



## RENOVATED ARENA BY 2010

### *Saluki Basketball*


SIU Arena will undergo a complete retrofit – both inside and out. Patrons will enjoy new chairback seating in the lower seating bowl of the arena. In addition, a new permanent upper bowl will also feature five rows of chairback seating. In total, the retrofitted arena will contain over 4,800 chairback seats, an increase of 1,200 chairback seats over its existing configuration.

Fans will be greeted by a new entrance and lobby area, as well as a concourse encircling the outside of the arena featuring an athletic ticket office, Saluki Team Store, expanded concessions and new restrooms. The upgraded SIU Arena will also feature a VIP Club Room and state-of-the-art scoreboard with individual statistics and replay capability to enhance the fan experience. In addition, the retrofitted SIU Arena will meet or exceed all Americans with Disabilities Act requirements, including middle hand rails in all aisles and elevator access.

Construction on the arena began in the spring of 1962, and took nearly two years to complete at a cost of \$4.2 million (\$30 million in today's dollars). The basketball team played its first game in the new complex on December 1, 1964. The Salukis beat Oklahoma State, 78-55, in the opener and posted a 14-1 home record.





# ESPN GAMEDAY AT SIU ARENA



The Salukis have had nine players go on to play in the National Basketball Association. Most recently, guard Troy Hudson played for the Golden State Warriors.

Hudson was not selected in the 1997 NBA draft and played his first season in the Continental Basketball Association. He made the Utah Jazz in 1998, however, Hudson had his best years with the Minnesota Timberwolves. He averaged a career-best 14.2 points and 5.7 assists in 2002-03, and was nicknamed "Laker Killer" for his outstanding postseason play against the Los Angeles Lakers.





The Salukis have had 11 players selected in the National Basketball Association draft. Walt Frazier was the highest pick ever from SIU, chosen number five overall in 1967.

Frazier is the most famous former Saluki. He is considered one of the best point guards in the history of the game. He guided the New York Knicks to the franchise's only two NBA Championships (1970 & 1973), and was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 1987. Upon his retirement from basketball, Frazier went into broadcasting and is currently the color commentator for Knicks games on TV.




# ORIGIN OF THE SALUKIS

## *Saluki Basketball*

Several members of the Southern Illinois University athletic staff suggested a new nickname in 1951. The teams had been known as the Maroons since intercollegiate athletics began in 1913. The name became official on March 19, 1951, when the student body overwhelmingly approved "Salukis" as the new symbol of SIU athletics, easily besting "Rebels," "Knights," "Flyers," "Marauders," and "Maroons."

The oldest purebred dogs in the world with records dating back to 3600 B.C., the Saluki is an ancient Egyptian hunting dog known for its speed and hunting prowess.

So why is the name Salukis relevant to Southern Illinois? Natives of southern Illinois know that the region is frequently referred to as "Egypt." Historian Baker Brownell, in his book "The Other Illinois," explained how the region came to be known as Egypt.

He wrote, "There was a drought in the northern counties (of Illinois) in the early 1800s...the wheat fields dried up, the streams died in their beds. But in southern Illinois, rain fell and there were good crops, and from the north came people seeking corn and wheat as to Egypt of old. Thus, the name, Egypt."

The 19th century drought in Illinois parallels the Biblical account of the country of Egypt. "There was famine in all lands; but in all the land of Egypt there was bread. All the earth came to Egypt to Joseph to buy grain, because the famine was so severe. And (Jacob) said, 'Behold, I have heard that there is grain in Egypt; go down and buy grain for us there, that we may live, and not die.' So 10 of Joseph's brothers went down to buy grain in Egypt." (Genesis 41:54b, 57, 42:2-3).

In Egypt at that time, Salukis were accepted as the finest animal a family could possess. Adopting such a well-respected dog as its mascot fit perfectly for a school in a region known as "Egypt."

The tomb of King Tut lies in the northeast corner of McAndrew Stadium and will be exhumed and moved to the new stadium in 2010. After Khalila died in 2005, Saluki fans throughout the area have volunteered their purebred dogs to serve as mascot.







## CHRIS LOWERY FOSTERING RETURN TO GREATNESS

**P**laying one of the toughest schedules in school history a year ago, including games against Duke and UCLA, was a tremendous learning experience for a Saluki squad that featured four freshmen and two sophomores in its playing rotation.

