#### THORNS CLOSE WEEK 6 AT HOME

Portland are back at Providence Park for a Sunday matchup against Racing Louisville FC, looking to record consecutive wins for the first time this season.

Portland kickoff against Louisville on Paramount+ and NWSL+ at 1 pm PT on Sunday, April 27.

#### STARTING OFF UNBEATEN AT HOME

After their dominant 4-1 display against Gotham FC, the Thorns remain undefeated at Providence Park to start 2025 with a record of 1W. 2D.

Historically, the Thorns have been consistent in starting NWSL seasons strong at home. Per Opta, the Thorns are 13W-1L-6D in matches played at Providence Park during the months of March and April.

The Thorns will hope to string together its first set of back-to-back wins in 2025 against Louisville to add a 14th to the aforementioned March/April record plus uphold its undefeated home record of 3W, 1D against the Kentucky side.

#### THORNS OVERCOME THE GOTHAM OBSTACLE

Portland's victory over Gotham was the first time the Thorns beaten their east coast rival since October 2023. The Thorns had lost their previous four encounters with Gotham which includes the 2024 quarterfinal match that Portland lost in heartbreaking fashion with the stoppage time winner from Gotham.

Needless to say, the sense of relief felt by those on the Thorns after avenging last season's playoff exit and putting an end to the losing streak was highly evident from the players, staff and fans after Tuesday's victory, made all the more better by the way in which they finally bested Gotham.

#### **NOTABLE DEBUT GOALS**

Tuesday's victory over Gotham was the first time that four goal scorers scored their first-regular season goals for the Thorns (Mimi Alidou, Deyna Castellanos, Caiya Hanks, Jayden Perry) and just the second time in NWSL history that that has happened in a single match (Last time was in 2024, KC Current 5-4 Portland) Two of those goals were scored by NWSL rookies Hanks and Perry, who are quickly beginning to establish a name for themselves in the league as two up and coming talents to watch out for.

Analyzing those two rookie contributions, Hanks is the first NWSL rookie since Jameese Joseph in June 2024 to score and assist in a single NWSL match, the seventh rookie this season to find the back of the net and the third whose debut goal was a game-winner.

As for Perry, is the first rookie in NWSL history to convert a penalty within her first four regular season games, one faster than Mallory Swanson (5th game) in 2017.

Castellanos' first goal for Portland was an extremely meaningful one for the Venezuelan international, as that goal marked the end of her 23-match goal scoring drought. And for veteran Canadian forward Mimi Alidou, it was her way of continuing to showcase the sort of offensive finising and ability she can bring to this young Portland squad.

#### THORNS X WNBA PORTLAND FACILITY GROUNDBREAKING

Before beating Gotham 4-1 at Providence Park, RAJ Sports, the Portland Thorns and WNBA Portland broke ground earlier that same day for its historic \$150 million, 12-acre Women's Performance Center, a first-of-its-kind dual sport women's facility that'll continue to cement Portland as a global epicenter of women's sports.

The 12-acre performance center will feature the following:

- Dedicated rooms for player's families
- Team meeting rooms and social media content rooms
- Private player parking and player entry for convenience and security

#### LOOKING TO END THE WINLESS STREAK

After snapping a four-game losing streak against Gotham, the Thorns will now hope to end another winless streak this Sunday when they host Louisville.

Their last encounter in October 2024 seemed primed for a scoreless draw until Louisville found the late winner at home. Portland's last win against Louisville was in April 2023, a 2-0 home victory. Since then, the Thorns have lost twice on the road and drawn once at home (a second half stoppage time equalizer by Sam Coffey rescued the point on that occassion).

#### FIRST BATTLE AT HOME FOR GALE

The last time Portland and Louisville played at Providence Park – a match that ended in a 2-2 draw – Mike Norris was still Head Coach for the Thorns. It was ultimately the final home game for Norris as Head Coach before it was announced three weeks later that

Rob Gale would be taking over as interim head coach following a shift in Thorns soccer operations which saw Norris shift over to technical director.

Gale would go on to lead Portland to a strong 4-1 win over Houston at home in his first match as head coach and finished the regular season with an 11W-9L-3D record.

Having suffered defeat on the road last year in his first meeting with Louisville, Gale will have his first opportunity to lead the Thorns at home against the Kentucky team. With recent momentum and the support of the fans, he'll hope results can go his way to keep Portland's undefeated home record against Louisville going.

#### THE TURNER CONNECTION

This Sunday's match will be the first match that forward Reilyn Turner will take on her former side at her new home.

Turner had initally signed on for Louisville after being selected #6 in the first round of the 2024 NWSL College Draft. Across all competitions, she made 19 appearances, scored five goals and assisted two others.

The young forward would ultimately be traded to Portland for Janine Beckie in August of last year. However, it's seeming like the trade has worked in her favor as she's netted three times across all competitions for the Thorns – including the NWSL quarterfinal match last year – and has established herself as a starter for a Portland side in the midst of its new era

No doubt Turner will look forward to welcoming familiar faces to her new home, including best friend and USWNT international Emma Sears, but as the saying goes "Friendship does not exist once the whistle blows."

#### WITHOUT THE IRONWOMEN

One of the challenges Portland will face against Louisville is not having captain Sam Coffey in the midfield, who'll be missing the

match on an excused absence.

Prior to missing Sunday's contest, Coffey had been the only Thorns player to contest every single minute of NWSL action to start the season, playing a pivotal role holding down the defensive midfield and registering the game-winning assist for Caiya Hanks' goal against Gotham.

Coffey is expected to return to NWSL action next week against Orlando Pride, but the Thorns will need to make sure to carry on its momentum and take care of business against Louisville.

#### **MILESTONE WATCH**

#### Bella Bixby - Regular Season Clean Sheets

Currently has 25 clean sheets and needs 1 more to tie AD Franch's club record of 26 as well as 6th-most in league history for a single club.

#### Sam Coffey - Regular Season Assists

Currently has 14 assists and is 1 behind Sophia Wilson for 4thmost in Thorns history.

#### Olivia Moultrie - Regular Season Goals

Currently has 11 goals and her next goal will tie her with Tobin Heath and Hayley Raso for 9th in club history.

#### Olivia Moultrie - Regular Season Goals by Teenager

Currently has 11 goals and is 3 away from recording the most goals by a teenager in the NWSL. Moultrie has until her birthday in September to score 3 more times to beat the record currently held by North Carolina's Jaedyn Shaw who bagged 13 goals before turning 20 last November.

#### Olivia Moultrie - Regular Season Assists

Currently has 10 assists and her next assist will tie her with Alex Morgan for 8th in club history.

#### Hina Sugita - Regular Season Goals

Currently has 13 goals and is 2 away from becoming the 8th player to reach the 15-goal mark as a Thorn.





#### **NOTABLE QUOTES**

#### **Head Coach Rob Gale**

#### On the team's performance vs Gotham... (Post GFC)

"Terrific start, goal was brilliant. We worked on how to exploit their spaces, switch the point of attack, isolate and overload and get into key areas to score so I was delighted with that. Unfortunately, we made a mistake and coughed it up for their goal and didn't get across to cover it. I thought after such a positive start, it rocked [us] a bit because it was right after [our] goal. Young group, we let one mistake define us for 15-20 minutes... but [Gotham] didn't create any chances. Although I don't think we were terrific for a patch there, I knew going into halftime that we could go in and get the press right for the second half. Once we got the intention and intensity that, we knew we could lock them into wide areas... knew we had the legs to hurt them and turn them around... could've scored more bu the end.

It was a lovely Tuesday night in Portland. The fans were behind us and after a great day with the groundbreaking [of the Thorns x WNBA Portland Women's Performance Center] today, it was a terrific way to end it for the Portland faithful, so I was really pleased for the players and the fans tonight."

#### On the second half adjustments vs Gotham... (Post GFC)

"When we're aggressive and assertive... that's the identity of what we want to be and who we are. We dominated a top team in the league tonight, that second half was from the players a bit of a statement... It's been coming."

#### On the team's attitude and mentality during the tough scheduling... (Post GFC)

"Testament to all the players, over two games in such a short turnaround. We didn't get back until 2 am from Seattle. The day off doesn't feel like a day off, it's not a day off for the staff that came in Monday and Tuesday. The attitude was amazing, the quality of the football and training, I told [the team] they have been absolutely first class. So pleased with the attitude. There was a real focus before the game, the warmup. Despite that one mistake rocking them, we really got after it. We had brought 19 players featured between those two games and we talk about how we have to do it touether.

We're not a team full of superstars... being servants to the team and being humble, serving something bigger than ourselves. I thought they

all did that tonight and I'm so proud of them, of these young women. They're such a fun group to work with and when they get the rewards that their football deserves. I'm really pleased for them."

#### On the team's notential coming to fruition... (Post GFC)

"Honestly, pleased for the players. We believe in them, we see the potential, the identity we're trying to build is obvious. The performances have been good. You don't always get what you deserve in football and tonight, we did. Second half was excellent. Pleased for the players above all else, pleased for the supporters... because you want [the team] to fulfil their potential every time they go out there but we know there's going to be peaks and valleys with the youngest group. I've been in football too long to expect it to just be a fast trajectory... The signs are there, they're coming... Credit to the squad, the group, the attitude of these players. Super proud of them."

#### **Forward Caiya Hanks**

#### On the team's performance vs Gotham... (Post GFC)

"It was a really good match for us. Everything was coming together the way that we wanted it to. Sam Coffey gave us a great speech at the beginning to play with intensity but to also smile and have fun. That really showed today and everyone was happy."

#### On her first professional goal... (Post GFC)

"I saw Sam [Coffey] go through and she's our 6 so I was like 'I have to get in the box for her.' She made that effort to make that run so I decided to come back for her to cut back and honestly, I released all my thoughts and hesitations to just hit. It was just a really great moment, especially coming from Sam. She's been really supportive of me to breakout and be myself."

#### On her first professional assist and relationship with Mimi Alidou... (Post GFC)

She just got here... and she's my locker neighbor so we just chat here and there. She's really communicative and I got this weird feeling, connection where... 'I know you're going to be there.' It's weird because I've never known her before and we don't even follow each other on Instagram yet but it's really cool though when you meet those people because you know it's going to be a great relationship on and off the field. I knew she was there: I felt her presence."



#### **NOTABLE QUOTES**

#### On Portland putting four past Gotham... (Post GFC)

"I think we all knew we were due for a win. In our past few games, we had an issue with coming out slow, so I think that was out biggest thing for this game, to come out with the intensity, come out with the fire... Once one or two go in, they just start flowing. Everybody else finds those opportunities, so we were due for one [a high-scoring win]."

#### On the Rose City Riveters feeding her energy... (Post GFC)

I hear them and I'm like 'Go faster, go faster, go faster!' Honestly, I got caught a few times running faster than the ball was moving but yeah, it's so fuelling, and it builds so much fire and intensity for me and it's a

#### On the team's performance vs Gotham... (Post GFC)

"First half was a lot more defending than possession based, so [adjusting to be more offensive] was a goal coming into the second half. Obviously, we came out on the front foot and the momentum - especially from our fans - didn't stop the whole half and that's why we got three in that second half."

#### On her first professional goal being a PK... (Post GFC)

My teammates and my coaches put their trust in me to designate me to take that PK. I know that they had my back. I went into it confident and the fans behind the goal, I knew like no matter what, they're the best in the world. [I just took] a deep breath, letting go of everything and being confident in myself, doing what I know I can do."

#### On what her first goal would mean to her younger self... (Post GFC)

"[My younger self would] probable be crying right now. For a lot of us, it's such a dream of ours to play at this level. Not only are we here but we (Caiya and Jayden) scored our first goals tonight and that brings so much joy not only to myself right now but to my family. My mom and my sister were here today so that meant extra to me. [My younger self] would be jumping with joy. All of us today showed that we were playing with that passion that we had as little kids."

#### On why she took the PK... (Post GFC)

"One of my first weeks here, I told Rob 'Can I practice some PK's?' because I take PK's, I'm confident in myself. If you trust me, I will go and do the job."

### On the team's youth and chemistry... (Post GFC)

"Having a young team makes us so much closer too. We can hang out and go do stuff, we get each other. Especially a lot of us younger ones coming out of college, we're experiencing the same things so it's easy to lean in on each other."





#### JEFF AGOOS. PRESIDENT & GENERAL MANAGER OF SOCCER OPEARTIONS



Jeff Agoos was named President and General Manager of Soccer Operations for Portland Thorns FC on January 7, 2025. A legendary figure in American soccer, Agoos brings unparalleled expertise and an extensive track record of success to his leadership role with the Thorns.

Agoos is one of the most accomplished players in Major League Soccer (MLS) history, with a career that spanned more than a decade at the highest levels of the game. As a standaut defender for the U.S. Men's National Team, Agoos earned 134 caps and represented his country in three FIFA World Cups—1994, 1998, and 2002. His defensive prowess and leadership on the international stage were integral to the success of the U.S. during his fenure, and he remains a central figure in the country's soccer history.

A key contributor to the dominance of MLS in its early years, Agoos played for two of the league's most successful franchises—O.C. United and the San Jose Earthquakes. During his career, he amassed five MLS Cup championships, the most by any player in league history. His time with O.C. United saw him win MLS titles in 1995, 1997, and 1999, while his later years with San Jose were highlighted by additional titles in 2001 and 2003, cementing his place as one of the league's most decorated players. In recognition of his extraordinary career, Agoos was inducted into the National Succer Hall of Fame in 2009.

Following his retirement from playing in 2005, Agoos transitioned to executive leadership, where he has continued to shape the landscape of American soccer. He served as Technical Director for the New York Red Bulls, a role in which he was responsible for overseeing player development, team operations, and strategic direction. Most recently, Agoos held the position of Senior Vice President of Competition, Operations, and Medical at Najor Leaque Soccer. In this capacity, he played a nivotal role in the league's growth, overseeing key areas such as competition integrity, operations, and player welfare, all while enhancing MLS's global standing.

