ABOUT UCONN-- The University of Connecticut has an overall record of 23-9 entering the South Regional Semifinals of the NCAA Championship. The Huskies are the No. 5 seed in the 2003 NCAA South Region and will face No. 1 seed Texas (24-6) in the Sweet 16 on Friday, March 28 at 7:27 p.m. eastern time. UConn advanced to the Sweet 16 through Spokane, WA, with a 58-53 first round win over No. 12 seed BYU Thursday and an 85-74 win over No. 4 seed Stanford in the second round. UConn has won 10 of its last 14 games entering the Sweet 16 and the Huskies are 7-3 since the return to the bench of head coach Jim Calhoun from prostate cancer surgery on February 22. The Huskies finished 10-6 in the BIG EAST Conference, good for a share of the BIG EAST East Division title, the school's eighth BIG EAST Regular Season Championship. UConn advanced to the BIG EAST Tournament Championship game before falling to Pittsburgh.

CALHOUN GOES FOR 400-- UConn head coach Jim Calhoun enters the game against Texas with a record of 399-158 in his 17 seasons at Connecticut. He is the winningest coach in both UConn and New England college basketball history.

HEAD COACH JIM CALHOUN-- The head coach of Connecticut, in his 17th season with the Huskies, is Jim Calhoun. Coach Calhoun has a career record of 647-295 in his 31st season of collegiate coaching. He has a record of 399-158 in 17 seasons at UConn and was 248-137 in 14 seasons at North-eastern. Calhoun has a record of 26-8 in the NCAA Tournament at Connecticut and is 29-13 in his career in the NCAA Tournament.

SCOUTING THE HUSKIES-- Leading the way for the Huskies is the sophomore duo of Ben Gordon and Emeka Okafor. Gordon is averaging 19.7 points per game, 4.9 assists and 4.3 rebounds. Okafor has 21 double-double's and is averaging 15.7 points, 11.0 rebounds and 4.7 blocks per contest. Senior Tony Robertson has come off the bench in all but nine games and is averaging 10.0 points, while grabbing 3.2 rebounds. Junior Taliek Brown is averaging 7.7 points and 4.8 assists. He suffered a broken left index finger at Virginia Tech on February 5 and missed four games before returning vs. St. John's on February 22. Freshman Denham Brown has started 27 games at the small forward spot and is averaging 7.7 points. Freshman Hilton Armstrong has started the last 21 games and averages

2.8 points and 2.9 rebounds. Freshman forward Rashad Anderson has provided an offensive boost, starting four games, and is scoring 8.3 points per game. Freshman Marcus White has emerged over the past 15 games as a major contributor at the power forward spot and averages 4.1 points and 5.6 rebounds for the season.

UCONN IN THE NCAA CHAMPIONSHIP-- This is Connecticut's 24th trip to the NCAA Division I Basketball Championship, dating back to 1951. In 52 NCAA games played in their 24 trips to the NCAA tourney, UConn is 30-22 overall. Prior to Jim Calhoun's tenure, UConn had posted a 4-14 mark in 13 trips to the NCAA Championship. In Jim Calhoun's 17 years as UConn head coach, the Huskies have posted a 26-8 record in the NCAA Championship.

HUSKIES IN THE SWEET 16-- UConn is making its 12th trip to the NCAA Sweet 16 and its ninth under head coach Jim Calhoun. The Huskies are 6-5 in Sweet 16 games, 5-3 under Calhoun. UConn has advanced to the Sweet 16 or beyond in 1956, 1964, 1976, 1990, 1991, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1998, 1999, 2002 and 2003.

NOTING ROUNDS ONE AND TWO-- UConn advanced to the NCAA South Regional with wins over BYU and Stanford. The sophomore duo of Emeka Okafor and Ben Gordon led the

way, with Okafor setting a Spokane Arena record for blocked shots with seven in the BYU game and tying the building record for rebounds with 15 in the win over Stanford. Gordon tied an arena record with 29 points in the Stanford game, the fifth highest point total for a Husky in NCAA Tournament play.

HUSKIES 20-2 IN NCAA FIRST/SECOND ROUNDS UNDER JIM CALHOUN-- The Connecticut basketball program has posted an impressive 20-2 record in NCAA First/Second Round competition in UConn's 11 tourney appearances under head coach Jim Calhoun. UConn is a spotless 11-0 in NCAA First Round play. The Huskies are 9-2 in NCAA Second Round matchups.

UCONN AND TEXAS-- The Huskies and Longhorns will match-up for the fifth time in the series history, with UConn holding a 3-1 advantage. The teams last met in Austin in the 2000-01 season, a game won by Texas. UConn won the first three meetings between the schools, at Texas in 1991-92, in Storrs in 1993-94 and in Hartford in 1999-00... Jim Calhoun is 9-7 vs. Rick Barnes, 8-6 at Providence College and 1-1 at Texas.

UCONN IN DOMES IN NCAA PLAY-- The game vs. Texas in the NCAA South Region Semifinal will be UConn's 10th in a domed facility in NCAA competition. The Huskies have a 7-2 record in those nine previous contests, going 1-1 in Syracuse in 2002, 2-0 in Tampa, FL in 1999, 2-0 in Indianapolis in 1996, 0-1 in Pontiac, MI in 1991 and 2-0 in Minneapolis in 1991.

