CAREER AVERAGES:

Caruso has appeared in 363 games and averaged 6.8 points, 2.9 rebounds, 2.9 assists and 1.3 steals in 22.7 minutes of action per contest.

CAREER NOTES:

2023-24 (CHICAGO): Appeared in a career-high 71 games (57 starts - career high) and posted career-high averages with 10.1 ppg, 3.8 rpg, 1.0 bpg and 28.7 mpg, alongside 3.5 apg and 1.7 spg. Shot a career-high .468 from the field, .408 from three and .760 from the free-throw line. Was awarded the 2023-24 NBA Hustle Award. Earned a 2023-24 Kia NBA All-Defensive Second Team selection. Became the ninth player in franchise history to earn two or more All-Defensive Team nods, joining Michael Jordan (9x), Scottie Pippen (8x), Norm Van Lier (7x), Jerry Sloan (6x), Bob Love (3x), Joakim Noah (3x), Jimmy Butler (3x), and Horace Grant (2x), while becoming fifth undrafted NBA player in league history with multiple NBA All-Defensive honors (Bruce Bowen - 8x. Ben Wallace - 6x, Moses Malone - 2x, Raja Bell - 2x). Led the NBA in deflections per game (3.7), while ranking second in total deflections (265), third in total steals (120) and tied for third in steals per game (1.7). Was the only NBA player with at least 100 steals and 70 blocks. Was the only player in the NBA with 130-plus 3FGM, 100-plus steals and 60plus blocks, becoming the first NBA player to do so since 2020-21 (Robert Covington) and the first player in franchise history to record such a season. Set single-season career highs in total minutes (2,040), total points (715), FGM (253), 3FGM (136), steals (120) and blocks (40). Led the Bulls in steals on 25 occasions, while leading Chicago in blocks 30 times. Had 37 games with two or more steals and 17 games with two or more blocks. Tallied one or more blocks in a career-best 17-straight games (12/30-2/6), which marked the longest streak of this sort by any NBA guard or forward. Recorded two-plus 3FGM in a career-high 44 games, including a career-best nine consecutive games with two-plus 3FGM (1/10-1/28). Scored a season-high 23 points (9-13 FG, 5-6 3FG) at IND

(3/13). Logged a career-high four blocks vs. MIN (2/6). Tallied three blocks alongside five 3FGM at PHX (1/22), making him the first Bulls player since 2017-18 to tally such minimums. Pulled in a careerhigh 13 rebounds alongside 13 points, which marked his lone double-double of the season. 2022-23 (CHICAGO): Appeared in 67 games (36 starts) and averaged 5.6 ppg, 2.9 rpg, 2.9 apg and 1.5 spg in 23.5 mpg. Shot .455 from the field, .364 from three and a career-high .808 from the freethrow line. Earned a 2022-23 Kia NBA All-Defensive First Team selection. Became the 14th player in franchise history to garner an All-Defensive nod and the third in the last 10 seasons (Joakim Noah. Jimmy Butler). Ranked top-15 in the NBA in several notable defensive categories, ranking first in steals per 100 possessions (3.0 - min. 1.500 minutes played), first in deflections per 36 minutes (5.2), tied for fifth in deflections per game (3.4). sixth in total deflections (226), tied for ninth in steals per game (1.5) and 14th in total steals (98). Was one of five players in the NBA to finish the 2022-23 regular season with at least 95 steals and 45 blocks and the first Chicago player to do so since 2013-14 (Joakim Noah). Set single-season career highs in steals (98) and blocks (46). Tied a single-season career high with 55 three-pointers made. Was awarded the 2023 NBA Community Assist Award for January. Matched a single-game career high with three blocks vs. DET (1/19). Nabbed a season-high five steals vs. OKC (1/13). Pulled down a career-high 11 rebounds at TOR (11/6). 2021-22 (CHICAGO): Appeared in 41 games (18 starts) and averaged 7.4 ppg, 3.6 rpg, 4.0 apg and 1.7 spg in 28.0 mpg. Shot .398 from the field, .333 from three and .795 from the freethrow line. Pocketed his 250th career steal at WAS (3/29). Made 10th start of the season vs. TOR (3/21), playing 33 minutes, dishing six assists and finishing with a +17 plus/minus. Returned to action vs. CLE (3/12) after missing 22-straight games due to a fractured right wrist and played 29 minutes,

recording 11 points, four assists and four steals. Matched season highs with 11 FGA and six 3FGA while also pulling down a season-best eight defensive rebounds at MIL (1/21). Returned to action after missing 13 consecutive games due to a left foot sprain (six games), followed by Health and Safety Protocols (seven games), recording nine points, three rebounds and two assists in 23 minutes off the bench vs. CLE (1/19). Recorded a season-high 22 points while also knocking down his 150th career three-pointer and grabbing his 500th career rebound vs. MIA (11/27). Came within one assist of recording his first triple-double with 12 points, a then career-high 10 rebounds and season-high nine assists at POR (11/17); also

