THE MATCH-UP-- Today's game features the Huskies of the University of Connecticut against the Tar Heels of the University of North Carolina. The Huskies are 11-1 on the season, 2-0 in the BIG EAST Conference after an 83-65 win over Virginia Tech on January 14. UConn has won 23 of its last 25 games dating back to last season. North Carolina is 10-5 on the season, 2-1 in the Atlantic Coast Conference coming off a 68-66 win over Clemson in Chapel Hill on January 14.

THE COACHES-- The head coach of Connecticut, in his 17th season with the Huskies, is Jim Calhoun. Coach Calhoun has a career record of 635-287 in his 31st season of collegiate coaching. He has a record of 387-150 in 17 seasons at UConn and was 248-137 in 14 seasons at Northeastern. Matt Doherty is in his third season as the head coach at North Carolina and has a record of 44-32 with the Tar Heels. He is 66-48 in his fourth season as a collegiate head coach, spending one season at Notre Dame.

LAST TIME OUT FOR UCONN-- Sophomore Ben Gordon (Mt. Vernon, NY) scored 24 points and the sixth-ranked Connecticut Huskies used a 26-4 run midway through the second half to overcome pesky Virginia Tech, 83-65, Tuesday, before a sellout crowd of 16,294 at the Hartford Civic Center. Virginia Tech led 43-39 at the half and maintained the four point advantage at 53-49 with 13:29 to play before freshman Rashad Anderson hit three free throws among seven straight points by Anderson to instigate the key run that left UConn ahead 75-57 exactly 10 minutes later. Sophomore center Emeka Okafor scored eight points in the decisive spurt. Gordon was solid throughout the contest, hitting on nine of 13 field goals, including three of five from beyond the arc, and also dished out five assists. Okafor overcame a sluggish beginning to score 19 and yank down 12 rebounds, his 10th double-double effort of the season. Freshman Hilton Armstrong, making his first career start, set career-highs with 12 points and seven rebounds. Anderson finished with 10. Starting point guard Taliek Brown had eight points, six assists and just one turnover. Bryant Matthews and Terry Taylor each scored 16 points to lead Virginia Tech. The Huskies stumbled out of the gate for the third consecutive game, falling behind 20-10 just 7:28 into the contest, but regrouped to retake the lead at 24-23 on a jumper by senior Tony Robertson, but Virginia Tech rallied to take a 43-39 lead at intermission. The Huskies finished the game shooting a crisp 54% (35 of 65), and pounded the ball inside in the second half, scoring 30 points in the paint after halftime.

SCOUTING THE HUSKIES-- Leading the way for the Huskies is the sophomore duo of Ben Gordon and Emeka Okafor. Gordon is averaging 21.8 points per game, 4.2 assists and 3.8 rebounds. Okafor has ten double-double's and is averaging 16.3 points, 11.8 rebounds and 4.9 blocks per

contest. Senior Tony Robertson is thriving in the sixth man role, averaging 11.0 points, while grabbing 3.0 rebounds. Junior Taliek Brown is averaging 8.1 points and 6.8 assists in his third season as the starting Husky point guard. Freshman Denham Brown has started all 12 games at the small forward spot. He is averaging 8.8 points. Freshman Hilton Armstrong made his first career start against Virginia Tech and averages 3.9 points and 3.1 rebounds.

SERIES HISTORY & NOTES-- UConn and North Carolina will meet for the fourth time in the sport of men's basketball, with the Tar Heels holding a 2-1 advantage in the series... In last season's meeting, Caron Butler scored 29 points and the Huskies recovered from an early 11-2 deficit to post an 86-54 decision over North Carolina on CBS at Gampel Pavilion. The Huskies finished the first half with a 24-6 run to break open a 20-20 game and lead 44-26 at the break. UConn then used a 34-8 burst in the second half to open its biggest lead of 41 points, 84-43 with 3:36 to play. The Huskies held the Tar Heels without a field goal for nearly nine minutes in the second half. Butler scored ten straight Husky points to help the Huskies claw back from the early deficit and scored his 29 points in only 28 minutes of action. Ben Gordon added 17 points and Emeka Okafor grabbed 13 rebounds... The teams met in the 1998 NCAA East Regional Championship Game at Greensboro Coliseum on March 21, 1998. UNC took a 75-64 decision as regional MVP Antawn Jamison scored 20 points. Vince Carter added 12 points. Khalid El-Amin scored a game-high 24 for UConn... The Heels took the first meeting between the schools on December 6, 1990, 79-64, in the ACC/BIG EAST Challenge at the Smith Center in Chapel Hill, NC... Rick Fox scored 18 that night to lead UNC, while Chris Smith had a game-high 21 for the Huskies, who led 40-33 at the half... UConn has a record of 15-11 vs. the Atlantic Coast Conference under head coach Jim Calhoun. The Huskies are 4-1

