2005-06 REGULAR SEASON IN REVIEW

82 GAMES AREN'T ENOUGH - The Bucks have advanced to the NBA playoffs for the 25th time in their 38-year history and for the 6th time in the last 8 seasons. The franchise owns 13 Division Titles (1971, 1972, 1973, 1974, 1976, 1980, 1981, 1982, 1983, 1984, 1985, 1986 and 2001) and owns 2 Conference Titles (1971 and 1974). They won the NBA Championship in 1971. This season, Milwaukee was one of two teams in the Eastern Conference (Cleveland) to make the playoffs after missing the postseason last year, and just one of four teams in the NBA to do so (LA Lakers and LA Clippers).

MAKING IMPROVEMENTS - The Bucks finished the 2005-06 regular season with a 40-42 record, a 10-win improvement from last year's 30-52 record. Their 10-game improvement is tied for the 6th-best improvement from one season to the next in team history (they've now done it three times ... during the 1970-71 season when their 66-16 record was 10 games better than their 56-26 record from the 1969-70 season and during the 2000-01 season when their 52-30 record was 10 games better than their 42-40 record from 1999-00).

ROSTER REVAMP - Only seven players from the Milwaukee's roster at the end of the 2004-05 season were on the team at the start of this season (T.J. Ford, Dan Gadzuric, Reece Gaines, Toni Kukoc, Michael Redd, Joe Smith and Mo Williams) and four of Milwaukee's regular season starters did not play for the Bucks last season (Andrew Bogut, Jamaal Magloire, Bobby Simmons and T.J. Ford) (Ford missed all of 2004-05 with an injury). In advancing to the playoffs, the Bucks became the first team in NBA history to make the playoffs with four new starters from the previous season.

A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING - The Bucks are looking to change history in this year's first round playoff series with Detroit. Milwaukee and Detroit have met three times in the NBA playoffs. The Pistons have won all three series. They edged the Bucks in the 1976 Western Conference first round (2-1). The Pistons swept the Bucks 4-0 in the 1989 Eastern Conference Semifinals on their way to their first NBA Championship. Detroit beat the Bucks again in the 2004 Eastern Conference first round (4-1).

LEADER OF THE PACK - Last season, Michael Redd became just the second Bucks player in franchise history to lead the team in scoring 50 times in one season. Kareem Abdul-Jabbar was the other, leading the Bucks in scoring 50 or more times in six straight seasons from 1969-75, including a high of 74 games during the 1971-72 season. Redd, who logged exactly 50 games in which he led the Bucks in scoring last year, topped that number this season by leading his club in points 63 times.

MR. 2,000 - Michael Redd finished the season with 2,028 points, becoming just the second player in franchise history to break the 2,000-point mark in a single season. Kareem Abdul-Jabbar did it in five of his six seasons in Milwaukee (from 1969-75), including a franchise-best 2,822 points during the 1971-72 season. Redd's 2,028 points were 252 more than his previous career-high of 1,776 set during the 2003-04 season.

NOT YOUR AVERAGE ... MICHAEL - Michael Redd's 2,028 points over 80 games resulted in a 25.4 scoring average, not just a career-high, but also the highest for a Buck since Marques Johnson averaged 25.6 points during the 1978-79 season. His 25.4 ppg stat ranked 9th in the NBA. Redd has increased his season scoring average in each of his six NBA seasons. He averaged 23.0 points per game during the 2004-05 season.

KNOCKING ON TOP TEN'S DOOR - Michael Redd began the 2005-06 season 16th on the team's all-time scoring list with 5,520 career points as a Buck. 2,028 points later, he sits alone in 11th with 7,548 career points, just 22 points shy of Ricky Pierce and 10th place (see chart to the right)

WE KNOW DRAMA - The Bucks set an NBA record this season by winning their first 13 games decided by 6 points or less (they were also 9-0 in games decided by 3 points or less). They became the first team in the shot clock era (since 1954-55) to win their first 12 games decided by 6 pts or less (12-0) when they beat Minnesota 95-92 on 1/10, topping the previous record of 11 set by both the 1967-68 St. Louis Hawks and the 1959-60 Boston Celtics. Milwaukee's streak came to and end when they lost in San Antonio on 1/18 by a final of 92-95.

THREE-POINT BUCKS - The Bucks finished the season 4th in the league in 3FG% (38.0). That's the second-best season mark in team history, behind only the 2002-03 squad's 38.3 percent. They made 507 treys on the season, marking the 4th time in club history that they've made over 500 threes in one season. Charlie Bell finished the year 11th in the NBA in 3FG% (42.3) and teammate Bobby Simmons finished T-12th (42.0). Simmons set new career bests with 105 3PM and 250 3PA. Mo Williams also set new career highs with 73 3PM and 191 3PA ... both of those numbers were more than his previous two seasons combined (he made 42 threes in 138 attempts in his first two seasons in the league).

