

ABOUT

Representing New Jersey and New York, Gotham FC plays its home matches at Sports Illustrated Stadium in Harrison, New Jersey.

Founded in 2007, Gotham FC originally debuted as Jersey Sky Blue and played in the United Soccer League's W-League. Later that year, it was selected to represent the New Jersey/New York metropolitan area in the newly founded Women's Professional Soccer (WPS) League, which began operations in 2009. The club rebranded as Sky Blue FC and won its first trophy in the inaugural WPS championship in 2009.

Sky Blue FC was one of eight teams to join the National Women's Soccer League (NWSL) in 2012 following the disbanding of the WPS. In April 2021, the club underwent a major rebrand and officially changed its name to NJ/NY Gotham FC. The name, logo and colors were selected after extensive fan involvement and will guide the club into the future with bold international ambitions.

In 2023, Gotham FC won the first NWSL championship in club history, defeating Seattle's OL Reign, 2-1, in the final and completing the best season-to-season turnaround in NWSL history, going from last place to league champion.

Building on the momentum of its 2023 championship, Gotham FC had a record-breaking 2024 campaign, achieving the best regular-season finish in club history. The team set a franchise record with 56 points, the most earned by the club in an NWSL season, and tied for the league's best defensive record.

OUTLINE CREST

The crest contains several elements that celebrate the club's growth and past. It prominently features the Statue of Liberty's iconic crown. A national monument, the Lady in the Harbor was voted the most recognizable symbol of New Jersey and New York by fans. Her crown represents Gotham FC's ambitions to be a global power and provides a welcoming symbol for the team's diverse fanbase.

The crest center proudly displays three letters in sky blue coloring – an "N" and a hybrid "J/Y", which acknowledges New Jersey as the club's birthplace while embracing the club's growing New York reach.

WORDMARK

The official colors of the club are Sky Blue, Gotham Black and Cloud White. The colors represent the team's history and prior identity, the club's new identity and the longstanding foundation of the club's supporters group, Cloud 9.

TEAM LEADERSHIP





YAEL AVERBUCH WEST

GENERAL MANAGER AND HEAD OF SOCCER OPERATIONS

An accomplished business leader, former member of the U.S. Women's National Team and standout collegiate and professional player, Yael Averbuch West was named interim General Manager and Head of Soccer Operations of Gotham FC on Aug. 3, 2021. She took the permanent position four months later. Under her leadership, Gotham FC won the 2023 NWSL championship and registered the most successful regular season in club history in 2024.

Born in New York and raised in Montclair, N.J., Averbuch developed as a player in youth programs in her home state before reaching the first of her two goals in the game: playing for the University of North Carolina.

In her time at UNC, the Tar Heels won national championships in 2006 and 2008. Averbuch set the school record by starting 105 consecutive games, and she scored the fastest goal to begin a game in women's college soccer history (four seconds, against Yale in 2006). Among several honors during her collegiate career, Averbuch was named ACC Offensive Player of the Year in 2006 and ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year for women's soccer in 2007, and she was voted First Team All-America three times by the NSCAA coaches. Averbuch received the ultimate honor when North Carolina retired her No. 17 after her senior year.

Averbuch achieved her other childhood dream by earning 26 caps as a member of the U.S. Women's National Team from 2007-13. When she took the helm at Gotham FC in 2021, Averbuch became the first former U.S. Women's National Team player to be named general manager of an NWSL club.

Averbuch was selected by Sky Blue FC with the fourth overall pick in the 2009 WPS Draft and went on to win the league championship that year. She won another WPS title with the Western NY Flash in 2011.

After two years playing in Russia and Sweden – which included competing in the UEFA Women's Champions League in 2012 – Averbuch played in the NWSL for five years between 2014-18. This included an NWSL championship in 2015 during her three seasons with FC Kansas City, and she played one season each with the Washington Spirit and Seattle Reign.

While still playing in the NWSL, Averbuch began her career as an entrepreneur and business leader. In 2016, she launched Techne Futbol – an app providing personal training for soccer players of all ages, experience and skill levels – and remains the owner of the business today. In 2017, she founded the NWSL Players Association and served as the organization's first president and, later, its first executive director.

