JIM CALHOUN

Head Coach

22nd Season at Connecticut

36th Season Overall

Entering his 22nd season as head coach at the University of Connecticut and his 36th year as a collegiate head coach, Jim Calhoun has unquestionably stood the test of time in establishing himself as perhaps the greatest program builder in college basketball history.

Jim Calhoun's coaching success story includes winning two NCAA National Championships (1999, 2004) at Connecticut, passing the elite 700-win plateau, and earning basketball's highest honor, election into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame as a member of the Class of 2005. Coach Calhoun is also a member of the Founding Class of the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame, announced in November of 2006.

The beginning of what has become one of college basketball's greatest coaching achievements—transforming the University of Connecticut into one of the nation's elite programs—was launched in May of 1986 when Jim Calhoun was named head coach.

Twenty-one years later, UConn Basketball sits atop the college basketball landscape with a pair of NCAA National Championships, an NIT Championship, recognition as the most successful program in the history of the Big East Conference with a record-setting 16 league titles, and annual acknowledgement as one of America's truly outstanding college programs.

In September of 2005, with some 60 of his former players in attendance, Jim Calhoun's four decade body of work as one of college basketball's greatest coaches was formally rewarded when the UConn coach was enshrined as a coach into the Basketball Hall of Fame.

In April of 2004, Jim Calhoun cemented his place among the all-time collegiate coaching

greats and as a future member of the Hall of Fame by leading UConn to the 2004 national title. In directing Connecticut to its second NCAA National Championship in a six-year span, Jim Calhoun became one of only two coaches to win multiple NCAA titles since the tournament field expanded to 64 teams in 1985.

On March 2, 2005, Jim Calhoun joined an elite club, becoming one of only 19 coaches in NCAA Division I basketball history to reach the 700-win plateau when UConn beat Georgetown, 83-64.

Within a six-day period in April 2005, Jim Calhoun was honored with two career awards. On April 4, 2005, the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame introduced Coach Calhoun as a Class of 2005 Hall of Fame enshrinee. On April 9, 2005, Coach Calhoun became just the seventh recipient of the prestigious John R. Wooden "Legends of Coaching Award" presented by the Los Angeles Athletic Club. Previous winners of the award include Hall of Fame coaches Dean Smith, Mike Krzyzewski and Lute Olson.

In 35 seasons as a head coach on the NCAA Division I collegiate level, Jim Calhoun's overall collegiate head coaching record is 750-328. That includes a 248-137 record in 14 seasons as head coach at Northeastern (MA) University and a 502-191 mark in his 21 seasons at Connecticut.

In his 21 seasons at Connecticut, Jim Calhoun has compiled a stunning 48-15 overall record in national postseason tournament competition (36-11 in NCAA play, 12-4 in NIT play).

Jim Calhoun has led UConn to 14 NCAA bids in the past 18 years. Under Coach Calhoun's direction, UConn has never lost a NCAA First Round game and UConn is 25-3 in NCAA First and Second Round competition since 1990. The Huskies have earned 11 NCAA Sweet 16 berths in the past 17 years, seven Elite Eight appearances, two NCAA Final Four trips and two National Championships.

Under Coach Calhoun, UConn has captured a league record 16 BIG EAST Championships, ten regular season crowns and six tournament titles. The Huskies are 28-15 in BIG EAST Tournament play under Calhoun.

Jim Calhoun ranks No. 9 all-time in NCAA career victories with 39 (36-11 at Connecticut, 3-5 at Northeastern). Coach Calhoun is 39-16 in overall NCAA play (with two NCAA titles).

Jim Calhoun's overall career record for national postseason tournament competition is a remarkable 51-20 (39-16 in NCAA play, 12-4 in NIT play). He has coached in the NCAA Tournament 19 times and in the NIT five times (including winning the 1988 NIT title).



GEORGE BLANEY

**Associate Head Coach
7th Season at UConn**

George Blaney completed his sixth season as a member of the Connecticut basketball staff in the 2006-07 season. He was named the Associate Head Coach in July of 2007.

