Credentials: 2025 Rocket City Trash Pandas media credentials will be issued only to accredited media members at the discretion of the Trash Pandas Media staff. Any media wanting to cover an individual game must communicate their intentions to the Trash Pandas no later than 24 hours before the first pitch of any game. Credentials must be visibly worn at all times. To obtain a credential, all media members must complete and sign the 2025 Minor League Baseball Terms and Conditions of Credentials for Professional Development League Events.

Photographers: Photo credentials will be issued to legitimate news organizations and photographers authorized by the Trash Pandas. All photos MUST be for news-gathering purposes or companies licensed by Major League Baseball/Minor League Baseball. Priority will be given to news organizations on the deadline. Photographers are prohibited from placing equipment on the playing field, dugout, or clubhouse.

Media Entrance: Media may pick up their credentials at the Trustmark VIP Gate at Toyota Field and enter the ballpark through the VIP gate. All bags are subject to inspection upon entry. A valid photo ID will be needed to pick up credentials. Media will have access to the Northrop Grumman Press Box, but seating is limited.

Clubhouses: Per 2025 rules imposed by Major League Baseball, the clubhouses are permanently off-limits to all media members.

In-Season Interviews: Before Trash Pandas home games, players and coaches will likely be available for in-person interviews after batting practice (around 4:15 p.m. for a 6:35 p.m. game). Media seeking interviews must submit their request to the Trash Pandas beforehand. Pre-game interviews will be conducted in the area near the Trash Pandas dugout. No starting pitchers will be made available pre-game on the day they are starting. Requests for interviews with players/coaches from visiting teams must go through the visiting team's Media Relations staff.

Postgame Interviews: Following each Trash Pandas home game, subject to availability, Trash Pandas Manager Andy Schatzley and select players will be available for interviews. Media wishing to talk to any Trash Pandas player or coach must communicate that request to a member of the Trash Pandas Media Relations staff before the conclusion of the game.

Television Policy: TV stations wishing to have a live pre-game guest for their newscasts must contact the Trash Pandas no later than noon on game days for night games or by 6 p.m. the day before day games. Roving cameras are allowed with permission from the Trash Pandas. Cameras are permitted throughout the public areas but must not block any aisles or the view of any fans. Camera lights may be turned on unless facing the field of play.

Use of Photography/Video: Media outlets needing to use Trash Pandas photography or video may contact Chris Harris. Accredited media members may use Trash Pandas photographs for non-endorsement projects only.

Autograph Policy: Credentialed media members are not permitted to seek autographs, foul balls, or other baseball equipment at any point. A member of the Trash Pandas staff who finds a member of the media in violation of this policy may revoke their credentials.

*All Media guidelines for 2025 are subject to change at any point and for any reason.

Join Josh Caray and Chris Harris for all 138 broadcasts, which will begin 15 minutes before the first pitch with the Trash Pandas Pregame Show. Select games can be heard on ESPN Winchester 106.9 FM/1340 AM with all games being streamed on the app. Each contest can also be heard via the MLB Gameday App.



For the fifth season, all home games can be seen on WAAY The Grio, Bally Live as well as a subscription to the MLB.TV package. Games can also be streamed on MiLB TV and Bally Live and watched on the following stations: WAAY 31.6 (THIS TV!), Channel 1181 on XFINITY, Channel 155 on WOW! LEGACY, Channel 46 on WOW+ TV and Channel 176 on FAYETTEVILLE UTILITIES.

Ticket Prices: For most Trash Pandas games, tickets start at \$8 for seating on the Budwesier Berm. Full ticket prices can be found at trashpandasbaseball.com

Restrooms: Located on both baselines on the main concourse.



WHAT IS A TRASH PANDA?

The name was chosen in a name-the-team contest and is a reference to the area's association with the space industry and the determination and ingenuity of raccoons, aka Trash Pandas.

Trash Pandas, slang for raccoon, was included in the original 10 nominations following several Brandiose-led focus groups in Madison and Huntsville. The ballot descriptor read: Our community is known for engineering, and no creature in our galaxy is as smart, creative, determined and ingenious a problem solver - dedicated to the challenge at hand - as our local raccoons!

In July 2018, after the results from several focus groups in Madison and Huntsville, 10 names were selected, based on their uniqueness and how each name relates to the characteristics of the area: (Alphabetically) Army Ants, Comet Jockeys, GloWorms, Lunartics, Moon Possums, Puffy Head Bird Legs, Space Chimps, Space Sloths, ThunderSharks and Trash Pandas. The focus groups were led by San Diego-based Brandiose, the Minor League Baseball industry's premiere branding partner.

Over the next few weeks, two rounds of online voting took place. The first round narrowed the list to Comet Jockeys, Moon Possums, Space Chimps, ThunderSharks and Trash Pandas.



Trash Pandas won the final round with 44.75 percent of the vote to ThunderSharks 19.25 percent. Moon Possums was third (12.57 percent); Space Chimps fourth (12.05 percent); and Comet Jockeys fifth (11.38 percent).

By the way, Trash Pandas dominated both rounds.