vs. Virginia, 3-2 vs. Duke, 2-2 vs. Maryland, 1-3 vs. Florida State, 1-2 vs. UNC, 2-1 vs. NC State and 1-0 vs. Clemson and Wake Forest since start of the 1987-88 season.

HUSKIES ON ESPN-- The game vs. North Carolina will be UConn's 110th game to be televised nationally by ESPN/espn2 during the past 13 seasons (since the start of the 1989-90 season). UConn is 76-33 overall (69.7%) on ESPN/espn2 during that span. This is the second of eight regular season games in 2002-03 scheduled to be carried by the worldwide leader. UConn dropped its contest at Oklahoma on January 7 that was televised on espn2. The remaining games are: at Miami (ESPN, 1/20), at St. John's (ESPN, 1/27), at Providence (ESPN, 2/8), Syracuse (ESPN, 2/10), at Notre Dame (ESPN, 2/24), at Boston College (ESPN, 3/8). UConn was 9-2 on ESPN/espn2 last season.

VS. NON-CONFERENCE FOES-- UConn is 181-37 against non-conference opponents under Jim Calhoun... UConn is 20-9 on the road against non-conference foes under Jim Calhoun... The Huskies are 22-9 in non-conference games in January and February under Jim Calhoun... The Huskies are 9-1 in non-conference games this season and went 10-4 last season in non-conference contests.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN-- The Huskies will play only their third road game of the season at North Carolina. The first was a 76-70 win at Vanderbilt on December 1 and the second a 73-63 loss at Oklahoma on January 7. UConn compiled a 14-5 mark in 2001-02 away from the friendly confines of Gampel Pavilion or the Hartford Civic Center. The Huskies were 7-3 in road games and were 7-2 in neutral site contests.

BEASTS OF THE BIG EAST-- Since the beginning of the 1997-98 season, UConn has compiled a league record of 64-22. In that six-season span, UConn is followed by Miami (57-29), St. John's (57-29) and Syracuse (56-30). In that time, UConn has won three regular season and three tournament championships.

STARTING YOUNG-- UConn currently starts a junior, two sophomores and two freshman, the youngest fivesome to start for the Huskies since the 1996-97 season, when the Huskies started two sophomores and three freshmen. In 1997-98, the Huskies started junior Ricky Moore, sophomores Richard Hamilton, Kevin Freeman and Jake Voskuhl and freshman Khalid El-Amin. That team lost in the NCAA Elite Eight to North Carolina in Greensboro and was the last Husky squad without a senior starter.

GORDON LEADS THE WAY-- Sophomore **Ben Gordon** leads the Huskies in scoring at 21.8 points per game. He has topped the 20-point mark on eight occasions and had 31 vs. Sacred Heart and 29 vs. Wagner and UNC Asheville. For the season, he is averaging 21.8 ppg, shooting 47.8 from field, 48.6 from three and 88.7 from the line... He also averages 4.2 assists and 3.8 rebounds... He has increased his scoring average from 12.6 as a freshman, a jump of 9.2 points per game. Gordon's career numbers to date are strikingly similar to Ray Allen. Both averaged 12.6 points as a frosh coming off the bench as the sixth man. Ray averaged 21.1 as a sophomore in 1994-95.

NEXT STOP: 1,000-- Senior **Tony Robertson** will continue his pursuit of 1,000 career points entering the game. Robertson has 969 career points entering the game and is averaging 11.0 points per game in 2002-03 off the Husky bench in his sixth man role. He has reached double figures in seven games this season.