Blaney brings to the Connecticut staff more than 30 years of coaching experience. He was an All-New England college basketball standout at Holy Cross, scoring 1,012 points in his college career and leading the Crusaders to back-to-back 20-win seasons before graduating in 1961. Blaney was a fourth round selection of the New York Knicks in the 1961 NBA Draft and played during the 1961-62 season with the Knicks.

In the summer of 2003, Blaney was inducted as a member of the New England Basketball Hall of Fame.

Blaney began his coaching career as head coach at Hudson Catholic High School in Jersey City, NJ in 1965. He moved into the college coaching ranks two years later when he was named head coach at Stonehill (MA) College. After two seasons at Stonehill, Blaney spent three years as head coach at Dartmouth College before returning to his alma mater and coaching the Holy Cross program for the next 22 years.

While directing the Holy Cross program, Blaney led the Crusaders to three NCAA tournament berths, five invitations to the NIT, and a 357-276 overall record. Holy Cross posted seven 20-win seasons during Blaney's tenure as head coach.

In 1994, George Blaney joined the BIG EAST Conference and spent three seasons as head coach at Seton Hall. He departed the college coaching ranks to become Vice President of Basketball Operations for the International Basketball League in 1998. He remained in that post for two years before joining the University of Rhode Island as an assistant coach during the 2000-2001 season.

In 30 seasons as a collegiate head coach, Blaney posted an impressive overall record of 459-382.

During his coaching career, Blaney spent 12 years on the Board of Directors of the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and served as the organization's president in 1993-94. He has earned numerous honors including the 1996 Bob Cousy Humanitarian Award; 1994 Eastern Basketball Magazine's Man of the Year; 1990 Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Coach of the Year; 1982 inductee into the Holy Cross Hall of Fame; 1981 inductee into the Hudson County Hall of Fame; 1980 U.S. Olympic Festival coach; 1977 Eastern Coach of the Year; and 1976 Hugh Greer Memorial New England Coach of the Year.

Born November 12, 1939, Blaney and his wife, Maryellen, have two daughters and three sons, along with five grandchildren.



ANDRE LaFLEUR

**Assistant Coach
7th Season at UConn**

Andre LaFleur completed his third season as an assistant coach and his sixth year on the UConn Basketball staff in 2006-07. He spent three seasons as the Director of Basketball Operations before moving into the assistant coaching role beginning with the 2004-05 campaign.

LaFleur is a graduate of Northeastern University where he was one of the nation's premier point guards. A native of Los Angeles and a product of Governor Dummer Academy in South Byfield, Mass., he was a prime recruit for then-Northeastern head coach Jim Calhoun in a class that included Wes Fuller and Reggie Lewis.

The impact of that freshman class at Northeastern was instantaneous. The Huskies romped through their conference schedule with a perfect 14-0 mark and an overall record of 27-5. They won the ECAC North Atlantic title and went on to the NCAA Tournament. This pattern continued throughout his career as every year the Huskies won the league crown and went on to the NAAs. From the 1983-84 season through LaFleur's senior year of 1986-87, the team boasted a conference record of 60-6 and an overall record of 102-26. During one stretch, the Huskies won 38 consecutive home games.

LaFleur played 4405 minutes in 128 consecutive games - more minutes and more games than any other Northeastern player, past or present. LaFleur scored 1143 career points, graduating as the 10th all-time leading scorer in NU history and he is a member of the Northeastern Hall of Fame. He registered 89 steals as a senior and 252 for his career, both still Northeastern records. His total of 894 career assists set a new NCAA record in 1988 and he still ranks 12th in NCAA history. As a junior and senior, LaFleur was named All-Conference, while serving as a tri-captain with Fuller and Lewis. As a freshman, he made the conference All-Rookie Team.

LaFleur was a fifth-round draft pick of the Houston Rockets in 1987 and lasted until the team's final cut of the preseason. He then played and coached professionally in Australia and overseas for 11 seasons. After completing his professional career, Andre took a position as School Sports Coordinator for the Sydney City Basketball Association.

Born March 22, 1965, Andre, and his wife Alana reside in Manchester and have two sons, Adonis and Adrian.