The Salukis did not make the NCAA Tournament for the second-straight year, and Chris Lowery said his young squad is hungry to redeem itself this season.

The theme for the 2009-10 campaign — “Return to Greatness” — is not a prediction as much as it is a challenge Lowery has ascribed to his team.

“I just wanted them to understand where this program has been,” he explained. “Our six-straight NCAA Tournaments were not a

mythical time period. It was not something that just happened. Those guys worked at it and made it happen.”

During off-season workouts, Lowery told players how the Salukis of yesterday built the program into the crown jewel of the Missouri Valley Conference. No MVC team has made more NCAA Tournament appearances (6) or won as many

NCAA Tournament games (5) this decade as SIU.

“We wanted to put in their minds that if you play hard, you can get back to that level,” he said. “It has to be through hard work. We’re challenging them to get back to a place where we feel our program deserves to be.”

Lowery believes the program is on solid footing. Five of the six returning players will be entering just their second season of college basketball.

“The most exciting thing for us is that we’re building for the future,” Lowery said. “We know that when these guys are juniors and seniors, that we have a chance to be really special as a program again.”

As he tends to do during the off-season, Lowery fine-tuned his approach to coaching. His experience as an assistant with USA Basketball, which claimed the Under-19 Gold medal in New Zealand last summer, was especially applicable.

“I learned how to be an assistant again,” Lowery said. “You get used to only thinking one way as a head coach, and I thought that it was eye-opening to be an assistant again.”

Players tend to confide in assistants more readily than the head coach, Lowery found. The

assistants often have a better pulse on what’s happening internally with the team.

“As an assistant, you get to listen to the gripes and deal with the gripes of kids wanting to play more and asking, ‘why am I being taken out?’” Lowery said. “I think it will help me understand my players better — thinking in terms of what they need from an assistant standpoint.”


The origins of the juggernaut that has become Saluki Basketball can be traced all the way back to the 1992-93 season. That team, which was

led by a 20-year-old point guard named Chris Lowery, broke a 16-year NCAA Tournament drought in '93. In doing so, it set into motion a chain of events that has evolved into one of the nation's best college basketball programs.

Lowery was the catalyst for the 1993 and 1994 teams that reached the NCAA Tournament. A scrappy, hustling player, he still ranks among the school's career leaders in scoring, assists and steals.

Lowery returned to his alma mater as an assistant coach under Bruce Weber in 2002. That team advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament, knocking off opponents such as Indiana, Texas Tech and Georgia.

Saluki Basketball has been on a sweet ride ever since.

After Lowery spent three seasons serving under Weber, he was named head coach at Southern Illinois in 2004.

In his first year at the helm of SIU, all Lowery did was win 27 games and become the youngest coach, at age 32, to ever win Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year honors. The Salukis won the MVC regular-season crown

and beat Saint Mary's in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

The program continued its steady ascent.

Lowery guided a team with no seniors to the 2006 NCAA Tournament and a Missouri Valley Conference tournament championship.

In 2006-07, the Salukis had the greatest season in school history. They won a school-record 29 games, advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament and finished the year with a No. 11 ranking — the highest ever at SIU.

More than any season in school history, the 2006-07 season established an identity for Saluki Basketball. Com-

mentators from across the country marveled at the tenacity with which the Salukis played defense.

"They play as good a defense, if not better defense, than just about anybody in the country," said ana-

lyst Jerry Tarkanian. "Lowery's defense was so similar to what we were playing at UNLV, that I really fell in love with it. His team just plays so hard and sound. I like his philosophies — he believes in good, solid defense, starting with fundamentals and with intensity and playing hard."

"Southern Illinois hit a home run when it convinced Chris Lowery to stay and continue to build one of the premier programs in the country instead of searching for some potentially propped-up higher major conference job that wouldn't offer the same results. On April 9, 2004, he fulfilled a dream. Lowery returned to his alma mater and was introduced as the 12th men's basketball head coach at Southern Illinois University in the 91-year history of the program.