HUSKIES CONQUER THE "WEST"-- For the third time under Jim Calhoun, UConn has seen success in the West in NCAA Tournament play. Despite being bracketed in the South Region, UConn opened 2003 play in Spokane, WA and won a pair of games. That improves UConn's record to 9-1 in games in the western United States in NCAA Tournament play. UConn won two games

in Denver and two games in Phoenix en route to the 1999 National Championship. The Huskies won two games in Salt Lake City and went 1-1 in Oakland in 1995, falling to eventual national champion UCLA in the Final Eight.

UCONN VS. NO. 1 SEEDS-- UConn is 1-4 in NCAA Tournament play vs. No. 1 seeds, beating Duke in 1999 in the NCAA Championship game and losing to Maryland (2002), North Carolina (1998), UCLA (1995) and Ohio State (1992)... The Huskies are 3-6 in NCAA Tournament play when facing a higher seeded opponent.

FACING THE "HOME" TEAM-- The game against Texas will mark the fifth time under Jim Calhoun that UConn has played a game in the regionals against a team playing in their home state. In addition to facing Texas in San Antonio, UConn played North Carolina in Greensboro (1998), UCLA in Oakland (1995), Florida in Miami (1994) and Ohio State in Cincinnati (1992). This will be the fourth time in those five games that the opponent was a No. 1 seed. The Huskies have lost all four of those previous contests.

16 STRAIGHT POST-SEASON BIDS-- The Connecticut basketball program is one of only five schools (among 318 NCAA Division I institutions) to have advanced to national post-season tournament competition (NCAA or NIT) in each of the past 16 seasons (dating back to the 1987-88 season). Under the guidance of head coach Jim Calhoun, UConn has earned 11 NCAA bids (1990, 1991, 1992, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2003) and five NIT bids (1988, 1989, 1993, 1997, 2001). The five institutions who have advanced to national tournament play for the past 16 consecutive seasons include: Arizona, **CONNECTICUT**, Indiana, Oklahoma and Temple.

UCONN'S SEEDS UNDER JIM CALHOUN-- Connecticut's No. 5 seed in the East Region of the 2003 NCAA Championship Tournament marks the 11th NCAA bid for UConn in Jim Calhoun's 17 years as head coach of the Huskies. Following are UConn's seedings in each of its 11 NCAA berths since 1990.

BIG EAST SWEET 16'S-- By advancing to the NCAA Sweet 16 for the ninth time, UConn has now tied Georgetown for the most Sweet 16 appearances in BIG EAST history. Syracuse has made eight Sweet 16 appearances since the creation of the league.

HUSKIES PACE BIG EAST IN NCAA-- Since 1989-90, Connecticut has been the "best" of the BIG EAST Conference teams in NCAA Championship play. Through games of March 21, UConn has won 26 NCAA games during the past 14 years (1990-2002) while Syracuse is next with 17 victories. Georgetown has 11 NCAA wins in that span, followed by St. John's with nine wins, Seton Hall with eight wins, Boston College with six wins, Notre Dame and Pittsburgh with four wins, Miami, Providence, and Villanova with with three wins each and West Virginia with two wins.

UCONN ON CBS-- During the past 14 seasons (since the 1989-90 season), the Connecticut Basketball program has been televised nationally by CBS Sports a total of 77 times (38 during the regular season, 36 during the NCAA Championship, five in the BIG EAST Tournament). UConn has compiled an overall record of 49-28 in those 77 games on CBS (26-8 in NCAA play, 3-2 in the BIG EAST Tournament, 20-18 in regular season play). UConn is 3-1 on CBS this season, beating St. John's, BYU and Stanford and losing at Pittsburgh.

VS. NON-CONFERENCE FOES-- UConn is 192-39 against non-conference opponents under Jim Calhoun. The Huskies are 11-2 in non-conference games this season.

UCONN VS. RANKED OPPONENTS-- Texas will be the eight nationally-ranked opponent for UConn in 2002-03 and the Huskies are 4-3 in those games to date... The Huskies have gone 1-3 against top ten opponents, losing at No. 9 Oklahoma, winning at No. 9 Notre Dame and losing at No. 8 Pittsburgh and to No. 5 Pittsburgh in the BIG EAST Tournament... UConn has won 21 of its last 34 overall against top ten teams... UConn is 65-72 vs. nationally-ranked teams under Jim Calhoun.

JIM CALHOUN IMPRESSIVE IN POST-SEASON-- UConn head coach Jim Calhoun currently sports an impressive 76.0% winning percentage in national post-season tournament play in his 17 years as Husky head coach (38-12 overall—26-8 in NCAA play, 12-4 in NIT play).

JIM CALHOUN IN MARCH-- Head coach Jim Calhoun carries a 17-year record at Connecticut of 74-31 (69.9%) in the month of March as he guides his Huskies through the 2003 NCAA Tournament. In his years in charge of the UConn program, Jim Calhoun's record in the month of March is as follows: 12-7 in regular season play, 24-12 in BIG EAST Tournament play, 26-8 in NCAA play, 12-4 in NIT play.

1999 NATIONAL CHAMPION-- In 1999, UConn, the No. 1 seed in the West Region of the NCAA Championship, beat No. 16 Texas-San Antonio (91-66) and No. 9 New Mexico (78-56) at McNichols Arena in Denver to advance to the West Regional in Phoenix. Connecticut topped No. 5 seed Iowa (78-68) in the "Sweet 16" round of play and bested No. 10 seed Gonzaga (67-62) to earn its "first-ever" trip to the NCAA Final Four. UConn beat South Regional champ Ohio State (64-58) in the national semifinals and the Huskies topped East Re-



gional champ Duke (77-74) in the national championship game. Connecticut concluded its 1998-99 national championship season with a 34-2 overall record.

LEADERS OF THE BLOCK-- UConn is on track to lead the country in blocked shots as a team for the second straight season. With sophomore Emeka Okafor leading the way, UConn is averaging 7.66 blocks per game as a team. The Huskies led the nation in 2001-02 with 6.94 blocks per contest. Since Okafor joined the Huskies a year ago, UConn has had more blocks than their opponents in 57 of 66 games. The Huskies blocked 15 shots in the win over St. John's on February 22, the most in the school's BIG EAST history.

AN ANNUAL RITUAL-- UConn once again ranks among the national leaders in field goal percentage defense, marking the sixth time in seven seasons that the Huskies are among the country's best in this category. UConn is currently ranked No. 4 through games of March 17 and is holding opponents to 38.0% from the field entering the South Regional. UConn's best ranking came in 1995-96, finishing No. 4 with a FG% defense of 38.6%. The 2001-02 Huskies finished ranked No. 5 in the country at 38.0%. That mark was the lowest ever for the Huskies under head coach Jim Calhoun, topping the 38.3% mark by the 1996-97 squad. That team finished the year ranked No. 8 in the country.

REACHING TEN AGAIN-- UConn finished the regular season with a 10-6 mark in BIG EAST play, marking the 10th time in Jim Calhoun's 17 seasons that the Huskies reached the ten win plateau in the league. Syracuse has reached the ten-win mark 17 times in 24 seasons under Jim Boeheim and Georgetown hit ten wins in league play 13 of 20 seasons under John Thompson.

BEASTS OF THE BIG EAST-- Since the beginning of the 1997-98 season, UConn has compiled a league record of 72-28. In this six-season span, UConn is followed by Syracuse (66-36), St. John's (63-37), and Miami (61-39). Over that time, UConn has won three regular season and three tournament championships.

UConn IN BIG EAST PLAY-- The Huskies have compiled an overall BIG EAST record of 243-187. Under Jim Calhoun, UConn is 205-119 in BIG EAST play and the 205 league wins place Calhoun third among all-time winningest coaches in league history. Calhoun trails only Jim Boeheim (284) and John Thompson (231).

YOUNG AND DEEP HUSKIES-- The 2002-03 Huskies have the current distinction of being the youngest and deepest team in the 17-year tenure of head coach Jim Calhoun. Never in Coach Calhoun's previous 16 seasons has he had a squad with ten players averaging double figure minutes played and he has also never had four freshman averaging double figure minutes. Seven previous seasons have seen nine players average double figure minutes, the most recent being the 1998-99 season. UConn won the National Championship that

season. The Huskies have had three freshmen average double figure minutes two times under Calhoun, in 1996-97 and 1992-93. UConn went to the NIT both of those seasons.

20 WINS AGAIN-- For the 18th time in his career and 13th time in 17 seasons at UConn, head coach Jim Calhoun has reached the 20-win plateau. This marks the sixth straight season that UConn has reached the 20-win mark, the longest such streak in school history. UConn had compiled eight 20-win seasons in 84 seasons before Coach Calhoun's 1987-88 team went 20-14 and won the NIT.

OKAFOR HONORED-- Sophomore Emeka Okafor has earned recognition for his outstanding efforts this season. He was named the BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year and was named to the ESPN.com All-American Third Team. He was also selected as the CollegeInsider.com National Defensive Player of the Year. He also earned a spot on the BIG EAST All-Tournament team. Okafor led the BIG EAST in rebounding and blocked shots and earned a first team spot after earning third team recognition a year ago. He was a pre-season first team pick in 2002-03. Okafor becomes the eighth player in UConn to earn first team recognition and the fifth sophomore, joining Donyell Marshall, Ray Allen, Richard Hamilton and Caron Butler.

GORDON HONORED-- Sophomore Ben Gordon earned a spot among the top players in the BIG EAST Conference by being named to the All-BIG Second Team. Gordon finished seventh in the league in scoring and third in assists. He was also named to the BIG EAST All-Tournament team for the second straight season. He was also a NABC and USBWA All-District First Team selection.

OKAFOR NAMED ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN-- Sophomore center **Emeka Okafor** has been named to the 2003 Verizon Academic All-America First Team, as selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America. The three teams were announced Thursday, March 6, 2003. Okafor is only the second Academic All-America in UConn men's basketball history, joining Wes Bialosuknia, who was also a first team selection in 1966-67. He is joined on the first team by Matt Bonner of Florida, Clint Cuffle of Evansville, Adam Mark of Belmont and Brett Starkey of Denver. Okafor, a finance major at Connecticut, carries a cumulative grade point average of 3.73. He has earned 70 academic credits as a member of the honors program, giving him junior academic status. He has been on the Dean's List all three semesters at UConn.

OKAFOR CAREER BLOCKS-- Sophomore Emeka Okafor currently has 288 blocked shots (4.36/game) in his 66-game career as a Husky, first on the UConn career list. Donyell Marshall, currently with the Chicago Bulls, (1992-94) previously held the career mark of 245 in his 91 career contests. His career average of 4.36 per game is No. 7 in NCAA history and is the highest of any player in BIG EAST Conference history.



OKAFOR SEASON BLOCKS-- Sophomore Emeka Okafor is first in the nation in blocked shots, averaging 4.7 per contest. He has 150 blocks this season, which sets a new UConn single season record, surpassing his record in 2001-02 of 138 blocked shots, when he finished No. 3 in the country. His 150 blocked shots are the 13th highest total in NCAA single season history and his 4.69 average is No. 23 all-time and the fourth highest by a BIG EAST player.