PATRICK SELLERS

**Assistant Coach
4th Season at UConn**

Patrick Sellers completed his third season as the Director of Men's Basketball Operations at the University of Connecticut in 2006-07 and was promoted to the position of assistant coach in the spring of 2007.

Sellers came to Connecticut after spending the 2003-04 season as an assistant coach at the University of Massachusetts, where he served as a recruiter and was instrumental in the development of the UMass frontcourt.


Patrick is the older brother of former Husky standout and team captain Rod Sellers, who played at UConn from 1989-1992.

Sellers moved to UMass from his alma mater, Central Connecticut State University, where he spent four seasons with head coach Howie Dickenman, a former UConn assistant coach. Patrick helped the Blue Devils to NCAA Tournament appearances in 2000 and 2002, winning the Northeast Conference Regular Season and Tournament Championship in both of those seasons. During his time as an assistant coach at Central Connecticut, his responsibilities included recruiting, inside player development, scouting and assisting with on-court practices. He also served as a co-director of the Howie Dickenman Basketball School.

Prior to his time at Central Connecticut State, Sellers served as the head coach at St. Thomas Aquinas High School in New Britain, Conn. In his first season as the varsity head coach in 1998, Sellers led the Saints to a Northwest Conference Championship. His team also made back-to-back appearances in the state playoffs during the 1998 and 1999 seasons. Sellers originally joined the basketball staff at St. Thomas Aquinas in 1994 as the junior varsity coach and an assistant under head coach Jerry DeGregorio.

A 1991 graduate of Central Connecticut State with a bachelor's degree in accounting, Sellers served as the Blue Devils' captain during his senior season, and was named East Coast Conference Defensive Player of the Year in 1991. He led the team in rebounding in both his junior and senior seasons, finishing his career with 581 rebounds. He played professionally in Europe in the British Basketball League during the 1992-93 season.

Born December 28, 1968, Patrick resides in Vernon.



BEAU ARCHIBALD

**Director of Operations
1st Season at UConn**

Beau Archibald was named the Director of Men's Basketball Operations on June 11, 2007.

Archibald brings a variety of coaching and playing experience to the Husky program, including three seasons as a member of the UConn squad as a student-athlete. Archibald was a medical redshirt in 1998-99 as he recovered from surgery on both knees for patella tendinitis. He saw action in nine games for the Huskies in 1999-00. During the 2000-01 season, Archibald worked as an assistant to the coaching staff while still on scholarship.

Archibald has spent the past five seasons working as an assistant coach on both a full-time and volunteer basis. In 2006-07, Archibald worked as an assistant coach at Florida International University. He was an assistant coach at the University of Texas at San Antonio in 2005-06 and served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator for Hugh Durham at Jacksonville University in 2004-05. In 2003-04, Beau was an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Florida Atlantic University. He assisted the coaching staff on a volunteer basis at Texas Tech University in 2002-03.

Archibald earned his bachelor of arts from UConn in May of 2003 and earned an associate degree from Utah Valley State College. He spent his freshman season at Washington State in 1996-97, playing in 29 games at the Pac-10 school and averaging 6.1 points per contest. He played in only nine games in 1997-98 at Utah Valley State before undergoing the first of three knee surgeries in January of 1998. He also had knee procedures performed in January of 1999 and April of 1999 while at Connecticut. His knee injuries finally forced him to end his collegiate playing career prior to the 2000-01 season at UConn.

Archibald was born on December 19, 1976 and is a native of Los Angeles. He attended high school in Arizona and Utah while his father, the late Lynn Archibald, coached at Utah, Idaho State, BYU and Arizona State. He was the head coach at Idaho State (1977-82) and Utah (1984-89). His brother Damon is an assistant coach at New Mexico State and has also coached at Iowa State, USC and Pepperdine.



UConn enters this season in an unfamiliar position, trying to rebound from a disappointing year in 2006-07. Without having a single upperclassman on scholarship last year, the Huskies struggled through the rigors of the Big East conference season. The team is still young, listing four juniors, seven sophomores, and one freshman, but there is plenty of experience among those players.