passed 500 career assists. Logged a season-high 39 minutes in his first start of the season at LAC (11/14). Matched a career high with six steals vs. DAL (11/10) and led the bench scoring with 16 points, making him one of four reserves in Bulls history to record such totals. 2020-21 (L.A. LAK-ERS): Appeared in 58 games (six starts) and averaged 6.4 ppg. 2.9 rpg. 2.8 apg and 1.1 spg in 21.0 mpg. Shot .436 from the field, .401 from three and .645 from the free-throw line. Scored in double figures 12 times and tallied multiple steals in 22 games. Had 17 points, a season-high eight assists, three rebounds and three steals vs. PHX (5/9). Scored a season-high 18 points with six rebounds and two assists at POR (5/7). Made first start of the season vs. TOR (5/2). Finished with five points, a season-high four steals, three rebounds and one assist vs. CLE (3/26). Missed five games due to the Health and Safety Protocols (12/28-1/5), two games due to a right hand strain (2/8-2/10), one game with neck spasms (3/3), two games due to a mild concussion (3/15-3/16), two with back spasms games (4/28-4/30) and one game with right foot soreness (5/12). DNP-CD once (5/15). 2019-20 (L.A. LAKERS): The NBA Champion appeared in 64 games (two starts) and averaged 5.5 ppg, 1.9 rpg, 1.9 apg and 1.1 spg in 18.4 mpg while shooting .412 from the field. .333 from three and .734 from the free-throw line. Scored in double figures 12 times. In first start of season, totaled nine points with two rebounds and one steal at MEM (2/29). Logged eight points, three rebounds, eight assists, two steals and one block in 17 minutes vs. NOP (2/25), becoming the first Lakers player to have eight-plus assists in less than 20 minutes since Ronnie Price in 2014. Had a career-high six steals in 20 minutes at PHI (1/25), becoming the first NBA player since Pablo Prigioni (1/13/16) to have that steal total in 20 minutes or less. Tallied season-high 16 points with four rebounds and four assists vs. MIN (12/8). DNP-CD once (10/22). Missed one game due to right calf strain (11/23), one due to right calf tightness (1/3), two games due to right hamstring soreness (3/1-3/3), one game due to left neck muscle spasms (8/6) and one game due to right neck muscle spasms (8/13). 2018-19 (L.A. LAKERS): Appeared in 25 games (four starts) and averaged 9.2 ppg, 2.7 rpg and 3.1 apg in 21.2 mpg and shot .445 from the field. .480 from three and .797 from the free-throw line. Had three double-doubles. Scored in double figures in 11 games, including

two 20-point games and one 30-point contest. Led the team in scoring once, rebounds once, assists three times, steals seven times, blocks three times and minutes twice. Upped his career high assist total for second-straight game vs. POR (4/9), totaling 13 dimes with 12 points and seven rebounds for his third consecutive double-double. Totaled 18 points and 11 assists vs. UTA (4/7). At LAC (4/5). finished with a career-high 32 points (5-7 3FG, 7-7 FT), 10 rebounds, five assists and two steals, good for his first career double-double: became the first Laker since Pau Gasol (2009) to record that line in a game. Made first start of season vs. GSW (4/4), finishing with nine points, five rebounds and six assists. Had a then career-best 23 points with six assists and four steals at NOP (3/31), becoming the first Lakers player to reach or surpass those totals off the bench since steals became an official stat (1973-74). Tallied 12 points with steals (5) and blocks (3) at NYK (3/17), becoming the first reserve in the NBA to have fiveplus steals and three-plus blocks in a single game in 2018-19. Scored first points of the season vs. GSW (1/21), finishing with six points, one assist and a team-high two blocks. Made first appearance of the season at SAC (12/27). DNP-CD five times (2/21, 2/25-3/2). 2017-18 (L.A. LAKERS): Appeared in 37 games (seven starts) and averaged 3.6 ppg, 1.8 rpg and 2.0 apg in 15.2 mpg and shot .431 from the field. .302 from three and .700 from the free-throw line. Led the team in assists three times, steals eight times and blocks once. Tallied 15 points and seven rebounds, both career highs, in season finale at LAC (4/11). Totaled nine points, four rebounds, six assists and two steals vs. HOU (4/10) in first career start, finished with seven points, four rebounds, two assists, one steal and one block vs. SAC (4/1). Finished with nine points, four rebounds and a season-high eight assists vs. NYK (1/21). In his NBA debut, totaled two points, one rebound and two assists vs. LAC (10/19). Inactive for 44 games. DNP-CD once.

streak in Thunder history. On 2/2, the Thunder defeated the Mavericks, 120-114, in overtime and he scored 14 of the team's 17 overtime points, becoming the seventh NBA player since 1996-97 to score 14 or more points in a single OT period. He finished with 30 points and tied his season-best six made threes, which was one shy of his career-high mark. Grabbed a season-high eight rebounds three times and dished out four assists in five games. On 12/28, he scored 19 points while going 2-for-7 from three, marking the second longest active streak in the NBA with a made three-pointer (46) behind only Stephen Curry (157) at the time. Scored 34 points on 11/17 for the second highest mark in his career, behind his all-time high of 42 points on 4/13/21. Posted a career-high five-game streak of scoring 20-plus points after tallying 20 on 11/15 vs. Miami. 2020-21 (OKLA-HOMA CITY): Named to Team World for 2021 NBA Rising Stars. Hit at least one three-pointer in 46 of his 52 appearances, leading the team with 113 threes this season. Led the team in scoring 10 times, in rebounding three times and in assists three times. Notched 36 games with 10+ points, nine games with 20+ points and one game with 40+ points. On 4/27 at Boston, led the Thunder with his 24 points, four rebounds and two assists, draining three shots from long range. Missed one game with left knee soreness. Sat out three games due to his left great toe. Missed seven games on concussion protocol. Sat out one game with left shoulder soreness. Missed four games with a right hip strain. 

