For the second time in the past three seasons, UConn will enter the college basketball season as a favorite to win a national championship. In 2003-04, the Huskies were the consensus pick across the nation, with Emeka Okafor, Ben Gordon and Taliek Brown headlining a talented supporting cast. In the 2005-06, several of those supporting cast members are ready to lead a charge of their own, joined by several players who are among the best in the country at their respective positions.

Talent and experience. These are two attributes that 20th-year head coach Jim Calhoun will have in abundance in the 2005-06 season. Calhoun enters the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in September and captured his 700th career win in March of 2005. This 20th edition of his Huskies may be among the most talented that he has ever had, but will also benefit from the presence of four seniors who will see significant minutes, a rarity these days in major college basketball.

Let's start with the talent. A pair of juniors and a one sophomore will headline the returning Huskies. Junior **Marcus Williams** (Los Angeles, Calif.) finished No. 3 in the nation in assists last season at 7.8 per game and could be the nation's best returning point guard. Williams was the BIG EAST's Most Improved Player a year ago and also showed that he can score, averaging 9.6 points per game, but hitting for double figures in ten of the final 11 games. Junior **Josh Boone** (Mt. Airy, Md.) will be among the nation's best returning big men. He averaged 12.4 points and 8.4 rebounds, along with 2.9 blocks a year ago. He was the BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year and also brings the experience factor, having played a key part in the 2004 title run, including grabbing 14 rebounds in the national semifinal win over Duke.

The most talented returning Husky is sophomore **Rudy Gay** (Baltimore, Md.). Gay will be among the candidates for National Player of the Year honors and comes off a solid rookie campaign after which he was named the *Sporting News* National Freshman of the Year. Gay was also the BIG EAST Rookie of the Year and will join Boone and Williams this summer among the candidates to represent the USA on a pair of competing teams.

The performance of the Husky seniors is what could likely make-or-break the Husky title aspirations. Senior **Rashad Anderson** (Lakeland, Fla.) returns after a frightening conclusion to his junior year. Anderson had a breakout NCAA tourney run in 2004 and was the leading scorer for the Huskies in 2004-05 until an infection in his leg in February became life threatening. Anderson missed seven games and, despite a miraculous return to action in March for postseason, was not the same player. A spring and summer of training hopes to have Anderson back at the top of his game as one of the most dangerous three-point shooters in the country. Senior **Denham Brown** (Toronto, Ontario) has played in more games than any other player on the roster and was among the best players on the roster in UConn's February surge a year ago. He has been a standout at the international level for Team Canada for the past two summers and will again be a key part of the Calhoun rotation.

Seniors **Hilton Armstrong** (Peekskill, N.Y.) and **Ed Nelson** (Ft. Lauderdale, Fla.) will be the pieces of the UConn puzzle in 2005-06 that make the Huskies different from any other team. Both players have seen significant time at the highest level of competition and either player could start in the Husky frontcourt.

Armstrong is a high energy performer who will help keep the blocked shot as a primary deterrent for UConn opponents for the fifth year in a row. Nelson is a rugged performer who struggled to find his spot last season. His talents are unquestioned though, as he earned ACC Rookie of the Year honors in 2001-02 at Georgia Tech. Nelson saw success in some key spots down the stretch for the Huskies and should play a much bigger role in 2005-06.

The role of the newcomers for the Huskies in 2005-06 is mostly undetermined, especially with so many talented and experienced returnees, but one player who will most definitely have a role if healthy is freshman **A.J. Price** (Amityville, N.Y.). His story is well-known and inspiring. Price was slotted to be the two spot of a potent one-two punch with Marcus Williams in the Husky backcourt. In October, Price was rushed to the hospital with what was later diagnosed as a life threatening malformation of the arteries and veins that had caused bleeding on his brain. Price underwent radiosurgery in February to correct the malformation and could soon receive clearance to make a full return to training and begin working toward his return to the court. Price will give the Huskies another ball handler in the backcourt and an excellent three-point shooting threat as well.

Three other freshmen will definitely join the Husky squad and battle for playing time. **Jeff Adrien** (Brookline, Mass.) is a rugged forward who reminds the coaching staff of former UConn standout Kevin Freeman. Adrien will be a nice fit for the bump-and-grind style of league play and be ready physically to make an immediate impact. **Marcus Johnson** (Los Angeles, Calif.) is a talented wing man who can score, but also defends at a high level, a must under Jim Calhoun. Johnson will have a tough battle with all of the returnees at the wing spot, but he is talented enough to make an impact. **Craig Austrie** (Stamford, Conn.) was an April addition to the signing class and will add depth to the Husky backcourt. He is a combo guard, fitting nicely into the Husky scheme.