Coach Jim Calhoun's 22nd edition of the Huskies is in position to show marked improvement. Last season's struggles provided a foundation to be built upon for future success. Under Calhoun's leadership and coaching and the emergence of several key players throughout the previous season, UConn appears primed to return to its standard of excellence.

The 2007-08 Huskies will be led this year by a quartet of two juniors and two sophomores.

Junior **Jeff Adrien** (Brookline, Mass.) is expected to be one of the top big men in the country this season. Last year, Adrien was named to the All-BIG EAST second team while leading the league in double-doubles recording 15. For the season, Adrien was third in the conference in rebounding, grabbing 9.7 boards per game and averaging 13.4 points per game as well.

Sophomore guard **Jerome Dyson** (Rockville, Md.) is expected to once again pace UConn's offense. As a freshman, Dyson blossomed to lead the Huskies in scoring, netting 13.6 points per contest. Dyson was a unanimous choice to the All-BIG EAST Rookie Team, not only for his scoring ability but his outstanding on-ball defense.

Directing the Husky offensive attack this season will be junior point guard **A.J. Price** (Amityville, N.Y.). After missing the previous two seasons due to injury and suspension, Price proved to be a steady hand for the Huskies. Price led the team in assists but also managed to be aggressive himself, scoring 9.3 points per game last year.

Sophomore center **Hasheem Thabeet** (Dar Es Salaam, Tanzania) emerged as one of the elite defensive players in the country. Thabeet led the BIG EAST and was third nationally in blocks last season, swatting 3.9 blocks per game. Standing seven-feet three-inches tall, Thabeet is one of the most intimidating defenders in the country. For his defensive efforts, Thabeet was named to the All-BIG EAST Rookie Team.

The contributions of the two experienced juniors will also significantly impact the potential success for the Huskies.

Junior **Craig Austrie** (Stamford, Conn.) has seen significant playing time during his first two seasons in Storrs. As a freshman during the 2005-06 season, Austrie guided UConn to the Maui Invitational Tournament championship in his second, third, and fourth career games. Austrie's versatility to play both guard positions is a great asset for the Huskies. He is a steady leader at the point and an excellent outside shooter as a scoring guard.

Fellow junior **Marcus Johnson** (Los Angeles, Calif.) is an experienced wing. Known for his smothering defense, Johnson is typically given the opportunity to defend the opposition's top scoring threat. Johnson's long frame allows him to cause turnovers and create numerous deflections. Johnson is at his best in the open court where he has the ability to pull up for his favored baseline jump shot or power home a thunderous dunk.

A pair of sophomores are expected to make a significant contribution for the Huskies in 2007-08, both of whom showed glimpses of outstanding play in their rookie year.

Sophomore **Doug Wiggins** (East Hartford, Conn.) showed his ability to fill the scoring column last season. Despite his small frame, Wiggins has an uncanny ability to get the ball to the basket. Wiggins is lightning quick both with the ball in his hands and on the defensive end.



Sophomore **Stanley Robinson** (Birmingham, Ala.) will be expected to show vast improvement this season for the Huskies. This talented wing has a very well-rounded game, being able to handle the ball, shoot, defend, and block shots. Robinson's length allows him to be a disruptive defender and a nuisance for the opposition. His unique skill set will help Robinson to be a key factor in 2007-08.

Other returnees include sophomores **Curtis Kelly** (Queens, N.Y.), **Gavin Edwards** (Gilbert, Ariz.) and **Jonathan Mandelove** (Stone Mountain, Ga.) who will provide depth in the frontcourt.

Kelly proved to be a skilled interior scorer as well as a relentless offensive rebounder. Kelly also showed good athleticism for a 6-9 forward and a willingness to run in transition.

Edwards owns a polished, fundamentally sound game. Edwards is willing to set screens, fight for position on the interior, and hustle after loose balls. His "lunch pail" mentality garners respect from both coaches and teammates alike.

Mandelove established himself as an interior force on the defensive end. Mandelove's defensive talent is highlighted in his ability to block shots and grab rebounds in traffic.

