### **2024 CHARLESTON BATTERY MATCH NOTES**

#### **PREVIEW**

The Charleston Battery hit the road in Week 4 to face Miami FC on March 30 for the final match of the month. Kickoff at FIU Football Stadium is set for 7 p.m. ET and the game will air on ESPN+.

Charleston and Miami square off for the first time this season. The South Florida side won the previous meeting, 1-2, in the penultimate match of the 2023 regular season. Charleston will aim to avenge that result this weekend.

The Battery (1W-0L-2D, 5 pts) enter Saturday following their first win of the season, an imposing 4-0 victory over New Mexico United. Six different players recorded goal contributions and the goals were scored by Nick Markanich, Arturo Rodriguez, Aaron Molloy and Jackson Conway. Goalkeeper Adam Grinwis tallied his second clean sheet of the season, placing him tied for the league lead.

Miami (1W-1L-1D, 4 pts) return to Florida following a 2-2 road draw against Orange County SC. Miami let a halftime lead slip but the side put in an all-around strong performance away from home, with Allen Gavilanes' brace earning his side a point.

In the all-time series, Miami hold an edge with a 6W-3L-3D record against Charleston and are undefeated in the last seven meetings.

### **TONIGHT'S STORYLINES**

**CARRY THE MOMENTUM**: The Week 3 victory over New Mexico saw Charleston's offense produce its best game to date, with four goals on 10 of 18 shots being on target. The Battery, who lead the league with 47 shots taken, will hope the upward trend continues on the road.

#### SEARCHING FOR SOUTH FLORIDA

**SUCCESS**: The Battery have played six matches at Miami's FIU Stadium but have a 0W-3L-3D record at the venue since the first match in 2020. Charleston will be searching for their first win in trip No. 7 to the grounds this weekend. Conference Title ahead of kickoff.

**NEW LOOK MIAMI**: The Miami team Charleston will face on Saturday will be unlike what they saw in 2023. Only three Miami players from last year's team remain with the 2024 squad under first-year head coach Antonio Nocerino.

**ALL CLEAR**: This weekend's match will feature two of the early leaders in clearances this season in center-backs Nicolás Cardona of Miami (18, tied for third-most) and Graham Smith of Charleston (16, tied for seventh-most).

BATTLES OF BESTS FROM WEEK 3: The league's Week 3 Team of the Week featured three Battery players, Nathan Dossantos, Aaron Molloy and Nick Markanich, but Miami's Allen Gavilanes took home Player of the Week honors. The in-form sides are now set to clash in the next round of fixtures.

**FAMILIAR FACES:** Saturday will mark two firsts. It will be the first return to Miami for Mark Segbers, who joined the Battery from Miami via transfer late in the 2023 season. The night will also mark Andrew Booth's first match against the Battery since joining Miami in the offseason after a two-year stay in the Lowcountry.

### **PLAYER BIOS**



**#1 ADAM GRINWIS** GOALKEEPER

Grinwis, 31, arrives in Charleston with years of experience and trophies won in both Major League Soccer and the USL Championship. Grinwis most recently played for MLS outfit Orlando City SC, from 2018-19 and 2021-23, appearing in 11 matches for The Lions. The shot-stopper gained popularity for his heroics in the 2019 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup with two saves in the penalty shootout against New York City FC to advance to the semifinals. He also helped Orlando lift the Open Cup trophy in 2022.



### **#2 MARK SEGBERS**

Segbers enters his second season with the Battery after joining the club via transfer from Miami FC in September 2023. The 27-year-old played a key role in the Battery's push to the USL Championship Final following his late-season transfer to the Lowcountry. He started all seven matches he was available for in the regular season and playoffs and added an assist in the Final. Between Miami and Charleston, Segbers tallied four assists, 48 interceptions, 44 clearances, 34 tackles won, and 169 duels won across 37 matches in the regular season and playoffs.



### **#3 JOSH DRACK** MIDFIELDER

Josh Drack enters his first season in Charleston after signing a multi-year contract in December 2023. The 24-year-old full-back from Arizona adds potent versatility on offense and defense to Charleston's left side as the club aims to defend their Eastern Conference title. Drack most recently played for Huntsville City FC of MLS NEXT Pro, featuring in 25 matches while tallying one goal and three assists. His lone goal came as a match-winner against Toronto



### **#4 CHRIS ALLAN**

Allan enters his second season with the Battery in 2024 after signing a multi-year contract with the club in December 2022. The English midfielder developed into one of the Battery's most consistent and reliable players as a holding midfielder, featuring in 39 matches across all competitions en route to the club's Eastern Conference title. Allan recorded 44 interceptions, 30 clearances, 39 tackles won and 122 duels won in Championship play.



### **#5 LELAND ARCHER**

Leland returns for his seventh season with the Black and Yellow, entering as the longest-tenured player for the club. The 27-year-old defender has played over 100 matches for the Battery across all competitions. Archer anchored the back line and ascended to the captain's role during the Battery's run to the USL Championship Final. Archer led the league (regular season and playoffs) in clearances, with 164 in 33 matches. He also recorded a team-high 18 blocks, along with 22 interceptions, 94 duels won, 84.8% passing accuracy and one goal in Championship play.



