
2024 TEAM AWARDS

CARLES GIL

REVOLUTION TEAM MVP

&

PLAYERS' PLAYER OF THE YEAR



- Recorded seven goals and 10 assists in 25 MLS starts, becoming the first Revs player with five seasons of 10-or-more assists.
- First Revs player with four Team MVP awards, surpassing Joe-Max Moore (1996, 1998, 1999) and Taylor Twellman (2002, 2003, 2007).
- Revolution captain is tied for the club's all-time lead with 73 regular season assists, including a Revolution record 26 game-winning helpers.
- His 84 assists in all competitions are the most in Revolution history.
- Selected to MLS Team of the Matchday on seven occasions during the 2024 campaign.
- Ranked third in MLS with 94 key passes and second with 124 shot-creating actions.
- Matched own club record with an assist in five straight MLS games between June 1 - Aug. 24, 2024.
- After six seasons, Gil's career rate of 0.49 assists per 90 minutes played ranks top 10 in MLS history (min. 20 assists), and first in club annals.
- Stands among top players in MLS history in assists (4th - 69), game-winning assists (T-2nd - 25), and multi-assist games (T-6th - 11) through a player's first 150 MLS appearances.
- Since entering MLS in 2019, leads the league with 78 assists (including playoffs), while his 73 regular season helpers are sixth most among all active MLS players.

ANDREW FARRELL

HUMANITARIAN OF THE YEAR

- The fourth player to earn three Humanitarian of the Year honors, claiming the honor for the second year in a row.
- 12-year Revolution defender has firmly established on-field legacy as New England's all-time leader in appearances (341), starts (328), and minutes played (29,273).
- Hosts Andrew's NEGU Crew (Never, Ever Give Up), welcoming local pediatric cancer fighters to Gillette Stadium with the Jessie Rees Foundation.
- Long-time supporter of Special Olympics Massachusetts and the Revolution Unified Team for the program's full 10-year duration; helped raise over \$600,000 to date through the club's annual fundraiser, Bowl for a Goal presented by the Arbella Insurance Group.
- Leader in the Revs' Kick Childhood Cancer efforts, attending Box Car Movie Night, Boston Children's Hospital visits, and much more.
- Active supporter of the Animal Rescue League of Boston.





2024 TEAM AWARDS

GIACOMO VRIONI

REVOLUTION GOLDEN BOOT WINNER

- Finished the MLS regular season with a team-high nine goals.
- With three goals in the Concacaf Champions Cup, his 12 goals in all competitions also paced the team.
- In third season with the Revolution, set new MLS career highs in appearances (31), starts (26) and minutes played (2,248).
- Between June 1 and August 24, scored seven goals in seven MLS appearances, including a pair of multi-goal performances.
- Recorded a team-high 76 shots in MLS play, including 53 shot attempts since June 1 - eighth-most leaguewise in that span.
- Won 70 aerial duels this season, fourth-most among forwards in MLS.
- In all competitions with New England, Vrioni owns 22 goals and six assists, averaging 0.56 goal contributions per 90 minutes.



DAVE ROMNEY

DEFENDER OF THE YEAR

- Voted the club's Defender of the Year by media, becoming the fifth Revolution player to win the honor multiple times, and the fourth to do so in consecutive seasons.
- Started 24 of his 27 league appearances this season, his second with the club.
- Tied for seventh in MLS this season with 77 clearances.
- Completed 88.3 percent of his passes on the season, a new career best.
- Also won 61.7 percent of his aerial duels.
- Eclipsed 200 MLS starts with a 90-minute outing against Columbus on June 29.
- Since the start of 2020, ranks second leaguewise in minutes played (12,961) and third in starts (143).
- Over the last five seasons (since 2020), ranks among the top five MLS players in clearances (2nd - 680), blocked shots (T-3rd - 120), and aerial duels won (T-4th - 360).

ERIC KLEIN

RECORD YEAR: REVOLUTION THIRD IN MLS ATTENDANCE

The 2024 season marked a record-setting campaign for both the New England Revolution and MLS, with attendance figures reaching new highs across the league. Over 11.2 million fans attended an MLS match this season, a new all-time mark.

In New England, the Revolution posted the third-best MLS attendance average with 29,262 fans per match, marking a 22.2% increase over 2023's then-record total (23,940).

New England surpassed 25,000 fans eight times this season, seeing crowds of over 40,000 on three occasions. On April 27 vs. Inter Miami CF, the Revolution drew 65,612 fans, a new club record and the second-largest soccer match in Gillette Stadium history.

New England's final home match on Oct. 5 vs. D.C. United drew 44,310 fans to Foxborough, the second-largest crowd for a standalone regular season game in club history. The 2024 season saw three of the six-largest home crowds the Revs have seen in their 29 years.

LUCA LANGONI OFF THE MARK AFTER MIDSEASON ARRIVAL

New Revolution forward and club-record transfer signing **Luca Langoni** had an MLS debut to remember. In New England's 5-0 victory at CF Montreal on August 24, Langoni announced his arrival in MLS by recording a goal and an assist in just 13 minutes off the bench. Langoni provided an assist only two minutes into his Revolution tenure on Giacomo Vrioni's ninth goal of the campaign, before netting his first goal for the club four minutes later off a feed from fellow U-22 Initiative signing **Dylan Borrero**. Langoni also scored in his first MLS start and home debut on Sept. 7 vs. St. Louis.

Langoni joined an exclusive club of 21 MLS debutants to tally both a goal and an assist in their league debut. Langoni and LA Galaxy newcomer Marco Reus both pulled off the feat on the same night, two of five occurrences since the start of 2020.

This year, the Spaniard became the first Revolution player with five seasons of 10-or-more assists. Gil's career rates of 0.49 assists per 90 minutes played and 0.46 assists per game are both best in club history and near the top of the MLS all-time charts. For his MLS career, Gil owns 78 assists (including playoffs), the most leaguewise since his arrival in 2019.

KING OF THE GIL: CAPI ONE OF MLS' BEST EVER MIDFIELDERS

When New England captain **Carles Gil** tallied two assists against Montreal on Sept. 18, he became the first Revolution player with 10-plus assists in four straight seasons. He has reached double digits every year of his Revs career, save for an injury-shortened 2020 campaign. With his team-best 10 helpers in 2024, Gil is now the only Revolution player to lead the club in assists in four consecutive seasons (2021-24).

Gil will begin the 2025 season tied with Steve Ralston (73) for the club's MLS assists record. He already surpassed Ralston's all-competitions total (82), doing so in 42 fewer regular season appearances.

HERE TO STAY! CARLES GIL SIGNS MULTI-YEAR EXTENSION

In March 2024, New England Revolution captain and midfielder Carles Gil signed a multi-year contract extension, guaranteed through the 2026 Major League Soccer season, with an additional one-year club option for 2027. After six MLS seasons in New England, Gil has amassed a plethora of awards and honors, putting him in elite company in Boston's revered sports landscape. The MLS leader in assists since his arrival in 2019, Gil finished the season tied for the most regular season assists in club history, while his 128 goal contributions across all competitions are third best.

ELITE COMPANY

Few athletes in any league have been as dominant in their sport as Carles Gil since his arrival to Major League Soccer in 2019, when he was named the MLS Newcomer of the Year. Gil is the only Boston athlete in the five major men's professional sports to win his league's Most Valuable Player honor since 2019, and one of only three to do so since 2010 (Tom Brady - 2010 and 2017, Mookie Betts - 2018).

MILLER, BAJRAKTAREVIC NAMED TO 2024 MLS 22 UNDER 22

New England Revolution midfielder **Esmir Bajraktarević** (19) and defender **Peyton Miller** (16) were named to the MLS 22 Under 22 presented by BODYARMOR, a list of the top 22 players in MLS under the age of 22 – as voted by on by an expert panel consisting of select MLS staff and MLS Season Pass talent.

Bajraktarević, a Homegrown product of the Revolution's pro player pathway, ranked No. 10 on the annual list. Miller, 16, came on strong in the second half of the season after making his MLS debut on July 17. He landed at No. 22 as the second-youngest player on the list. The Revolution are one of only five MLS clubs with multiple players selected.



Bajraktarević excelled as a key contributor in New England's attack in the 19-year-old's third MLS season. The Homegrown Player born in Appleton, Wis., tallied three goals and three assists over 29 MLS games played and 22 starts - all career bests. Of Bajraktarević's three goals scored, two were game-winning tallies. The winger's 29 league appearances were two shy of the Revolution team lead. Across all competitions in 2024, Bajraktarević recorded four goals and seven assists, including four helpers in six appearances in the 2024 Concacaf Champions Cup.

Across three MLS seasons, Bajraktarević owns 45 MLS appearances and 28 starts. On the international stage, he has collected four caps for Bosnia and Herzegovina, and one for the U.S. Men's National Team, all coming in 2024. In September, Bajraktarević made his senior debut for Bosnia and Herzegovina on Sept. 7 in UEFA Nations League A play against the Netherlands, marking the occasion with an assist off the bench. He collected two more caps in October UEFA Nations League A matches against Germany and Hungary.

Miller suited up for 10 league appearances, eight of them starts, with one assist in his debut MLS campaign. The 16-year-old became the second-youngest player to play for the Revolution on July 17. Three days later, Miller became the second-youngest player in club history to earn an MLS start. The outside back logged his first MLS assist on Sept. 18 in a 2-2 draw versus CF Montréal, becoming the eighth-youngest player in league history to record an assist.

A native of Unionville, Conn., Miller made three additional starts in Leagues Cup 2024. He is the 11th Homegrown Player to appear in MLS for the Revolution, and the first Connecticut native. In October, Miller earned his first selection to the United States Under-20 National Team as it prepares for the 2025 FIFA U-20 World Cup. He previously represented the Stars & Stripes at the U-17, U-16, and U-15 levels.

DAVE ROMNEY AMONG MLS SERVICE LEADERS

Veteran center back **Dave Romney** was once again voted Revolution Defender of the Year in 2024 by local media. He earned the honor in 2023 after his first season with the club. This season, Romney made 27 MLS appearances, starting on 24 occasions, and surpassed 2,000 regular season minutes played for the fifth consecutive season.

During his first season with New England in 2023, Romney, who arrived in New England after a three-year tenure with Nashville SC, had a perfect service record in 2023, becoming the second player in club history to play every minute of a 34-game season (Jose Goncalves - 2013).

Aside from his defensive numbers, Romney's disciplinary record with New England has been exemplary, committing just 26 fouls and receiving two yellow card over 61 appearances.

A denizen in central defense for Nashville prior to arriving in Foxborough, Romney ranks second among all MLS outfield players in regular season minutes played (12,961) and third in starts (134) since the start of 2020.

In 2024, Romney completed 88.3 percent of his passes on the season, a new career best, and also won 61.7 percent of his aerial duels. ALJAŽ IVACIČ ANCHORS REVOLUTION DEFENSE

The New England Revolution signed goalkeeper **Aljaž Ivačić** on April 23, and the Slovenian went on to anchor the Revs the rest of the way. Ivačić recorded 25 regular season starts and notched four clean sheets. Most notably, **Ivačić** posted a five-save shutout on June 8 in a 1-0 win over the New York Red Bulls to earn MLS Player of the Matchday honors.

Ivačić is only the second Revolution goalkeeper to earn MLS Player of the Matchday honors, joining Matt Turner (Week 8 - 2021). He became the first goalkeeper leaguewide to claim the award since Minnesota United's Dayne St. Clair in Matchday 3 of the 2022 season.

One week prior, he also backstopped New England to a 2-1 victory over Nashville SC on June 1 with a penalty kick save on 2022 MLS MVP Hany Mukhtar's attempt, helping start a four-game win streak for the Revolution.

On Sept. 7 vs. St. Louis, Ivačić matched his career high with nine saves, following an eight-save outing the week prior at Real Salt Lake. The Slovenian led the league in saves in 2022 with Portland Timbers FC when he stopped 112 shots. Since making his Revolution debut on May 4, Ivačić led MLS with 101 saves over that span.

MATT POLSTER A MIDFIELD MAINSTAY FOR NEW ENGLAND

Revolution midfielder Matt Polster has been a mainstay in the New England lineup since his arrival in August 2020. This season, Polster became the 28th player in club history to log 10,000 minutes across all competitions for the club. He eclipsed 15,000 MLS minutes on May 4 against his former club, Chicago Fire FC, and reached 200 MLS appearances for his career on June 8.

This year, Polster matched his career high with 31 starts, donning the captain's armband 13 times in all competitions while Carles Gil was sidelined with injuries. Since joining the Revolution, Polster ranks second among MLS midfielders in interceptions (192) and ranks seventh in blocked shots (45).

YUSUF MAKES STRONG FIRST IMPRESSION FOR REVOLUTION

Revolution midfielder **Alhassan Yusuf**, the club's latest addition in the summer signing spree, made seven appearances, with five starts, in his debut MLS campaign with New England. The Nigeria international tallied two assists in league play, his latest on Decision Day against Inter Miami.

