THE MATCH-UP-- Today's game features the Huskies of the University of Connecticut against the Eagles of Boston College. The Huskies are 13-3 on the season, 4-1 in the BIG EAST Conference. The Huskies come off a 74-68 win at St. John's on Monday at Madison Square Garden. The Eagles are 9-8, 2-4 in the BIG EAST coming off a 95-71 win at Virginia Tech on Wednesday.

THE COACHES-- The head coach of Connecticut, in his 17th season with the Huskies, is Jim Calhoun. Coach Calhoun has a career record of 637-289 in his 31st season of collegiate coaching. He has a record of 389-152 in 17 seasons at UConn and was 248-137 in 14 seasons at Northeastern. Al Skinner is in his sixth year at Boston College and has guided the Eagles to an 88-81 record. He is in his 15th season as a collegiate head coach and has a career record of 226-207.

LAST TIME OUT FOR UCONN-- Sophomore Ben Gordon scored 23 points, including 9 of 18 shooting from the field, while sophomore Emeka Okafor posted his twelfth double-double of the season with 21 points and 13 rebounds to lead the No. 12 University of Connecticut to a 74-68 win over St. John's Monday night in front of a crowd of 12,010 at Madison Square Garden. The win was UConn's first win over St. John's at Madison Square Garden since the 1999 Championship season. UConn led 36-29 at halftime and opened up the biggest lead of the game 40-29, in the opening minute of the second half. St. John's quickly stormed back, scoring the next seven points to make it 40-36 with 17:29 left to play. The game remained tight and Connecticut increased it's lead to seven, making the score 51-44, as Gordon hit a three pointer with 12:53 to play. St. John's closed the gap to two, 53-51, as Anthony Glover hit a jump-shot. The game remained a two point affair, 57-55, with 7:41 to play, but Okafor hit a jump-shot with 7:10 to play and Shamon Tooles connected on a conventional three-point play with 5:54, moving UConn to a 62-55 lead. St. John's could never get closer than five points the rest of the way. St. John's was led in scoring by Marcus Hatten with 26 points, while Glover added 17. For Connecticut, Tony Robertson added a spark off the bench with seven points, and five rebounds. With 3:40 remaining in the second-half, Robertson's basket put UConn up eight points and made him the 34th player in UConn Men's basketball history to score 1,000 points. The Huskies out rebounded the Red Storm 45 to 35, but allowed St. John's to stay close as they turned the ball over 21 times to St. John's 7.

SCOUTING THE HUSKIES-- Leading the way for the Huskies is the sophomore duo of Ben Gordon and Emeka Okafor. Gordon is averaging 21.4 points per game, 4.5 assists and 4.3 rebounds. Okafor has 12 double-double's and is averaging 15.6 points, 11.1 rebounds and 4.8 blocks per contest. Senior Tony Robertson has come off the bench in all but one game and is averaging 10.2 points, while grabbing 3.3 rebounds. Junior Taliek Brown is averaging 7.6 points and 6.1 assists in his third season as the starting Husky point guard. Freshman Denham Brown has started 15 games at the small forward spot and is averaging 8.8 points. Freshman Hilton Armstrong has started the last five games and averages 3.8 points and 3.8 rebounds.

SERIES HISTORY & NOTES-- UConn and Boston College will meet for the 86th time in the series history, with the Huskies holding a 52-33 advantage. The Huskies lead the series as BIG EAST members by a count of 34-12... UConn took both meetings a year ago, taking a 79-77 overtime decision at the Hartford Civic Center and a 75-61 win at Conte Forum... The Huskies have won 26 of the last 27 meetings and Jim Calhoun has a 28-4 record against the Eagles at Connecticut. The following are the game recaps from 2001-02:

2/25/02 at Boston College-- UConn bolted out to an 18-point halftime lead, holding the Eagles to 25.8% from the field in the half, and cruised to a 76-61 victory over Boston College on Senior Night in Conte Forum. The BC trio of Troy Bell, Ryan Sidney and Kenny Walls combined to hit on 2-of-17 three pointers and UConn blistered the Eagles on the boards as well, grabbing 43 rebounds to BC's 28. Caron Butler led the way for UConn, scoring 24 points and grabbing 15 rebounds, 11

offensive. Ben Gordon scored 15 points, hitting on 3-of-3 three's in the process. Johnnie Selvie had 14 points. Emeka Okafor became UConn's single season shot block record holder, swatting five shots to give him 115 on the year, passing the 111 Donyell Marshall blocked in 1993-94.

