### PRFC Match Preview Presented by Mayo Clinic

Phoenix Rising (1-2-0) hosts New Mexico United (1-1-1) this Saturday, March 30 at 7:30 p.m. The match will also be broadcast live on Arizona's Family Sports and streamed on ESPN+.

New Mexico enters the match having lost 4-0 in Charleston on March 23. Facing the defending Eastern and Western Conference Champions in consecutive weekends would be a daunting task for any club, but head coach Danny Stone believes United remains a difficult opponent.

"I've seen some good things from New Mexico this season," said Rising Head Coach Danny Stone. "They have a clear philosophy of how they want to play. We can look at the result last weekend and they'll be disappointed with the result but that doesn't mean they're not a good team. No one moment in a season discounts the fact they have quality players. We'll see a good team this weekend and we'll be preparing as such."

Rising enters the fray ahead of schedule defensively, having allowed just 0.66 goals per game this season. Despite winning it all in 2023, Phoenix began the year allowing two goals per game in its opening three matches and did not get a clean sheet until May 20. Rising picked up a shutout last time out, vs. Oakland on March 23. A big reason for that is the play of Senegalese defenders Mohamad Traore and Pape Mar Boye.

"We have quality players in every position," said Traore. "Even if someone else gets injured, we have a good player ready to step up. It showed last game, we had players out and we didn't allow a shot on goal. I'm really happy for [Boye]. It's an honor to play with him. We've known each other since we were young, playing back in Senegal. We already have a lot of chemistry. It's a pleasure."

Despite beating Rising at 38th/Washington in October, roughly a month before Rising lifted the USL Championship trophy, New Mexico hasn't had the same luck on the road in 2024. United was outshot 39-16 in its two losses outside of New Mexico this season. Within state lines, United won its only match, 1-0 vs. Pittsburgh on March 9. In that game, New Mexico completed 639 passes, held a 67-33 edge in possession and got a 44th minute goal from former Rising forward Greg Hurst to pick up the win vs. the defending regular season champs.

"Greg is a good player," said Stone. "I look forward to seeing him this weekend. He has shown again the quality he has... beginning the season as the nine for a very good team. That speaks to his quality and we know that. I only have good things to say about Greg. This weekend, I look forward to saying hello to him, giving him a pat on the back and then competing against him."

### TRIPLE

FC Tulsa has three goalscorers this season - Stefan Stojanovic who scored a header from close range, Phillip Goodrum, who scored a lazer from the top of the box and Milo Yosef, who beat a defender on the left side of the box and slotted a shot low into the corner of the goal. All three goals were scored against Las Vegas on March 16. Two of the three were set up via quick transitions from Blaine Ferri.

### STREAKY

Since Phoenix and Tulsa first met on May 9, 2015, a 1-1 draw, both teams have rebranded and both teams have enjoyed multiple game winning streaks. Tulsa won four in a row, outscoring Phoenix 14-6, then Phoenix won the next five, outscoring Tulsa 18-4. Rising has shut out Tulsa in four consecutive matches.

# Phoenix Rising at 38th St/Washington



## About Phoenix Rising Soccer Complex

The Phoenix City Council voted unanimously on November 16, 2022 to approve a multi-year lease of land for Phoenix Rising FC Stadium and professional soccer training facility at 3801 East Washington Street, adjacent to the popular Phoenix Park 'n Swap.

"Phoenix Rising is the ultimate fan experience attracting residents from all over the valley," said Phoenix Councilmember Carlos Garcia. "Their move to Phoenix will not only centrally locate the stadium but also bring economic value to the city. I am thrilled to welcome them to District 8. I can't wait to cheer them on alongside my family and District 8 residents."

The capacity, look and feel of the club's current stadium at Wild Horse Pass was transferred to the new, more centrally located site in Phoenix during the 2022-23 offseason. In addition to being centrally located and adjacent to Phoenix Park 'n Swap, the new stadium site in Phoenix provides Rising fans with abundant paved parking and light rail access directly to the stadium via the nearby Valley Metro Station light rail stop at 38th St/Washington.

"This move will allow us to immediately upgrade our gameday fan experience, which has always been our top priority," said Phoenix Rising FC Governor Bill Kraus. "Accessibility to the site is excellent and there will be opportunities to create partnerships with the small businesses at Phoenix Park 'n Swap. We have so much respect for the hundreds of business owners who operate there and the thousands of customers they serve every week."

## GOALS ALLOWED

From March 11 to August 12, 2023, Phoenix allowed 45 goals in 22 games - 2.04 per match. This season, Rising's defense has allowed just 0.75 goals per game.

## MARCH

Rising won the USL Championship in 2023 and the 2019 Regular Season Title. The club's record in March those seasons is a combined 0-1-4.

The most points Rising has accumulated in March is four, which occurred during the 2018 season (1-0-1). The team was 0-1-0 in 2017, secured three points in 2019, 2020, 2022 and 2024. Rising did not play a game in March 2021. Last season Phoenix went 0-1-1 in March.

