SEASON-ENDING ROSTER MOVES

Following the end of the 2022 Major League Soccer season, the New England Revolution exercised the contract options of nine players, bringing the club's MLS roster to 24 players entering the 2022-23 MLS offseason.

The nine players who had their 2023 contract options exercised were **D Jon Bell**, **GK Earl Edwards Jr.**, **GK Jacob Jackson**, **D Henry Kessler**, **M Maciel**, **F Justin Rennicks**, **D Ben Reveno**, **M Damian Rivera**, and **D Ryan Spaulding**.

The following 15 players entered the offseason with guaranteed contracts with New England for the 2023 season: **F Jozy Altidore**, **M Esmir Bajraktarević**, **M Dylan Borrero**, **F Gustavo Bou**, **M Noel Buck**, **D Brandon Bye**, **D Andrew Farrell**, **M Carles Gil**, **D Omar Gonzalez**, **D DeJuan Jones**, **D/M Christian Makoun**, **M Tommy McNamara**, **GK Djordje Petrović**, **M Matt Polster**, and **F Giacomo Vrioni**.

The Revolution did not exercise the contract options of four players: **M Emmanuel Boateng**, **GK Clément Diop**, **M Wilfrid Kaptoun**, and **F Edward Kizza**. Three additional players are out of contract with the club at the end of 2022: **D A.J. DeLaGarza**, **M Nacho Gil**, and **GK Brad Knighton**. The Revolution have until the MLS deadline of Nov. 14 to exercise or decline the option of **F Ismael Tajouri-Shradi**.

As a result of these moves, the Revolution enter the offseason with 24 players under guaranteed contracts for 2023, giving the club six open roster slots and three open International roster slots. The returning Revolution players will reconvene at the Socios.com Training Center in Foxborough on October 17 for two weeks of post-season training.



2022 REVOLUTION TEAM AWARDS

DJORDJE PETROVIC WINS REVOLUTION TEAM MVP


Djordje Petrović, a top candidate for 2022 MLS Newcomer of the Year and Allstate MLS Goalkeeper of the Year honors, earns his first Revolution Team MVP Award after joining the club from Serbian first-division side FK Čukarički in April 2022. The goalkeeper was also voted Players' Player of the Year by his teammates. He is the fourth Revolution goalkeeper to earn Team MVP honors, joining Walter Zenga (1997), Matt Reis (2006 and 2011), and Matt Turner (2020). Petrović is also the third goalkeeper to be recognized by his teammates as the club's Players' Player of the Year award, joining Turner (2020) and Knighton (2016). The last newcomer to win Team MVP honors was Carles Gil in 2019.



The 23-year-old goalkeeper quickly racked up seven shutouts over 21 starts this season. Petrović's shot-stopping prowess has been elite as he finished his debut season with a 75.68 save percentage, second best in MLS (min. 30 saves). He recorded a club-record four penalty saves, the most in an MLS season since 2017. During the 2022 campaign, the Serbian international backstopped New England to four consecutive clean sheets and a 402-minute shutout streak, the second longest in club history and the third best in MLS this season. According to American Soccer Analysis' advanced metrics, Petrović recorded -10.66 goals prevented and +11.83 goals added this year, both of which mark the highest single-season totals in MLS since the statistics were first tracked in 2013. Those marks come despite Petrović playing just 1,890 minutes over the course of his debut season with New England.

ANDREW FARRELL VOTED REVOLUTION DEFENDER OF THE YEAR

Andrew Farrell was voted the Revolution Defender of the Year by local media for the fourth time in the last five seasons, and for a team-record fifth time overall in his 10-year MLS career (2015, 2018, 2019, 2021, and 2022). In 2022, Farrell started 32 of the club's 34 games in central defense and contributed to nine clean sheets, both tied for the most among Revolution defenders this year. On October 1, he became the first Revolution player to start 300 career regular season games. Earlier this season, Farrell became the Revolution's all-competitions leader in appearances, starts, and minutes played. Among all MLS defenders in 2022, Farrell ranked third with 215 possessions won.



BRAD KNIGHTON HONORED AS HUMANITARIAN OF THE YEAR


Revolution goalkeeper **Brad Knighton**, in his club-record 12th season with New England, receives his first Revolution Humanitarian of the Year Award for his support of countless charitable initiatives, most evident this season in his work with Special Olympics Massachusetts and throughout Fight Childhood Cancer Month in September. Knighton showed his support for the Revolution Unified Team by coaching the athletes at their tryout clinic in April before returning to welcome them to the club on their signing day in August.



Knighton, a father of three, is also passionate about supporting the club's efforts around childhood cancer awareness. The 15-year veteran visited Mass General Hospital for Children to meet with patients earlier this September, and again met with BCH families to watch the Revolution's Sept. 17 match together in a suite at Gillette Stadium. Knighton closed out 2022's Kick Childhood Cancer month on Sept. 28 by attending Box Car Movie Night with Binkeez for Comfort, a local non-profit he has supported over the years including visits to their headquarters to make blankets.

JACK PANAYOTOU NAMED ACADEMY PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Revolution Academy graduate **Jack Panayotou** has been named the UnitedHealthcare Revolution Academy Player of the Year for the 2021-22 MLS NEXT season, becoming the eighth different recipient of this award.



Panayotou, 18, excelled with New England since joining the Revolution Academy in 2019. The midfielder scored four goals during the 2021-22 regular season, before recording a team-high six goals in the MLS NEXT Cup Playoffs as he propelled the Under-19s to the program's first national championship title. Panayotou capped off the title run by scoring the game-winning goal in the final. At the professional level, Panayotou made nine appearances in MLS NEXT Pro with New England's second team this year, recording the fourth brace in Revolution II history on April 17 in the team's 3-2 comeback win over FC Cincinnati 2.

The Cambridge, Mass. native capped off his final Academy season with a selection to the inaugural MLS NEXT All-Star Game. He has also earned three call-ups to the U.S. Under-19 Men's Youth National Team to date, including a selection to the roster for September's Slovenia Nations Cup. This fall, Panayotou began his collegiate career at Georgetown University, notching three goals and two assists through his first six games played.

PETROVIC MAKES CASE FOR NEWCOMER OF THE YEAR

Revolution goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović** wasted no time in establishing himself as a top contender for MLS Newcomer of the Year, MLS Best XI, and Allstate MLS Goalkeeper of the Year honors. The Serbian international made his MLS debut for New England on June 12 and delivered seven shutouts in 21 starts with a 1.29 goals against average and 75.68 save percentage in his first season with the club -- the third-highest mark in club history and the highest since Matt Reis' club record 81.4 save percentage in 2009.

Petrović ranked second in MLS in save percentage this season among goalkeepers with at least 30 saves, while his rate of 0.33 shutouts per start was fifth best in MLS (min. 10 starts). He posted four consecutive shutouts from July 23 to Aug. 13, tied for a club record. That stretch was part of a 402-minute shutout streak, the third-longest streak in MLS this season and the second-longest shutout run in club history.

Much like his predecessor Matt Turner, Petrović showcased his ability to win points for New England with his heroics in net. Despite making only 21 starts, the shotstopper led MLS with four penalty saves on 12 attempts, tied for the most in club history for a single season and the most in an MLS campaign since 2017.

Petrović ranked atop MLS this season in goals prevented (G-xG) according to American Soccer Analysis, despite playing only 21 games and at least 1,000 fewer minutes than the rest of the top four. Since ASA began tracking advanced stats and analytics for MLS in 2013, Petrović's total of -10.66 surpassed Tim Melia's (SKC) benchmark of -10.37 goals prevented from 2017.

KING OF THE GIL: CAPTAIN CARLES LEADING THE WAY

Carles Gil finished his fourth MLS season and continued to rack up MLS accolades, most recently earning his second straight selection to the 2022 MLS All-Star Team. In this year's summer showdown, Gil played 45 minutes, coming on as a halftime substitute and winning a decisive penalty that Seattle's Raul Ruidiaz converted for the game winner.

The second player in club history to take home MLS MVP honors last year, Gil is also a two-time MLS Best XI selection (2019, 2021), MLS Newcomer of the Year (2019), MLS Comeback Player of the Year (2021), MLS All-Star (2021-22), and two-time Revolution Team MVP (2019, 2021).

In 2022, Gil again ranked among the top three in a wide variety of key attacking categories after he paced the league in many of these same areas during his MVP and Supporters' Shield-winning 2021 season.

GUSTAVO BOU CLAIMS REVOLUTION GOLDEN BOOT

Despite playing in just 19 games this season due to multiple injury spells, forward **Gustavo Bou** ended his fourth season in New England as the club's Golden Boot winner, the first time in his Revolution career he has led the team in scoring. Bou scored seven of his goals in an eight-game stretch from May 28 through July 16 and added his final tally as a game-winner on Oct. 1 against Atlanta.

Bou has been one of Major League Soccer's top attacking players since entering the league in July 2019. Bou's 57 combined goals and assists, including playoffs, are sixth most in the league, while his 40 goals are fourth most during that span.

