\$3 Million Academic and Training Facility to Open in 2005

Thomas P. "Pete" Wittmann admits he wasn't a star athlete during his days as a Southern Illinois University Carbondale student. But the experience taught him the importance of perseverance and teamwork, qualities he hopes to help instill in future student-athletes.

Wittmann, a native of Town and Country, Mo., contributed a \$4.5 million gift - the largest private donation in the University's history - \$3 million of which will pay for a spacious, new high-tech training facility for intercollegiate student athletes.

"This marks the first time a new facility on our campus will be constructed entirely with private funds from a single donor," SIUC Chancellor Walter V. Wendler said. "The University relies on tuition, state dollars, grants and contracts, and private contributions like this one to build on our long-standing tradition of commitment to excellence. This very generous gift is a significant investment in our students."

Plans call for a two-story, 10,000-square-foot addition to the north wing of Lingle Hall, which adjoins the SIU Arena. Construction will begin in November of 2004 and should be completed in 2005.

The building will bear the names of Wittmann, who insists on giving himself second billing, and his best friend from college, Kenny Troutt. The two met on McAndrew Stadium's football field and belonged to the Salukis' team in the late '60s. They went on to become roommates, fraternity brothers, incredibly successful business partners - and remain best friends today in Dallas.

Wittmann, 55, admits he personally lacked the prowess to become a Saluki standout. But he said participating in college sports sparked a doggedness that has spurred his success - first as crew chief for Troutt's basement water-

proofing business, later overseeing massive tile installations in such places as St. Louis Centre and Barnes Hospital and finally as an early investor in a Troutt-founded telephone company, which mushroomed to become the nation's fifth largest by 1997.

"Athletics has always been to me a very important part of life," Wittmann said. "And in sports, of course, you always want to win. But when you don't, athletics teaches you to strive to get better and better."

Wittmann said he hopes the new center will inspire a new crop of young men and women to set high standards and to develop the perseverance and grit necessary to attain them.

"I wasn't a great athlete," Wittmann said, "in fact, I warned the bench most of the time. But belonging to the team gave me the drive and the desire to get better. I aim for that in all my work. I learned if you just keep on trying and keep on trying - you're going to come out OK."

The Troutt-Wittmann Athletic and Training Center will feature a first-floor fitness center nearly three times larger than the one now available to intercollegiate athletes. The larger facility will be able to accommodate more athletes at once and allow concurrent use by several teams.



On the second floor, athletes will find a mix of quiet areas in which to study or be tutored, along with high-speed Internet hook-ups and a combination of traditional and modern educational resources, from books to study guides and computer labs.

"The future of Saluki Athletics is considerably brighter, thanks to the generosity of Pete and Elaine Wittmann," athletics director Paul Kowalczyk said. "Their gift will improve our ability to nurture and enhance both the academic and athletic abilities of our student athletes."



Top faculty and staff, programs and a history of open doors to all students has created a rich legacy of choice and access at SIU. Many students choose the

campus for its varied programs. Others are here because of a wide variety of programs and policies that focus on a tradition of access. For example, tuition at SIU has consistently ranked among the state's affordable; ample student work programs and other assistance help low-income students earn as they learn. Salukis Unbeaten at SIU Arena Against MVC Teams Since 2002



There are few places in the nation where the home court advantage is as distinct as SIU Arena.

When you pack nearly 10,000 screaming fans into a classic, old facility, the decibel level can be overpowering.

The Salukis are undefeated at home during the last three seasons against Missouri Valley Conference teams (27-0) and are 40-1 overall during that span.

Entering its 41st year of service, SIU Arena continues to be a big part of the program's success, thanks to its excellent upkeep and dedicated fan support.

Southern Illinois has an all-time record of 399-132 (.751) at home, including a 71-11 (.866)

mark during the Bruce Weber-Matt Painter era.

Last year, the Salukis set a school record for the longest home winning streak in school history — 31 games. The streak was snapped on Jan. 2, 2004 when Charlotte beat SIU, 64-59.

Two years ago, the Salukis posted a perfect 14-0 season. It was the sixth time in arena history the Dawgs finished undefeated at home and set the school mark for best home record. Other unbeaten home seasons include 2001-02 (13-0), 1974-75 (12-0), 1966-67 (12-0), 1965-66 (13-0) and 1960-61 (9-0).

Construction on the arena began in the spring of 1962 and took nearly two years to complete. The basketball team played its first game in the new complex on December 1, 1964. The Salukis pummeled Oklahoma State, 78-55, in the opener and went on to post a 14-1 record at home that season.

Through the years, many teams from "high profile" conferences have played at SIU Arena,

including Arizona, Arizona State, Arkansas, Charlotte, Florida State, Georgia Tech, Hawaii, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas State, Louisville, Miami (Fla.), Michigan, Mississippi, Missouri, Navy, Nebraska, Oklahoma State, Oregon, Purdue, SMU, TCU, Texas, Texas Tech, UTEP and Wisconsin.

Fan support has been extraordinary the past three years, with five sellouts during that time.

Last year, the Salukis finished the season with an unprecedented three, consecutive sellouts. Two years ago, a full house witnessed SIU beat a Top 25 Creighton team to help solidify the Salukis' regular season championship. Three years ago, the Salukis played host to Big Ten foe Indiana in a highly anticipated December matchup. The game was a sellout and featured an indoor fireworks display before the game. The Salukis rolled to a comfortable 72-60 win over the Hoosiers, thanks in part to a raucous crowd, which stormed the court after the final buzzer.

Enthusiastic fans and big

crowds are a trademark of SIU Arena. Although its stated capacity is 9,628, the arena has packed in 12-standing room only crowds, including a record 10,300 overflow crowd to see Larry Bird and Indiana State in 1979.

During the last three seasons, SIU has clinched the Missouri Valley Conference regular-season title at home, sparking wild celebrations each time.





SIU Arena was completed in the Spring of 1964. The two-year project cost \$4.3 million.

Ashraf Amaya played two seasons in the NBA, one with the Vancouver Grizzlies and the other with the Washington Wizards. At SIU, Ashraf was one of the finest big men to ever wear the maroon and white. He ranks second in career scoring with 1,864 points and third in rebounds with 1,137.



Chris Carr (1995-2001)
Guard, 6-6, 200

Carr's best year statistically was the 1997-98 season when he averaged 9.9 ppg and 3.0 rebounds per game with the Minnesota Timberwolves. At SIU, he was MVP of the conference in 1995, as he led the team in scoring with 22.0 ppg. He played a central role on SIU's NCAA Tournament teams from 1993-95.

The Origin of the Salukis

Several members of the Southern Illinois University athletic staff suggested a new nickname in 1951. The teams had been known as the Maroons since inter-collegiate athletics began in 1913.

The name became official on March 19, 1951, when the student body overwhelmingly approved "Salukis" as the new symbol of SIU athletics.

Salukis received 536 votes, followed by "Rebels" with a mere 144 votes. Other names on the ballot included Knights, Flyers, Marauders and Maroons.

The oldest pure-breed dogs in the world with records dating back to 3600 B.C., the Saluki is an ancient Egyptian hunting dog known for its speed and hunting prowess.

So why is the name Salukis relevant to Southern Illinois?

Natives of southern Illinois know that the region is frequently referred to as "Egypt."

Historian Baker Brownell, in his book "The Other Illinois," explained how the region came to be known as Egypt.

He wrote, "There was a drought in the northern counties (of Illinois) in the early 1800s...the wheat fields dried up, the streams died in their beds. But in southern Illinois, rain fell and there were good crops, and from the north came people seeking corn and wheat as to Egypt of old. Thus, the name, Egypt."

The 19th century drought in Illinois parallels the Biblical account of the country of Egypt.

"There was famine in all lands; but in all the land of Egypt there was bread. All the earth came to Egypt to Joseph to buy grain, because the famine was so severe. And (Jacob) said, 'Behold, I have heard that there is grain in Egypt; go down and buy grain for us there, that we may live,



and not die.' So 10 of Joseph's brothers went down to buy grain in Egypt." (Genesis 41:54b, 57, 42:2-3).

In Egypt at that time, Salukis

were accepted as the finest animal a family could possess. Adopting such a well-respected dog as its mascot fit perfectly for a school in a region known as "Egypt."





History of Official Saluki Mascots

Since its adoption as SIU's sports symbol in 1951, 19 different Saluki dogs have graced the campus as the official mascot.

The first, and most well known, was King Tut who came to SIU in 1953, but was killed in an automobile accident just one year later. Tut was buried in the northeast corner of McAndrew Stadium by the Sigma Pi fraternity that housed him, and in 1961, he was honored with a small stone pyramid marking his grave.

During the 1956 Homecoming game, two beautiful new mascots, Burydown Datis and Ornah Farouk of Pine Paddocks, made their debut. The two pure bred dogs were donated by W. W. Vandever, an SIU alumnus and president of Ashland Oil Co.

Burydown Datis, a male, was imported from England, while

Ornah Farouk, a female, was a direct descendant of a champion from the kennels of King Ibn Saud of Saudi Arabia.

These two produced a litter of seven, of which SIU kept four: Desert Dusk, Desert Dawn, Lord Sundanya and Lady Syriana. All four represented SIU at football and basketball games at various times during the 1960s.

In 1968, Dr. Bert Hanicke of St. Louis donated 18-month-old Amira. In the same year, Dr. Leon Striegel, a Carbondale veterinarian, bought and presented two 9-month-old sisters, Sarra Aribi and Yembo Aribi. Three months later, Sarra escaped and was found struck by a car.

In 1969, an SIU fraternity, Alpha Phi Omega, bought and donated four-month-old Billa-de-Esta Iben Saude.

In 1970, the University acquired Bir Sheba Cairo from Wendell Allen of Wichita. Shortly thereafter, Billa bore eight pups. Most were sold, one was kept, and two were presented to Shelby State College of Memphis, who took the nickname "Saluqis."


By 1979, only one Saluki remained from that litter. The University acquired Debbie and Bandit, and the dogs were housed and cared for by the Alpha Phi Omega fraternity.

Then in 1980, Gary Strong of St. Louis presented SIU with two more dogs, Sharif and Khalid. Sharif would become sick in 1982 and die, but would be replaced by Thunder, who was donated by Mary Capron.

In 1986, two alums, John and Linda Saunders, took over the duties of caring for the remaining mascots, Thunder and Khalid.

Upon the deaths of Thunder and Khalid in 1987, one of the Saunders own dogs, a beautiful Saluki named Tavanai Shabaka JoLinSco, became the first outside, or independently owned Saluki to represent SIU as its official mascot.

Shabaka was a dual AKC Conformation and Field dog show champion. He also earned the distinction of being the first Saluki mascot to lead the SIU football team onto the field.



Tut II

Upon his death in 1997, the official mascot duties were assumed by another of the Saunders' dogs, Tavanai TUTIISIU JoLinSco (pronounced Tut 2 S.I.U.), also known as Tut II. Named after the original Saluki mascot, Tut

II brought the mascot full circle.

Sadly, Tut II was put to sleep in July of 2004, at the age of 13. Since that time, a host of fans and supporters have volunteered the services of their Saluki pets to serve as mascot at games.





The Distinguished Wendler is Southern's Chancellor

Walter V. Wendler was appointed chancellor of Southern Illinois University Carbondale on July 1, 2001.

He is the guiding force behind the remarkable "Southern at 150" project, in which hundreds of people participated in a yearlong process to develop clarity and direction for Southern. Their comprehensive ideas created a vision about what the University should look like when it reaches its 150th anniversary in 2019. It is a living blueprint for the University's future.

Says Wendler, "Our brand of higher education will remain accessible, be of the highest quality, and will be the foundation for a society that is better prepared to meet the challenges of future generations."

Immediately prior to the appointment, he served as vice chancellor for planning and system integration of The Texas A&M University System since September 1999.

He was the inaugural holder of the William M Peña Professorship of Information Management in the College of Architecture.

Wendler was the executive assistant to the president of Texas A&M University beginning in September 1997.

He served as dean of the College of Architecture, initially appointed in March 1992, and was re-appointed in September 1996.

Wendler was the head of the Department of Architecture from 1989 to 1992, and executive associate dean in the College of Architecture at Texas A&M University from 1988 to 1989.

His present research interests include the pedagogy of the design studio and appropriate teaching and learning strategies for university education in this setting.

Before coming to Texas A&M University, he was an assistant professor in the Department of Architecture at Louisiana State University, Baton Rouge. During his tenure there, he conducted research and service work related to energy use and its effect on building design.

He has delivered and published numerous papers on these subjects. From 1977 through 1981, he was a principal in an architectural firm that executed residential, commercial and institutional work.

He is an excellent teacher

who has been recognized by the Association of Former Students of Texas A&M University, with a Distinguished Teaching Award.

He received his Ph.D. in curriculum and instruction from the University of Texas; the professional master of architecture degree from the University of California, Berkeley; the bachelor of environmental design from Texas A&M University; and an associate's degree in applied science from the State University of New York at Farmingdale. He is a member of

a number of honorary societies, a registered architect and holds the National Council of Architectural Registration Board's certificate.

Wendler was reared



in Northport, New York. He graduated high school there in 1968.

He married Mary L Haney in 1973. They have two grown sons, Walter III and Bradley.





Saluki Athletics Reaching New Heights

Since his arrival on campus four years ago, athletics director Paul Kowalczyk has orchestrated an amazing transformation of the Saluki athletics department.

The revival began in the summer of 2000, when Kowalczyk charted a new course for a department which had struggled to balance its budget, field competitive teams and put fans in the stands.

With an emphasis on customer service, sound fiscal management and teamwork, the 46-year-old Ohio native rolled up his sleeves and set out to change the culture of Saluki athletics.

The challenges were daunting. Football had slowly deteriorated in the two decades since winning a national championship. The once-proud men's basketball program was six years removed from its last NCAA Tournament appearance. Aging facilities and an outdated development plan were additional burdens.

Yet, four years later, the department is in what could easily be described as the glory days of Saluki athletics. And the best may be yet to come as optimism and confidence abounds among coaches and staff.

In the last four years, Saluki athletics has established itself as one of the premier "mid-major" universities in the nation. The de-

partment is now on solid financial footing, winning is commonplace and major facility improvements have taken place.

The football team is coming off its best season in 20 years, posting 10 wins and climbing as high as #2 in the national polls.

The success on the gridiron is no accident.

After a disappointing season in 2000, Kowalczyk scoured the country for a new football coach and landed the perfect man for the job, Jerry Kill. Kowalczyk gave Kill the tools he needed to rebuild the program, including a new AstroPlay turf surface, new stadium lights and a renovated locker room. A new stadium and football complex remains a high priority for a program that enters the 2004 season projected to be among the best in the country.

A remarkable turnaround has also taken place in the men's basketball program under Kowalczyk, who has been adept at hiring the right coach at the right time.

