TEAM MVP & PLAYERS' PLAYER OF THE YEAR

CARLES GIL



Carles Gil earns Revolution Team MVP and Players' Player of the Year honors for the third time in his five seasons with New England (2019 and 2021). The Revolution captain won the club's Golden Boot with a career-high 11 goals scored, along with 15 assists, third most in MLS. Gil's seven game-winning assists also paced the league. This year, Gil became the first player in Revolution history to record multiple 10-goal and 10-assist seasons. He is now only the second Revolution player to record at least 24 goal contributions in multiple seasons, joining Taylor Twellman. His 26 goal involvements were tied for second most in a season by a New England player, and the most for the club since 2014.

The Revolution captain's 2023 season also featured his third MLS All-Star selection, to go along with his numerous previous league honors including the 2021 Landon Donovan MLS MVP award, two MLS Best XI selections (2019 & 2021), 2019 MLS Newcomer of the Year, 2021 MLS Comeback Player of the Year. After leading MLS in chances created the last two seasons, Gil again finished among the league's top three in key passes. The Spaniard's stellar performances landed him on the MLS Team of the Matchday 10 times, including one Player of the Matchday selection following a two-goal performance on May 31 at Atlanta United FC. Gil's dynamic playmaking catalyzed a New England attack that ranked fourth in MLS with 58 goals scored, as he leads New England back to the postseason for the fourth time in his five seasons with the club.

DEFENDER OF THE YEAR

DAVE ROMNEY



Dave Romney was voted the Revolution Defender of the Year by local media in his first season with New England. Acquired via trade from Nashville SC during the offseason, Romney was the only MLS outfield player to play every minute of the 2023 regular season, and one of three MLS players overall to achieve the feat. The 30-year-old center back is only the second player to do so for the Revolution over a 34-game season, joining Jose Goncalves (2013). Romney ranked among the MLS leaders in clearances, blocked shots, and aerial duels. Romney now embarks on his fifth consecutive MLS Cup Playoffs campaign, with three different clubs. Since the start of 2020, he leads all MLS outfield players in games started and minutes played, while ranking tied for second with 37 clean sheets during that four-year span.

HUMANITARIAN OF THE YEAR

ANDREW FARRELL



Andrew Farrell has been honored as the club's Humanitarian of the Year for the second time in his career (2018). A fixture on the Revolution for 11 seasons, Farrell's impact off the field has been equally significant through his work with Special Olympics Massachusetts and the Revolution Unified Team, the Animal Rescue League of Boston, the club's partners for Childhood Cancer Awareness Month, and so much more. This season, Farrell has appeared in 22 matches, starting on 20 occasions, with New England posting a 9-5-8 record in those matches. New England's all-time leader in games played on the pitch, Farrell owns over 350 appearances across all competitions in a Revolution shirt, including 326 regular season games and 13 additional appearances, all starts, over six previous postseason runs.

UNITEDHEALTHCARE ACADEMY PLAYER OF THE YEAR

OLGER ESCOBAR



Olger Escobar has been named the New England Revolution's UnitedHealthcare Revolution Academy Player of the Year for the 2022-23 MLS NEXT season. Escobar, 17, has excelled in New England's system since joining the Academy in 2018. Following a sensational season where the Malden native tallied 15 goals in 17 starts with the U-17s, Escobar was named the U-17 MLS NEXT MVP, becoming the first New England player to earn the national honor. The forward also became the club's third MLS NEXT All-Star in 2023. The Massachusetts product featured with New England's Under-19 Academy squad earlier this summer, helping the side claim their second consecutive MLS NEXT Cup title in Frisco, Texas. He went on to sign with New England Revolution II on July 26 after making his professional debut with the team on April 21 and recorded one assist across 16 appearances including the postseason.

CARLES GIL A MODEL OF OFFENSIVE CONSISTENCY

Carles Gil has been a model of consistency since arriving in New England in 2019. Whether its scoring or assisting goals, Gil has produced massive offensive numbers throughout his MLS career. BOBBY WOOD ENJOYS SUCCESSFUL COMEBACK CAMPAIGN

Revolution forward **Bobby Wood** arrived in the offseason to provide depth and experience to the New England striker corps. Coming off a 2022 season that ended prematurely for the veteran due to a hip injury, Wood faced uncertainty as he entered 2023. New England selected Wood in the MLS Re-Entry Draft in December and the former U.S. international provided an immediate impact up top.

Wood earned the starting role throughout the first half of the season, and at one point ranked among the league leaders in goal contributions per 90 minutes. Wood wound up finishing tied for sixth among MLS forwards with his 0.30 assists per 90 minutes. Additionally, Wood was one of just 16 players in MLS this season to have three or more games with a goal and an assist. REVS' HOMEGROWNS FINDING PROFESSIONAL SUCCESS

New England signed 18-year-old forward **Malcolm Fry** to a first-team contract as a Homegrown Player beginning in 2024 through the 2026 season, with an additional one-year club option for 2027. The Groton, Mass. native and Revolution Academy graduate is the 13th Homegrown Player signing to join the Revolution's MLS roster, and the eighth player to ascend from the Revolution II roster to the first team. Fry will join **Peyton Miller**, 15, and **Tiago Suarez**, 18, as the three teenagers set to join the Revolution squad next season as Homegrown Players.

Since 2021, four of New England's Homegrown Players have made their MLS debut at age 18 or younger. The most recent was **Jack Panayotou**, who at 18 years and 293 days old was the sixth-youngest Revolution Homegrown Player to make his debut.

EIGHT REVOLUTION PLAYERS MAKE POSTSEASON DEBUTS

New England has qualified for the playoffs in four of the last five seasons. While the 2023 roster included several MLS veterans, there were seven players who saw their first action in the MLS Cup Playoffs on Oct. 28 at Philadelphia. **Noel Buck**, **Tomás Chancalay**, **Nacho Gil**, **Jacob Jackson**, **Christian Makoun**, **Ryan Spaulding**, and **Giacomo Vrioni** all made their postseason debut in Game 1 of the Round One Best-of-3 series. Additionally, goalkeeper **Earl Edwards Jr.** earned the starting nod in Game 2 on Nov. 8 for his first career postseason appearance.

In his first playoff match, Vrioni tallied an assist on New England's lone goal of the match. The forward entered the match as a halftime substitute, logging a 45-minute shift. Fellow debutants Christian Makoun and Nacho Gil also came off the bench. In the starting lineup, 18-year-old Noel Buck was a standout performer, completing all 44 of his passes while also recording team highs in fouls won (3) and chances created (2). Buck was one of three Revolution II graduates to earn a spot in the Starting XI alongside Ryan Spaulding and Jacob Jackson. Argentine forward Tomás Chancalay also started and played 75 minutes, matching Buck with a pair of chances created while registering four shots.



HOME, SWEET HOME: REVS FORMIDABLE IN FOXBOROUGH

This season, New England became the 10th team in MLS history to go undefeated over its first 15 home matches of a season, marking the longest such run to begin a season in club annals. At the end of the season, the club's .824 winning percentage at home was tied for best in the league.

The Revolution matched the club record for most home wins in a single season (12), set in 2017 and matched in 2021. With a victory over Philadelphia on Decision Day, New England set a new club record for most home points earned in a season (40), surpassing the previous mark of 39, becoming only the 17th team in league history to reach that total in a 34-game season.



The New England Revolution (1-0-0, 3 pts.) opened the 2023 Major League Soccer season with a 1-0 win on the road against Charlotte FC (0-1-0, 0 pts.) on Saturday night. **Henry Kessler** notched the game winner in the 89th minute to secure New England's first season-opening victory since 2013. Goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović**, a finalist for the 2022 Allstate MLS Goalkeeper of the Year and 2022 MLS Newcomer of the Year awards, made four saves en route to his eighth career MLS clean sheet in just 22 games with the Revolution.

Dave Romney and **Bobby Wood**, two of New England's offseason acquisitions, made their Revolution debuts in the match. Romney, acquired in a January trade with Nashville SC, started and played the full 90 minutes. Wood, a former United States international selected by New England in the 2022 MLS Re-Entry Draft, entered the match in the 63rd minute replacing **Giacomo Vriani**. Vriani opened his second MLS campaign with the start, as did Colombian winger **Dylan Borrero**, who logged a team-high three shots.

Kessler broke the deadlock in the 89th minute, making a run down the right flank to slot home his fourth-career goal with a right-footed shot. Kessler had a golden chance to tally in the 61st minute, heading a cross from **Noel Buck** off the post. Charlotte also struck the woodwork, with Kerwin Vargas coming inches from equalizing at the death for the hosts.

Buck and **Damian Rivera**, 17 and 20 respectively, each started Saturday's contest, marking the first time two Homegrown Players started in the season opener since 2020 (Diego Fagundes & Scott Caldwell).

POSTGAME NOTES

- New England defeated Charlotte FC 1-0, marking the third straight year the Revolution have secured at least a point in their season opener. The victory was New England's first in a season opener since 2013 (1-0 at Chicago).
- Henry Kessler** tallied the opening goal of the season for New England – his fourth career goal – while notching a team-high eight clearances.
- Djordje Petrović** recorded his eighth clean sheet in 22 matches with the Revolution, moving him into a tie with Walter Zenga for seventh-most shutouts in club history. The Serbian finished the evening with four saves.

The New England Revolution (2-0-0, 6 pts.) defeated Houston Dynamo FC (0-2-0, 0 pts.), 3-0, on Saturday night in the club's 2023 home opener at Gillette Stadium. Midfielder **Dylan Borrero**, forward **Bobby Wood**, and defender **Brandon Bye** each registered their first goal-and-assist performances in MLS. Midfielders **Carles Gil** and **Latif Blessing**, who made his Revolution debut, and defender **DeJuan Jones** each tallied an assist. With tonight's victory, New England opens the season with consecutive wins for the first time in club history, and begins a league campaign with back-to-back shutouts for the first time since 2006.

Borrero, who tallied two shots on target, opened the scoring with a right-footed strike on assists from Bye and Wood in the 42nd minute, giving New England a 1-0 lead at halftime. Wood added on to the scoring with his first goal in a Revolution uniform in the 53rd minute, knocking home a left-footed shot on assists from Jones and Gil. Bye capped the scoring in the 65th minute, converting on assists from Blessing and Borrero with a right-footed shot deflected into the bottom-right corner of the net.

On the defensive end, goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović** tallied five saves en route to his ninth clean sheet in just 23 MLS appearances since joining the Revolution midway through the 2022 season. The 23-year-old has logged points in nine of his 11 games played in Foxborough with a 5-2-4 record at Gillette Stadium. Newcomer **Dave Romney** suited up for his second start in central defense, alongside **Henry Kessler**, and recorded a team-high nine clearances.

The New England Revolution (3-1-0, 9 pts.) defeated Nashville SC (2-1-1, 7 pts.), 1-0, on Saturday night at Gillette Stadium. **Gustavo Bou** scored his first goal of the season to secure the victory, assisted by **DeJuan Jones**, as **Djordje Petrović** recorded three saves to give New England its third win and third shutout through the first four games of the 2023 season.

New England's three shutouts, tied for the most in MLS through Matchday 4, are the team's most after four games in any season. Nine points marks the club's second-best start through four matches. With the shutout, Petrović becomes the fifth MLS goalkeeper to record 10 clean sheets through his first 25 league starts, according to the Elias Sports Bureau.

Bou broke the stalemate in the 52nd minute, collecting a through ball from Jones and blasting a left-footed shot inside the near post. The goal was the first conceded by Nashville SC this season, snapping their shutout streak at 322 minutes. Bou, the Revolution's leading scorer in 2022 and the fifth New England player to find the back of the net this season, moved into seventh place on the club's all-time scoring list with his 38th regular-season goal. Jones notched his 15th career MLS assist on the winning goal, his second helper in as many home games. Since the start of 2020, Jones ranks third among MLS defenders with 18 combined goals and assists.

POSTGAME NOTES

- The Revolution have recorded three shutouts through the first four games of a season for the first time in club history. New England's three clean sheets are tied for the most in MLS this season.
- The victory gives New England nine points through four games, marking the second-best start to a season in club history (10 points in 2005).
- The Revolution improve to 2-0-0 at home on the young season. The team's 21 home wins since the start of 2021 are fourth most in MLS.
- The Revolution defeated Nashville SC for the first time in the series history (1-1-3). The Revolution have blanked Nashville in all three of their visits to New England (1 win, 2 scoreless draws).

- **Gustavo Bou** opened his goal-scoring account for the 2023 season – the first goal conceded by Nashville SC this season in 322 minutes of play. Bou now has 38 regular season goals for New England, seventh most in team annals.
- **Dave Romney** made his 175th career MLS appearance – lining up against his former club for the first time. Romney has recorded shutouts in seven of his last 13 starts between New England and Nashville.