TAKE IT OUTSIDE: BYE & JONES TOP FULL BACK DUO IN MLS

When it comes to Revolution defenders finding the scoresheet, **DeJuan Jones** and **Brandon Bye** are among the best in club history. This season, the duo combined for 14 assists. Jones recorded his seventh helper of the season on Sept. 10 at New York Red Bulls, giving him the most assists by a Revolution defender in a single season. As for Bye, the right back tallied an assist in New England's final match to match Jones' mark, which was second most on the team this season.

In Revolution history, only six defenders have ever recorded five or more assists in a single campaign. Revolution Homegrown Players **Noel Buck** and **Esmir Bajraktarević** made their MLS debut on Aug. 13 and Aug. 17, respectively. Buck, who signed as the club's eighth Homegrown Player in February 2022, started three matches and scored his first goal on Sept. 4 vs. New York City FC, making history as the second-youngest player in club history to start in consecutive games and to score a goal (17 years, 152 days).

Buck is no stranger to the pro game, having played 44 games for Revolution II over the past two seasons. Buck made his pro debut on April 10, 2021, just five days after his 16th birthday, and was one of only two players to appear in all 28 matches for Revs II during the 2021 campaign. Buck inked his first professional contract with New England's second team in June 2021. Named the 2021 UnitedHealthcare Revolution Academy Player of the Year, Buck joined the New England Revolution Academy in 2017 at the age of 12 and went on to make 66 appearances for the program.

Bajraktarević, who joined the Revolution Academy's residency program in August 2021, made his professional debut soon after on Aug. 21, 2021. He has since made 28 appearances with 19 starts for New England's developmental team. The midfielder also earned four call-ups in 2022 to the U.S. Under-19 and Under-20 Men's Youth National Team, including helping the U.S. U-19s claim the Slovenia Nations Cup in September.

In May 2022, the New England Revolution signed Bajraktarević to a Homegrown Player contract after inking his first pro deal with Revolution II in December 2021. The 17-year-old made his first-team debut on May 25, starting and playing 67 minutes at New York City FC in U.S. Open Cup action.

Since Revolution II began play in 2020, Buck and Bajraktarević are among seven players to make the leap to the first team roster and six to make their MLS debut:

BENVENUTO: NEW DP GIACOMO VRIONI ENDS SEASON STRONG

On July 5, the New England Revolution acquired forward **Giacomo Vrioni** from Italian Serie A club Juventus FC and signed the Italy native and Albania National Team striker to a Designated Player contract through the 2025 MLS season with an additional one-year club option. Vrioni, 23, occupies New England's third and final Designated Player slot as well as an International roster slot.



Vrioni made his MLS debut on July 23 at Columbus, playing 23 minutes off the bench and recording nine touches and appeared the following week for the first time at Gillette Stadium before missing six weeks with a knee injury. The Albanian international appeared in the club's final five matches, starting twice and converted a penalty on Oct. 1 for his first MLS goal.

The striker arrived in New England after scoring 17 regular season tallies and four more in Europa League Playoff and domestic cup action. Vrioni totaled 21 goals with five assists in 30 appearances across all competitions with the Austrian club. Vrioni owns six senior caps with the Albania National Team since debuting in 2018, including four UEFA Nations League appearances.

DYLAN BORRERO SHOWS FLASHES IN FIRST MLS SEASON

The New England Revolution acquired 20-year-old midfielder **Dylan Borrero** from Clube Atletico Mineiro, the reigning Campeonato Brasileiro Série A champions, and signed him to a three-year MLS contract with a one-year club option. Borrero was New England's first acquisition under Major League Soccer's U-22 Initiative, aimed to promote further investment in young players approaching the primes of their soccer careers.

In his first MLS campaign, Borrero was limited to just 12 games due to injury yet still produced three goals and two assists. Borrero closed the year with a bang, notching a game-winning assist on Oct. 1 against Atlanta and netting a stunner in the season finale at Chicago on Oct. 9. In his first MLS start on June 12, Borrero tallied his first league assist.

Borrero arrived in New England with 50 professional appearances across all competitions for Atletico Mineiro and Colombian first-division side Independiente Santa Fe. Primarily a winger, Borrero helped Mineiro win the 2021 Brasileiro Série A and Copa do Brasil titles.

Borrero made his club debut on May 21, marking the sixth Brazilian-based player under the age of 22 to arrive in New England since the start of 2020:

ARENA FIRST TO REACH 250 MLS WINS

Bruce Arena, who won his MLS-record fourth Supporters' Shield title in 2021, continued climbing the MLS record books as he finished his 18th season as an MLS head coach. With New England's victory over Atlanta United on October 1, 2022, Arena became the first coach in league history to win 250 regular season matches, having already set the all-time wins record in March.

Entering 2022, Arena was already the winningest coach in the history of the MLS playoffs (35 wins) and the U.S. Men's National Team (81 wins). Arena owns 285 combined regular season and postseason wins in MLS, more than any other coach. Arena's all-time regular season record currently stands at 250-147-124, including a 48-26-35 mark with New England.

FARRELL FIRST TO REACH 300 MLS STARTS WITH REVOLUTION

Revolution defender **Andrew Farrell** continued to rewrite the club record books this season, making 32 league appearances, all starts, and an additional three appearances in Concacaf Champions League and U.S. Open Cup competitions. The 10-year pro stands as the Revolution's all-time leader in MLS regular season games played (304), games started (301), and minutes played (26,792). Farrell is the first Revolution player to appear in 300 games and to make 300 regular season starts, earning his club record fifth Revolution Defender of the Year award as voted by the media.

Farrell has been an ironman since he entered the league, leading all MLS players in games played, games started, and minutes played since 2013. Farrell has never missed more than five games in a season.

NEW ENGLAND REVOLUTION

Coming off an historic 2021 season that saw the Revolution capture its first Supporters' Shield en route to setting an MLS record with 73 points, New England felt the overwhelming support from the throngs of fans in Foxborough throughout the regular season.

In 2022, New England averaged 21,221 fans for its 17 MLS regular season home games at Gillette Stadium, the second-highest total in club history and most since 1997.

On five occasions in 2022, New England surpassed 25,000 in attendance and twice broke 30,000, including the highest attended game since 2018 on Sept. 17 against CF Montreal (35,455). Additionally, 10 of New England's 17 regular season home games saw over 20,000 fans make their way through the turnstiles. New England concluded the home slate with points in 13 of those 17 matches (7-4-6).





BRUCE ARENA
SPORTING DIRECTOR

Bruce Arena has spent four seasons as Sporting Director and Head Coach of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on May 14, 2019. The five-time MLS Cup winner is the eighth head coach in club history and oversees all soccer operations for the New England Revolution, including head coaching duties, roster management, scouting, and the oversight of Revolution II and the Revolution Academy.

In his first four seasons at the helm in New England, Arena has revived the Revolution by leading the side to three consecutive MLS Cup Playoff appearances from 2019-21. His .601 winning percentage with New England entering 2023 is the best of any manager in the club's history. In 2021, Arena won his record fourth Supporters' Shield, the first in Revolution history, after guiding the team to 22 wins, 73 points, and 2.15 points per game - all MLS records. For his efforts, Arena was awarded with his league-leading fourth MLS Coach of the Year honor.

In 2020, his first full season in New England, Arena led the Revolution to the Eastern Conference Final. Arena's impact in New England was immediately evident upon his arrival in Foxborough. Arena made his return to the MLS postseason in 2019 by leading one of the most remarkable turnarounds in league history. After a 2-8-2 start had the Revolution sitting in last place in MLS, Arena went unbeaten in his first eight games at the helm and helped New England reach the postseason, ending a three-year drought for the club.

The Long Island, N.Y. native joined the Revolution with one of the most decorated coaching careers in American soccer history that has spanned more than 40 seasons at the collegiate, professional, and international levels. Arena's MLS resume includes a record five MLS Cup titles, four Supporters' Shields, seven conference championships, one U.S. Open Cup title, and one Concacaf Champions' Cup. He has reached the MLS Cup final in seven of his 16 seasons coaching in the league. Arena has earned three MLS Coach of the Year selections, tied for the most all-time, first winning the honor in 1997 with D.C. United before being recognized in 2009 and 2011 with the LA Galaxy.

With 285 combined regular season and postseason wins in MLS entering the 2023 season, and a regular season record of 250-147-124 (.598), Arena is the league's winningest head coach. He owns the best winning percentage in MLS history and with his final win of 2022, became the first coach in league annals to reach 250 league victories. Arena is the league's all-time leader in MLS Cup Playoff games coached with 55 (35-13-7), while his 35 playoff wins are also the most in league history.

On the international stage, Arena, 71, coached the U.S. Men's National Team over two separate stints from 1998-2006 and 2016-17, amassing the most wins in the program's history with a record of 81-35-32. He led the Stars and Stripes to a Quarterfinal finish in the 2002 FIFA Men's World Cup - the country's best showing since 1930 - as well an appearance in the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup. Arena also guided the U.S. Men's National Team to more Gold Cup titles than any other coach, capturing the continental trophy three times in 2002, 2005, and 2017.

Before his time in the professional ranks, Arena began his head coaching career with one season at the University of Puget Sound (1976), before being named the head coach at the University of Virginia in 1978. During his decorated 18-year tenure at Virginia, he led the Cavaliers to five NCAA Division-1 National Championships, including four in a row from 1991-94, as well as six ACC Men's Soccer titles (1988, 1991-95). While at Virginia, Arena coached a number of American soccer legends, including Claudio Reyna, John Harkes, and Ben Olsen, among many others.