More than 28,500 nominations and votes were recorded. According to Brandiose, this represented - by far - the largest community participation in a Name the Team contest in the history of Minor League Baseball.

The team name was announced at a local microbrewery in September 2018 with nearly 1,500 fans on hand. Trash Pandas was nominated by Matthew Higley of Lacey's Spring, Ala. He received two box seats for the first five seasons and threw out the ceremonial first pitch at a Trash Pandas home game.

The regional identifier was also chosen by the community. Out of 13,559 votes cast, 67.4 percent chose Rocket City over North Alabama (18.09 percent) and Madison (14.51 percent).

TRASH PANDAS CELEBRITIES



SPROCKET - MASCOT

It all started on a run-of-the-mill October Day in Alabama. Kids were playing, birds were chirping, everything was normal in the world, until it wasn't.

At a local waste dump lived a little bandit-eyed rascal named Sprocket. He spent his mornings moving from trash can to trash can looking for that day's "breakfast."

This particular morning was going just as he had planned when, CRASH! A pile of hazardous waste came raining down upon this tiny raccoon, but something was different.

This tiny raccoon was no longer tiny. In a matter of seconds, Sprocket had grown five feet in length and was walking on his two back feet. So how did Sprocket react to this rapid transformation?! He started dancing!

Sprocket's favorite baseball movie is *Angels in the Outfield*. His favorite color is red, and his favorite song is *Sweet Home Alabama* by Lynyrd Skynyrd.

SALLY, BUZZ, NEIL & MAE

IN-GAME ASTRONAUT RACERS



SALLY (Blue): The first female racer, Sally's rides to victory are often neck and neck with fierce rival Buzz. With her youthful spirit, Sally is never deterred in her quest to reach the finish line.

BUZZ (Orange): Usually running neck and neck with rival racer Sally, Buzz uses a measured approach in the nightly Astronaut race. Buzz is never first out of the gate, and as the first of the racers with a doctoral degree, relies on his smarts to compete in his quest for victory at Trash Pandas games.

NEIL (White): After getting off to a quick start, Neil's all or nothing approach stumbles more often than not in the nightly race at Toyota Field. Although his path to victory is often clouded in misfortunes, Neil's rare upset wins are always memorable and inspiring.

MAE (Silver): The reigning rookie of the year, Mae, didn't take long to get comfortable with the Astronaut Race after being introduced midway through the 2023 season. Mae uses her patience and intelligence to wait for the perfect moment to make a move to the front.

TRASH PANDAS TIMELINE

October 2017: The Southern League approves the sale of the Mobile BayBears to BallCorps LLC, setting up an eventual move to Madison.

November 2017: BallCorps LLC closes on the purchase of the Mobile BayBears.

January 2018: The Madison City Council signs a deal with BallCorps LLC for a \$46 million multi-use stadium.

May 2018: The Southern League approves relocating the Mobile BayBears to Madison for the 2020 season.

June 2018: Nearly 2,000 people are on hand for the stadium's groundbreaking ceremony at the Town Madison development site.

September 2018: After more than 28,000 votes were cast in a name-the-team contest, BallCorps LLC announces the team will be called Rocket City Trash Pandas.

October 2018: The first concrete for the stadium is poured. Hundreds of fans turn out at Madison's Dublin Park for a logo reveal celebration.



November 2018: Trash Pandas open the Emporium at Bridge Street Town Centre for the holiday season and set Minor League Baseball merchandise sales records before closing at the end of the year.

May 2019: Team passes \$1 million in merchandise sales.

June 2019: Trash Pandas unveil the team uniforms at Huntsville's Big Spring Park in front of several hundred fans.

August 2019: Trash Pandas release inaugural season schedule and inaugural mission logo.

October 2019: First seat is installed in Toyota Field; Sod is laid for the berm and the infield and outfield grass; Toyota Field naming ceremony held.

November 2019: Final concrete pour is made; Trash Pandas mascot Sprocket is named.

December 2019: Center field Batter's Eye installed; Trash Pandas surpass \$2 million mark in merchandise sales; Home plate field box seats installed; Right- and left-field foul poles installed; Kids Zone completed.

January 2020: Jay Bell is named the team's first manager.

March 14, 2020: Toyota Field is open to the public for the first time; single-game tickets go on sale.

March 18, 2020: The Trash Pandas front office closes in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

May 4, 2020: The front office returns to Toyota Field to begin plans for the summer with the season still in flux.

June 1, 2020: The Trash Pandas host their first event since coming out of the shutdown with a week-long Kids Camp.

June 6, 2020: The Trash Pandas hold their first event open to the general public with a Block Party at Toyota Field. The party draws approximately 1,500 fans.

June 17, 2020: The first baseball game at any level is played at Toyota Field as the Trash Pandas host The Rocket City Classic.

15 travel select teams play over a five-day span. The first game is between Viper Baseball Academy (VBA) and 43 at 3 p.m.

June 30, 2020: The inaugural 2020 season is cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

February 12, 2021: The Trash Pandas sign a Player Development License with the Los Angeles Angels, keeping Rocket City an Angels' affiliate through 2030.

