The first half of 2023 went pretty well for the Blue Wahoos. On the strength of returning players from last year's championship team and the addition of some talented newcomers, Pensacola clinched another first half title and punched their ticket to the playoffs come September.


Up and down the roster, we've seen so many outstanding performances. Patrick Monteverde has been the best pitcher in the league, ending the first half with a league-best seven wins and an ERA almost a full run better than the next qualified starter. On the offensive side, familiar names like Troy Johnston, Griffin Conine and Will Banfield have put up tremendous numbers as they search for a promotion to Triple-A and beyond. New arrivals like Cody Morissette and Victor Mesa Jr. have provided some big moments, too.


We've had plenty of guys take the next steps towards realizing their big league dreams. At the time I write this, five Blue Wahoos alumni have made their MLB debuts in 2023. That list is headlined by Eury Pérez, who began the year in Pensacola and has been nothing short of dominant since being promoted straight to the big leagues. Through his first eight starts with the Marlins, the 20-year-old phenom has the third-lowest ERA to start a career since they started keeping track of earned runs more than a century ago!

Speaking of former Blue Wahoos chasing ghosts, how about Luis Arraez? The hitting savant passed through Pensacola as a Twins prospect in 2019, and we now have an excuse to follow him closely as he's once again with our MLB affiliate in Miami. He's flirted with a .400 batting average - long thought to be an impossible relic of a bygone era - and helped lead the Marlins to a surprising playoff push.

So, what's next? We'll have plenty of individual performances to track in the second half, both in Pensacola and beyond, as more of our players climb the ranks. And we'll no doubt have a new infusion of exciting young stars arrive as the season goes along.

Last year, the Blue Wahoos used their first half championship to glide into the playoffs and eventually claim the Southern League title. So far, this season is following the exact same script!





Lieutenant Amanda Lee is a native of Mounds View, Minnesota. While attending the University of Minnesota Duluth, Amanda enlisted in the U.S. Navy as an Aviation Electronics Technician (AT). She was selected to commission as a Pilot through the Seaman-to-Admiral (STA-21) commissioning program in 2009. The following year, Lee attended the Naval Science Institute (NSI) for officer training in Newport, Rhode Island, and simultaneously began her studies at Old Dominion University in Norfolk, Virginia, where she received a Bachelor of Science in biochemistry.

Amanda joined the Blue Angels in September 2022. She has accumulated more than 1,360 flight hours and over 225 carrier-arrested landings. Her decorations include four Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medals and various personal and unit awards. In 2023, the Blue Angels welcomed Lt. Amanda Lee as the first woman F/A-18 demonstration pilot, a significant milestone in the squadron's 77-year history. She is the second woman pilot, following our previous C-130 pilot. The team is currently comprised of 24 total women who are junior and senior enlisted, and officers. 2023 marks the 50th Year of Women Serving in Naval Aviation. The first woman joined the Blue Angels in 1969.

When reflecting on the Blue Wahoos' past championship season, manager Kevin-Randel hits home with the significance of such an achievement.

"Winning championships is hard, no matter what level," he said. "It's a hard thing to do. Getting there, winning it, not an easy thing to do."

And yet, the Blue Wahoos as a franchise have made it look routine.

In clinching the first half Southern League South Division title on June 21 against the Tennessee Smokies, thus ensuring the Blue Wahoos an opportunity to defend their 2022 league championship, the feat continued an amazing trend.

This is the seventh time in the past eight seasons that Pensacola has reached the playoffs. And the Blue Wahoos have done it with three different affiliations.

"That is a testament to the fans who come out and support us every week," said Troy Johnston, who has spent part of the past two seasons with the Blue Wahoos. His two-run, two-out triple in the team's 3-1 win over the Smokies was the difference-maker in Pensacola's first-half clinching victory.

"Realistically we love showing up to the ballpark at home every day because know we will have a sold out crowd on a Tuesday," Johnston said. "We go to some of these other places and the crowds are not so great and the players have to bring the energy.

"Playing in Pensacola is an unbelievable place to play because the fans bring the energy every day every night and especially on weekends."