SAM PRESTI EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT & GENERAL MANAGER

Sam Presti is currently in his 18th season with the Thunder franchise. During Presti's tenure, the Thunder has captured six Northwest Division Championships and reached the Conference Finals four times, including the team's trip to the NBA Finals in 2012. This past season, Oklahoma City secured its 12th postseason appearance in the last 15 seasons which represents the second most postseasons for any NBA team during this span.

Presti was 29 years old when he was named General Manager on June 7, 2007, making him the second youngest person to ever hold the position in NBA history. The next season he was promoted to Executive Vice President and General Manager by Professional Basketball Club Chairman, Clayton I. Bennett. Presti stands as the third-most tenured head of basketball operations in the NBA. Presti and Bennett also represent the second-longest pairing for a Governor of an NBA team and head of basketball operations.

Throughout the Thunder's time in Oklahoma City, the organization has been known as one of the premier franchises in the NBA for player development. As a result, both Thunder teams and individuals have set historic marks for accomplishment at very young ages. This past season, the Thunder became the youngest team in NBA history to win 55 games and claim the No. 1 seed in either conference. The Thunder achieved a 17-win improvement in 2023-2024 and during the 2022-23 season, Presti oversaw a 16-win improvement, making the Thunder one of just four teams in NBA history to see that level of improvement in consecutive seasons. The 2023-24 Thunder also set an NBA record by becoming the youngest team to win 50 games and clinch a playoff berth, records that were previously set by the Thunder in 2010. Additionally, the Thunder is currently tied for the NBA lead with eight seasons of a 50-plus win equivalent over the past 15 seasons.

Since the NBA/ABA merger in 1976, the Thunder enjoyed the most successful first 15 seasons of any expansion or relocation team. The Thunder ranks first in wins per season, winning percentage, net rating, playoff series wins, Division titles, Conference Finals Appearances and tied for 1st in NBA Finals appearances, compared to the other 17 expansion or relocation teams. Additionally, the Thunder ranks first with four First Team All-NBA players (nine total First Team All-NBA selections) when compared across the same timeline to those other 17 teams. Presti is the only current NBA General Manager to draft four All-NBA players.

Presti led the Thunder to the second-best record in the NBA for more than a decade (2009-2020), and the seventh best wining percentage in all of the four major North American professional sports, creating an unprecedented period of sustained success in June of the smallest markets in the NBA. After acquiring six-time All-Star Paul George in a landmark trade from the Indiana Pacers in June of 2017, George then signed a multi-year deal with the Thunder in the summer of 2018. This occurred the year after Oklahoma City signed Russell Westbrook to his third multi-year contract extension in September of 2017. Following the 2018-19 season, Presti began repositioning and replenishing the franchise with a series of moves, acquiring Chris Paul, Shai Gilgeous-Alexander, Danilo Gal-linari, eight first round draft picks and four pick swaps in separate deals involving Paul George, Russell Westbrook and Jerami Grant. In the George deal alone, the Thunder again made the playoffs in 2020, earning the fifth seed in the Western Conference as Presti finished second in Executive of the Year voting.

Before the start of the 2020-2021 season, in order to continue to reposition the franchise, Presti and the Thunder executed 11 trades with 15 different teams, marking the most activity for a team in a single offseason since the advent of the NBA Draft Lottery in 1985. Currently, Presti and the Thunder have amassed a total of 13 first-round and 16 second-round picks to accompany first round pick swaps through the 2031 NBA Draft.

Throughout his time leading the Thunder's basketball operations efforts, Presti and his staff have enjoyed incredible success with respect to the NBA Draft, beginning with the 2007 selection of Kevin Durant with the second overall pick. Presti went on to draft Russell Westbrook and Serge Ibaka in 2008 with the fourth and 24th selections, before taking James Harden with the third overall pick in 2009. The selections of Durant, Westbrook and Harden marked the only time in NBA history where future MVPs were selected by the same GM in three consecutive drafts.

More recently, Chet Holmgren (2023-24) and Jalen Williams (2022-23) both finished second in rookie of the year voting after they were selected 2nd and 12th, respectively in the 2022 NBA Draft. Cason Wallace also emerged as a strong rotation player during his rookie year this past season after being selected 10th overall in the 2023 NBA Draft.