April 1, 2021: The Trash Pandas surpass the \$4 million mark in merchandise sales.

May 5, 2021: After a rainout on May 4, the Trash Pandas take the field for the first game in team history, one year and one day after the Trash Pandas front office returned to Toyota Field following the shutdown due to the pandemic. David MacKinnon leads off with a single and comes home to score the first run in team history, but Rocket City falls to the Lookouts 6-1.

May 11, 2021: Liftoff at Toyota Field as a sold-out crowd of 7,500 enjoys the first Trash Pandas home game, a 4-3 loss in 10 innings to the Tennessee Smokies.

February 25, 2022: Andy Schatzley named the second manager in Trash Pandas history.

March 9, 2022: SEC baseball comes to Toyota Field for the first time, with Auburn defeating Tennessee Tech 4-3 in front of an energetic crowd of 6,710

April 8, 2022: The second season in Trash Pandas history begins on a high note with an 8-2 road victory over the Birmingham Barons at Regions Field.

June 19, 2022: Rocket City defeats Montgomery 7-2 at Toyota Field, clinching the First-Half North Division title and the first playoff berth in team history. Bryce Teodosio gave the Trash Pandas the lead in the seventh inning with a go-ahead inside-the-park home run, the first Trash Pandas inside-the-park home run.

September 3, 2022: Chase Silseth, Luke Murphy, and Eric Torres combine on the first no-hitter in Trash Pandas history in an 8-0 win over Biloxi at Toyota Field.

September 15, 2022: Trash Pandas clinch Second-Half North Division title with a 5-2 win over Birmingham at Toyota Field.

September 20, 2022: Trash Pandas go on the road and beat Tennessee 9-5 at Smokies Stadium in the first playoff game in team history.

September 22, 2022: Trash Pandas drop first playoff game in Toyota Field history, 4-2 to Tennessee.

September 23, 2022: The Trash Pandas are eliminated with a 3-1 loss to Tennessee, dropping the North Division series two games to one.

October 15, 2022: Toyota Field is transformed into a gridiron for the first football game in the facility, a 47-31 Jacksonville State win over North Alabama in a unique one-way game in front of 10,124 fans.

April 8, 2023: Trash Pandas throw second no-hitter in franchise history in 7-5 loss against Chattanooga.

August 18, 2023: Angels 2023 first-round pick Nolan Schanuel is selected to the Angels roster from Rocket City just 40 days after he was drafted, becoming the fastest promotion since 1995.

May 13, 2024: The Trash Pandas set a major milestone when they welcomed Melanie Forbes to the ballpark as the one millionth fan to visit Toyota Field in team history.

August 2, 2024: Christian Moore, the Angels' first-round pick out of Tennessee was promoted to Rocket City.

GARRETT FAHRMANN

EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT & GENERAL MANAGER

After a stellar baseball career at Concord College in Athens, WV, Garrett Fahrman coached for three years at his alma mater before leaving the field for the front office and his first stop as stadium operations manager for the Carolina League's Potomac Cannons.

Originally from Latimer, Iowa, Fahrman earned a Master's in Sport Management from Slippery Rock University before climbing up the MiLB ranks. Fahrman then went west to join the Fresno Grizzlies as Senior Vice President of Operations. At the time, the Grizzlies were the Triple-A affiliate of the San Francisco Giants.

Following nearly six years in Fresno, opportunity arose for Garrett, this time back East - another 3,000-mile trek across the country.

With the best wishes of the Grizzlies staff, Fahrman was to take the reins as Director of Operations for the Lehigh Valley IronPigs. The IronPigs, whose logo was created by Brandiose, the creator of the Trash Pandas' logos, are the Philadelphia Phillies' Triple-A affiliate.

After four years in Lehigh Valley, Fahrman went back out west for one season to Salt River Fields in Scottsdale, AZ, Spring Training home of the Colorado Rockies and Arizona Diamondbacks. From there, he headed back out west and was out of baseball, working as a real estate agent and for a property insurance company before the allure of the Trash Pandas got him back in the game. He began in Rocket City in July 2019 and was named General Manager in August.

With his strong baseball management background and outstanding business background, Garrett has the perfect combination to be the Trash Pandas first general manager. Garrett and his wife Natalie, make their home in Madison with daughters Riley (12) and Kinsley (10).



LINDSEY KNUPP

EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT

To say Lindsey "brought home the bacon," is, well, the truth.

Before arriving in the Rocket City, Knupp oversaw what many observers call the best in-game experience in Minor League Baseball. Through her efforts, the Lehigh Valley IronPigs won the 2019 Larry MacPhail Award, recognizing the top promotional effort in the sport. No stranger to personal accolades herself, she was the 2015 recipient of the Rawlings Women Executive of the Year award, which is presented annually by Minor League Baseball to the woman who has made outstanding contributions to her club, league, or the sport in general.

A graduate from Shippensburg (PA) University where she was also a two-time All-American in field hockey, Knupp is the caretaker of the Trash Pandas' public image, heading the team's marketing, game promotions, giveaways, and all entertainment in Toyota Field, ensuring the experience in the ballpark is second to none.