Pensacola's support has been rewarded with a rare run of sustained success.

It began in the second half of the 2015 season as a Cincinnati Reds affiliate. Manager Pat Kelly steered the Blue Wahoos to their first postseason appearance



"The franchise is pretty special," Randel said. "You just kind of thank the fans for coming out and showing up and keeping us going.

"We didn't have our best home record the first half (17-16), but I have a feeling the second half is going to be a lot better."

What enhanced the Blue Wahoos' division win this year is how much turnover occurred during the first three months of the season. It made for a different dynamic from a year ago when the Blue Wahoos clinched the division on the road against the Biloxi Shuckers.

The Blue Wahoos began 2023 with Dax Fulton, Eury Perez and Patrick Monteverde as their 1-2-3 pitchers in the starting rotation. Fulton got injured and Perez was promoted in May to Miami, where he made his debut and has since become one of the biggest stories in Major League Baseball among rookie sensations.

Monteverde stepped into the ace role and shined with one of the best records and earned run averages in Minor League Baseball during the first half of the season.

The Blue Wahoos also had catcher Paul McIntosh on the injured list, and had top performers Dane Myers and Sean Reynolds called up to Triple-A Jacksonville.

"Dane didn't get to celebrate with us even though he was one of the guys instrumental in our first half success," said Johnston. "But realistically, everyone knows about the player movement.

"Guys get moved and other guys step up. We have a really good team culture here for a Double-A team, even with a lot of movement. And it just helps that everyone is here for each other."

That kind of camaraderie is an element that Morissette believes has been a difference in the Blue Wahoos recent success.

"We have something great right here," Morissette said. "I've talked to some of the older guys on this team... you don't get a college clubhouse that often. But that's what we have.

"In (the clubhouse) we're all friends, we're all having fun, we all hang out off the field. We just have a really good group of guys. And we





have a really good group of leaders that know how to keep everyone together. Off days, we spend them all together. We hang out and I think that translates on the field."

The Blue Wahoos entered the final week of the first half schedule needing only one win to clinch the half.

But the first game that week in Tennessee was rained out. Before they played the second day, the Blue Wahoos already knew the Biloxi Shuckers had closed the gap with a second win against Chattanooga.

Pensacola trailed 1-0 into the eighth inning of the June 21 clinching game. Will Banfield tied it with a home run. Johnston's clutch single provided the go-ahead runs in the ninth. Reliever Jefry Yan sealed the win in the bottom of the ninth and did a celebratory leap and spin in the air.

"How the game unfolded, it was just a lot of pressure off the guys," Randel said. Me personally, win, lose or draw, you throw 'em (players) out there and see what they can do and I'm glad they came out on top."

The Blue Wahoos will be assured of a home-field edge in the South Division series that will begin on September 19 against the second-half champion, or the second-best team in win percentage, should the Blue Wahoos win the second half. The first game will be on the road, but the final two in the best-of-three series will be in Pensacola.

No matter how it unfolds, the Blue Wahoos' recent string of playoff trips is something rarely duplicated in any level of Minor League Baseball.

"I believe the most special part of this is that we all did it together," said Johnston on the first half success. "There wasn't just one guy that stood out and carried the team to the first half championship.

"Our pitching was great, our defense was great. I think we are one of the single best well-rounded teams that I have ever played on. We can hit, we can bunt, we can play the small game, we'll hit the long ball. It doesn't matter."

What has mattered most is winning games, as the Blue Wahoos have proven.

BUBBA WATSON grew up in Bagdad, Florida on his way to becoming a professional golfer and two-time Masters champion. Since returning to Pensacola with his family, Bubba has invested heavily in the community, opening Bubba's Sweet Spot downtown, donating generously to the Studer Family Children's Hospital, and becoming a part-owner of the Blue Wahoos with business partner RANDALL WELLS.

DERRICK BROOKS played youth football in his hometown of Pensacola, Florida before becoming a two-time All-American linebacker at Florida State and an 11-time Pro Bowler in a 14-year NFL career. He led the Tampa Bay Buccaneers to a Super Bowl title in 2003, was inducted into the Pro Football Hall of Fame in 2014, and joined the Blue Wahoos as an owner in 2018.