THE KING OF SWAT-- Emeka Okafor is averaging 4.41 blocks per game in his career in BIG EAST games, swatting 141 shots in 32 conference games. That is the best average in league history, surpassing Patrick Ewing of Georgetown, who blocked 247 shots in 62 career league games, a 3.98 average.

THE KING OF SWAT II-- By blocking nine shots vs. St. John's, Emeka Okafor became the only player in the history of the BIG EAST Conference to record nine or more blocks in a game on three occasions. Okafor turned the trick at Rutgers and vs. Boston College last season. Seton Hall's Samuel Dalembert is the only other player to reach the nine block mark in a league game two times.

OKAFOR FOR TWO-- Emeka Okafor has connected on 58.6% of his field goal attempts in his 66-game career, good for the No. 1 spot in the UConn career record book. Chuck Aleksinas holds down the No. 2 spot at 56.6% from 1980-82. Okafor has hit on 318-of-543 attempts in his career. He is shooting 58.4% from the field in 2002-03 and shot 59.0% in 2001-02.

OKAFOR IN THE NCAA'S-- Emeka Okafor enters the NCAA South Regional having played in six NCAA Tournament games in his career and is averaging 12.2 points (73), 9.3 rebounds (56) and 3.2 blocked shots (19) in those contests. He is shooting 66.7% in his career in NCAA games, connecting on 32-of-48 from the field. With his 15 rebounds in the second round win over Stanford, Okafor joined Toby Kimball as the only Husky players to grab 15 or more rebounds in an NCAA Tournament game more than one time. Okafor has 15 boards vs. Hampton in 2002. Emeka needs 19 total rebounds to pass Kimball as UConn's all-time NCAA Tournament leader.

OKAFOR ON THE BOARDS-- Emeka Okafor is among the national leaders in rebounding at 11.0 boards per game. He has recorded double figure boards in 22 games this season and has 21 double-doubles. He comes off a 15-rebound performance in the NCAA Second Round win over Stanford. He had 18 rebounds in the BIG EAST quarterfinals vs. Seton Hall. He had his career BIG EAST best total of 16 rebounds in the loss at Villanova. He grabbed a career-high 19 rebounds in the win over Wagner, which tied the Gampel Pavilion record for rebounds in a game with Rod Sellers. He has 27 career double-doubles.

PASSING 1,100-- Senior Tony Robertson became the 34th UConn player to reach 1,000 career points with his seven points in the win at St. John's on January 27. He is averaging 10.0 points per game in 2002-03 and continues to climb up the UConn career scoring ladder. He now has 1,156 career points and has moved into 26th place. Next up on the list is Donny Marshall (1,197). Tony has played in all 32 games this season, starting nine. He has reached double figures in 14 games this season.

GORDON LEADS THE WAY-- Sophomore Ben Gordon leads the Huskies in scoring at 19.7 points per game. He has topped the 20-point mark on 17 occasions. For the season, he is averaging 19.7 ppg, shooting 44.5 from field, 42.2 from three and 81.5 from the line... He also averages 4.9 assists and 4.3 rebounds.

STARTING HIS OWN CLUB-- Ben Gordon currently sports season averages of 19.7 points, 4.3 rebounds and 4.9 assists per game. If he can keep those averages at their current levels, he will have a chance to become the first player in UConn history to average 20+ points, 4+ rebounds and 4+ assists per game over a season. Ray Allen came the closest, averaging 23.4 points, 6.5 rebounds and 3.3 assists in 1995-96... Gordon also has a chance to become the sixth player in UConn history to lead the team in scoring and assists in the same season.

GORDON HITS 1,000-- Ben Gordon reached the 1,000-point career mark in the BIG EAST semifinal win over Syracuse. Gordon is only the fifth sophomore at UConn to reach the 1,000 career point mark. Richard Hamilton, Ray Allen, Caron Butler and Khalid El-Amin each reached the 1,000-point mark in their sophomore years at Connecticut. Gordon now has 1,056 career points and is the 35th Husky in school history to reach the plateau. Tony Robertson became the 34th earlier this season.

GORDON HITS 600-- Ben Gordon has 629 points in the 2002-03 season and is only the fifth sophomore to reach the 600-point plateau. Chris Smith (89-90), Ray Allen (94-95), Richard Hamilton (97-98), and Caron Butler (01-02) turned the trick before Gordon.

GORDON FOR THREE-- Ben Gordon has connected on 41.8% of his career three-point attempts (140-of-335), good for No. 2 on the UConn career list. Gordon trails only Ray Allen, who hit on 44.8% (233-of-520) from long range from 1994-96. Gordon is hitting on 42.2% in 2002-03 (78-of-185) and hit on 41.3% in 2001-02 (62-of-150).

TALIEK ON THE ASSIST LIST-- Junior Taliek Brown has 133 assists (4.8 per game) and has committed 69 turnovers in 28 games and leads the BIG EAST in assist-to-turnover ratio. Taliek has 462 career assists, 4.9 per game. His 462 assists are No. 7 all-time at UConn. He has had a pair of 10-assist games on the season and seven in his career. That total ties him with Tate George for second place in double-figure assist games. Kevin Ollie holds the school record with nine double figure assist efforts in his career. Ollie also shares the single game record of 14 with Earl Kelley. Ollie reached 14 assists on two occasions.