In seven games with New England, including starts in his last five appearances, Yusuf completed 91.3 percent of his passes, including 48-of-49 in a 75-minute shift at Charlotte FC on Sept. 21 in his first league start, along with winning 76.5 percent of his tackles, per FBRef. On Sept. 28, Yusuf logged 90 minutes in a 1-0 win over Nashville, collecting a secondary assist on Brandon Bye's game-winning goal for his first MLS helper.

Yusuf, 24, joined the Revolution after three years in the Belgian topflight with Royal Antwerp FC, where he won three trophies including the 2022-23 Belgian Pro League championship and 2022-23 Belgian Cup, and was named the club's Player of the Month in August 2022. Yusuf has won seven caps from the Nigeria National Team, all coming this year after his debut in January 2024 in a friendly against Guinea, and received call-ups for AFCON Qualifying matches in September and October.

MILLER, 16, ETCHED NAME INTO CLUB HISTORY

New England added Homegrown defender Peyton Miller to its roster ahead of the 2024 season after the Academy product impressed in MLS NEXT Pro with Revolution II in 2023. Miller made his much-anticipated MLS debut with a substitute appearance on July 17 at Philadelphia. The Unionville, Conn. native became the second-youngest player to debut for the club in MLS, and only the second to do so at 16. Three days later, on July 20 vs. FC Dallas, Miller became the second 16-year-old to start an MLS match for New England, behind Diego Fagundez.

Miller also became the eighth-youngest player in league history to record his first MLS assist (16 years, 315 days) on Sept. 18 against CF Montreal, setting up Bobby Wood's opening goal on the night. Four of New England's current Homegrown Players made their MLS debut at age 18 or younger.

SIGNED F LUCA LANGONI FROM BOCA JUNIORS

The New England Revolution acquired Argentinian winger **Luca Langoni** from Club Atlético Boca Juniors and signed the attacker through the 2027 Major League Soccer Season, with an additional one-year club option for 2028, via the league's U22 Initiative.

Langoni, 22, made the move to MLS in a *club-record transfer* after spending the early portion of his career with legendary Argentinian club Boca Juniors in his home city of Buenos Aires. With the Blue and Gold, Langoni helped the club win the 2022 Liga Profesional title and 2023 Supercopa trophy. A native of Gregorio de Laferrère, Argentina, the versatile and technically skilled winger totaled 69 senior appearances with 11 goals and four assists for Boca Juniors from 2022-2024.

In the 2024 Liga Profesional season, Langoni appeared three times in league play and six times in cup competitions. In 2023, he also logged three games played for Boca Juniors in the Copa Libertadores.

ACQUIRED NIGERIAN M ALHASSAN YUSUF

The Revolution acquired Nigerian midfielder **Alhassan Yusuf** from Belgian club Royal Antwerp FC for an undisclosed fee and signed the 24-year-old using the season ending injury replacement mechanism. Yusuf, a TAM-eligible player, will occupy an international roster spot and is signed through the 2027 Major League Soccer season, with a club option for 2028.

Yusuf, 24, joined the Revolution after three years in the Belgian topflight with Royal Antwerp, where he won three trophies including the 2022-23 Belgian Pro League championship and 2022-23 Belgian Cup, and was named the club's Player of the Month in August 2022. In the 2023-24 UEFA Champions League, Yusuf played in all six games for Antwerp, registering a goal in his first start against FC Porto and adding an assist against FC Barcelona later in the group stage. He has earned seven additional appearances in UEFA Europa League qualifying and tournament action. Yusuf finishes his Antwerp career with 90 league appearances in the Jupiler Pro League and Jupiler Pro League Champions' Playoffs.

\$600K GAM AND D WILL SANDS ACQUIRED FROM COLUMBUS

The New England Revolution acquired \$600,000 in General Allocation Money (GAM) and defender **Will Sands** and from the Columbus Crew in exchange for defender DeJuan Jones. New England will receive \$300,000 in 2024 GAM and \$300,000 in 2025 GAM and will retain a portion of the fee if Jones is transferred abroad.

Sands, 24, joined New England after three seasons in Columbus, where the Rye, N.Y. native collected 25 league appearances, including 16 starts, and three assists for the Crew. In 2023, Sands featured in seven games, all starts, and logged two assists, helping Columbus to the MLS Cup title. This season, the left back posted six appearances, including four starts, prior to the trade. Sands made his Revolution and Leagues Cup debut on August 6 against Nashville SC as a second-half substitute.

Prior to arriving in Columbus, Sands played three seasons of collegiate soccer at Georgetown University from 2019-21. Sands registered 56 career appearances for the Hoyas, with four goals and five assists. Sands helped Georgetown win the NCAA College Cup during his freshman campaign in 2019, in addition to helping guide the Hoyas to Big East Conference titles in 2019 and 2021. On the youth international level, Sands featured for the United States at the Under-17 and Under-19 levels.

\$600K GAM AND D TIM PARKER ACQUIRED FROM ST. LOUIS

The New England Revolution acquired \$600,000 in 2025 General Allocation Money (GAM) and defender **Tim Parker** from St. Louis CITY SC in exchange for defender Henry Kessler.

Parker, 31, owned 267 appearances in Major League Soccer, including 256 starts, with six goals and four assists, across 10 seasons with Vancouver Whitecaps FC, the New York Red Bulls, Houston Dynamo FC, and St. Louis City SC. The veteran central defender has registered 13 additional games played in the MLS Cup Playoffs, with three goals scored and one assist. The New York native produced his best season in 2023, earning MLS Best XI and All-Star selections in helping guide St. Louis City SC to an appearance in the MLS Cup Playoffs in the club's inaugural season. Parker netted a career-best four goals last season across 29 MLS appearances, all starts.

Parker arrived in MLS as the 13th-overall selection in the 2015 SuperDraft by Vancouver Whitecaps FC. Prior to arriving in MLS, Parker played four seasons of collegiate soccer for St. John's University. Parker helped the Red Storm to three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances from 2011 to 2013. On the international stage, Parker owns two caps for the United States Men's National Team and also suited up for the Stars and Stripes at the U18 and U23 levels.

CALEB PORTER ECLIPSES 300 GAMES COACHED

A two-time MLS Cup Champion, **Caleb Porter** became the 13th coach in league history to reach 300 MLS regular season games on the touchline on March 23 vs. Chicago Fire FC.

Throughout his MLS coaching career, Porter's teams have been tough to beat when tallying the first goal. This season, New England posted a 9-4-2 record when scoring first. Of Porter's 122 regular season coaching victories in his career, 101 have come when his team strikes first.

Porter's .780 win percentage when scoring first is the fourth-best mark among active MLS bosses (min. 150 games).

Dating back to March 2022, New England has lost just once in its last 28 games when leading at the half (23-1-5), while the Revolution own a 36-2-7 record when leading at halftime since the start of the 2021 season. This season, the Revolution were 6-1-2 when leading at halftime.



DAVID KAMMARMAN HIRED AS HEAD OF PLAYER RECRUITMENT

The New England Revolution bolstered its front office in May with the addition of longtime soccer executive **David Kammarman** as the club's Head of Player Recruitment. Working alongside Sporting Director Curt Onalfo, Assistant Sporting Director Chris Tierney, and Technical Director Remi Roy, Kammarman adds over 25 years of professional soccer experience including leadership positions with multiple clubs as head scout and director of soccer operations, contributing to the success of eight MLS Cup champion teams and five Supporters' Shield winners.

Kammarman spent the last five years as Head Scout for Los Angeles FC, helping build the perennial title contender as a key member of the team's scouting group from 2019-23. With LAFC, Kammarman helped compile rosters that won one MLS Cup (2022), two MLS Supporters' Shields (2019 and 2022), and made two Concacaf Champions Cup Finals appearances (2022 and 2023). Prior to his time at LAFC, Kammarman worked as a scout for Atlanta United from 2017-19, contributing to the team's first MLS Cup title in 2018.

Kammarman was previously the longtime Director of Soccer Operations with the LA Galaxy for eight seasons from 2009-16, where he overlapped with Onalfo as they won three MLS Cups together in 2011, 2012, and 2014. The Galaxy also won Supporters' Shield titles in 2010 and 2011.

CONCACAF CHAMPIONS CUP NOTES

CHANCALAY, BAJRAKTAREVIC AMONG TOURNAMENT LEADERS

Revolution forward **Tomás Chancalay** stole the show for New England in the Concacaf Champions Cup, leading the charge with four goals in his first four matches, tied for the tournament lead after the opening two rounds. His performances landed Chancalay on the Concacaf Best XI for Round One of the tournament, guiding the Revolution past Panamanian side CA Independiente, and earned him two Player of the Match awards.

On Feb. 21 in Panama, Chancalay volleyed home the winning goal to take home Player of the Match honors. The Argentine followed that up with a goal in the second leg at home on Feb. 29. In the Round of 16 first leg against LD Alajuelense, Chancalay bagged a brace, his third multi-goal game with the club, surpassing Adam Buksa (2) for the most goals by a Revolution player in Champions Cup play.

Chancalay bagged a brace in Leg 1, his third multi-goal game with New England since joining the club last August. Mensah started and played 90 minutes in both contests, registering a combined 16 clearances and four blocks as the Revolution conceded just once in 180 minutes.

The New England Amputee Soccer Association hosted an exhibition match between the Revolution Amputee Soccer Team and the Metro New York Amputee Soccer Team on Saturday, May 25 at Gillette Stadium. The exhibition, the first full-length amputee soccer contest at Gillette Stadium, was played following the MLS match between the New England Revolution and New York City FC. This marked a continuation of the Revolution's longstanding support of amputee soccer in New England, which has included past donations of team uniforms, training field time, and durable high-performance crutches designed for use in competition. The Revolution also sponsored this year's U.S. Amputee Soccer Cup, the second edition of the annual six-team tournament, which took place in Cambridge, Mass. in October 2024.

The New England Revolution and Metro New York Amputee Soccer Teams are captained by Nico Calabria and Jovan Leheld-Booker, respectively. In 2023, New England defeated the Metro New York Amputee Soccer Team, etching its name into soccer history by winning the first-ever U.S. Amputee Soccer Cup. This year's exhibition featured two 20-minute halves and ended 4-2 in favor of the Revolution, marking the first post-match amputee exhibition contest in MLS history.

Amputee soccer follows the same rules as traditional soccer, with few modifications. The exhibition match presents an opportunity to unite, support, and learn from amputee athletes. Fans attending the MLS match are encouraged to remain at Gillette Stadium following the conclusion of the contest to support the amputee athletes. The amputee match offers a new and exciting form of entertainment for soccer fans and serves as a platform for the athletes to display their skills and raise awareness about limb differences, important of inclusivity in sports and diverse representation in athletic competitions, and the broader sports landscape of adaptive sports among the disability community.



PRIDE NIGHT

On June 29, New England hosted its annual **Pride Night** when the club faced reigning MLS Cup champion Columbus Crew. The Fan Zone featured a pride-themed photo opportunity along with activations from BAGLY and Theater Offensive. The Progress Flag was flown at Gillette Stadium, as well as held on the field during the national anthem by members of Gable, Gillette's LGBTQ+ Employee Resource group. Inside the stadium, players wore MLS' Pride pre-match tops during warmups, and the video boards featured pride-themed branding throughout the night. A tifo, designed and painted by The Rebellion, will be unfurled prior to the match in front of The Fort.

SALUTE TO HEROES MATCH



On May 18, the Revolution honored active and retired military, police, and fire personnel along with all first responders at the club's annual **Salute to Heroes Match**. The Revolution donned special jerseys featuring a commemorative patch on the front, which were auctioned after the match to benefit the **VA of Massachusetts**. The national anthem was performed by The Navy Band Northeast, with retired military members unfurling a large American flag on the pitch. All active and retired military personnel and first responders were honored on Saturday as the Heroes of the Match.

ESPORTS NIGHT

The Revolution hosted its first **eSports Night** on Wednesday, Sept. 18 when New England faced CF Montreal. Prior to the match in the Fan Zone, multiple collegiate eSports teams challenged fans to games. HEAD COACH

CALEB PORTER AT A GLANCE

- Named the ninth head coach in Revolution club history on Dec. 19, 2023.
- One of six coaches to win multiple MLS Cups, and one of only three to do so with different clubs, having led the Portland Timbers (2015) and Columbus Crew SC (2020) to league titles.
- Owns the 12th most wins in MLS history and 11th best winning percentage among all MLS coaches (min. 200 games).
- Led Columbus to 2020 MLS Cup title in second season with the club, and won the 2021 Campeones Cup the following season.
- Named 2013 MLS Coach of the Year after first MLS season, when he led Portland to a 23-point turnaround and first-place finish in the Western Conference.
- With the University of Akron from 2006-12, won the 2010 NCAA D-I men's soccer national championship, seven consecutive MAC regular season titles, and six straight MAC Coach of the Year honors.
- Won back-to-back NCAA College Cup titles (2003 and 2004) as an assistant at his alma mater, Indiana University.

The 2024 season marked Caleb Porter's first year as head coach of the New England Revolution. Porter, appointed the ninth head coach in club history on Dec. 19, 2023, is a two-time MLS Cup winner with over 20 years of coaching experience in Major League Soccer, the NCAA, and international soccer.