During Presti's tenure, the Thunder front office have either drafted or traded for 12 All-Stars (K. Durant, R. Westbrook, J. Harden, V. Oladipo, D. Sabonis, P. George, C. Anthony, C. Paul, A. Horford, Gilgeous-Alexander and G. Hayward). Since 2008, the Thunder leads the NBA with 16 First Team or Second Team All-NBA appearances.

With Presti at the helm, the Thunder advanced to the postseason five straight years (2010-14) and at the conclusion 2012-13 season, Oklahoma City became just the second team in NBA history (Boston Celtics; 1955-60) to increase its winning percentage for five consecutive seasons while maintaining a winning percentage of .700 or better in two of those seasons.

During the 2009-10 season, Oklahoma City experienced one of the largest turnarounds in NBA history. A year after winning 23 games, the Thunder concluded the 2009-10 season with a 50-32 record (.610) and captured the franchise's first playoff berth in Oklahoma City. The 27-win improvement was tied for the eighth-largest improvement in NBA history. Presti was named NBA Executive of the Year by Sporting News at the conclusion of the season.

As player development has been a signature of the Thunder organization, so has leadership development. Since 2010, the Thun-

der have produced the most front office members to become general managers as Rich Cho, Will Dawkins, Rob Hennigan, Michael Winger and Troy Weaver were all hired from the Thunder into that respective role.

During his tenure in OKC, Presti has hired three head coaches. The Thunder is the only team in NBA history to have three consecutive coaches named Coach of the Year (Scott Brooks – 2011; Billy Donovan – 2020 and Mark Daigneault - 2024).

Prest has also devoted time serving on several NBA committees. At the request of former NBA Commissioner David Stern and then Deputy Commissioner Adam Silver, Presti was named to the league's first-ever Competition Committee in May of 2012 (2012-2018). During his term, Presti was a part of the committee that enacted several rule changes, such as concussion protocol, a package of rules to increase game flow, player rest policies, anti-flopping rules, deliberate away-from-the-play fouls, modifications to playoff seeding, qualification and tie-breakers, and adjustments to the NBA Finals scheduling format.

Additionally, Presti was asked to serve on the NBA's Instant Replay Committee in 2009, which helped to lay the groundwork for rules changes that the Competition Committee would later make regarding instant replay expansion and the expanded use of the replay center. He has also been a part of the General Manager Sub-Committee which was designed to help identify opportunities to enhance the future of the NBA.

Prior to joining the Thunder, Presti held a variety of roles with the San Antonio Spurs. After starting in 2000 as a video intern for Gregg Popovich, Presti moved up through the front office ranks under the leadership of R.C. Buford before being elevated to the position of Vice President and Assistant General Manager. As a member of the Spurs, Presti was part of NBA Championship teams in 2003, 2005 and 2007, as well as five division titles.

Community involvement and giving back has been a pillar of the Thunder organization since moving to Oklahoma City in 2008. Presti has led community involvement initiatives for both Thunder players and staff. Under his leadership, Thunder players have made more than 2,850 community appearances in and around Oklahoma City. Presti understands how the Oklahoma City National Memorial and Museum is part of the fabric of the community and has made it policy for every new player and staff member to tour the Oklahoma City National Memorial & Museum soon after joining the organization.

Philanthropy has been a lifelong passion and commitment of Presti and his family as well. Presti was elected as a member of the Executive Committee at the Oklahoma City National Memorial & Museum after previously serving on the Board of Trustees. While on the Board, Presti helped lead the Memorial's Oklahoma Standard campaign, a movement built on the foundation of resilience, compassion, consistent acts of honor, service and kindness.

Presti has also created and launched several transformational initiatives. In July of 2020, Presti and his high school teammate, friend and CAA Sports executive Mike Johnson, launched the Thunder Fellows Program, a partnership between the Thunder and CAA Sports intended to unlock new opportunities in sports, technology and entertainment for Black students in the Tulsa area. Located in the Historic Greenwood District of Tulsa, the curriculum offered through the Thunder Fellows Program, focuses on increasing the odds of high school and college completion through mentorship, skill development, and the provision of practical experience. Students are exposed to a variety of disciplines within Thunder basketball operations, where they work on real-world projects for the organization.

The Presti family became significant benefactors to the Children's Hospital at OU Medicine in 2019, as their contributions provided renovations and upgrades to two procedure rooms at the Jimmy Everest Center for Cancer and Blood Disorders for Children and the Bone Marrow Transplant Unit at The Children's Hospital. The Presti's philanthropy also helped create the "Presti Clubhouse," a nurturing and interactive space for children and their parents.

In recent years, Presti has led a fundraising initiative to establish a scholarship in honor of Professor Mike Brown at his alma mater, Emerson College. Professor Brown taught courses on government, civil rights and the First Amendment. The scholarship will support incoming students from historically underserved and underrepresented backgrounds with financial need.

Also, Presti established the Keenan Smith-Anthony Halls Scholarship Fund at his former high school, Concord-Carlisle. The scholarship is named after two high school basketball teammates and close friends of Presti's, Anthony Halls and Keenan Smith, who were participants in the METCO program at Presti's high school. The scholarship recognizes Concord-Carlisle High School METCO graduating seniors who: possess good academic and attendance records and who have demonstrated a strong athletic performance.