TALIEK CONTINUES TO DISH-- Junior **Taliek Brown** leads the Huskies in assists with 82 (6.8 per game) and has committed only 24 turnovers in 12 games. Taliek is second in the BIG EAST Conference and is ranked No. 10 nationally, through games of January 13. Taliek has 411 career assists, 5.3 per game. His 411 assists are No. 8 all-time at UConn. He has had a pair of 10-assist games on the season and seven in his career. That total ties him with Tate George for second place in double-figure assist games. Kevin Ollie holds the school record with nine double figure assist efforts in his career. Ollie also shares the single game record of 14 with Earl Kelley. Ollie reached 14 assists on two occasions.

OKAFOR ON THE BOARDS-- Sophomore **Emeka Okafor** is fifth in the nation (through games of January 13) in rebounding at 11.8 boards per game. He has recorded double figure boards in all but one game this season and has ten double-doubles. He grabbed a career-high 19 rebounds in the win over Wagner, which tied the Gampel Pavilion record for rebounds in a game with Rod Sellers. He also has 17 career double-doubles.

BLOCK PARTY CONTINUES-- **Emeka Okafor** leads the nation (through games of January 13) in blocked shots, averaging 4.9 per contest. Okafor set a UConn single season record in 2001-02 with 138 blocked shots and has 197 (4.3/game) in his 46-game career as a Husky, currently second on the UConn career list. He recently passed Jake Voskuhl, currently with the Phoenix Suns, (1997-00) who is third on the blocked shot list with 193 blocks in his 138 career contests. Donyell Marshall, currently with the Chicago Bulls, (1992-94) holds the career mark of 245 in his 91 career contests.

CALHOUN HOLDS UCONN WIN % MARK-- Head Coach **Jim Calhoun** enters the game with North Carolina with a record at UConn of 387-150, a winning percentage of 72.1%. With the win over Wagner on December 7, Calhoun surpassed former Husky coach Hugh Greer, who was 286-112 (71.859%) from 1946-63.

STRONG START FOR ARMSTRONG-- Freshman **Hilton Armstrong** made his first career start in the win over Virginia Tech. He totaled career-highs of 12 points, seven rebounds, two assists, three blocks and two steals in 22 minutes. The lanky forward has played in 11 games this season, averaging 3.9 points and 3.1 rebounds in 10.5 minutes per game.

INSTANT OFFENSE FROM ANDERSON-- Freshman forward/guard **Rashad Anderson** has shaken off a slow start to his Husky career and become instant offense off the UConn bench. Over the past seven games, Anderson is averaging 9.6 points (67 pts.) and has hit on 14-of-32 three's (43.8%)... In the win over Virginia Tech, Anderson scored seven straight points to key a 20-2 second half run. In the win over St. Bonaventure, it took Anderson only six seconds after checking into the

game to fire and hit his first three-pointer, keying a Husky comeback from an early 10-point deficit. In the back-to-back wins over UMass (16 points) and UNC Asheville (13 points), Anderson scored 20 points in 35 total minutes off the bench, hitting on 9-of-17 shots from the field and 7-of-13 from three-point range. He also keyed the comeback in the UMass game, hitting three three-pointers in the crushing 29-2 second half run and knocked down 4-of-6 three's in the win over Asheville... For the season, he is averaging 6.4 points and 11.0 minutes per game. In the first five games, Anderson played a total of only 25 minutes and scored 10 points.

DENHAM IN DOUBLES-- Freshman forward **Denham Brown** has started every game for the Huskies at the small forward spot and is fourth on the squad in scoring at 8.8 per game and also grabs 3.4 boards per game. He is shooting 46.7% from three-point range, hitting on 14-of-30 attempts. He had a career-best 18 points in the win over Miami and has scored in double figures in four of the last seven games, reaching double figures on six occasions on the year. That includes 13 points in the road win at Vanderbilt, all of which came in the first half, and 15 in the win over UNC Asheville.