The New England Revolution (4-1-0, 12 pts.) came from behind to defeat D.C. United (1-3-1; 4 pts.), 2-1, on Saturday night at Audi Field to improve to four wins in five games to open the 2023 MLS regular season. Revolution captain **Carles Gil** recorded his 50th MLS assist on **Gustavo Bou**'s equalizer in the second half, before Homegrown Player **Noel Buck** tallied the game-winning goal in the 88th minute to secure the three points and lift New England into first place in the Eastern Conference through Matchday 5.

New England deployed a starting lineup that featured three players 18-years-old or younger with Homegrown Players **Noel Buck** (17), **Esmir Bajraktarevic** (18), and **Jack Panayotou** (18) all featuring in the Starting XI. Buck, making his fifth consecutive start to begin the season, tallied his second MLS goal with the game-winning tally in the 88th minute as his deflected shot broke the 1-1 tie. Panayotou played 77 minutes in his MLS debut, while Bajraktarevic made his season debut in his second MLS start and fourth career appearance.

Despite the Revolution outshooting the hosts 11-5 in the first half, D.C. United got on the board first with a goal from Christian Benteke moments before halftime. The Revolution rebounded quickly as Gil entered the match in the 62nd minute and made one of his first touches count. The captain sent a cross to Bou at the back post, who corralled the long pass off his chest to set himself up for a right-footed shot that pulled the Revolution level at 1-1 in the 63rd minute.

With his 50th assist, Gil becomes the third Revolution player to reach the half-century mark and pulls even with Lee Nguyen for second-most assists in club history. With the goal, Bou now has 39 regular season tallies with New England and two on the season after three starts.

POSTGAME NOTES

- New England improves to 4-1-0 (12 pts.) and is currently in first place in the Eastern Conference after five matches.
- New England has won eight of the last nine meetings with D.C. and are now level in the all-time series (35-35-15) with the fellow MLS original club.
- Gustavo Bou** scored his second goal of the season in his third start, giving him 39 regular season goals with the Revolution. His 41 total goals including playoffs are fourth most in MLS since he entered the league in 2019.
- Carles Gil** recorded his 50th MLS regular season assist within a minute of entering the match as a substitute in the second half. Gil is the third player in club history to reach 50 assists as he pulls level with Lee Nguyen for second most in club history.

- Panayotou**, an 18-year-old Homegrown Player from Cambridge, Mass., played 77 minutes in his MLS debut and first start. Panayotou played one semester of college soccer in the nation's capital at Georgetown University.
- Bajraktarevic** made his fourth MLS appearance, his first of 2023, and second career MLS start.

Notching a team-high five shots, **Carles Gil** tallied his first goal of the season as **Djordje Petrović** made two saves to secure the point for the Revolution.

Scoreless through the first half, New England almost broke through in the 63rd minute as midfielder **Dylan Borrero** sent in a cross that deflected off of New York City's Mitja Ilenič into the back of the net. The goal was disallowed for offside after a check by the Video Assistant Referee. The Revolution broke the deadlock seven minutes later, as **Bobby Wood** passed to Carles Gil who sent a low, left-footed shot from outside the box into the bottom-right corner. The New England Revolution (5-1-1; 16 pts.) defeated CF Montreal (1-5-0; 3 pts.), 4-0, at Gillette Stadium on Saturday night. **Dylan Borrero**, **Carles Gil**, **Bobby Wood**, and **Giacomo Vrioni** all tallied goals for New England as **Djordje Petrović** made three saves and recorded an assist to help secure the club's fourth clean sheet of the season through seven games.

Dylan Borrero opened the scoring in the 21st minute with a curling right-footed shot into the top-right corner, with **Gustavo Bou** and **Carles Gil** earning the assists. In nine games against Montreal, Bou has amassed six goals and three assists. For Gil, it was his 51st regular season assist for New England, passing Lee Nguyen for second place on the club's all-time list.

Carles Gil registered a secondary assist on Borrero's goal before converting a penalty in first-half stoppage time, marking his first goal-and-assist performance since May 1, 2021. Gil's assist also gives him 51 in MLS play, passing Lee Nguyen (50) for second in club history. The helper marks his 16th game-winning assist, tying Chris Tierney for second place on the club's all-time list. Gil has reached the scoresheet in three consecutive games for the eighth time in his MLS career.

Bobby Wood notched his second goal of the season 50th minute, giving him two goals and two assists in seven games. Wood was replaced by **Giacomo Vrioni** in the 62nd minute, who capped off the scoring with an individual effort to create a long-distance shot, which he tucked inside the post past an outstretched Jonathan Sirois. Goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović**, who now has the fourth most shutouts in team annals, recorded the assist on Vrioni's goal. It was the first assist by a Revolution goalkeeper since Matt Turner on Sept. 22, 2021 at Chicago Fire FC.

The New England Revolution (5-1-2; 17 pts.) played to a 1-1 draw against the Columbus Crew (4-2-2; 14 pts.) on Saturday night at Lower.com Field. Goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović** made six saves as New England played the final 25 minutes with 10 men after **Dylan Borrero** was shown a second yellow card in the second half.

After a strong first-half performance that saw the New England outshoot Columbus 10-5, the Revolution broke the deadlock in the 58th minute via an own goal after a Borrero cross deflected off Columbus defender Milos Degenek and into the net. Borrero was then sent off in the 65th minute after receiving a second yellow card and will miss next Saturday's match against Sporting Kansas City. Columbus equalized at the death deep into second-half stoppage time, as Sean Zawadzki headed home a cross from Lucas Zelarayán.

The Revolution backline held strong for much of the night, with center backs **Dave Romney** and **Andrew Farrell** starting together for the first time this season. Farrell collected his first start of the season and his 307th regular season appearance - the fourth-most games played entirely for one club in MLS history. Romney collected a season-high 11 clearances.

New England made three changes to the starting lineup from last week, with Farrell, **Esmir Bajraktarević**, and **Giacomo Vrioni** all slotting in on Saturday. The New England Revolution (6-1-3; 21 pts.) played FC Cincinnati (6-1-3; 21 pts.) to a 1-1 draw on Saturday night in front of 30,080 at Gillette Stadium to extend their unbeaten run to seven games in MLS regular season play. **Emmanuel Boateng** tallied his first goal of the season, assisted by **Brandon Bye**, while goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović** made four saves, including his fifth career penalty kick save in the 30th minute to help New England remain undefeated at home.

Petrović denied Luciano Acosta from the penalty spot after Revolution forward **Justin Rennicks** was called for handling in the penalty area. With the stop, Petrović became the fastest player in MLS history to record five penalty saves, doing so in his 31st MLS match and on his 14th attempt faced. Moments later, Cincinnati opened the scoring when Yerson Mosquera headed in an ensuing corner.