## IT'S HOW YOU FINISH

Rising finished the 2023 season with a record of 15-10-13, but was just 8-8-8 and down 2-1 in the 81st minute at Vegas on August 26 before coming from behind in the final nine minutes to win 3-2.

The win was the first of three consecutive wins and the first time the team won three straight games last season. Rising rolled that momentum into an eight-game unbeaten run that ended on October 7.

Rising finished 7-2-5 to win its first USL Championship in Charleston on November 12.

## BREAK ON THROUGH

Despite losing to Birmingham in the opening match of the 2024 season, Phoenix managed to outshoot Legion, 18-11, putting eight shots on target to the visitors' three. Rising held possession 54-46 and completed 523 passes to Birmingham's 447. Phoenix had a six-to-one edge in corner kicks.

"We were very threatening tonight," said Rising Head Coach Danny Stone following the game. "We produced chances but that will come. I believe once that first moment comes, we'll see more following quite quickly."

## MISSING PIECE

Rising recalled Swedish defender John Stenberg from Östers IF on August 2, 2023. The defender made his first appearance on August 12. Prior to that match, Phoenix had allowed 45 goals in 22 games - 2.04 per match. After his arrival, Rising allowed just 1.06 goals per game (17GA

in 16 games). Stenberg scored the game-tying goal in the 90th minute of the final, then subbed off due to an illness that was later revealed to be Valley Fever. Stenberg was named team captain by head coach Danny Stone on February 29.

Despite the absence of Stenberg and fellow defender Alejandro Fuenmayor at the start of this season, Phoenix has allowed just 0.66 goals per game to start this season, due in large part to the play of two young Senegalese defenders Mo Traore and Pape Mar Boye. Laurence Wyke, a veteran USL defender with MLS experience has anchored the right side of the defense. He and Boye have started all three matches for Rising this season.

## KINGS OF THE WEST

Rising is 2-0-1 in Western Conference Finals, having defeated OC, 2-1, in 2018 and edging out El Paso, 5-4, in PKs following a 1-1 draw in 2020. Phoenix downed Sacramento, 2-1, on Nov. 4, thanks to a thunderbolt of a goal by Cuello in the second minute of stoppage time.

## FIREMAN

Cuello came off the bench to extinguish Rising's opponents during the 2023 postseason. The Argentine played 16 minutes and scored a game-winner vs. Sacramento on Nov. 4. He played 24 minutes of the 30-minute extra time period against Orange County, scoring the game-winner in the 116th.

## IRONMAN

Alejandro Fuenmayor was the only player to play all 450 minutes for Phoenix Rising in its run to claim the 2023 USL Championship Title. Fuenmayor is recovering from an injury he picked up during preseason. He is expected to be available for selection by the end of the month.

## SCORE FIRST & DOUBLE UP

Phoenix was 14-0-3 last season when scoring two or more goals. Rising was also 12-1-4 when scoring first. The lone loss came when Rising played all but 12 minutes of a match a man down to San Antonio, losing 2-1 on Aug. 5.

## CLOSER

Dariusz Formella scored two stoppage-time goals in just 77 minutes between Sept. 16 and Sept. 23. He finished the season with six goals for Rising since coming over via trade on July

25, 2023. Five of the six goals came after the 85th minute. Formella is poised to take on a large role in the offense with the departure of forwards Danny Trejo and Manual Arteaga.

## COMEBACK CREW

Phoenix achieved what had eluded it the entire season on August 26, 2023 – coming from behind to win. Prior to August 26, Phoenix had been 0-7-2 when allowing the first goal. Rising crawled out of both a 0-1 and 1-2 hole, to win its fifth away match of the season, 3-2, vs. Vegas.

Rising did it again vs. San Diego on Oct. 22, coming back from 1-0 down and 2-1 down before taking a 3-2 lead in the second half of its playoff win. Sacramento was another come-from-behind rebirth on Nov. 4. The Republic scored in the 31st minute, but Rising answered back in the 80th and took the lead in the second minute of stoppage time.

## NARROW

Rising won back-to-back matches by a single goal (3-2 vs. Vegas on 8/26/23 & 2-1 vs. Sacramento on 8/30/23) to bring its record in one-goal games to 5-5-0 on the year. Phoenix fell by one goal to New Mexico on Oct. 7 to make it 5-6-0, but won three consecutive one-goal games in playoffs to flip the script and finish 8-6-0.

## INTERNATIONAL SQUAD

Rising has 13 different nations represented on its roster: Giulio Doratiotto (Italy), Remi Cabral (France), Laurence Wyke (England), John Stenberg (Sweden), Gabi Torres (Brazil), Patrick Rakovsky (Germany), Dariusz Formella (Poland), Panos Armenakas (Australia), Mo Traore & Pape Mar Boye (Senegal), Argentina (x2), Venezuela (x5) and the US.

## ROAD TEAMS

Rising (3-11-3) finished the 2022 season with just three wins away. In 2023 (5-7-5) the team earned eight more points outside of Arizona and then did the unthinkable, going 3-0-1 on the road in the postseason to claim its first USL Championship Title on Nov. 12.
