THORNS VISIT THE ROYALS

Back on the road after a two-game home series, Portland Thorns FC and Utah Royals will both be in search of their first win when they open NWSL Matchday 4 at America First Field.

Portland is set to kickoff its match against Utah on Prime Video (NWSL+ for international fans) beginning at 7 pm PT on Friday, April 11.

America First Field will play host to the 11th regular season meeting between the two clubs and the 12th matchup across all competitons.

LOOKING TO SNAP THE STREAK WITH A WIN

Heading into the weekend, Portland won't just be in search of its first 2025 NWSL win but also its first win against Utah since a 3-0 home victory in September 2020. The Thorns are winless in their last four matches against Royals (2L, 2D), so an opportunity lies this Friday for Portland to ignite the fire with a meaningful win.

MACCA STEPS UP IN A BIG WAY

Looking at Mackenzie Arnold in net to start the season, the Aussie international has come up big to sit 2nd in the league with 12 saves, making a huge PK save against North Carolina Courage's Jaedyn Shaw to keep the match level and record her first NWSL clean sheet since joining the Thorns.

In addition to going 2/2 in NWSL penalty attempts saved, Arnold is the first goalkeeper in 10 years to save the first two PK attempts faced in the regular season (excludes ball hitting posts, wide balls, etc.). The last to do so was Brittany Cameron for Sky Blue FC (now NJ/NY Gotham FC) in 2015, blocking her first attempt in 2013.

Plus, Arnold's PK save was Portland's 11th in NWSL regular season play, meaning no club has saved as many penalties as the Thorns (11 PKS/32 PKF).

BUILDING TOWARDS THE FIRST WIN

On the field, there's been a lot of positives for Portland to build off as they prepare for their next challenge against Utah.

In its last two matches (draws against Angel City FC and North Carolina Courage), the Thorns defense has shown signs of improvement to keep opponents at bay. During its home series, Portland's backline registered 30+ clearances (2nd-most in NWSL in the last two games with 63 total) while combining for 21 interceptions.

Up top, the Thorns are creating opportunities to threaten opponents as it sits 4th in the NWSL total shots with 31. The attacking abilities of Portland's young front line to enter the final third and create chances have been quite evident to start the season. As the technical staff work to improve finishing, the potential of this Portand attack is one that promising to be exciting and dangerous.

LETTING THE YOUTH SHINE

The Thorns fielded its second youngest ever lineup in club history against the Courage (and youngest since 2016), with an average age of 24 years and 288 days. As a reminder, the Thorns began the 2025 season with no field players 30 or older and remain the youngest squad in the NWSL with an average age of 25.10. Plus, players 25-years-old and younger have played 1902 minutes for the Thorns this season, most in the NWSL.

To start the 2025 season, Portland's youngsters have stepped into the spotlight ready to prove their capability to contribute. In her 5th season as a Thorn, 19-year-old midfielder Olivia Moultrie stands out as an offensive leader on the pitch. She opened Portland's 2025 scoring account against Kansas City and leads the team in penalty area entries with 26 (3rd-most in NWSL), which is more than that of second placed Hina Sugita and Sam Coffey combined (12 each).

Additionally, after a lengthy internal review process by Opta,

Moultrie was officially awarded with an assist for her pass to Reilyn Turner in the 1-1 draw against Angel City. The assist was Moultrie's 10th for the Thorns, making her the 10th player in Portland history to record at least 10 assists. Add on the fact that she's been the team's primary corner taker (12 taken so far) and it continues to showcase how much trust the technical staff and team have in the teenager.

Forwards Reilyn Turner (who joined midseason in 2024) and Caiya Hanks are also gaining more trust and confidence with the Thorns technical staff and becoming players fans are getting excited about, evident as they've worked up to becoming starters to lead the frontline. Turner's confidence was further boosted by scoring the equalizer against Angel City FC, her first NWSL regular season goal for Portland. To round up the Thorns' attacking youth, Pietra Tordin has been a headache for opposing defenders, already registering 4 shots despite having only contested 28 minutes.

Against a Royals backline that's allowed the second-most goals to start the season [7] with a combined 6 goals conceded in the last two games, the young Thorns offense needs to pounce on its opportunities to capitalize when given the chance.