2005-06 REGULAR SEASON IN REVIEW

THE REDD LINE - Michael Redd shot a career-best 87.7% from the free throw line this season, sinking a career-high 501 free throws in a career-high 571 attempts. He ranked T-8th in the league in FT%, 9th in FTM and 14th in FTA. Redd shot an NBA-best 94.6% in the month of February (70-74) and he hit 50 consecutive free throws from 2/14 to 3/1. Redd's career-high FT streak is 58, set during the 2003-04 season from 1/19/04 to 2/10/04.

THUNDER FROM DOWN UNDER - Andrew Bogut had a fine rookie season for the Milwaukee Bucks, averaging 9.4 points, 7.0 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 0.83 blocks in 28.6 minutes per game. He appeared in all 82 games for the Bucks (joining Jamaal Magloire as the only two Bucks to do so) and started 77 of them. He led all rookies in rebounds, blocks and FG% (53.3%), was 5th in scoring and 7th in assists per game. He also ranked among league leaders in FG% (5th), rebounds (T-29th) and blocks (40th). He was named the Eastern Conference's Rookie of the Month for January after averaging 10.4 points, 8.8 rebounds and 2.4 assists in 17 games for the Bucks. He also shot 55.4% from the field during the month.

THE UNBEATEN PATH - In advancing to the postseason, Andrew Bogut has become just the 4th number one overall pick in the last 21 years to appear in the postseason his rookie year (Tim Duncan in 1997-98 with San Antonio; David Robinson in 1989-90 with San Antonio; and Chris Webber in 1993-94).

BUILT FORD TOUGH - After missing the second part of the 2003-04 season and all of the 2004-05 season with a spinal cord bruise, T.J. Ford made his return to the NBA in grand fashion. He averaged 16.7 points, 10.3 rebounds and 5.7 assists in 40 minutes per game during the first week of the season. He helped lead Milwaukee to a 3-0 start and was rewarded with the season's first Eastern Conference Player of the Week award for his efforts. Ford finished the season T-12th in the NBA in assists per game (6.6) and T-19th in steals (1.44).

FRIENDLY COMPETITION - Andrew Bogut and T.J. Ford squared off as opponents in the T-Mobile Rookie Challenge on 2/17. The event was part of NBA All-Star Weekend in Ford's hometown of Houston, TX. Bogut notched a double-double for the rookies in 16 minutes of action, scoring 14 points and grabbing 11 rebounds. Ford logged 18 minutes off of the bench and handed out 5 assists to go along with 3 points and 3 rebounds.

TRIP-BELL DOU-BELL - Charlie Bell logged the 42nd triple-double in team history on 3/28 against the Phoenix Suns (132-110 Bucks win). Bell finished the night with 19 points, 10 rebounds and 13 assists, all career highs at the time (he went on to score 29 points on 4/4 in Miami). The triple-double was the first for a Buck since Sam Cassell turned the trick on 1/22/03 in Boston (14 points, 11 rebounds and 16 assists).

LIVING DOWNTOWN - Milwaukee hit a franchise-record 18 three-pointers in their 132-110 rout of the Phoenix Suns at the Bradley Center on 3/28. The 18 treys topped the previous franchise mark of 16 (done twice, most recently on 12/9/02 at Cleveland in double-overtime). They also set a new NBA record after hitting 11 of those 18 triples in the 3rd quarter. The previous record for threes in a quarter was 10. They hit 14 threes in the 2nd half, also a new NBA record (previous record was 12).

SELFISH BUCKS - Milwaukee set a new NBA record for fewest turnovers in a game on 4/1 against Indiana. They're 2 miscues beat out the old mark of 3 (set by 7 teams, most recently by Toronto on 12/27/05). Milwaukee's previous franchise record for fewest turnovers in a game was 4, set on 3/2/03 vs. Atlanta.

DURABLE BIG CAT - Jamaal Magloire was the only Buck to start in each of the team's 82 games this season. It was the 4th time in his NBA career that he has appeared in a team's complete regular season schedule, and the third time in which he has started all 82 games. The 6-11 center averaged a team-best 9.5 rebounds for Milwaukee, good for 10th in the NBA. He led the team in rebounding 50 times and was also tops with 17 double-doubles.

ANSWERING THE BELL - After averaging 5.3 points 1.6 assists in 17 minutes per game prior to the All-Star break, Charlie Bell picked up his game after the NBA's annual classic. He averaged 11.4 points and 2.8 assists in 26.5 minutes per game in Milwaukee's last 30 games. His 47.4% three-point average after the all-star game (55-116) was the 2nd best in the NBA during that time among players who shot at least 50 3PA. Entering this season, Bell had played in only seven NBA games, all during the 2001-02 season (two games with Dallas and five with Phoenix).

ROAD IMPROVEMENTS - Milwaukee enjoyed more successful road trips this season than last. The team went 15-26 away from the Bradley Center after going just 7-34 on the road last season. Their 8-game road-win improvement from last season was tops in the Eastern Conference.

DEFENSE! DEFENSE! - Milwaukee set a franchise record this past season when they held 12 consecutive opponents to 94 points or less. They did so from 1/27 to 2/21 and finally saw their streak snapped when they lost to the Bulls on 2/22 by a final of 91-97. The previous team record was eight straight games from 2/9/99 to 2/23/99.

