KICKING OFF..

LAST TIME OUT: The Courage took an early lead over the Chicago Red Stars, but had a red card just minutes later in what would end a 1-1 draw last Sunday. The Courage had several big opportunities, including a PK chance and a shot off woodwork, but split the points to go 1-0-1 with the Red Stars this season. The goal allowed, which came in the 63', was the first allowed by the Courage at home since May 6 (all competitions).

CAROLINA STRONG: The Courage will hold a pregame moment of silence and Tar Heel blue tape will be worn by players Saturday as a show of solidarity with the UNC Chapel Hill community after an on-campus fatal shooting of a faculty member earlier this week.

PASSING GRADE: The Courage lead the NWSL in passing accuracy (81.81), successful passes (7,048), and possession (59.04). Gotham ranks second in possession (54.4)

BATTER UP: The Courage, the second-youngest roster in the NWSL, are seeking their first win against the most veteran lineup in the league in Gotham Saturday. The Courage fell in both trips to Harrison this season and earned a 1-1 draw at home back in early May. The Courage are 9W-4L-2D in lifetime regular season meetings with Gotham.

CARY, N.C. (Sept. 1, 2023) – The North Carolina Courage host Gotham FC in a critical NWSL showdown at WakeMed Soccer Park on Saturday, September 2, with kickoff slated for 7:30 p.m. ET. The holiday weekend showdown features two of the top four teams in the league table with five matches left regular season.

The Courage looked to return to form early last Sunday, quickly integrating players new to the roster and returning from the World Cup. They struck for an early goal and had dominant possession and passing stats, but a straight red card was shown 20 minutes in, forcing the Courage had to battle down a player for over an hour. A set piece goal for Chicago and some near misses for North Carolina saw the match end in a 1-1 draw.

There were still plenty of positives to take away for this young Courage group. The squad showed resilience, grit, and unwavering effort in the intense heat. Regardless of results, this team's heart has been unquestionable all season long. Manaka Matsukubo was as advertised in her NWSL debut while Kerolin Nicoli was dangerous as ever in her return to club action.

For all the ups and downs, the Courage – predicted to finish near the bottom of the table at the start of the year – enter the final quarter of the regular season in second place and are very real contenders for not just playoffs, but the NWSL Shield, and they will play in a UKG Challenge Cup semifinal next week. Regardless of how the rest of the season plays out, this is a team that has massively outperformed external expectations and has made the club and its supporters proud to be a part of Courage Country.

The Matchup

The Courage, the second-youngest roster in the NWSL, are seeking their first win against the most veteran lineup in the league Saturday. This will be the fourth, and final, meeting between the clubs in 2023 between regular season and Challenge Cup group play. North Carolina fell in both trips to Harrison this season and earned a 1-1 draw at home back in early May. The Courage are 9W-4L-2D in lifetime regular season meetings with Gotham.

Scouting Gotham

This weekend is the penultimate road trip for Gotham this season, with three of their last four matches at Red Bull Arena. A veteran roster brimming with proven professional talent, Gotham's stark turnaround from a lackluster 2022 to contending 2023 is no surprise. They're even with the Courage for second-fewest goals conceded this season, lead the NWSL in tackle success and rank second in tackles won. Familiar face Lynn Williams has been the focal point of the Gotham attack, netting seven goals on 49 shots this season.

Wrapping Up

A Courage win guarantees first or second in the standings after the weekend while a draw keeps them in the top three. While North Carolina can't drop from playoff positioning regardless of result, the compact standings make every point critical down the stretch. With just two home fixtures left, Courage Country's support for the home field advantage Saturday will be key.

NOTABLES CONTINUED

SUNNY AND 75: The Courage next regular season win will the 75th in club history. Only three other clubs have hit this milestone.

CLEANING UP: The Courage lead the NWSL with eight clean sheets this season. Casey Murphy became the youngest player in league history, and fourth overall, to reach the 30 milestone (regular season only) earlier this season.

MINUTES STREAK: The Courage went 460 regular season minutes without conceding between the 8' on June 3 in Kansas City and the 18' on July 10 in Los Angeles. The streak is longest in the NWSL this season and ranks fifth all-time in league history.

LUSSI ENDS: Tyler Lussi has five goals this season, four of which have been game-winners in 1-0 Courage victories. Lussi now has 12 goals for her career with her teams 11-1 when she scores after the loss last Sunday.

IRON WOMAN 2: Kaleigh Kurtz is the lone Courage player remaining on the Iron Woman list for the 2023 regular season. She was an iron woman for the Courage in 2022 as well and is one of four 2022 Iron Women to still be in the running in 2023.

KERO COOKS AT HOME: Kerolin's assist on Sunday was her fifth in her NWSL career with all five coming at home. Only Meleana Shim (8) has more career NWSL assists with all of them coming at home.

HEAD COACH: SEAN NAHAS (25W-14D-18L ALL COMPS)



Nahas begins his second full season as head coach of the Courage in 2023, bringing nearly two decades of coaching experience to the sideline. Nahas led the Courage to the 2022 Challenge Cup championship in his first season at the helm and was a member of the coaching staff that lead the team to their NWSL Championships in 2018 and 2019. He has valuable US National Team coaching experience, including assistant coaching positions with the U20 USWNT and U14 Youth National Team and serving as a US National Team Youth Scout. He has held several leadership positions with CASL (now NCFC Youth), including Director of Girls Classic Soccer, ECNL Director, and Director of CASL Player Development. As ECNL Director, he helped CASL reach its highest ranking in USYS of No.7 nationally in 2010-2011.

ASSISTANT COACH - NATHAN THACKERAY



Thackeray enters his sixth season on the Courage staff in 2023. He was a member of the 2018 and 2019 NWSL Championship coaching staff. started his coaching career in 2011 after playing with England's Bradford City from 2003-2006 and William Woods University from 2006-2010. He worked with Young Harris College in Georgia, and then became the Head of Goalkeeping at the Houston Dynamo Academy in 2012. Thackeray is a USSF licensed coach.

ASSISTANT COACH - EMMA THOMSON



Thomson begins her second season as a full-time assistant in 2023. She spent six prior years with George Mason University, while also coaching with FC Virginia in the DA. She holds a USSF A license and is also on staff with the NC Courage Girls Academy. She grew up playing in the FA Women's Premier league and represented England at youth levels. A two-time captain for Penn State women's soccer, Thomson helped the Nittany Lions to four NCAA Tournament appearances, collecting four Big Ten Championships and one Big Ten Tournament Championship.

ASSISTANT COACH - FABRICE GAUTRAT



Gautrat begins his first season with the Courage in 2023. He spent the prior three seasons with the Chicago Red Stars, including full-time in 2022. He also worked with youth club Chicago FC United from 2018-22, taking over as academy director in 2020 to lead the program through a transition to the Girls Academy. He coached in the USYNT camp in June of 2019. The Santa Clarita, California native played for the University of San Diego from 2006-07 before playing professionally through 2015. He also spent time as an assistant in the Olympique Lyonnais academy.

ASSISTANT COACH - VICTORIA BOARDMAN



Boardman begins her first season on the Courage staff in 2023, joining the team in February. She was on the first-ever staff of the San Diego Wave, helping the team to a playoff berth in their first season of competition in 2022. Prior to joining the Wave, she was a head coach for BEACH Futbol Club in California for over four years. She earned her USSF A license in 2018 and achieved her UEFA B license in 2021. She graduated from Long Beach State in May 2020 with a degree in kinesiology and exercise science.