Presti has impacted the lives of over 550 students through his Forward Thinking Leadership Development Program. Created in 2011, in partnership with several local organizations, the program aims to help the next generation of youth in the surrounding community and it's currently being taught to the Thunder Fellos students in Tulsa, Okla. Presti has also incorporated UPenn and their standard bearing resilience and optimism training for the students as part of his Forward Thinking program.

Through the years, Presti has been involved with PeacePlayers International (PPI), a global outreach program focused on bringing children and communities together through the game of basketball. In 2018, Presti brought PPI together with the Oklahoma City Police Athletic League and made a significant donation to help the two parties collaborate and develop programs to foster positive relations with youth and law enforcement.

In the spring of 2024, Presti received the Lee Allan Smith Legacy Award from the Oklahoma Hall of Fame. This award is presented annually to someone in the community who is impacts future generations through their civic engagement and volunteer efforts.

During September of 2021, Oklahoma City University announced the induction of Presti into the Oklahoma Commerce and Industry Hall of Honor which recognizes business and community leaders who have made significant contributions to the growth and development of Oklahoma.

In 2016, Presti was awarded the Humanitarian Award from the Oklahoma Center for Community and Justice thanks to his work in the area of diversity and inclusion in the workplace. He was named 2016 Oklahoman of the Year by Oklahoma Magazine. Presti was recognized as Oklahoma City University's 2012-13 recipient of the Abe Lemons/Paul Hansen Award for Sports Excellence and he also won the Oklahoma March of Dimes Sports Headliner Special Award for 2013.

Presti earned his bachelor's degree in 2000 in communications, politics and law with a minor in psychology from Emerson College in Boston, where he was the first Rhodes Scholar nominee in school history. The Concord, Mass. native served as team captain of the Emerson College basketball team during both his junior and senior seasons. In addition, Presti earned All-Academic honors two times and was twice selected to the Great Northeast Athletic Conference All-Tournament team.

He was honored with the Emerson College Young Alumnus Award in 2005. Presti has also completed Harvard University's Continuing Education program on leadership and decision-making.

A skilled drummer, Presti has produced three music CDs with all proceeds benefiting the Extra Ordinary Needs Fund at Children's Hospital in Boston.







MARK DAIGNEAULT HEAD COACH

Mark Daigneault (DAYG-nalt) was named head coach of the Oklahoma City Thunder on Nov. 11, 2020. He is the fourth head coach in Thunder history and is the first person to become an NBA team's head coach after previously being the club's G League head coach. He is the fourth-youngest active head coach in the NBA.

Daigneault was named 2024 NBA Coach of the Year and the 2024 Michael H. Goldberg NBCA Coach of the Year after leading the Thunder to a first-place finish in the Western Conference with a 57-25 record. With Daigneault at the helm, Oklahoma City became the youngest team in NBA history to clinch a No. 1 seed in the conference and win over 55 games. OKC was one of two teams in the 23-24 season to finish top five in both offensive (118.3, 3rd) and defensive rating (111.0, 4th). The Thunder became just the 14th team in NBA history to finish top-three in field goal percentage (49.9), 3-point percentage (38.9) and free throw percentage (82.5). On the defensive end, Oklahoma City ranked tied for the NBA lead with the most blocked shots (6.56) and steals (8.46). Oklahoma City saw its record improve by 17 wins this season, becoming just the fourth team in NBA NBA history to have two consecutive seasons with a 16-plus win improvement.

In the 2022-23 season, Daigneault finished second in coach of the year voting after leading the Thunder to a 40-42 record and an appearance in the Play-In Tournament. The Thunder set team records for points scored in a game twice during the season (153 vs. HOU, 2/4/23 and 150 vs. BOS, 1/3/23). Under his tutelage, Oklahoma City ranked fourth in the league in steals (8.24) and scored the second-most points off turnovers (20.6) in the NBA. The Thunder recorded 17 double-digit comeback wins, tied for the most in the league.

During the 2021-22 season, Daigneault led the youngest team in NBA history to eight 15-plus point comeback wins, tied for the third most such wins since 1996-97. It was tied for the most comebacks after trailing by 15-plus points by any Thunder team with the 2019-20 Thunder team. Prior to the All-Star Break, the Thunder boasted a stout defense, ranking eighth in defensive rating at 108.6.

He spent the 2019-20 season as an assistant coach for Oklahoma City and became the fourth-straight head coach of the Thunder's G League affiliate to make the move to an NBA bench. Previously, Daigneault served for five seasons as the head coach of the Oklahoma City Blue, the longest-tenured coach in franchise history. During his tenure, he led the Blue to four playoff appearances and a 143-107 (.572) record, the most wins by a coach in franchise history. Daigneault also coached the Thunder's Summer League team for three summers.

Daigneault led the Blue to its third consecutive division championship in the 2018-19 season, as the team tied a franchise record with 34 wins and advanced to the conference semifinals. The Massachusetts native was named NBA G League Coach of the Month three times in his tenure, including twice during the 2018-19 season.

