

US SOCCER ANNOUNCES FIRST ROUND AND BRACKETS OF 2007 US OPEN CUP

May 30th, 2007 It has been an interesting week for the Cleveland City Stars. Although they remain undefeated after five games, the draw with the Wilmington Hammerheads puts the Stars (4-0-1) currently in third with 13 points due to lesser games played. Fortunately for them, the Richmond Kickers (5-0-1) also only managed a draw this weekend, which means CCS is keeping pace with the league leaders, a team the Stars have yet to face.

The Cleveland City Stars are scheduled to host the Kickers on July 21st, but may not have to wait that long. Provided both teams win their respective first round matches on June 12th, where the Stars will face the Kansas City Brass (PDL Team), CCS will play the Kickers in what would be a very meaningful game on June 26th in the second round of the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup.



The winner of the June 26th match will have the opportunity to host an MLS team in the third round. "Of course just qualifying for the U.S. Lamar Hunt Open Cup so early in our franchise's history is a tremendous accomplishment. But that was one of our goals from the beginning. Making it to the third round and having an opportunity to host an MLS team would go a long way in establishing CCS in the community and getting some recognition at the highest level of American soccer," said Mark Geissbauer, CCS General Manager.

CCS RESERVE TEAM HEADS TO HAITI TO "CHANGE THE WORLD"

During the last CCS home game, all fans had an opportunity to give to the poorest kids in Haiti. Haiti Night was an opportunity for fans to bring new or gently used soccer items including balls, cleats and ball pumps. All the donations from last week's game as well as donations collected in Baltimore when the Stars played Crystal Palace back in May will be personally distributed to the children of Haiti as the Cleveland City Stars Reserve Team (CCSR) begins their two week Goodwill tour tomorrow morning.

The CCS Reserve Team will have high-caliber matches with the Haitian Futsal National Team, the U-17 Haitian Outdoor National Team and three other matches in the cities of Flora, St Marc and Cap Haitian. For the first time, Haitians living outside Port-au-Prince will be able to enjoy watching their teams compete with players from another country.



In addition to playing matches CCSR will partner with Union Evangelique Baptiste de Haiti, Athletic de Haiti Soccer Academy, Servants for Haiti and Ambassadors in Sport to conduct soccer and futsal clinics for underprivileged and orphaned children. During these clinics the CCSR goal is to provide positive role models for Haitian kids and to use this as a platform to serve and direct individuals to something greater than themselves.