Now led by its third head coach in three years, the Salukis have nonetheless maintained consistency on the court, earning three-straight at-large bids to the NCAA Tournament in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The 2002 club advanced to the "Sweet 16," gaining unprecedented national media exposure. The 2004 squad rose to #15 in the national polls, the highest in school history.

An energized fan base is one of the outgrowths of the basketball program's success. Five sell-outs have taken place at SIU Arena in the last three years, including three in a row to end the 2004 season.

Olympic sports have also flourished under Kowalczyk, with the softball team advancing to the NCAA Tournament two years in a row, and a total of 12 teams finishing among the top four in conference play last season.

While many state universities are struggling to make ends meet in the wake of budget cuts, the Salukis are prospering, thanks to increased ticket sales and marketing opportunities, plus fiscal responsibility.

Kowalczyk also recognized



the need for a fund-raising mechanism to defray scholarship costs, as well as reward the department's valued supporters. Thus, the new Saluki Athletic Scholarship Fund was born in 2003. The SASF has been a huge success, already topping \$325,000 annually in scholarship money.

Facility improvements are yet another major focus of Kowalczyk's administration, and new structures have been erected or are on the way.

Softball's Charlotte West Stadium, a state-of-the-art facility, opened in the spring of 2003 and has already hosted one Missouri Valley Conference championship. Thanks to a generous gift from alumnus Pete Wittmann, a new \$3.0 million academic and training center should be completed by the summer of 2005.

Success off the field is equally important to Kowalczyk, who is committed to supporting academic and community service programs for student-athletes. During his tenure, student-athletes have

outperformed the general student body in the classroom. Last year, 36 athletes earned academic all-conference honors, and two were named Academic All-American.

Kowalczyk came to SIU from Northwestern University, where he was an integral part of the school's rise to success in the early '90s. He began in 1991 as the business manager in charge of finance and personnel, and was promoted four years later to associate athletic director for external affairs. Prior to Northwestern, Kowalczyk spent three years at Kansas State as assistant athletic director for business operations.

He began his career in athletics in 1986, working at his alma mater, Kent State, while earning a master's degree. He then accepted a position as business manager for athletics at Portland State.

Kowalczyk holds a bachelor's of business administration in accounting and a master's in sports administration from Kent State. He and his wife, Peg, reside in Carbondale.



Chris Lowery Comes Home to Southern Illinois

Few people have had a bigger hand in the success of Saluki basketball than Chris Lowery. Just 10 years ago, as the team's starting point guard, he finished up a stellar playing career by leading his club to a fourth-straight postseason bid. More recently, as Bruce Weber's assistant coach, he helped recruit and guide the players who have built Saluki Basketball into one of the top college programs in America.

On April 9, 2004, Chris Lowery fulfilled a dream. He returned to his alma mater and was introduced as the 12th men's basketball head coach at Southern Illinois University in the 91-year history of the program.

Lowery, the fifth-youngest

coach in Division I at age 32, has spent the past three seasons on Bruce Weber's staff at both Southern Illinois and Illinois.

He helped the Salukis to a 52-15 (.776) record and two trips to the NCAA Tournament, including a run to the Sweet Sixteen in 2002 and back-to-back Missouri Valley Conference championships. He went with Weber to Illinois in 2003 and helped guide the team to a Big Ten title and a trip to the Sweet 16.

Regarded as one of the top, young recruiters in college basketball, Lowery said he is honored to have the opportunity to be a head coach at a young age.

"I was so happy to be up at Illinois," he said. "I thought I would be there for a while and had no idea that an opportunity to be head coach would come about so quickly. I think that when you're successful, things happen more quickly than when you're not."

Success and Lowery have gone hand-in-hand his entire life.

A native of Evansville, Ind., Lowery played point guard at Southern Illinois from 1990-94. He helped lead SIU to two, straight NCAA Tournament appearances in 1993 and '94 after consecutive NIT berths in 1991 and '92. A second-team All-Missouri Valley selection in 1992, Lowery scored 1,225 career points and dished out 391 assists, ranking third in



school history on the career assists chart. SIU went 86-37 (.699) during his four years.

"Chris has been a winner his whole career," said Saluki athletics director Paul Kowalczyk, who named Lowery one day after Matt Painter resigned to take a position at Purdue. "He won here as a player, and as an assistant coach, he helped elevate our program to its current level of unprecedented success."

Weber said he is happy for Lowery and his family, and pleased for the players at SIU as well as Saluki fans and the Carbondale community.

"They're getting one of their own in Chris, and a coach that they all know and respect," Weber said. "The system will stay the same as it has been for the past six years, and the future of the SIU program remains bright."

Lowery began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Rend Lake Community College in Ina, Ill. for two seasons. He then coached at Missouri Southern State College for three years, helping the Lions to a 30-3 record and an NCAA Division II Final Four appearance in 2000.

Prior to his coaching tenure

at Southern Illinois, Lowery spent one season as an assistant at Southeast Missouri State under Gary Garner.