The lone newcomer, freshman **Donnell Beverly** (Hawthorne, Calif.), is expected to log playing time in the backcourt this season. At 6-4, Beverly should have a height advantage over most point guards he faces and will give the Huskies another solid ball-handler and good passer.





The University of Connecticut men's basketball team finished the 2006-07 season with a 17-14 mark overall and a 6-10 record in BIG EAST Conference play.

UConn has now put together 20 consecutive winning seasons, dating back to the 1987-88 season. The Huskies are one of only seven schools to put together such a streak. Entering the 2007-08 season, the schools are: Syracuse-- 37 (last at .500 or below, 1969-70); Oklahoma-- 26 (1980-81); Kansas-- 24 (1982-83); Arizona-- 23 (1983-84); Connecticut-- 20 (1986-87); Murray State-- 20 (1986-87). UConn did have its streak of 19 consecutive national postseason appearances snapped when it was not selected for the NCAA Tournament or the National Invitation Tournament.

The Huskies led the nation in two different defensive categories, averaging 8.6 blocks per game and holding opponents to 37.1% from the field. The Huskies shot 42.2% from the field and outrebounded opponents by a 42.3-35.6 margin. Individually, the Huskies spread the wealth, featuring seven different players who led the team in scoring and ten different Huskies who reached double figures in scoring at least once. Among the top performers were:

Freshman Jerome Dyson averaged a team-leading 13.8 points per game, finishing the year with 21 points in the game vs. Syracuse at the BIG EAST Tournament, his 11th time in double figures in the final 12 games. He was the BIG EAST Rookie of the Week twice this season. He started 30 of 31 games this season and led the squad in scoring at 13.8 points per game. He reached double figures in 11 of the last 12 contests and averaged 19.9 points

per game in the last seven contests. He finished the season with 21 points in the BIG EAST Tournament contest vs. Syracuse, giving him 20 or more points in five of seven games. He was named the league Rookie of the Week twice this season. He had six 20-point contests in 2006-07, the third most by a UConn freshman under Jim Calhoun. Khalid El-Amin (11 in 1997-98) and Richard Hamilton (9 in 1996-97) head that list. Dyson had one full tooth and part of another knocked out of his mouth after a hard fall to the floor in the loss at DePaul. He only missed a few minutes of action and led the Huskies with 16 points in the contest. He led the team in steals on the year at 1.9 per contest and reached double figures in scoring 24 times this season. He led the Huskies in scoring 13 times this year, including the first two games of the season, becoming the first freshman to lead the Huskies in scoring in the first two games of the season under Jim Calhoun and the first at UConn since Corny Thompson turned the trick in 1978-79.

Dyson's play over the final weeks of the season was reminiscent of a former Husky who also finished his freshman season with a flourish. Dyson averaged 19.0 points per game over the last eight games of the season, including five games over the 20-point barrier. In 1996-97, then-freshman Richard Hamilton averaged 19.2 points per contest to close out the regular season and then went on to average 23.3 points per game in the post-season (BIG EAST Tournament and NIT). Dyson entered the game at DePaul on January 31 with a point-per-game average of 11.9 and increased that to 13.8 in the final ten games. Hamilton finished the month of January in 1997 with four points in a loss to Providence and was averaging 11.5 points per game at that juncture. He finished the year with an average of 15.9 ppg.

Sophomore Jeff Adrien started all 31 games at the power forward spot and was No. 2 on the team in scoring at 13.1 points per game and No. 3 in the BIG EAST at 9.7 rebounds per contest (No. 15 nationally). Jeff finished the regular season with 14 points and nine boards at Georgetown and 20 points and ten rebounds in the loss to Villanova. He also averaged 1.4 blocks per game on the season. He tied for the lead in the BIG EAST with his 15 double-doubles on the year. He started his sophomore year in stellar fashion, recording a double-double in the first four contests. He joined Emeka Okafor as the only players under Jim Calhoun at UConn to start a season with four straight double-doubles (Okafor

did it in five straight in 2002-03). Adrien had only one double-double all of last season. He was the Most Valuable Player in the Hispanic College Fund Classic, averaging 14.7 points and 11.0 rebounds in the three wins. He grabbed a career-high 16 rebounds in the season opening win over Quinnipiac. The 16 rebounds is the most ever by a Husky under Jim Calhoun in the season opener and matches the most in a season opener by any Husky in the lid lifter in 29 years.