New England equalized in first-half stoppage time as Bye drove a cross through the six-yard box to Boateng, who tapped home his first goal of the season. Boateng led the Revolution with four shots and two on target in the match across his 90 minutes of action. The assist was Bye's 20th helper in all competitions for the Revolution.

Two Homegrown Players started the match, as **Justin Rennicks** led the line with **Noel Buck** in the midfield. Fellow Revolution Academy product **Esmir Bajraktarević** also entered the match in the 22nd minute to replace **Dylan Borrero**, who left the match with a left knee injury.

With tonight's result, the Revolution remain unbeaten against Eastern Conference opponents, now 4-0-3 on the 2023 season, and also remain undefeated at home through six games for the fourth time in club history, posting a 4-0-2 record in regular season play at Gillette Stadium.

POSTGAME NOTES

- New England has yet to concede a goal from open play in six league games at home. This is the fourth time New England has gone unbeaten in its first six home games of a season, last achieved in 2017.

The New England Revolution (7-1-3; 24 pts.) defeated Toronto FC (2-3-6, 12 pts.), 2-0, at BMO Field on Saturday night to maintain their first-place position in the Supporters' Shield and Eastern Conference standings. New England improves to 3-1-1 on the road and is now undefeated in eight consecutive games.

Forward **Bobby Wood** opened the scoring in the 19th minute with a breakaway goal following a Toronto turnover, giving the visitors an early lead. Defender **DeJuan Jones** doubled the advantage in the 62nd minute with his first goal of the season, finishing a rebound set up by **Carles Gil**'s one-timed shot on a cross from **Emmanuel Boateng**. Gil paced the Revolution with three chances created. Goalkeeper Djordje Petrović made five saves to guide New England to its fifth clean sheet of the campaign.

Wood, who collected his 40th MLS appearance tonight, netted his third tally of the season, tied for the team lead. Boateng made his third consecutive start, a first for the midfielder in a Revolution uniform. Boateng featured alongside Homegrown Players **Noel Buck** and **Esmir Bajraktarevic**, who logged their ninth and fourth starts of the season, respectively. Midfielder **Latif Blessing** returned to action to help close out the victory as a substitute.

New England's 24 points (2.18 ppg) through 11 games are the second most in club history at this stage of a season (2005 - 25 pts.). With the shutout, New England has conceded nine-or-fewer goals in its first 11 games for the third time. The victory also marks the Revolution's 11th consecutive triumph when leading at halftime.

The New England Revolution (7-3-5; 26 pts.) fought back from a late deficit to draw Atlanta United FC (6-4-6, 24 pts.), 3-3, at Mercedes-Benz Stadium on Wednesday night. Revolution captain **Carles Gil** opened the scoring with the second-fastest goal in club history 21 seconds into the match, before forward **Bobby Wood** doubled the lead in the 37th minute. Atlanta scored three goals in the second half before Gil tallied again in second-half stoppage time to secure the point away from home.

Gil put the Revolution on the front foot when he scored the quickest goal in MLS this season, capitalizing on an Atlanta turnover deep in its own defensive half. New England then doubled its advantage in the 37th minute as Wood scored his fifth goal of the year, and his second in as many games. **Emmanuel Boateng**, making his seventh consecutive start, delivered a pinpoint cross from the left side on the goal for his third helper of the campaign. **DeJuan Jones** also earned a secondary assist on the play.

Atlanta put New England under pressure for long stretches of play and finally broke through for a goal in 56th minute through Giorgos Giakoumakis. The hosts then equalized in the 74th minute as Thiago Almada's shot took a deflection on its way into the net. Atlanta pulled ahead on a Miguel Berry strike from distance in the 87th minute. With the Revolution on the verge of defeat, Gil brought New England level with his second goal of the game three minutes into added time. The Spaniard's second career MLS brace gives him five tallies on the year, tied with Wood for the team lead, and 26 for his MLS career.

POSTGAME NOTES

- New England extended its unbeaten streak against Atlanta to five games (3-0-2) with Wednesday's 3-3 draw.
- New England are unbeaten in their last 13 regular season games when leading at the half, and its last 11 matches when scoring the first goal.

The New England Revolution (7-3-6; 27 pts.) duelled New York City FC (4-7-5; 17 pts.) to a 0-0 draw at Yankee Stadium on Saturday afternoon. Revolution goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović** made five saves as the Revolution's sixth clean sheet of the season, and third consecutive draw, brings their away record to a 3-3-3.

Bobby Wood, starting for the seventh consecutive match, looked to score the opening goal just after the 20-minute mark when he snuck in behind the NYCFC defense, but the play was ruled offside. Moments later, Wood had another chance to break the deadlock as he dribbled into the area, but his effort was saved.

Petrović kept the match scoreless at the half with a spectacular diving save to deny Gabriel Pereira in the 23rd minute, his first of several crucial stops on the night. NYC's Richie Ledezma nearly broke the deadlock in the 34th minute with a shot from 20 yards away that rattled the woodwork. The New England Revolution (8-3-6; 30 pts.) defeated Inter Miami CF (5-12-0, 15 pts.), 3-1, on Saturday night at Gillette Stadium with 36,235 fans in attendance. Revolution captain **Carles Gil** tallied a goal and two assists, scoring the opening goal from the penalty spot before providing the service on goals by **Matt Polster** and **Bobby Wood**.

Carles Gil opened the scoring in the 27th minute after Polster drew a foul just inside the 18-yard box. Gil converted his 11th MLS penalty kick in 13 attempts. With his goal and two assists, Gil is now the fifth Revolution player to reach 80 career goal contributions with the club. The Revolution captain has now found the scoresheet in six of seven games played at Gillette Stadium this season and raised his total to four goals and three assists in his last six appearances. Polster tallied seven minutes later, heading in a cross from Gil's corner kick in the 34th minute to double New England's lead. Wood added to the scoring in the 51st minute, receiving a long through ball from Gil and slotting home a finish past Inter Miami goalkeeper Drake Callender. The New England Revolution (9-3-6; 33 pts.) defeated Orlando City SC (7-4-6, 26 pts.), 3-1, on Saturday night at Gillette Stadium. **Emmanuel Boateng**, **Gustavo Bou**, and **Carles Gil** all found the scoresheet while **Earl Edwards Jr.** made three saves in his first start of the season. With the victory, New England extends its home unbeaten streak to nine games (6-0-3), matching the club's longest streak without a home loss to open a season.