In fact, her title could very well be Vice President of Fun. That "title" followed her from Lehigh Valley where she came up with the idea of a cap with a strip of bacon on the front. It turned out to be the team's best merchandising campaign.

And, because of ideas such as those over her 12 years with the IronPigs, the team won five Golden Bobblehead Awards for its promotions in that span, including: Best Non-Game Day Event (2011), Best In-Game Promotion (2013), Best Theme Night (2016), Best Digital Campaign (2018) & Best Overall Promotion or Event (2018).

Her promotions have been noticed by the likes of The Wall Street Journal, USA Today, Sports Illustrated and ESPN, where sports business analyst Darren Rovell said Lindsey is among the "Best Marketers in Minor League Baseball."

Prior to joining Rocket City in November 2019, Knupp was the Director of Sales and Marketing for the Lehigh Valley Zoo. She also worked for the Reading Phillies for three seasons before joining the IronPigs in 2007.

His dad is Skip Caray, Atlanta Braves Hall of Famer, who called games for Turner Sports' coverage of the Braves, NBA, and NFL. His half-brother Chip is the St. Louis Cardinals' current TV broadcaster. Josh's nephew, Chris, was recently named a TV broadcaster for

the Oakland Athletics.

Josh has developed a pedigree of his own, broadcasting college and pro sports. During the baseball offseason, Josh can be heard calling Alabama and UAB athletics on ESPN+. Josh made his Angels radio debut by broadcasting the Angels' Spring Breakout Game against the Cubs on March 15.

Saturday, September 13 – Patriotic Jersey with Pre-Game Softball Contest between the USA Patriots Amputee Softball Team vs. AUSA.

YOUTH INSTRUCTIONAL CAMP

Between two sessions in June, Trash Pandas and Angels players including Eric Wagman, Sam Brown, Houston Harding, Ben Gobel, Gustavo Campero, Tyler Payne, Victor Mederos and Arol Vera taught children ages 7-10 baseball fundamentals and skills on the field at Toyota Field before a Trash Panda game. Over 100 campers learned the fundamentals of hitting, pitching, fielding, and baserunning from the players. All children went home with new skills, autographs, photos, and memories to last a lifetime.

CONCESSIONS FUNDRAISING

NPO's had the opportunity to fundraise for their organization during games by volunteering in our concession stands. Each volunteer in attendance was paid by the hour with that money directly benefitting the organization. A total of \$52,044 was raised through our concessions program.

COMMUNITY DONATIONS

The Trash Pandas are proud to support local organizations and fundraisers through our donation program. Anyone hosting a fundraiser is eligible to apply for tickets, autographed

for their fundraising event. Over \$12,500 in-kind memorabilia donations were made to local fundraisers in 2024. Throughout the season, organizations had the opportunity to set up space on the main concourse and be featured live on the videoboard where they were given the opportunity to promote their cause, recruit volunteers and raise awareness. In 2024, 36 organizations participated, bringing a total in-kind value of \$36,000 donated.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

New for 2024, The Trash Pandas Foundation celebrated its first annual scholarship awards, presenting three \$2,000 scholarships to outstanding local high school seniors from the Greater Tennessee Valley Region. These scholarships are aimed at students pursuing further education in trade schools, junior colleges, or four-year universities. This year's scholarship recipients: McKia Bolding (Career Academies of Decatur); Maja Sullivan (James Clemens High School); Mary Louise Gore (Westminster Christian Academy).

FOOD BANK DONATIONS

This off-season the Trash Pandas Foundation was proud to play a small part in helping fight the local food crisis that is happening in our community. A total of \$4,900 was donated to Manna House, One Generation Away, and Food Bank of North Alabama to allow them to continue their efforts of fighting the shortage. Funds donated will allow them to purchase and provide meals and other necessities for those affected by the food crisis.

BREAKFAST WITH SANTA

Kicking off the '24 holiday season, the Foundation hosted the 3rd annual Breakfast with Santa. This sold out event featured a delicious breakfast buffet with crafts and story time for the kids, and special appearances made by Anna from Frozen, Bluey, Sprocket and of course Santa and his elves!

READING WITH SPROCKET

In 2024, the Trash Pandas Foundation started the first ever Reading with Sprocket program. The program was designed to inspire and motivate local students in the North Alabama area while stressing the importance of reading. Each participant received their very own exclusive Trash Pandas bookmark and folder and a visit from Sprocket himself to kick off the program. Those that completed the program also received a ticket to a Trash Pandas game. We were able to reach close to 2,000 students in the North Alabama community and are excited to grow even more in the 24-25 school year!

MLB PLAY BALL WEEKEND

To inspire participation in baseball and softball activities and encourage local youth to get outside, the Trash Pandas held the 3rd annual "PLAYBALL WEEKEND" event. All 30 MLB and 120 MiLB Clubs held various baseball related activities between June 14th- June 16th. In 2024, our front office staff took a trip to the Miracle League of North Alabama and volunteered to help facilitate games between their teams.

VOLUNTEERING

In addition to the long hours worked during baseball season, our front office staff contributed 200 hours of community service outside the workday to help support our community.