### #6 AARON MOLLOY

MIDELE DESCRETE among the top midfielders in the USL Championship the past two seasons and was an MVP finalist in 2022 in addition to consecutive First Team All-League selections in 2022 and 2023. The midfielder registered a club-best 18 assists and 154 chances created across the regular season and playoffs in those two seasons for Memphis. Molloy scored 10 goals in that time. His 80 chances created in 2023 were the most in the league. Aaron scored his first goal of the season in the Battery's 4-0 over New Mexico on



### **#7 JAKE LACAVA**

Jake LaCava enters his first season with the Battery after signing a multi-year contract in December 2023. LaCava has made his mark in the Championship with Red Bulls II and the Tampa Bay Rowdies the past four seasons, scoring 26 goals and 18 assists in over 100 appearances across the regular season and playoffs. He's a dynamic player who excels in one-on-one situations and in creating chances for his teammates.



### **#8 EMILIO YCAZA**

Ycaza (EE-kah-zah) enters his second season with the Black and Yellow after a successful first season that saw the Battery finish 2023 as USL Championship Finalists. Quickly developing into a fan-favorite, the 26-year-old was a spark at midfield and tallied four goals and three assists across 24 matches in the regular season and playoffs. Ycaza additionally tallied 28 chances created, 32 interceptions, 26 tackles won and 113 duels won.



### #9 MD MYERS

Matthew Dyan "MD" Myers enters his first season with the Black and Yellow in 2024 after being acquired via transfer from New York City FC II. Myers won the Golden Boot for the 2023 MLS NEXT Pro season after scoring 19 goals for NYCFC II. He earned MLSNP Best XI honors after the prolific campaign. "MD" was clinical throughout the 2023 season, scoring braces against Toronto FC II. Huntsville City FC. Columbus Crew 2. and Orlando City B. and a hat trick against Inter Miami CF II. He averaged one goal involvement every 102 minutes and was named the league's Co-Player of the Month for August.



### **#10 ARTURO RODRIGUEZ**

Arturo enters his second season with the Black and Yellow after signing with the club in March 2023. Rodríguez ended 2023 leading the club in chances created (44) across the regular season and playoffs. He additionally scored four goals and five assists across 27 Championship matches. This includes the two goals and two assists he had in the playoffs, with one of the goals coming via a sensational free kick in the Eastern Conference Final to help the Battery lift the trophy. Arturo scored his first goal of the season in the Battery's 4-0 win over New Mexico on March 23.



#### #11 DIEGO GUITIERREZ FORWARD

Diego Gutiérrez enters his first season with the Black and Yellow after signing prior to the 2024 season. The 25-year-old forward featured for Portland Timbers of Major League Soccer the previous two years, along with stints with Timbers 2 in MLS NEXT Pro. Gutiérrez made his MLS debut on March 12, 2022, and would make 12 appearances for the Timbers across all 2022-23 competitions, recording one assist. With Timbers 2, Gutiérrez scored seven goals and added one assist across 21 matches.



### **#13 NICK MARKANICH**

Nick Markanich (Mar-CANE-ick) enters his second season with the Black and Yellow after a breakout 2023 campaign. Markanich, 23, was among the USL Championship's top attackers in 2023. He was a five-time Team of the Week selection, the Week 15 Player of the Week and a Player of the Month nominee in June. Nick tallied 13 goals and four assists in 36 matches across all competitions, finding the back of the net in the regular season, playoffs and Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup. Nick scored his second goal of the season in the Battery's 4-0 victory over New Mexico on March 23



#### **#16 GRAHAM SMITH** DEFENDER

Graham enters his first season with the Battery after signing a multi-year contract in in December 2023. The 6-3 center-back's 2023 season was a true force in anchoring Memphis 901 FC's defense. Smith led Memphis in clearances (133), blocks (15) and aerial duels won (91) across 30 appearances in the regular season and playoffs. He additionally contributed two assists and one goal. Smith, 28, has been one of the top center-backs in the USL Championship recently and brings experience from the Championship and



### **#19 ROBBIE CRAWFORD MIDFIELDER**

Robbie Crawford enters his fifth season with the Black and Yellow, having made 88 appearances across all competitions since first arriving in 2020. The Scottish midfielder was a regular on the pitch and played in 36 matches across all competitions. One of the most technical players in the league, his versatility was often relied on as he played numerous different positions, which in turn helped the Battery in their run to the USL Championship Final. Crawford recorded one goal and two assists in 2023.



### **#23 JUAN SEBASTIAN PALMA** DEFENDER

Juan Sebastián Palma enters his second year with the Black and Yellow after signing in December 2022. In his first season in the United States, Palma recorded 95 clearances, 14 blocks, 27 interceptions, 87 duels won and one goal across 25 matches in league play (regular season and playoffs). He additionally featured in the Battery's three 2023 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup
