ROAD TRIP CONTINUES IN FRESNO: The San Jose Giants continue their longest road trip of the season with a six-game series versus the Fresno Grizzlies (Rockies affiliate) this week at Chukchansi Park. The Giants won five of six games against visiting Fresno from April 22-27 in the previous meeting between the teams this season. San Jose scored 46 runs during that six-game set against the Grizzlies (7.7 runs per game).

SERIES SPLIT: The Giants had to settle for a split of their six-game series in Stockton last week to open the current road trip. San Jose won three of the first four games in the series, including a thrilling 11-10, 11-inning triumph last Friday that saw the Giants overcome a seven-run deficit for their largest comeback victory of the season. However, the Giants suffered back-to-back losses in the final two games, including a heartbreaking 7-6 setback on Sunday when the Ports rallied for three runs in the bottom of the ninth – all with two outs – to earn the split.

ROAD REPORT: The Giants are currently in the midst of a 12-game, 13-day road trip – their longest road trip of the season. San Jose enters the week with an 8-13 record away from home and are still looking for their first road series win of the season. Five of the 13 losses for the Giants have come in walk-off fashion, three of which were games in which San Jose led in the bottom of the ninth inning. Also of note, 15 of the 21 road games to date have come against teams currently in first place (Modesto and Rancho Cucamonga). The Giants are batting only .222 on the road this season while averaging 4.8 runs per game compared to a .284 mark and 7.6 runs per contest at home (13-5 record).

STARTING STRONG: Giants starting pitching has been excellent during the first half of the season. San Jose starters own a combined 2.92 ERA – second-best in the California League (Rancho Cucamonga 2.83). Two of the six hurlers in the Giants starting rotation boast sub-2 ERA's: **Hunter Dryden** (1.37) and **Niko Mazza** (1.54). Dryden has surrendered only four earned runs in 26 1/3 innings this season while Mazza has yielded four earned runs over 23 1/3 innings. **Greg Farone** will enter his start this week with a 2.08 ERA and has collected a team-leading 42 strikeouts in 30 1/3 innings. Farone had a streak of 21 consecutive scoreless innings earlier this season. Giants starting pitchers have allowed only four home runs in 148 innings pitched this year.

BULLPEN WOES: While the Giants starting rotation continues to excel, the bullpen has struggled of late. Over the last 14 games in which San Jose has posted just a 5-9 record, the Giants have held the lead in the seventh inning or later in six of those nine losses. Three of the setbacks were games in which San Jose led in the ninth inning. The Giants bullpen fashioned a sparkling 2.99 ERA in their first 25 games of the season, but have a 5.21 ERA over the last 14 contests. The Giants' nine blown saves this season lead the league.

MARTIN MASHES: Walker Martin has been one of the hottest hitters in the California League recently. Martin has connected for an impressive six home runs to go with 16 RBI's over his last nine games (.353 AVG). He's raised his season AVG from .176 to .235 during the stretch. Martin enters the week with seven home runs overall this season to rank tied for first in the league. He homered three times during last week's series in Stockton.

**CATCH US IF YOU CAN:** The Giants have been remarkably successful in stealing bases this season. Entering the week, San Jose is 71-for-78 in stolen base attempts through their first 39 games. The 91 percent success rate leads the league and the club's 71 overall steals rank tied for second. Individually, **Carlos Gutierrez** is tops on the club with 15 stolen bases (in 17 attempts) while **Dakota Jordan** is next with 13 steals (in 13 attempts).

HIT LEADERS: The Giants feature three of the top 10 players in the California League in hits this season. Carlos Gutierrez's 48 hits are second in the league while he also ranks third with a .333 batting average. Gutierrez is hitting .417 in May (12 games). Dakota Jordan enters the week seventh in the Cal League with 40 hits. He's also fifth in RBI's (28). Finally, Lisbel Diaz ranks 10th in the league in hits (39). As a team, the Giants have scored the third-most runs in the California League this season (6.1 runs per game) trailing only Rancho Cucamonga and Modesto.

**DREW'S BACK:** The Giants welcomed back catcher **Drew Cavanaugh** from Triple-A Sacramento last Sunday. Cavanaugh was batting .288 with three doubles, one triple, four home runs and 14 RBI's in 16 games for the Giants this season before he was transferred to Sacramento on April 29. He ranked among the top 5 in the league in home runs and OPS (.989) at the time of the initial roster move. With Sacramento, Cavanaugh was 6-for-31 (.194 AVG) with one double in nine games played.

ON DECK: Following the current series in Fresno, the Giants return to Excite Ballpark on the Memorial Day holiday (Monday, May 26) to begin a six-game series against the Inland Empire 66ers.