Highlights include our newly established Adopt a Mile program, local festivals and parades such as Depot days and Madison Street Festival, and handing out meals at Manna House. f

COLOR THE CAN

New for 2024 was our Color the Can contest! Kids ages 3 to 12 were invited to submit a fun and creative design for the first ever Cash Can. The Cash Can is a 6-foot trash can, which acts as a donation bank for the Foundation. The top 10 submissions were featured on Tennessee Valley Living with the public being able to vote online. The winner received their drawing re-created on the can and was displayed for the season on the concourse.

POP UP SERIES

In a rare and unique circumstance due to unplayable field conditions in Mississippi, the Braves and Trash Pandas played a five-game series in four days at Toyota Field between June 13-16. The Braves were the home team while the Trash Pandas were the visitors on their home field. Ticket proceeds benefited the foundation, and all reserved seats were \$10. A total of \$39,173 was raised from the series. This money helped support the scholarship program, food bank donations, and will help support field renovations and future grant donation programs.

TRASH PANDA FOR A DAY

The Trash Panda For a Day program is launching this season in partnership with the LA Angels and with an exciting initiative to support youth in the community. Each month, one elementary or middle school student will have the opportunity to spend a day with the Trash Pandas, experiencing the thrill of being part of something greater.

LOOKING AHEAD

Because of our charitable efforts and impact in 2024, a combined cash and in-kind total of \$170,944 was donated to the North Alabama community. As our Foundation continues to grow, the money we continue to raise will help us focus on community initiatives and programming in the North Alabama community such as education and healthy living. Things to look forward to in 2025 include Foundation event fundraisers, community grants and scholarships, field renovations and more!

2024 TRASH PANDAS BY THE NUMBERS

FUTURES GAME SELECTION: On July 13th, Caden Dana represented the Trash Pandas at the 2024 All-Star Futures Game in Arlington, TX. Following a stellar season in Rocket City, he went on to make his Major League debut with the Los Angeles Angels on September 1st.

2 100-HIT SEASONS: For the fourth consecutive season, the Trash Pandas lineup boasted a pair of players with 100 hits or more. Tucker Flint led the way with 104 knocks, and 19-year-old Nelson Rada reached 100 on the dot.

3 CAREER COMPLETE GAMES FOR JACK KOCHANOWICZ: The big right-hander tossed a pair of complete games in a span of just 10 days this summer. On June 26th in Chattanooga, Kochanowicz went the distance against the Lookouts and followed it up against the Barons two starts later at Toyota Field. After making his MLB debut on July 11th, Jack went on to register nine quality starts with the Halos.

4 WEEKLY AWARD WINNERS: Four different players racked up Southern League honors during the 2024 campaign: Gustavo Campero on July 15th, Christian Moore on August 11th, Tucker Flint on August 19th, and George Klassen on September 16th. In addition, Campero, Caden Dana, and Eric Wagaman were also named Southern League All-Stars.

5 CHRISTIAN MOORE HOME RUNS: Drafted eighth overall out of the University of Tennessee, Moore lit the baseball world on fire with the start to his professional career. After racking up 6 hits and 6 RBI over his first two games with Single-A Inland Empire, "CMO" was assigned to the Trash Pandas on August 3rd. He then proceeded to blast five longballs in a span of six games, including a pair of multi-homer performances.

6 WALK-OFF WINS: The Trash Pandas certainly had a flair for the dramatic in 2024. Rocket City played a whopping 92 games this season decided by three runs or less, which mean they nearly always had a shot to win. Those shots amplified playing at home in front of raucous, raccoon-clad fans, which led to five home walk-offs...and weirdly one on the road. Gustavo Campero slid home on a wild pitch on May 23rd, Denzer Guzman obliterated a grand slam two nights later on May 25th, Nelson Rada slapped a successful single on July 15th, Christian Moore ripped an opposite-field home run on August 8th, Campero delivered a strange 7th inning victory in a makeup game at Chattanooga on August 15th, and Tyler Payne was the hero in arguably the wildest sequence of the season for Huntsville Stars Night on September 8th.

7 PLAYERS FROM OPENING DAY ROSTER TO MLB: Ben Joyce, Victor Mederos, Kyren Paris, Jack Kochanowicz, Caden Dana, Eric Wagaman, and Gustavo Campero all started the season in Rocket City before making their way to the Halos.

8 PLAYERS FROM OPENING DAY ROSTER TO TRIPLE-A SALT LAKE: Ivan Armstrong, Michael Darrell-Hicks, Brett Kerry, Hayden Seig, Kenyon Yovan, Eric Torres, Houston Harding, and Tucker Flint all received promotions after successful stints with the Trash Pandas.

9 ORLANDO MARTINEZ FRANCHISE RECORDS: May as well call him "Mr. Trash Panda" at this point. Outfielder Orlando Martinez has now spent the better part of four seasons in North Alabama, where he now holds all-time records for Games Played (296), At-Bats (1,107), Hits (296), Runs (150), Home Runs (34), RBI (178), Doubles (62), Triples (8), and Total Bases (476).