Now that she has come full circle as GM and Head of Soccer Operations for Gotham FC, Averbuch has returned to Montclair, where she lives with her husband and two children.





JUAN CARLOS AMORÓS

HEAD COACH

Juan Carlos Amorós was named head coach of Gotham FC on Nov. 1, 2022, and has been the most successful coach in the club's history through two seasons.

In 2023, Amorós guided Gotham FC to the 2023 NWSL championship after being the last team to qualify for the postseason, winning the club's first NWSL hardware in defeating league powerhouse OL Reign in the final. A year later, Amorós led Gotham FC to the best regular season finish in club history, reaching the semifinals of the NWSL playoffs.

Amorós came to Gotham FC after an interim stint as the head coach for the Houston Dash, helping the club reach the NWSL playoffs for the first time in its history.

The 40-year-old Amorós brings extensive international coaching experience, having worked in top leagues across Spain, England and the United States. Before his time in Houston, he coached Real Betis Féminas from 2021-22, guiding the club to a record eight-match unbeaten streak in Spain's top division.

During a nine-year tenure at Tottenham Hotspur FC Women, Amorós led the club from the third tier of English soccer to the FA Women's Super League. In 2019, he was named Manager of the Year along with his co-head coach Karen Hills after guiding Tottenham to promotion with a second-place finish in the FA Women's Championship. They also earned the honor while managing the club in the third-tier FA Women's National League.

Amorós took over as interim head coach of the Houston Dash on July 16, 2022, opening his tenure with a 4-1 win over Chicago. He finished the season with a 6-3-2 record, leading Houston to its first playoff berth in the club's nine-year history.

In 2023, Amorós led Gotham FC to a sixth-place finish in the NWSL regular season, securing a playoff spot after the club had finished last the previous year. The team set multiple club records, including fewest shots allowed (155) and fewest shots on goal allowed (82). Gotham FC earned its first-ever NWSL playoff win by defeating the North Carolina Courage in the quarterfinals, then advanced past the Portland Thorns in the semifinals before defeating Seattle Reign FC to capture its first NWSL title.

The 2024 season saw Amorós and his squad break even more records. Gotham FC set new marks with 17 wins (surpassing the previous high of 10 in 2013 and 2017), 56 points (up from 36 in 2013), just four losses, nine home wins, eight away wins, 23 goals scored at home, 20 goals conceded (the fewest in club history), and six road shutouts. These milestones secured Gotham FC its first-ever home playoff game, where it defeated the Portland Thorns in the quarterfinals.

Amorós holds a UEFA Pro license, the highest-level UEFA coaching certification, and has a diploma in Football Management from the League Managers Association Institute of Leadership and High Performance. He has also completed elite coaching courses with the Royal Spanish Football Federation, the Scottish FA and the English FA and earned an MBA from the Autonomous University of Madrid in 2018.





ANDY SPENCE

ASSISTANT HEAD COACH

Andy Spence joins Gotham FC as an assistant head coach, bringing a wealth of experience from both domestic and international women's soccer. A highly respected figure in the game, Spence has spent more than two decades developing elite talent and competing at the highest levels of the game.

Before arriving at Gotham FC, Spence served as an assistant coach for the Canada Women's National Team. Appointed in 2022, he played a pivotal role in the team's preparation for major international tournaments, including the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup. He was the interim head coach for Canada during the 2024 Summer Olympics, leading the team to the quarterfinals of the knockout tournament.

Prior to his tenure with Canada, Spence was a leader with multiple roles at Everton FC, where he played a key role in shaping the club's women's program for over a decade. He served in multiple coaching positions, including head coach and academy director, helping Everton consistently compete in England's top flight while mentoring several players who went on to excel internationally. Spence also gained valuable experience working with England's youth national teams, serving as an assistant coach for the U-19 and U-21 squads.

Now with Gotham FC, Spence adds his expertise and leadership to the coaching staff as the club gears up for the 2025 NWSL season.