# **COACHING STAFF**

#### Ydwin Villegas - Manager

Is in his second season as manager of the San Jose Giants (2024-25). Led the Giants to a league-best 74-57 record last season earning a playoff berth after winning the second half North Division title. Was named 2024 California League Manager of the Year. Previously served as San Jose's fundamentals coach in 2023 after a three-year stint as fundamentals coach for the SF Giants' rookie-level Arizona Complex League affiliate from 2020-22. Was also San Jose's bullpen catcher during the 2019 season. Spent his entire seven-year minor league playing career with the Giants organization after signing as an international free agent out of Venezuela in 2008. The former infielder played for San Jose during parts of the 2012, 2013 and 2014 seasons (79 total games) and advanced as high as Triple-A during his playing career.

#### Dan Runzler - Pitching Coach

Is in his fourth season as San Jose's pitching coach (2022-25) and fourth year overall as a coach in the San Francisco Giants organization. Under his direction, the San Jose Giants pitching staff has led the California League in ERA in all three of his seasons. The '22 staff also achieved a new team single-season strikeouts record (1,443). Prior to joining the Giants organization, was a pitching coach for the Milwaukee Milkmen of the American Association of Independent Professional Baseball in 2021, the Sugar Land Skeeters of the independent Atlantic League in 2019 and Cabrillo College in 2018. A ninth round pick of the San Francisco Giants in 2007, he made his major league debut with San Francisco in 2009 and spent four seasons with the Giants, earning World Series rings in 2010 and 2012. Owned a career 3.89 ERA over 97 appearances (one start) with San Francisco (2009-12) and Pittsburgh (2017). Was a member of San Jose's 2009 California League championship team.

#### Travis Ishikawa - Hitting Coach

Is in his fourth season as San Jose's hitting coach (2022-25) and eighth year overall as a coach in the San Francisco Giants organization. Has overseen impressive hitting groups in San Jose as the 2023 team led the California League in batting average while the 2022 club smacked 149 home runs - just one HR shy of matching the team's single-season record. Prior to joining the San Jose staff, was a hitting coach for the Arizona Rookie League Giants for four seasons. A 21st round pick of the San Francisco Giants in 2002, he spent parts of eight seasons in the major leagues with the Giants (2006, 2008-10, 2014-15), Milwaukee Brewers (2012), Baltimore Orioles (2013), New York Yankees (2013) and Pittsburgh Pirates (2014-15). Finished his big league career with a .255 batting average, 23 home runs and 137 RBI's in 488 games. Hit a memorable walk-off, three-run home run for the Giants to defeat the St. Louis Cardinals in the clinching Game 5 of the 2014 NLCS. Spent parts of three seasons in San Jose (2004, 2005, 2007) with his 36 career home runs ranking tied for fifth all-time in SJG history. Won Cal League championships in 2005 and 2007.

# Nate Keavy - Fundamentals Coach

Is in his second season as fundamentals coach for the San Jose Giants (2024-25) and third year overall as a coach in the San Francisco Giants organization. Previously served as a fundamentals coach for the Giants in the rookie-level Arizona Complex League in 2023 after a five-year stint as a bullpen catcher in the organization. Former catcher played three seasons collegiately at Loyola Marymount University from 2015-17.

# SAN JOSE GIANTS QUICK HITS

- This year marks San Jose's 37th season as an affiliate of the San Francisco Giants the longest current partnership in the California League. Since their inception in 1988, the San Jose Giants have won seven league championships (1998, 2001, 2005, 2007, 2009, 2010, 2021) and graduated 247 players to the major leagues.
- The Giants have posted a winning record in 28 out of their 36 seasons, including each of the last four years (2021-24).
- Last season, the Giants finished with a league-best 74-57 overall record and qualified for the playoffs after winning the second half North Division title. It marked the first time since 2013 that San Jose posted the top overall record in the California League. The Giants were then swept two-games-to-none by eventual league champion Modesto in the North Division Series. It was the third consecutive year (2022-24) that San Jose was swept in the Division Series.
- The Giants have reached the playoffs in five straight seasons (2019, 2021-24) and in 17 out of the last 20 seasons overall dating back to 2004. San Jose set a league-record with seven consecutive first half division titles from 2005-11 and reached the playoffs in 10 straight years from 2004-13.
- The Giants have led the California League in ERA the last four seasons (2021-24). The San Jose pitching staff set a team single-season record for strikeouts in 2021 and then broke the record again in 2022.

- In 2021, the San Jose Giants won a league championship for the first time since the franchise claimed back-to-back titles in 2009-10. The Giants went 76-44 - their best regular season winning percentage since 2011. San Jose established a new team record with 150 home runs during the 2021 championship season.
- The San Jose Giants organization made several significant ballpark announcements last offseason including a 25-year lease extension that keeps the team in San Jose through 2050 and construction plans for a new athletic building and clubhouses beyond the left wall to debut on Opening Day 2026. Additional upgrades to Excite Ballpark for this season include a newly installed backstop net extending to both foul poles, an outfield batter's eye extension and overhead shade to the third base VIP Deck.
