SAN ANTONIO'S TANI OLUWASEYI BAGS SECOND HAT TRICK

San Antonio FC's Tani Oluwaseyi joined a short list of players who have recorded multiple hat tricks in the same USL Championship regular season on Friday night as he scored the first three goals in his side's 4-0 victory against Memphis 901 FC at AutoZone Park. Oluwaseyi is the first player to notch two hat tricks in a single Championship season since the 2019 campaign, when both New Mexico United's Kevauhn Frater and Real Monarchs SLC's Douglas Martinez Jr. accomplished the feat.

Only former Louisville City FC player Matt Fondy has previously recorded three hat tricks in a single USL Championship regular season, with his campaign part of a 2015 season in which he set a single-season goalscoring record with 22 goals and claimed the league's Most Valuable Player award.

LEGION FC'S ENZO MARTINEZ MOVES SECOND IN COMBINED GOALS+ASSISTS

Birmingham Legion FC's Enzo Martinez moved into second place all-time in combined goals and assists in the USL Championship's regular season history on Saturday night with his one goal, two assist performance against Las Vegas Lights FC moving him to 109 Goal Contributions in his career.

Martinez surpassed Jorge Herrera for second place in the list and has now recorded 66 goals and 43 assists in his career in the USL Championship. The 32-year-old has recorded a combined 35 goals and assists (22G+13A) since joining Legion FC prior to the start of the 2022 USL Championship season, already placing him third in club history behind **Neco Brett** (38) and **Prosper Kasim** (37).

INDY'S AODHAN QUINN ENTERS WEEK WITHIN REACH OF 20,000 MINUTE LANDMARK

Indy Eleven's **Aodhan Quinn** will enter Wednesday night's contest within reach of recording 20,000 regular season minutes in the USL Championship's regular season. The 31-year-old sits at 19,916 minutes going into Indy's contest with the Charleston Battery, 84 minutes shy of joining Taylor Mueller, currently the lone player to have reached 20,000 minutes of regular season play in league history.

Quinn has played all but 30 minutes of the 2023 regular season for Indy, logging 1,500 minutes in 17 appearances for the side. At his current pace, he could become the all-time leader in regular season minutes played by the end of July, but competition for the record mark will continue with Mueller the lone retired player among the current Top 10 in regular season minutes among players.

NEW MEXICO UNITED'S JOSH SUGGS REACHES 250-GAME LANDMARK

New Mexico United's **Josh Suggs** became only the third player to reach 250 regular season appearances in the USL Championship's history on Saturday night when he came on as a second-half substitute in the side's 1-0 victory against Detroit City FC. Suggs joins current Tampa Bay Rowdies midfielder **Yann Ekra** (262) and USL Championship all-time leading goalscorer **Dane Kelly** (251) in reaching the landmark.

With the appearance, Suggs is now eight minutes shy of reaching 20,000 regular season minutes in the league, a mark only previously achieved by former Championship All-League selection **Taylor Mueller** during his career with the Charleston Battery and Tacoma Defiance (20,077 minutes).

Quick Hits

- The Tampa Bay Rowdies' **Cal Jennings** scored the third hat trick of his career in the USL Championship on Saturday night in his side's 3-0 win against Oakland Roots SC. Jennings is the second player to record hat tricks for three different clubs in the league's history (Memphis 901 FC, Las Vegas Lights FC, Tampa Bay Rowdies). Only **Dane Kelly** has previously recorded four hat tricks in the Championship's history, doing so for the Charleston Battery, Reno 1868 FC, and Charlotte Independence.
- New Mexico United's **Alex Tambakis** recorded his 43rd regular season shutout in the USL Championship on Saturday night in the side's 1-0 win against Detroit City FC. Tambakis is now tied for second place all-time in the league's regular season history alongside former Goalkeeper of the Year winner **Brandon Miller**.
- San Antonio FC's **Tani Oluwaseyi**'s six shots on target against Memphis 901 FC on July 7 were the most by a single player in a USL Championship game this season.
- The 36 combined shots recorded by **Las Vegas Lights FC** and **Birmingham Legion FC** in the 3-3 draw between the sides on July 8 was the second-most in a game so far this season, trailing only the 39 combined shots recorded by El Paso Locomotive FC and Detroit City FC on March 18.