Prior to landing the head coaching job, Lowery spent three seasons on Bruce Weber's staff at both Southern

Illinois and Illinois. Lowery said working for Weber helped prepare him for the opportunity to be a head

allowed per game with 56.2 in the Sweet 16 season. "I've said for years that no school plays better fundamental, man-to-man defense than Southern Illinois," according to CBS analyst Seth Davis. "Lowery is very charismatic, very intense, and he's a great motivator. He is a product of a winning culture, and it's one of the best examples at the mid-major level of a school having a culture that allows you to win consistently."

Lowery said the key to Southern's defense is how it dictates what an opponent can and cannot do.

"I think our ability to take things away from people

sets us apart," explained Lowery. "We play hard on defense. That's probably the only thing that is going to stick out, is our ability to guard and how tough our kids are. We defend, we're tough, and we are in great shape."

Lowery, Saluki Basketball and winning have been intertwined since he first set foot on the campus as a player in 1990.


In his 11 seasons as a Saluki player, assistant coach and now head coach, all but one of his teams have advanced to postseason play. His four-year record as head coach is a remarkable 109-59.

It all started 18 years ago when Lowery, as the team's starting point guard, began a stellar playing career that featured two NCAA Tournament berths and two NITs from 1990-94.

A product of Evansville, Ind., Lowery scored

1,225 career points and dished out 391 assists at SIU. The Salukis recorded an 86-37 record during his four years.

coach at a young age.

"I saw how Coach Weber implemented an entire program at Illinois, and I watched more than I spoke," he said. "I know we have to work hard to continue at this pace of success."

"Chris was instrumental

in much of the success we have had at each school," said Weber "He's a terrific young coach."

Lowery is also regarded as one of the top young recruiters in college basketball and has consistently landed some of the region's top players. The 2007-08 recruiting class is widely regarded as the best in school history.

"(He) has the innate ability to light up a room with his smile and demeanor," ESPN analyst Doug Gottlieb said. "No wonder so many great kids want to play for him."

Lowery's recruiting philosophy is simple.

"Recruit the areas you're strong in," he said. "And the areas you're not strong in, get to know the people better and work with them. Don't waste time recruiting people that don't want to come, you're not going to get, or that aren't good enough. I think we've done a good job of those three things."

Lowery began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Rend Lake Community College in Ina, Ill. for two seasons. He then coached at Missouri Southern State College for three years, helping the Lions to a 30-3 record and an NCAA Division II Final Four appearance in 2000.

Prior to his

coaching tenure at Southern Illinois, Lowery spent one season as an assistant at Southeast Missouri State under Gary Garner. The Redhawks finished 18-12 that season.

Lowery is the third-youngest head coach in school history, behind former Saluki coach and NBA Hall-of-Famer Harry Gallatin, who was 31-years-old when he was named head coach in 1958, and William McAndrew, the founder of Saluki basketball, who was 26 when he took the reigns of SIU's first squad in 1913.

Lowery was born on July 7, 1972 in Evansville, Ind. and attended Harrison High School. He graduated from Southern Illinois in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in physical

education.

Lowery and his wife, Erika, have four children: Lexis (15), C.J. (9), Kahari (8) and Jazmyn (5). They reside in Carbondale.

Lance Irvin is a rising star in the ranks of college coaches. Last summer, Irvin was selected to participate in the Achieving Coaching Excellence program — a prestigious four-day clinic sponsored by the Black Coaches Association and the NCAA — which preps the next generation of head coaches.

Irvin has worked with many big names and high-profile programs in college basketball — Joey Meyer (DePaul, 1992-97), Larry Farmer (Loyola-Chicago, 1998-01), Larry Eustachy (Iowa State, 2001-02), Tom Richardson (Illinois State, 2002-03), Melvin Watkins (Texas A&M, 2003-04), Quin Snyder (Missouri, 2005-06) and Matt Doherty (SMU, 2006-08).

“He’s recruited nationally in a lot of different circles, and he has a good grasp of the Chicago scene, which is obviously very important for us,” Lowery said.

Irvin said he doesn’t want to be known as just a recruiter, though.

“I’ve worked hard not to be labeled as a guy who just recruits,” he said. “I can coach, too. I bring a little bit of everything to the table. I think I relate well to players. I try to be well-rounded.”

Irvin started his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Idaho in 1991-92. Along the way, he has helped several players reach the NBA, including Jackson Vroman (Iowa State), Paul McPherson (DePaul), and Antoine Wright and Acie Law (Texas A&M).