Porter's 329 games of MLS coaching experience are sixth most among all active managers. After 10 seasons in the league, Porter currently owns the 11th best winning percentage among all coaches with at least 200 games on the touchline. In the MLS Cup Playoffs, Porter's postseason record stands at an impressive 9-3-4 (.688).

Porter, 49, joined the Columbus Crew ahead of the 2019 season and remained with the club through 2022, posting a 52-46-39 record in his four seasons. In only his second season with the club, Porter guided the Crew to a 12-5-6 record in the regular season to secure third place in the Eastern Conference en route to the club's second MLS Cup title, defeating Seattle Sounders FC, 3-0, in the final. In doing so, he became only the third coach to win multiple MLS Cups with different clubs. The following year, Porter guided the Crew to the 2021 Campeones Cup trophy with a 2-0 win over LIGA MX side Cruz Azul.

The Tacoma, Wash. native began his MLS coaching career in 2013 with the Portland Timbers where he would lead Portland to the Western Conference Final twice in three years. In his first season in Portland, Porter won MLS Coach of the Year honors after leading the Timbers to a 14-5-15 record, marking a 23-point turnaround from the previous year, and a first-place finish in the Western Conference. Porter posted a 68-50-52 record with the Timbers and won his first MLS Cup in 2015 after setting a new single-season club record in wins (15) and leading MLS in shutouts (13). In his final season with Portland, Porter helped claim the 2017 Cascadia Cup and led the Timbers to another first-place finish in the Western Conference.

Before entering the professional ranks, Porter coached the men's soccer program at University of Akron for seven seasons from 2006-12, winning the MAC regular season title each of those years. In 2010, he led the Zips to the NCAA Division 1 national championship with a 1-0 victory over the University of Louisville in the final. Porter compiled a 123-18-17 record at Akron and garnered numerous honors including National Soccer Coaches Association of America National Coach of the Year (2009) and six consecutive MAC Coach of the Year awards from 2007-12. He remains the fastest coach in program history to reach 100 wins at Akron, doing so in just 126 matches, while also setting an NCAA record conference unbeaten streak at 47 games (44-0-3) in 2012.

While at Akron, Porter also gained valuable coaching experience at the international level as head coach of the U.S. Under-23 Men's National Team from 2011-12. He also worked as an assistant with the Under-18 national team from 2009-11. Porter's experience in international club competition also includes three Concacaf Champions Cups (2014-15, 2016-17, 2021), as he is set to enter the tournament for the fourth time with New England in February 2024 when he coaches in his first official competitive action with the club.

Porter began his coaching career as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Indiana University, from 2000-05. He helped the Hoosiers win back-to-back NCAA College Cup titles in 2003 and 2004, five consecutive Big Ten Conference regular season championships, and two Big Ten Conference Tournaments in 2001 and 2003.

Porter's playing career includes four seasons of collegiate soccer at the University of Indiana, where the former midfielder graduated with a bachelor's degree in sports management. The San Jose Clash selected Porter in the third round with the 27th overall pick in the 1998 MLS College Draft. Porter spent the 1999 MLS season with the Clash before joining the A-league's Sacramento Geckos on loan for two matches that season. He went on to sign with the Tampa Bay Mutiny in July 1999 before knee injuries led to his retirement on June 30, 2000.

STAFF BIOS

PABLO MOREIRA**ASSISTANT COACH**

Pablo Moreira finished his first season as an Assistant Coach with the New England Revolution and his 10th season as an assistant in Major League Soccer. Moreira is a two-time MLS Cup champion over 339 matches in his career. During his time in MLS, Moreira has coached an MLS League MVP, MLS Cup MVP, Newcomer of the Year, Goalkeeper of the Year, seven MLS Best XI selections, and nine MLS All-Star Selections en route to 137 total career wins.

Prior to joining the Revolution, Moreira served as an Assistant Coach for the Columbus Crew from 2019-22. Moreira helped the club win the 2020 MLS Cup, becoming the youngest Assistant Coach in MLS

history to win multiple MLS Cups – doing so with two different clubs in each conference. The next year, he helped lead Columbus to the 2021 Campeones Cup, the club's first international trophy, beating Liga MX Champions Cruz Azul.

Moreira, 39, entered the professional ranks as an Assistant Coach for the Portland Timbers from 2013-17. Moreira's first season with the Timbers included a 23-point improvement and a 43 goal-differential improvement from the previous season, securing a first-place finish in the Western Conference and the club's first postseason berth. Additionally, Moreira helped lead the Portland Timbers to their first MLS Cup championship in 2015, as well as Concacaf Champions League appearances in 2014 and 2016, Western Conference regular season first-place finishes in 2013 and 2017, and a Cascadia Cup in 2017.

Collegiately, Moreira served as an Assistant Coach / Video Analyst at the University of Akron from 2010-2012. During his three seasons with the Zips, Moreira posted a 55-6-9 record through 70 games. In addition, he garnered the No. 2 recruiting class in the nation in each of his first three years, producing 14 professionals into the MLS ranks during that span. In 2011, Akron set an MLS record for most first-round selections from a single school, landing five of the first eight picks during the MLS Super Draft.

CLINT PEAY**ASSISTANT COACH**

Clint Peay finished his first season as an Assistant Coach with the New England Revolution and his fifth season with the organization. Peay spent the last four years as the inaugural head coach of Revolution II, and briefly served as Interim Head Coach for the first team in 2023. The 20-year coaching veteran boasts an extensive background in player development that includes an eight-year tenure in the U.S. Youth National Team program and 10 years in the NCAA as both a head coach and assistant.

In his four seasons at the helm of Revolution II, Peay oversaw the professional debuts of 49 different players, including 29 products of the Revolution Academy, in both MLS NEXT Pro and USL League One. He helped lead the developmental team reach the MLS NEXT Pro Eastern Conference Championship in 2023, as Revolution II set single-season records for wins, points, and goals scored.

A proven winner at the game's highest levels, the Columbia, Md. native enjoyed a decorated playing career spanning a decade from his collegiate days at the University of Virginia (1991-95) through five MLS seasons with D.C. United (1996-2000). In his four years at Virginia, Peay won four straight NCAA Division I national titles and saw his Cavaliers rank first in the nation at the end of each of campaign. He preceded his college tenure at Oakland Mills High School, where he helped lead the school to a Maryland State Championship and a No. 1 national ranking as a senior. At the international level, Peay served as captain of the U.S. Under-20 Men's National Team. He went on to compete for the United States in the 1995 Pan American Games and 1995 World University Games, before being named to the roster for the 1996 Summer Olympics.

BLAIR GAVIN**ASSISTANT COACH**

Blair Gavin completed his first season as an Assistant Coach with the New England Revolution. Hired on January 8, 2024 after one season as Head Coach of FC Tulsa in the USL Championship, Gavin, a former Revolution player, reunites with Caleb Porter after serving as an Assistant Coach on his staff in Columbus in 2022.

Gavin, 35, earned his first coaching opportunity in 2018 with Phoenix Rising FC after his retirement. The Phoenix, Ariz. native, who spent his final two seasons as a player with his hometown club from 2016-17, joined Patrice Carteron's staff at just 29 years old.

In his first season coaching Phoenix, Gavin helped guide the club to a Western Conference Championship and its first berth in the USL Cup Final. In 2019, Gavin and Phoenix finished with the best regular season record in the USL Championship. In his final season with Phoenix in 2020, Gavin helped the club reach the USL Cup Final once again, though the championship match was cancelled due to health and safety protocols.

As a player, Gavin spent eight seasons as a midfielder in MLS and the USL. He was originally selected by Chivas USA as the 10th-overall pick in the 2010 MLS SuperDraft. In parts of three seasons with Chivas, Gavin appeared in 43 matches, scoring three goals. Midway through the 2012 season, he was acquired by the New England Revolution and went on to make two appearances for the club. After a brief spell with Seattle Sounders FC, Gavin made the move to the NASL with the Atlanta Silverbacks, followed by three years in the USL Championship with Portland Timbers 2 and Arizona United/Phoenix Rising FC, tallying 86 more appearances and five goals.

The former two-time First Team All-Mid-American Conference honoree played three seasons of collegiate soccer under Porter at the University of Akron before earning a Generation Adidas selection. Gavin scored seven goals over 68 games for the Zips, helping the team earn a berth in the 2009 College Cup Final.

KEVIN HITCHCOCK**GOALKEEPERS COACH**

Kevin Hitchcock completed his sixth season as Goalkeeper Coach with the New England Revolution after joining the club on April 30, 2019. Hitchcock brings nearly 25 years of coaching experience to Caleb Porter's staff, including time in the first divisions of England, Qatar, and India, as well as a decorated 18-year playing career in England.

In his five previous seasons coaching the Revolution's goalkeepers, Hitchcock oversaw the development of two of the best shotstoppers in league history in Matt Turner and Djordje Petrović, who helped the team to four playoff berths in the last five years. Both goalkeepers made major strides in their development under Hitchcock's tutelage, resulting in multi-million-dollar transfers to the English Premier League. At the time of Turner's move to Arsenal FC in 2021, it was the largest outgoing transfer fee for a goalkeeper in MLS history, a mark that Petrović beat when he made his move to Chelsea FC in 2023.

With Hitchcock as their mentor, Turner (2020 and 2021) and Petrović (2022) finished in the top five of MLS Goalkeeper of the Year voting in four consecutive seasons (2019-22), and placed in the top two three years in a row (2020-22). Turner was named the 2021 Allstate MLS Goalkeeper of the Year after the club's historic Supporters' Shield campaign, when the American international backstopped the Revolution to a league-record 73 points. In 2020, Turner finished second in the voting as New England reached the Eastern Conference Final, while setting a new club record for lowest goals-against average. Before joining the Revolution, Hitchcock, who owns a UEFA "A" Goalkeeper License and UEFA "B" Coaching License, spent the previous 18 years as a first-team goalkeeper coach, including nine seasons working with top-flight players in the English Premier League.

CURT ONALFO

SPORTING DIRECTOR



Curt Onalfo finished his first season as Sporting Director of the New England Revolution, overseeing all aspects of the club's soccer operations including personnel, scouting, player development, and the pro pathway. After serving as Interim Sporting Director for part of 2023, Onalfo was elevated to the post on Nov. 30, 2023. He was previously New England's Technical Director since June 2019, where he led an overhaul of the Revolution's pro player pathway inclusive of Revolution II, the Revolution Academy, and the first team.

Since arriving in New England, Onalfo has helped the Revolution first team reach the Audi MLS Cup Playoffs in four of five seasons and win the 2021 Supporters' Shield with an MLS-record 73 regular season points. His expertise in player development has also resulted in a clearly defined pathway from the team's youth ranks up to the first team, accelerated by the launch of Revolution II under his direction ahead of its inaugural 2020 season. In its first four seasons, Revolution II provided the first professional minutes to 49 different players, including 29 current and former Revolution Academy players to make their pro debuts with the second team.

Onalfo, 54, has led a renaissance in the Revolution Academy since taking over the program midway through 2019. Under his guidance, the Revolution Academy became the first in MLS NEXT history to win back-to-back MLS NEXT Cup national championships, with the Under-19s winning the postseason tournament in 2022 and 2023. The Revolution Academy also featured the MLS NEXT Under-17 MVP in forward Olger Escobar. The success of New England's pro pathway under Onalfo is also evident in the influx of youthful Homegrown Players into the first team, including teenagers Noel Buck, Esmir Bajraktarevic, Jack Panayotou, all three of whom have garnered national team recognition. Buck, 18, started 20 MLS games in 2023 and earned multiple appearances with the England U-19 Youth National Team, while fellow 18-year-old Bajraktarevic is a fixture on the U.S. Under-23 Olympic Team for Paris 2024 and earned his senior national team cap in January 2024.

A native of Sao Paulo, Brazil, Onalfo possesses New England roots as he was raised in Ridgefield, Conn. He arrived in New England following an extensive coaching and playing career in Major League Soccer and with the United States Men's National Team. He owns 13 years of MLS coaching experience, highlighted by head coaching roles with D.C. United (2010), the Kansas City Wizards (2007-09), and the LA Galaxy (2017). While working as an Assistant Coach with the Galaxy, he also served as the inaugural Head Coach of USL Championship side LA Galaxy II from 2014-16, where he led the club to a Western Conference title in 2015. When he departed "Los Dos" to become Head Coach of the Galaxy's first team, his overall record with the developmental side finished at 46-29-20.

On the international level, Onalfo spent six years as an Assistant Coach with the United States Men's National Team. He served as an assistant for the USMNT from 2002-07 – including at the 2002 and 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup – and also worked as an assistant with the U.S. Under-23 Men's National Team in 2002. Prior to joining the Revolution, he most recently assisted the U.S. Under-20 Men's National Team from 2018 through May 2019, including in Poland at the FIFA U-20 Men's World Cup, and briefly served as Acting Head Coach of the U-19 side for a training camp in January 2019.

Onalfo entered the coaching ranks an assistant with D.C. United in 2000 following his retirement. He remained with the Black and Red until September 2002, briefly serving as Interim Head Coach in 2001. After his time in the U.S. Men's National Team setup, Onalfo was appointed Head Coach of the Kansas City Wizards shortly after the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup. He led Kansas City for two-and-a-half seasons, compiling a 27-29-22 record, and helped the club reach the postseason twice, including a Western Conference Finals appearance in 2007. In December 2009, Onalfo was named Head Coach of D.C. United.