"He has the integrity, class, work ethic and intelligence to be an outstanding head basketball coach for many years," Kowalczyk said. "Plus, his knowledge of our current system will allow him to continue to build on our program's achievements. I'm pleased to welcome Chris back to the SIU family."

Lowery is the third-youngest head coach in school history, behind former Saluki coach and NBA Hall-of-Famer Harry Gallatin, who was 31-years-old when he was named head coach in 1958, and William McAndrew, the founder of Saluki basketball, who was 26 when he took the reigns of SIU's first officially recognized squad in 1913.

Lowery was born on July 7, 1972 in Evansville, Ind. and attended Harrison High School. He graduated from Southern Illinois in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in physical education.

Lowery and his wife, Erika have three children, Lexis, C.J. and Kahari.



Q & A With Chris Lowery

What is the most important thing you've learned about coaching as an assistant for Bruce Weber?

"Doing things right on a daily basis, I think that is the biggest thing with Coach Weber. He always wants you to do things right all the time. Not whenever you feel like it, or not *sometimes* during the game, but convincing kids to do things right on both ends of the floor. It's very hard to do, and you've got to be willing to fight people. It's not easy, and that's what I learned from him, to be consistent, you've got to make 'em do right."

Do you consider him your mentor?

"I think it's pretty obvious that he is. He brings strong values as a person away from the court, which makes him even a better guy to work for and be around. At times, it's almost like you're not working *for* him. He is my mentor. He is a guy I look to for guidance on almost a daily basis. He brings so much to the table away from the coaching aspect, because you can just talk to him about a lot of things."

Why do you think the Gene Keady/Bruce Weber system has been so successful?

"I think if you look at Coach Keady's system, the defensive principle is all the same. Offensively, I think that's where Coach Weber is different from Coach Keady — the fact that we do a

lot more motion than they do. We play a little differently on the offensive end, but as far as toughness, being hard-nosed, and just making games an all out fight on the defensive end, I think that's the trait that's similar."

What will be your points of emphasis with this year's team?

"We have to get better offensively. I think last year at times, they were very stagnant and struggled to score at times. Even when you guard all-out, sometimes people are gonna score on you, and you have to counteract that by making them pay on the other end, and making them guard you. I think that's the stamp that we've got to get across to these guys. Not only are we going to guard, but we're also going to be very efficient with the basketball."

How did coaching at the Big Ten level help your development as a coach?

"It allowed me to get in different recruiting circles that there's no way I could here at Southern Illinois. I was able to go recruit the best AAU teams in the country and get to know guys from their teams. Now I have a relationship with these guys, and it's paid off very quickly for us. We've really gotten ahead of the game in recruiting, and that's because my assistants here, too, did a tremendous job. But being able to call these guys and talk to them and be personal with them obviously helps."

How have you dealt with the pressure that goes with the high expectations of this program?

"Now with the season about to start, I think the pressure's starting to hit me that it's finally here and the games are about to start. When I first got here, I had to focus on making sure everybody came, and then we really focused on recruiting and making sure we have the best possible players that we can get to come here. Fortunately, I have good assistants, good players, players who have played in some of the biggest games in school history. I think that enables me to deal with pressure."

What's been your biggest adjustment from assistant coach to head coach?

"Having the final say in things. I've always been told by Coach Weber I complain too much. He said one day, you're gonna see. Now I see what he's talking about. He always used to say, I hate my cell phone, and now I really see it. It never stops ringing, and you're always needed to do something. I think that's the biggest adjustment. As an assistant, I could just go to my office, sit back and do whatever I wanted. Now there's so many things to do on a given day."

Has your familiarity with the program helped you adjust?

"It was very easy for me to come back here and coach Stetson and Darren and Josh, and even young kids like LaMar and Tatum, because I recruited them. It was very easy, because I had a personal relationship with everybody. You talk about Matt Shaw. We recruited him since he was a freshman. It was easy to come back here."

What does Southern need to do to be successful on a national level this year?

"Everybody keeps comparing us to Gonzaga, and at one point, Gonzaga had a feature player, Dan Dickau, who got them over the hump nationally. He was the player who got them to national recognition. Darren Brooks has to be that player for us. If we want to continue being at this level, we've got to have somebody to get us

over the hump, like Kyle Korver at Creighton. He got them over the hump nationally. He was such a talented player, he's an NBA guy. You need those guys if you want to maintain your consistency, your best players need to step up and be above and beyond what's normal."

Word has it that off-season workouts have been especially grueling this year. How is the team's focus heading into the season?

"I think that we've made it tough because we didn't want them to get bored with winning. I think sometimes that can happen. We've got kids who don't know anything other than winning. I didn't want them to think it was gonna be easy the last time, their senior year. It was so hard to get to that point. Now we're here. We're picked first finally in everything, where in the past, we always had something to motivate them. So we decided to make workouts harder, to test them on a daily basis, make them mentally tough."

Who has had the biggest influence on your life?

"My grandmother. As far as basketball, there were doubts about whether I was big enough to play or whether I could go to college if I didn't get a scholarship. She always maintained 'you can do it' and she was very positive with me and continued to keep me focused. She's had the biggest impact. She lives in Evansville still, and she'll get to come watch me coach."