As a player, Irvin was an all-city, all-area and all-state selection and an honorable mention All-American as a senior at Chicago’s Julian High School in 1987. Irvin played basketball at Colorado State before transferring to Idaho, where he played for Eustachy. Irvin received his bachelor’s degree in criminal justice from Idaho in 1992.

He comes from a basketball family. His brother, Byron, played college basketball at Missouri, after which he was selected in the 1989 NBA Draft with the 23rd pick by the Portland Trail Blazers. His father runs one of the premier AAU teams in Illinois — the Mac Irvin Fire.

**M**arcus Belcher is the newest addition to the Saluki coaching staff, joining the program last June, after Rodney Watson accepted the head coaching spot at Southern Indiana.

Although Belcher has been at his current post at SIU only a short time, he has deep roots with Saluki Basketball. Belcher was the starting point guard on the 2002 Sweet 16 team that beat Texas Tech and Georgia in the NCAA Tournament and led the squad with 118 assists. He scored 350 points in 66 games in two seasons at SIU.

"He is a family member, and one of the guys who helped build our program," Lowery said. "He's a proven recruiter, and as a former point guard, he understands the nuances of the game."

Belcher began his coaching career in 2004 as an assistant to Marty Simmons at Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville. The Cougars made NCAA Tournament appearances in both 2005 and 2006. Belcher moved up to the Division I level as an assistant coach at Eastern Illinois in 2007, before re-joining Simmons at the University of Evansville a year ago.

SIU's program now has three former players on its five-man coaching staff. Belcher joins Lowery (1990-94) and Brad Korn (1999-04) as former Salukis turned coaches at Southern.

"Marcus is family," Lowery said. "He really cares about this place. It means a lot to him to be back here as an assistant, and he's done a tremendous job for us so far."

Belcher graduated from Southern Illinois with a degree in marketing, and received his master's degree in sport management from Southern Illinois University-Edwardsville in 2006.

Whether as a player or assistant coach, Brad Korn has contributed as much to the bottom line of Saluki Basketball as anyone.

During his career as a player, the Salukis made three-straight NCAA Tournament appearances and won three MVC championships. Now as an assistant coach, he has three more tourney appearances and championship rings to his credit.

In addition to recruiting, breaking down film and preparing scouting reports, Korn handles a variety of administrative matters and oversees the off-season conditioning program.

"Brad is the teacher on our staff, and our kids relate well to him," Lowery said. "He understands how to get people better at their respective positions. He's grown by leaps and bounds within our program, first as a player, and now as a coach. He does a great job in all facets of coaching."

Success is a good word to define Korn's four-year career at SIU from 1999-2004. At the time he graduated, Korn had the distinction of having been involved in more wins in his career at Southern than any other player in school history (92).

The 6-foot-9, Plano (Ill.) native was often like having a coach on the floor. He was a prolific 3-point shooter, finishing his career with 78 3-pointers.

In 2004, he started for the first time and was named to the MVC's Most Improved team. He improved his scoring average from 3.8 ppg to 9.7 ppg and ranked among the team leaders in free throw shooting. Korn posted a career-high 17 points versus Bradley, Jacksonville State and Wright State in 2003-04.

"Brad has a huge respect level with our players," Lowery said. "They know that he can still get out there and play. They understand he cares about them, but at the same time, he's stern enough to get them to play hard."

**K**oby Altman made such a strong impression on Chris Lowery as a volunteer for Team USA Basketball last summer, that the Saluki head coach promptly tabbed him for the program's vacant graduate assistant position.

Altman spent the last two seasons as an assistant coach at Amherst College, where he helped guide the team to a 48-11 record and Division III runner-up finish in the 2008 championship game. Last summer, he was named operations director for USA Basketball.

"He did such a great job of being organized and helping Coach (Matt) Painter and myself break down film," Lowery said. "He's extremely bright and brings with him a commitment to excellence."

Although the New York native grew up on the east coast, Altman said he is very familiar with the Saluki program.

"At Amherst, we used Chris Lowery's teaching tapes on how to play defense," he said.

Altman played collegiately at Middlebury College in Vermont, where he was a three-year starter at point guard. After college, he worked for three years in real estate investment sales for Friedman-Roth Realty Corp. in New York.

