HEAD COACH, GENERAL MANAGER **BRENDAN BURKE**

On December 12th, 2023, Brendan Burke was named the Head Coach and General Manager of Hartford Athletic. Born in Massachusetts, Burke spent two seasons as Head Coach of the Colorado Springs Switchbacks, and added the role of General Manager for the 2022 campaign before being signed as Assistant Coach of MLS' Houston Dynamo. In his time in Colorado Springs, Burke took over a two-win club in 2020 leading a resurgence that saw his club earn two trips to the USL Championship playoffs, a first ever trip to the Western Conference Finals, and a 30-23-13 overall record. Burke also earned USL Championship Coach of the Month honors in April of 2022 and was nominated as a finalist for the league's Coach of the Year award in 2021. Burke is the sixth Head Coach in Club history, and brings the most proven success with a 146-99-72 record as a professional.



ASSISTANT COACH **AARON WHEELER**

Aaron Wheeler, 35, comes to Hartford for his first coaching job in the USL Championship after retiring from an extensive 11-year playing career at the professional level in November of 2023. He made his debut in 2010 with FC Tampa Bay (NASL), and went on to make 25 appearances in MLS with Philadelphia Union across the 2013 and 2014 seasons. He originally retired in 2017, but made his return as a player for Brendan Burke and the Switchbacks in 2022 and was a part of their run to the Western Conference Finals that season. The striker scored two goals off the bench in their 3-0 win over RGV in the Quarterfinals. Wheeler is a native of Baltimore, Maryland, and he is joined in Hartford by his wife Ashli and daughter.



GOALKEEPER COACH **DAN GASPAR**

On September 29, 2022, Dan Gaspar was announced as Hartford Athletic's Goalkeeper Coach and Assistant Coach. Gaspar, a Glastonbury, Connecticut native, brings a wealth of experience and knowledge to the club. Over the last 30 years, he has coached eight different national teams, three collegiate teams, and six other professional clubs. He made a seven-year run as Assistant Coach of the Iranian National Team from 2011-2018 where he worked with Hartford Assistant Coach Omid Namazi. The two of them assisted former Real Madrid Head Coach Carlos Queiroz. Over Gaspar's seven year stretch, he helped the team reach two FIFA World Cups, including a first place finish in their qualification group and third place finish in the group stage in 2018 behind Portugal and Spain. Before joining the Iranian National Team Staff, Gaspar was on the technical staff of the Portuguese National Team during their World Cup run to the round of 16 in 2010.

LAST TIME OUT

Hartford Athletic are coming off a 1-0 victory at El Paso Locomotive FC on Saturday, March 9th, taking a victory into their bye week. The lone goal came from Romario Williams on an early penalty kick in the 13th minute. Williams was the one who drew the penalty himself, drawing contact in the box from El Paso's Bolu Akinyode. Hartford defense remained steady through the rest of the game, and held on for the 1-0 victory.

KEEPING IT CLEAN

Hartford Athletic started the season off with a clean sheet in their 1-0 victory over El Paso, a positive start for a team that led the league in goals conceded a season ago. The defensive effort was led by Thomas Vancaeyezeele, who booted six clearances and swiped two interceptions from the back line. It's an excellent return to USL Championship play for Vancaeyezeele, making an impact in his first game back in the league since 2022.

MATCHUP HISTORY

Hartford Athletic are 1-4-1 against Birmingham Legion all-time. Of those six matches, four of them have been decided by just one goal. In 2022, it was Anderson Asiedu who headed in a game-winning goal in stoppage time to beat Hartford in Birmingham 1-0. Now, Asiedu dons green and glue in his first matchup against his former club. Earlier this week, Brendan Burke said, "There's a lot of MLS quality talent in their group. A lot of guys who have played in the league and come down. They're solid in every position and they're an experienced group, well-coached, disciplined in their defensive shape... You need things to break your way [when playing against them], and you need to be pragmatic about how you approach them. You can't expose yourself too much."

MISSING A PROLIFIC SCORER

Williams' goal against El Paso marked the sixth club that he's scored for in the Championship overall since his first in the league for the Charleston Battery in March, 2016. Only five players have scored for more clubs in the USL Championship than Williams during their career, including his new teammate Marcus Epps, who has scored for seven different teams during his career so far. Hartford will be without Williams this Saturday, as the 29 year old has been called up to the Jamaican National Team for their CONCACAF Semi-Final matchup with the U.S. on March 21st at 7:00pm in Dallas.

BETWEEN THE POSTS

Hartford signed goalkeeper Paul Walters on loan from FC Cincinnati on March 8th, and he was given the start against El Paso. He made three saves and earned a clean sheet in his USL Championship debut against El Paso, and showed reliability in a short sample size. Walters was signed after Renan Ribeiro was ruled out with a quad injury. Brooks Thompson (2023 League One Champion with North Carolina), Greg Monroe, and academy signing Justin DiCarlo follow on Hartford's depth chart of five keepers. Speaking on the goalkeeper group earlier this week, Coach Burke said: "[Renan] is back in training now, so it's only a matter of time, it could be this weekend. He's a really high-end keeper, but Paul stepped in and did an admirable job. I thought he was clean, his kicking was excellent, and his decision making was good."

