CLEVELAND-PHOENIX CONNECTIONS

A CAVALIER ASSIST: Phoenix Suns assistant coach Marc Iavaroni spent two seasons (1997-99) as an assistant coach under Mike Fratello when Fratello coached the Cavaliers.

BANISHED KNIGHT: The Cleveland Cavaliers selected current Phoenix Suns backup point guard Brevin Knight with the 16th pick of the 1997 NBA Draft. He was traded to Atlanta in the 2000-01 season for Jim Jackson, Anthony Johnson and Larry Robinson.

M AND M'S: Cleveland Cavaliers center Jelani McCoy and Phoenix Suns point guard Stephon Marbury were teammates on the 1995 USA Junior National Select Team.

HIGH PICK HIGH SCHOOLERS: Phoenix Suns power forward Amare Stoudemire (No. 9) was the only player selected directly from high school in the 2002 NBA Draft. Cleveland Cavaliers guard/forward LeBron James was the first (No. 1 overall) of five high schoolers selected in the 2003 NBA Draft.

TOP TIGERS: Cleveland Cavaliers guard Dajuan Wagner was the highest picked player from the University of Memphis (No. 6 in 2002 NBA Draft) since Phoenix Suns guard Anfernee Hardaway was selected with the third overall pick in the 1993 NBA Draft.

NOT NUMBER ONE: The Phoenix Suns have never had the first overall pick in the NBA Draft since the franchise's inception in 1968. The Cleveland Cavaliers entered the league two years later and have had three number one picks – Austin Carr (1971), Brad Daughtery (1986) and LeBron James (2003).

CAVALIERS – SUNS GAME NOTES

NEW SEASON, SAME BEGINNINGS: The 2003-04 Cleveland Cavaliers season begins much like last season did. The Cavaliers will play the Phoenix Suns in the second game of this season; last season they played in the Cavaliers' third game. The Cavaliers-Suns game is also part of a three-game road trip, just as it was last season.

GOT YOUR BACK: The Cleveland Cavaliers-Phoenix Suns game marks the tail end of the first back-to-back series of the season for the Cavaliers. Cleveland has 20 scheduled back-to-back situations this season.

SUNS DOWN: The Cleveland Cavaliers dropped both games to the Phoenix Suns last season. The Suns have defeated the Cavaliers in seven of their past eight games.

Z'S ON BOARD: Cleveland Cavaliers center Zydrunas Ilgauskas grabbed a career-high (and Cavaliers-Phoenix series high) 22 rebounds when the Cavaliers played the Phoenix Suns in their third game last season on November 1, 2002.

AS SEEN ON TV: The Cleveland Cavaliers will be televised nationally (TNT, 10:30 p.m. EST) for the second straight game. The Cavaliers will appear on national television 13 times this season.

CAVALIERS LAST GAME

KINGS 106, CAVALIERS 92 – ARCO Arena, Sacramento, CA (10/29/03)

The Cleveland Cavaliers hung tough on the road in Sacramento but dropped its season opener, 106-92 to the Kings. LeBron James scored 25 points, dished out nine assists and grabbed six rebounds to lead the Cavaliers in his NBA debut. Cleveland took the lead at the 10:53 mark of the third quarter (85-83) on a J.R. Bremer three-pointer, but the Kings would pull away down the stretch for the win. Bremer hit a career-high tying six 3FG and Carlos Boozer collected his first double-double of the season (14 pts and 11 rebs).

CAVALIERS RECENT GAMES

CAVALIERS 108, WIZARDS 92 (PRESEASON) – Gund Arena, Cleveland, OH (10/22/03)

LeBron James scored 11 of his preseason-high 19 points in the fourth quarter to help the Cavaliers defeat the Washington Wizards 108-92. The Cavaliers outscored the Wizards 34-16 in the fourth period, playing the entire quarter without committing a turnover. Five Cavaliers (Ilgauskas, James, Davis, Boozer and Bremer) scored in double figures en route to a preseason-high 108 points. Gilbert Arenas led the Wizards and all scorers with 29 points. The victory moved the Cavaliers to 4-3 in the preseason while dropping Washington to 2-5.

CAVALIERS 102, LAKERS 87 (PRESEASON) – Centennial Gardens, Bakersfield, CA (10/19/03)

The Cavaliers outscored the Lakers 32-12 in the second quarter and coasted to a 102-87 win, snapping a three-game losing skid. Ricky Davis hit on 11-16 FG in scoring a game-high 27 points, including 5-6 FG in the game's opening quarter. LeBron James recorded his first preseason double-double and Kevin Ollie came off the bench to score 15 points and dish out five assists in the win. Cleveland out-rebounded L.A. 44-27 and the Cavaliers led by as much as 26 points at the start of the third quarter.

CLIPPERS 95, CAVALIERS 90 (PRESEASON) – STAPLES Center, Los Angeles, CA (10/17/03)

Cleveland lost its third consecutive game, falling 95-90 in Los Angeles to the Clippers. Rookie LeBron James scored a game-high 16 points in a tightly-contested game. The Clippers used a big fourth quarter by reserve guard Eddie House to pull away from the Cavaliers. House scored all of his 12 points in the final seven minutes of the game, helping the Clippers turn a one-point deficit into a nine-point lead at one point. The loss dropped the Cavaliers to 2-3 in the preseason.

LAKERS 86, CAVALIERS 78 (PRESEASON) – STAPLES Center, Los Angeles, CA (10/16/03)

Cleveland dropped its second consecutive game, falling 86-78 in Los Angeles to the Lakers. The Lakers jumped out quickly taking a 47-33 lead at halftime. Cleveland however responded in the third quarter, using an 18-6 run in the first seven minutes of the second half to climb back within two. The Cavaliers led by as many as four with 7:19 left in the game but the Lakers stormed back, led by Karl Malone, outscoring the Cavaliers 18-10 down the stretch for the victory.

CLEVELAND-PORTLAND CONNECTIONS

BLAZER TRADER: Cleveland Cavaliers Team President and General Manager Jim Paxson has a long history with the Portland Trailblazers. He played nine seasons with the club after being selected in the 1979 NBA Draft by Portland (12th overall). He was a two-time NBA All-Star and was named second-team All-NBA Second Team in 1984. He was selected to the Trailblazers 25th Anniversary “Legendary Lineup”. After finishing his playing career, he also returned to Portland as an offensive skills coach in 1993-94.

CAVALIERS ON GUARD: Portland Trailblazers guard Derek Anderson was drafted by the Cleveland Cavaliers with the 13th pick in the first round of the 1997 NBA Draft. Anderson played two years with the team before being traded to the Clippers with Johnny Newman for Lamond Murray.

FOLLOW THE LEADER: Portland Trailblazers assistant coach Jim Lynam followed Cleveland Cavaliers head coach Paul Silas as coach of the San Diego Clippers from 1983-85. Silas coached the Clippers from 1980 until 1983.

BRUIN REUNION: Cleveland Cavaliers center Jelani McCoy and forward Jason Kapon and Portland Trailblazers forward Tracy Murray all attended UCLA. McCoy is UCLA’s all-time season field goal percentage leader at 69.4 percent. Kapon is the school’s leader in three-point field goals made (253) and attempted (549). Murray has the highest season three-point percentage, shooting 50 percent in 1992.

HIGH PICK HIGH SCHOOLERS: Cleveland Cavaliers guard/forward LeBron James and Portland Trailblazers forward Travis Outlaw were the only high schoolers picked in the top 25 of the 2003 NBA Draft. James was taken with the first overall pick while Outlaw was picked by the Blazers with the 23rd pick in the first round.

TRAIL BACK TO OHIO: Portland Trailblazers assistant coach John Loyer attended college at nearby University of Akron.

CAVALIERS – TRAILBLAZERS GAME NOTES

THIS DAY IN HISTORY: The Cleveland Cavaliers and Portland Trailblazers met on the same date, Nov. 1 last season. The Trailblazers defeated the Cavaliers, 118-94.

PLAYOFF STREAKING: The Cleveland Cavaliers and Portland Trailblazers entered in the NBA in 1970, but have far different playoff histories. The Cavaliers have made the playoffs in 13 of their 33 total seasons (the last trip in the 1997-98 season). The Trailblazers have made it to the postseason in 26 of their 33 seasons, including an NBA-high 21 years straight.

FALLING HARD: The Cleveland Cavaliers dropped both games to the Portland Trailblazers last season. The Trailblazers won by large margins each game, the first, 118-94, and the second, a 114-95 win at Gund Arena.

NOT A BED OF ROSES: The Cleveland Cavaliers have won only 13 times in 46 trips to Portland.

BRICKHOUSE: The Cleveland Cavaliers and Portland Trailblazers were two of the league’s worst three-point shooting teams last season. The Trailblazers finished 24th in the league last season from behind the three-point line with the Cavaliers right behind in 25th place.

CAVALIERS TEAM NOTES

ROOKIE SENSATION: LeBron James totaled 25 points, six rebounds and nine assists in his NBA debut against Sacramento. He joined a group of three other players who had 25+ points and 9+ assists in their NBA debuts (Oscar Robertson, Isiah Thomas and Guy Rodgers). He also tallied the most points for any player that jumped right to the NBA following high school.

KILLER B'S: Carlos Boozer set a career-high in blocks with four against Sacramento and collected his first double-double of the season while J.R. Bremer tied a career-high with six 3FGM in a 106-92 loss to the Kings on October 29.

IT ALL BEGINS: The Cavaliers finished the 2003 preseason with a record of 4-3, its best record since 1997 when the club went 5-2. Zydrunas Ilgauskas (15.0 ppg, 5.4 rpg), Ricky Davis (14.9 ppg), LeBron James (11.6 ppg, 5.0 rpg, 4.9 apg) and Carlos Boozer (9.3 ppg, 10.9 rpg) led the way for the Cavaliers.

POINTS TO GROW ON: Cleveland topped the 100 point plateau in its final two preseason games; a 102-87 victory in Bakersfield, CA over the Lakers and a 108-92 win at Gund Arena over the Washington Wizards. In the preseason, the Cavaliers averaged 91.7 points per game while allowing 89.0 points.

“NO”FOUNDLAND: Cleveland’s final preseason tune-up game on October 23 was cancelled due to unplayable court conditions at Mile One Stadium in St. John’s, Newfoundland. The Cavaliers game versus the Toronto Raptors was supposed to be the final game for both teams before the 2003-04 regular season started, but due to humidity in the building and condensation on the court, the game had to be cancelled.

SUBSTITUTE CARETAKERS: The Cavaliers committed just eight turnovers in their 108-92 victory over the Wizards on October 22. Heading into the game, the club was averaging 21.7 per game. In the contest, six Cavaliers were used as substitutes (Diop, Mihm, Ollie, Bremer, Kapon and McCoy) and none of them committed a turnover, while dishing out 11 assists, in a combined 101 minutes of action.

WAGNER SURGERY DELAYED: Surgery to repair Dajuan Wagner’s right knee, injured during training camp, is being delayed because of an inflammation of the liver and pancreas. Wagner will be re-evaluated on Friday (Oct. 24) and a date for surgery will be scheduled after the inflammation has subsided.

EARLY INDICATIONS: The Cleveland Cavaliers have had 12 preseasons in which they finished with better than a .500 record. Eight of those 12 teams finished their respective regular seasons above .500. The Cavaliers wrapped up the preseason with a 4-3 record.

ROOKIE PERSPECTIVE: Cavaliers rookie LeBron James begins his first season in the NBA following four years at St. Vincent-St. Mary high school in Akron, OH. Since Kevin Garnett’s departure to the NBA following high school in 1995, nine high schoolers have followed and been selected in the NBA Lottery. Here’s a look at the rookie-year statistics put up by lottery picks that went right to the pros following high school:

BOOZIN': Cavaliers second-year forward Carlos Boozer has picked up this preseason where he left off at the end of last season in terms of rebounding. Boozer averaged 10.9 rebounds per game which led the NBA in the preseason.

ON THE RISE: The Cleveland Cavaliers are a team to keep your eye on during the 2003-04 season according to the 29 NBA general managers. In the annual NBA.com general managers' survey, the Cavaliers were selected by 33 percent of GM's as the team that will be most improved this season. 33 percent also predicted Cleveland's acquisition of LeBron James will make the biggest impact of any acquired player this offseason. Fourteen percent believe the Cavaliers will be the most fun to watch this season while 81 percent thought James would not only win this year's rookie of the year award but would also be the best player in five years. Ten percent of GM's thought Paul Silas was the best coach at developing young players.

SEEING DOUBLE, SHOOTING WELL: Power forward Carlos Boozer scored 15 points on 7-of-9 shooting from the field and added a team-leading 14 rebounds in the Cavaliers preseason opener against the Pistons. Boozer led all Cavaliers last season in field goal percentage (.536) and double-doubles (21).

The new faces for the Cavaliers this year include a mix of veterans and younger players: Here's a look at the new additions to the Cleveland Cavaliers:

- J.R. BREMER** – acquired from Boston; Cleveland native; All-Rookie Second Team selection last season
- LeBRON JAMES** – consensus high school player of the year; led summer league team in scoring and assists
- JASON KAPONO** – UCLA MVP all four years of college, first team All-Pac 10 all four years
- JELANI McCOY** – leading FG percentage shooter in UCLA history, Cavaliers training camp invitee
- IRA NEWBLE** – played in 73 games for the Hawks; shot .495 FG% and .381 3FG %; free agent signee
- KEVIN OLLIE** – seasoned veteran, 10th team in seven seasons; played in Milwaukee/Seattle last year; free agent signee
- BRUNO SUNDOV** – 7-2 center played in a career-high 26 games for the Celtics last season

A NEW EXPRESSION: Not only will this year's Cavaliers team look different in terms of personnel, but the club also features a new logo and colors. The "New Expression of Wine and Gold" debuted at halftime of last season's final game and is in place as the 2003-04 season begins.

KEEPING SCORE: Both Ricky Davis and Zydrunas Ilgauskas improved drastically on their scoring numbers from the 2001-02 season. Here is a look at where each player ranked in terms of scoring improvement around the league during the 2002-03 season:
