

THORNS HOST THE DEFENDING CHAMPIONS

Portland Thorns FC close out a three-match home series with a major matchup against defending NWSL champions Orlando Pride.

Portland kickoff against Orlando on ION at 4:30 pm PT on Saturday, May 3.

UNBEATEN AT HOME

The Thorns remain **undefeated at Providence Park to start 2025** with a record of 1W, 3D. In fact, **the Thorns have not lost at Providence Park since October 2024** when they upset Orlando Pride 2-0.

The Thorns have historically been **dominant at home against Orlando**, winning 9 of 10 matches played (8W-1L-1D) including playoffs. Since 2018, the Thorns are perfect at home against Orlando (5W-0L-0D) and have **not conceded in their last three matches dating back to 2022**, combining to outscore the Pride 12-0 (6-0, 4-0, 2-0).

The Thorns' **90% win rate at home against the Pride is the highest of any team against an opponent they've hosted seven or more times in NWSL history** (all competitions).

A DIFFICULT MATCH

"Chippy," "intense" and "chaos" were just a few words used to describe Portland's 3-3 draw against Racing Louisville FC last week.

In a match that saw a new **league record 41 fouls** registered, the Thorns found a way to come back and rescue a much needed point to keep itself undefeated at home and above the playoff line. Initially going down on an early set piece, the Thorns would find an equalizer courtesy of Reilyn Turner in the 17th minute. Portland would then concede twice before finding their second via Jessie Fleming in the dying minutes of first half stoppage time.

Despite continuing to press the opposing backline, it wouldn't be until the final minutes of second half stoppage time that Portland's Jayden Perry would step up to bury a crucial penalty to secure the draw after a very physical Sunday afternoon.

GOALS & HONORS

Forward **Reilyn Turner continues to lead the Thorns' goalscoring leaderboard**, tallying her third goal this season – against her former side – with an incredible header that would win her NWSL Goal of the Week honors.

Midfielder **Jessie Fleming's penalty goal was her first goal** as a member of the Portland Thorns since she joined ahead of the 2024 season.

Rookie defender **Jayden Perry – who has now scored two penalties in as many matches – now sits second in both Portland's goals leaderboard as well as assists** (her halffield cross to Turner won NWSL Assist of the Week).

Plus, her game-tying penalty kick was the 50th PK attempt in Thorns regular-season history, the most of any club in the NWSL, and she is the **second rookie in league history to score more than one PK goal in their debut season** (last to do so was Michelle Cooper in 2023 for KC, also back-to-back games). Perry is also the **first rookie, and third player overall, in NWSL history to score multiple penalties within her first five regular-season appearances**, joining Diana Matheson (2013) and Kim Little (2014).

In fact, **Jessie Fleming and Jayden Perry are only the 2nd pair of teammates to score penalties in a single NWSL match** (last time was August 2014). They are also the **first pair of Thorns to score two penalty goals in a single game**.

And to cap it all off, **all three goals by Portland against Louisville were scored by former UCLA Bruins** (Fleming: 2016-19; Turner: 2020-23; Perry: 2021-24)

THE YOUNGEST SQUAD

With an average age of 24.4, Portland's starting lineup vs Louisville was the youngest starting lineup the Thorns have fielded in their history, serving as yet another indicator of this team's new youth-led era.

NO SECOND CHANCES

One thing to know about this Portland squad: they know how to make second half adjustments.

Portland are the only team remaining this season to allow no goals in the second half, showcasing the team's ability to go into the breaks, regroup and shift game tactics to shutout opponents in the final 45 minutes.

COFFEY IS BACK

Missing the Louisville game on an excused absence, Thorns fans will no doubt be delighted to see captain midfielder Sam Coffey return to action ahead of a major matchup against Orlando Pride.

Prior to missing the game against Louisville, Coffey was the last ironwoman standing for Portland, meaning she had contested every possible minute of every match up to that point. Yet, she comes back from her absence to a young and hungry squad ready to pull off a result against the defending champions.