Then the coaching bug bit. Altman started out as the freshman basketball coach at Xavier High School in New York City. In 2007, he took the post at Amherst.

## GLENN POSHARD LEADS UNIVERSITY SYSTEM AT SIU

**G**lenn Poshard, who was inaugurated as President in September of 2006, brings more than 40 years of public service to Southern Illinois University.

The fifth of five children who grew up on a family farm, Poshard is a native of White County, Illinois. He graduated from Carmi Township High School in 1962 and after graduation served in the United States Army in Korea, where he received a commendation for outstanding service.

Dr. Poshard is a three-degree graduate of Southern Illinois University Carbondale, the first such graduate to serve on its Board of Trustees.



Entering on the G.I. Bill, he earned a bachelor's degree in secondary education in 1970, a master's degree in

health education in 1974, and a Ph.D. in higher education administration in 1984. During this time he worked as both a student worker and a civil servant.

While working toward his master's degree, Dr. Poshard taught and coached at Galatia and Thompsonville high schools. Over the next 10 years, he served as Assistant Director of the Southern Illinois Regional Education Service Center and Director of the Area Service Center for Educators of the Gifted.

In August 1984, Dr. Poshard was appointed to the Illinois State Senate. He was successfully elected later that year and was re-elected in 1986.

Based on his success in the State Senate, the citizens of southern Illinois sent him to the United States Congress in 1989 to represent the 22nd Congressional District. He set a limit of ten years on his service in Congress and in 1998 won the Democratic nomination for Governor of the State of Illinois but lost in the general election.

During his years in the Illinois Legislature and in the U.S. Congress, he advocated for campaign finance reform, clean coal research, the Shawnee National Forest, tourism, economic development, transportation, and higher education.

Dr. Poshard limited individual donations to his campaign and refused to accept donations from political action committees.

In 1999, Dr. Poshard


and his wife, Jo, founded the Poshard Foundation, which raises money to fund care for abused, neglected, and abandoned children. The Foundation has been a leader in efforts to prevent child abuse throughout southern Illinois, including helping to build a new \$600,000 women's shelter in Cairo in December 2003. Presently, the Foundation is building a new shelter in West Frankfort, Illinois.

In 1999, Dr. Poshard was appointed Vice Chancellor for Administration for the Carbondale campus of Southern Illinois University, a post he held until July 2003. Governor Rod Blagojevich appointed him to the Board of Trustees of Southern Illinois University in January

2004. Later that year, he was elected Chair of the Board of Trustees, a position he held until declaring his candidacy for President of the University system.

Dr. Poshard is a past recipient of the Lindell W. Sturgis Memorial Public Service Award (2003) and the SIU Distinguished Alumni Award (2003) and is a member of the SIUC College of Education and Human Services Hall of Fame (1992).

The Poshard family includes two adult children, Dennis and Kristen, a daughter-in-law, Diane, and five grandchildren, Lydia, Madeline, America, Tucker, and Harrison. Glenn and Jo, a retired public school teacher, live in rural Murphysboro.





## SAMUEL GOLDMAN IS SIUC'S CHANCELLOR

**S**outhern Illinois University President Glenn Poshard named retired professor and long-time Carbondale community leader Samuel Goldman the school's chancellor on April 11, 2008.

"My biggest focus is to bring the university campus together to meet the challenges we have," Goldman said upon taking over as chancellor. "We have such an enormous wealth of talent here. We need to remember our main source of strength is in the university."



Goldman is a native of Winnipeg, Canada. He earned his bachelor's degree in English and sociology at the University of Manitoba, and then moved to the United States in the

mid-1950s to attend the University of Chicago.

He earned both his master's degree and doctoral degree in social sciences with a major in education from the University of Chicago.

He became an American citizen in January 1978. In 1980, Goldman left Ohio University to become dean of the former College of Human Resources at SIU Carbondale.

He subsequently joined former President Albert Somit's staff, focusing on regional research and service. Goldman then served as a professor in the Department of Educational Administration and Higher Education in the College of Education and Human Services.

In addition to his research, administrative and classroom work, Goldman served on the Faculty Senate's Judicial Review Board.