During the 2017-18 campaign, the Blue made finished the regular season at the top of the Midwest division and ranked third in the Western Conference. The 2016-17 season saw several records set, as Daigneault led the team to a franchise-record-tying 34 wins. The Blue finished as the regular-season Western Conference Champions and advanced to the Western Conference Finals for the first time under Daigneault.

In 2015-16, Daigneault joined Billy Donovan's Thunder coaching staff midseason on Feb. 17 in place of Thunder assistant Maurice Cheeks, who was sidelined for six weeks due to hip surgery. Daigneault remained with the Thunder for the conclusion of the 2015-16 season and entirety of the Thunder's postseason campaign to the Western Conference Finals.

Under his watch, the Blue had eight players called up to NBA rosters, four players signed to Two-Way Contracts and 10 Thunder players assigned.

Daigneault came to Oklahoma City after spending four years working under Donovan at the University of Florida, where he last held the position of assistant to the head coach. Throughout his four years at Florida, the Gators totaled a record of 120-30 (.800), won three SEC titles and advanced to the Elite Eight each year.

Prior to his time at Florida, Daigneault spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Holy Cross. During Daigneault's tenure, the Crusaders finished as runner-up of the Patriot League Championship in 2008-09.

A 2007 graduate of the University of Connecticut, Daigneault served as a student manager with the Huskies under Jim Calhoun from 2003-07. A native of Leominster, Mass., Daigneault holds a master's degree in sports management from the University of Florida. He and his wife, Ashley Kerr, have two children, AJ and Stella.



DAVE BLISS ASSISTANT COACH

Dave Bliss is set to start his sixth season as an assistant coach for the Thunder and 12th overall with the organization. He returned to Oklahoma City at the start of the 2018-19 season to serve as senior player development coach after spending three seasons with the New York Knicks as a player development coach. He previously worked with Oklahoma City as video analyst/player development coach from 2010-15 and has also served as the head coach for the Thunder's summer league team.

He began his coaching career as a volunteer assistant at the University of Georgia before transitioning to Virginia Commonwealth University to work as a graduate assistant. Bliss worked under Head Coach Shaka Smart in his time at VCU, helping the team to a 27-9 record. Bliss also served as an assistant coach for Germany's men's senior national team in 2016 and 2017.

A four-year starter at Georgia, Bliss played a key role as the Bulldogs won the school's second SEC Conference Tournament Championship in 2008. The Wisconsin native holds a master's in education from VCU and graduated with honors from Georgia with degrees in political science and real estate.

MIKE WILKS ASSISTANT COACH

Mike Wilks starts his sixth season as an assistant coach for the Thunder, his 13th with the organization overall. Wilks spent seven seasons working in the front office, most recently holding the title of senior pro evaluation scout. He is the fourth former Thunder player (Royal Ivey, Eric Maynor, DJ White) to join the team's coaching staff.

He enjoyed a seven-year NBA playing career where he appeared in 233 games with ten different NBA teams and won an NBA championship with the San Antonio

Spurs in 2005.

The Milwaukee native played four years of basketball at Rice University where he majored in Economics and earned Western Athletic Conference Scholar Athlete honors in his senior year.

> DAVID AKINYOOYE ASSISTANT COACH

David Akinyooye (ah-kin-YO-yay) begins his 10th season with the franchise and sixth as a Thunder assistant coach. Akinyooye spent four seasons as an assistant coach for the Oklahoma City Blue. He came to Oklahoma City in 2015 following a one-year stint as an assistant coach in Lyon, France with Asvel Lyon-Villeurbanne Basket.

Prior to his time in Lyon, Akinyooye served the San Antonio Spurs as a player development quality assurance assistant during San Antonio's 2013-14 NBA champion-

ship season. He began his coaching career in 2012-13 with the New York Knicks in the role of coaching workout associate.

Following a collegiate career at Adelphi University in New York, Akinyooye played one season with the Springfield Armor of the NBA G League. The Elmont, N.Y. native received a Bachelor of Science in Communication from Adelphi in 2011.

GRANT GIBBS ASSISTANT COACH

Grant Gibbs begins his eighth season with the organization and third as an assistant coach with the Thunder. Prior to this role, he spent three seasons as the head coach of the Oklahoma City Blue.

Gibbs became the seventh head coach in Blue franchise history after spending the previous two seasons as an assistant coach for the Blue from 2017-2019. In his time on the bench, the team went 62-38 (.620) and advanced to the playoffs in both years.

As head coach of the Blue, Gibbs amassed a 43-49 overall record. In the 2021-22 season,

he led the sixth-seeded Blue to a runner-up finish in the G League Showcase Cup. Oklahoma City finished the season with the third-ranked defensive rating in the league. In the shortened 2020-21 season, he led the Blue to an 8-7 record in the G League bubble and posted a 20-22 record the previous year when the season was suspended due to the COVID-19 pandemic in March 2020.