MARCUS MAKES HIS MARK--

Freshman Marcus White has come off the bench in the last 15 games and become a major contributor in the Husky frontcourt. In those 15 contests, White is averaging 5.1 points (77) and 7.8 rebounds (117), while getting to the free throw line to hit on 33-of-50 attempts. He had an eight-point, nine-rebound performance in the NCAA first round win over BYU. He has grabbed double figure rebounds on four occasions, including a career-best 14 boards in the win at Notre Dame and also vs. Syracuse in the BIG EAST semifinals. For the season, White has appeared in 22 games off the bench, averaging 4.1 points and 5.6 rebounds. He averaged 4.2 points and 6.4 boards in 13 BIG EAST contests.

INSTANT OFFENSE-- Freshman forward Rashad Anderson has been a source of instant offense for UConn. He had a 21-point performance in the BIG EAST semifinals against Syracuse. He had a career-best 22 points, including 6-of-9 shooting from three-point range, at Notre Dame. He had 13 points in the win over Syracuse. He had a career-best 22 points at Virginia Tech on February 5, making him the ninth player in 17 seasons under Jim Calhoun at UConn to score 20 points off the bench in a game... In the win over Villanova, Anderson had a game-high 18 points in only 15 minutes of play. In the win over Virginia Tech on January 14, Anderson scored seven straight points to key a 20-2 second half run. In the win over St. Bonaventure, it took Anderson only six seconds after checking into the game to fire and hit his first three-pointer, keying a Husky comeback from an early 10-point deficit. In the back-to-back wins over UMass (16 points) and UNC Asheville (13 points), Anderson scored 20 points in 35 total minutes off the bench, hitting on 9-of-17 shots from the field and 7-of-13 from three-point range. He also keyed the comeback in the UMass game, hitting three three-pointers in the crushing 29-2 second half run and knocked down 4-of-6 three's in the win over Asheville... For the season, he is averaging 8.3 points and 14.6 minutes per game. In the first five games, Anderson played a total of only 25 minutes and scored 10 points.

THREE'S VS. TWO'S-- Rashad Anderson looks like a lock to join a unique group of individuals in UConn basketball history. To date, only three UConn players have gone through an entire season and made more three-point field goals than two-point buckets. Anderson has made 53 three's in 2002-03 and 37 two-pointers. In 1999-00, Albert Mouring made 86 three's





During the past 17 years, University of Connecticut head basketball coach Jim Calhoun has steadily built UConn basketball into one of the elite college programs in the nation.

The move toward national prominence for the University of Connecticut basketball program began in May of 1986 when Jim Calhoun was named head coach.

Seventeen years later, UConn Basketball sits atop the college basketball landscape with a National Championship and a regular spot in the top 25 collegiate polls.

In 2002-03, Coach Calhoun faced the biggest challenge of his life and tackled it with the will and determination that we have grown to expect from him and his program. On February 3, 2003, Calhoun announced that he had been diagnosed with prostate cancer. He took an immediate leave of absence from the team and underwent surgery on February 6 to have his prostate removed. He was released from the hospital on February 9 and within days was back in the office, involved in the many day-to-day aspects of running the program. On February 22, Calhoun remarkably returned to the sidelines for the team's match-up with St. John's at Gampel Pavilion, only 13 days after his prostate cancer surgery. He has remained on the sidelines since, slowly working his way back to full strength, and bringing his team along

to full strength as well.

The 2002-03 Huskies enter the NCAA Sweet 16 with a 23-9 overall record, finishing 10-6 in the BIG EAST. The Huskies captured a share of the BIG EAST East Division title, the program's eighth BIG EAST Regular Season Championship in the past 14 seasons, and lost in the championship game of the BIG EAST Tournament. UConn spent the first 14 weeks of the season ranked in the National Top 25, reaching as high as the No. 3 spot. UConn is in the NCAA Tournament for the 11th time under coach Calhoun, making the program one of only five schools to advance to national postseason play for the last 15 straight seasons and the Huskies are in the NCAA Sweet 16 for the ninth time in 11 trips to the tourney under Coach Calhoun.

The 2001-02 season served to reinforce UConn's place among the elite. The Huskies finished the year with a 27-7 record, marking the eighth time they have reached the 25-win plateau under Jim Calhoun. For the seventh time in 13 seasons, UConn finished the season ranked in the top ten of the Associated Press National Rankings, finishing 10th. The Huskies also finished tied for sixth in the final ESPN/USA Today poll. With a 13-3 league record, UConn captured its seventh BIG EAST Regular Season Championship in 13 seasons. The Huskies then captured their fifth BIG EAST Tournament title. The

Huskies advanced to the NCAA Final Eight for the fifth time and made their eighth Sweet 16 appearance, each in the past 13 seasons.

In 31 seasons as a head coach on the NCAA Division I collegiate level, Jim Calhoun's overall collegiate head coaching record is 647-295 (68.7% winning effort). That includes a 248-137 (64.4%) record in 14 seasons as head coach at Northeastern (MA) University and a 399-158 (71.6%) mark in 17 years at Connecticut.

During the 2001-02 season, Calhoun became the 26th coach in NCAA Division I history to reach the 600-win plateau and his 647 career wins place him No. 9 among active Division I coaches. He has more wins than any coach in UConn and New England Division I college basketball history.

When he arrived at Connecticut as the 17th head coach of men's basketball on May 15, 1986, Jim Calhoun immediately began to chart a new course for success. He promised to "do it the right way, with no short cuts". He noted he wanted to establish a program at UConn that would annually be called one of the top programs in the nation.

Mission accomplished.

One collegiate basketball writer, authoring an article on Connecticut basketball for a national publication, said it best when he noted, "Bringing the UConn program to this point from where it was when he took over is nothing short of miraculous".

On March 29, 1999, Coach Calhoun capped his remarkable transformation of the Connecticut basketball program when UConn won the 1999 NCAA Division I National Championship, beating Duke 77-74 in the title game at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg, Florida.