Forwards **Bobby Wood** and **Giacomo Vriani** provided the scoring while goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović** made a career-high nine saves for New England. The Revolution improved to 7-0-3 at home this season, setting a new mark for the club's longest streak without a loss at home to begin a season.

Toronto opened the scoring in the 11th minute when Deandre Kerr nodded home a cross past a diving Petrović. The New England Revolution (10-3-7; 37 pts.) played FC Cincinnati (13-2-5, 44 pts.) to a 2-2 draw on Saturday night at TQL Stadium. New England secured a point to extend the unbeaten streak to seven matches, while becoming the first visiting team to register a point at TQL Stadium this season. Forward **Gustavo Bou** played a role in both of New England's goals tonight, netting his fourth tally of the season after forcing an FC Cincinnati own goal.

After FC Cincinnati netted the opening goal via Dominique Badji's tally in the 11th minute, New England scored twice within a 10-minute window to claim the lead. Bou's long-distance shot in the 15th minute was saved by FC Cincinnati goalkeeper Roman Celentano, but the rebound deflected off of Badji into the net for the game-tying goal. Nine minutes later, Bou scored his fourth goal of the season on a left-footed shot from the center of the box to give New England a 2-1 advantage. Bou played 86 minutes in tonight's match and led the Revolution's attack with a team-high three shots, two on target.

Midfielder **Carles Gil**, who logged three chances created, eclipsed the 10,000 MLS minutes played mark tonight. However, a yellow card for Gil will see the midfielder suspended for next Saturday's match at the New York Red Bulls. In the backline, right back **Brandon Bye** suited up for his 150th MLS appearance, while left back **Ryan Spaulding** made his second consecutive start since returning to the club from loan. Bye registered a game-high five clearances. Goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović**, a 2023 MLS All-Star selection, made five saves. Tonight's match marked the fourth time in the last eight years that the top two teams in MLS played against one another 19 or more games into a season. New England's away record shifts to 3-3-4 following tonight's draw.

After going down to 10 men following a **Latif Blessing** red card, **Brandon Bye** tallied his second goal of the season, but a late winner by the hosts snapped the Revolution's seven-game unbeaten streak. **Andrew Farrell** appeared to equalize for the visitors in second-half stoppage time, but the goal was disallowed for offside.

Frankie Amaya opened the scoring for New York in the 58th minute. Two minutes later, Blessing saw his night end early after being issued a red card. Down a man and a goal, Bye moved into the attack on a corner kick and leveled the score with a headed finish in the 76th minute. **Gustavo Bou** provided the service for his third assist of the campaign. Bou's assist extends his impressive run of form against New York, giving him five goals and three assists in seven games against the Red Bulls. The Argentine striker has two goals and two assists in his last four games.

The New England Revolution (11-4-7; 40 pts.) defeated Atlanta United FC (9-6-8; 35 pts.), 2-1, on Wednesday night at Gillette Stadium to move into second place in the Eastern Conference. Midfielder **Matt Polster** and forward **Giacomo Vrioni** scored for New England in the fourth and ninth minutes of the match, respectively, giving the Revolution a swift 2-0 lead, before Atlanta recorded a consolation goal in the final moments. Goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović**, set to join the 2023 MLS All-Star Team next week, registered a career-best 10 saves in net to help keep New England improve to 8-0-3 at home this season.

Polster opened the scoring just four minutes after kickoff, netting a right-footed shot from long distance for his second tally of the season. New England doubled the lead soon after with Vrioni collecting a through ball from **Carles Gil** for his fifth goal of the 2023 campaign. The 24-year-old Albanian finished the match with four shots, including a team-best three on target.

Gil's 10th assist of the season moves him into a tie for the MLS lead and also marks the fourth time the Spaniard has reached double-digit assist since arriving in 2019. The Revolution captain, who returned to action after a one-game suspension, finished the match with a team-best five chances created. Gil will join Petrović for MLS All-Star festivities next week, his third straight selection. Also in the midfield, **Ian Harkes** made his Gillette Stadium debut and second straight appearance with the club, registering a 66-minute performance in tonight's win.

On the defensive end, Petrović highlighted Wednesday's victory with a career-high 10-save performance. The 23-year-old Serbian becomes the first Revolution goalkeeper to make 10 saves in match since 2010. Petrović has now registered points in 17 of his 19 starts at Gillette Stadium, with a 10-2-7 home record.

The New England Revolution (12-4-7; 43 pts.) maintained their undefeated home record by dispatching D.C. United (8-10-6; 30 pts.), 4-0, on Saturday night in front of 29,884 at Gillette Stadium. Midfielder **Ian Harkes**, making his second Revolution start, notched his first career multi-goal game while **Carles Gil** registered his second multi-assist game of the season. **Gustavo Bou** opened the scoring with his fifth of the year, before an own goal by D.C. capped the scoring. New England earned its seventh shutout of the season behind a four-save effort from goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović**, matching his career high from 2022.

The New England Revolution (13-5-7; 46 pts. – 2nd in East) defeated the New York Red Bulls (7-11-8; 29 pts. – 12th in East), 1-0, on Wednesday night at Gillette Stadium. New England extended its home unbeaten run to 14 games, improving to 10-0-3 this season, led by **Giacomo Vrioni's** sixth tally and fourth game-winning goal of the season. **Earl Edwards Jr.**, starting in goal for a second straight match, recorded a pair of saves to help earn the team's eighth clean sheet of 2023.

In the team's sixth consecutive home win in league play, New England found the scoresheet at the half-hour mark as **Mark-Anthony Kaye** sent a through ball up the left flank to a streaking Vrioni, who outran his defender before tucking a left-footed shot inside the far post. The New England Revolution (13-5-8; 47 pts. – 2nd in East) played to a 2-2 draw with Austin FC (9-12-6, 33 pts. – 10th in West) at Gillette Stadium on Saturday night. Revolution forward **Tomás Chancalay** registered a brace in his second start for the club as New England is now the lone team in MLS unbeaten at home this season with a 10-0-4 mark. The Revolution have now gone 15 straight home matches without a defeat, two shy of the equaling the club record.

Austin FC took the lead in the 27th minute through Emiliano Rigoni, sending a bouncing a shot over an outstretched **Earl Edwards Jr.** The Revolution goalkeeper made his third straight start, collecting three saves. New England responded just over one minute later as Chancalay scored his first MLS goal, firing home a shot from six yards out. **Carles Gil** and **Ian Harkes** combined on the right-hand flank to create the opportunity.