AN EXCITING FRONTLINE ADDITION

On April 26, the Thorns announced they had signed Canadian international forward Marie-Yasmine "Mimi" Alidou from Portuguese giants SL Benfica. Alidou, who arrives on a transfer for her first ever NWSL stint, is signed with Portland through 2026 with a club option for 2027.

Perhaps not the highest profile name in international women's soccer but there's no doubting the level and experience that the 29-year-old brings to a new and relatively young Portland frontline.

In her debut season with Benfica in 2023, she led the team in scoring across all competitions with 26 goals (and assisted 3) on the path to winning all four domestic competitions that season as well as cementing Benfica as the first Portuguese side to reach the UEFA Women's Champions League quarterfinals. Combined between both seasons for the club, Alidou tallied 33 goals and 7 assists in 72 matches and 4,617 minutes played.

Her first season in Portugal was with Famalicão (2022-23) which saw her score 12 times and assist 4 across all competitions, helping the club lift its first Taça de Portugal Femenina trophy. Additional European clubs she fielded for include Sturm Graz (Austria; 2022), Klepp (Norway; 2020-21), Sporting Huelva (Spain; 2019-20) and Linköpings FC (2018). Alidou got her professional start in France with the historic Olympique de Marseille organization, debuting in 2017.

In addition to her club career, she has international experience as a member of the Canada Women's National Team where she shared the field with current Thorn Jessie Fleming and the legendary Christine Sinclair. In 8 caps, Alidou has started 5 matches and scored 5 goals. Her most notable moment with Canada came in the form of her first international hat-trick in a dominant 7-0 victory against Chinese Taipei Cup this past February.

INTERNATIONAL THORNS RECAP

Portland Thorns FC had 11 players called up to represent their countries in the April 2025 FIFA Women's International Window, making key appearances and gaining valuable experience in competitive matches across the globe. As many began their returns back to Portland on Wednesday to partake in the final training session on Thursday, see below a recap of each player's participation this international window.

Midfielder Sam Coffey played a key role in midfield in the USWNT's 2-0 victory against Brazil at SoFi Stadium and came on in the second half in a tightly contested second 2-1 loss against their South American rival in San Jose.

Midfielder Jessie Fleming and forward Mimi Alidou suited up for Canada in two matches against Argentina, coming together to

help Les Rouges put up an impressive 3-0 result at BC Place in the first game then falling 1-0 in the follow up.

For Australia, defender Kaitlyn Torpey contributed to two shutout wins (1-0, 2-0) against confederation rivals South Korea, even finding the back of the net in the second match. Goalkeeper Mackenzie Arnold had been called up to play in Australia's matches, but a minor arm injury saw her forced to withdraw from camp as a precautionary measure.

Midfielder Hina Sugita made her long-awaited return to action with the Japanese National Team, captaining the side for a full match in a 6-1 win over Colombia to go undefeated in the twomatch series against the South American side. Japan drew 1-1 in the first match which saw Sugita come in as a second half sub.

Defender Reyna Reyes and Mexico won both their matches against Jamaica with clean sheets (3-0, 4-0), with Reyes playing the full 90 in the second game held at Houston's Shell Energy Stadium.

Defender Isabella Obaze was a member of Denmark's UEFA Women's Nations League matches against Wales (2-1 W) and Italy (3-0 L), with the Danes' victory against the Welsh setting them up in a good position to gain movement up the group standings in the next window.

Wrapping up the International Report, midfielder Olivia Moultrie as well as forwards Caiya Hanks and Reilyn Turner participated in U.S. Soccer's U-23 "Futures Camp," a camp that featured up-andcoming USWNT prospects and were observed by senior USWNT technical staff including Head Coach Emma Hayes.

MILESTONE WATCH

Bella Bixby - Regular Season Club Shutouts

Currently has 24 shutouts and is 1 away from becoming the 7th goalkeeper in NWSL to reach 25 for one club. If she reaches the milestone, she would be the second Portland keeper to do so after AD Franch who recorded 26 as a Thorn.

Sam Coffey - Regular Season Club Assists

Currently has 13 assists and is 2 behind Sophia Wilson for 4thmost in Thorns history.

Olivia Moultrie - Regular Season Club Goals

Currently has 11 goals and her next goal will tie her with Tobin Heath and Hayley Raso for 9th in club history.