Adrien's 15 double-doubles in 2006-07 put him in elite company over the past 21 seasons under Jim Calhoun. Adrien stands behind only Emeka Okafor in total double-doubles in a season under Calhoun. Okafor had 24 in 2003-04 and 22 in 2002-03. Adrien had previously surpassed Donyell Marshall, who had 13 in 1993-94. *Among sophomores*, again, only Okafor (22 double-doubles in 2002-03) has totaled as many double-doubles in year two as a Husky. Adrien had more double-doubles than Charlie Villanueva (12 dd's in 2004-05), Josh Boone (11 double-doubles in 2004-05) and Marshall (ten double-doubles in 1992-93) did in their sophomore seasons.

Freshman center Hasheem Thabeet started all 31 games and averaged 6.2 points, 6.4 rebounds and 3.8 blocked shots per contest (No. 3 nationally and No. 1 in BIG EAST). He blocked 119 shots and only one other freshman in UConn history has blocked more shots in a season, as Emeka Okafor totaled 138 blocks in 2001-02. He had seven or more blocked shots in six games this season and had two double-doubles on the season. He matched the UConn single game record of 10 blocked shots in the win over Texas Southern, equaling the mark held by Emeka Okafor and Donyell Marshall. He also blocked nine shots in the win over Fairfield and was named to the all-tournament team of the Hispanic College Fund Classic. Thabeet joins the recent group of standout shot blockers to come through the Husky program. Okafor led the nation in total blocked shots in 2002-03 and 2003-04 and was the National Defensive Player of the Year both seasons. The Huskies have had the BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year the past four seasons, with Okafor being followed by Josh Boone (04-05) and Hilton Armstrong (05-06).

Sophomore A.J. Price played in all 31 games this season, starting 23 at point guard. He averaged 9.4 points per game and led the team in assists. He finished the year with 11 points, seven

assists and six rebounds in the BIG EAST Tournament vs. Syracuse. He had 11 points in the loss to Louisville and ten points in the win over Rutgers, making the start in both games after coming off the bench for six straight games. He had 12 points in 20 minutes off the bench in the win over Syracuse on February 5, his second double figure effort of the year as a reserve. He reached double figures 16 times total, led the squad in scoring five times and led in assists 21 times. He missed the 2004-05 season after a life threatening battle beginning October 4, 2004 caused by an Arteriovenous Malformation (AVM) which caused bleeding in his brain. He was suspended by the University for the 2005-06 academic year due to violations of the University Student Code of Conduct.

Sophomore Craig Austrie appeared in 30 games on the season. He started six

contests and averaged 9.5 points in those starts. In those six starts, Austria totaled 25 assists and only four turnovers. For the year, Austria averaged 5.8 points (6.8 in league games). He had consecutive double figure games off the bench, scoring ten points in each of the games vs. Villanova and Louisville. He started 11 games as a freshman in 2005-06, playing in all 34 contests and averaging 3.3 points.

Freshman Doug Wiggins appeared in all 31 games this season, starting two at the point guard spot. He was No. 4 on the squad in scoring at 6.8 per game. Wiggins had ten points in the win over Seton Hall and eight points in the loss at Georgia Tech after scoring only four points total in the previous three games. He reached double figures eight times off the Husky bench in 2006-07. In his 20-point performance in the game at West Virginia on December 30, Wiggins became the 11th player off the bench in Jim Calhoun's 21 seasons at UConn to reach the 20-point mark in a game. The other players in this group are Rashad Anderson (11 times), Brian Fair (9 times in his career), Ben Gordon (5 times), Ray Allen (4 times), Johnnie Selvie (4 times), Phil Gamble (3 times), John Gwynn (2 times), Tony Robertson (1 time), Charlie Villanueva (1 time) and Rashamel Jones (1 time).