DANA SUSKIND is a professor of Surgery and Pediatrics at the University of Chicago Medical Center and the co-founder and co-director of the Thirty Million Words Center for Early Learning. She is a popular author and is devoted to treating children born with hearing loss.

JOHN LIST is an economist at the University of Chicago. The author of over 200 academic publications, he was a finalist for the Nobel Prize in economics in 2015 and is co-founder of the Thirty Million Words Center for Early Learning with Dana Suskind.

# FREDWATERS, YOUTH GLANG

At the urging of Blue Wahoos owner Quint Studer, the Fred Waters Youth Baseball Clinic was revived on June 10 at Blue Wahoos Stadium.

It included much of Pensacola's baseball royalty – generations of former players who reached the major leagues – and represented the community in special ways. They were instructors for youth players ages 7-12 in two different sessions that morning at the ballpark. The clinic was free.

Three of those former Pensacola players, Kevin Saucier, Greg Litton and Adron Chambers, all played in the World Series with different teams.

Also included were two former MLB managers: Jim Riggleman, who was the Blue Wahoos first manager in the 2012 inaugural season, and former Miami Marlins general manager Dan Jennings, who served as Marlins manager for one season.

"It is probably one of the most special things that has happened to me in a long time, baseball wise," said Mike Russell, a Gulf Breeze resident who was been a Major League Baseball scout since 1987 and was inducted in 2013 into the Professional Baseball Scouts Hall of Fame in Fort Myers.

Russell, a Detroit Tigers scout for more than 20 years, joined with former MLB pitcher Kevin Saucier in helping arrange the clinic. Both were annually part of the original Fred Waters Clinic that occurred from 1990 to 2001 at the University of West Florida's baseball Waters' daughter, Mary Francis, was at the June 10 clinic and was able to meet Quint Studer as well as thank Saucier

and others she met on the concourse that day for being part of bringing the event back to the community.

"That really meant so much to me. She said how much Fred would have loved this," said Saucier, who helped Escambia High win a pair of state championships when Fred Waters was the team's head coach.

Saucier then rose all the way to the major leagues where he was a reliever on the Philadelphia Phillies 1980 World Series championship team - the first in Phillies history.



"It was great getting all these guys together again," Saucier said. "You learn a few things for the future and there will be one again next year, but overall, I don't think we could have asked for a better day, a better turnout and the



experience for these kids."

Prior to the clinic's start, the former players, along with Blue Wahoos players Troy Johnston and Brady Puckett, gathered in the Blue Wahoos staff conference room to meet and retell stories.



"The thing about baseball is this.... you can go 20 years without seeing these guys," Russell said. "But you put us all together in a room and it's like we've talked every day. That is the way baseball is. And that is the way it's always been."

One of those examples was JJ Cannon, who in 1977 became the first Pensacola Junior College player to make an MLB debut. Cannon then went on to coach five different minor league teams. One of those was the St. Catharine's (Ontario) Blue Jays in the Pioneer League, then an affiliate with Toronto.

Russell was his third base coach for part of that season.

"I played junior college baseball with JJ's brother, Tim, then I got to know JJ. We were all involved in the Fred Waters clinic when it was here," Russell said. "I used to travel with Fred a lot when he was a scout.

"What a gentleman he was. If you didn't like Fred Waters, there was something wrong with you."

Waters, a Mississippi native and former MLB player, settled in Pensacola in 1958 and became a godfather of baseball in this community, including as head coach at three different high schools during the 1960s and '70s.

"This is going to be such a wonderful thing to keep Fred's name out there and get so many kids involved," Saucier said. "I am so thrilled Quint wanted to do this and get this (clinic) going again. It means a lot to all of us who were part of those clinics all those years ago and the impact that Fred Waters had on kids."

All participants received a free subscription to MLB.TV and MiLB.TV for the remainder of the season, which itself was a tremendous value. Each youth also received a plastic bat and ball for play in the backyard.