For his personal efforts in building Connecticut Basketball into one of the nation's top programs, Jim Calhoun has earned a host of coaching honors.

Jim Calhoun is the only coach in the history of the BIG EAST Conference to have been named BIG EAST Conference Coach of the Year four times. He earned his first BIG EAST Coach of the Year award in 1989-90 and also won the honor following the 1993-94, 1995-96 and 1997-98 seasons. John Thompson of Georgetown and Lou Carnesecca of St. John's each earned the prestigious honor three times.

In the summer of 2002, Jim Calhoun was selected as a member of the inaugural induction class to the New England Basketball Hall of Fame.

After directing Connecticut to the NCAA National Championship, Jim Calhoun received the 1999 Winged Foot Award from the New York Athletic Club, recognizing him as their National Coach of the Year. He also received the prestigious Victor Award as 1998-99 College Basketball National Coach of the Year and was the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District I Coach of the Year.

In March of 1990, at the conclusion of only his fourth season as head coach of the Huskies, Jim Calhoun was the consensus choice as the 1989-90 College Basketball National Coach of the Year. He guided UConn to a 31-6 overall record as the Huskies won both the BIG EAST regular season and tournament titles and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight. He was named National Coach of the Year by five different organizations (Associated Press, United Press International, *The Sporting News*, CBS-TV Sports, *Basketball Weekly*).

In addition to the outstanding won-loss record he's compiled as a collegiate head coach, Jim Calhoun's postseason national tournament record is truly remarkable. During the past 22 seasons, Jim Calhoun-coached teams have earned national tournament berths 20 times (15 NCAA, 5 NIT). At Northeastern, he earned NCAA bids in five of the last six years he directed that program. At Connecticut, he and his Huskies have played in 15 consecutive postseason national tournaments.

In his 17 years at Connecticut, Jim Calhoun has

compiled a stunning 38-12 overall record in national postseason tournament competition (26-8 in NCAA play, 12-4 in NIT play). Coach Calhoun's winning percentage for national postseason tournament play while at UConn (38-12=76.0%) is better than his overall winning percentage at Connecticut (399-157=71.6%). His 26 NCAA wins at UConn, all achieved in the past 15 years, far outdistances the entire total of four NCAA victories recorded at Connecticut before Coach Calhoun took over the Husky basketball program in the spring of 1986.

In addition to directing Connecticut to the 1999 NCAA National Championship, Jim Calhoun has led UConn to 11 NCAA bids in the past 14 years. Under Calhoun's direction, UConn has never lost a NCAA First Round game, the Huskies have earned nine NCAA Sweet 16 berths in the past 14 years, and Connecticut advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight in 1990, 1995, 1998, 1999 and 2002. The Huskies have also spent 12 weeks as the No. 1 ranked team in the country during Calhoun's tenure.

Prior to taking over the UConn program in May of 1986, Jim Calhoun had led Northeastern University to five NCAA berths from 1981 to 1986. Including all NCAA and NIT appearances as a collegiate head coach, Jim Calhoun's overall national postseason tournament record is 39-17. His combined total of 27 NCAA wins (24 at UConn, 3 at Northeastern) places Jim Calhoun No. 13 on the all-time collegiate coaching list for career NCAA victories.

Connecticut basketball under head coach Jim Calhoun has achieved a unique "double", winning both the 1999 NCAA Division I National Championship as well as the 1988 National Invitation Tournament (NIT) Championship.

The 1999 NCAA Championship completed a clean sweep in 1998-99 for the Huskies. UConn won both the regular season and tournament titles in the BIG EAST Conference. The Huskies were the No. 1 seed in the West Region of the NCAA Tournament and Connecticut ran off six straight NCAA victories to finish the year with a single-season school record 34 wins and claim the national championship. UConn finished the year ranked No. 1 in the nation in the final *USA Today*/ESPN Top 25 poll.

Eleven years before winning the 1999 NCAA Championship, Jim Calhoun brought his first national title home to the Storrs campus as his Huskies claimed the 51st annual NIT title in March of 1988, beating Ohio State 72-67 in the championship game at Madison Square Garden.

Much like his success at Connecticut, Jim Calhoun's performance as head coach at Northeastern (MA) University in Boston for 14 seasons was nothing short of sensational. He developed a program from Division II status to a nationally-recognized squad which became a perennial NCAA Division I tournament team. At NU, Jim Calhoun won 20 or more games in five of his last six seasons, chalked up a brilliant 135-47 record during that span, and earned five NCAA Division I tournament berths.

His final three years at Northeastern resulted in NCAA automatic bids each season and a three-year mark of 75-19.

At Northeastern, Jim Calhoun is the winningest coach in school history (248-137) as his teams averaged 17.9 wins per season. He was a three-time New England "Coach of the Year" and a three-time Kodak District I "Coach of the Year".

In leaving Northeastern in 1986, Coach Calhoun left perhaps the most talented team in the school's history, along with a first round NBA draft pick in senior Reggie Lewis, who later became captain of the Boston Celtics before his untimely death during the summer of 1993.