UCONN IN THE NATIONAL POLLS-- UConn is ranked No. 6 in the ESPN/USA Today Top 25 and tied for No. 6 in the Associated Press Top 25 (through

games of January 12). The No. 3 ranking the week of January 5 was the highest ranking during the regular season since the Huskies were ranked No. 2 on January 4, 2000. The Huskies were ranked for the final three polls in 2001-02 and five weeks total last season. UConn has been ranked at least one week in the national polls during 14 of the past 15 seasons under Jim Calhoun... UConn has spent a total of 106 weeks in the top ten of the Associated Press poll since the 1989-90 season and is back in the top ten of the AP poll during the regular season for the first time since January 2, 2001. The Huskies finished last season No. 10 in the final AP poll and was No. 6 in the final ESPN/USA Today ranking.

NOTING AN UNBEATEN START-- UConn's 9-0 start was the fourth time under Jim Calhoun and sixth time in school history that the Huskies started at least 9-0. Only five teams at UConn have bettered a 9-0 start, but each went on to win at least their first 11 games. UConn started 19-0 in 1998-99, 15-0 in 1994-95, 14-0 in 1953-54, and 11-0 in 1991-92 and 1980-81. Husky squads in 1993-94, 1985-86, 1964-65, 1954-55 and 1952-53 each started the year 8-0, but each lost in game nine... This also marked the ninth time UConn has entered the month of January undefeated, four times under Calhoun.

ALSO OF NOTE-- Freshman Marcus White made his first career appearance in the win over UNC Asheville, scoring six points and grabbing two rebounds in nine minutes of play... Senior Mike Hayes made his first career start against Sacred Heart and made the most of it. He totaled a career-best nine points and tied his career-high of nine rebounds, set a game earlier vs. Vanderbilt... Junior Taliek Brown and sophomore Ben Gordon each had 10 assists in the win over Sacred Heart, marking the first time in UConn history that teammates registered double-digit assist totals in the same game... Senior **Tony Robertson** poured in 21 points off the bench against GW, extending his membership in a select group to

accomplish the feat under Jim Calhoun. Robertson also scored 22 off the bench vs. Fairfield as a freshman. He is joined in the club by Brian Fair (9 times in his career), Ben Gordon (5 times), Ray Allen (4 times), Johnnie Selvie (4 times), Phil Gamble (3 times), John Gwynn (2 times) and Rashamel Jones (1 time)... Junior **Shamon Tooles** made the most of his first career start, in the opener vs. Quinnipiac, recording career-highs in nearly every category, including his eight points and eight rebounds.

A NEW CAPACITY AT GAMPEL-- The Harry A. Gampel Pavilion has a new seating capacity after a six-month renovation project. The new capacity is 10,167, an addition of 140 seats to the arena. The project consisted of the construction of new complexes for both basketball programs, including locker rooms, lounges and staff offices. A new training room, weight room, study hall and office complex for the Athletic Communications staff were also a part of the project. The additional seats are in the two end zones.

NEW TO THE STAFF-- UConn has two new additions to the basketball staff for the 2002-03 season. Assistant Coach Clyde Vaughan joined the staff in May, replacing Dave Leitao, who became the Head Coach at DePaul University. Vaughan is no stranger to fans of BIG EAST basketball, enjoying a standout career at the University of Pittsburgh from 1980-84. Vaughan led the BIG EAST in scoring in 1982-83 and was a two-time All-BIG EAST selection. He is the No. 2 all-time scorer at Pitt. Also joining the basketball support staff is Athletic Trainer Jason Miller. Miller replaces Joe Sharpe, who took a position with the Minnesota Timberwolves. Miller spent the past four seasons as the basketball trainer at Auburn University. Miller is a graduate of Iowa.

HAZELTON LEAVES SQUAD-- Sophomore forward Scott Hazelton (Somerville, MA) has left the basketball program, it was announced by Head Coach Jim Calhoun Tuesday, December 17. Hazelton appeared in 42 games in his Husky career, averaging 2.5 points and 1.7 rebounds. He had seen action in five games in 2002-03, averaging 12.0 minutes per game, 4.6 points and 2.0 rebounds.

HUSKIES ON TELEVISION-- UConn will have 24 of its 27 regular season games televised this season, including 10 appearances on national television. The only three games not televised this year were the contests against George Washington, Sacred Heart and St. Bonaventure. UConn will appear two