NUMBER 10 NAMED TRASH PANDAS HITTER OF THE YEAR: In 2022, Gustavo Campero played just six games all season and mostly served as a bullpen catcher. Two years later, the catcher-turned-outfielder put up an incredibly impressive campaign of 14 homers, 45 RBI, 29 steals, and a league-best .888 on-base + slugging percentage. This earned him the recognition of Trash Pandas Hitter of the Year, a Southern League All-Star, and September call-up to make his MLB debut with the Los Angeles Angels.

2024 TRASH PANDAS NOTES

2024 TRASH PANDAS TOP PITCHING PERFORMANCES

The Trash Pandas saw some tremendous pitching talent come through Rocket City during the 2024 season, which included three arms who made it to the Majors. Here were the best performances on the mound this year:

5. RHP Chase Chaney (6/21 vs. BLX) - 7 IP, 2 H, 7 K, 1 BB

The Southern League leader in innings pitched, this start marked the first time Chaney hit the 7-inning mark in 2024 as it was the first of two occasions where he would toss seven scoreless against Biloxi. The right-hander closed the season strong, registering quality starts in 4 of his final 5 outings.

4. RHP Brett Kerry (8/29 vs. TNS) - 7 IP, 2 ER, 1 H, 14 K, 2 BB

Nobody racked up more strikeouts in a game this season than Brett Kerry on August 29th. Facing a first-place Smokies team, the righty ripped through their lineup, putting up the second-most strikeouts in franchise history behind a 16 K performance from Reid Detmers in 2021.

3. RHP Jack Kochanowicz (7/6 vs. BIR) - 9 IP, 1 ER, 5 H, 7 K

In an era where complete games are becoming a rarity, Jack Kochanowicz is an exception. The big right-hander with a heavy sinker tossed a pair of complete games for the Trash Pandas in 2024. On June 26th at Chattanooga, Jack went the distance against the Lookouts. Two starts later on July 6th, he did it again while striking out seven and surrendering just one run. This start helped Kochanowicz earn his first promotion to the Angels, where he made his MLB debut on July 11th and went on to log nine quality starts for the Halos.

2. RHP Caden Dana (7/26 vs. CHA) - 9 IP, 2 ER, 3 H, 10 K, 1 BB

After watching his teammate throw a pair of complete games, the Angels' top pitching prospect fired the first one of his career for his best start of the season. Matched up against top Reds prospect, Rhett Lowder, Caden Dana struck out ten Lookouts hitters and gave up just three hits on the night. Dana went on to lead the Southern League in ERA, WHIP, strikeouts, and quality starts in his tremendous 2024 campaign. The righty was then called up to make his major league debut for the Angels on September 1st.

1. RHP George Klassen (9/14 @ CHA) - 6 IP, 12 K, 1 BB

In the final official Trash Pandas game of the season, George Klassen came out firing. The Angels third-ranked prospect took a perfect game into the 6th, surrendered zero hits, and recorded a career-high dozen strikeouts against Chattanooga.

2024 TRASH PANDAS TOP HITTING PERFORMANCES

The Trash Pandas used contributions from up and down the lineup in 2024, with eight different players notching 30 or more RBI and six different players registering 70 or more hits. Here were the best individual performances at the plate this season:

5. OF Nelson Rada (6/7 vs. CHA) - 3 for 4, 1 HR, 1 RBI, 1 SB

The Angels No. 4 prospect hit his first professional home run during a Rocket City victory against the Lookouts, a 400-foot shot to left-center. It was one of six games during the year where Rada recorded a season-high three hits. The 19-year-old finished his first season at the Double-A level with exactly 100 hits.

4. OF Tucker Flint (7/3 @ BIR) - 3 for 5, 2 HR, 2 RBI, 1 SB

Flint's multi-homer game was his first time accomplishing the feat in his professional career. His first one of the night came off Jake Eder in the top of the 5th, an opposite field shot off a hanging slider. His very next at-bat, he crushed a breaking ball from Tristan Stivors deep over the bleachers at Regions Field. Flint ultimately led the team with 104 hits, 16 homers, 58 runs batted in, 61 runs scored, and 71 walks. The outfielder was then promoted to Triple-A Salt Lake for the first time on September 8th.

3. INF Sam Brown (6/25 @ CHA) - 3/4, 5 RBI

Nobody played more games for the Trash Pandas this season than Sam Brown. A consistent presence in the lineup, the first baseman delivered his best night on June 25th in Chattanooga. Amidst a 17-4 beatdown of the Lookouts, Brown got it started in the 1st inning with an RBI single. In the 4th, he followed up with a sacrifice fly. Finally in the 7th with the bases loaded, he blasted a double off the wall to bring home all three runners. Brown's five runs batted in were the most for Rocket City this year.

2. OF Gustavo Campero (6/21 vs. BLX) - 3 for 3, 2 RBI, 2 BB, 3 SB

This statline perfectly showcases the impact Gustavo Campero had for the Trash Pandas. The catcher-turned-outfielder led the team offensively in 2024, and he turned in a total performance on June 21st against the Shuckers -- five times on base, two doubles, two walks, and three steals. Other games considered were his April 17 game in Pensacola where he finished 3-for-5 with two home runs and three RBI, and his July 2 game in Birmingham where he went 4-for-4 with a home run and three RBI. Campero's sensational season earned a promotion to Triple-A Salt Lake on August 16, and then a call-up to Los Angeles for his major league debut on September 15.