Olivia Moultrie - Regular Season Goals by Teenager

Currently has 11 goals and is 3 away from recording the most goals by a teenager in the NWSL. Moultrie has until her birthday in September to score 3 more times to beat the record currently held by North Carolina's Jaedyn Shaw who bagged 13 goals before turning 20 last November.

Hina Sugita - Regular Season Club Goals

Currently has 13 goals and is 2 away from becoming the 8th player to reach the 15-goal mark as a Thorn.

Hina Sugita - Regular Season Club Assists

Additionally, currently has 12 assists and is 1 behind Sam Coffey and Allie Long for 5th-most in Portland history.



NOTABLE QUOTES

Head Coach Rob Gale

On the team's performance vs North Carolina... (Post NC)

"I thought we started well, started better. I wanted us to shoot a little more often, we kept trying to beat the defenders... we readjusted the defensive shape after 35 minutes and it was a lot better. That was the most I've seen North Carolina play long and we've played them a few times, they had run out of ideas when they couldn't go through the midfield. Second half, we were the better team for sure. Subs came on again, caused havoc. [We] just got to find that last little bit, force the will like we did. Fearless second half is how we need to play."

On Caiya Hanks' progression to becoming a starter... (Post NC)

"I told her 'trust your qualities.' She makes natural runs and when she's isolated 1v1 with the [opponent] center back down the channels, you know she's caused all kinds of problems. We got to keep getting her in attacking situations, facing the defender 1v1 and then backing up because you can see how much problem she can cause an opponent."

On Mackenzie Arnold's performance and development... (Post NC)

"Terrific. She's starting to grow in the team, she's a captain and she feels more comfortable. Now you can see with that new group that came in last year at the end and the new faces we've got this year, she feels that she's a big part of it. They nominated her as captain so that leadership role is starting to take place. I was delighted for her tonight and I knew she would save the penalty. Great performance from Macca and deserved the clean sheet."

On facing Utah on the road on top of the challenge of numerous players having been out on international duty... (Pre UTA)

"It's going to be how ready we can get the players that we would like to be on the field, and how many of those is possible. The good part is the ones who maybe haven't featured as much, could be called upon, either from the start or to finish the game. I've had a good amount of work in the time between but when you go there, it's a challenging place with the altitude. We're only going in late (Thursday) after training here to change that up, which should help with a little bit of the recovery for the players to sleep in their own bed and minimize the time on the road. They're very high in their pressing and their organization and they love to jump and come at you, so we're going to have to be very good on the ball and continue to put out the offensive output we've done through the first three games in the season."

On the youth leading Portland's offense... (Pre UTA)

"For them, it's trying to reiterate that they're doing the right things. Keep their confidence, make sure they're not second guessing their abilities... opportunities are being created these by youngsters and we want them to know that they have our trust, that they're creating the chances. We're winning the ball back in higher areas up the field, which is leading to more pressures and more opportunities. And if you continue to do those right things, you will get rewarded."

Forward Caiya Hanks

On the team's perforance vs North Carolina... (Post NC)

"I'm really happy with the way we performed. We created a lot of chances and we need to work on putting them away, but I think the energy was there, the confidence was there so I'm pretty proud of the performance."

On her first professional start and it being in Portland... (Post NC)

"I'mso grateful. The girls have been great for me as well as the coaching staff being really supportive. I'm super grateful to be able to play in front of the fans who are super supportive and awesome. Hearing them scream, yell and cheer is really motivating so it's a blessing."

Forward Deyna Castellanos

On the scoring opportunities the Thorns are creating... (Pre UTA)

"The positive side is that we are creating a lot of opportunities, a lot of chances, we just need to finalize. Obviously, that's something that we want to improve, and not just our forwards, but also, like, our midfield line and everybody on the team that because we all were capable of scoring and yeah, like, is a topic that we have been talking a lot about.

On her and teammates adjusting to new roles... (Pre UTA)

"I think it's fun. We have a lot of quality players in the midfield and I think it's very fun that we all can rotate and play in different positions. In that way, we are also not that predictable about who is going to play where. We all are very capable of adapting to any position that Rob wants us in that day. So I think that is an advantage for us as a team. I already knew that was going to be the role for me to play anywhere in the midfield or in the attacking line and I think that's a great quality that this team really has."