2/16/02 at the Hartford Civic Center-- Taliek Brown had eight points and two assists in the final 2:47 of the game to help UConn erase a 10-point deficit and the Huskies went on to a crucial 79-77 win over the Eagles at the Hartford Civic Center. Troy Bell scored 27 points and made a pair of free throws to force the overtime session, but also missed his last five shots from the field and turned the ball over three times in the final moments of regulation and OT. Caron Butler scored 19 for the Huskies and Tony Robertson broke out of a five-game scoring slump in scoring 19 as well. Emeka Okafor had nine points, 11 rebounds and nine blocks for the Huskies, while Ryan Sidney had 20 points and ten rebounds for the Eagles.

HUSKIES IN GAMPSEL-- UConn has a record of 82-12 in Gampel Pavilion, 36-4 against non-conference opponents and 46-8 vs. BIG EAST competition. The Huskies have won 19 of their last 20 games in Gampel, last losing in the building on March 18, 2001 to Detroit Mercy in the second round of the NIT. UConn is 4-0 in Gampel this season, beating Quinnipiac, Sacred Heart, Wagner and Miami. UConn is 5-0 against Boston College in Gampel and the Eagles will play in the building for the first time since December 7, 1996.

BEASTS OF THE BIG EAST-- Since the beginning of the 1997-98 season, UConn has compiled a league record of 66-23. In that six-season span, UConn is followed by St. John's (59-30), Miami (58-31) and Syracuse (58-31). In that time, UConn has won three regular season and three tournament championships.

UConn IN BIG EAST PLAY-- The Huskies have compiled an overall BIG EAST record of 2354-181. Under Jim Calhoun, UConn is 197-113 in BIG EAST play and the 197 league wins place Calhoun third among all-time winningest coaches in league history. Calhoun trails only Jim Boeheim (276) and John Thompson (231).

GORDON LEADS THE WAY-- Sophomore **Ben Gordon** leads the Huskies in scoring at 21.4 points per game. He has topped the 20-point mark on ten occasions and had a career-high 32-point performance at Miami. He also had 31 vs. Sacred Heart and 29 vs. Wagner and UNC Asheville. For the season, he is averaging 21.4 ppg, shooting 47.5 from field, 43.2 from three and 87.1 from the line... He also averages 4.5 assists and 4.3 rebounds... Gordon's career numbers to date are strikingly similar to Ray Allen. Both averaged 12.6 points as a frosh coming off the bench as the sixth man. Ray averaged

JOINING THE 1,000-POINT CLUB-- Senior **Tony Robertson** became the 34th UConn player to reach 1,000 career points with his seven points in the win at St. John's on January 27. Robertson has 1,000 career points and is averaging 10.2 points per game in 2002-03. He has come off the Husky bench in the sixth man role in 15 games, starting the game at Miami. He has reached double figures in seven games this season.

TALIEK CONTINUES TO DISH-- Junior **Taliek Brown** leads the Huskies in assists with 98 (6.1 per game) and has committed only 41 turnovers in 16 games. He is third in the BIG EAST and 22nd in the nation in assists. Taliek has 427 career assists, 5.2 per game. His 427 assists are No. 8 all-time at UConn. He has had a pair of 10-assist games on the season and seven in his career. That total ties him with Tate George for second place in double-figure assist games. Kevin Ollie holds the school record with nine double figure assist efforts in his career. Ollie also shares the single game record of 14 with Earl Kelley. Ollie reached 14 assists on two occasions.

OKAFOR ON THE BOARDS-- Sophomore **Emeka Okafor** is ninth in the nation (through games of January 28) in rebounding at 11.1 boards per game. He has recorded double figure boards in 13 games this season and has 12 double-doubles. He grabbed a career-high 19 rebounds in the win over Wagner, which tied the Gampel Pavilion record for rebounds in a game with Rod Sellers. He also has 19 career double-doubles.

BLOCK PARTY CONTINUES-- **Emeka Okafor** leads the nation (through games of January 28) in blocked shots, averaging 4.8 per contest. Okafor set a UConn single season record in 2001-02 with 138 blocked shots and has 214 (4.3/game) in his 50-game career as a Husky, currently second on the UConn career list. Donyell Marshall, currently with the Chicago Bulls, (1992-94) holds the career mark of 245 in his 91 career contests.