Rodney Watson is the dean of Missouri Valley Conference assistant coaches – beginning his 17th season on the Southern Illinois staff. There is no question work behind the scenes has aided SIU’s rise to national prominence.

In addition to recruiting, Watson handles advance scouting of opponents.

During Watson’s tenure, the school has won eight Missouri Valley Conference championships and qualified for six NCAA Tournaments and five NITs. The Salukis have compiled a 321-180 record during Watson’s 16 seasons, including 11 postseason appearances.

A native of Paris, Ill., Watson began his coaching career at Coulterville High School, where he guided the school to its first regional championship.

He moved to Madison, Ill. in 1984, and led that school to a regional and sectional championship, advancing all the way to the high school Elite Eight.

Watson used his success at the high school level as a springboard to the college ranks.

He coached two years at Nebraska-Omaha (1986-88) before joining Rich Herrin’s staff at SIU.

Watson, age 44, and his wife, Carol, have four children, Ashley (13), Zach (12) and twins Olivia and Blake (8).

Jack Owens has quickly earned a reputation as one of college basketball’s best recruiters. The relationships he’s built with high school coaches and his keen eye for talent have helped the Salukis make in-roads in talent hot-beds throughout the midwest.

Owens was hired in the summer of 2003 by former Saluki head coach Matt Painter, who first watched Owens play during a recruiting visit to Howard (Texas) Community College. Painter, then an assistant on the staff at Eastern Illinois, signed Owens, who went on to have a stellar, two-year career for EIU from 1997-99.

In 1999, Owens averaged 11.7 ppg and led the Ohio Valley Conference in assists (6.5 apg). Owens was honorable mention all-conference, team MVP, “Outstanding Defensive Player” and co-captain.

The 27-year-old assistant coach joined the Saluki staff after one year as an assistant at his alma mater. From 2000-2002, Owens was an assistant coach at Barton County (KS) Junior College, which was ranked as high as second in the nation during the 2001-02 season. He also coached at Howard Community College in 2000 and served briefly as interim head coach.

“I love recruiting and enjoy working with kids,” Owens said. “This is a great opportunity for me.”

Shane Hawkins, the most prolific 3-point shooter in school history, returned to his alma mater as graduate manager on coach Bruce Weber's staff three years. He was promoted to full-time assistant in the summer of 2004.

Hawkins is involved in all phases of the program, ranging from recruiting to administrative matters such as team travel and organizing off-season outings and events.

From 1995-98, Hawkins made 314 shots from 3-point range and 39 percent of his attempts from behind the arc. He ranks 14th in career scoring with 1,348 points and second in assists with 435.

Hawkins' stellar career included a trip to the NCAA Tournament during his freshman year, in which he made 7-of-8 3-point shots in a 96-92 loss to Syracuse.

Hawkins found his first coaching job at Barton County Community College (Kan.), where he served as an assistant from 1999-2001. Hawkins handled recruiting, worked with the team's perimeter players, and monitored the academic progress of student-athletes, among other responsibilities.

In 2001, Hawkins joined the staff at Southwestern Illinois College (Ill.), where he also served as recruiting coordinator.

In three years as a JUCO assistant coach, Hawkins' teams had a combined 85-18 record. He helped coach 10 future Division I players and three All-Americans.

There are many coaches around the Missouri Valley Conference breathing a sigh of relief that Brad Korn is no longer knocking down 3-pointers for the Salukis.

However, he's doing the next best thing — mentoring his former teammates as the team's graduate assistant.

During his four-year career at SIU from 1999-2004, Korn was one of the most prolific 3-point shooters in the MVC. He finished his career with 78 3-pointers and ranks among the leaders all-time at SIU.

Last year, he started for the first time and was named to the MVC's Most Improved team. He improved his scoring average from 3.8 ppg to 9.7 ppg and ranked among the team leaders in free throw shooting. Korn posted a career-high 17 points versus Bradley, Jacksonville State and Wright State in 2003-04.

Korn also has the distinction of having been involved in more wins in his career at SIU than any other player in school history (92).

Salukis Set Sights on Fourth-Straight Conference Title


So what do you do when your team has won three-straight conference titles and made three-straight NCAA Tournament appearances? *You work even harder.* That's the philosophy of new head coach Chris Lowery, who is guarding his team from complacency by pushing them to their limits as they prepare for the 2004-05 campaign.

The Southern Illinois University men's basketball program has enjoyed unprecedented success the last three seasons. Does anyone doubt that it is among the elite programs in the nation?

Consider last year, that the Salukis spent six weeks in the Top 25, rising as high as #15. SIU won its first 17 games in the Missouri Valley Conference and breezed to a five-game lead over second-place Northern Iowa and Wichita State.

Or how about two years ago, when Southern posted a 16-2 conference record, edging out nationally ranked Creighton and star forward Kyle Korver for the MVC title?