In 1996, Arena received an offer to lead the United States Under-23 Men's National Team in the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta. Shortly after the Olympics, he assumed the head role with D.C. United, where he led the Black-and-Red to a 61-35 record, including the first two MLS Cup titles in 1996 and 1997, and the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup title in 1996.

Off the field, Arena has authored a number of books and is a member of the NJCAA Lacrosse Hall of Fame, after receiving induction in 2008. He and his wife, Phyllis, live in Boston. Arena's son, Kenny, was an assistant coach under his father with the LA Galaxy from 2014-16 and is now an assistant coach with FC Cincinnati.



CURT ONALFO
TECHNICAL DIRECTOR

Curt Onalfo concluded his fourth season as Technical Director of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on June 2, 2019. In his role, Onalfo works closely with Sporting Director Bruce Arena managing the club's day-to-day soccer operations, including oversight of Revolution II, the Revolution Academy and the scouting department.

The Sao Paulo, Brazil native and Ridgefield, Conn. product joined the Revolution following an extensive coaching and playing career in Major League Soccer and with the United States Men's National Team. Onalfo has won MLS Cup as both a player and a coach, including one as a member of D.C. United in 1999, and three as an assistant coach with the LA Galaxy in 2011, 2012, and 2014.

Since joining New England, Onalfo has been instrumental in the evolution of New England's pro player pathway. Onalfo played a leading role in the launch of the club's second team, Revolution II, ahead of its inaugural 2020 season. To date, seven players have ascended from the second team to the club's MLS roster, while 25 current or former Revolution Academy players have made their professional debuts with Revolution II. At the youth level, Onalfo's guidance helped lead the Revolution Academy to its first national championship, as the Under-19 team claimed the 2022 MLS NEXT Cup crown. The previous season, the Revolution sent the Under-15s to the national semifinals at MLS NEXT Cup.

Onalfo owns 12 total years of MLS coaching experience, highlighted by stints as head coach of D.C. United (2010), the then-Kansas City Wizards (2007-09), and the LA Galaxy (2017). While continuing as an assistant with the Galaxy, he also served as the inaugural head coach of USL Championship side LA Galaxy II from 2014-16, where he led the club to a Western Conference title in 2015. When he departed "Los Dos" to take over head coaching duties with the Galaxy first team, his overall record with the developmental side finished at 46-29-20.

On the international level, Onalfo spent six years as an assistant coach for the United States Men's National Team under Bruce Arena. He served as an assistant for the USMNT from 2002-07 - including at the 2002 and 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup™ - and also worked as an assistant with the U.S. Under-23 MNT in 2002. Prior to joining the Revolution, he most recently assisted the U.S. Under-20 Men's National Team from 2018 through May 2019, including in Poland at the FIFA U-20 Men's World Cup™, and served as acting head coach of the U-19 side for a training camp in January 2019.

Onalfo, 52, entered the coaching ranks an assistant with D.C. United in 2000. He remained with the Black and Red until September 2002, briefly serving as interim head coach in 2001. After his time in the U.S. Men's National Team setup, Onalfo was appointed head coach of the Kansas City Wizards shortly after the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup. He led Kansas City for two-and-a-half seasons, compiling a 27-29-22 record, and helped the club reach the postseason twice, including a Western Conference Finals appearance in 2007. In December 2009, Onalfo was named head coach of D.C. United, where he would remain for eight months.

After starring for Ridgefield High School in Connecticut, Onalfo played collegiately for Bruce Arena at the University of Virginia from 1987-1990. In four seasons with the Cavaliers, he earned a pair of All-ACC First Team selections and helped the team win the 1988 ACC Championship. He began his professional career with French side La Ciotat in 1991, before featuring for the Connecticut Wolves of the USISL from 1994-95, and Mexican second division side Tampico Madero in 1995.

Onalfo was selected by the LA Galaxy in the inaugural MLS Draft and would make 13 appearances for the club in 1996, helping it reach the first ever MLS Cup. The defender went on to register 23 appearances across four seasons in MLS, spending additional time with San Jose (1997) and D.C. United (1998-99). He recorded one international cap with the U.S. Men's National Team and featured extensively at the youth level, including the 1989 FIFA World Youth Championship, the 1991 Pan American Games, and the 1992 Summer Olympics.

Onalfo's journey took a detour soon after the 1992 Olympics, when a diagnosis of stage three Hodgkin's disease at the age of 24 disrupted his career and nearly ended his life. After surviving his arduous battle with cancer, Onalfo resumed his playing career with Connecticut and then Mexican side Tampico FC, before joining the Galaxy for the inaugural MLS season.



RICHIE WILLIAMS

ASSISTANT COACH

Richie Williams has served as an assistant coach for the New England Revolution for four years after joining Bruce Arena's staff in June 2019. Williams brings 17 years of coaching experience in Major League Soccer, USL Championship, and the United States Men's National Team to New England. He most recently served as the first ever head coach of USL Championship side Loudoun United FC.

During the 2020 season, Williams coached the Revolution through three unbeaten games in August 2020 in place of a suspended Bruce Arena, leading New England to a 1-0-2 mark.

A native of Middletown Township, N.J., Williams has previously served as either an assistant coach or head coach for seven different teams over the course of his coaching career. Prior to managing Loudoun United in 2019, he served as an assistant coach for the United States Men's National Team from 2017-18. In addition, he has served as an assistant for Real Salt Lake in 2016, the U.S. U-17 MNT from 2012-15, the U.S. U-18 MNT from 2011-12, the New York Red Bulls from 2006-11 -- where he also completed two stints as interim head coach in 2006 and 2009 -- and the University of Virginia from 2005-06.

Williams enjoyed a successful playing career prior to entering the coaching ranks. He played under Bruce Arena at multiple stops during his career, including at the University of Virginia from 1988-91, D.C. United from 1996-98, and the United States Men's National Team from 1998-2002. Together, Arena and Williams won an NCAA Championship at the University of Virginia in 1991, before helping D.C. United to three consecutive MLS Cup appearances, including championships in 1996 and 1997.

The former midfielder also earned 20 international caps with the USMNT under Arena, highlighted by a CONCACAF Gold Cup title in 2002. He also spent time with the Richmond Kickers in 1993 and 2004-05, Scottish side Ayr United FC from 1993-94, and the New York/New Jersey MetroStars in 2001 and 2003.



DAVE VAN DEN BERGH

ASSISTANT COACH

Dave van den Bergh finished his fourth season as Assistant Coach for the New England Revolution after joining the club's staff in June 2019. Van den Bergh, 46, arrived in New England following nine years as a coach with various United States Youth National teams.

The Amsterdam native served as assistant coach for the United States Under-20 Men's National Team in 2019 and from 2010-16, head coach of the United States Under-19 Men's National Team in 2018, and head coach of the United States Under-15s from 2016-18. Van den Bergh recorded a 6-0-4 record as head of the U.S. U-15s, and helped guide the U-20s to consecutive Quarterfinal appearances in the 2015 and 2019 FIFA U-20 World Cups.

Van den Bergh enjoyed a decorated playing career from 1995-2009, featuring extensively in the Dutch Eredivisie, La Liga, and Major League Soccer. He began his career with Dutch powerhouse Ajax in 1995 after spending 10 years in the club's academy. Van den Bergh made 12 appearances across three seasons for Ajax -- highlighted by a league title in the 1995-96 season -- before moving to Spanish side Rayo Vallecano, where he logged 47 appearances from 1997-2000. He returned to the Eredivisie in 2000, joining FC Utrecht. The winger scored 29 goals across 184 games played for Utrecht, and led the club to consecutive Dutch Cup wins in 2003 and 2004, as well a Dutch Super Cup title in 2004.

Van den Bergh signed with the Kansas City Wizards of Major League Soccer in 2006. After one season with Kansas City, he joined the New York Red Bulls, where he played under Bruce Arena in 2007. Following two seasons with New York, Van den Bergh featured for FC Dallas in 2009. On the international stage, Van den Bergh collected two caps with the Netherlands in 2004.



KEVIN HITCHCOCK

GOALKEEPERS COACH

Kevin Hitchcock has spent four seasons as Assistant Coach for the New England Revolution after joining the club's staff in April 2019. Hitchcock brings two decades of professional coaching experience in the top flights of England, Qatar, and India, as well as a decorated 18-year playing career in England, to New England.

Hitchcock, who owns a UEFA 'A' Goalkeeper License and UEFA 'B' License, spent the previous 18 years as a first-team goalkeeper coach with several top-flight clubs. His experience includes stints with Watford FC (2001-04), Blackburn Rovers FC (2004-08), Manchester City FC (2008-10), Fulham FC (2011), Queens Park Rangers (2012-15), Al Arabi Sports Club (2015-16), and Birmingham City FC (2016-18). More recently, Hitchcock spent one year as the goalkeepers coach for Indian Super League side Chennaiyin FC.