KEY DATES IN 2005-06 SEASON

October 26 - Acquired Jamaal Magloire in exchange for Desmond Mason, the Bucks 2006 first round choice and cash considerations.

November 1 - Milwaukee gave Terry Stotts his first win as Bucks head coach in his first try after downing host Philadelphia 117-108. The Bucks erased a seven-point lead with two minutes remaining in the fourth quarter, capped off by Michael Redd's buzzer-beating three-pointer that sent the game into overtime.

November 2 - The Bucks erase a 16-point, first-half deficit en route to beating the Nets by 14 (100-96) and spoiling another team's home opener for the second straight night. Michael Redd scores a then-career-high 41 points in the win.

November 5 - The Bucks beat the Miami Heat in their Bradley Center debut, marking the first time they started a season 3-0 since 2000-01.

November 7 - T.J. Ford received Eastern Conference Player of the Week honors for the NBA's opening week after posting averages of 16.7 points, 10.3 assists and 5.7 rebounds during Milwaukee's 3-0 start.

November 12 - Mo Williams hits a deep three-pointer as time expires to give the Bucks a stunning home win over division rival Indiana (103-102). Milwaukee trailed the Pacers by 14 with 3:30 left in the 4th and by 8 with 50 seconds to play.

November 16 - The Bucks snap a 17-game road-losing streak against Western Conference opponents with their 90-87 triumph at Golden State.

December 2 - Mo Williams did it again, draining a buzzer-beating three-pointer to lift the Bucks to a 105-102 win over host Washington. Williams had a season- and career-high 35 points in the win, including 17 in the 4th quarter.

December 20 - With 0.7 seconds left in overtime and the Bucks tied at home with the San Antonio Spurs, Toni Kukoc feeds a perfect in-bounds lob to Andrew Bogut who catches, shoots and scores for a dramatic Bucks win (109-107).

January 4 - Milwaukee's bench scores 0 points for the first time since 11/27/70. Bucks lose 84-91 to Cleveland.

January 13 - With their 103-102 win in Charlotte, the Bucks improved to 9-0 in games decided by three points or less and an NBA-record 13-0 in games decided by six points or less to start the season.

January 18 - Milwaukee's streak of winning 13 straight games decided by six points or less to start the season comes to an end with a 92-95 loss in San Antonio.

January 21 - Jamaal Magloire grabs a career-high 22 rebounds and a career-high 18 defensive rebounds in Milwaukee's 101-91 win over Charlotte.

January 23 - Michael Redd ties his then-career-high of 41 points on the road in Detroit. He also finished with 9 rebounds and 8 assists in the Bucks loss (102-106, OT).

February 1 - Andrew Bogut earns Eastern Conference Rookie of the Month honors for the month of January after averaging 10.4 points, 8.8 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 1.35 blocked shots in the month. He also shot 55.4% from the field.

February 17 - Andrew Bogut and T.J. Ford took part in the Rookie/Sophomore Challenge as part of the NBA's All-Star Weekend. Bogut started for the rookies and had 14 points and 11 rebounds, while Ford came off the bench and had 3 points and 5 assists for the sophomores.

February 21 - Despite losing to New Jersey by a final of 85-89, the Bucks held an opponent to 94 points or less for the 12th straight game, a franchise record. The previous record was 8 straight games from 2/9/99 to 2/23/99. The streak would end the next night against Chicago (91-97 loss).

February 24 - Joe Smith scored a game-high 32 points off of the Bucks bench on 13-16 shooting in Milwaukee's 111-116 loss at home to Philadelphia.

March 5 - USA Basketball announces that Michael Redd accepts an invitation to be a part of the 2006-08 Men's Senior National Team Program.

March 28 - The Bucks set a franchise record for three-pointers in a game with 18 (previous record was 16) and an NBA record for three-pointers in a quarter when they hit 11 of them in the 3rd quarter at home against Phoenix (previous record was 10). Milwaukee beat the Suns by a final of 132-110.

Charlie Bell logged the first triple-double of his career after posting 19 points, 10 rebounds and 13 assists in 35 minutes of play.

April 4 - Charlie Bell comes off of the bench in Miami to score a career-high 29 points, including a 6-9 effort from the three-point line (all of his made treys came in the first half). The Bucks bench outscores the starters 53-36 for the first time since 2/14/05.

April 5 - T.J. Ford scored a career-high 34 points (to go along with 11 assists and 6 rebounds) in a 105-108 loss in Orlando.

April 15 - Despite losing to the Atlanta Hawks by a final of 114-120, the Bucks earned their 25th playoff appearance in team history with the Philadelphia 76ers losing in Orlando.

April 18 - Milwaukee went into Washington needing a win to finish .500 and clinch the East's 5th seed. But the Wizards offense was too much for the Bucks as Washington went on to win 103-116. The Bucks would have to wait one day to see if they would be the 6th, 7th or 8th seed.

Michael Redd scored a career-high 43 points in the loss. He also became the second player in team history to score 2,000 points in a season (he finished with 2,028) and passed Jon McGlocklin for 11th on the Bucks all-time scoring list.