Goldman was a member of the committee that drafted SIUC's strategic plan, Southern at 150: Building Excellence Through Commitment. Goldman retired from that position in 2003 and remains very active in the southern Illinois community.

He has worked separately with Hospice of Southern Illinois and with Southern Illinois Regional Social Services in both fund raising and marketing.

Upon completion of his three-year term as Chair of the Carbondale Human Relations Commission (2003-2006), he was appointed to the Carbondale Convention and Tourism Bureau and cur-

rently serves as Board Chairman.

He is a certified clergy volunteer at the Illinois Youth Center in Murphysboro, Memorial Hospital of Carbondale, the Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Marion, St. Joseph's Hospital in Murphysboro and Herrin Hospital.

He has won numerous honors for his contributions in education and in community service, including: Kentucky Colonel award from the governor of Kentucky for service to public education in that state; Honorary Tar Heel, from the governor of North Carolina in recognition of his

service to public education in that state; special citation from the Ohio Legislature for "an extensive record of community services especially in the areas of community health and public education"; 2000 Citizen of the Year from the Southern Illinois District of the National Association of Social Workers; and the 2001 Essence Award from the Center for Comprehensive Services in Carbondale.

He has two grown sons, Joseph, who is Assistant Director of Golf Operations at a resort in Hawaii, and Peter, who is a sculptor and attends Northeastern Illinois University in Chicago.





## MARIO MOCCIA DIRECTS SALUKI ATHLETICS

**U**nder the leadership of director of athletics Mario Moccia, the future has never been brighter for Saluki Athletics. Not only does the department have a host of successful teams, soon it will have the state-of-the-art facilities those programs deserve.

Shortly after Moccia arrived on campus in 2006, he charted the course for Saluki Way — an ambitious \$83 million facilities campaign that will feature a new football stadium, renovated arena and 50,000-square foot team facility.



The department broke ground on the project last spring and the new facilities will open in 2010-11.

When Moccia (pronounced Mo-chuh) took the helm at SIU, the annual

scholarship fund totaled slightly more than \$600,000. Three years later, it has more than doubled to \$1.275 million.

Ticket sales have made dramatic gains during Moccia's tenure, with sharp increases in revenue in both football and men's basketball. The athletics department also reached lucrative agreements with both Learfield Sports and Under Armour.

The financial success has allowed Moccia to hire and retain marquee coaches such as Chris Lowery and Dale Lennon.

Under Moccia's watch, the men's basketball program advanced to the Sweet 16 in 2007 and finished No. 11 in the nation — the highest ranking in school history.

During Moccia's tenure the football program has risen to elite status. The team reached the Final Four of the FCS Playoffs in 2007 and pulled off shocking upsets of FBS schools Indiana (2006) and Northern Illinois (2007).

The Salukis have also won conference championships in women's golf, women's basketball, men's cross country, men's tennis, women's track and women's swimming & diving in the last three years.

Equally impressive are the marks Saluki student-athletes have posted in the classroom. The cumulative GPA of all student-athletes stands at a school-best 3.06.

Prior to SIU, Moccia was the senior associate AD for external operations at the University of Missouri,



where he oversaw the largest fund-raising effort in the history of Mizzou Athletics with the Champions For Life campaign. The external components of the athletics department at Missouri were routinely recognized as among the best in college athletics. During his tenure (1998-2006), Missouri posted record football season ticket sales and an increase of more than \$3 million in annual giving during a five-year period.

Prior to Missouri, Moccia was associate athletics director at Texas State University in San Marcos from 1997 to 1998, and he was director of sales and assistant director of the Lobo Club for the athletic department at the University of New Mexico from 1993 to 1997.

Moccia holds a bachelor's degree in psychology from New Mexico State Univer-

sity (1989), where he was the Most Valuable Player of the Aggie baseball team in 1988 and 1989. As a senior, he was a preseason All-American. Moccia was drafted by the Detroit Tigers and played professionally for two years before beginning his administrative career.

Moccia earned a master's degree in sports administration from the University of New Mexico (1993). In 1998, he was named to the New Mexico State University Athletics Hall of Fame. Moccia is a member of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) and serves on several regional and national committees.

Mario and his wife, Heidi — a former All-American women's soccer player at UMass — reside in Murphysboro with their daughter, Addie.

