LEGION FC'S NECO BRETT SCORES 75TH REGULAR SEASON GOAL

Birmingham Legion FC's Neco Brett became just the fourth player in the USL Championship's history to record 75 regular season goals, reaching the landmark in his 189th regular season game on Saturday in his side's 2-0 victory against Louisville City FC.

Brett broke a tie with former Championship standout Corey Hertzog, who now sits alone in fifth place in the league's all-time list. The Jamaican has averaged a goal every 176.7 minutes since making his debut for the Portland Timbers 2 in 2017, a mark that puts him seventh in strike rate among players with at least 50 goals in the Championship's regular season.

ORANGE COUNTY SC'S WINNING STREAK REACHES SIX GAMES

Orange County SC recorded its sixth consecutive victory on Saturday night in a 2-0 win against the Charleston Battery. In doing so, it equaled a club record for the Championship's regular season and moved within one of matching the longest winning streak in the league this year.

OCSC previously recorded a six-game winning streak between August 17 and September 21 during the 2019 season, during which it scored 13 goals and conceded only twice, posting four shutouts. In the club's current streak, it has recorded 14 goals and conceded five, posting three shutouts.

LOCOMOTIVE FC WINLESS RUN REACHES DOUBLE-DIGITS

El Paso Locomotive FC's winless streak reached 10 games on Saturday night after a 3-2 defeat to Indy Eleven at Southwest University Park. The mark leaves Locomotive FC with the dubious distinction of becoming the first team in the USL Championship's history that has recorded both a double-digit undefeated streak and winless streak in the same season.

El Paso went 12 games undefeated between a 3-0 victory against Louisville City FC on March 25 and a 1-1 draw against the Tampa Bay Rowdies on June 17. That draw served as the inflection point for its current winless run, which stands as the longest in the club's history.

Quick Hits

- Birmingham Legion FC goalkeeper **Matt VanOekel** became the fourth-eldest player to record a regular season shutout in his side's 2-0 victory against Louisville City FC on Saturday, aged 36 years, 10 months, 30 days old. He had previously held the No. 5 position in the all-time list, and surpassed former Sacramento Republic FC goalkeeper **Dominik Jakubek**, whose last shutout in the league came aged 36 years, 9 months, 7 days old.

- **Joaquin Rivas'** hat trick for Miami FC against Hartford Athletic was the first of the El Salvador international's career. It also marked the first hat trick recorded by a Miami FC player since the club joined the USL Championship for the 2020 season.

- **San Diego Loyal SC and New Mexico United** played to a fifth consecutive draw in their regular season series on Saturday night, with neither side yet to claim the upper hand on the other in their respective histories. This marked the second time this season a streak of that kind has occurred, with **FC Tulsa** and **Las Vegas Lights FC** having played five drawn contests in their series since its inception in 2018.

- **Sacramento Republic FC** and **Orange County SC** will meet for the 25th time in the USL Championship's regular season on Saturday night. It will be the sixth series in league history to have played 25 editions, with Sacramento holding a narrow 10-9-5 lead in victories.