At the three spot, freshman Stanley Robinson (5.1 ppg, 4.4 rpg) started 13 games, while sophomore Marcus Johnson averaged 5.5 points and started 19 games on the year.

Freshman Gavin Edwards (2.0 ppg) and freshman Curtis Kelly (2.7 ppg, 2.5 rpg) rounded out the Husky rotation for the season.

UConn had three players earn post-season recognition in 2006-07. Sophomore Jeff Adrien earned selection to the All-BIG EAST Second Team and was also named to the USBWA All-District team and the NABC All-District Second Team. A pair of Husky freshmen also were honored. Jerome Dyson was a unanimous selection to the BIG EAST All-Rookie team, while Hasheem Thabeet was also chosen to the All-Rookie squad.

UConn continued its annual presence among the national leaders in field goal percentage defense, now having finished among the nation's top 15 schools in ten of the last 12 seasons. In 2006-07, UConn held opponents to 37.1% from the field and ranked No. 1 nationally. It marks the sixth straight finish in the top five and the second time in four years that the Huskies led the nation in the category.

UConn is the first school in NCAA history to lead the country in blocked shots for six straight seasons, turning the trick in 2006-07 once again. The Huskies blocked 266 shots (8.6/game), led by freshman center Hasheem Thabeet, who had 119 of the 266 rejections. Eleven different players recorded a blocked shot on the season. UConn has averaged national leading totals of 8.6 in 2006-07, 8.8 in 2005-06, 8.9 blocks in 2004-05, 8.1 blocks in 2003-04, 7.7 blocks in 2002-03 and 6.9 blocks in 2001-02.

The 2006-07 Huskies were by far the youngest team that Jim Calhoun has fielded in his 21 years as the head coach. With five scholarship sophomores and eight freshmen, UConn was without a scholarship senior for only the second time in Calhoun's tenure, the other being the 1993-94 campaign. It was the first season Calhoun had no scholarship juniors. The eight freshmen matches the 1991-92 group for most frosh. The 2006-07 team started the season with 104 total games of college experience, spread among the four returning sophomores. By comparison, the 2005-06 Huskies had seven returnees with a total of 536 college games under their belt. Denham Brown alone had 103 games of experience entering the year.

Freshmen Jerome Dyson and Hasheem Thabeet became the

14th and 15th freshmen in the Jim Calhoun era at UConn to start the season opener and this marks the sixth time in seven seasons that a freshman has cracked the season opening starting line-up. The list of freshmen to start the season opener includes: Craig Austria (05-06), Josh Boone (03-04), Denham Brown (02-03), Emeka Okafor (01-02), Taliek Brown (00-01), Khalid El-Amin (97-98), Richard Hamilton and Jake Voskuhl (96-97), Doron Sheffer (93-94), Donyell Marshall (91-92), Scott Burrell (89-90), Rod Sellers (88-89) and Tate George (86-87).

The University of Connecticut unveiled a banner prior to the game against Marquette on January 10 recognizing head coach Jim Calhoun's inclusion as a member of the Founding Class of the National Collegiate Basketball Hall of Fame. The founding class of the NCBHOF includes about 180 players, coaches and contributors with roots in college basketball that are already part of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Mass. Dean Smith, Oscar Robertson, Bill Russell, John Wooden and the family of basketball founder Dr. James Naismith were the five members chosen to represent the founding class and were honored in November at induction ceremonies November 19 in Kansas City. Other members of the founding class, including Coach Calhoun, will be honored during subsequent induction ceremonies. The NCBHOF will be located in Kansas City, as part of a new arena to open in October 2007, the Sprint Center.

Thirteen players and three coaches representing more than 60 years of University of Connecticut men's basketball history constituted the inaugural class of inductees in the UConn's men's basketball "Huskies of Honor" recognition program. UConn officially recognized its men's basketball "Huskies of Honor" inaugural class of honorees in halftime ceremonies on Monday, Feb. 5, when the Huskies played host to Syracuse.

