MANAGER BUTCH HOBSON

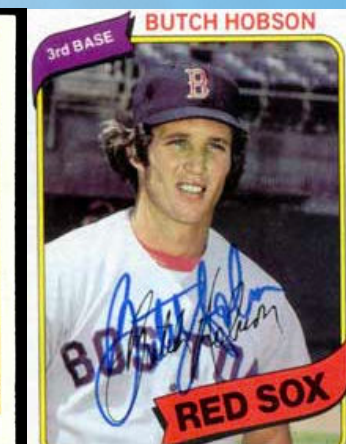
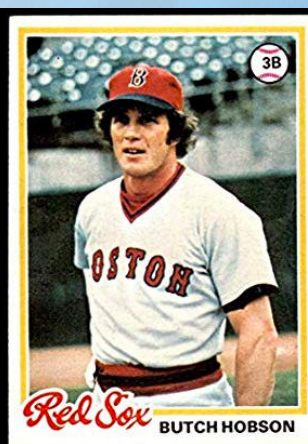
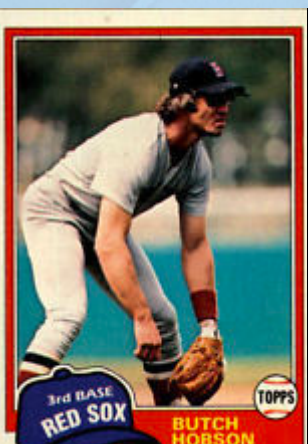
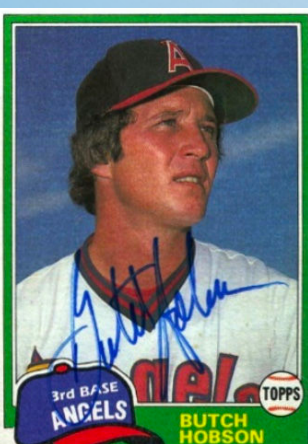
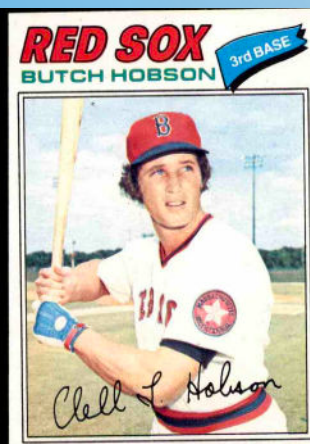
Entering his fourth season in Chicago, Butch Hobson is the first (and only) manager in Chicago Dogs history. Hobson boasts more than 30 years of experience in both major and minor league baseball, including three seasons as manager of the Boston Red Sox. He is a University of Alabama alumnus who once played as a backup quarterback under coach Bear Bryant.

Hobson is also a former MLB third baseman, having played for the Boston Red Sox (1975-80), California Angels (1981) and New York Yankees (1982). After retiring as a player, Hobson managed the Pawtucket Red Sox before being promoted to Boston. As manager of MLB's Red Sox from 1992-94, Hobson led the team to 207 victories. Hobson has also managed in the Boston Red Sox minor league system, New York Mets minor league system, Philadelphia Phillies minor league system and the Independent Atlantic League's Lancaster Barnstormers, as well as with the Mobile Bay Sharks and Nashua Pride. Hobson most recently served as manager of the Arizona Diamondbacks' Class-A affiliate.

Joe Dominiak enters his first season as Chicago Dogs hitting coach.

Dominiak's résumé includes nearly 30 years of baseball coaching experience between the professional, collegiate and high school levels.

In 1998, Dominiak inherited a dormant program, taking the position as head coach for Saint Martin's University in Lacey, Washington (NCAA Division II), a program that hadn't competed in 40 years.

At Saint Martin's, Dominiak built a new stadium and reached the NCAA Regionals during his tenure, which ended in 2008.

Collegiately, Dominiak also has held assistant coaching posts at the University of Washington, University of Puget Sound and Chemeketa Community College.

Dominiak coached in the West Coast League, a collegiate summer league, spearheading the Bend Elks in Bend, Oregon.

Dominiak then transitioned to high school, where he led the baseball team at Madras High School in Oregon.

In the professional ranks, Dominiak most recently worked in the Los Angeles Angels organization in player development.

Dominiak graduated from Southern Oregon University in 1989.

Stew Cliburn enters his first season as Chicago Dogs pitching coach.

Born in Jackson Mississippi, Cliburn boasts an impressive professional baseball history that began four decades ago, when the Pittsburgh Pirates selected him in the fourth round of the 1977 MLB Draft out of Delta State University.

After five years in the Pirates organization, Cliburn signed with the Angels in 1982. Two years later, Cliburn debuted at the big-league level, pitching as a September call-up.

Cliburn then skyrocketed into a dependable relief pitcher in 1985, appearing in 44 games and posting a 2.09 ERA. Cliburn finished fifth in American League Rookie of the Year voting that season. Injuries then derailed the subsequent few seasons before Cliburn returned to the MLB mound in 1988, tallying a 4-2 record and 4.07 ERA for the Angels.

After two more minor league seasons, Cliburn retired and transitioned into coaching. He served as a pitching coach in the Angels organization for two seasons before joining the Minnesota Twins farm system in 1993. Cliburn remained with the Twins through the 2019 season, coaching at every level during his 28-year run with the organization that ended with the Rochester Red Wings (Triple-A).

Cliburn spent the 2020 season coaching with the Wei Chuan Dragons, an expansion team in the Chinese Professional Baseball League in Taiwan.

Cliburn's twin brother, Stan, served as the Dogs' pitching coach in 2018 and now manages the Southern Maryland Blue Crabs of the Atlantic League.