With the result, the Revolution clinched a berth in the Audi 2023 MLS Cup Playoffs, the team's fourth trip to the postseason in the last five years.

In the eighth minute, Edwards Jr. parried the first threat from Chicago as he got down quickly to save a laser off the foot of Fabian Herbers, before making another save on Jairo Torres in the 10th minute. New England's advantage was erased only 90 seconds later, as Chicago's Brian Gutiérrez tallied the equalizer. On the other side of halftime, the hosts took the lead behind Gastón Giménez's goal in the 54th minute. Revolution captain Carles Gil pulled New England level at 2-2 in the 59th minute with his team-high ninth goal of the season, his 22nd overall goal contribution this season. **Noel Buck** started the move down and sent a cross in from left side, which **Giacomo Vriani** gently laid off to Gil, whose shot deflected past Brady into the center of the net.

The New England Revolution (14-6-10; 52 pts. – 3rd in East) defeated Charlotte FC (7-11-12; 33 pts. – 13th in East), 2-1, on Saturday night at Gillette Stadium. **Noel Buck** and **Dave Romney** each scored for New England, with the latter heading home the game winner in the 85th minute for his first regular season goal as a member of the Revolution. Saturday's match saw the return of Revolution forward **Gustavo Bou**, who had been out since early August with a right leg injury. Bou logged 18 minutes off the bench in his first MLS outing since July 15.

With Saturday's result, New England rises to third in the Eastern Conference with four games to play. The victory extends New England's home unbeaten run to 16 games (12-0-4) dating back to last October – one shy of the club record (17). New England is now the 10th team in MLS history to go unbeaten in its first 15 home games in a season. One more win over the final two games at Gillette Stadium would tie the team record of 12 home wins in a single campaign.

The two sides played a scoreless first half, which saw Charlotte come closest to breaking the deadlock with a strike off the crossbar in the 45th minute. New England striker **Bobby Wood**, making his first start since July 22, nearly connected on two headers. On the other side of intermission, New England opened the scoring in the 64th minute when Buck collected a through ball from **Mark-Anthony Kaye**, put himself in on goal with his first touch, and fired a low shot into the bottom-right corner. It marked the Homegrown Player's third goal of the season in the 20th start of his MLS career.

Charlotte battled back, equalizing in the 84th minute through Karol Świdzki as he pounced on a loose ball at the top of the box and slotted a low shot into the bottom-left corner. It took only 89 seconds for New England to restore its lead, as **Dave Romney** connected on a cross from **DeJuan Jones** at the back post for a simple headed finish. The goal was Romney's first regular season tally for the club, his second goal of the season in all competitions, and the eighth goal of his MLS career.

POSTGAME NOTES

- New England extended its home unbeaten streak to 16 games (12-0-4) games dating back to last October.
- The Revolution are now the 10th team in MLS history to go undefeated in the first 15 home matches of a season. One win over the final two home games would see New England tie a club record with 12 home victories in a season.
- New England is unbeaten in their last 18 matches (12-0-6) when tallying the opening goal.
- Revolution earned their first win under Interim Head Coach **Clint Peay** (1-1-1).
- Saturday's attendance of 37,701 was a season high for New England, and the biggest home crowd since the 2016 regular season finale.

The New England Revolution (14-7-10; 52 pts. – 5th in East) fell to the Columbus Crew (15-8-9; 53 pts – 4th in Eastern Conference), 2-1, on Wednesday night at Gillette Stadium. Forward **Tomás Chancalay** tallied his fourth goal for New England, with assists from **DeJuan Jones** and **Carles Gil**, in what marked New England's first home loss of the 2023 MLS regular season.

Columbus opened the scoring in the 20th minute, with Diego Rossi placing a shot into the bottom-right corner. Rossi later assisted on the game winner in the 86th minute, sending in a cross to defender Malte Amundsen, who poked in a shot off the bottom of the bar.

Trailing 1-0 in the 48th minute, **Carles Gil** sent a through ball up the right side of the field to Jones, who sent a cross into the middle of the box to meet a streaking Chancalay. The Argentinian forward rocketed a half volley into the net to level the match, his fourth tally in eight league appearances. With a secondary assist on the play, Gil became the second player in MLS history to record 14 or more assists in four different seasons, joining Carlos Valderrama. The captain's team-high four chances created on the night also move him within striking distance of the MLS lead in key passes.

Chancalay led the team with eight shots – the highest single-game total for a Revolution player this season. The Argentine nearly gave the hosts the lead in the 57th minute, hitting the crossbar with a curling right-footed effort. Fellow countryman **Gustavo Bou** logged his second straight appearance off the bench, a 20-minute shift, following a six-match injury absence.

The result ends New England's home unbeaten streak at 16 games dating back to October 2022, the second longest run in club history and one of shy of the all-time best mark. The Revolution, now 11-1-4 at home in league play, can still set a new single-season record for home points and match the mark for most home wins when they host the Philadelphia Union for the regular season finale on MLS Decision Day presented by AT&T on Saturday, Oct. 21.

POSTGAME NOTES

- New England is the last team in MLS to suffer a defeat at home in 2023, as the record at Gillette Stadium moves to 11-1-4.
- The 16-game home undefeated streak goes into the history books as the second longest in team annals, one short of the club record.
- Carles Gil** recorded a secondary assist, his 14th of the campaign – tied for second most in MLS. Gil joins MLS legend Carlos Valderrama as the only players in league history to record 14 or more assists in four or more seasons.
- According to Opta, **Gil** now has 92 chances created on the season, only three behind the league lead as he attempts to pace MLS in that category for the third consecutive year.

The New England Revolution (14-8-10; 52 pts. – 5th in East) fell to Orlando City SC (17-7-9; 60 pts. – 2nd in East), 3-2, on Saturday night at Exploria Stadium. Revolution captain **Carles Gil** tallied his third two-goal performance in MLS, giving him a career-high 11 goals on the season, but New England's comeback attempt fell just short in Florida.

After Orlando jumped out to an early advantage, finding the scoresheet in the 31st and 37th minutes, Carles Gil got New England on the board with a left-footed shot from well outside the box that knuckled towards Orlando goalkeeper Pedro Gallese, who spilled it into the net. With the Revolution within a goal and rallying, Orlando again extended its lead to two goals in the 45th minute, swinging momentum back to the hosts at halftime.

Interim Head Coach **Clint Peay** deployed three changes at halftime, bringing on **Gustavo Bou**, **Henry Kessler**, and **Emmanuel Boateng** to help shift the match back in New England's direction. In the second half, Gil was denied by Gallese from point-blank range as he stepped onto Boateng's cross in the penalty area, but the Orlando goalkeeper made the stop to keep the deficit at two. Gil completed his brace in the 93rd minute with another long-range effort.

Gil's first-half tally gave him double-digit goals for the second time in MLS, while his second strike set his new career high at 11 goals. The Spaniard is now the first player in team history with multiple 10-goal and 10-assist seasons. Gil's 25 goal contributions are also a new personal best and the fourth most in a season in club history. He joins Taylor Twellman (2002, 2005) as the only Revolution players to record at least 24 goal contributions in two different seasons.

Mark-Anthony Kaye and **DeJuan Jones** both appeared on the scoresheet with the assists on Gil's goals. Kaye has helped create goals in two of the last three games, while Jones' seven assists this season tie his career high. Tonight's match also saw the return of defender **Henry Kessler**, who entered as a substitute in the 46th minute to mark his first MLS appearance since April 8. Seeing his first action since a hamstring injury that required surgery, the fourth-year center back completed 95 percent of his passes in the match.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Carles Gil's** 11 goals lead the team and set a new career high. Gil has now reached the scoresheet in five of the last six games, with four goals and two assists. In eight career games played against Orlando, Gil owns five goals and six assists.

The New England Revolution (14-9-10; 52 pts. – 5th in East) fell to Nashville SC (13-10-10; 49 pts. – 7th in East), 3-2, at GEODIS Park on Saturday night in the club's final road match of the regular season. Argentinian striker **Tomás Chancalay** accounted for both of New England's goals with tallies in the 49th and 70th minutes, marking the 23-year-old's second brace of the season. Goalkeeper **Jacob Jackson**, New England's first-round selection in the 2022 MLS SuperDraft, recorded seven saves in his MLS debut.

After the hosts jumped out to a three-goal lead in the opening half, Chancalay put New England on the board just four minutes after the intermission with a right-footed shot from the center of the box. Fellow countryman **Gustavo Bou** provided the assist, delivering a cross to hit Chancalay in stride. He then cut the deficit to one in the 70th minute as he buried a rebound for his sixth goal in 10 MLS appearances, and his fourth goal in the last five games.

Bou's assist marked the striker's fourth helper of the season and his 20th in MLS play. It marked his fourth straight appearance and first start for the club since July 15. Now one appearance away from 100 MLS games played, Bou finished the match with a game-high five chances created over a 90-minute performance.

Defender **Henry Kessler** featured in New England's starting lineup for the first time since sustaining an injury on April 8 and played 64 minutes. **Dave Romney**, starting alongside Kessler and **Omar Gonzalez** in a three-man backline, made his return to Nashville, where he played three seasons from 2020-22. A candidate for MLS Defender of the Year, Romney is one game away from becoming the second Revolution player to play every minute of a 34-game season.

POSTGAME NOTES

- With one more match remaining in the 2023 regular season, New England sits fifth in the Eastern Conference after tonight's result, with an opportunity to finish in the top-four to secure homefield advantage in Round One of the Audi 2023 MLS Cup Playoffs.

The New England Revolution (15-9-10; 55 pts. – 5th in East) defeated the Philadelphia Union (15-9-10; 55 pts. – 4th in East), 2-1, on Saturday night at Gillette Stadium to secure the No. 5 seed in the Eastern Conference entering the Audi 2023 MLS Cup Playoffs. The victory sets up a rematch of the Revolution and Union in the best-of-three Round One series.

Gustavo Bou recorded a first-half brace in his 100th MLS appearance, while goalkeeper **Jacob Jackson** made two saves to secure his first MLS win in front of 41,355 fans. The Argentine's two goals gave New England its 12th home win to tie the club's single-season record. With a 12-1-4 mark at home in the regular season, the Revolution set a new single-season attendance record in 2023 with an average of 23,940, a top 10 attendance figure in MLS.

In the regular season finale, Philadelphia opened the scoring when Julian Carranza poked a loose ball into an open net in the 16th minute, following a miscommunication between Jackson and **Dave Romney**. Only nine minutes later, Bou responded with his first goal since July 15, tallying from the penalty spot after Philadelphia was called for handling in the box. Bou secured his brace just before halftime as **Noel Buck** fed a pass to **Carles Gil**, who sent Bou in on goal for his 50th tally across all competitions with New England. Bou's 44 regular season goals are fifth most in club history, and the second most by a Revolution player in his first 100 games.

For Carles Gil, the helper gave him 15 assists in a season for the second time in his career. He finishes the campaign with 26 goal involvements, tied for second most in team single-season history and the most by a Revolution player since 2014. The three-time Revolution Team MVP also claimed the team's 2023 Golden Boot award, finishing the regular season with a team-leading 11 goals. Since the start of 2019, he is one of only four MLS players with 10 goals and 15 assists in a season. Revolution defender **Dave Romney** played 90 minutes on Saturday, making him the only outfield player to play every minute of the 2023 MLS season. He is the second Revolution player to have a perfect service record across a 34-game regular season, the other being José Gonçalves in 2013.

POSTGAME NOTES

- New England became the 17th team in MLS history to compile 40 points at home – a new club record.
- The Revolution welcomed a season-high 41,355 fans to Gillette Stadium for Saturday's match, the first time New England has surpassed 40,000 fans at a match since Oct. 17, 2015.
- New England is unbeaten in its last 20 matches (17-0-3) when leading at halftime, including a 9-0-3 mark this season.
- Gustavo Bou** made his 100th MLS regular season appearance on Saturday, marking the occasion a pair of goals. The brace was Bou's second in MLS.

The New England Revolution (No. 5) opened the Audi 2023 MLS Cup Playoffs with a 3-1 loss to the Philadelphia Union (No. 4) on Saturday night at Subaru Park in Game 1 of the best-of-three Round One series. **Gustavo Bou** tallied his fourth career postseason goal in the 68th minute of a match that saw seven Revolution players make their MLS Cup Playoffs debut, but three first-half goals from the Union proved to be the difference to hand Game 1 to the hosts.

New England opened the game on the front foot, controlling the possession and threatening the Philadelphia goal as Homegrown Player **Noel Buck** rattled a shot off the crossbar in the ninth minute. Buck went on to complete 100 percent of his passes in his playoff debut. Philadelphia turned the tables with their first goal of the match in the 19th minute.

After a video review confirmed that Revolution goalkeeper **Jacob Jackson** brought down a Union player in the penalty area, Philadelphia's **Dániel Gazdag** converted from the spot to put the hosts ahead, 1-0. Mikael Uhré and Nathan Harriel added goals in the 26th and 37th minutes, respectively, to extend Philadelphia's lead to three before the intermission. **Carles Gil**, New England's regular season leader in goals (11) and assists (15), was fouled multiple times in the early action, ultimately being forced to leave in the 23rd minute with a right leg injury following a late challenge. Forward **Bobby Wood** entered the match for Gil, his first playoff action with the Revolution, and recorded two shots.

The Revolution got on the board in the 68th minute with **Giacomo Vriani** and Bou combining for the Argentinian's third goal against Philadelphia in the last two weeks. Vriani fought through a Union defender to slide the ball to the top of the box where Bou collected and muscled his way through multiple Union defenders to create a tight-angled shot, which he roofed past Andre Blake at the near post. Wood nearly added a second goal for the Revolution in the 75th minute, redirecting a cross from **Emmanuel Boateng** on target that was parried off the woodwork by Union goalkeeper Andre Blake.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Gustavo Bou** scored the first goal of the Audi 2023 MLS Cup Playoffs for New England. Bou's fourth career postseason tally ties Charlie Davies for third most in club history.

The New England Revolution (No. 5) were eliminated from the Audi 2023 MLS Cup Playoffs after falling to the Philadelphia Union (No. 4), 1-0, on Wednesday night at Gillette Stadium. The result gives Philadelphia the series win, 2-0.

The two sides battled to a stalemate in a scoreless first half, which saw the Revolution reduced to 10 men just before halftime when Mark-Anthony Kaye was issued a red card after video review for violent conduct against Philadelphia's Daniel Gazdag. Goalkeeper Earl Edwards Jr., who earned his MLS Cup Playoff debut, made one save in the first half and finished with three stops on the night.

The Revolution continued to battle in the second half, putting three shots on target, one from defender Andrew Farrell that forced a save from the Union's Andre Blake. Farrell, making his 15th postseason appearance for New England, also saw another shot narrowly miss the top-right corner.

New England withstood the Union's pressure well, but Philadelphia finally broke the deadlock in the 79th minute. The New England Revolution dued the New York Red Bulls to a 0-0 draw on Saturday night at Red Bull Arena in the first match of the Leagues Cup 2023 group stage. The Revolution bring one point home to New England after falling in the shootout, 4-2.

New York nearly broke through for the opening goal moments after the 20-minute mark, as Dante Vanzeir fired a low shot into the waiting hands of Revolution goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović**. The Serbian stood tall again in the 40th minute with another crucial save from point-blank range, this time denying Frankie Amaya.

The New England Revolution defeated LIGA MX side Atlético de San Luis, 5-1, on Wednesday night at Gillette Stadium in their Leagues Cup 2023 group stage finale. **Giacomo Vrioni** netted the first hat trick of his Revolution career, while **Gustavo Bou** tallied a goal and two assists. With the victory, New England advances to the Round of 32 and will await the result of Sunday's East 4 finale between Atlético de San Luis and New York Red Bulls to decide the group.

Vrioni opened the scoring in the 15th minute, tallying his first goal of the match with a left-footed shot from the center of the box, set up by a give-and-go between Bou and **Ian Harkes**. Mateo Klimowicz evened the score for Atlético de San Luis seven minutes later, firing a volleyed shot past **Djordje Petrović**.

New England retook the lead in the 29th minute when **Bou** blasted home a shot into the upper corner after collecting a turnover at the top of the box. The Revolution carried the play for the remainder of the match, quickly doubling its lead in the 32nd minute with an own goal by Atlético de San Luis defender Julio Dominguez. Vrioni and Bou combined again in the 39th minute. Vrioni completed the hat trick in the 60th minute, finishing a cross from **Brandon Bye** with a finish from close range. It marked New England's first hat trick in an international competition and raised Vrioni's total to eight goals on the year in all competitions. The Revolution also earned valuable contributions in midfield from newcomers Harkes and **Mark-Anthony Kaye**. The latter made his Gillette Stadium debut and his second consecutive start for New England.

The New England Revolution played to a 1-1 draw with LIGA MX side Querétaro FC in the Leagues Cup 2023 Round of 16, falling 4-3 in the penalty shootout at Gillette Stadium on Monday night to end the club's Leagues Cup 2023 campaign. Homegrown Player **Esmir Bajraktarević** tallied his first goal for the Revolution first team in Monday's match.

New England started the match without midfielder Carles Gil and forward Gustavo Bou, both sidelined with injuries. New England and Querétaro duelled to a scoreless first half in a tightly contested battle. Defender **DeJuan Jones**, who shifted to right back in place of the injured **Brandon Bye**, had the best chance of the opening 45 minutes as his header from **Noel Buck's** service ricocheted off the crossbar. In the opening minute of the second half, Querétaro midfielder Jamie Gómez put the visitors in front, glancing a header past Revolution goalkeeper **Djordje Petrović**. The Serbian international made two point-blank saves in the match.

The Revolution drew level in the 78th minute off the foot of Bajraktarević, who collected a pass from **Matt Polster** and tucked a left-footed strike into the net. The goal was the 18-year-old Academy product's first senior tally with New England. New England poured on the pressure late, narrowly missing a winner in the dying moments. In the penalty shootout, Querétaro converted all four of its attempts while Revolution midfielders **Nacho Gil** and **Ian Harkes** had their attempts saved by Fernando Tapia.

The New England Revolution defeated Hartford Athletic, 2-1, in the third round of the 2023 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup on Tuesday night at Gillette Stadium. **Justin Rennicks** and **Dave Romney** provided the goals for New England, as goalkeeper **Earl Edwards Jr.** made four saves to lead New England into the Round of 32.

Rennicks opened the scoring in the 13th minute with his second career U.S. Open Cup goal, heading home a cross off a tight angle a corner kick by fellow Revolution Academy product **Damian Rivera** in the 13th minute. Rennicks and Rivera were among a club-record five Homegrown Players to feature in the Revolution starting lineup, alongside **Esmir Bajraktarević**, **Noel Buck**, and **Jack Panayotou**. Including last Saturday's win over Sporting Kansas City in MLS play, this marks the second straight game all five players have appeared in a match.

After Hartford forward Antoine Hoppenot equalized for the visitors in the 52nd minute, the Revolution brought in reinforcements, including **Carles Gil** and **Dave Romney**, off the bench. The duo linked up for the go-ahead goal in the 70th minute. Gil crossed the ball to the center of the six-yard box where Romney buried the shot for the winner. Gil's assist marks the Revolution captain's third helper in three U.S. Open Cup appearances.