"Quint was very impressed with the people we had in those days at the Fred Waters Clinic when it was at UWF," Saucier said. "I mean in those days, we had Tommy Lasorda one year, Dusty Baker one year, all of our Pensacola guys, who were playing then, like Travis (Fryman) and Jay (Bell) and Jimmy Presley. Buck (Showalter, New York Mets manager) was part of it. I mean it was a huge deal.

"So Quint approached Mike and I and said he knew this couldn't be to that g degree, but he would like to keep Fred's name, keep this going. We will set up stations just like we did then. The bottom line is for kids to have fun. Stay involved in the game of baseball and have fun with it. That's the way Fred Waters wanted it."

#### Kevin Randel Manager

Kevin Randel has coached in the Marlins organization since 2010. A 13th round selection in the 2002 MLB Draft, Randel played eight seasons in the Marlins farm system, reaching the Triple-A level. After retiring following the 2009 season, he quickly transitioned into coaching in the Marlins organization. From 2010-2014, he served as a hitting coach before becoming a manager in 2015. Since, he's racked up over 300 wins managing at the A, A+, and AA levels.



#### Matt Snyder Hitting Coach

Matt Snyder comes to Pensacola after two successful seasons as the hitting coach in High-A Beloit. A 10th round selection in the 2012 MLB Draft by the New York Yankees, Snyder played professionally through the 2019 season with Triple-A New Orleans in the Marlins organization. The three-time Minor League All-Star was named the Marlins Player Development Staff Member of the Year in 2022.



#### **Dave Eiland Pitching Coach**

Dave Eiland brings over two decades of MLB experience to Pensacola in his second season as the Blue Wahoos pitching coach. After pitching in the Major Leagues for 10 seasons with the Yankees, Padres, and Devil Rays, Eiland won World Series rings as a pitching coach with the Yankees (2009) and Royals (2015) during a career as an MLB coach that stretched from 2008-2019.



#### Danny Black Defensive Coach

Danny Black played six seasons in the Marlins minor league system from 2010 to 2015, including parts of four seasons for Double-A Jacksonville in the Southern League and parts of two seasons with Triple-A New Orleans. He began his coaching career in 2018 and has served in various roles since, including as an assistant coach for Advanced-A Jupiter from 2018-2019 and as a defensive coach for Triple-A Jacksonville in 2021 and the FCL Marlins in 2022.




#### Seth Gregorich Strength Coach

#### **BLUE WAHOOS STADIUM**




Entering its 11th season, Blue Wahoos Stadium is widely considered one of the premier facilities in Minor League Baseball. Recently named the Best Ballpark in Double-A by Ballpark Digest, the stadium has established itself as one of the best places to enjoy a Minor League Baseball game in the country. A three-time recipient of the Southern League Ballpark of the Year, Blue Wahoos Stadium welcomed over two million fans in its first eight seasons, finishing first or second in the league in attendance five times.



With a capacity of 5,038 fans, Blue Wahoos Stadium is the smallest in the Southern League, allowing fans to get closer to the action than any other park in the league. Nestled alongside the water in Pensacola's Community Maritime Park, the field provides unbeatable views of the Pensacola Bay. The playing surface at Blue Wahoos Stadium was officially named Admiral Fetterman Field in 2015 in honor of the late Admiral Jack Fetterman, who was instrumental in the creation of Community Maritime Park for the Pensacola community.



Blue Wahoos Stadium and the surrounding Maritime Community Park were built to be used by the local community throughout the year, not just for Wahoos baseball games. Each year, over 200 events are held at the ballpark throughout the year, making it truly a stadium for the entire community, to enjoy.

#### **Honoring Admiral Fetterman**

On September 23, 2015, the field at Blue Wahoos Stadium was officially renamed Admiral Jack Fetterman Field. It honors the memory of Fetterman, a three-star Vice Admiral in the U.S. Navy who retired in Pensacola and became a prominent civic leader, dedicating himself, alongside his wife Nancy, to preserving Pensacola's history.