Hitchcock has coached and developed a number of elite professional goalkeepers, including Joe Hart, Kasper Schmeichel, Shay Given, Robert Green, Júlio César, Mark Schwarzer, and Matt Turner, among others. With New England, Hitchcock mentored Turner en route to the 2021 MLS Goalkeeper of the Year Award before his Summer 2022 transfer to Arsenal FC. The following season, Hitchcock helped 22-year-old Serbian goalkeeper Djordje Petrovic earn top consideration for MLS Goalkeeper of the Year and MLS Newcomer of the Year accolades after he recorded a 75.7 save percentage, second best in MLS.

Prior to entering the coaching ranks, Hitchcock registered nearly 300 appearances across an 18-year playing career in England, highlighted by two FA Cups, one League Cup, one Cup Winners Cup, and one Super Cup with Chelsea FC. In total, he recorded 96 appearances for The Blues from 1988-2001, also completing loan assignments to West Ham United FC (1993) and Northampton Town FC (1990). Prior to joining Chelsea, Hitchcock began his professional career with Mansfield Town FC, where he made 168 appearances from 1984-88.



SHALRIE JOSEPH

ASSISTANT COACH

Shalrie Joseph concluded his first season as an Assistant Coach with the New England Revolution on Bruce Arena's technical staff following two seasons as a coach with the Revolution Academy.

A native of St. George's, Grenada, Joseph returned to the Revolution organization in 2020 as a Head Coach for the Revolution Academy Under-15 team. During his first season at the helm, Joseph guided the Revolution U-15s to the semifinals of the inaugural MLS NEXT Cup Playoffs in June 2021. Joseph continued coaching the 2006 age group in 2021-22, moving up to coach the Revolution U-17 side. During that time, he simultaneously served in an unofficial capacity with the first team during the team's record-setting 2021 Supporters' Shield campaign.

After a decorated playing career highlighted by more than 10 seasons with the New England Revolution, Joseph made his managerial debut as head coach of the Grenada National Team from 2018-19. He previously earned 20 international caps with the national team from 2002-08. As Grenada's head coach, he helped the side qualify for the 2021 Concacaf Gold Cup and earn promotion to League A in the 2019-20 Concacaf Nations League after an unbeaten 4-0-2 record in League B group play. After parting ways with the Grenada Football Association, Joseph began assisting with the Revolution Academy in an unofficial capacity. Prior to accepting the head coaching position with Grenada, Joseph also spent time as an assistant with the FC Boston Bolts Academy at the U-16 level.

Joseph, 44, entered the coaching ranks following an elite playing career that saw him lead New England to three straight MLS Eastern Conference titles from 2005-07. In addition to his eight consecutive MLS All-Star selections (2004-11) and four MLS Best XI nods (2005, 2007, 2008, 2009), both club highs, Joseph was recognized as a 2009 MLS MVP finalist.





The New England Revolution (0-0-1, 1 pt.) opened the 2022 Major League Soccer season with a 2-2 draw on the road against the Timbers (0-0-1, 1 pt.) on Saturday night. **Brandon Bye** netted New England's first goal of the season with a powerful header in the 41st minute, assisted by **Carles Gil**, to give the Revolution a 1-0 lead at halftime. Newcomer **Sebastian Lletget** added a 63rd-minute tally in his Revolution debut.

Three of the Revolution's key offseason acquisitions – **Lletget**, defender **Omar Gonzalez**, and forward **Jozy Altidore** – made their Revolution debuts in the contest. Gonzalez, who collected his 240th MLS start, led the Revolution with two shots on target in addition to four clearances. Altidore entered the match as a 79th-minute substitute to see out the draw.

Bye scored the first goal of the game in the 41st minute, rising up to meet Carles Gil's corner kick and sending his headed shot off the underside of the crossbar. Portland midfielder Dairon Asprilla tied the game in the 61st minute, before Lletget reclaimed the lead for New England just two minutes later. **DeJuan Jones** registered the primary assist on Lletget's goal, with **Tommy McNamara** also picking up an assist. Portland's Yimmi Chara delivered the game-tying goal on a bicycle kick in the 78th minute.

POSTGAME NOTES

- New England has opened the season on the road in 14 consecutive years. This marks the second straight year they've opened the season with a draw.
- New England and Portland played to a tie for the fifth consecutive meeting and the eighth time in 11 all-time matchups.
- The Revolution extended their unbeaten streak in the Pacific Time Zone to 11 games dating back to June 18, 2016.
- Brandon Bye** scored the opening goal of the 2022 season for New England, the sixth of his career and his first since July 31, 2021. Bye added five clearances on the defensive end.
- Carles Gil**, the reigning Landon Donovan MLS MVP who led the league with 18 assists last season, provided the helper on Bye's opener. Gil's 35 MLS assists are tied with Joe-Max Moore for sixth most in Revs history.
- Gil** recorded a game-high six chances created on the night.
- Omar Gonzalez** and **Sebastian Lletget** both made their Revolution debuts as part of the starting lineup after arriving in Foxborough this offseason.
- Lletget** tallied a goal in his first match with the club, the first Revolution debutant to score in his first match since Gustavo Bou did so on July 17, 2019.
- DeJuan Jones** made his 70th MLS appearance and surpassed 5,000 career minutes played. Jones marked the occasion with an assist on Lletget's tally, the seventh of his Revolution tenure.
- Jozy Altidore** made his Revolution debut, playing 11 minutes as a substitute, after signing with New England earlier in February.
- Earl Edwards Jr.** made his Revolution MLS debut and his first league start since August 4, 2018. Edwards registered three saves as his career record moves to 1-3-2.
- Andrew Farrell** had a team-high eight clearances on the night.

The New England Revolution (1-0-1, 4 pts.) recorded their first win of the season in the 2022 home opener against FC Dallas (0-1-1, 1 pt.) on Saturday afternoon. **Earl Edwards Jr.** recorded his first MLS clean sheet while **Carles Gil** notched the game winner from the penalty spot in the first half to secure Sporting Director and Head Coach **Bruce Arena's** 241st win of his career, moving him ahead of Sigi Schmid as the winningest coach in Major League Soccer history.

Gil, who recorded an assist in the season opener last weekend, tallied his first goal of the season after drawing a penalty in first-half stoppage time. The midfielder picked the bottom right corner with a left-footed spot kick to send New England into halftime with a one-goal lead. New England is now 11-2-4 when Gil notches a goal in the regular season or playoffs.

Sebastian Lletget made his first start at Gillette Stadium in a Revolution uniform. Fellow newcomers **Omar Gonzalez** and **Jozy Altidore** both saw action as second-half substitutes. Gonzalez entered the match at the start of the second half to replace an injured **Henry Kessler**, while Altidore subbed on for **Tommy McNamara** in the 69th minute.

POSTGAME NOTES

- New England earned a 1-0 victory in their home opener for a second straight season, improving to 9-1-6 over their last 16 home openers at Gillette Stadium. The club is now 15-6-5 all-time in home openers.
- The Revolution registered their first victory over FC Dallas since Sept. 10, 2011, snapping a nine-game winless run in the series and improving their all-time record against FC Dallas to 24-19-4.
- New England has avoided defeat in its last 33 MLS matches when scoring the opening goal, dating back to March 7, 2020. The Revolution have not lost a match when leading at halftime since Sept. 7, 2019.

New England raced out to a swift 1-0 lead when Buksa, who returned to the starting lineup following a one-game red card suspension, converted on a cross from defender **Brandon Bye**. Buksa's tally was his 25th goal from open play in the MLS regular season or playoffs, tied for second most in the league since he arrived in 2020.

Polster, who surpassed 10,000 career minutes played in tonight's match, also registered an assist on Buksa's goal and later doubled New England's lead on an unassisted tally in the 72nd minute when he blocked a Charlotte clearance near the goal line. Homegrown Player **Damian Rivera** scored in the first minute of his first MLS start – the third player in league history to do so – while **Adam Buksa** tallied his third goal in as many games. Goalkeeper **Matt Turner** returned from injury to make his first start of 2022, saving all three shots he faced to secure his 22nd career clean sheet.

In the opening minute, **Matt Polster** intercepted an errant Miami pass and found **Carles Gil** at the top of the box, who served the ball to Rivera. The 19-year-old midfielder and Cranston, R.I. native notched his first MLS goal with a left-footed shot past Miami goalkeeper Nick Marsman to put New England ahead early. Buksa extended New England's lead in the 63rd minute, heading in **DeJuan Jones'** cross. Buksa has now scored in three consecutive MLS games for the first time in his career. Miami saw two players sent off in the second half, with Damian Lowe and Jairo Quinteros each picking up two yellow cards in the contest.

The Revolution have now won two in a row at home as they improve to 3-2-0 in Foxborough. Tonight's Starting XI featured four changes from last Saturday's match at D.C. United as Turner, defender **Henry Kessler**, midfielder **Tommy McNamara**, and Rivera started in place of **Brad Knighton**, **Omar Gonzalez**, **Emmanuel Boateng**, and **Justin Rennicks**. The New England Revolution (4-5-3, 15 pts.) defeated FC Cincinnati (6-6-1, 19 pts.), 3-2, at TQL Stadium on Saturday in a match delayed 78 minutes by inclement weather. **Brandon Bye** recorded three assists while **Adam Buksa**, **Sebastian Lletget**, and **Tommy McNamara** each tallied goals in New England's first away win of the season.