## SALUKIS RETURNING TO BLUE COLLAR ROOTS

After a two-year absence from the NCAA Tournament, Saluki Basketball is gearing up for what it hopes is another run of postseason berths. The much-heralded class of 2008 has a year under its belt, and with the addition of Iowa transfer Tony Freeman, the Salukis are aiming for a “Return to Greatness.”

Head coach Chris Lowery has challenged his team to restore the program’s reputation as a perennial powerhouse. He said they will accomplish the task by returning to the program’s blue-collar roots of tough defense and teamwork.

“It goes back to getting better in practice every day and re-dedicating ourselves to the system,” he said. “Watching film this summer as a staff, we would shake our heads and say ‘Why did we let these guys do that?’ But, sometimes you have to learn from losing.”

Lowery believes team chemistry is another critical element.

“We have to love each other and re-establish the brotherhood,” Lowery said. “That’s what our successful

teams were able to do.”

After securing what many consider the best recruiting class in school history in 2008, Lowery has supplemented the roster with what he calls a “blue-collar class” in 2009.

“People talked about how good our glamour class was,” he said. “Now, we brought in a blue-collar class right behind it with kids who can push to get better. We don’t have anybody stagnant.”

The backbone of this year’s team will be the guard duo of Iowa transfer **Tony Freeman** and last year’s Missouri Valley Conference Freshman of the Year **Kevin Dillard**.

Freeman was an All-Big Ten selection at Iowa two years ago and sat out last season after transferring to Southern. He is the team’s only senior, and Lowery said Freeman is like having an extra coach on the floor.

“When it comes to work ethic, Tony sets the standard and is bridging the gap of getting our guys to work harder,” Lowery said. “He’s a great leader. He’s a great student. He’s maintenance-free. He’s always going to do the right thing. He’s pulled some of those guys into doing the right things. We’re con-



fidant whenever he’s involved, that good things are going to happen.”

Dillard was an electric performer for the Salukis a year ago, leading the team in scoring average with 12.2 points and earning top freshman honors.

“Kevin is in line to be the next leader,” Lowery said.

# Stats from University of Iowa in 2007-08

“He’s been very vocal — more than he was when he was a freshman. He knows that winning is everything, and he’s always won.”

In addition to Dillard, the Salukis have a talented returning starter in junior forward **Carlton Fay**. Fay was named to the league’s most-improved team after his scoring average jumped from 2.4 points his freshman year to 10.4 points in 2009. He scored double figures in 19 of the team’s 31 games.

Junior **Justin Bocot** took over a starting guard slot after Bryan Mullins broke his foot. He poured in 28 points

at Missouri State and was named to the league’s all-bench team after the season.

Sophomore forward **Anthony Booker** has the tools to be one of the conference’s elite big men. He showed flashes of brilliance a year ago and put up his best numbers during the final month of the season. Booker led the team in blocks.

**Nick Evans** was making excellent strides last season, until he was sidelined with a broken wrist. Now a sophomore, the 6-foot-11 center is still scratching the surface of his potential. He ranked among the league leaders in blocked shots last year, also.

SIU has bolstered its backcourt with a pair of JUCO prospects in **Jack Crowder** and **John Freeman**.

Crowder led the Jayhawk Conference in scoring average last year with 20.6 points. The Cowley College product was named honorable mention All-American and was ranked as the No. 24-best JUCO prospect by jucojunction.com.

Freeman (no relation to Tony) was a stat-sheet stuffer at Vincennes University, where he averaged 15.0 points, 7.0 rebounds, 4.8 assists and 3.6 blocks a year ago.

**Kendal Brown-Surles** is a speedy point guard and cousin of the head coach. He earned all-state honors and was named to the Indiana All-Stars after averaging 19.6 points and 5.3 assists.


Fellow Hoosier **Jordan**

**Myers** is a skilled big-body with excellent shooting range. He was also an Indiana All-Star and averaged 19.1 points and 9.9 rebounds.

Depth will be supplied by a trio of walk-ons in 6-foot-5 forwards **Aaron Moise** and **Nate Mitchell** and guard **Caleb Long**.