REYES CARD ACCUMULATION

Defender Reyna Reyes - who won the penalty that would secure the late equalizer against Louisville - unfortunately picked up her fourth yellow card of the season. Reyes is now one yellow card away from card accumulation suspension (which would see her miss one regular season game if suspended)

However, in accordance with the NWSL's new "Good Behavior Incentives," Reyes can avoid potential match suspension if she can go five consecutive matches without getting a yellow or red card to have one of her yellow cards deducted from her

accumulation total.

Against a difficult Orlando offense, she'll need to ensure she's timing her runs and tackles perfectly to avoid suspension.

THORNS X WNBA PORTLAND FACILITY GROUNDBREAKING

Last week, the Portland Thorns and WNBA Portland broke ground on its historic \$150 million, 12-acre Women's Performance Center, a first-of-its-kind dual sport women's facility that'll continue to cement Portland as a global epicenter of women's sports.

The 12-acre performance center will feature the following:

- 63,000-square-foot training facility
- 17,000-square-foot practice gym, featuring two full size basketball courts
- Two full-sized soccer pitches with an outdoor training zone
- A 5,000 square-foot, dynamic strength training facility featuring top of the line equipment, an outdoor turf zone and a yoga/pilates room
- Elite training core program, integrating strength and conditioning, sports science, and sports medicine
- Dedicated dressing rooms for the WNBA and NWSL teams with amenities designed for the female athlete in a spa like setting
- Dining room with a full-time chef and nutritionist, offering performance-focused meals and refueling stations throughout the facility
- Dedicated rooms for player's families
- Team meeting rooms and social media content rooms
- Private player parking and player entry for convenience and security

MILESTONE WATCH

Bella Bixby - Regular Season Clean Sheets

Currently has 25 clean sheets and needs 1 more to tie AD Franch's club record of 26 as well as 6th-most in league history for a single club.

Sam Coffey - Regular Season Assists

Currently has 14 assists and is 1 behind Sophia Wilson for 4th-most in Thorns history.

Olivia Moultrie - Regular Season Goals

Currently has 11 goals and her next goal will tie her with Tobin Heath and Hayley Raso for 9th in club history.

Olivia Moultrie - Regular Season Goals by Teenager

Currently has 11 goals and is 3 away from recording the most goals by a teenager in the NWSL. Moultrie has until her birthday in September to score 3 more times to beat the record currently held by North Carolina's Jaedyn Shaw who bagged 13 goals before turning 20 last November.

Olivia Moultrie - Regular Season Assists

Currently has 10 assists and her next assist will tie her with Alex Morgan for 8th in club history.

Hina Sugita - Regular Season Goals

Currently has 13 goals and is 2 away from becoming the 8th player to reach the 15-goal mark as a Thorn.

NOTABLE QUOTES

Head Coach Rob Gale

On the team's performance vs Louisville... (Post LOU)

"Difficult to describe, much better second half. We got on the ball, started to move it... to get ourselves back in the game and if I take anything from that with a young group, the character, the persistence to show that, get a result and stay unbeaten at home was positive. I'll give credit to the players; they didn't stop going."

On how the Thorns will use the Louisville game as a learning experience... (Post LOU)

"With young players, you're going to get ups and downs; it's going to be a roller coaster. There's so much learning out there... I will give absolute credit to the players in that they didn't lose that game. You could easily lose that game and opposition physical battling direct... it's horrible opposition to play against because they're effective and they know what they are and they do it very well, so credit to Louisville for causing that pressure, errors [that a] young group have to learn [from]. Second half, they stood up to be counted to that and I was delighted that they got their rewards for the effort and throwing everything at them to get a point in the end."

On the team's improvements over the course of the start of the season... (Post LOU)

"We've scored seven goals in the last two games, which is excellent... so I'm a little bit more pleased with the ability to finish and create and force chances because you get penalties by putting the opposition under pressure. I'd say those would be the two biggest improvements that I've seen so far but with this young group, there's a lot more to come. That's our job to continue to push that and learn from difficult days like today to go back and learn those lessons - and learn them quickly - so that we can get back to the level of performances that I've seen in the last few games."