Onalfo was selected by the LA Galaxy in the 1996 MLS Inaugural Player Draft and would make 13 appearances for the club in the league's debut season, helping it reach the first ever MLS Cup final. The defender went on to register 23 appearances across four MLS seasons, including stints with San Jose (1997) and D.C. United (1998-99).

CHRIS TIERNEY

ASSISTANT SPORTING DIRECTOR



Chris Tierney completed his first season as Assistant Sporting Director after being promoted to the position on January 8, 2024. Prior to his appointment, Tierney served two seasons as the club's Director of Soccer Operations from 2022-23 and was the club's Player Recruitment Manager from 2019-22. Tierney works in tandem with Sporting Director Curt Onalfo to manage the day-to-day operations of the club's soccer operations including a leading role in player scouting, contract negotiations, and salary cap management.

Tierney transitioned into the front office in August 2019 following a decorated 11-year playing career from 2008-18, all with the Revolution, and was long regarded as one of Major League Soccer's top left backs. He announced his retirement in November 2018, finishing his tenure as one of the club's all-time leaders in several statistical categories. Tierney still ranks among the club's top five for games played (246), games started (220), and assists (40).

As a player, the Wellesley, Mass. native helped New England to a 2008 North American SuperLiga title as well as appearances in the 2014 MLS Cup and 2016 U.S. Open Cup finals. Among his career accolades are an MLS All-Star Team selection in 2015, Revolution Defender of the Year honors in 2016, and Midnight Riders Man of the Year recognition in 2016.

Tierney played collegiately from 2004-08 at the University of Virginia. He currently resides in Charlestown, Mass. with his wife, Eliza, and their two children.

REMI ROY

TECHNICAL DIRECTOR



Remi Roy completed his 15th season with the New England Revolution and his first as Technical Director, having been appointed to the position on January 8, 2024. Roy previously served as the club's Director of Scouting & Player Personnel since 2018, after initially joining the club as an assistant coach for eight seasons from 2010-17.

In his current role, Roy is focused on scouting, recruitment, and talent identification in players at the collegiate, national, and international levels. He works closely with the Sporting Director Curt Onalfo and Assistant Sporting Director Chris Tierney in player evaluation and has a role in all soccer-related aspects of the organization, including communication with agents and facilitating MLS communication and compliance.

Roy was heavily engaged in the Revolution's scouting operations throughout his tenure as an assistant coach, contributing to the club's domestic and international scouting efforts. As an assistant coach, first under Steve Nicol and then for six seasons on Jay Heaps' staff, he worked primarily with the club's first-team goalkeepers and provided additional training for the Revolution Academy goalkeepers.

During his time on the Revolution coaching staff, Roy mentored several talented goalkeepers and helped them each achieve success in the professional ranks. In addition to coaching former Revolution goalkeeper Matt Reis in his pursuit of MLS longevity and success, Roy mentored longtime New England 'keeper Brad Knighton, and helped Bobby Shuttleworth establish himself as one of the league's premier goalkeepers since his debut in 2010.

The New England Revolution (0-1-0; 0 pts) fell to D.C. United, 3-1, on Saturday night at Audi Field in the 2024 MLS season opener. The Revolution went down to 10 men in the first half when forward **Giacomo Vrioni** was dismissed following a second yellow card. After entering the halftime intermission down 1-0, **Carles Gil** knotted the score with the club's first goal of the new MLS campaign with a curling effort from distance in the 67th minute. The hosts sealed the victory with a pair of second-half goals from striker Christian Benteke, who netted all three tallies for D.C. United.

Head Coach **Caleb Porter**, managing his first league contest with New England, made three changes to his Starting XI from Wednesday's win in Leg 1 of Round One of the Concacaf Champions Cup. A pair of Homegrown midfielders collected starts tonight in Arlington, Mass. native **Noel Buck** and winger **Esmir Bajraktarević**. In his 88-minute performance, Bajraktarević earned a game-high seven fouls. Veteran center back **Jonathan Mensah** made his Revolution debut on the backline, while goalkeeper **Henrich Ravas** made his MLS debut tonight.

The New England Revolution (0-2-0; 0 pts) fell to Toronto FC (1-0-1; 4 pts.), 1-0, on Sunday afternoon at Gillette Stadium. Revolution captain **Carles Gil** made his 125th MLS start in the match while defender **Henry Kessler** logged the full 90 minutes in his first MLS start of 2024.

New England outshot Toronto, 19-8, on the afternoon, placing six shots on target to the visitors' two. Homegrown midfielder **Esmir Bajraktarević** recorded a career high three shots on frame during his 90-minute performance, adding three chances created. **Tomás Chancalay** was also heavily involved in the attack as New England applied pressure throughout the game, registering his sixth straight MLS match with at least five shot attempts.

Toronto's Lorenzo Insigne found the back of the net in the 27th minute, marking the game's lone goal. The Revolution created several opportunities to tie the match, especially in the final 20 minutes of action, seeing six of their shots blocked or saved to close out the second half. **Matt Polster** nearly pulled the Revolution level with a powerful strike in the second-half stoppage time, but Toronto goalkeeper Sean Johnson made the stop, one of his six on the day, to preserve the clean sheet.

Alongside Bajraktarević, Homegrown midfielders **Noel Buck** and **Jack Panayotou** both saw action in New England's MLS home opener. The New England Revolution (0-3-0; 0 pts.) fell on the road to Atlanta United FC (1-1-0; 3 pts.), 4-1, on Saturday night at Mercedes-Benz Stadium. **Carles Gil** tallied the lone goal for New England, combining with his younger brother, Nacho, marking the second time the two have connected on a goal so far this season in all competitions.

New England began the match on the front foot, with **Tomás Chancalay** striking the cross bar with a powerful header in the 14th minute off **Nick Lima's** pinpoint cross. Carles Gil pulled one back for the Revolution with his second goal of the season, a curling effort past his former Aston Villa teammate Brad Guzan in the 83rd minute, assisted by **Nacho Gil** and Homegrown midfielder **Esmir Bajraktarević**, who made his 25th career MLS appearance one day shy of his 19th birthday. The assist gives Bajraktarević one goal and two assists in his last four appearances. Carles Gil, who signed a multi-year contract extension with the Revolution this week, is now one goal away from becoming the fifth Revolution player to achieve 40 goals and 40 assists in all competitions for the club.

The New England Revolution (0-4-0; 0 pts.) fell at home to FC Cincinnati (2-0-2; 8 pts.) on Sunday afternoon at Gillette Stadium, 2-1. Cincinnati pulled ahead with two goals within the first 10 minutes of the second half, before **Giacomo Vrioni** scored New England's lone goal in the 62nd minute, his second tally in the last two games and his first regular season goal of 2024.

After the two Eastern Conference teams dueled to a stalemate through 45 minutes, the introduction of the reigning MLS MVP Luciano Acosta provided a spark to the visitors after halftime. Acosta set up Cincinnati's opening goal in the 52nd minute, looping the ball across the face of goal to Yuya Kubo, who headed the ball across the line to give the visitors the lead. Acosta doubled the advantage two minutes later, driving a low free kick underneath the Revolution wall and past a diving **Henrich Ravas**.

The Revolution forced their way back into the match with a flurry of late chances, ultimately finishing with a 17-13 advantage in shot attempts. Vrioni was able to cut the deficit in half with a solo effort in the 62nd minute, winning possession before driving towards goal and creating a shot on his left foot, which he delivered into the bottom-left corner. Vrioni now has two goals in all competitions this season, both coming this week after he tallied the equalizer at LD Alajuelense on Thursday night in Concacaf Champions Cup action. The Albanian international has now recorded 12 goals and four assists in all competitions for New England.

Chicago opened the scoring in the 20th minute, capitalizing off a Revolution turnover at midfield. Maren Haile-Selassie won the ball for Chicago before jumpstarting a counter-attack up the right wing to Fabian Herbers, who fed in a cross to Hugo Cuypers to give the visitors an early lead. Seven minutes later, New England nearly equalized off a corner. **Henry Kessler** found space near the penalty spot, but looped his volley over the bar.

Nacho Gil evened the proceedings just before the intermission, heading home a rebound off older brother **Carles Gil's** shot with the last action of first-half stoppage time. The tally was his second across all competitions this season and his first in MLS league play. Nacho Gil nearly added a second goal in the 69th minute, firing a one-time shot from the top of the box that was deflected into the hands of Chicago goalkeeper Spencer Richey.

Earl Edwards Jr. earned the start in net for New England, his 2024 season debut, replacing **Henrich Ravas** who is away on international duty with Slovakia. Edwards made one save, denying Georgios Koutsias in the 67th minute. Following a giveaway, Edwards, with help from substitute **Ryan Spaulding**, forced Koutsias into a narrow angle before getting a hand to the low shot to keep the game tied.

Goalkeeper **Henrich Ravas** earned the shutout in net while **Carles Gil** scored his team-leading third goal of the regular season, making him the fifth Revolution player to record 40 goals and 40 assists for the club across all competitions.

Both teams earned quality chances in the opening 20 minutes of the match, though neither team was able to convert. Following early pressure from Charlotte, **Giacomo Vrioni** responded with two headed chances from close range, both off crosses from **Tomás Chancalay**. Vrioni's first header went inches wide of the near post, while his second attempt struck the crossbar. Vrioni finished the night with a team-leading four shots, including one on target.

Carles Gil broke the deadlock in first-half stoppage time, giving the hosts the lead entering the intermission. The Revolution captain slipped his brother, **Nacho Gil**, in behind the Charlotte defense, though the Spaniard's initial effort was denied. The rebound caromed out to the older Gil, who directed a shot through a sea of defenders inside the far post to put New England ahead. It marked the first time in the MLS season New England has opened the scoring. Gil finished the night with a team-high three key passes.

Ravas started in net tonight, his first appearance since returning from international duty, and recorded his first clean sheet in MLS play with a three-save effort. It marked the Slovakia international's fourth shutout in all competitions through nine starts. He was aided by a backline that included **DeJuan Jones** and **Nick Lima** on the flanks, with the latter recording his 200th MLS appearance. **Jonathan Mensah** started alongside **Henry Kessler** in central defense, though the Ghanaian was replaced by **Dave Romney** after 44 minutes due to a right leg injury.

New England hits the road for a pair of matches next week. First, New England heads to Mexico City for the second leg of the Concacaf Champions Cup Quarterfinals against Club América on Tuesday, April 9, trailing 4-0 on aggregate. The 10:30 p.m. ET kickoff at Estadio Azteca airs nationally in the U.S. on FOX Sports 1 (English) and TUDN (Spanish).

The New England Revolution (1-5-1; 4 pts.) fell to New York City FC (2-4-2; 8 pts.), 2-0, on Saturday night at Yankee Stadium. The Revolution dueled the hosts to a scoreless first half before conceding the winner in the 57th minute. New England goalkeeper **Henrich Ravas** registered four saves on the night, while forward **Tomás Chancalay** led the attack with a game-high four shots.

In the first half, Chancalay provided the best of New England's scoring opportunities, including a 27th-minute volley that was saved by New York City goalkeeper Matt Freese. The Argentine had another shot skim the crossbar seconds later. Soon after, Revolution captain **Carles Gil** tried his luck from outside the box with a left-footed shot in the 28th minute, also saved by Freese. Forward **Giacomo Vrioni** was also involved in the attack throughout the night, contributing two shots on target.

New York City forward Agustín Ojeda broke the deadlock in the 57th minute to open the scoring for the hosts. New England applied pressure late and created several chances to even the score, including a deflected shot from defender **Ryan Spaulding** in the 78th minute that took a deflection and nearly trickled over the goal line.

The Revolution's best opportunity to equalize came on a header from Chancalay from Carles Gil's pinpoint cross, but the powerful attempt was denied by Freese. Forward Julián Fernández put the game out of reach in stoppage time with a strike into the top-left corner past a diving Ravas, sealing the 2-0 win for the hosts.

The New England Revolution (1-6-1; 4 pts.) played to a narrow 1-0 defeat against Toronto FC (4-4-1; 13 pts.) on Saturday night at BMO Field. The Revolution controlled the ball and threatened Toronto with chances throughout the night, finishing with an 18-15 edge in shot attempts, but could not overcome a 66th-minute goal by Toronto forward Prince Owusu. New England goalkeeper **Henrich Ravas** kept New England within striking distance with a single-game high seven saves, including his first MLS penalty stop.

In the first half, New England tested Toronto with several scoring opportunities, including a well-struck shot by **Nacho Gil** in the 39th minute that looked destined for the back of the net, before a timely block by Toronto defender Nicksoen Gomis denied the opening goal. After halftime, **Giacomo Vrioni** nearly put the Revolution in front on a breakaway attempt, but Toronto goalkeeper Sean Johnson parried the shot wide with one of his six saves on the night. Vrioni finished with two shots on target, while **Carles Gil** paced the team with three attempts on frame.

New England saw another quality chance following a free kick from **Esmir Bajraktarević**, which fell to **Andrew Farrell**, but the defender was unable to find the target. Bajraktarević was one of two 19-year-old Homegrown players to start the match along with **Noel Buck**, who exited in the 44th minute with an injury and was replaced by Toronto native **Mark-Anthony Kaye**. Bajraktarević played the full 90 minutes and recorded three key passes, tied with Carles Gil for the team lead.

After the half, Toronto forward Prince Owusu broke the deadlock in the 66th minute with the opening goal. The hosts then looked destined to double their lead when they were awarded a penalty in the second half, but Ravas made the save down to his left in the 76th minute to keep the Revolution within one. In search of an equalizer, **Caleb Porter** deployed forwards **Tomás Chancalay** and **Bobby Wood** off the bench in the 72nd minute. The pair combined for five shot attempts over the final 18 minutes, but the visitors could not find the net.

The New England Revolution (1-7-1; 4 pts.) were defeated by Inter Miami CF (6-2-3; 21 pts.), 4-1, in front of a club-record crowd of 65,612 fans at Gillette Stadium on Saturday night. **Tomás Chancalay's** opening-minute goal for New England sent the second-largest soccer crowd in Gillette Stadium history into a frenzy, but his early strike was cancelled out by two goals and two assists from Inter Miami midfielder Lionel Messi, who played all 90 minutes of the match.

New England immediately began the night on the front foot, with Chancalay tallying his first goal of the MLS regular season only 37 seconds into the match. **Carles Gil** intercepted a pass in the middle of the park and sent a ball in behind the Miami defense to Chancalay, who lofted a shot from a tight angle over the charging goalkeeper Drake Callender. The goal marked New England's earliest in a match since Gil scored in the first minute against Atlanta on May 31, 2023.

Making his second appearance at Gillette Stadium, and his first since arriving in MLS last season, Messi pulled Inter Miami level with his first goal of the night in the 32nd minute. The Argentinian slotted home a through ball from Robert Taylor, beating Revolution goalkeeper **Henrich Ravas**, before he struck again with a 68th-minute goal to put Miami in front. Messi helped set up the final two goals on the night for Miami by Benjamin Cremaschi in the 83rd minute, and Luis Suarez in the 88th minute.

New England defender **Henry Kessler** started the match for his 100th professional appearance across all competitions for the club. Revolution midfielder **Dylan Borrero** entered the match in the 81st minute to make his long-awaited return from a knee injury suffered one year ago.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Saturday's crowd of 65,612 set a new single-game attendance record for the Revolution, surpassing the 2002 MLS Cup final (61,316).
- The crowd is also the second-largest attendance for a soccer match at Gillette Stadium in the venue's 23-year history, only behind a 2007 international friendly between Brazil and Mexico (67,584).
- **Tomás Chancalay** scored his first goal of the regular season, his fifth tally across all competitions this season.
- The first-minute goal was New England's fastest tally since May 31, 2023, when **Carles Gil** scored 21 seconds into the match.
- **Carles Gil** tallied his first regular season assist of 2024, his 75th helper across all competitions for the club. Gil led the team with seven key passes on the night.
- **Gil** now has 99 goal contributions for his MLS regular season career, one shy of becoming the fifth player in club history to reach the century mark.
- Defender **Xavier Arreaga**, acquired on Tuesday by New England in a trade with Seattle, earned his first start for the club on Saturday night.
- **Henry Kessler** made his 100th appearance for New England across all competitions in Saturday's match, completing 92 percent of his passes.
- **Dylan Borrero** returned to action for New England 365 days after suffering a knee injury, entering the match as an 81st-minute substitute.

The New England Revolution (2-7-1; 7 pts.) defeated Chicago Fire FC (2-5-4; 10 pts.), 1-0, on Saturday night at Soldier Field. Forward **Tomás Chancalay** netted the lone goal of the match, his second tally in as many games. Goalkeeper **Aljaž Ivačič** suited up for his Revolution debut and collected the clean sheet with a two-save performance.

After a 45-minute weather delay, Saturday's match was scoreless through 45 minutes before New England came out on the front foot in the second half. Chancalay broke the stalemate in the 62nd minute with his second goal of the MLS campaign, his sixth in all competitions this season. Forward **Giacomo Vrioni** flicked a goal kick from Ivačič into Chancalay's path, as the Argentine then drove into the center of the field and unleashed a curling left-footed strike from outside the penalty area, which found the side netting. Chancalay led New England's attack with three shots, including two on target.

With the one-goal advantage, Ivačič and the Revolution backline, anchored by **Xavier Arreaga** and **Henry Kessler** in central defense, controlled the match to preserve the clean sheet. The 30-year-old Slovenian goalkeeper denied Chicago's Xherdan Shaqiri with a highlight-reel save on a free kick attempt in the 73rd minute.

Revolution captain **Carles Gil** played 90 minutes in the victory and contributed a team-high five key passes. Midfielder **Dylan Borrero** logged his second consecutive appearance, a 15-minute shift off the bench, in his return from a knee injury. Midfielder **Matt Polster**, playing against his former club, also logged the full 90 minutes to surpass 15,000 minutes played in his MLS regular season career.

The New England Revolution (2-8-1; 7 pts.) fell to the New York Red Bulls (5-2-5, 20 pts.) 4-2, on the road at Red Bull Arena on Saturday night. New England captain **Carles Gil** netted his team-best fourth goal of the 2024 campaign, becoming the fourth player in club history to reach 100 goal contributions in MLS regular season play. Forward **Giacomo Vrioni** closed the scoring for New England with his second goal of the regular season in the closing minutes.

After New York opened the scoring in the sixth minute, Gil found the equalizer midway through the first half. **Tomás Chancalay** delivered a pinpoint cross into the penalty area where Gil nodded it home for the first headed goal of his MLS career. With his first assist in a Revolution uniform, Chancalay has now reached the scoresheet in three consecutive games. Tonight, he led New England's attack with three shots, including two on target.

The Revolution had momentum with halftime approaching, but New York retook the lead from the penalty spot via Emil Forsberg in the 43rd minute after **Henry Kessler** was whistled for a handball in the box. New York extended its lead to 3-1 in the 84th minute, before Vrioni closed the gap with a left-footed tally in the 90th minute. Vrioni converted on assists from midfielders **Emmanuel Boateng**, who now owns 25 career helpers in MLS, and **Ian Harkes**. With the Revolution pressing for an equalizer, the Red Bulls closed the door with a fourth goal in stoppage time to seal the 4-2 result.

Midfielder **Matt Polster** played all 90 minutes in his 100th regular season start for the Revolution. On the defensive end, goalkeeper **Aljaž Ivačić** suited up for his second consecutive start and eclipsed 5,000 MLS minutes played with his performance tonight. Defender **Xavier Arreaga** collected his third consecutive start tonight in central defense alongside Kessler. With **Ryan Spaulding** unavailable due to illness, **Andrew Farrell** slotted in at right back with **Nick Lima** shifting to the left side.

The New England Revolution (2-9-1; 7 pts.) fell, 3-0, to the Philadelphia Union (4-4-5, 17 pts.) on Saturday night in front of 34,947 fans at Gillette Stadium. An early red card to **Ryan Spaulding** in the 14th minute forced New England to play with 10 men for the final 76 minutes of the match. The Revolution battled through the one-man disadvantage to create several scoring chances, but it was Philadelphia who broke the deadlock in the 38th minute and extended the lead with two second-half goals.

After starting the match on the front foot, New England was reduced to 10 men in the 14th minute when Spaulding was shown a red card for bringing down Philadelphia's Mikael Uhre from behind, a foul the referee deemed denial of an obvious goal-scoring opportunity. The Revolution continued to apply pressure despite the setback, though Philadelphia finally took advantage in the 38th minute when Julian Carranza headed home a cross from Jack McGlynn. Dániel Gazdag added to the Union lead on the other side of halftime with goals in the 47th and 80th minutes.

In tonight's match, Revolution forward **Dylan Borrero** started for the first time this season as he made his fourth appearance back from injury. The young Colombian's best chance came in first half stoppage time, receiving a pass in behind before being denied from a narrow angle by Union goalkeeper Oliver Semmler. Defender **DeJuan Jones** made his first appearance as a second-half substitute after missing the last four matches. Fellow outside back **Nick Lima** suited up for his 175th MLS start on Saturday. In net for New England, **Aljaž Ivačić** recorded seven saves in his home debut for the club.

- **Dylan Borrero** made his first start of the season and his fourth appearance, logging one shot on target in his 50-minute shift.

The New England Revolution (2-10-1; 7 pts.) were defeated, 1-0, by New York City FC (8-5-2, 26 pts.) on Saturday night at Gillette Stadium. Despite the Revolution holding an edge in shots and possession, with an eight-to-four advantage in shots on target, NYCFC claimed all three points after an 81st-minute header from midfielder Keaton Parks provided the difference.

New England controlled the play during the first half, staving off an early push from the visitors thanks to two blocked shots by **Henry Kessler** in the opening five minutes. Kessler was cautioned in the 13th minute and will be suspended for next weekend's contest at Nashville for yellow card accumulation. The Revolution were also forced to dip into their bench early, as **Tomás Chancalay**, who returned to the starting lineup after missing last week's match through suspension, picked up a right leg injury 10 minutes into the match. He was replaced by Homegrown midfielder **Esmir Bajraktarević** for the remainder of the match and recorded five shot attempts, even with **Giacomo Vroni** for the team lead, with a career-high four shots on target.

The Revolution produced a flurry of chances just shy of the half-hour mark as they pushed to open the scoring. **Xavier Arreaga** narrowly missed a header wide off a corner kick in the 25th minute. Vroni then had an effort saved and **Dylan Borrero** fired a shot high in quick succession. Borrero made his second straight start and fifth appearance of the season, logging 78 minutes in his 25th MLS appearance.

At the start of the second half, Vroni was again stymied by NYCFC goalkeeper Matt Freese, who parried away the Albanian's glancing header. Freese, who finished with eight saves, also denied Borrero and **Carles Gil** two minutes apart midway through the second half to keep the game scoreless. In addition to his one shot on target, Gil recorded eight key passes in the match, his most in a single game since 2021. In the 81st minute, Parks got separation from his defender and nodded home a cross from Tayvon Gray to put the visitors in front.

The New England Revolution (3-10-1; 10 pts.) earned a hard-fought 2-1 victory over Nashville SC (4-5-7, 19 pts.) on Saturday night at GEODIS Park. **Carles Gil** tallied his 10th goal-and-assist performance in MLS, including a helper on **Esmir Bajraktarević's** game-winning strike for the 19-year-old's first goal in MLS. With the result, the Revolution have won two of their last three games on the road.

Gil gave the Revolution a 1-0 lead at the break with his team-leading fifth goal of the season. The captain curled a left-footed shot past an outstretched Joe Willis in the 18th minute. **Dylan Borrero**, starting his third consecutive match, tallied an assist on Gil's opening goal - his first helper of the season. Gil also recorded an assist in the second half, his second of the season and the 65th assist of his MLS career.

The Revolution doubled the advantage shortly after half time as Bajraktarević tallied his first MLS goal with a superb right-footed strike, assisted by **Giacomo Vroni** and Gil. The Homegrown midfielder will join the United States Men's Olympic Team next week for the final pre-Olympic training camp, culminating with a friendly match against Japan on June 11.

Aljaž Ivačić, making his fifth Revolution start, recorded four saves in the victory, including a 57th-minute penalty denial of Hany Mukhtar in the second half. Mukhtar got another chance from the spot in the 80th minute, converting to cut the deficit. New England fought off a furious push from the hosts throughout 11-plus minutes of second-half stoppage time to preserve their second road victory of the season.

The New England Revolution (4-10-1; 15 pts.) defeated New York Red Bulls 1-0, (8-4-5; 29 pts.) on Saturday night in front of 29,288 fans at Gillette Stadium. New England midfielder **Emmanuel Boateng** scored the winning goal in the 81st minute, his first tally of the 2024 campaign, with assists from **Carles Gil** and **Xavier Arreaga**. Goalkeeper **Aljaž Ivačič** recorded his 10th career clean sheet and second with the Revolution.

The Revolution controlled the run of play for much of the first half with 62 percent of the possession, threatening the New York end through clever combination play in the mid-field between Gil and forward **Dylan Borrero**, who logged his fourth straight start. The pair combined for three shots in the first half, while Gil recorded three of his season-high seven key passes in the first half. The Revolution captain's 55 key passes are second most in MLS through Matchday 19.

Deep into the second half, New England broke the deadlock when Boateng slotted home a cross from Gil with his first touch, beating Red Bulls goalkeeper Ryan Meara for the game's lone tally. The Ghanaian's goal gave Gil his 24th game-winning assist, extending his club record. Arreaga, making his seventh consecutive start, helped create the opportunity with a through ball to Gil as the Ecuadorian registered his first helper since 2020.