## 1966-67 NIT CHAMPIONS

**I**t was March of 1967. Lyndon Baines Johnson was still President of the United States.

The Vietnam War was taking place overseas. A few months earlier, the Green Bay Packers rolled over Kansas City in the first Super Bowl. The Beatles' renowned "Sgt. Pepper's" album was still two months away from its release date. Meanwhile, people in the small town of Carbondale, Ill., were engulfed in Saluki fever.

The Southern Illinois University men's basketball team defeated Marquette, 71-56, in the National Invitation Tournament championship game on March 18 of that year. It was not considered an upset either, as most college basketball pundits picked the Salukis to take the title.

Walt "Clyde" Frazier and Dick Garrett led SIU into New York City's Madison Square Garden with a record of 20-2. The NCAA Tournament consisted of only 16 teams at the time, and the NIT was much more prestigious than it is today. SIU was considered a small college (based on how many major schools it had played) at the time, so it could not participate in the NCAA postseason event. The Salukis were coached by Jack Hartman.

The school turned down a bid to the NCAA Small College Tournament. SIU had already defeated #2-ranked Louisville and defending NCAA champion Texas Western, and wanted no part of the small school postseason.

Garrett scored 28 points to lead SIU over St. Peter's, 103-58, in its opening NIT game. Frazier added 24 points and 14 rebounds for the Salukis (21-2).

The Salukis faced off against Duke in the quarterfinals of the NIT. The Blue Devils had dropped the championship game of the Atlantic Coast Conference tournament just two days earlier. Southern knocked off Duke, 72-63, and Garrett led the club with 18 points. Frazier and Ralph Johnson added 17 points apiece for SIU, which outrebounded the Blue Devils 47-41.

Duke head coach Vic Bubas called the Salukis "a great team" and praised the play of

Frazier and Garrett.

"The thing that impresses you about Southern Illinois is its fine team discipline," Bubas said in *The Chicago Daily News*.

The victory was Hartman's 100th as coach of SIU, and moved the team to 22-2. The Saluki coach played for the legendary Hank Iba, and talked about his team's discipline after the game.

"You demand it," Hartman said. "If you don't get it, you fire somebody."

In the NIT semifinals, SIU defeated Rutgers, 79-70. Frazier led the Salukis with 26 points and 18 rebounds. Garrett tallied 22 points and Clarence Smith added 15. Jim Valvano led the Scarlet Knights with 24 points.

Rutgers coach Bill Foster told *The Home News* he was nervous about the SIU offense before the game even began.

"There's no place to cheat on that ball club," Foster said. "They can really shoot. I got sick just watching them warm up."

SIU would meet up with Marquette – coached by Al McGuire – in the NIT championship game. The Salukis were 23-2 while Marquette held a record of 21-8.

Frazier scored 21 points and grabbed 11 rebounds – on his way to the NIT MVP – as Southern defeated Marquette, 71-56, to win it all. Garrett added 16, Smith had 13 and Roger Bechtold scored 10 for SIU. The Warriors led 42-34 with 13 minutes left in the game, but it was not to be for Marquette.

"We hadn't been taking the battle to them," Hartman said. "We were letting them control the game. I told them at halftime they had to be more aggressive."

The Salukis trailed by 11 points at halftime, and they played inspired basketball in the second half.

"It was a matter of a good club going up against a great club," McGuire said to *The Associated Press*. "They (SIU) are No. 3 in the nation in my book – behind UCLA and North Carolina."

SIU had dropped the title game of the NCAA College Division (small schools) playoffs the previous two years, but this was one to remember.

The Saluki faithful rushed the court as time expired, and they carried many players on their shoulders.

"We weren't going to be denied this time," said SIU center Ralph Johnson.


Hartman added, "We didn't want to go to the small college tournament again. We were hoping like the devil to get in the NIT."

Frazier signed a contract with the New York Knicks instead of returning to Southern for his senior year.

The rest of the magical Saluki team included: Chuck Benson, Ed Zastrow, Willie Griffin, Creston Whitaker, Jay Westcott, Craig Taylor, Rick Millis, Rich Brueckner, Andy Kukic and Bobby Jackson.

As impressive as the Salukis' NIT run was, the regular season had its great moments as well.

The Salukis lost in double overtime at Louisville 70-66 in their third game. The Cardinals were led by Butch Beard and Wes Unseld – both went on to the NBA. SIU held Beard to only nine points, but Unseld erupted for 21 points and 28 rebounds.