On working with the youngest squad in the NWSL... (Post LOU)

"Absolutely love it, terrific. What you want in a group is that you create an environment that's challenging, that they can grow. That's enjoyable, and that they come to work every day, realize that we're in a privileged position, want to get better, and want to come out and entertain and perform. But look again, you got to find a way and I was delighted with the group because that's what they did. The narrative for me going out of this is 'you found a way against a very challenging opponent against

some very challenging circumstances in the game that didn't allow for any kind of flow or rhythm.' They showed their character; they showed their quality. We stay unbeaten at home, and we move on."

On facing Orlando, the defending NWSL champions... (Post LOU)

"We've got to be brave... and against Orlando - where you can look at their threats the opposite way - we've got to make sure we exploit their weaknesses in the opposite way. They've shown progress and promise today; I was not as pleased in our performance, delighted with the character. We've got to get back on the performance train, trust the process, continue to develop the talent that we have and make sure we get it right against difficult opposition. There are no easy games in the NWSL... it's wild and that's why you all love it."

On the team's performance vs Louisville... (Post LOU)

"In reflecting closely in our performance, I think we played into their hands a little bit and dug ourselves a hole. That match can't keep happening in this league (Note: a single-game league record of 41 fouls were registered in PORvLOU). It's embarrassing, it alters the match, the sport... I'm very proud that we were able to find a way to come back from that and get a point out of that game. To be honest, probably one of, if not, the most, frustrating matches I've ever been a part of as a player so I think the league needs to look at that closely."

On her first goal as a Thorn... (Post LOU)

"It's long, long overdue for me. Just nice to have that off the list and hopefully continue to help the team create and score more."

On the team's celebrations after Jayden Perry's late equalizer... (Post LOU)

"I typically pride myself on being fairly calm on the pitch, but I think the emotion of the match got the best of me today. I think we deserved to tie the match and I think seeing [Jayden Perry] handle a very high-pressure situation, all of the emotions surrounding the game, we were just excited as a team."

On Sam Coffey's absence... (Post LOU)



2025 TECHNICAL LEADERSHIP

JEFF AGOOS, PRESIDENT & GENERAL MANAGER OF SOCCER OPERATIONS



Jeff Agoos was named President and General Manager of Soccer Operations for Portland Thorns FC on January 7, 2025. A legendary figure in American soccer, Agoos brings unparalleled expertise and an extensive track record of success to his leadership role with the Thorns.

Agoos is one of the most accomplished players in Major League Soccer (MLS) history, with a career that spanned more than a decade at the highest levels of the game. As a standout defender for the U.S. Men's National Team, Agoos earned 134 caps and represented his country in three FIFA World Cups—1994, 1998, and 2002. His defensive prowess and leadership on the international stage were integral to the success of the U.S. during his tenure, and he remains a central figure in the country's soccer history.

A key contributor to the dominance of MLS in its early years, Agoos played for two of the league's most successful franchises—D.C. United and the San Jose Earthquakes. During his career, he amassed five MLS Cup championships, the most by any player in league history. His time with D.C. United saw him win MLS titles in 1996, 1997, and 1999, while his later years with San Jose were highlighted by additional titles in 2001 and 2003, cementing his place as one of the league's most decorated players. In recognition of his extraordinary career, Agoos was inducted into the National Soccer Hall of Fame in 2009.

Following his retirement from playing in 2005, Agoos transitioned to executive leadership, where he has continued to shape the landscape of American soccer. He served as Technical Director for the New York Red Bulls, a role in which he was responsible for overseeing player development, team operations, and strategic direction. Most recently, Agoos held the position of Senior Vice President of Competition, Operations, and Medical at Major League Soccer. In this capacity, he played a pivotal role in the league's growth, overseeing key areas such as competition integrity, operations, and player welfare, all while enhancing MLS's global standing.

MIKE NORRIS, TECHNICAL DIRECTOR



Mike Norris was named Technical Director of Portland Thorns FC after serving as the team's fifth head coach. In his new role, Norris will focus on scouting, talent acquisition, and player development. As head coach, he posted a record of 10-7-8 in 25 NWSL matches.

Before joining the Thorns, Norris spent eight years with Canada Soccer, where he served as the set play and goalkeeper coach for the Canada Women's National Team from 2019 to 2021. During that time, Canada won a gold medal at the Tokyo 2020 Olympics.

Born in Ashington and raised in Newcastle upon Tyne, Norris brings a wealth of experience in soccer both internationally and domestically to his role with the Thorns.