The three coaches honored in the men's basketball "Huskies of Honor" inaugural class included current head coach and Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer Jim Calhoun, as well as former head coaches Hugh Greer and Dee Rowe.

The 13-player "Huskies of Honor" inaugural class included 12 members of the UConn Men's Basketball All-Century Team as well as 2004 NCAA National Player of the Year Emeka Okafor (2001-04).

Joining Okafor as UConn All-Americans in the inaugural class of honorees were Donyell Marshall (1991-94), Ray Allen (1993-96) and Richard Hamilton (1996-99).

Other former Husky stars in the inaugural class included: Walt Droppo (1942-47), Vin Yokabaskas (1948-52), Art Quimby (1951-55), Toby Kimball (1961-65), Wes Bialosuknia (1963-67), Tony Hanson (1973-77), Corny Thompson (1978-82), Clifford Robinson (1985-89), Chris Smith (1988-92).

Of the 13 players enshrined in the UConn "Huskies of Honor", six (Robinson, Smith, Marshall, Allen, Hamilton, Okafor) played their college basketball for Jim Calhoun, who joined his standouts in the inaugural class. Calhoun, the winningest coach in New England College Basketball history, completed his 21st season as Connecticut's head coach and has led UConn to a pair of NCAA National Championships in 1999 and 2004 as well as winning the 1988 National Invitation Tournament (NIT) title.

"We are proud to announce this inaugural class of the Huskies of Honor," says UConn Director of Athletics Jeff Hathaway. "The spectrum of this first class is extraordinary, including UConn's first to play professional basketball, our first 1,000-point scorer, several All-America selections and national champions, a National Player of the Year and a Hall of Fame coach. We look forward to

Joins Hamilton and Butler as UConn's 2007 All-Stars**



Ray Allen (UConn, 1993-96) of the Seattle SuperSonics scored 12 points on February 18 in his seventh All-Star game appearance. Allen was joined in the game by Richard Hamilton (UConn, 1996-99) of the Detroit Pistons and Caron Butler (UConn, 2000-02) of the

Washington Wizards in Las Vegas. Hamilton scored eight points and Butler added two points. **UConn was the only college in the nation represented by three players in the contest.** This was the second straight season the University of Connecticut was represented in the NBA All-Star game by multiple former Husky standouts. Last season, Hamilton made his first NBA All-Star appearance and was joined by Allen.

honoring these UConn greats who have made such a tremendous impact upon this program."

Four honorees (Dropo, Yokabaskas, Quimby and Kimball) played at UConn under the guidance of the late Hugh Greer. Considered the "Father of UConn Basketball", Greer was head coach of the Huskies for 17 seasons (1946-63), compiling an overall record of 286-112. He passed away unexpectedly during the mid-point of the 1962-63 season.

Dee Rowe, UConn's nationally-known ambassador and a member of the Husky athletics family for the past 37 years, joined Calhoun and Greer as "Huskies of Honor" coaching honorees. Rowe served as Husky head coach for eight years, twice earning New England Coach of the Year honors and directing the Huskies to the 1976 ECAC New England Championship and an NCAA "Sweet 16" berth. He then moved into athletic administrative duties and established the fund-raising arm of UConn, the University of Connecticut Athletic Development Fund (UCADF). Dee Rowe also represented the United States on the international stage as assistant coach of the 1980 United States Olympic Men's Basketball Team.

The "Huskies of Honor" program pays visible tribute in the Harry A. Gampel Pavilion to the top players and coaches in UConn men's and women's basketball history.

At the ceremony on February 5, honorees were recognized with the unveiling of 16 four foot-by-five foot panels. The panels of each

of the 13 players include the name, uniform number and years of collegiate competition for the Husky greats. The honor does not retire that jersey number, allowing for future use of the numbers.

In addition to the large individual panels honoring the inductees that are permanently displayed adjacent to the scoreboard at the West end of Gampel Pavilion, each honoree also has a plaque that is on display on the lobby level of Gampel Pavilion. The 16 plaques include a photo of each honoree and summarize in text the top career achievements for each "Huskies of Honor" inductee.