Lletget fired the Revolution in front with a spectacular overhead finish in the 17th minute, rising for a scissor kick that sent Bye's cross past Cincinnati's rookie goalkeeper Roman Celentano. Cincinnati leveled the score in the 26th minute on a headed goal by Brandon Vazquez, before Buksa reclaimed the lead for New England with a clever backheeled finish in the 43rd minute, again assisted by Bye.

Buksa has now scored in seven consecutive games for New England, tying a Revolution club record set in 2000. The Polish international has nine goals in his last eight starts, and six goals in four career starts against FC Cincinnati across all competitions. **Carles Gil** moved into a tie for first in MLS with his seventh assist of the year on Buksa's goal. MATCH #13 vs PHILADELPHIA UNION: MAY 28, 2022

The New England Revolution (4-5-4, 16 pts.) played the Philadelphia Union (6-1-7, 25 pts.) to a 1-1 draw at Gillette Stadium on Saturday night. Forward **Gustavo Bou**, making his first MLS start since March 5, converted a second-half penalty kick for his first goal of the season. Moments later, Philadelphia's Mikael Uhre capitalized on a New England mistake to tie the match in the 76th minute.

New England recorded a season-high 22 shots in the match, while Bou led all players with six shots and three on target. The Argentinian forward threatened to score on numerous occasions before finally converting from the penalty spot in the 75th minute, after **Dylan Borrero's** cross struck the arm of Union defender. For his MLS career including playoffs, Bou now owns 33 goals and 50 combined goals and assists, both third most in MLS since he joined the league.

Goalkeeper **Matt Turner**, now set to join the U.S. Men's National Team for international duty, made one save on two shots faced in the match. Turner maintained his unbeaten in MLS this season with a 2-0-3 record. Borrero made his home debut in the 62nd minute and recorded three shots in his 27 minutes played.

POSTGAME NOTES

- New England extended its unbeaten streak in league play to five matches, finishing the month of May with a 2-0-3 record in MLS play.
- The Revolution extended its unbeaten streak against the Union to five matches with Saturday's draw. New England is 3-0-2 in its last five meetings with Philadelphia.
- Andrew Farrell** surpassed 25,000 MLS minutes played (reg. season) for his career, the most in MLS since 2013.
- Carles Gil** led the team with six chances created and five fouls won.
- Gustavo Bou** suited up for his third start of the regular season and his first in MLS start since March 5. The Argentine converted from the penalty spot in the second half for his first goal of the season and closed the night with a game-high six shots, including three on target.
- Bou** has recorded 50 goals and assists – including playoffs – since he joined New England on July 17, 2019, third most in MLS. His 33 goals are also third best.
- Bou's** 30 regular season goals are 10th most in Revolution history.
- DeJuan Jones** surpassed 6,000 career minutes played (regular season) and recorded a team-high two blocked shots.
- Arnór Traustason** made his first start in MLS play since April 9, tallying three shots in a 63-minute shift.
- Dylan Borrero** made his second MLS appearance for New England and first at Gillette Stadium, logging 27 minutes and finishing with three shots.
- Wilfrid Kaptoum** started his second straight league match, recording two interceptions while winning five of his seven duels.

MATCH #14 at SPORTING KANSAS CITY: JUNE 12, 2022

The New England Revolution (5-5-4; 19 pts.) defeated Sporting Kansas City (3-8-6; 14 pts.), 2-1, in 87-degree heat on Sunday afternoon at Children's Mercy Park. The victory, the Revolution's second straight triumph on the road, extends New England's unbeaten streak to six matches in league play. Forward **Gustavo Bou** delivered the opening goal, converting on midfielder **Dylan Borrero's** first MLS assist in the 30th minute. New England played with a man advantage for the majority of the second half, after Kansas City midfielder Oriol Rosell received his second yellow card of the afternoon in the 48th minute. Midfielder **Emmanuel Boateng** broke a 1-1 tie with the game-winning goal in the 87th minute.

Borrero registered his first MLS start after logging appearances off the bench in his first two matches. The 20-year-old Colombian winger, acquired by New England in April under the MLS U-22 initiative, posted a 73-minute shift with his first MLS assist on Bou's goal with a clever chipped ball behind Kansas City's back line. Bou, who has now scored in consecutive matches, led New England's attack with four shots, including three on target. Boateng's goal, scored after Bou's initial shot was spilled by Kansas City goalkeeper Tim Melia, marked the midfielder's second tally of the season. Boateng now owns five career game-winning goals, including two in a Revolution uniform.

Sunday's match featured the MLS debut of 22-year-old Serbian goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović**. Acquired in April from Serbian club FK Čukarički, Petrović tallied one save in the game, a point-blank denial on Russell's right-footed shot in the 67th minute to keep the score knotted at 1-1.

POSTGAME NOTES

- New England extended its unbeaten streak to six games (3-0-3) dating back to April 30.
- New England collected its 20th road victory since the start of 2020 across both the regular season and playoffs, most in MLS during that span.
- New England's 14 road goals this season are tied for the most in MLS.
- New England is now 6-2-1 against Kansas City since the start of 2014 while the victory is New England's first at Children's Mercy Park since Sept. 26, 2014 (3-2).
- The victory also marked New England's first road win against a Western Conference foe since July 4, 2019 at Colorado (2-1).
- New England has now scored in each of its last nine matches, tallying 18 goals over that span (2.0 GPG).
- Gustavo Bou** scored for the second straight game since returning from injury. Bou led the team with four shots, with three on target, and added one chance created on the day.
- Dylan Borrero** registered his first MLS start in his third league appearance on Sunday, and tallied his first Revolution assist on Bou's opening goal.
- Emmanuel Boateng** tallied his second goal of the season, the game winner, and led New England with a team-high three chances created in only 18 minutes played.
- Carles Gil** made his 75th MLS regular season start on Sunday, marking the occasion by winning a team-best five duels.
- Gil** and **Tommy McNamara** remain the only two Revolution players to appear in every match this season, with the latter making his 13th start of the year.
- Matt Polster** returned to the starting lineup in MLS play for the first time since May 15 and completed 94-of-97 passes (92 percent) for the game.

The New England Revolution (5-5-5, 20 pts.) played Orlando City SC (6-5-4, 22 pts.) to a 1-1 draw at Gillette Stadium on Wednesday night. **Carles Gil** scored his fourth goal of the season in the 22nd minute, assisted by **Gustavo Bou**, as New England stretched its unbeaten run to seven games in MLS play.

New England got on the board first as Bou streaked across the midfield line and crossed the ball to Gil, who cut onto his left foot and delivered a curling strike past Orlando goalkeeper Pedro Gallese for the opening goal. This mark's Bou's third assist in six career games against Orlando, Bou crossed the ball over to Gil who delivered a left footed shot from the top of the box sending the ball through the top left corner. With the goal, Gil improved his total to 11 combined goals and assists on the year, tied for third most in MLS. Bou's third assist in five regular season games against Orlando.

Orlando equalized in the 35th minute on a goal from Robin Jansson. Revolution goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović**, making his second league start and his league debut at Gillette Stadium, turned aside four of the Lions' five shots on target. Defender **Jon Bell** and midfielder **Sebastian Lletget** both returned to the starting lineup, with Bell making his first MLS start since March 19. **Jozy Altidore** played the entire second half as a substitute, recording one shot.

POSTGAME NOTES

- The Revolution extend their unbeaten streak to seven games (3-0-4) in league play dating back to April 30.
- New England has now scored in each of its last 10 matches, tallying 19 goals over that span (1.9 GPG).
- Carles Gil** tallied his fourth goal of the season to open the scoring. His 11 combined goals and assists are tied for third most in MLS. Gil finished the night with three chances created and seven possessions gained.
- Gustavo Bou** registered his first assist of the season and the 15th of his MLS career on Gil's opening goal. The striker, who leads all MLS forwards in chances created from open play since the start of 2020, added three key passes on the night and led the team with five shots, including two on target.
- DeJuan Jones** collected his 70th MLS regular season start tonight, winning a team-high seven duels while adding seven recoveries.
- Jon Bell** featured in the starting lineup for the first time since March 19, registering team highs in interceptions (3) and clearances (6).
- Sebastian Lletget** returned to the Starting XI for his 14th appearance and 13th start of the season after missing Sunday's match due to injury, completing 94 percent of his passes.
- Wilfrid Kaptoum** made his fourth consecutive start and fifth in MLS play this season, completing all 16 of his passes in a 45-minute shift.
- Matt Polster** made his 120th MLS start, but was forced off early due to a head injury.

The New England Revolution (6-5-5, 23 pts.) defeated Minnesota United FC (5-7-3, 18 pts.), 2-1, on Sunday night at Gillette Stadium as the club commemorated the Juneteenth holiday. **Djordje Petrović** made five saves on six shots as **Dylan Borrero** and **Gustavo Bou** each scored in the second half to lead New England to its sixth victory of the season.

With the win, New England extended its unbeaten streak to eight games (4-0-4), tying the fifth-longest stretch without a loss in club annals. Minnesota took the lead in the 37th minute after Emanuel Reynoso scored on a penalty kick.