Gibbs joined the organization after a three-year international playing career that included stints in the Netherlands and Germany after he graduated from Creighton with a degree in journalism. The lowa native began his collegiate career at Gonzaga and then transferred to Creighton after two seasons with the Bulldogs. He ranks fourth all time in Creighton school history with 498 career assists.



ERIC MAYNOR ASSISTANT COACH

Eric Maynor enters his second season as an assistant coach with the Thunder. It is his sixth season with the organization, as he previously served as the Thunder's assistant coach for player development for two seasons and spent two seasons as an assistant coach with Thunder's G League affiliate, the Oklahoma City Blue.

Maynor owned a nine-year NBA playing career, including three seasons with the Thunder, appearing in 267 games throughout his career. The North Carolina native

is the fourth former Thunder player (Royal Ivey, Mike Wilks, DJ White) to begin his coaching career in the organization.

A graduate of VCU with a degree in Sports Management, Maynor was a two-time CAA Player of the Year and has his No. 3 jersey retired by the school, one of just five players to have his number retired.



CONNOR JOHNSON ASSISTANT COACH

Connor Johnson is in his fifth season with the organization where he serves as an assistant coach. He has also served as an assistant coach for program development for the organization.

Prior to joining the Thunder, Johnson spent three seasons as the head coach of the Delaware Blue Coats, the Philadelphia 76ers' G League affiliate. In his final year as head coach, he led the team to the 2021 G League championship game, marking the first playoff appearance and playoff victories in the franchise's history.

Johnson joined the 76ers organization in 2014, where he started as a video coordinator and eventually rose to the position of Director of Player Development and Coaching Administration. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant with the Villanova men's basketball team and earned his master's degree in public administration.

The San Diego, California native is a graduate from Amherst College in Massachusetts. He married his wife, Meredith, in the summer of 2020.



CHIP ENGELLAND

ASSISTANT COACH

Chip Engelland begins his third season as an assistant with Oklahoma City and holds 25 years of NBA coaching experience. Prior to the Thunder, he spent 17 seasons as an assistant coach with the San Antonio Spurs, where he was a part of two NBA championships (2007, 2014).

Engelland began his NBA coaching career in 1999 as a shooting analyst for the Detroit Pistons before transitioning to work for the Nuggets in 2003 for two seasons as director of player of development.

A graduate of Duke University, Engelland played four seasons for the Blue Devils, becoming team captain in his senior year. He also enjoyed a nine-year professional playing career in the Philippines, Canada and the CBA.

He and his wife, Jessica, have two sons, Press and Path.

DANIEL DIXON ASSISTANT COACH FOR PLAYER DEVELOPMENT

Daniel Dixon enters his third season with the Thunder organization, first as an assistant coach for player development. He spent the last two seasons as an assistant coach with the Oklahoma City Blue, winning the 2024 NBA G League Championship. Previously Dixon worked as video coordinator for the Charlotte Hornets in the 2021-22 season. This summer, Dixon served as the head coach for the Thunder's Summer League team in Las Vegas.

The Great Falls, Va. product played in three G League seasons from 2017-2020,

which included stints with the Maine Red Claws, Northern Arizona Suns and Windy City Bulls. Dixon made 91 career appearances (35 starts) and averaged 10.6 points, 3.9 rebounds and 2.3 assists in 27.7 minutes per game.

Dixon played college basketball at William & Mary and graduated as part of the program's winningest class with 77 victories over his four seasons. He earned First Team All-CAA and NABC All-District honors as a senior (2016-17) and finished his career third in program history in three-pointers made (241) and 14th in scoring (1,355).

VICE PRESIDENT OF BASKETBALL OPERATIONS

Jesse Gould begins his first season as Vice President of Basketball Operations and his 16th season with the organization. He most recently served as Vice President of Strategy and Analysis for four seasons. Sullivan and his wife. Molly, have one son, Wilder.




AYANA LAWSON VICE PRESIDENT, LIFESTYLE SERVICES & SOCIAL IMPACT



he Oklahoma City Blue is set to begin its 17th season as the Thunder's NBA G League affiliate. Originally purchased in 2008 by the Professional Basketball Club, LLC, the Thunder's development team played its first six seasons as the Tulsa 66ers before being relocated to Oklahoma City in 2014.

The Blue returns to the court for the 2024-25 season after being crowned the 2024 G League Champions following a 2-1 series win over the Maine Celtics in the G League Finals.

The Thunder has displayed a strong history of utilizing its G League affiliate for developing talented players and staff. Entering his third season as the Blue Head Coach, Kam Woods previously served as an assistant coach with the Thunder in the 2021-22 season. The Butler product returned to the program after he played two seasons with the Blue (2015-2017) before starting his coaching career.

The past five coaches of this team have received "call-ups" to the NBA ranks. Mark Daigneault (2014-19) was named Head Coach of the Oklahoma City Thunder on Nov. 11, 2020 after spending the 2019-20 season as an assistant on the Thunder bench. Grant Gibbs was named a Thunder assistant coach on Sept. 23, 2022, after leading the Blue for three seasons from 2019-2022. Darko Rajaković (2012-14) is the head coach of the Toronto Raptors and began his career with the Thunder while Dale Osbourne (2011-12) and Nate Tibbets (2009-11) both serve as an assistant coach with the Orlando Magic.

