LOUCITY MAKES HIGHMARK HOME AWAY FROM HOME

Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC has made Highmark Stadium one of the most difficult places to visit since Head Coach Bob Lilley took the helm prior to the 2018 season with an 87-34-51 record on home turf across the regular season and playoffs. There is one team the Hounds have regularly faced, however, that they have failed to find success against so far in Louisville City FC, which is undefeated in its nine prior visits to Highmark.

LouCity's 5-0-4 all-time record against Pittsburgh is currently the most away games played in a series across the regular season and playoffs without having suffered defeat. Head Coach Danny Cruz's side will try to stretch that streak into double digits when the sides meet this Saturday night.

LEGION FC'S VANOEKEL GETS FIRST CHANCE AT 40TH SHUTOUT

Birmingham Legion FC goalkeeper Matt VanOekel will get his first chance at another landmark in his outstanding career on Saturday night as he enters the side's contest with San Antonio FC having recorded his 39th regular season shutout in the USL Championship last Wednesday night. Four other players have previously recorded 40 regular season shutouts in the Championship's history.

In his three-save performance against Loudoun, the veteran became the fifth-oldest goalkeeper to record a shutout in the Championship's regular season aged 36 years, 9 months and 1 day old. That mark ranks as only six days younger than No. 4 on the list, former Sacramento Republic FC goalkeeper Dominik Jakubek.

VanOekel's shutout was his first in the Championship's regular season since August 13, 2022 against San Diego Loyal SC. This season, Legion FC's goalkeeping duties have been split between VanOekel and Trevor Spangenberg as the side sits with three shutouts in the regular season.

TAMPA BAY'S JENNINGS NOTCHES SUBSTITUTE BRACE

The Tampa Bay Rowdies' Cal Jennings recorded the fifth two-goal performance of his career in the USL Championship on Saturday night, and his first as a substitute to lead the Rowdies to a 4-2 comeback victory against Loudoun United FC at Segra Field.

Jennings's two-goal game was the third by a player introduced as a substitute this season following those by San Antonio FC's Ignacio Bailone against the Charleston Battery on May 13 and San Diego Loyal SC's Ronaldo Damus against San Antonio FC on June 3. Since the start of the 2019 USL Championship season, 42 braces have been scored in the Championship's regular season by substitutes, with former Loudoun United FC forward Tyler Freeman leading the way with three individually and both San Diego Loyal SC's Tumi Moshobane and former Tampa Bay Rowdies forward Steevan Dos Santos having done so twice.



MEMPHIS' CALVIN HARRISON MAKES HISTORIC DEBUT

Memphis 901 FC's Calvin Harrison made club history last Wednesday night as he made his debut for the club aged 15 years, 149 days old, becoming the youngest player to appear for 901 FC in its history. Harrison came on as a second-half substitute, and is 15th all-time among the youngest players to appear in the USL Championship's regular season.

Harrison is the second-youngest player to appear in the USL Championship this season, with only San Antonio FC's Dalziel Ozuna having been younger in his league debut. Ozuna was 15 years, 27 days old when he played for SAFC against Monterey Bay F.C. on April 1 this season.