UCONN WIN % MARK-- Head Coach **Jim Calhoun** enters the game with Boston College with a record at UConn of 389-152, a winning percentage of 71.903%, first in UConn history. Hugh Greer was 286-112 (71.859%) from 1946-63.

STRONG START FOR ARMSTRONG-- Freshman **Hilton Armstrong** has started the last five games and has 26 points and 30 rebounds in the five contests.

He had a career-best five assists in the win over Villanova. He totaled career-highs of 12 points, seven rebounds, three blocks and two steals in 22 minutes. The lanky forward has played in 15 games this season, averaging 3.8 points and 3.8 rebounds in 12.9 minutes per game.

INSTANT OFFENSE FROM ANDERSON-- Freshman forward/guard **Rashad Anderson** has shaken off a slow start to his Husky career and become instant offense off the UConn bench. Over the past 11 games, Anderson is averaging 9.3 points (102 pts.) and has hit on 22-of-49 three's... In the win over Villanova, Anderson had a game-high 18 points in only 15 minutes of play. In the win over Virginia Tech, Anderson scored seven straight points to key a 20-2 second half run. In the win over St. Bonaventure, it took Anderson only six seconds after checking into the game to fire and hit his first three-pointer, keying a Husky comeback from an early 10-point deficit. In the back-to-back wins over UMass (16 points) and UNC Asheville (13 points), Anderson scored 20 points in 35 total minutes off the bench, hitting on 9-of-17 shots from the field and 7-of-13 from three-point range. He also keyed the comeback in the UMass game, hitting three three-pointers in the crushing 29-

2 second half run and knocked down 4-of-6 three's in the win over Asheville... For the season, he is averaging 7.0 points and 11.7 minutes per game. In the first five games, Anderson played a total of only 25 minutes and scored 10 points.

DENHAM IN DOUBLES-- Freshman forward **Denham Brown** has started 15 of 16 games for the Huskies at the small forward spot and is fourth on the squad in scoring at 8.8 per game and also grabs 3.8 boards per game. He is shooting 50.0% from three-point range, hitting on 19-of-38 attempts. He had nine points and seven boards in the win at St. John's and he had 14 points in the win over Villanova. He had a career-best 18 points in the win over Miami on January 11 and has scored in double figures on eight occasions on the year. That includes 13 points in the road win at Vanderbilt, all of which came in the first half, and 15 in the win over UNC Asheville.

UConn IN THE NATIONAL POLLS-- UConn is ranked No. 12 in the ESPN/USA Today Top 25 and No. 14 in the Associated Press Top 25 (through games of January 26). The No. 3 ranking the week of January 5 was the highest ranking during the regular season since the Huskies were ranked No. 2 on January 4, 2000. The Huskies were ranked for the final three polls in 2001-02 and five weeks total last season. UConn has been ranked at least one week in the national polls during 14 of the past 15 seasons under Jim Calhoun... UConn has spent a total of 106 weeks in the top ten of the Associated Press poll since the 1989-90 season and is back in the top ten of the AP poll during the regular season for the first time since January 2, 2001. The Huskies finished last season No. 10 in the final AP poll and was No. 6 in the final ESPN/USA Today ranking.

AN UGLY TREND-- For the first six games in the month of January, UConn trailed by double digits in the first half and have done so in seven games total on the season. The Huskies came back to win four of those games and in the three losses, at Oklahoma, at UNC, and at Miami, the Huskies nearly overcame their early troubles to win, cutting a 20-point hole to five points at Oklahoma, erasing a 19-point deficit against the Tar Heels to take a one-point lead in the final minute before losing and taking as big as a five-point lead before losing in heartbreaking fashion at Miami. The Huskies biggest deficit of the year was 25 points to UMass, trailing 34-8 in the first two minutes of the second half. UConn responded with a 29-2 run and won the game by 11 points.

NOTING AN UNBEATEN START-- UConn's 9-0 start was the fourth time under Jim Calhoun and sixth time in school history that the Huskies started at least 9-0. Only five teams at UConn have bettered a 9-0 start, but each went on to win at least their first 11 games. UConn started 19-0 in 1998-99, 15-0 in 1994-95, 14-0 in 1953-54, and 11-0 in 1991-92 and 1980-81.