The Revolution were energized to start the second half and tied the game in the 53rd minute with **Dylan Borrero's** first Revolution goal. The Colombian midfielder collected a pass from **Carles Gil** and scored with a right-footed shot from the outside of the box. In the 69th minute, **Gustavo Bou** broke the deadlock with a free kick goal, the game winner, into the top right corner. This marks the fourth consecutive match in which Bou has appeared on the scoresheet, with three goals and one assist in his last four starts.

Goalkeeper **Matt Turner** spent the match as an unused substitute on New England's bench in what marked the final match of his Revolution tenure. Turner is now set to travel to London to complete his transfer to English Premier League club Arsenal F.C.

POSTGAME NOTES

- The Revolution extended their unbeaten streak to eight consecutive matches with tonight's 2-1 victory over Minnesota United FC, posting a 4-0-4 record during that span. Eight games equals the fifth-longest unbeaten streak in club history.
- The win lifts the Revolution into sixth place in the Eastern Conference, as the Revs' 23 points are only four behind first-place New York City FC in the Eastern Conference.
- With tonight's victory, the Revolution improved their home record to 4-2-3 on the season. New England is 3-0-3 over its last six matches in Foxborough.
- Dylan Borrero** netted his first career MLS goal in tonight's match, converting on Carles Gil's assist in the 53rd minute to knot the score at 1-1. Borrero, who has appeared in five consecutive matches since arriving in New England in May, logged three shots, including one on target, while winning nine of 12 duels.
- Gustavo Bou** scored the game-winning goal, his third tally of the season via a free kick in the 69th minute. The Argentinian striker has now reached the scoresheet in four straight games, with three goals and one assist. Bou has netted 12 game-winning goals since arriving in MLS in July 2019, tying Steve Ralston for sixth most in Revolution history.
- Carles Gil** tallied his eighth assist of the season tonight, matching Orlando's Mauricio Pereyra for the league lead. The reigning MLS MVP surpassed 7,000 MLS minutes played, completing 58 of 69 pass attempts with two shots.
- Djordje Petrović** recorded a career-high five saves in his third consecutive start for the Revolution. Petrović has posted a 2-0-1 record in MLS since debuting last Sunday.
- Revolution II graduate **Jon Bell** posted his second consecutive 90-minute performance. Bell led the defense with a team-best four clearances and added one interception.
- Tonight's match saw the MLS debut of rookie defender **Ben Reveno**, who subbed in for Borrero in the 89th minute.

The New England Revolution (6-5-6; 24 pts.) extended their unbeaten streak to nine games with a 0-0 draw against Vancouver Whitecaps FC (6-8-3; 21 pts.) at BC Place on Sunday night. Revolution goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović** recorded six saves, a new personal best with New England, in his first clean-sheet performance and the team's third of the season.

Gustavo Bou started at forward and recorded eight shot attempts, tied for the most in a game by a Revolution player this season. **Dylan Borrero** played an 81-minute shift in his fourth straight start and nearly broke the deadlock with a right-footed shot in the 53rd minute that struck the crossbar. **Carles Gil** teed up Borrero for another dangerous opportunity moments later, one of Gil's game-high six chances created, but the shot was parried by Cody Cropper.

There were chances at both ends as the two teams finished even with 16 shots apiece. Petrović, whose record moves to 2-0-2 in MLS play, was assisted by a resolute defensive performance from a backline anchored by **Andrew Farrell** and **Jon Bell**, with **DeJuan Jones** and **A.J. DeLaGarza** starting on the outside. Bell and Farrell, starting together in central defense for the third straight game, combined for 11 clearances.

POSTGAME NOTES

- The Revolution extended their unbeaten streak to nine games (4-0-5) dating back to April 30. The streak is tied for the fourth longest in club history and marks the fourth such streak of nine or more games unbeaten since 2019.
- The Revolution extended their unbeaten streak in the Pacific Time Zone to 12 games dating back to June 18, 2016.
- The result marks the first scoreless draw for New England since August 4, 2021 (0-0 vs. Nashville SC).
- The Revolution improved its unbeaten streak against Vancouver to five games (3-0-2), with its last loss to the Whitecaps coming in 2015.
- Djordje Petrović** collected his first clean sheet for the Revolution with a six-save performance in his fourth MLS start, moving his record to 2-0-2 on the season. The six saves are an MLS-high for the Serbian.
- Gustavo Bou** registered a game-high eight shots on the night, one shy of his MLS career high.
- Dylan Borrero** made his fourth consecutive start and his sixth appearance since arriving in New England in May. He registered two shots, one shot on target, and one chance created.
- Carles Gil** added four shots to go along with a game-high six chances created, moving his league-leading total to 61 key passes on the season.
- Jon Bell** recorded his third consecutive start, completing 88 of his 96 passes and registering team highs in clearances (7), duels won (6), and aerials won (5).
- Wilfrid Kaptoum** recorded his sixth consecutive start in central midfield and the 30th appearance of his MLS regular season career.
- Damian Rivera** made his first MLS appearance since May 21, entering the game as a substitute in the 82nd minute.

MATCH #18 ^VS FC CINCINNATI: JULY 3, 2022

The New England Revolution (6-5-7; 25 pts.) played to a 2-2 draw with FC Cincinnati (7-7-4, 25 pts.) on Sunday night at Gillette Stadium behind goals from **Dylan Borrero** and **Gustavo Bou**.

Borrero, making his fifth consecutive start, put the Revolution ahead in the 30th minute as the Colombian fired a left-footed shot into the far corner off a feed from **Sebastian Lletget**. Lletget, who had missed the last two games with an injury, picked up his fourth assist of the season on the play.

Cincinnati equalized 11 minutes later on a **Henry Kessler** own goal. Kessler made his return to the starting lineup for the first time since May 15 at Atlanta, playing 45 minutes on the night before being withdrawn at halftime for **Jon Bell** in a planned substitution.

In the second half, **Emmanuel Boateng** entered for an injured Borrero and yet again made an impact off the bench. The Ghanaian midfielder provided the cross on **Gustavo Bou's** fourth goal of the season, a glancing header to the back post. **DeJuan Jones** was credited with a second assist on the play – his fourth helper of the campaign.

Cincinnati nearly equalized in the 69th minute but was denied by a double save from Revolution goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović**. The Serbian saved the first shot, which deflected off defender **Brandon Bye**, before stopping a point-blank effort on the rebound to preserve the lead. Cincinnati's persistence paid off as the visitors capitalized on Revolution giveaway in the 73rd minute, leading to the tying goal by Brenner.

POSTGAME NOTES

- The Revolution extended their unbeaten streak to 10 games (4-0-6) dating back to April 30. The streak is tied for the third longest in club history, only one game shy of the club record (11 games – 2019 and 2005).
- New England extended its home unbeaten streak to eight games across all competitions (4-0-4) dating back to April 16. This season, the Revolution are 6-2-4 overall and 4-2-4 in league play at Gillette Stadium.
- Dylan Borrero** scored the opening goal for New England – the second straight home game he has tallied for the Revolution. Borrero played 45 minutes and finished with three shots, two on target, and six duels won before being subbed off due to injury.
- Gustavo Bou** notched his 60th MLS start on Sunday, marking the occasion with his fourth goal of the season. For the second straight match, 'La Pantera' registered eight shots with three on target. Of his 33 goals, tonight's tally was only Bou's second headed goal with New England.
- Emmanuel Boateng** replaced the injured Dylan Borrero at halftime and tallied his seventh assist in a Revolution uniform, his third of the 2022 campaign. Boateng continues to lead MLS with 1.15 combined goals and assists per 90 minutes since signing with the Revolution in 2021.
- DeJuan Jones** was credited with a second assist on Bou's goal and now ranks second among MLS defenders in combined goals and assists since the start of 2020.
- Brandon Bye** returned to the starting lineup after missing last weekend's game due to injury, winning six of his seven aerial duels and added a team-high seven recoveries.
- Carles Gil** had team highs in chances created (3), duels won (8) and successful dribbles (4).

The New England Revolution (6-5-8; 25 pts.) saw their undefeated streak end at 10 games with a 4-2 loss at New York City FC (9-4-5, 32 pts.) on Saturday afternoon at Yankee Stadium. Revolution forward **Gustavo Bou** scored twice to give him six goals in the last seven games, while goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović** logged seven saves including first penalty stop in MLS. However, the Revolution could not overcome a tumultuous first half that featured three first-half penalty kicks awarded to the hosts and a red card ejection of **Andrew Farrell**.

The Revolution fell behind early as New York City's Talles Magno was fouled by Farrell to draw a penalty, which he converted in the 10th minute. New England quickly pulled level courtesy of Bou's fifth goal of the season in the 18th minute. **Carles Gil** launched the attack by playing **Sebastian Lletget** in behind the NYCFC defense. Lletget raced to the endline and sent a cutback pass to Bou, who one-timed a shot past Sean Johnson.

New York City was awarded another penalty kick in the 32nd minute, but Petrović kept the score level as the newcomer guessed correctly against Valentin Castellanos. The 22-year-old dove to his right for the stop, one of his MLS-career-high seven saves on the day. In the 41st minute, Farrell was ejected after another foul in the box. This time, Castellanos made no mistake from the spot and put NYCFC ahead 2-1 before halftime. After the intermission, New York City widened the gap to two goals with a tally from Gabriel Pereira in the 49th minute.