With Arreaga and **Dave Romney** anchoring the backline ahead of him, Ivačič protected the net with five saves in his sixth start of the season as his record improved to 3-3-0, with two shutouts. On his 31st birthday, midfielder **Matt Polster** played all 90 minutes in his 200th MLS regular season appearance, but will be suspended for next week's contest against the Vancouver Whitecaps due to yellow card accumulation. Meanwhile, forward **Giacomo Vrioni** suited up for his 50th match for New England and had two shots on the night, including a left-footed effort that required a diving save from Meara as it curled inside the far post.

The New England Revolution (5-10-1; 16 pts.) defeated Vancouver Whitecaps FC (8-4-5; 29 pts.), 3-2, on Saturday night at Gillette Stadium, marking the team's third consecutive win and second straight victory at home. Two Homegrown players tallied in the match, with midfielder **Noel Buck** tallying his fifth career goal to open the scoring, and **Esmir Bajraktarević** scoring the winner for his second goal in as many appearances. **Giacomo Vrioni** recorded the Revolution's second goal of the match, his third of the season.

New England opened the scoring early with a perfectly placed goal from Buck in the seventh minute, the second-fastest tally of the season for the Revolution. The Arlington, Mass. native, who returned from international duty with England's Elite League Squad this week, opened his 2024 account. After Vancouver equalized in the 13th minute, Vrioni netted a left-footed strike to restore New England's lead. Vrioni converted on assists from **Dylan Borrero** and **Carles Gil**. Gil now has a helper in three consecutive games, four on the season, while Borrero has registered an assist in two of his last three games.

Bajraktarević added to the lead in the 39th minute with an unassisted goal that looped over Vancouver goalkeeper Yohei Takaoka's head for the winning tally. The 19-year-old Homegrown player, who returned to the club earlier this week from international duty with the U.S. Men's Olympic Team, has now scored in consecutive MLS appearances for the first time in his career.

Vancouver closed the scoring shortly before the final whistle with a knuckling shot, as New England held on through the final moments of stoppage time to secure the 3-2 result. With the win, goalkeeper **Aljaž Ivačič** improved his record with New England to 4-3-0 with his six-save performance. Left back **DeJuan Jones** featured in the starting lineup for the fourth consecutive match, while center back **Xavier Arreaga** logged his eighth consecutive start. Head Coach **Caleb Porter** improved his all-time record against Vancouver to 9-4-7, as the Revolution have now won five of seven all-time home meetings against Vancouver.

The New England Revolution (6-10-1; 19 pts.) extended their winning streak to four consecutive matches with a 2-1 victory at FC Cincinnati (12-4-3; 39 pts.) on the road at TQL Stadium on Saturday night. Forward **Giacomo Vriani** netted both goals to raise his tally to five goals on the league campaign, while midfielder **Carles Gil**, making his 150th MLS appearance, tallied two assists in the victory.

New England opened the match on the front foot and Vriani rewarded the early onslaught when he found the back of the net in the 21st minute. Gil found the Albanian near the top of the penalty area and the 25-year-old capitalized with a left-footed strike past a diving Roman Celentano. Vriani, who also drew a team-high five fouls on the night, then completed his brace in the 41st minute by converting a header, assisted by **Emmanuel Boateng** and Gil. Vriani's fourth multi-goal game for New England in all competitions gave the Revolution multiple first-half goals for the second straight game.

With his 11th career multi-assist game, and his first of the 2024 campaign, Gil has now set up a goal in four consecutive games for the third time in his Revolution career. Through a player's first 150 MLS games, the 31-year-old Spaniard ranks fourth all-time with 69 assists and tied for second with 25 game-winning helpers.

FC Cincinnati cut into New England's lead in the 65th minute, with Yamil Asad converting on Luciano Acosta's assist from a corner kick. Four minutes later, the hosts were limited to 10 men when a second yellow card was issued to Obinna Nwobodo. Head Coach **Caleb Porter**, who improved to 98-13-33 (.795) in his career when his teams score first, deployed multiple substitutions to close out the match, including the long-awaited return of defender **Brandon Bye**, who came off the bench in the 88th minute for his first action since suffering an ACL tear last August.

Aljaž Ivačić bolstered the back end for New England, making three saves to improve to 5-3-0 on the season as the Revolution limited a Cincinnati side, which had tallied four goals in back-to-back games entering tonight, to only four shots on target.

POSTGAME NOTES

- New England's four-game winning streak is the team's first since August 2021.
- The Revolution are the only Eastern Conference team never to lose on the road to FC Cincinnati as they improve to 5-2-3 in the all-time series, 4-0-1 on the road.
- New England improved to 6-0-1 this season when scoring the first goal, while Head Coach **Caleb Porter** boasts a .795 winning percentage when his team tallies first.

New England Revolution (6-11-1; 19 pts.) fell to the Columbus Crew (9-4-5; 33 pts.), 5-1, on Saturday night at Gillette Stadium. Midfielder **Emmanuel Boateng** scored the lone goal for New England in his 200th MLS appearance and 100th career start before the visitors scored five unanswered goals to end the Revolution's winning streak at four games.

New England's high press produced several scoring opportunities early in the match and led to the opening goal in the ninth minute, as Boateng intercepted a pass between the Columbus center backs and chipped Crew goalkeeper Patrick Schulte for his second tally of the season. However, Columbus quickly rallied to level the score in the 19th minute through Cucho Hernandez. The Revolution had multiple chances to add a second goal, with **Giacomo Vriani** registering shots on target in the 18th and 39th minutes. Vriani ended the night with six shots, a new single-game high for the Albanian.

The visitors took the lead through Max Arfsten's goal in the 43rd minute, and doubled the advantage in first-half stoppage time off the foot of Diego Rossi. After the intermission, the Revolution immediately threatened to pull one back as Vriani saw another shot attempt sail just over the crossbar. The match remained tightly contested until Columbus scored on a corner kick in the 73rd minute, with Rudy Camacho heading home Rossi's cross. Rossi and Crew forward Cucho Hernández each tallied one goal and two assists in tonight's showing.

Revolution defender **Brandon Bye** played his second straight game in his return from a knee injury last August, seeing 26 minutes of action. **Matt Polster** wore the captain's armband for New England, as **Carles Gil** missed the match with an injury. Polster was supported by Boateng and **Ian Harkes** in the midfield, while in the backline, central defender **Dave Romney** suited up for his 200th MLS career start.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Tonight's defeat ended New England's season-long winning streak at four matches.
- The defeat was the Revolution's first in the month of June since 2021, ending a run of 12 straight games without a loss (9-0-3).
- Emmanuel Boateng** suited up for his 100th MLS start in his 200th league appearance, marking the occasion with his second goal of the season to open the scoring. The Ghanaian midfielder has found the scoresheet in three of his last four appearances and recorded a team-high three key passes.
- Giacomo Vriani** set a new MLS career high with six shots on Saturday night, including three on target – both team highs.

The New England Revolution (7-11-1; 22 pts.) defeated Atlanta United FC (6-9-6; 24 pts.), 2-1, on Wednesday night with over 20,171 fans on hand at Gillette Stadium. The Revolution, winners of five of their last six matches, were led to victory by forward **Giacomo Vrioni's** two-goal performance, his second brace in the last three games. Defender **DeJuan Jones** and Homegrown midfielder **Noel Buck** each collected an assist, while goalkeeper **Aljaž Ivačić** registered six saves to help secure the win.

New England started Wednesday's match on the offensive from the opening whistle, aided by winger **Dylan Borrero**, who returned to the starting lineup after a two-game injury absence. The Revolution's early efforts culminated in a goal from Vrioni in the 11th minute. The 25-year-old striker collected a pass from Jones and nutmegged his defender to create space for a left-footed strike. Jones, who suited up for his 125th MLS start on Wednesday, recorded his first helper of the 2024 campaign on the early tally.

The Revolution continued to pressure Atlanta's defense with scoring opportunities in the ensuing minutes. Once again, Vrioni rewarded New England's labor in the attack with his second goal of the night in the 45th minute, giving him five tallies in the last four games. Buck delivered a pinpoint cross to the back stick, where Vrioni leapt to meet it and redirect a shot past Brad Guzan, sending the Revolution into the halftime break with a 2-0 advantage. Buck has now reached the scoresheet in two of his last four games played.

New England kept the visitors at bay in the second half, maintaining the two-goal lead until Atlanta reached the scoreboard on forward Daniel Ríos' goal in stoppage time. The Revolution held on for the win, giving the team its third home win in the last four games in Foxborough. Ivačić, who made his 10th start since joining New England in April, recorded his sixth victory of the season. **Henry Kessler** returned to the Starting XI, pairing with **Xavier Arreaga** in central defense.

POSTGAME NOTES

- With tonight's victory, New England evened the all-time series against Atlanta at 5-5-4, including a 4-1-2 mark in Foxborough.

The New England Revolution (7-12-1; 22 pts.) were defeated by Seattle Sounders FC (8-7-7; 31 pts.), 2-0, on the road at Lumen Field on Saturday night. In the teams' first meeting since 2019, the Sounders scored a goal in each half to hand New England only its second loss in the Pacific Time Zone in the last 15 trips.

After 15 minutes, the hosts scored the opening goal of the match as Seattle forward Jordan Morris charged onto a pass from Albert Rusnák and blasted a right-footed shot past Revolution goalkeeper **Aljaž Ivačić**. The Revolution had multiple opportunities to equalize beginning at the half-hour mark, when **Esmir Bajraktarević** found a streaking **Giacomo Vrioni** on the break, but the striker's left-footed shot was blocked.

Bajraktarević, who led the team with three key passes, created another scoring chance when he danced around three defenders to set up a shot for Vrioni, followed by his own rebound attempt. Seattle captain Stefan Frei stood tall with a clutch double save to deny New England. The Revolution sustained heavy pressure on the Seattle goal through the remainder of the half, nearly breaking through when **Ian Harkes'** rocket from outside the box in the 41st minute was tipped over the bar by Frei.

Early in the second half, Vrioni came within inches of the equalizer when his shot was deflected, forcing an awkward save by Frei. Ivačić was called into action again in the 55th minute as he made a diving stop to deny a low shot through traffic. He made another quick reaction denial in the 61st minute, pushing Nouhou's header over the bar for one of his five saves on the night. Midfielder **Ian Harkes** was the lone scorer for New England, tallying his first goal of the 2024 MLS campaign in his 25th start for the club in all competitions.

Against a shorthanded Revolution team limited by injuries, Philadelphia pulled out to 3-0 lead in the first half, with Tai Baribo opening the scoring in the 29th minute and Jakob Glesnes adding the second goal in the 39th minute. Baribo finished the night with a hat trick, tacking on goals in the 44th and 52nd minutes. Quinn Sullivan wrapped up the scoring for Philadelphia with an 84th-minute strike from distance. Union defender Kai Wagner assisted on three of his team's goals.

Shortly after halftime, Harkes cut the deficit to two when he scored his first goal of the season in the 50th minute, a curling, right-footed shot over the head of Andre Blake into the far corner. The New England Revolution (7-14-2; 23 pts.) played to a 1-1 draw with FC Dallas (8-11-5; 29 pts.) on Saturday night at Gillette Stadium. Revolution Homegrown defender **Peyton Miller**, 16, earned his first MLS start at left back on Saturday, becoming the second-youngest player to start a regular season match in club history. Miller helped create New England's lone goal along with **Bobby Wood**, who forced an own goal in the 65th minute.

Miller nearly opened his scoring account twice in the opening 10 minutes. The Unionville, Conn. native fired a shot off a corner kick that was blocked in the fourth minute, before striking the outside of the post from a narrow angle moments later. Fellow defender **Xavier Arreaga** also had quality scoring chance in the first half, sending a header over the bar on two occasions.

Miller was vital in creating New England's goal 20 minutes into the second half. A lofted long ball from **Mark-Anthony Kaye** found the foot of Miller, who whipped in a cross towards Wood that was redirected into the net off FC Dallas defender Nkosi Tafari. Wood started for a second consecutive contest, logging the full 90 minutes and finishing with a team high-four shots.

FC Dallas equalized in second-half stoppage time, with captain Paul Arriola converting a penalty kick. With the result, New England moves to 3-2-1 in the last six home games.

POSTGAME NOTES

- Homegrown defender **Peyton Miller** made his first MLS start, three days after earning his league debut for the first team. At 16 years, 255 days old, he is the second youngest player to start a match for the club behind Diego Fagundez (16 years, 229 days).
- Miller** was one of three Revolution Homegrowns to feature in Saturday's match, joined in the starting lineup by **Esmir Bajraktarevic** and by second-half substitute **Jack Panayotou**.
- Bajraktarevic** finished the night with a team-high three key passes.

The New England Revolution (8-14-2; 26 pts.) returned to MLS play with a 5-0 victory on the road at CF Montreal (6-11-9; 27 pts.) on Saturday night at Stade Saputo. **Bobby Wood** opened the scoring with two first-half goals and **Carles Gil** marked his return to the lineup with a pair of assists, matching Steve Ralston (82) for the most assists in club history across all competitions. Forward **Luca Langoni** made his MLS debut, logging a goal and an assist off the bench in the second half. **Ian Harkes** pitched in with two assists as a substitute, while **Giacomo Vriani** and **Nick Lima** also added goals.