And no one will forget the 2001-02 campaign, in which the Salukis won a school-record 28 games and advanced to the Sweet 16 of the NCAA Tournament. SIU defeated basketball powers such as Iowa State, Texas Tech, Georgia and national runner-up Indiana. The Salukis finished the season ranked #22 in the Coaches Poll and garnered unprecedented media attention. Saluki players and coaches were featured guests on television networks such as ESPN, Fox Sports and CNN and on radio sports talk shows throughout the country. Feature stories appeared in the nation's biggest newspapers, including USA Today, the

New York Times and the Los Angeles Times.

Add it all up, and Southern has recorded 77 wins in the last three seasons. Only seven schools have fared bettered (Pittsburgh, Duke, UConn, Kansas, Gonzaga, Kentucky and Xavier).

Yes, there is no question the Salukis have established themselves on the national scene. The respect the program has earned is evidenced by its three-straight at-large berths to the NCAA Tournament. The selection committee knows a good thing when it sees it.

The fervor and sustained national attention of the past three seasons is unparalleled in school history.

School pride permeates the university and the region. The Salukis sold out the last three games of the 2003-04 season, something it had never done before.

And while change is a never-ending fact of college basketball, the core of

the program remains in place.

Former head coach Bruce Weber is now at Illinois. His successor, Matt Painter, returned to his alma mater, Purdue.

Returning to guide the team is former Saluki point guard Chris Lowery, who has spent the last three years on Weber's staff and has had a hand in recruiting most of the players on the current roster.

Stetson Hairston

Four seniors will form the foundation of this year's squad.

Guard **Darren Brooks (6-3, 205, Sr.)** is the reigning MVC Player of the Year and Defensive Player of the Year.

After playing a complementary role on the team as a freshman and sophomore, he blossomed into a superstar in 2003-04. Brooks is a multi-dimensional player who led the team in scoring (16.5 ppg), rebounding (5.7 rpg), assists (82) and steals (60). He ranks among the career leaders at SIU in all of those categories.

His veteran backcourt mate in the Salukis' three-guard attack is **Stetson Hairston (6-3, 220, Sr.)**. An excellent defender and explosive open court player, Hairston has started 96 games since his freshman year and is the only player on the current squad who started for the Sweet 16 team.

Hairston averaged 9.1 ppg last year, yet was named Second Team All-MVC and was tabbed for the All-Defensive team.

A pair of rising sophomores will battle for the starting point guard position.

Jamaal Tatum (6-2, 175, So.) had an excellent rookie campaign a year ago. He finished second in the conference in 3-point shooting, hitting a remarkable 45.6 percent. Tatum was named to

both the MVC's All-Bench and All-Freshman teams. A scoring point guard with great quickness, he is also a tenacious defender.

Speaking of defense, **Tony Young (6-0, 190, So.)** may be the best on-ball defender on the squad. One television announcer said he guarded like a "rabid dog," hounding the opposing point guard across every inch of the court.

Young also demonstrated a nice shooting touch, making 41.9 percent of 3-point tries.

Two newcomers will try to break into the backcourt playing rotation.

Guard **Mike Dale (6-5, 205, So.)** is a much-heralded prospect who sat out the 2003-04 season to focus on academics. Lowery said Dale has as much raw ability as any guard in school history, quite a statement, considering Walt Frazier donned the maroon and white in the late '60s. At 6-5, Dale really is a guard, Lowery said. His ball-handling skills rival those of the team's point guards.

If you look closely at guard **Wesley Clemmons (6-3, 180, Fr.)**, you might think you're seeing a younger version of Brooks or Hairston. Clemmons has a well-defined body and strength that is lacking in most young guards. He is a top athlete with upside.

The front court returns a pair of seniors.

Center **Joshua Warren (6-8, 265, Sr.)** is a true, back-to-the-basket player with a nice variety of post-up moves. He also has a deft shooting touch out to 15 feet and has been a productive player the last two seasons.

Although a tad undersized, forward **LaMar Owen (6-5, 185, Sr.)** compensates with his determination and athletic ability. He is a high-energy player who came off the bench last year and consistently gave the team a boost. Owen was named the MVC's Sixth Man of the Year and was also named to the All-Bench and All-Newcomer teams.

Two redshirt big men are poised to make an impact on the Saluki front court.

Jamaal Foster (6-10, 210, Fr.) is long and skilled and has made big strides both on the court and in the weightroom. He brings athleticism and shot blocking to the table.

Randal Falker (6-7, 225, Fr.) is another athletic forward whose greatest attribute is rebounding. Lowery believes Falker, who has

added 10 pounds to his muscular frame since last year, can be one of the best rebounders in school history.

Two true freshman have bright futures in the Saluki front court, as well. Forward **Matt Shaw (6-7, 225, Fr.)** is one of the most highly prized signees by an MVC school in recent history. He has the strength and athletic ability to be a force inside, yet also has an outside game that will make him a difficult matchup for opponents.

Forward **Tony Boyle (6-8, 220, Fr.)** is a rugged, blue-collar player whose toughness is his strongest asset. He is also a skilled player with the ability to knock down the mid-range jumper.