Spence holds a BSc in Science and Football from Liverpool John Moores University that he earned in 2005. He has also obtained several prestigious coaching qualifications, including the UEFA A License (2011), the UEFA Youth Diploma (2018) and an LMA Diploma in Football Management from the University of Liverpool (2020).





JEN LALOR

ASSISTANT COACH

Jen Lalor joined Gotham FC in 2023. In addition to her duties as assistant coach, Lalor also plays an integral role for Gotham FC with the club's player development pipeline. Lalor won the bronze medal with the USWNT at the 1995 FIFA Women's World Cup and played professionally in Japan, Denmark and Sweden. She also played in the first women's professional league in the U.S. (Women's United Soccer Association) with the New York Power and San Diego Spirit.

At Santa Clara University, Lalor was the first women's soccer player in school history to earn a full athletic scholarship and was later inducted into the SCU Athletic Hall of Fame.

Lalor has worked extensively at U.S. Soccer in the youth national team system as a coach, scout, technical advisor and club development manager. As a head coach, she has led two teams to national championships: San Diego SeaLions of the WPSL in 2013 and Albion SC San Diego U16 in 2022.



SHAUN HARRIS

ASSISTANT COACH

Shaun Harris has more than 15 years of coaching experience spanning five continents. His international career includes notable achievements such as helping Tottenham Hotspur Women achieve its highest-ever finish in the Women's Super League (WSL). In 12 years at Tottenham, Harris worked as lead technical coach and as a member of the global football development team, delivering coaching education and player development programs to national football associations.

Beyond the pitch, Harris enjoys spending time with his wife and two children and enjoys listening to new music and eating spicy cuisine.



AK LAKHANI

ASSISTANT COACH

Ak Lakhani joined Gotham FC in 2023 from the Jamaican Football Federation, where he was the head of United Kingdom recruitment for the Women's U-17, U-20 and Women's National Team. He was the assistant coach of the Jamaican Women's National Team that advanced to the Round of 16 in the 2023 FIFA Women's World Cup and was assistant coach when the team won the bronze medal at the 2022 Concacaf Women's Championship in Mexico. Lakhani was part of Amorós's coaching staff during his successful tenure at Tottenham Hotspur Women's FC when the club earned back—to—back promotions. He has also worked at Tottenham Hotspur Academy and Leyton Orient Academy, and he was one of 150 coaches in the UK to be awarded a medal from Prince William for "Outstanding Contribution to Football."





GUILLERMO AMOR ÓS

ASSISTANT COACH

Guillermo Amorós brings nearly two decades of coaching experience to Gotham FC, having begun his career at 18. He holds both the UEFA A License and the Professional Soccer Coach License (equivalent to the UEFA Pro License) from the Royal Spanish Federation.

His coaching career includes positions at several prestigious European academies. He has served at Tottenham Hotspur Women with the U-18 and reserve teams, Madrid CFF with the U-18 and U-21 divisions and Malaga CF with the U-16 team, where he led the squad to two Andalucian state league championships.

Amorós joined Gotham FC in October 2024.



HEAD GOALKEEPER COACH



Now entering his fourth season with Gotham FC as Head Goalkeeper Coach, Brody Sams brings over a decade of experience in elite and professional football across both the women's and men's games. A native of Australia, he has worked with and supported top-level goalkeepers who have gone on to achieve success in professional leagues worldwide as well as on the global stage at the Olympics and FIFA Women's World Cup.

At Gotham FC, Sams plays a key role in building a world-class goalkeeper department, working closely with goalkeepers Ann-Katrin Berger, Shelby Hogan and Ryan Campbell while also contributing to the development of future goalkeeper coaches. Committed to innovation and mentorship, Sams takes pride in creating an environment where both players and staff are empowered to grow and succeed in pursuit of excellence.



ASSISTANT GOALKEEPER COACH



Born in Queens, N.Y., Betos played high school soccer at St. Francis Prep before attending the University of Georgia and graduating with a degree in psychology. Betos played professionally from 2010-24, predominantly in the NWSL, including stints in Australia, Norway, Denmark and Cyprus. She won an NWSL Shield with the Portland Thorns in 2016 and the NWSL championship with Gotham FC in 2023. After retiring in 2024, Betos is finishing her courses to become a Certified Mental Performance Coach and working with Gotham FC as Assistant Goalkeeper Coach. She will play a role in culture development and maintenance. Her greatest joy is growth and improvement, and she is ecstatic about the opportunity to help the players in their individual and collective journeys.



