USL CHAMPIONSHIP TRIO SET FOR OPEN CUP QUARTERFINALS

Indy Eleven, **New Mexico United** and **Sacramento Republic FC** each advanced to the Quarterfinals of the 2024 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup last week, marking the first time in more than a decade that three USL clubs were in the last eight of the competition.

The last time such an instance occurred was in 2012, the first edition of the Open Cup in which every team in the men's professional landscape participated in the tournament. That season, then USL Championship-clubs the **Charlotte Eagles** and **Dayton Dutch Lions** – both now members of USL League Two – and the **Harrisburg City Islanders** each advanced to the final eight, defeating MLS opposition along the way.

REPUBLIC FC EXTENDS UNDEFEATED START TO 11 GAMES

Sacramento Republic FC became the eighth club to start a USL Championship regular season with at least an 11-game undefeated streak on Saturday night following the club's 0-0 draw against Birmingham Legion FC at Heart Health Park. Sacramento is now the last undefeated team in men's professional soccer in the United States across all competitions this season, having also won twice in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, after the Charleston Battery's defeat by El Paso Locomotive FC last Friday night.

Sacramento's undefeated start is an anomaly in USL Championship history, however, with the side having earned five wins and six draws to start the regular season. Each of the prior seven clubs to reach this mark did so while posting more wins than draws, with San Antonio FC's 9-0-2 start to the 2017 season marking the most victories in an undefeated 11-game start in league history.

INDY, NEW MEXICO COMPLETE PERFECT MONTHS

Indy Eleven and New Mexico United each completed perfect months in the USL Championship this past Saturday with Indy's 2-1 victory against Phoenix Rising FC moving the side to 4-0-0 in May and New Mexico's 2-1 victory against San Antonio FC moving it to 3-0-0 in the month. The two sides joined Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC (3-0-0) in taking maximum points from their games over the month.

Indy's four-win month is the most so far this season for a side to take maximum points in a month. Both Detroit City FC and Louisville City FC went 3-0-0 in March to start the season, while no side went through the month of April without dropping points.

Indy's current five-game winning streak is its longest regular season run since the 2019 season, when it took five consecutive victories in June as part of a 10-game undefeated run (6-0-4). The Boys in Blue are currently undefeated in nine games overall across all competitions after joining New Mexico in the Quarterfinals of the 2024 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup last week.

RHODE ISLAND FC'S HOME WINLESS STREAK CONTINUES

Rhode Island FC's home winless streak stretched to six games on Saturday afternoon following a 0-0 draw against Louisville City FC. It's now the longest a side has gone without a win at home in its inaugural season in USL Championship history since **Memphis 901 FC** also went six games without a home win to start the 2019 season. 901 FC went on to win its seventh home game, a 4-1 win against Hartford Athletic.

While RIFC is currently winless at home, it has drawn five of its six contests at Beirne Stadium, notably earning points at home against not only LouCity but also Sacramento Republic FC and the Charleston Battery during its current run. It's next chance to claim a first home win will come on June 8 at home to Detroit City FC.

- Hartford Athletic's **Thomas Vancaeyezeele** recorded the first two-assist game of his career in the USL Championship in his side's 2-1 victory against Monterey Bay F.C. last Friday night.

- Birmingham Legion FC's **Enzo Martinez** has entered the top 15 in the USL Championship's all-time regular season appearances list with 231 appearances. He currently sits alongside former Charlotte Independence teammate **Jorge Herrera** in a tie for 15th.

- Birmingham Legion FC's **Matt VanOekel** extended his mark as the third-oldest goalkeeper to record a shutout in the USL Championship in his side's 0-0 draw with Sacramento Republic FC, aged 37 years, 8 months, 5 days old.

- Memphis 901 FC forward **Marlon Santos**' assists streak came to an end at four games against Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC, but the Brazilian has now scored in four consecutive games with five goals in that span.

- El Paso Locomotive FC Head Coach **Wilmer Cabrera** became the first Head Coach in Locomotive history to win his opening game at the helm in the side's 2-1 victory against the Charleston Battery on Friday night.
