacola. It helped that Pérez proved he was ready for the leap.

In his final two starts, Pérez worked a combined 11 innings and recorded 20 strikeouts while yielding just two earned runs. His final pitch was a 99-mph fastball to retire M-Braves slugger Drew Lugbauer, the club's all-time home run leader.

It's a scene that the Marlins hope to see for many years to come.





We want every game at Blue Wahoos Stadium to be BALLDARK RULES an enjoyable and memorable experience for every fan. To make that possible, the following rules are

- Foul/abusive language and/or rowdy behavior will not be tolerated and will be cause for ejection and/or arrest. Violators may also have their season tickets revoked. Notify the nearest guest services or safety/security representative immediately if actions of this type occur near you.
- · The use of derogatory language, which is defined as offensive language concerning another person's race, ethnicity, gender, religion, disability, age, sexual orientation, or national origin is cause for immediate ejection from the stadium without a refund and could result in future ticket loss.
- . By Major League Baseball rule, bags are not permitted in the stadium. Diaper bags, medical bags, and small purses are allowed.
- Entering the playing field without authorization or throwing objects onto the field is a violation of ballpark rules and may be hazardous. Offenders will be ejected and subject to arrest and prosecution.
- All tobacco and electronic cigarettes are prohibited in Blue Wahoos Stadium which includes the seating sections, concourses, and stairwells.
- Keep aisles clear at all times; emergency situations require that stairways be kept clear. Guests sitting or standing in the ballpark aisles jeopardize the safety of others.
- For your safety and the safety of those around you, please sit in your assigned seat to avoid inconveniencing other guests.
- · Drunk and disorderly behavior as well as violation of any alcohol policy will result in ejections from the ballpark without a refund and could result in the loss of season tickets. Underage consumption and the excessive consumption of alcohol is strictly prohibited.
- Umbrellas are allowed in the stadium. Please be courteous of those around you when using an umbrella.
- The Blue Wahoos ask that no one solicit contributions or distribute literature on stadium property without written approval of the team.
- · Flags and banners without poles are permitted. Flags must be event related and may not cover any ballpark signage. All flags or banners deemed inappropriate by stadium management are subject to removal.
- · Gates will open 60 minutes (1 hour) prior to the start of the game for admission into the stadium. We strongly encourage guests to enter the stadium as early as possible to avoid delays.
- All guests entering the stadium are subject to search. Refusal may be grounds to prohibit admission.
- The following items are prohibited from entering the stadium: bottles, cans, coolers, containers, fireworks, flares, pets or animals of any kind (with the exception of service animals), weapons, water guns, toy/replica weapons, squirt bottles, soap bottles, balloons, brooms, skateboards, roller blades or skates.
- Handheld radios and televisions are allowed as long as quests listen with an earpiece or headphones. Guests should be considerate of their neighbors when using these devices.
- · Outside food and beverages are not permitted inside the stadium. Concession stands are conveniently located on both sides of the concourse for your food and beverage needs.