PROFESSIONAL

2024 (Portland): Had a breakout season with the Thorns, making 21 league appearances and recording 70 saves. Also collected nine clean sheets, second-most in the regular season behind only Orlando Pride's Anna Moorhouse (13). 






SUE BIRD INVESTOR

Other recent Thirty Five Ventures initiatives include the recently debuted BASKETBALL COUNTY: In The Water documentary on SHOWTIME and the upcoming basketball-themed scripted series "SWAGGER" with Imagine Entertainment and Apple; an equity partnership with premium audio brand Master & Dynamic; a minority stake in and consulting agreement with MLS club Philadelphia Union; and the Durant Center, a state-of-the-art educational and leadership facility in Durant's hometown in Prince George's County, Maryland.

The Thirty Five Ventures umbrella includes the sports business media network Boardroom; an investment portfolio with more than 75 companies, including Acorns, Coinbase, Dutchie, Overtime, Dapper Labs/NBA Top Shot, Postmates, OpenSea and more; a film/TV arm with projects including the documentary series In the Water (SHOWTIME), the Academy Award-winning Two Distant Strangers (Netflix) and the critically acclaimed scripted series "SWAGGER" (Apple TV+); a minority stake in MLS team Philadelphia Union, and management of Kevin Durant's on-and-off court business.

Kleiman also serves as the executive director of the Kevin Durant Charity Foundation, helping oversee the development and expansion of the Durant Center in Maryland's Prince George's County. KDCF has also partnered with the College Track program in its first Washington, D.C, area presence and has built or refurbished more than 25 basketball courts throughout the globe.

Kleiman sits on the board of directors at New Heights Youth, Inc., a nonprofit dedicated to sports-based youth development and education in New York. He is also very active in volunteering and fundraising for Coalition for the Homeless.

In 2013, Kleiman helped launch Roc Nation Sports, where he served as vice president of the sports agency founded by Jay-Z. He worked with athletes such as Victor Cruz, CC Sabathia, Skylar Diggins-Smith, Robinson Cano and more. Kleiman started with Roc Nation in 2008 as a music manager representing artists and DJ/producers like D Nice, Mark Ronson, Solange, Wale and Meek Mill.

Kleiman's career in entertainment began at renowned production company Radical Media, where he was a music supervisor as well as producer on projects such as Jay-Z's feature-length documentary Fade To Black.



Sports Illustrated Stadium

Sports Illustrated Stadium is the benchmark in the North American soccer stadium landscape and sets the standard for other venues of its kind across the continent. The 25,000-seat state-of-the-art facility located in Harrison, New Jersey, is the home of Gotham FC of the NWSL and the New York Red Bulls of Major League Soccer.

Opened in March 2010, Sports Illustrated Stadium has hosted a number of top club and international squads, including the U.S. Women's and Men's National Teams, men's national teams of Argentina, Ecuador and Colombia, and iconic European clubs Chelsea, Barcelona, Bayern Munich, Arsenal, Manchester City, Juventus and Tottenham Hotspur.

The arena is structured to create a distinct soccer atmosphere as fans in the front row are just 21 feet from the touchlines. Its dynamic roof is a curving structure that wraps the entire arena in an elegant metal shell to create an architectural statement of power and elegance. Sports Illustrated Stadium has been awarded the Professional Soccer Field of the Year by Sports Turf Management Association in 2018 and 2021.

In 2024, the stadium hosted 19 Gotham FC matches, highlighted by the club's first-ever home playoff game and a high-profile summer friendly against Chelsea FC.





RED BULLSTRAINING FACILITY

Red Bulls Training Facility is the world-class home for training sessions of Gotham FC, the New York Red Bulls of MLS, New York Red Bulls II and Red Bulls Academy teams. The facility has hosted various national teams and other club teams, including the United States Men's National Team, Mexico Men's National Team and Inter Milan.