The Revolution created several late chances to cut into the deficit, including a shot from Lletget that struck the woodwork in the 60th minute. Bou pulled one back for the visitors with his second goal of the match in the 77th minute. Carles Gil was awarded with his ninth assist on the play – one behind the MLS lead. **DeJuan Jones**, who provided the primary helper, and Lletget are now tied for second on the Revolution with five assists each.

New England's comeback effort ultimately fell short as Castellanos scored NYCFC's fourth goal of the match in the 82nd minute to put the game out of reach. The loss is New England's first in MLS action since April 23.

The New England Revolution (6-7-7; 25 pts.) were defeated by the Philadelphia Union (10-2-9, 39 pts.), 2-1, at Subaru Park on Saturday night. **Gustavo Bou** delivered the goal for New England, his seventh tally in the last eight games, before the Revolution's lead was undone by goals from the hosts in the 75th and 79th minutes, the latter coming from the penalty spot.

After a tightly contested opening hour, Bou broke the deadlock in the 61st minute with a first-time finish, assisted by **Brandon Bye** and **Carles Gil**. Bou, who celebrates the three-year anniversary of his Revolution debut on Sunday, increased his total to 39 goals across the regular season and playoffs, third most in MLS during that span.

Gil's helper was his 11th of the season, moving the Revs' captain into sole possession of the MLS lead. The assist was also the 45th of Gil's regular season career, tying him for third most in club history. **Dylan Borrero** provided the early attacking threat for New England, recording three shots in his 63-minute shift, including an attempt from outside the box that rang off the crossbar in the 29th minute.

In central defense, **Jon Bell** stepped into the New England lineup for the sixth time this season and completed 94 percent of his passes. Bell, a second-year pro and Revolution II alum, logged his 15th MLS start in the match.

The New England Revolution (6-7-9; 27 pts.) battled Toronto FC (6-12-5; 23 pts.) to a 0-0 draw on Saturday night at Gillette Stadium in front of a season-high 29,097 fans. Goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović** tallied three saves, including a penalty kick denial against Toronto's Lorenzo Insigne in the 81st minute, to record his third clean sheet in MLS and the club's second in a row. Forward **Giacomo Vrioni** made his home debut, coming in as a substitute in the 55th minute, and recorded three shots.

The New England Revolution (7-7-9; 30 pts.) defeated Orlando City SC (8-10-6; 30 pts.) at Exploria Stadium, 3-0, on Saturday night. Midfielders **Matt Polster** and **Wilfrid Kaptoum** and defender **Henry Kessler** scored New England's goals in the 20th, 51st, and 75th minutes, respectively, as the Revolution recorded three consecutive shutouts for the first time since 2015.

Matt Polster tallied New England's opening goal in the 20th minute, taking a feed from **Tommy McNamara** who found the midfielder's streaking run up the middle of the field. Polster's first touch put him in behind Orlando's backline and his second placed was a low shot to Pedro Gallese's right for his second goal of the season and the seventh of his MLS career.

Orlando nearly pulled level in the 33rd minute when Pato struck a firm shot from inside the box, but **Djordje Petrović** made a quick reaction to record the save. Petrović recorded three stops as he picked up his fourth shutout in 10 MLS starts. He was aided by the defensive backline of **Brandon Bye**, **Andrew Farrell**, **DeJuan Jones**, and **Henry Kessler**, who have collectively played every minute of the current three-game shutout streak. The Revolution have now played 368 minutes without conceding a goal from open play.

In the 51st minute, **Wilfrid Kaptoum** doubled the Revs' lead with a first-time finish hit with pace into the near corner. McNamara picked up his second assist on the play, giving him three career games with multiple helpers. **Henry Kessler** then tacked on the third goal, his third in MLS, with a header in the 75th minute following **Carles Gil's** corner kick. Gil logged his 12th assist of the season, currently second most in MLS, as he moves up to third place on the Revolution's MLS assists chart.

United (6-14-4; 22 pts.), 1-0, on Saturday night at Gillette Stadium as the club recorded its fourth consecutive shutout to tie a club record. **Djordje Petrović** recorded three saves while midfielder **Carles Gil**, fresh off his appearance in Wednesday's MLS All-Star Game, scored his fifth goal of the season with assists from **Brandon Bye** and **Tommy McNamara**. Homegrown Player **Noel Buck**, a 17-year-old from Arlington, Mass., also made his MLS debut in the match.

New England got on the board early as McNamara sent a pass in behind the D.C. defense for Bye, who chased the ball to the endline and cut a pass back into the box for Carles Gil to meet with a left-footed finish. The reigning MLS MVP raised his total to 17 combined goals and assists, which ranks among the top 10 in MLS. Gil finished the night with a game-high nine shots, also a personal single-game high. With Bye's sixth assist, the right back ties a Revolution club record for assists by a defender in a single season. Bye made his 125th regular season appearance and eclipsed 10,000 career minutes played in the match.

The Boston-area native logged 27 minutes in his first MLS appearance, recording one shot and one chance created. The New England Revolution (8-7-10; 34 pts.) played Toronto FC (8-12-6; 30 pts.) to a 2-2 draw at BMO Field on Wednesday night behind goals from **Tommy McNamara** and **Justin Rennicks**. Now with only two losses in their last 17 games, the Revolution have climbed up to sixth place in the Eastern Conference following Wednesday's MLS action.

The Revolution carried a four-game shutout streak into tonight's match, which ended in the 31st minute when Toronto's Federico Bernardeschi scored the game's opening goal from the penalty spot. New England's shutout streak ended at 402 minutes, the second longest in club history. **Djordje Petrović**, who had been in net for the entirety of that run, finished the match with five saves.

New England responded emphatically before halftime as Rennicks' shot was saved and McNamara cleaned up the rebound, burying his second goal of the season from close range in the 37th minute. For McNamara, who has contributed to four goals in the last three games, it marked his 20th MLS regular season goal.

Shortly after the intermission, Rennicks, making his fourth straight start, put the visitors ahead with his second career MLS goal. The Homegrown forward collected **Carles Gil's** through ball and fired a right-footed shot past Alex Bono in the 48th minute. Gil recorded his 13th assist on the play, only one behind the MLS lead. The New England Revolution (8-9-10; 34 pts.) were defeated by the LA Galaxy (11-11-4; 37 pts.), 2-1, on Sunday night at Gillette Stadium. The Galaxy raced out to an early two-goal lead in the first 15 minutes, before midfielder **Carles Gil** scored his sixth goal of the season, assisted by **Tommy McNamara**, but the Revolution's comeback effort fell short.

The visitors struck first in the fourth minute as Daniel Aguirre collected an assist from Javier "Chicharito" Hernandez and finished past Revolution goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović** for the game's opening goal. New England got on the board early as Bell opened his 2022 account with a left-footed shot from the center of the box. The New England Revolution (9-10-11; 38 pts.) fell to the New York Red Bulls (14-9-8; 50 pts.), 2-1, on Saturday night at Red Bull Arena. Midfielder **Tommy McNamara** netted his fourth goal of the season in the 53rd minute, on assists from forward **Gustavo Bou** and defender **DeJuan Jones**. The Red Bulls knotted the score in the 58th minute, snapping a Revolution streak of 312 minutes without conceding a goal, before netting the game winner from the penalty spot in the 78th minute.

Houston midfielder Darwin Quintero netted the opening goal of the match in the 37th minute, giving the hosts a 1-0 lead at halftime. Forward **Gustavo Bou** drew a foul inside the box in the 59th minute, setting up midfielder **Carles Gil** for the equalizing goal from the penalty spot in the 63rd minute. Houston's Fafà Picault netted goals in the 76th and 85th minute to seal the victory for Houston.

The New England Revolution (9-12-11; 38 pts.) were defeated by CF Montreal (18-9-5; 59 pts.), 1-0, on Saturday night in front of a season-high 35,455 fans at Gillette Stadium. With two games remaining in the 2022 MLS regular season, the Revolution will return to action on Saturday, Oct. 1 at home against Atlanta United FC (1:30 p.m. ET – TUDN, Twitter, and 98.5 The Sports Hub).

In New England's penultimate home match of the season, forward **Justin Rennicks** returned to the starting lineup for his career-high 11th start of the campaign. Rennicks produced the hosts' first chance of the night in the 12th minute when he rolled a pass into the path of Matt Polster, whose low shot was saved by Montreal goalkeeper Sebastian Breza. **Carles Gil** and **Gustavo Bou** combined for another opportunity in the 21st minute, but Gil's effort sailed over the net.

Dylan Borrero and **Giacomo Vrioni** each notched substitute appearances in the second half as the two continue to work back to full fitness after lengthy injury absences. **Bruce Arena** inserted the 2022 newcomers as substitutes just past the hour mark of the match, marking their first appearances at home since July. Vrioni logged one shot, while Borrero registered one chance created.

Montreal scored the game's lone goal in the 72nd minute on a counter-attack, with Alistair Johnson slotting home a pass from Romell Quioto. Revolution goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović** made two saves, both in the second half. New England came close to equalizing in the 89th minute as Vrioni broke through the defense and sent a left-footed shot high of the frame.