1. INF Christian Moore (8/7 vs. BIR) - 4 for 5, 2 HR, 3 RBI

Nobody had a more mercurial few weeks in 2024 than first-round pick, Christian Moore. After racking up 6 RBI in his first two professional games, "CMO" was then promoted to Rocket City on August 3rd. All he did with his first week with the Trash Pandas? 14 hits and 5 homers, punctuated by a pair of blasts on August 7th. He started the game with a solo shot in the 1st, and then ended the game with a walk-off two-run swing to the opposite field in the bottom of the 9th.

HUNTSVILLE STARS



In 1984, Larry Schmittou brought baseball to Huntsville in a series of transactions that moved the then Double-A Nashville Sounds up to Triple-A, and resulted in the forming of the Huntsville Stars. The team began play at Joe W. Davis Municipal Stadium in 1985. Beginning their tenure as the Double-A affiliate of the Oakland A's, the Stars got off to a hot start in 1985, taking home the Southern League crown in their inaugural season. After becoming a Milwaukee Brewers affiliate in 1999, the Stars remained a Brewers affiliate at Joe Davis Stadium until 2014 before moving to Biloxi in 2015 to become the Shuckers. Due to construction delays in Biloxi, the Shuckers played 15 home games at Joe Davis Stadium in 2015, with the final game being a 7-2 Biloxi win over Birmingham on May 25, 2015.

In a ceremony prior to the first game at Toyota Field 5/11/21, the Trash Pandas retired the number 5 in honor of Huntsville baseball legend Don Mincher. A Huntsville native who played 13 MLB seasons, Mincher went on to serve as the Huntsville Stars' first President and General Manager before serving as President of the Southern League from 2000-2011. As a player, Mincher was a two-time All-Star first baseman in 1967 and 1969 before winning a World Series in his final season as a player with the Oakland A's in 1972. Mincher's number 5 was previously retired by the Huntsville Stars. Jackie Robinson's number 42 was retired across baseball in 1997 for breaking baseball's color barrier and for his tremendous contributions to the game. Both numbers hang atop the Inline Electric Rock Porch in right field.

2025 SOUTHERN LEAGUE PLAYOFF PROCEDURES

The Southern League Championship season will be played as a split season (i.e., the season will be divided into two halves). For a season consisting of 138 games (Double-A), the final game of the first half is the originally scheduled game #69 and the first game of the second half is the originally scheduled game #70. Any game that is suspended or postponed during the first half must be completed or made up prior to the first date of the second half, otherwise such game shall be cancelled. Win-loss records will be reset at the beginning of the second half. For the Trash Pandas, the first half will end on Sunday, June 23 vs. Biloxi and the second half will begin on Tuesday, June 25 at Chattanooga.

The format for the Southern League Postseason will consist of four teams per participating in a best-of-three Division Series, followed by a best-of-three Championship Series. The four playoff participants will be the winners of each division from both halves based on the best winning percentage of each half. In the event the same Club wins both halves, the Club with the next best full season winning percentage in that division will advance. In the event of any ties, the following tiebreakers will apply in the order below:

1. Head-to-head record (if 3 or more Clubs, best winning percentage in games among the Clubs).
2. If the Clubs remain tied, best overall winning percentage over the last 20 games.
3. If the Clubs remain tied, best overall winning percentage over an additional game (i.e., the last 21 games, the last 22 games, etc.) until one emerges with a better winning percentage in that span.

The winners of the first half in each division will host game two and, if necessary, game three of the Division Series. The winners of the second half in each division will host game one of the Division Series. The winner of the Division Series from the North Division will host game two and, if needed, game three of the Championship Series; the other Division Series winner will host game one.



RECENT MINOR LEAGUE BASEBALL RULE CHANGES

Major League Baseball announced a variety of experimental playing rules which were implemented starting during the 2023 season throughout each Professional Development League (PDL). Consistent with the preferences of fans, these changes are designed to enhance the quality of the game on the field by increasing action, providing additional opportunities for players to showcase their athleticism, and improving the pace of play. Below were the rules that were first introduced to the Southern League in 2023.

PITCH TIMER: To encourage a crisp pace of play, Pitch Timers will be used at all full-season PDL levels. The Pace of Game Procedures that will be used in 2025 are very similar to the regulations that were used at the PDL levels during the 2022 season. In the Southern League, the pitch clock will be 14 seconds between pitches with the bases empty, 18 seconds between pitches with runners on, and 30 second between batters. Inning breaks and pitching changes come with a two minute and 15 second timer. Batters will be required to be in the batter's box and alert to the pitcher with 8 or more seconds remaining on the Timer, which is a change from the 9-second threshold used at all PDL levels in 2022. If the pitcher makes a pickoff attempt at any base, feints a pickoff, or otherwise steps off the rubber with runners on base he shall be charged with a Disengagement. To ensure that pitchers do not circumvent the Pitch Timer regulations by stepping off the rubber, pitchers at all PDL levels shall be limited to a total of two Disengagements per plate appearance with runners on base. Consistent with the Disengagement Rule in use during the 2022 PDL season, the Disengagement count will not reset until the following plate appearance, even if a runner advances or is retired during a plate appearance.