A strong advocate for the construction of Maritime Community Park and Blue Wahoos Stadium, Fetterman passed away on March 24, 2006 at the age of 74 and was never able to see his vision of a waterfront stadium become reality. Although he never watched the Wahoos play at the ballpark, his memory is honored at each game played on the field bearing his name.

As you enjoy today's game at Blue Wahoos Stadium, please take a moment in your own way to thank Admiral Fetterman for his contributions to the city of Pensacola and the United States military.

A Pennsylvania native, Fetterman graduated from college in 1954 and enlisted in the U.S. Navy. He made his first trip to Pensacola soon after to attend the Aviation Officer Candidate School at Naval Air Station Pensacola.

He rose in rank and was appointed Rear Admiral and then Vice Admiral, assuming command duties of the U.S. Naval Air Force Pacific Fleet in San Diego, a capacity he served in until 1990.

In 1991, Fetterman returned to Pensacola where his Naval career began and assumed duties as Chief of Naval Education and Training before retiring from active duty in 1993. During his illustrius Naval career, he formulated and produced the Core Values Training program, earning him the title of "Father of Navy Ethics."

He then became president and CEO of the National Naval Aviation Museum at NAS-Pensacola. Under his leadership, the museum grew in capacity and scope, making the facility one of the largest air and space museums in the world.

In addition to his work at NAS-Pensacola and with other U.S. Navy roles, Fetterman served his community in roles that included being Chairman of the Pensacola Mayor Community Core Values Board. He was also Chairman of the Pensacola Chamber of Commerce.

The Blue Wahoos are proud to honor Fetterman's service to our nation, along with his legacy and efforts to make Pensacola the greatest place to live on earth.



HEAD FOR THE MILL!

The triple-sport transition Cody Morissette always made from youth league to high school star in New Hampshire was taken as a simplistic challenge.

The quarterback, defensive back and punter would focus on football, then become a point guard in basketball, before becoming a baseball infielder to finish spring and summer. And this would all start again each year.

"When August came around, I picked up a football and tried to win a state championship," said Morissette in a matter-of-fact tone that revealed how he adjusted. "November came around, I picked up a basketball, and it took me a couple weeks to get my shot back, but I did. And I tried to win a state championship in that.

"But I always tried to get in the (batting) cage and work on my swing. Because baseball was my first love."

In fact, as Morissette explained, when baseball season beckoned, "It was like Christmas Day."

The gift keeps on giving.

After three sport stardom, then three seasons of collegiate baseball at Boston College, Morissette, 23, has quickly climbed to a rare level as a two-position infielder with the Blue Wahoos. He played a big role in helping the Blue Wahoos win the first half Southern League South Division championship. On the way, he attained one of baseball's sacred feats – hitting for the cycle on June 14 in the Blue Wahoos win against the Mississippi Braves in Pensacola.

That night at Blue Wahoos Stadium also happened to be the first time his mother, Kristen, a former star softball and basketball player at Plymouth (Mass.) State University, ever saw her son play in a professional baseball game.

"Watching him on TV or the computer is nothing like seeing him play in person," she said. "So special. And this stadium, this setting, is so beautiful. It's amazing."



Kristen and Dave Morissette, a former men's basketball player at Plymouth State where the two first met, are now coaching at their alma mater, which makes traveling away from their job a little challenging.

"Just to see Cody's face and (Kristen's) face that night after the game and how happy he was, I won't forget," said Dave Morissette, who had been able to see Cody play in a couple previous minor league games. "He's a coaches' kid and he's always been in athletics since he was born because of us. But to see him play at this level, in this stadium, we pinch ourselves every day."

Cody was the Miami Marlins' secondround pick in the 2021 MLB draft after being a three-year starter at Boston College and freshman All-American, Before the 2022 season. he was rated the Marlins' No. 20 overall prospect by MLB Pipeline.

He ioined the Blue Wahoos on April 25. The next night, his first Double-A hit was a solo home run. A month later, he became the fifth Blue Wahoos player to steal home in a game. He's been able to help the Blue Wahoos as a third baseman and second baseman.





Cody credits his mother for his baseball skills, saying, "I always say whenever I've been interviewed that my mother has the best swing in the family.... but I think I might have it now. I was blessed to have this swing. She gave it to me. She was a tremendous athlete."