The New England Revolution (10-12-11; 41 pts.) defeated Atlanta United FC (10-13-10; 40 pts.), 2-1, on Saturday afternoon at Gillette Stadium. Forward **Giacomo Vrioni** made his first MLS start and opened the scoring with his first MLS goal from the penalty spot in the 33rd minute. **Gustavo Bou** scored in the 85th minute to lead the Revolution to victory in the team's final home match of the regular season.

New England broke the deadlock in the 32nd minute as Vrioni drew a foul in the box to secure a penalty kick. The striker stepped up to the spot and rolled a left-footed shot past Atlanta goalkeeper Raúl Gudiño to open his MLS account. Atlanta's Josef Martinez scored a bicycle kick in 81st minute to tie the match, but New England retook the lead just four minutes later via **Gustavo Bou's** eighth tally of the season. Following a fast break, Carles Gil, making his 100th MLS appearance, sent a pass to Bou, who calmly sent a right-footed finish to the back post for the game winner in the 85th minute. Bou now leads the club's Golden Boot race by one goal, just ahead of Gil's seven goals.

In addition to Gil's 100th appearance, veterans **Andrew Farrell** and **Tommy McNamara** also reached milestones. Farrell, who was named the Revolution Defender of the Year for a record fifth time, became the first player in club history to reach 300 MLS starts. McNamara started for the 150th time in his MLS career, making his career-high 29th appearance of the season. Midfielder **Nacho Gil** and Vrioni both made their first starts of the season, with the latter making his home debut. Nacho, alongside older brother **Carles Gil**, became the first siblings to start in the same match in Revolution club history.

With the win, **Bruce Arena** is now the first MLS coach in MLS history to record 250 regular season wins. His record with New England improves to 48-26-34 in regular season play. The Revolution close the home slate with a 7-4-6 record at Gillette Stadium.

The New England Revolution (10-12-12; 42 pts.) concluded the 2022 MLS regular season with a 1-1 draw against Chicago Fire FC (10-15-9; 39 pts.) at SeatGeek Stadium on Sunday. Goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović** made four saves and midfielder **Dylan Borrero** secured his third goal of the season in a 25-minute substitute appearance.

The Revolution recorded four shots in the first half, two by **Giacomo Vrioni**, who narrowly missed wide on an opportunity just 52 seconds into the contest. Vrioni was replaced by Borrero in the 65th minute, who broke the deadlock in the 88th minute to put the Revolution ahead. The 20-year-old Colombian winger collected a pass from **Brandon Bye** and set a right-footed curler into the left-side panel for his third tally of the season. Bye's assist was his seventh of the year, level with **DeJuan Jones** for second on the team and tied for fourth among all MLS defenders in 2022. Despite the late goal, Chicago's Alex Monis evened the score in the 92nd minute to seal the draw.

New England goalkeeper Djordje Petrović finished the contest with four saves, bringing his season total to 85 with a save percentage of 75.7, according to Opta. That is the second-best rate in MLS this season (min. 30 saves) and the highest for a Revolution goalkeeper since Matt Reis in 2009 (min. 40 saves). Petrović joins Reis (2006 and 2009) and Matt Turner (2021) as the only Revolution goalkeepers to finish a season with a save percentage of 75.0 or better.

Bruce Arena made two changes to today's Starting XI from last Saturday's 2-1 win over Atlanta United FC, with Jones and midfielder **Wilfrid Kaptoum** returning to the lineup. Jones, who marked his 100th MLS regular season appearance, saw his first action since Sept. 13. The draw extends New England's unbeaten streak against Chicago to eight games, with three wins and five draws in that span. New England concludes the 2022 MLS regular season in 10th place in the Eastern Conference.

- Dylan Borrero** tallied his third goal in his 12th appearance for New England. In his 25-minute shift, Borrero tied for the team lead with three shots and won three duels.

The New England Revolution defeated Pumas UNAM, 3-0, in the first leg of the 2022 Scotiabank Concacaf Champions League Quarterfinals on Wednesday night at Gillette Stadium. **Sebastian Lletget** opened the scoring in the first half and **Adam Buksa** notched a pair of second-half goals to secure the three-goal advantage heading into next Wednesday's second leg match in Mexico City.

Lletget opened the scoring in the 19th minute, his second goal in three games with New England, to give the Revolution an early lead. **Carles Gil** notched the assist, his third consecutive game on the scoresheet to open 2022, as New England improved to 23-0-8 across all competitions when Gil records an assist. Buksa, who recorded a team-high eight shots with four on target, extended New England's lead in the 72nd minute, taking advantage of a deflection from Alfredo Talavera's save on the forward's initial shot. On the third goal, the Polish striker combined with Gil, who recorded eight chances created on the night, to tack on the third goal for New England in second-half stoppage time.

Earl Edwards Jr., making his third consecutive start to begin the season for New England, recorded three saves to pick up his second straight clean sheet. Edwards Jr. was aided by New England's center back pairing of **Andrew Farrell** and **Omar Gonzalez**. The New England Revolution defeated FC Cincinnati, 5-1, on Wednesday night in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup Round of 32. Revolution midfielder and captain **Carles Gil** tallied the first U.S. Open Cup hat trick in club history while **Adam Buksa** notched a brace – his fifth consecutive game with a goal across all competitions. Goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović** made his first team debut, registering one save on two shots faced.

FC Cincinnati opened the scoring in the 10th minute with a goal from Álvaro Barreal from the center of the box. New England answered with multiple chances coming from Buksa and **Arnór Traustason**, resulting directly in the latter drawing a penalty in the 33rd minute. Carles Gil converted from the penalty spot to tie the game, his 10th penalty goal for New England in 12 attempts across all competitions. The Revolution captain quickly gave the hosts the lead, scoring off a deflected shot from outside the box in the 37th minute, assisted by **Tommy McNamara**.

The Revs scored three times in the opening 12 minutes of the second half to put the game out of reach. Buksa extended his scoring streak to five games, netting a header from the center of the box into the top right corner. Gil completed the hat trick in the 53rd minute with another left-footed shot to secure the first hat trick of his Revolution career and the first for New England since 2017. **Brandon Bye** tallied the assist on both of those goals, marking the second and third helpers in his U.S. Open Cup career. Buksa secured a brace in the 57th minute as he sailed a curling shot to the top-left corner from the outside of the box, with Gil earning the assist. New England improved to 6-0-1 in all competitions when Gil records both a goal and an assist in the same match.

The New England Revolution fell to New York City FC, 0-1, after extra time at Belson Stadium on the campus of St. John's University in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup Round of 16 on Wednesday night. Despite a six-save performance from Revolution goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović** to keep the game scoreless through 90 minutes, NYCFC's Santiago Rodriguez broke through for the game's lone goal in the 94th minute.

Bruce Arena deployed a rotated lineup for the Round of 16 contest, featuring 10 changes from New England's latest MLS win on May 21. Petrović recorded his second start of the Open Cup campaign and made an early impact with a stunning double save in the 12th minute, as the Serbian denied a pair of point-blank attempts to keep the match scoreless. Petrović logged another close-range stop in the 59th minute and finished the night with six saves.

Esmir Bajraktarević, announced as the club's latest Homegrown Player signing on Monday, made his first team debut with a start in the midfield. The 17-year-old recorded a shot on target in the 44th minute when he directed a cross from **Justin Rennicks** on frame, but the attempt was saved. Revolution II defender **Ben Reveno** also made his first team debut, earning the start at center back.

Bajraktarević was one of six Revolution players who made their U.S. Open Cup debuts on Saturday, along with Reveno, **Jon Bell**, **Gustavo Bou**, **Wilfrid Kaptoun**, and recent U-22 Initiative signing **Dylan Borrero**. This marked Borrero's second appearance with New England since arriving at the club earlier in May, while Bou played in a second straight game since returning from injury and nearly tied the game in the 119th minute with a headed shot on frame.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Six Revolution players made their U.S. Open Cup debuts: **Esmir Bajraktarević**, **Jon Bell**, **Dylan Borrero**, **Gustavo Bou**, **Wilfrid Kaptoun**, and **Ben Reveno** all made their U.S. Open Cup debuts tonight. For Bajraktarević and Reveno, it also marked their Revolution first team debuts.
- Bajraktarević, announced as the club's ninth Homegrown Player signing on Monday, made his first team debut. The 17-year-old played 67 minutes and recorded one shot on target.
- Three Homegrown Players featured in the starting lineup for New England: **Justin Rennicks**, **Damian Rivera**, and **Bajraktarević**. Rivera and Esmir each recorded one shot on target.
- Midfielder **Dylan Borrero** logged his second New England appearance, coming on in the 67th minute for Emmanuel Boateng. Borrero, 20, was acquired in April using the MLS U-22 Initiative from Brazilian Serie A champions Atlético Mineiro.
- New England rotated its starting lineup from the Round of 16 match, as **Bruce Arena** made eight changes from the last U.S. Open Cup match vs. FC Cincinnati on May 11. The three returning starters were **Djordje Petrović**, **Maciel**, and **Rivera**.
- New England's all-time record in the U.S. Open Cup moves to 22-18-5.