Since becoming the Oklahoma City Blue in 2014, the Blue has posted a winning record in six seasons and made five playoff appearances during that span.



KAMERON WOODS

HEAD COACH

Kameron Woods was named the eighth head coach in Oklahoma City Blue history on Sept. 23, 2022. Woods just completed his second season as head coach for the Blue, helping lead the team to its first-ever G League Championship. He enters his sixth season with the organization overall

Woods spent the 2021-22 season as an assistant coach for the Oklahoma City Thunder and the 2020-21 season as a player development coach for the Thunder. Woods also worked for two seasons as an assistant coach for the Thunder's G League affiliate, the Oklahoma City Blue.

Woods served as Head Coach for Thunder's 2024 Summer League team in Salt Lake City where he led Oklahoma City to a 2-1 record. Prior to that he was the Head Coach for the Thunder at 2023 summer league team in Las Vegas where he led Oklahoma City to a 2-3 record. Woods also led the team to a 5-3 mark during 2022 summer league competition in Salt Lake City and Las Vegas.

He previously played as a forward for the Blue for two seasons and appeared in 99 games (43 starts) during his tenure. A Butler University product, Woods finished his four-year collegiate career as the second-leading rebounder in the school's history with 956 rebounds. He led the Bulldogs in blocked shots in all four seasons.

Woods and his wife, Shakira, reside in Oklahoma City with their three children.

The three division winners and the team with the next-best record from each conference will receive the top four seeds and will be ranked Nos. 1-4 according to their guidar-season records. The remaining four teams in each conference will be seeded 5-8 according to their won-lost records. The Play-In Tournament will determine the teams that will fill the seventh and eighth playoff sects in each conference.

The Play-In Tournament, which will take place after the regular season and before the first round of the playoffs, will include the teams with the seventh-highest through the tenth-highest winning percentages in each conference. In each round of the playoffs, the team with the better regular-season wor-lost record gets the home-court advantage. All rounds of the playoffs are a best-of-seven series. Each best-of-seven series will play 2-2-1-11 format.





Michael Cage joined the Thunder broadcasting team in 2014 as its television analyst for all local broadcasts. Cage played 15 seasons from 1984-200 as a power forward in the NBA with the Los Angeles Clippers, Seattle Supersonics, Cleveland Cavaliers, Philadelphia 76ers and New Jersey Nets. He led the NBA in rebounding in 1998, capturing the title by grabbing 30 rebounds in the final game of the regular season. Cage played in 1,140 total NBA games, 736

consecutively which is top 5 all-time in NBA history.

A native of West Memphis, Arkansas, Cage was a first-round draft pick of the Clippers in 1984 following a successful career at San Diego State University. At SDSU he was named a second-team All-American in 1984 and twice was selected as Western Athletic Conference Player of the Year. The Aztecs retired his jersey (No. 44) in 1984 and officially hung it in the rafters in 2023. He was also a member of the gold-medal winning 1983 United States team in the Pan American Games, and is a member of both the Arkansas Sports Hall of Fame and the San Diego State Hall of Fame.

Following his playing career, Cage has worked as both a broadcaster and a high school and AAU basketball coach. His broadcasting experience includes serving as TV analyst for the Memphis Grizzlies, FOX Sports West, ESPN, Prine Ticket and Westwood One radio. Cage coached Mater Dei High School in Los Angeles to back-to-back state titles in 2013-14 and a national championship in 2014. He also served as a guest coach for the Cleveland Cavaliers at the 2013 NBA Summer League in Las Vegas.

Cage has a long history of giving back to the community during and after his NBA playing career. The Michael Cage Foundation works with young athletes to mentor, teach and share life lessons. Cage is a devoted father of three to daughters Alexis and Sydney and son Michael Jr.

Nick Gallo joined the Thunder in 2012 as the team's digital reporter. Beginning in the 2014-15 season, he has provided in-game courtside reports and postgame player interviews for Bally Sports Oklahoma television broadcasts. 

The Oklahoma City Thunder began calling the Thunder ION home just prior to

the start of the 2011-12 season. The 53,000 square foot state-of-the-art practice facility features two full-sized basketball courts, a 27-seat team classroom and a hydrotherapy area which was designed to benefit the Thun-

der's medical and training staff in the prevention and rehabilitation of injuries.

Funding for the construction of the practice facility and renovations to Paycom Center comes from a one-cent sales tax approved by Oklahoma City voters on March 4, 2008. The 15-month tax took effect on January 1, 2009 and ran through March 31, 2010. As part of the lease agree-

ment, the Thunder will make an annual rent payment to the City of Oklahoma City.

During the groundbreaking ceremony in August of 2009, Oklahoma City Mayor Mick Cornett commented, "Having

the Thunder in Oklahoma City has been a tremendous sense of pride for our community. When the citizens of Oklahoma City passed the Big League City initiative to renovate the city's downtown arena and build an NBA-leading practice facility, we all looked forward to this day."