New England got out on the front foot early, with Wood scoring just seven minutes into the contest. Carles Gil sprung a pass down the wing to **Brandon Bye**, who whipped in a cross to Wood at the top of the six-yard box for a one-time finish. Wood, making his 50th Revolution appearance, scored for the third straight match in all competitions. Bye logged his first assist in MLS this season, his second in as many games, before an ankle injury cut his night short only five minutes later. Wood added a second goal in the 37th minute, giving the Hawaiian forward his first multi-goal game in MLS.

Gil, playing in his first match since June 22 after missing nine games with a leg injury, made it five straight MLS appearances with an assist, matching his own club record. The Spaniard also set up **Nick Lima's** tally in the 71st minute with a well-placed cross to the center of the penalty area, which Vriani dummied to allow the defender to fire it home. Gil's second multi-assist performance of the campaign ties him for the most helpers by a Revolution player in all contests. Gil is now the fourth-fastest player in MLS history to reach 70 regular season assists, doing so in 151 games.

The second half saw the return of forwards Vriani and **Dylan Borrero** from injury, who both came off the bench in the 66th minute. Langoni also entered the game for New England in the second half to make his club and MLS debut. Vriani scored his seventh goal in his last seven league appearances, and nearly had a second goal called back for offside. Langoni finished the scoring four minutes later, firing a shot off the hands of Sirois off a feed from **Dylan Borrero**. The Argentine, who arrived on a club-record transfer from Boca Juniors, is the first Revolution player to register a goal and an assist in his club debut. **Ian Harkes** was credited with a pair of secondary assists on the final two goals of the night, his first multi-assist game in MLS. In goal, **Aljaž Ivačić** collected his third shutout of the season with a foursave effort in goal. **Will Sands** made his first Revolution start in his first league appearance for the club, replacing an injured **Peyton Miller**.

The New England Revolution (8-15-3; 27 pts.) battled St. Louis CITY SC (5-10-13; 28 pts.) to a 2-2 draw on Saturday night with 30,512 fans on hand at Gillette Stadium. Forward **Luca Langoni** tallied his second goal with the club in his first MLS start, while **Carles Gil** scored his sixth goal of the campaign. Defender **Will Sands** registered his first career multi-assist game as he helped set up both New England goals.

Former Revolution defender Henry Kessler, in his return to Foxborough, opened the scoring for St. Louis in the 23rd minute, looping a header off a Marcel Hartel corner over New England goalkeeper **Aljaž Ivačič**. Kessler, who spent the first four-and-a-half seasons of his MLS career in New England, was traded to St. Louis in August in exchange for **Tim Parker**. Parker made his Revolution debut in the match, as the 2023 MLS Best XI defender made his first start for the club.

Despite the early setback, the Revolution kept their composure and equalized only five minutes later off the foot of Langoni. The 22-year-old Argentine, making his Gillette Stadium debut after arriving from Boca Juniors in a club-record transfer, touched a driven pass from Sands around Kessler before slotting home the finish from a tight angle through the legs of St. Louis goalkeeper Roman Bürki.

After setting up the first goal, Sands helped create the go-ahead strike in the 40th minute. The left back fed a lateral pass to **Carles Gil**, who kissed a shot from 20 yards off the post and into the net for the Revs' second of the night. Gil's goal, his sixth of the season, was the captain's 125th goal contribution for the club across all competitions. Sands finished the night with a team-high three key passes.

Leading by a goal, the Revolution and St. Louis dueled throughout an evenly matched second half, before Simon Becher tied it up in the 72nd minute. Becher tucked a low shot past Ivačič, who registered nine saves on the night to match his career high. The Revolution nearly had an opportunity to answer when the referee went to the monitor to review a potential handball against St. Louis, though the penalty was not given and the two teams were forced to split the points.

The goal was Wood's third of the campaign, all coming against Montreal. Miller registered his first MLS helper on the goal, becoming the eighth-youngest player in MLS history to record an assist.

Gil set up the second Revolution goal 11 minutes later, feeding Bajraktarević who dribbled to his left and laced a shot past a diving Jonathan Sirois. The goal was Bajraktarević's third strike of the MLS campaign, a career high for the teenager. Gil's second assist of the game gives him double-digit helpers for the fifth time in his six MLS seasons, and the fourth year in a row.

Montreal leveled the match with a pair of goals 14 minutes apart in the second half. Tom Pearce curled in a free kick from 25 yards out to cut the deficit in half, before Nathan Saliba equalized in the 68th minute, firing a shot into the top-left corner from the top of the box.

POSTGAME NOTES

- **Carles Gil** tallied two assists to tie Steve Ralston (73) for the most assists in Revolution club history (MLS regular season).
- **Gil**, who has now found the scoresheet in seven of his last nine league appearances, has notched 10-or-more assists in all five of his complete seasons with the club, excluding only the shortened 2020 season.

The New England Revolution (8-17-4; 28 pts.) fell on the road at Charlotte FC (11-11-8; 41 pts.), 4-0, on Saturday afternoon at Bank of America Stadium. Nigerian Midfielder **Alhassan Yusuf** suited up for his first MLS start and third consecutive appearance. On the defensive end, 16-year-old Homegrown Player **Peyton Miller** recorded his second straight full 90-minute performance.

New England kept pace with Charlotte FC for the majority of the opening half, battling the home side to a scoreless stalemate. Charlotte FC broke the deadlock just minutes before the halftime whistle, with forward Liel Abada opening the scoring in the 39th minute. Defender Nathan Byrne doubled the lead with a 51st-minute tally.

Down 2-0, New England attempted to ramp up its attack by deploying wingers **Dylan Borrero** and **Luca Langoni** off the bench in the 56th minute. Borrero, however, was ejected from the match after being shown two yellow cards in the 70th minute. Charlotte FC made the most of the man advantage, netting two more goals over the final minutes to seal its 4-0 victory. Langoni has now appeared in six consecutive matches since joining the Revolution on a club-record transfer fee via the MLS U22 Initiative in August. Yusuf, who also joined the Secondary Transfer Window last month, continues to log extended playing time with a 75-minute performance today.

Homegrown Player **Esmir Bajraktarević** featured in the starting lineup for the second straight game, helping guide the attack with three shots, one on target, and three chances created. Forward **Giacomo Vrioni** matched his career-best mark of six shot attempts in today's match, a game-high, including two on target.

Defender **Brandon Bye** collected his first minutes since sustaining an ankle injury last month. Bye tallied one shot and one chance created over a 66-minute outing. Also in New England's defense, Miller, a Unionville, Conn. native, continues to earn valuable minutes in his first season on New England's senior team. Miller now owns five matches started across seven appearances in 2024.

The New England Revolution (9-17-4; 31 pts.) defeated Nashville SC (8-14-9; 33 pts.), 1-0, on Saturday night in front of 42,312 fans at Gillette Stadium, the fifth-largest home crowd in club history. **Brandon Bye** headed home his first goal of the season in the 86th minute, assisted by two of New England's summer signings, **Luca Langoni** and **Alhassan Yusuf**.

In their penultimate home match of the season, the Revolution dueled Nashville to a scoreless first half, which featured two saves from Revolution goalkeeper **Aljaž Ivačić**. Making his 75th MLS appearance, Ivačić made a point-blank stop on Alex Muyl's attempt in the eighth minute, and then denied Sam Surridge with a quick reaction in the 26th minute. Ivačić finished the night with four saves to collect his fourth shutout of the season.

New England took advantage of the home support to apply pressure in the second half. **Giacomo Vrioni**, the Revs' leading scorer on the year, recorded two shot attempts, both of which were blocked. The Revolution finally broke the deadlock in the 86th minute when Bye got his head to a precise cross from Langoni. The assist was Langoni's second in MLS, and his fourth goal involvement through his first seven MLS matches.

Yusuf, making his fourth appearance and second consecutive start since joining the club in late August, was credited with a secondary assist on the play. The helper was his first with New England. Including tonight's victory, the Nigerian midfielder has completed over 90 percent of his passes in each of his first four appearances with the Revolution.

Behind Yusuf in central defense, **Dave Romney** helped deliver the clean sheet against his former club, while **Xavier Arreaga** recorded his 100th MLS regular season start, coming on his 30th birthday. Meanwhile, Homegrown defender **Peyton Miller** notched his fifth consecutive start, playing all 90 minutes for the fourth time in that span.

The New England Revolution (9-18-4; 31 pts.) fell to Houston Dynamo FC (14-9-9; 51 pts.), 2-1, on Wednesday night at Shell Energy Stadium. **Carles Gil** converted from the penalty spot for New England's lone goal, his seventh of the campaign, but the Revolution could not overcome two second-half tallies by the hosts.

New England kept steady pressure on Houston throughout the 90 minutes, generating 3.2 expected goals on 18 shot attempts in the match. The Revs nearly found the breakthrough twice in the opening 13 minutes, first when **Bobby Wood** got on the end of a cross by **Brandon Bye**, blasting a first-timed shot off the chest of Houston goalkeeper Steve Clark from close range. Moments later, Bye again provided service to the center of the box for **Alhassan Yusuf**, who had his first effort blocked before sending the rebound wide.

Revolution goalkeeper **Aljaž Ivačić**, making his 75th MLS start, was called into action in the 25th minute for his first save of the night, denying a Sebastian Kowalczyk volley with a diving stop to keep the match scoreless. The Slovenian finished the night with five saves, including a pair of point-blank stops in the opening three minutes of the second half.

Ezequiel Ponce put Houston ahead in the 50th minute, tucking a long-range effort into the bottom right corner. New England equalized four minutes later from the penalty spot, with Carles Gil converting the Revolution's first penalty attempt of the regular season. The penalty kick was awarded after forward **Luca Langoni** was hauled down in the box by Houston's Artur. Erik Sviatchenko restored the Houston lead with a powerful volley off a free kick in the 68th minute, with Coco Carrasquilla adding his second assist of the night.

New England generated several late chances in an attempt to rescue a point, with forward **Giacomo Vrioni** adding a spark off the bench. The Albanian striker, making his 75th Revolution appearance in all competitions, delivered three shot attempts, including one on target that was saved by Clark. Carles Gil was denied a brace in the 75th minute, with Clark parrying away the captain's curling effort.

The New England Revolution (9-19-4; 31 pts.) were defeated by D.C. United (10-13-10; 40 pts.), 2-1, on Saturday night with 44,110 fans at Gillette Stadium, marking the club's second-largest home crowd for a standalone regular season game. With Saturday's result, New England has been eliminated from playoff contention.

The visitors began the night on the front foot, stunning the Revolution with two tallies in the opening eight minutes with goals from Pedro Santos and Major League Soccer's leading scorer, Christian Benteke. New England eventually settled into the match, limiting United's attacking chances for the rest of the half, but went into the break trailing by two goals.

Forward **Dylan Borrero** entered the match for New England to start the second stanza, immediately adding a spark to the Revolution attack as he forced D.C. goalkeeper Alex Bono into a save in the 50th minute. Borrero and **Nacho Gil** tied for the team lead with three shots each. **Esmir Bajraktarević** also came on as a substitute and contributed two shot attempts in his 29-minute shift.

The Revolution lost captain and attacking talisman **Carles Gil** midway through the second half to injury, with **Ian Harkes** entering the match in his place. Harkes helped cut the deficit in half against his former club by generating an own goal in the 75th minute, playing a cross that ricocheted off D.C. defender Matti Peltola into the net.

An equalizer seemed inevitable as New England piled on the pressure in the closing stages. A pair of set piece opportunities from just outside the penalty area nearly found their targets. However, the final whistle sounded before the Revolution could find a second goal. The result dropped the Revs' home record to 5-8-4 in the regular season as the loss takes them out of postseason contention.

In the second half, Lionel Messi came on as a substitute and lifted the hosts to victory with three goals and an assist.

Similar to the season's first meeting with Inter Miami, New England began the night on the front foot by tallying a goal within the opening two minutes of the match. Langoni raced onto a through ball from Yusuf and fired a shot on goal. The deflection fell kindly to the 22-year-old, who poked it around Inter Miami goalkeeper Drake Callender for his third tally of the year, coming only 73 seconds into the match. Langoni concludes the 2024 season with five goal contributions in his first 10 MLS appearances.

The Revolution doubled their lead in the 34th minute when Borrero tapped the ball through the legs of Callender. The Colombian netted his first goal of the season in his 10th start of the year. Yusuf, who returned to action after missing one game while on international duty with Nigeria, registered his second helper in MLS on the play. However, in the 40th minute, Suarez pulled one back for the hosts and tacked on the equalizer minutes later, leveling the proceedings at 2-2 heading into the intermission.

New England continued to press for a result in the second half, seeing two scoring opportunities from **Giacomo Vrioni** miss just wide of the mark. The match tilted in Miami's favor when Lionel Messi entered in the 57th minute. With his first touch, Messi set up the go-ahead goal from Benjamin Cremaschi. **Bobby Wood** appeared to get the Revolution back on level terms when he bungled his own deflected shot over the line, but the goal was called back for a handling offense.

Messi closed the scoring with three goals of his own to put the game out of reach. With the result, Inter Miami surpassed the Revolution's 2021 regular season points total (73) to set a new MLS record with 74 points.

