NEWS AND NOTES

LAS VEGAS' DIAZ AN ACE ON THE SPOT

Las Vegas Lights FC goalkeeper Leo Diaz recorded his third penalty kick save of the 2023 USL Championship season last Wednesday night against El Paso Locomotive FC, a stop that put the Argentine within sight of surpassing the league's record for most penalties saved in a regular season with more than half the season remaining.

The current mark is held by Jeff Caldwell, who recorded five penalty saves for Hartford Athletic in the 2021 season. Three other players have recorded four penalty kick saves in a regular season campaign since the start of the 2017 season, with Diaz currently in a group of five players to have recorded three penalty saves.

NEW MEXICO UNITED'S TAMBAKIS APPROACHING 500 SAVES

New Mexico United goalkeeper Alex Tambakis could become just the second goalkeeper in the USL Championship's history to reach 500 regular season saves this week, with the Greek shot-stopper five stops away from the landmark as United hosts both Phoenix Rising FC (Wednesday) and Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC (Saturday) in Week 16. Evan Newton is the lone prior goalkeeper to have reached the mark, doing so last season while playing for El Paso Locomotive FC on his way to a mark of 573 career regular season saves.

Officially the first player to be signed in Atlanta United FC's history in 2016, Tambakis has played in the USL Championship for the Charleston Battery, North Carolina FC and New Mexico United in his career. His current single-season high for saves was set in the 2018 season for North Carolina, where he notched 95 stops to rank third in the league that season. Already sitting in second place in both regular season saves and shutouts, the 30-year-old has averaged 2.81 saves per regular season game in his career.

USL CHAMPIONSHIP, LEAGUE ONE PLAYERS TO FEATURE AT 2023 GOLD CUP

Fourteen players from the USL Championship and League One are set to feature as the 2023 Concacaf Gold Cup kicks off on Saturday night, with six nations represented after the conclusion of the final stage of qualifying on Tuesday night.

Oakland Roots SC and North Carolina FC will each send two players, with Roots SC represented by **Neveal Hackshaw** (Trinidad and Tobago) and **Bryan Tamacas** (El Salvador). NCFC will be represented by **Nelson Flores** (El Salvador) and **Raheem Somersall**, who will be part of the first St. Kitts and Nevis squad to reach the group stage in the tournament's history.

Quick Hits

- **Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC** has recorded four consecutive shutouts following its scoreless draw with Oakland Roots SC on Saturday night. The club's current active shutout streak sits at 364 minutes, making it the second-longest in the Championship so far this season behind **Sacramento Republic FC**'s run of five consecutive shutouts and 594 consecutive minutes without conceding between March 18 and April 28.
- New Mexico United's **Josh Suggs** could become only the second player to record 20,000 minutes in the Championship's regular season and the third player to reach 250 regular season appearances this week, with the veteran defender requiring 54 minutes across two appearances in United's two-game week to reach both landmarks.
- Following Sacramento Republic FC's loss on Saturday night at home to Monterey Bay F.C., only **San Antonio FC** and **Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC** have yet to suffer a defeat in the league on their home turf this season. Pittsburgh hosts San Diego Loyal SC at Highmark Stadium on Saturday, while San Antonio's next home game comes on July 1 against Birmingham Legion FC.
- Las Vegas Lights FC's loss to El Paso Locomotive FC on June 14 marked the first time Lights FC had suffered defeat after scoring first in a game since September 26, 2021 against San Diego Loyal SC, ending a run of 18 consecutive games.
- **Orange County SC**'s victory against FC Tulsa on Saturday night marked the club's first road victory since July 23, 2022, ending a run of 12 consecutive road games without a win.