HOME, SWEET HOME

Hartford Athletic are 2-2-1 all-time in home opening matches, their last victory coming in 2020 over Loudoun United. Coach Burke said this week: "I hope people turn out... I just can't wait for home fans to see [this] group. I think it's unlike one that Hartford's ever seen."

MICHEE SAYS HELLO

Michee Ngalina was a headline signing for Hartford Athletic this offseason, and he made an impact almost immediately for his new team. Despite not scoring a goal, the winger largely had his way in the El Paso attacking third two weeks ago. He fired off four shots, put two on target, and one that hit the post. He got loose multiple times in the final third, and created Hartford's best chance of the second half on a cross that led to a shot on goal from Enoch Mushagalusa. The 23 year old gave a promising preview of what he is capable of in Hartford this year.

MANNING THE MIDFIELD

Jay Chapman was a difference-maker for Hartford from the midfield against El Paso. He did well to connect with his forwards and he was effective in getting the ball into opportunistic areas in El Paso's half. He led the team with 24 passes in the final third, including a quality ball into the box that allowed Romario Williams to draw the decisive penalty. Chapman is a part of a veteran midfield on Hartford's roster, joined by Anderson Asiedu, Marlon Hairston, and Danny Barrera, all players with extensive careers in either the USL Championship or MLS.

Monroe signs with Hartford after training with the Club for the majority of the 2023 season, then signing an amateur contract with MLS Next side Austin FC II in September. He began training with Hartford after a standout career at Siena College from 2018 to 2022. He left the Saints as one of their most decorated players, winning the 2022 MAAC Golden Glove award for the top goalkeeper and becoming Siena's all-time leader in wins, shutouts, goalkeeper minutes, and matches played.

Akpunonu spent the majority of 2023 with FC Cincinnati 2 of MLS Next Pro, making 23 appearances for the MLS affiliate side. He made his MLS debut with Cincinnati on June 24th, 2023, and appeared in two Open Cup matches with the first team. Akpunonu played collegiately at Bowling Green State University, where he started 42 of the 48 matches he played in, scored eight career goals, and was named to the all-Mid-American Conference (MAC) team in back to back seasons. He was one of just 44 players (and one of only 18 underclassmen) invited to participate in the Adidas MLS College Showcase, and was named to the MLS Generation Adidas 2023 class on Dec. 19, 2022. Two days later, Akpunonu was drafted by FC Cincinnati as the 22nd overall pick, making him the only Bowling Green Falcon to ever be selected in the first round of the MLS SuperDraft.

Scarlett is in his eighth season in the USL Championship, totaling 157 appearances and over 12,000 minutes played. He signed with Louisville City ahead of the 2023 season, but his campaign was cut short after three games due a knee injury that required surgery. The 28 year old spent three excellent seasons with Tampa Bay Rowdies from 2020 to 2022, serving as one of the club's defensive leaders. Over 79 appearances (73 starts), he totaled 207 clearances, 121 interceptions, and 88 tackles won. The Rowdies made it to the Eastern Conference Final in all three years of Scarlett's tenure, and gave up a league-low 27 goals in 2021. Born in Jamaica, Scarlett grew up in the Bronx and played collegiately at nearby Iona University before Major League Soccer's New York Red Bulls selected him in the 2017 SuperDraft. Internationally, Scarlett made his debut in June of 2022 when Jamaica faced off against Mexico in the CONCACAF Nations League.

Hodge returns to Hartford after a quality 2023 season with the Green and Blue. He was one of the team's most reliable defenders across 24 appearances, winning 28 tackles, 121 duels, and swiping 26 interceptions. The 29 year old played for Head Coach and General Manager Brendan Burke in 2020 and 2021 with Colorado Springs, making 19 appearances and helping the Switchbacks to a playoff berth. The 29 year old Trinidadian has nine caps for the Trinidad & Tobago National Team, most recently competing in the 2023 CONCACAF Gold Cup for his country. In 2017, Hodge played in the Soca Warriors' 2-1 win over the United States in the World Cup qualifiers.

Makangila returns to Hartford for a second year after a promising 2023 season in Green and Blue. The Congolese midfielder was set back by an ankle injury that saw him miss 11 games from April to June, but he responded with a quality second half of the season. Makangila became a frequent starter through Hartford's final 17 games, and added an exclamation point to his return by scoring one of the team's best goals of the season against New Mexico United.

Prior to signing with Hartford ahead of the 2023 season, Makangila spent 2021 and 2022 with Colorado Springs Switchbacks FC. He made 52 appearances and helped lead the Switchbacks to back-to-back playoff appearances under current Hartford Athletic Head Coach Brendan Burke.