The New England Revolution defeated CA Independiente, 1-0, on Wednesday night in the first leg of Round One of the 2024 Concacaf Champions Cup at Estadio Universitario F.C. **Tomás Chancalay** netted the game-winning goal in the early stages of the second half, converting on **Giacomo Vrioni's** assist. On the defensive end, goalkeeper **Henrich Ravas** highlighted his Revolution debut with a shutout performance. The Revolution will carry the one-goal advantage to Leg 2 of the Round One series next Thursday, Feb. 29 (8:15 p.m. ET on FS2, TUDN) at Gillette Stadium.

Chancalay carried New England's attack in tonight's victory with a team-high six shots, including two on target. After battling through a scoreless first half, New England took the lead in the 55th minute as **Nacho Gil** sailed the ball from midfield toward the top of the box, where Vrioni sent a header toward Chancalay. The Argentine winger found the back of the net with a right-footed shot to give New England a 1-0 advantage.

In defense, outside back **Nick Lima** helped guide New England's backline in the shut-out effort with a full 90-minute outing in the veteran's Revolution debut. **Dave Romney**, who registered his seventh Concacaf Champions Cup appearance, led the Revolution in central defense, alongside **Andrew Farrell**. A pair of Homegrown Players registered their debuts in the continental tournament in midfielders **Noel Buck** and **Esmir Bajraktarević**, who both appeared off the bench.

The New England Revolution defeated CA Independiente, 3-0, on Thursday night in Leg 2 of Round One of the 2024 Concacaf Champions Cup at Gillette Stadium. **Nacho Gil** and **Mark-Anthony Kaye** both tallied their first goals with the Revolution, while **Tomás Chancalay** recorded his second of the tournament to help secure a 4-0 aggregate victory over the two matches. The Revolution move on to the Round of 16 in the 2024 Concacaf Champions Cup as the squad now prepares to face off against Costa Rican side LD Alajuelense.

Nacho Gil gave New England an early 1-0 lead in the ninth minute, scoring on a touch pass from older brother **Carles Gil** for his first goal in a Revolution uniform. The assist was the third helper across four career Concacaf Champions Cup appearances for Carles Gil. The Revolution extended their lead in the 58th minute, when **Tomás Chancalay** tapped in a pass from Homegrown Player **Esmir Bajraktarević**. The New England Revolution defeated LD Alajuelense, 4-0, in the opening leg of the Round of 16 in the 2024 Concacaf Champions Cup on Wednesday night at Gillette Stadium. **Nick Lima** and **Esmir Bajraktarević** each scored to bookend a brace from **Tomás Chancalay**, whose two tallies put him in a tie for the tournament lead with four goals in New England's three Champions Cup matches this season. The shutout also marks the third for New England in as many games in the tournament. New England carries a 4-0 lead on aggregate into the second leg matchup next Thursday, March 14 in Costa Rica.

After withstanding early pressure from Alajuelense, the Revolution took the lead in the 28th minute when **DeJuan Jones** combined with Lima for the opening tally, his first goal with New England since joining the club in the offseason. The right back later added an assist on Bajraktarević's second-half strike, with the Homegrown midfielder tapping in a cross from Lima to ice New England's victory.

Minutes before halftime, New England doubled the lead when midfielder **Ian Harkes** forced a turnover with a strong tackle in the center circle, allowing **Nacho Gil** to find Chancalay for his first goal of the match. The Argentine added a second tally from the penalty spot just five minutes into the second half. Following a handball in the box in the 50th minute, Chancalay smashed the spot kick down the middle to secure his third multi-goal game with New England, and his fourth goal of the tournament.

Wednesday's win marks Head Coach **Caleb Porter's** 10th win in Concacaf Champions Cup action behind goalkeeper **Henrich Ravas'** three-save shutout – the team's third consecutive clean sheet in the tournament. Entering tonight, New England was one of only three teams not to concede a goal in Round One. Ravas anchored a veteran backline comprised of Jones and Lima flanking **Dave Romney** and **Jonathan Mensah**, the latter making his first start at Gillette Stadium as a member of the Revolution.

The New England Revolution secured a 1-1 result against LD Alajuelense in Leg 2 of the 2024 Concacaf Champions Cup Round of 16 at Estadio Alejandro Morera Soto in Costa Rica, winning the series 5-1 on aggregate. New England advances to the Quarterfinal Round of the continental tournament for the second time in three years, where it will face the current top-ranked club in Concacaf and the defending LIGA MX champions, Club América, to battle for a semifinal berth in the continental tournament.

New England, carrying a four-goal advantage into Thursday's second-leg away match, eliminated LD Alajuelense from the Champions Cup for the first time in three meetings. Tonight's 1-1 draw gives New England an unbeaten 3-0-1 record in the tournament, where it is outscoring opponents 9-1, while the club's record against Central American opponents moves to 4-2-2.

Alajuelense's Carlos Mora opened the scoring in the fourth minute, but the Revolution then settled into the match and limited the host's scoring chances for much of the night. Goalkeeper **Henrich Ravas** started his seventh game of the season and made five saves. Alajuelense's early goal was the only score conceded by New England through 360 minutes of action in the tournament thus far.

With New England trailing by a goal in the second half, forward **Giacomo Vrioni** provided a spark off the bench and delivered his first goal of the 2024 season in the 81st minute, assisted by **Esmir Bajraktarević**. Vrioni now has one goal and two assists in three Champions Cup appearances this year.

Midfielder **Matt Polster** donned the captain's armband for the Revolution and completed 98 percent of his passes in his 125th appearance for the club across all competitions. **Nacho Gil** and **Tomás Chancalay** each made their fourth starts of the tournament, with the latter recording two shots on target in his 57-minute shift.

The New England Revolution fell, 4-0, to Club América on Tuesday night at Gillette Stadium in Concacaf Champions Cup action. New England will look to overcome the four-goal deficit on aggregate in the second leg matchup next Tuesday, April 9, in Mexico City. The 10:30 p.m. ET kickoff at Estadio Azteca will air nationally on FOX Sports 1 in English and TUDN in Spanish.

Club América began the match on the front foot, breaking the deadlock in the 16th minute through Henry Martín. Following a Revolution giveaway at midfield, the visitors countered quickly, with the ball eventually finding Javairô Dilrosun on the right side of the penalty area. The Dutch winger sent a low cross to Martín, who turned and sent a shot through the hands of New England goalkeeper **Earl Edwards Jr.** for the early lead.

The LIGA MX frontrunners doubled the advantage eight minutes later, as Martín combined with Alejandro Zendejas. The striker threaded a through ball into the path of Zendejas, who cut back and fired a shot into the top left corner of the net. Cristian Calderón added a third in the 63rd minute for Club América, tapping home a rebound from close range. In the 90th minute, Brian Rodríguez finished off the scoring, slotting home a weighted pass from Diego Valdes.

New England created attacking chances late in the second half. First, **Tomás Chancalay** picked up a loose ball at the top of the penalty area and fired a shot that forced Club América goalkeeper Luis Malagon into an awkward save. The New England Revolution fell on the road to Club América, 5-2, on Tuesday night at historic Estadio Azteca in the second leg of the 2024 Concacaf Champions Cup Quarterfinals. **Giacomo Vrioni** bagged a brace for New England, with both goals assisted by **Esmir Bajraktarević**, as the Revolution's Concacaf Champions Cup campaign comes to a close following the two-leg aggregate defeat.

Vrioni tallied his second goal in this year's Concacaf Champions Cup in the 65th minute, flicking a header off the post and just over the goal line. The cross came off a corner from Bajraktarević, who was credited with his team-leading third assist of Champions Cup play. In the final moments of second-half stoppage time, the two connected again with Vrioni scraping home the deflected cross from Bajraktarević.

For Club América, Julián Quiñones and Diego Valdes linked up twice in the opening 34 minutes to give the hosts an early two-goal lead. Club América added a third goal just before the break, as Luis Fuentes set up Henry Martín. On the other side of halftime, the hosts struck again with Alejandro Zendejas finishing off a counter-attack off a slipped pass from Brian Rodríguez. In the 76th minute, Rodríguez converted a penalty to wrap up the scoring for the hosts.

The New England Revolution began the Leagues Cup 2024 campaign with a 1-0 victory over LIGA MX side Mazatlán FC at Gillette Stadium in the first of two Group Stage matches. Revolution Homegrown midfielder **Jack Panayotou** tallied his first goal for the first team in the 69th minute to provide the difference in the match.

In the teams' first meeting, New England and Mazatlán played to a scoreless first half, with the most promising shot coming from MLS veteran **Tommy McNamara**, who just missed placing his header inside the far post in the 45th minute. McNamara made his Leagues Cup debut in tonight's match, in his second straight start for New England.

New England broke the deadlock in the 69th minute when the 20-year-old Panayotou tallied his first goal. **Matt Polster**, wearing the captain's armband once again, recorded his second Leagues Cup assist with the low cross, which took a deflection from Mazatlán's goalkeeper and found Panayotou, who tapped it in for the game winner. The Cambridge, Mass. native, named the 2022 UnitedHealthcare Revolution Academy Player of the Year, has now made six appearances this season, including four starts in the last five games.

Defender **Henry Kessler** and Homegrown player **Peyton Miller** also made their first Leagues Cup appearances tonight. Miller, a 16-year-old Unionville, Conn. native who was named to the MLS Team of the Matchday last weekend, suited up for his second consecutive start at left back. Kessler and Miller both helped contribute to the clean sheet, along with goalkeeper **Aljaž Ivačić**, who made two clutch saves and registered his fourth shutout in 15 starts for New England.

Tonight's match marked the sixth different LIGA MX opponent the Revolution have faced since the start of 2022, with a 4-3-2 record over the last three seasons. The team's all-time home record against LIGA MX clubs improves to 10-2-3, while the New England moves to 10-4-3 against Mexican clubs overall.

The New England Revolution played to a 1-1 draw with Nashville SC on Tuesday night at Gillette Stadium in their Leagues Cup 2024 group stage finale. New England claimed a 5-4 victory in the subsequent penalty shootout to earn the additional point on the night. **Bobby Wood** netted his first goal of 2024, while **Jack Panayotou** registered his first assist this year and second goal contribution of the tournament, clinching New England a place in the Leagues Cup 2024 Round of 32 as the East Group 5 winner.

New England captured the lead early with Wood getting a foot on the end of Panayotou's cross in the third minute. The goal was Wood's first of the season, as the Hawaii native made his fourth straight start. Panayotou, who scored the winner in the first group stage game against Mazatlán FC, has now found the scoresheet in both Leagues Cup 2024 matches. Nashville's Sam Surridge equalized in first-half stoppage time, evening the score just before halftime.

The Revolution and Nashville battled to a scoreless second half, with **Aljaž Ivačić** posting three of his four saves on the night in the final 45 minutes. Ivačić had two crucial saves for New England in the second half, including a stop on a deflected Nashville blast in the 61st minute. The Slovenian made another diving save in the 79th minute, before making one stop in the shootout to help secure the win.

The Revolution's defensive line featured **Brandon Bye** and 16-year-old Homegrown player **Peyton Miller** on the wings, with **Xavier Arreaga** and **Dave Romney** in the middle. Miller, making his third straight start for the club, was replaced in the second half by defender **Will Sands**, who made his club debut after being acquired from Columbus in a trade on July 31.

The New England Revolution battled New York City FC to a 1-1 draw on a rainy Friday night at Gillette Stadium in the Leagues Cup 2024 Round of 32, falling in the subsequent penalty shootout, 7-6. Forward **Bobby Wood** notched his second goal in as many games, while defender **Brandon Bye** recorded his first assist of the year. The visitors topped New England in the ensuing penalty shootout, 7-6, to end the Revolution's Leagues Cup run in the first round of the Knockout Stage.

As the rain fell in Foxborough, New York City opened the scoring in the 35th minute after a video review awarded the visitors an opportunity from the spot. Santiago Rodriguez converted the attempt for his second goal of Leagues Cup 2024. New England quickly rallied, with Wood leveling the score just five minutes later. The Hawaiian forward buried a header from close range, capitalizing on a stellar cross from Bye on the right flank. Wood's tally marked his second goal of the tournament, while the helper was Bye's first since returning from an injury suffered in last year's Leagues Cup tournament.

Wood nearly recorded a brace before the halftime whistle, as the striker received a low, driven cross from left back **Peyton Miller** in the center of the 18-yard box, but his shot skipped wide of the right post. Earlier in the 29th minute, Wood found the back of the net with a powerful shot from outside the area, but an offside call nullified the goal.

Miller, 16, played 79 minutes in his fourth consecutive start and paced the team with two key passes on the night. In central defense, **Xavier Arreaga** completed a game-best 96.2 percent of his pass attempts. Goalkeeper **Aljaž Ivačič** posted a five-save performance in net tonight, including an impressive tip over the bar on a drilled shot by New York City forward Santiago Rodríguez.

In the 79th minute, defender **Will Sands** made his second appearance for the club in as many games. He played against his twin brother and New York City midfielder, James Sands, for the first time in their professional careers. Revolution Homegrown player and Groton, Mass. native, **Malcolm Fry** also entered the match as a second-half substitute, marking the local forward's third appearance with Revolution's first team.