ROB GALE, HEAD COACH



Rob Gale was appointed Head Coach of Portland Thorns FC in July 2024.

Gale joined the Thorns in March 2023 as an assistant coach under Mike Norris. He became the first Zambian-born individual to coach an NWSL team and win a league match.

Before his time with Portland, Gale built a strong coaching background at both the youth and professional levels. He began as a youth coach in NYCFC's academy system before becoming head coach and general manager of Valour FC in the Canadian Premier League. Additionally, he worked as a youth coach for Canada's national team programs, contributing to the development of emerging players.

CREDENTIALS

- Media members may apply for single-game matches, as well as season credentials by filling out the form located at thorns.com/media-resources/media-credentials.
- Credential applications must be submitted **no later than 72 hours** from match kickoff.
- The club will credential a limited number of non-rights media personnel, subject to the availability of media positions in the press seating areas, photographer, videographer and TV crew areas, as well as the photo workroom.
- Applications from freelance writers, photographers or videographers must come from a direct supervisor validating professional and editorial need for media access.
- Media members may not use credentials for preferential access, such as autographs, photographs or personal requests. Violations will result in potential loss of credential for any future match.

CREDENTIAL PICKUP & MEDIA ENTRANCE

- All media personnel must enter the stadium through Gate G on matchday. (SW 20th Ave., along the west side of Providence Park). Gate G will open 90 minutes prior to kick off on matchday.
- A member of Thorns gameday staff will be available at Gate G for credential pickup between the time media entrance begins and match kickoff.
- Photographer bibs will also be available at Gate G during this time window so please make sure to request it with the Thorns gameday staff member present.
- Media needing to pick up their credentials earlier or later than the Gate G credential pickup window can do so at Booth 3 at Gate F (located at the intersection of SW 20th Ave. and SW Morrison St.)

PARKING

- The Thorns have limited spots available for media to park in at the US Bank Lot located on SW Morrison St. Check in with Thorns PR before each match to inquire about parking availability as the list does change on a per-match basis based on demand.
- For weekend matches, the parking lot opens 3 hours before kickoff. For weekday matches, the parking lot will open at 5 pm.
- Media can street park should they need to park earlier than when the lot opens or are not on the parking list.

PROFESSIONALISM

- While on assignment at either training or match day, media is expected to dress professionally, meaning no jerseys or team representation of any kind.

PHOTO, VIDEO AND BROADCAST

- Approved photographers, videographers and TV crews will be permitted to shoot the match from assigned positions. Media members may not shoot in the stands or on the concourse without prior approval from the PR team. Under no circumstance can media members sit in front of the field boards.
- There is no photo access behind the goals without prior approval from a member of the PR team.
- Photographers and videographers are not allowed to shoot inside of the sixtyyard box.
- Media members are encouraged to stay on one endline during match play. Due to field seating, the east sideline is strictly off limits. Media are allowed to use the east sideline to pass from one end of the field to the other. The concrete area in the northeast corner near the photo work room is available for media to access when space is available during the run of play.
- Media members will only be allowed to cross the west sideline behind the benches during warm-ups, halftime or postgame when permitted by the PR team. The west sideline is off limits during the match for any non-club personnel. Due to limited space at Providence Park, photographers and videographers may only shoot from behind the field boards. Media should not utilize camera well platforms in the seating bowl to shoot the match without advanced approval from the communications staff. In addition, media are not permitted to shoot photos or video from the press box.
- Photographers, with the exception of club content staff and NWSL Live Content Creators (LCC), are not allowed on the pitch at any time, including warmups. At no point should photographers, videographers or TV crews enter the playing field, locker rooms, or other restricted areas proximate to players, coaches or club delegation members.

POST-GAME PRESS CONFERENCES

- The home team post-game press conference will be conducted in the Media Conference Room (MCR) approximately 15 minutes after the final whistle.
- The MCR is located on the inside concourse on field level, near the northwest corner of the field. Media are advised to take the suite elevator or stairs to field concourse level to access the MCR.
- The Thorns Head Coach as well as two players will be available for media, 15 minutes for each interview.
- Should you have a specific player request for post-match, please alert a member of the Thorns PR staff.