#### MIKE NORRIS. TECHNICAL DIRECTOR



Mike Norris was named Technical Director of Portland Thorns FC after serving as the team's fifth head coach. In his new role, Norris will focus on scouting, talent acquisition, and player development. As head coach, he posted a record of 10-7-8 in 25 NWSL matches.

Before joining the Thorns, Norris spent eight years with Canada Soccer, where he served as the set play and goalkeeper coach for the Canada Women's National Team from 2019 to 2021. During that time, Canada won a gold medal at the Tokyo 2020 Olympics.

Born in Ashington and raised in Newcastle upon Tyne, Norris brings a wealth of experience in soccer both internationally and domestically to his role with the Thorns.

#### ROB GALE, HEAD COACH



Rob Gale was appointed Head Coach of Portland Thorns FC in July 2024.

Gale joined the Thorns in March 2023 as an assistant coach under Mike Norris. He became the first Zambian-born individual to coach an NWSL team and win a league match.

Before his time with Portland, Gale built a strong coaching background at both the youth and professional levels. He began as a youth coach in NYCFC's academy system before becoming head coach and general manager of Valour FC in the Canadian Premier League. Additionally, he worked as a youth coach for Canada's national team programs, contributing to the development of emerging players.

### CREDENTIALS

- Media members may apply for single-game matches, as well as season credentials by filling out the form located at thorns.com/media-resources/media-credentials.
- Credential applications must be submitted no later than 72 hours from match kickoff.
- The club will credential a limited number of non-rights media personnel, subject to the availability of media positions in the press seating areas, photographer, videographer and TV crew areas, as well as the photo workroom.
- Applications from freelance writers, photographers or videographers must come from a direct supervisor validating professional and editorial need for media access.
- Media members may not use credentials for preferential access, such as autographs, photographs or personal requests. Violations will result in potential loss of credential for any future match.

### CREDENTIAL PICKUP & MEDIA ENTRANCE

- All media personnel must enter the stadium through Gate G on matchday. (SW 20th Ave., along the west side of Providence Park). Gate G will open 90 minutes prior to kick off on matchday.
- A member of Thorns gameday staff will be available at Gate G for credential pickup between the time media entrance begins and match kickoff.
- Photographer bibs will also be available at Gate G during this time window so please make sure to request it with the Thorns gameday staff member present.
- Media needing to pick up their credentials earlier or later than the Gate G credential pickup window can do so at Booth 3 at Gate F (located at the intersection of SW 20th Ave. and SW Morrison St.)

### **PARKING**

- The Thorns have limited spots available for media to park in at the US Bank Lot located on SW Morrison St. Check in with Thorns PR before each match to inquire about parking availability as the list does change on a per-match basis based on demand.

### PHOTO, VIDEO AND BROADCAST

- Approved photographers, videographers and TV crews will be permitted to shoot the match from assigned positions.
   Media members may not shoot in the stands or on the concourse without prior approval from the PR team. Under no circumstance can media members sit in front of the field hoards.
- There is no photo access behind the goals without prior approval from a member of the PR team.
- Photographers and videographers are not allowed to shoot inside of the sixyard box.
- Media members are encouraged to stay on one endline during match play. Due to field seating, the east sideline is strictly off limits. Media are allowed to use the east sideline to pass from one end of the field to the other. The concrete area in the northeast corner near the photo work room is available for media to access when space is available during the run of play.
- Media members will only be allowed to cross the west sideline behind the benches during warm-ups, halftime or postgame when permitted by the PR team. The west sideline is off limits during the match for any non-club personnel. Due to limited space at Providence Park, photographers and videographers may only shoot from behind the field boards. Media should not utilize camera well platforms in the seating bowl to shoot the match without advanced approval from the communications staff. In addition, media are not permitted to shoot photos or video from the press box.
- Photographers, with the exception of club content staff and NWSL Live Content Creators (LCC), are not allowed on the pitch at any time, including warmups. At no point should photographers, videographers or TV crews enter the playing field, locker rooms, or other restricted areas proximate to players, coaches or club delegation members.

### POST-GAME PRESS CONFERENCES

- The home team post-game press conference will be conducted in the Media Conference Room (MCR) approximately 15 minutes after the final whistle.
- The MCR is located on the inside concourse on field level, near the northwest corner of the field. Media are advised to take the suite elevator or stairs to field concourse level to access the MCR.
- The Thorns Head Coach as well as two players will be available for media. 15 minutes for each interview.
