LOUCITY ON PACE FOR SINGLE-SEASON HOME SCORING RECORD

Louisville City FC continued its dominance at Lynn Family Stadium this season last Wednesday night with a 5-1 victory against Detroit City FC. The result marked the fourth time this season LouCity has recorded at least five goals in a home USL Championship game this season, equaling the single-season record previously recorded by the New York Red Bulls II and the LA Galaxy II in the 2018 season and matched by Real Monarchs SLC in 2019.

INDY ELEVEN'S WINNING STREAK REACHES SIX GAMES

Indy Eleven became the 26th team in the USL Championship's history to record a six-game regular season winning streak with its 2-1 victory against Pittsburgh Riverhounds SC on Saturday night. The streak is the longest for the Boys in Blue since it joined the USL Championship in the 2018 season.

Only 11 of those 26 teams have seen their streaks reach seven games, with Phoenix Rising FC's north star of 20 consecutive victories in the 2019 season a mark we're unlikely to ever see again. Indy will pursue its seventh consecutive win on Sunday evening when it visits Birmingham Legion FC at Protective Stadium.

LOUCITY'S SEAN TOTSCH HITS 250 APPEARANCES, 20,000 MINUTES

Louisville City FC's Sean Totsch hit a significant double on Saturday night against Miami FC as he recorded both his 250th regular season appearance in the USL Championship and passed 20,000 regular season minutes in the league for his career.

Totsch is currently only the fifth player to have reached both landmarks in the USL Championship's regular season history, and now sits ninth in appearances and sixth in minutes played overall. For his career, Totsch has averaged 80.1 minutes per appearance, and has played 89 percent of available minutes in his regular season.

RISING'S ROCCO RÍOS NOVO JOINS EXCLUSIVE SHUTOUT CLUB

Phoenix Rising FC's Rocco Ríos Novo became the first goalkeeper to post a shutout with at least 10 saves this season in the USL Championship in his side's 0-0 draw against Las Vegas Lights FC. He also joined a select group of goalkeepers as only the 13th goalkeeper since the start of the 2015 USL Championship season to record double-digit saves in a shutout in the league's regular season.

Ríos Novo is the third-youngest to accomplish the feat, with current New York City FC and El Salvador goalkeeper Tomas Romero having posted an 11-save shutout for the Philadelphia Union II aged 18 years, 213 days old on July 20, 2019 in a 1-0 win against Louisville City FC to stand as the youngest. Ríos Novo's shutout is the second-most in a shutout in Rising history, meanwhile, with Carl Woszczynski having posted a 13-save shutout to set the high mark in the category against Orange County SC on July 5, 2015.