1967 NIT Champions

It was March of 1967. Lyndon Baines Johnson was still President of the United States. The Vietnam War was taking place overseas. A few months earlier, the Green Bay Packers rolled over Kansas City in the first Super Bowl. The Beatles' renowned "Sgt. Pepper's" album was still two months away from its release date.

Meanwhile, people in the small town of Carbondale, Ill., were engulfed in Saluki fever.

The Southern Illinois University men's basketball team defeated Marquette, 71-56, in the National Invitation Tournament championship game on March 18 of that year. It was not considered an upset either, as most college basketball pundits picked the Salukis to take the title.

Walt "Clyde" Frazier and Dick Garrett led SIU into New York City's Madison Square Garden with a record of 20-2. The NCAA Tournament consisted of only 16 teams at the time, and the NIT was much more prestigious than it is today. SIU was considered a small college (based on how many major schools it had played) at the time, so it could not participate in the NCAA postseason event. The Salukis were coached by Jack Hartman.

The school turned down a bid to the NCAA Small College Tournament. SIU had already defeated #2-ranked Louisville and defending NCAA champion Texas Western, and wanted no part of the small school postseason.

Garrett scored 28 points to lead SIU over St. Peter's, 103-58, in its opening NIT game. Frazier added 24 points and 14 rebounds for the Salukis (21-2).

The Salukis faced off against Duke in the quarterfinals of the NIT. The Blue Devils had dropped the championship game of the Atlantic Coast Conference tournament just two days earlier. Southern knocked off Duke, 72-63, and Garrett led the club with 18 points. Frazier and Ralph Johnson added 17 points apiece for SIU, which outrebounded the Blue Devils 47-41.

Duke head coach Vic Bubas called the Salukis "a great team" and praised the play of Frazier and Garrett.

"The thing that impresses you about Southern Illinois is its fine team discipline," Bubas said in The Chicago Daily News.

The victory was Hartman's 100th as coach of SIU, and moved the team to 22-2. The Saluki coach played for the legendary Hank Iba, and talked about his team's discipline after the game.

"You demand it," Hartman said. "If you don't get it, you fire somebody."

In the NIT semifinals, SIU defeated Rutgers, 79-70. Frazier led the Salukis with 26 points and 18 rebounds. Garrett tallied 22 points and Clarence Smith added 15. Jim Valvano led the Scarlet Knights with 24 points.

Rutgers coach Bill Foster told The Home News he was nervous about the SIU offense before the game even began.

"There's no place to cheat on that ball club," Foster said. "They can really shoot. I got sick just watching them warm up."

SIU would meet up with Marquette – coached by Al McGuire – in the NIT championship game. The Salukis were 23-2 while Marquette held a record of 21-8.

Frazier scored 21 points and grabbed 11 rebounds – on his way to the NIT MVP – as Southern defeated Marquette, 71-56, to win it all. Garrett added 16, Smith had 13 and Roger Bechtold scored 10 for SIU. The Warriors led 42-34 with 13 minutes left in the game, but it was not to be for Marquette.

"We hadn't been taking the battle to them," Hartman said. "We were letting them control the game. I told them at halftime they had to be more aggressive."

The Salukis trailed by 11 points at halftime, and they played inspired basketball in the second half.

"It was a matter of a good club going up against a great club," McGuire said to The Associated Press. "They (SIU) are No. 3 in the nation in my book – behind UCLA and North Carolina."

SIU had dropped the title game of the NCAA College Division (small schools) playoffs the previous two years, but this was one to remember.

The Saluki faithful rushed the court as time expired, and they carried many players on their shoulders.

"We weren't going to be denied this time," said SIU center Ralph Johnson.

Hartman added, "We didn't want to go to the small college tournament again. We were hoping like the devil to get in the NIT."

Frazier signed a contract with the New York Knicks instead of returning to Southern for his senior year.

The rest of the magical Saluki team included: Chuck Benson, Ed Zastrow, Willie Griffin, Creston Whitaker, Jay Westcott, Craig Taylor, Rick Millis, Rich Brueckner, Andy Kukic and Bobby Jackson.

As impressive as the Salukis' NIT run was, the regular season had its great moments as well.

The Salukis lost in double overtime at Louisville 70-66 in their third game. The Cardinals were led by Butch Beard and Wes Unseld – both went on to the NBA. SIU held Beard to only nine points, but Unseld erupted for 21 points and 28 rebounds.

"We were in the position of having to catch up all the time," Hartman said. "In the overtime periods, Unseld would control the tip, and they'd put the ball in the basket."

The Salukis defeated No. 4 Texas Western 59-54 at the Sun Bowl Tournament in their sixth game. Texas Western – which is now UTEP – were the defending NCAA champions. Johnson led SIU with 22 points in the contest.

SIU beat Indiana State 72-69 in its eighth game. The Sycamores were ranked sixth in the small colleges poll.

The Salukis got revenge on unbeaten Louisville 53-50 at SIU Arena in their 10th game. The Cardinals were still the No. 2 team in the major college polls at the time. This win remains arguably the greatest in SIU Arena history.