As was the case at Northeastern, Jim Calhoun's success at producing top-flight collegiate stars who also excel at the professional basketball level, is an annual happening at

Connecticut. A total of 16 former UConn stars who played for Coach Calhoun have been part of the National Basketball Association (NBA). They include: Clifford Robinson (Detroit Pistons/Phoenix Suns/Portland Trail Blazers), Tate George (New Jersey Nets), Chris Smith (Minnesota Timberwolves), Scott Burrell (New Jersey Nets/Chicago Bulls/Charlotte Hornets), Donyell Marshall (Chicago Bulls/Utah Jazz/Golden State Warriors), Donny Marshall (New Jersey Nets/Cleveland Cavaliers), Kevin Ollie (Seattle Sonics/Milwaukee Bucks/Indiana Pacers/Chicago Bulls/Philadelphia 76ers/Orlando Magic), Ray Allen (Seattle Sonics/Milwaukee Bucks), Travis Knight (New York Knicks/Boston Celtics/Los Angeles Lakers), Doron Sheffer (Los Angeles Clippers), Richard Hamilton (Detroit Pistons/Washington Wizards), Khalid El-Amin (Chicago Bulls/Dallas Mavericks/Miami Heat), Jake Voskuhl (Phoenix Suns/Chicago Bulls), Kevin Freeman (New Jersey Nets), Ricky Moore (Charlotte Hornets/Detroit Pistons) and Caron Butler (Miami Heat).

A former Little All-American and All-New England player at American International College in Springfield, MA, Calhoun graduated from AIC in 1968 with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Sociology. At AIC, he lettered three years while leading the Yellow Jacket basketball team in scoring as a junior and senior. He captained his alma mater in his senior year and left the school as the fourth all-time leading scorer along with helping the school earn a NCAA Division II playoff berth. He is a member of the AIC Hall of Fame and in the summer of 1994 earned the prestigious distinction of being elected to serve as a member of the American International College Board of Trustees. In the spring of 2000, Jim Calhoun served as the main commencement speaker at AIC's 115th graduation exercises and received an honorary degree from his alma mater.

Jim Calhoun began his coaching career at AIC, serving as an assistant basketball coach from 1966-68. After one year as head coach of basketball at Old Lyme High School in Connecticut, and one year as head coach of Westport High School in Westport, MA, Jim Calhoun moved on to become head coach at Dedham High School in Massachusetts. He quickly rebuilt the program, fashioning a 21-1 record in 1971-72 and seeing his club advance to the State Division I semi-finals.

In October of 1972, he moved into the collegiate coaching ranks at Northeastern University in Boston. In the years to follow, the Northeastern Huskies would dominate the ECAC North Atlantic Conference under his guidance. Northeastern won the league's regular season championship four times and shared the top spot two other times in seven years of conference play. NU also won five of the seven league tournaments and Coach Calhoun's record against conference competition in his career at NU was 74-13. While at Northeastern, he was inducted into the NU Sports Hall of Fame.

A graduate of Braintree (MA) High School, Jim Calhoun was a three-sport letter winner in football, basketball and baseball. As a senior captain, he earned All-Bay State League honors in football and basketball. His hometown of Braintree has bestowed a singular honor on Coach Calhoun, naming outdoor basketball courts in a city facility "Calhoun Park". He continues to return to Braintree to speak and conduct basketball clinics for area youths.

Jim Calhoun and his wife Pat make their home in Mansfield. They have two sons, James and Jeffrey. James and his wife Jennifer reside in London, England with their daughters, Emily (born 3/5/99) and Katie (born 12/29/00). Jeffrey and his wife Amy reside in Glastonbury, CT with their daughter Avery (born 1/26/02).

Tom Moore is in his ninth season on the University of Connecticut basketball staff in 2002-03.

A 1987 Boston University graduate, Moore, 37, was the head basketball coach at Worcester State (MA) College for five seasons before coming to UConn. He began his coaching career as assistant coach at Worcester State during the 1987-88 season. He spent the 1988-89 season as assistant coach at Assumption College before becoming the youngest head coach of a collegiate program in New England when, at age 24, he was named the Worcester State head coach prior to the 1989-90 season.

During his five seasons in charge of the Worcester State program, Moore compiled a record of 76-59, the winningest five-year period in the school's history.

In his second year as head coach, his 1990-91 club posted a 16-11 record, the winningest single-season at Worcester State in the previous 14 years. His 1992-93 club was named the region's Most Improved Team by the New England Basketball Coaches Association and that squad earned an ECAC tournament berth. The 1993-94 Worcester State team earned a spot in the NCAA Division III National Tournament. In addition to his role as head coach of basketball, Moore was an Assistant Athletic Director at Worcester State.

Moore joined the UConn coaching staff prior to the 1994-95 season and in his nine seasons associated with the Connecticut program the Huskies have compiled an overall record of 237-66, winning the 1999 NCAA Championship, six BIG EAST regular season titles, four BIG EAST tournament crowns, and earning nine straight postseason national tournament bids.

Moore, a graduate of St. John's High School in Shrewsbury, MA, has served as secretary-treasurer of the Worcester Coaches Association and has been a frequent lecturer at various summer camps throughout the country.

Moore and his wife, Eileen, live in Tolland and have three daughters, Elizabeth Rose, Catherine Grace and Caroline Mary.

George Blaney is in his second season as a member of the Connecticut basketball staff in 2002-03.

Blaney brings to Connecticut more than 30 years of collegiate coaching experience. He was an All-New England college basketball standout at Holy Cross, scoring 1,012 points in his college career and leading the Crusaders to back-to-back 20-win seasons before graduating in 1961. Blaney was a fourth round selection of the New York Knicks in the 1961 NBA Draft and played during the 1961-62 season with the Knicks.

During the 2002-03 season, Coach Blaney served as the interim head coach at UConn during Jim Calhoun's leave of absence for prostate cancer surgery. He guided the Huskies to a 3-2 record during that stretch, including a nationally-televised win over then-No. 17 Syracuse at the Hartford Civic Center.