He thanks his father for his passion and dedication.

"I had him turn on the car lights 8-9 o'clock at night and he would throw me batting practice until his arm fell off," Cody Morissette said. "I credit (mother and father) for everything they have done for me.

Though he was an all-state quarterback in football and was Mr. Basketball in named Hampshire as a prep senior, baseball was the sport Morissette loved the most and knew he would have a future beyond high school.

"Football helped me with the grind. Because football is a grind," said Morissette. "Basketball helped with my athleticism. But I never got tired of baseball.

"When opening day came, it was like, okay I have baseball for the next four to five months of my life. That is something I took pride in was playing three sports. It made me a better athlete and a better person.

His rapid climb in levels of pro baseball has caused Cody Morissette to make the adjustments to better pitching and faster speed of the game itself.

"I am starting to slow the game down now," said Morissette, who played most of last season for the Beloit Sky Carp. "Talking to the older guys, talking to the coaches, that is the big key. Slowing the game down right now is making it a lot easier and I am continuing to get better and that's the goal."

It led to his special night where he had doubled, tripled, then homered before coming up in a final at-bat against the Mississippi Braves needing a single.

Teammate Victor Mesa Jr, who hit for the cycle in April, was telling Cody to think blooper, a bloop single, anything, to get the base hit. Turns out, Morissette hit a spinning grounder that became an infield single.

"It is something I have never done and it's very rarely done by anyone," he said. "To be able to do it is extremely special."

And it's now part of Morissette's special achievements in a decorated athletic career.

We want every game at Blue Wahoos Stadium to be BALLDARK RULES an enjoyable and memorable experience for every fan. To make that possible, the following rules are

- Foul/abusive language and/or rowdy behavior will not be tolerated and will be cause for ejection and/or arrest. Violators may also have their season tickets revoked. Notify the nearest guest services or safety/security representative immediately if actions of this type occur near you.
- · The use of derogatory language, which is defined as offensive language concerning another person's race, ethnicity, gender, religion, disability, age, sexual orientation, or national origin is cause for immediate ejection from the stadium without a refund and could result in future ticket loss.
- . By Major League Baseball rule, bags are not permitted in the stadium. Diaper bags, medical bags, and small purses are allowed.
- Entering the playing field without authorization or throwing objects onto the field is a violation of ballpark rules and may be hazardous. Offenders will be ejected and subject to arrest and prosecution.
- All tobacco and electronic cigarettes are prohibited in Blue Wahoos Stadium which includes the seating sections, concourses, and stairwells.
- Keep aisles clear at all times; emergency situations require that stairways be kept clear. Guests sitting or standing in the ballpark aisles jeopardize the safety of others.
- For your safety and the safety of those around you, please sit in your assigned seat to avoid inconveniencing other guests.
- · Drunk and disorderly behavior as well as violation of any alcohol policy will result in ejections from the ballpark without a refund and could result in the loss of season tickets. Underage consumption and the excessive consumption of alcohol is strictly prohibited.
- Umbrellas are allowed in the stadium. Please be courteous of those around you when using an umbrella.
- The Blue Wahoos ask that no one solicit contributions or distribute literature on stadium property without written approval of the team.
- · Flags and banners without poles are permitted. Flags must be event related and may not cover any ballpark signage. All flags or banners deemed inappropriate by stadium management are subject to removal.
- · Gates will open 60 minutes (1 hour) prior to the start of the game for admission into the stadium. We strongly encourage guests to enter the stadium as early as possible to avoid delays.
- All guests entering the stadium are subject to search. Refusal may be grounds to prohibit admission.
- The following items are prohibited from entering the stadium: bottles, cans, coolers, containers, fireworks, flares, pets or animals of any kind (with the exception of service animals), weapons, water guns, toy/replica weapons, squirt bottles, soap bottles, balloons, brooms, skateboards, roller blades or skates.
- Handheld radios and televisions are allowed as long as quests listen with an earpiece or headphones. Guests should be considerate of their neighbors when using these devices.