NOTABLE QUOTES

On being away from the Venezuelan National Team this international break due to travel uncertainties... (Pre UTA)

"Obviously, the situation here and in Venezuela, like the political situation, is very tricky. So for me, I have a responsibility here. Obviously, I'm under a contract and the uncertainty of like, 'yeah, I can go home, but not knowing if I can come back' is something that is very scary, not just for me, but for players across the the league. It was very sad that I couldn't go with the national team, but I think it was the right decision for me to stay and just keep training and growing here."

Goalkeeper Mackenzie Arnold

On the team's improvements... (Post NC)

"Our performances have been building each week. Obviously we have a really new team this year and each game, you can see we're getting more and more comfortable playing with each other... each game we're getting better and better."

On the crucial penalty save... (Post NC)

"For whatever reason, I enjoy penalties. I don't really feel much pressure with them and [Jaedyn Shaw's] run-up was quite straight so I just made my bets and thankfully it paid off."

On her first NWSL clean sheet... (Post NC)

"It was really special. It's been a long time coming for this shutout. We're getting more confident with each game and personally, I'm glad I could get my first shutout. I obviously hadn't had the best start to my career here at Portland so to get that shutout and play decently well was a big step forward for all of us."

Ex-Thorn and USWNT icon Becky Sauerbrunn

On being honored by the Thorns... (Post NC)

"It's been really great. I was pretty intentional with how I announced my retirement, I wanted to peace out quietly but it has been really great... and I'm very thankful to the Thorns for making me feel very special today."

On the team's first clean sheet... (Post NC)

"You can never underemphasize how important it is to keep a clean sheet. For this defense with so many new players and having that

combination and [Mackenzie Arnold] coming up huge today – I thought she did really great– it's a really good thing to get [the first clean sheet] earlier in the season so you get that pressure off of you and I thought the defense was stellar today."



JEFF AGOOS, PRESIDENT & GENERAL MANAGER OF SOCCER OPEARTIONS



Jeff Aguos was named President and General Manager of Soccer Operations for Portland Thorns FC on January 7, 2025. A legendary figure in American soccer, Aguos brings unparalleled expertise and an extensive track record of success to his leadership role with the Thorns.

Agoos is one of the most accomplished players in Major League Soccer (MLS) history, with a career that spanned more than a decade at the highest levels of the game. As a standout defender for the LS. Mer's National Team. Agons earned 124 caps and represented his country in three FIFA World Cups—1994, 1998, and 2002. His defensive provess and leadership on the international stage were integral to the success of the U.S. during his tenure, and he remains a central figure in the country's soccer history.

A key contributor to the dominance of MLS in its early years, Agoos played for two of the league's most successful franchises—D.C. United and the San Jose Earthquakes. During his career, he amassed five MLS Cup championships, the most by any player in league history. His time with D.C. United saw him win MLS titles in 1980, 1997, and 1999, while his later years with San Jose were highlighted by additional titles in 2001 and 2003, cementing his place as one of the league's most decorated players. In recognition of his extraordinary career, Agoos was inducted in the National Soccer Hall of Fame in 2009.

Following his retirement from playing in 2005, Agoos transitioned to executive leadership, where he has continued to shape the landscape of American soccer. He served as lechnical Director for the New York Red Bulls, a role in which he was responsible for overseeing player development, team operations, and strategic direction. Most recently, Agoos held the position of Senior Vice President of Competition, Operations, and Medical at Najor League Soccer. In this capacity, he jouged a pivotal role in the league's growth, overseeing key areas such as competition integrity, operations, and player welfare, all while enhancing MLS's global standing.

MIKE NORRIS, TECHNICAL DIRECTOR



Mike Norris was named Technical Director of Portland Thorns FC after serving as the team's fifth head coach. In his new role, Norris will focus on scouting, talent acquisition, and player development. As head coach, he posted a record of 10-7-8 in 25 NWSL matches.

Before joining the Thorns, Norris spent eight years with Canada Soccer, where he served as the set play and goalkeeper coach for the Canada Women's National Team from 2019 to 2021. During that time, Canada won a gold medal at the Tokyo 2020 Olympics.

Born in Ashington and raised in Newcastle upon Tyne, Norris brings a wealth of experience in soccer both internationally and domestically to his role with the Thorns.

ROB GALE, HEAD COACH



Rob Gale was appointed Head Coach of Portland Thorns FC in July 2024.