Blaney began his coaching career as head coach at Hudson County High School in New Jersey in 1965. He moved into the college coaching ranks two years later when he was named head coach at Stonehill (MA) College. After two seasons at Stonehill, Blaney spent three years as head coach at Dartmouth College before returning to his alma mater and coaching the Holy Cross program for the next 22 years.

While directing the Holy Cross program, Blaney led the Crusaders to three NCAA tournament berths, five invitations to the NIT, and a 357-276 overall record. Holy Cross posted seven 20-win seasons during Blaney's tenure as head coach.

In 1994, George Blaney joined the BIG EAST Conference and spent three seasons as head coach at Seton Hall. He departed the college coaching ranks to become Vice President of Basketball Operations for the International Basketball League in 1998. He remained in that post for two years before joining the University of Rhode Island as an assistant coach during the 2000-2001 season.

In 30 seasons as a collegiate head coach, Blaney posted an impressive overall record of 459-382.

During his coaching career, Blaney spent 12 years on the Board of Directors of the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and served as the organization's president in 1993-94. He has earned numerous honors including the 1996 Bob Cousy Humanitarian Award; 1994 *Eastern Basketball Magazine's* Man of the Year; 1990 Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Coach of the Year; 1982 inductee into the Holy Cross Hall of Fame; 1981 inductee into the Hudson County Hall of Fame; 1980 U.S. Olympic Festival coach; 1977 Eastern Coach of the Year; and 1976 Hugh Greer Memorial New England Coach of the Year.

Blaney and his wife, Maryellen, have two daughters and three sons, along with four grandchildren.

Clyde Vaughan, a former standout player at the University of Pittsburgh, is in his first season on the UConn basketball staff.

Vaughan spent the past three seasons (1999-00 through 2001-02) as an assistant coach at the University of South Florida. Vaughan previously spent seven seasons (1992-93 through 1998-99) at Long Beach State University, first as an assistant coach ('92-'93 through '96-'97) and then as the associate head coach ('97-'98 through '98-'99).

At both Long Beach State and South Florida, Vaughan was known nationally as an outstanding recruiter and specifically worked with frontcourt and perimeter players. Vaughan helped Long Beach State and South Florida attract numerous nationally-ranked recruiting classes.

A 1984 graduate of Pittsburgh, Vaughan earned a bachelor's degree in communications. He led the Panthers in scoring and rebounding in his final three seasons at Pitt and finished his career as the No. 1 scorer in school history with 2,033 points. He is currently No. 2 behind Charles Smith. He is also the fifth all-time leading rebounder at Pitt with 920. As a junior in 1982-83, Vaughan led the BIG EAST Conference in scoring at 22.0 points per game. He was second to Chris Mullin in scoring in his senior year of 1983-84 at 20.3 points per game. He still ranks in the Top 15 in BIG EAST Conference history with his career averages of 19.5 points and 8.5 rebounds.

After completing his career at Pittsburgh, Vaughan was a sixth round selection by the Indiana Pacers in the 1984 NBA Draft. Vaughan opted to play professional basketball in Europe, where he was a standout in England during a seven-year career. He still ranks No. 3 on the all-time scoring average list, averaging 28.2 points per game. He was the English Player of the Year in 1989-90 and made 27 appearances for the English National Team. During Vaughan's lengthy playing and coaching career, he has traveled to 27 different countries.

Born in London, England, and raised in Mount Vernon, N.Y., Vaughan attended New Rochelle High School, where he was a standout basketball player. In September of 2000, he was inducted into the Westchester County Sports Hall of Fame and was a member of the Westchester County All-Century Basketball Team, as selected by *The Journal-News*.

Vaughan lives in Manchester, Conn., with his son C.J.



ANDRE LaFLEUR

Andre LaFleur is in his second season as the Director of Basketball Operations at the University of Connecticut in 2002-03.

LaFleur is a graduate of Northeastern University where he was one of the nation's premier point guards. A native of Los Angeles and a product of Governor Dummer Academy in South Byfield, Mass., he was a prime recruit for then-Northeastern head coach Jim Calhoun in a class that included Wes Fuller and Reggie Lewis.

The impact of that freshman class was instantaneous. The Huskies romped through their conference schedule with a perfect 14-0 mark and an overall record of 27-5. They won the America East title and went on to the NCAA Tournament. This pattern continued throughout his career as every year the Huskies won the league crown and went on to the NAAs. From the 1983-84 season through LaFleur's senior year of 1986-87, the team boasted a conference record of 60-6 and an overall record of 102-26. During one stretch, the Huskies won 38 consecutive home games.

LaFleur played 4405 minutes in 128 consecutive games - more minutes and more games than any other Northeastern player, past or present. LaFleur scored 1143 career points, graduating as the 10th all-time leading scorer in NU history and he is a member of the Northeastern Hall of Fame. He registered 89 steals as a senior and 252 for his career, both still Northeastern records. His total of 894 career assists set a new NCAA record in 1988 and he still ranks 11th in NCAA history. As a junior and senior, LaFleur was named All-Conference, while serving as a tri-captain with Fuller and Lewis. As a freshman, he made the conference All-Rookie Team.


LaFleur was a fifth-round draft pick of the Houston Rockets in 1987 and lasted until the team's final cut of the preseason. He then played for two years in the CBA before traveling to Australia where he played professionally for 11 seasons. After completing his professional career, Andre took a position as School Sports Coordinator for the Sydney City Basketball Association.

Andre also serves as the co-director of the Jim Calhoun Basketball Camp.