BIGGER BASES: 18-inch bases will continue to be used at all full-season levels of play in the 2024 season after debuting in 2022. Previously, bases were 15 inches square. This change has the effect of reducing the distance between first and second base and reducing the distance between second and third base.

RESTRICTIONS ON INFIELD POSITIONING: At all PDL levels, a minimum of four infielders (not including the pitcher and the catcher) will be required to be positioned within the outer boundary of the infield with two infielders entirely on each side of second base. Additionally, infielders may not switch sides during an inning unless there is a substitution for a defensive player other than the pitcher.

ENHANCED-GRIP BASEBALLS: During the 2021 season, MLB began working with the Dow Company, a materials science leader, to develop an alternative to the Delaware River mud currently applied to the baseball. The objective of this project was and remains to develop a treatment process that allows pitchers to secure a better grip on the baseball – particularly in extreme environmental conditions – while not altering performance properties. The baseballs that undergo this treatment process (“Enhanced-Grip Baseballs”) are Major League baseballs manufactured by Rawlings and are identical to the baseballs that will be in use during the 2024 Major League season. To evaluate the potential for these Enhanced-Grip Baseballs to be used at the Major League level in the future, Enhanced-Grip Baseballs will be used in the Southern League from Opening Day through July 13 (i.e., prior to the All-Star break). When games resume after the All-Star break, teams in the Southern League will use standard mudded Major League baseballs. This experimental design provides the best opportunity to collect feedback from players and coaches early in the season and to determine the impact that the treatment process has on performance properties (e.g., spin rate, drag).

BASEBALL CALCULATIONS

ASSISTS

An assist shall be credited to each fielder who throws or deflects a batted or thrown ball in such a way that a putout results, or would have resulted except for a subsequent error by any fielder. Only one assist and no more shall be credited to each fielder who throws or deflects the ball in a run-down play which results in a putout, or would have resulted in a putout, except for a subsequent error.

BATTING AVERAGE

Divide the numbers of at-bats into the number of hits.

SLUGGING PERCENTAGE

Divide the total bases of all safe hits by the total number of at-bats.

ON BASE PERCENTAGE

Take the total number of hits, walks, and hit-by-pitches and divide by the total number of at-bats, walks, hit-by-pitches, and sacrifice flies. Times awarded first base on interference or obstruction are not figured into on base percentage.

CONSECUTIVE GAME HITTING STREAK

A consecutive-game hitting streak shall not be terminated if all the player's plate appearances result in a walk, hit batsman, defensive interference or a sacrifice bunt. The streak shall terminate if the player has a sacrifice fly and no hit.

CONSECUTIVE GAMES PLAYED STREAK

A consecutive-game streak shall extend if the player plays one half-inning on defense, or if he completes a time at bat by reaching base or being put out. A pinch-running appearance shall not extend the streak.

DETERMINING THE MAGIC NUMBER

Determine the number of games yet to be played, add one, then subtract the number of games ahead in the lost column of the standings from the closest team.

EARNED RUN AVERAGE

Multiply earned runs by 9 and then divide by innings pitched.

FIELDING PERCENTAGE

Divide the total putouts and assists by total putouts, assists and errors.

SAVES FOR RELIEF PITCHERS

Credit a pitcher with a save when he meets all three of the following conditions:

- He is the finishing pitcher in a game won by his club; and
- He is not the winning pitcher; he must be credited with at least 1/3 of an inning pitched and
- He qualifies under one of the following conditions:
 1. He enters the game with a lead of no more than three runs and pitches for at least one inning; or
 2. He enters the game, regardless of the count, with the potential tying run either already on base, at bat or on deck; or
 3. He enters the game, regardless of how large the lead is, and pitches effectively as he completes the last three innings of the game.

No more than one save may be credited in each game.

WINNING PITCHER

The starting pitcher will be credited with the win only if he has pitched at least five complete innings and his team not only is in the lead when he is replaced, but remains in the lead the remainder of the game. When the starting pitcher does not meet the preceding criteria and more than one relief pitcher is used, the victory shall be awarded on the following basis:

- When, during the tenure of the starting pitcher, the winning team assumes the lead and maintains it to the finish of the game, credit the victory to the relief pitcher judged by the scorer to have been the most effective.
- Whenever the score is tied, the game becomes a new contest insofar as the winning and losing pitcher is concerned.
- Once the opposing team assumes the lead, all pitchers who have pitched up to that point are excluded from being credited with the victory except the current pitcher.
- The winning relief pitcher shall be the one who is the pitcher of record when his team assumes the lead and maintains it to the finish of the game.

EXCEPTION: Do not credit a victory to a relief pitcher who is ineffective in a brief appearance, when a succeeding relief pitcher pitches effectively in helping his team maintain the lead. In such cases credit the succeeding relief pitcher with the victory.