Gale joined the Thorns in March 2023 as an assistant coach under Mike Norris. He became the first Zambian-born individual to coach an NWSL team and win a league match.

Before his time with Portland, Gale built a strong coaching background at both the youth and professional levels. He began as a youth coach in NYCFC's academy system before becoming head coach and general manager of Valour FC in the Canadian Premier League. Additionally, he worked as a youth coach for Canada's national team programs, contributing to the development of emerging players.

CREDENTIALS

- Media members may apply for single-game matches, as well as season credentials by filling out the form located at thorns.com/media-resources/media-credentials.
- Credential applications must be submitted <u>no later than 72</u> <u>hours</u> from match kickoff.
- The club will credential a limited number of non-rights media personnel, subject to the availability of media positions in the press seating areas, photographer, videographer and TV crew areas, as well as the photo workroom.
- Applications from freelance writers, photographers or videographers must come from a direct supervisor validating professional and editorial need for media access.
- Media members may not use credentials for preferential access, such as autographs, photographs or personal requests. Violations will result in potential loss of credential for any future match.

CREDENTIAL PICKUP & MEDIA ENTRANCE

- All media personnel must enter the stadium through Gate G on matchday. (SW 20th Ave., along the west side of Providence Park). Gate G will open 90 minutes prior to kick off on matchday.
- A member of Thorns gameday staff will be available at Gate G for credential pickup between the time media entrance begins and match kickoff.
- Photographer bibs will also be available at Gate G during this time window so please make sure to request it with the Thorns gameday staff member present.
- Media needing to pick up their credentials earlier or later than the Gate G credential pickup window can do so at Booth 3 at Gate F (located at the intersection of SW 20th Ave. and SW Morrison St.)

PARKING

- The Thorns have limited spots available for media to park in at the US Bank Lot located on SW Morrison St. Check in with Thorns PR before each match to inquire about parking availability as the list does change on a per-match basis based on demand.
- For weekend matches, the parking lot opens 3 hours before kickoff. For weekday matches, the parking lot will open at 5 pm.
- Media can street park should they need to park earlier than when the lot opens or are not on the parking list.

PROFESSIONALISM

- While on assignment at either training or match day, media is expected to dress professionally, meaning no jerseys or team representation of any kind.
- Failure to comply may result in loss of credential.

The walkway leads directly to the press box. For media members needing elevator access, please use the suite elevator located on the northwest corner of the concourse

PHOTO, VIDEO AND BROADCAST

- Approved photographers, videographers and TV crews will be permitted to shoot the match from assigned positions. Media members may not shoot in the stands or on the concourse without prior approval from the PR team. Under no circumstance can media members sit in front of the field boards.
- There is no photo access behind the goals without prior approval from a member of the PR team.
- Photographers and videographers are not allowed to shoot inside of the sixyard box.
- Media members are encouraged to stay on one endline during match play. Due to field seating, the east sideline is strictly off limits. Media are allowed to use the east sideline to pass from one end of the field to the other. The concrete area in the northeast corner near the photo work room is available for media to access when space is available during the run of play.
- Media members will only be allowed to cross the west sideline behind the benches during warm-ups, halftime or postgame when permitted by the PR team. The west sideline is off limits during the match for any non-club personnel. Due to limited space at Providence Park, photographers and videographers may only shoot from behind the field boards. Media should not utilize camera well platforms in the seating bowl to shoot the match without advanced approval from the communications staff. In addition, media are not permitted to shoot photos or video from the press box.
- Photographers, with the exception of club content staff and NWSL Live Content Creators (LCC), are not allowed on the pitch at any time, including warmups. At no point should photographers, videographers or TV crews enter the playing field, locker rooms, or other restricted areas proximate to players, coaches or club delegation members.

POST-GAME PRESS CONFERENCES

- The home team post-game press conference will be conducted in the Media Conference Room (MCR) approximately 15 minutes after the final whistle.
- The MCR is located on the inside concourse on field level, near the northwest corner of the field. Media are advised to take the suite elevator or stairs to field concourse level to access the MCR.
- The Thorns Head Coach as well as two players will be available for media, 15 minutes for each interview.
- Should you have a specific player request for post-match, please alert a member of the Thorns PR staff.
- For media members wanting to join virtually, get in touch Thorns PR to get the meeting link.