Entering his 20th season at the University of Connecticut, Jim Calhoun has built the UConn basketball program into one of the elite major college programs in the nation and in the process established himself as one of the great college basketball coaches of all-time, earning a pair of NCAA Championships and enshrinement into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

The move toward national prominence for the University of Connecticut basketball program began in May of 1986 when Jim Calhoun was named head coach.

Twenty years later, UConn Basketball sits atop the college basketball landscape with a pair of NCAA National Championships, an NIT Championship, 15 BIG EAST Conference titles, and annual recognition as one of America's truly outstanding college programs.

The 2004-05 season saw perhaps the best coaching job of Jim Calhoun's career. The Huskies had to replace the No. 2 and No. 3 selections in the NBA Draft Lottery, as well as, the school's all-time assist leader, and dealt with the adversity of a pair of life-threatening illnesses. Despite those obstacles, Coach Calhoun had his Huskies again at the top of the BIG EAST Conference and among the contenders for an NCAA Championship. In what has become a Coach Calhoun tradition, the Huskies rolled into postseason, winning 10 of 12 games to end the season, capturing the school's ninth BIG EAST regular season title and 15th overall BIG EAST title, both league records. UConn finished the year ranked in the National Top 20 for the tenth time in the past 12 seasons and advanced to national postseason play for the 18th consecutive season, one of only four schools in the country to do so.

For the second consecutive year, Jim Calhoun was a finalist for election to the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame and on April 4, 2005 was named one of five individuals to earn the sport's highest individual honor. Calhoun will be enshrined in the Class of 2005 on September 9, 2005 in Springfield, Mass., becoming one of only 263 individuals to ever be so honored. He is one of only six active Division I coaches in the Hall of Fame, joining John Chaney, Bob Knight, Mike Krzyzewski, Lute Olson and fellow 2005 enshrinee Jim Boeheim.

After 33 seasons as a head coach on the NCAA Division I collegiate level, Jim Calhoun's overall collegiate head coach-

ing record is 703-310 (69.4% winning effort). That includes a 248-137 (64.4%) record in 14 seasons as head coach at Northeastern (MA) University and a 455-173 (72.5%) mark in his 19 seasons at Connecticut.

In 2003-04, UConn began the season as the consensus No. 1 team in the nation and was one of only two teams to spend the entire season in the top ten en route to the program's second national title. UConn finished the 2003-2004 season with a 33-6 overall record. In directing the Huskies to their second NCAA National Championship in six seasons, Jim Calhoun became only the second coach to win multiple NCAA titles since the tournament field expanded to 64 teams in 1985.

Coach Calhoun has reached several milestones during the past two seasons in addition to being a Hall of Fame finalist. On March 2, 2005, UConn defeated Georgetown to make Coach Calhoun the 19th coach in Division I history to reach the 700-win plateau. He also reached 450 wins at UConn in the victory over Notre Dame on February 21. During the 2003-04 season, he notched his 650th career win vs. Sacred Heart and registered his 400th career victory at UConn in the season opener vs. Yale. With the win over Syracuse on February 2, 2004, Coach Calhoun passed John Wooden to move into the top 20 on the NCAA All-Time Division I Coaching Wins list and currently stands tied for 18th place in NCAA history.

In his 19 seasons at Connecticut, Jim Calhoun has compiled a stunning 45-14 overall record in national postseason tournament competition (33-10 in NCAA play, 12-4 in NIT play). His 33 NCAA wins at UConn, all achieved in the past 16 years, far outdistances the entire total of four NCAA victories recorded at Connecticut before Coach Calhoun took over the Husky basketball program in the spring of 1986.

Jim Calhoun has led UConn to 13 NCAA bids in the past 16 years. Under Coach Calhoun's direction, UConn has never lost a NCAA First Round game and UConn is a stunning 23-3 in NCAA First and Second Round competition since 1990. The Huskies have earned ten NCAA Sweet 16 berths in the past 16 years, six Elite Eight appearances, two NCAA Final Four trips and two National Championships.

Under Coach Calhoun, UConn has captured a league record 15 BIG EAST Championships, nine regular season crowns and six tournament titles. The Huskies are 28-13 in BIG EAST Tournament play under Calhoun.

Jim Calhoun is the only coach in the history of the BIG EAST Conference to have been named BIG EAST Conference Coach of the Year four times. He earned his first BIG EAST Coach of the Year award in 1989-90 and also won the honor following the 1993-94, 1995-96 and 1997-98 seasons. John Thompson of Georgetown and Lou Carnesecca of St. John's each earned the prestigious honor three times.


In October of 2004, Jim Calhoun was named winner of the 2005 "Legends of Coaching Award" from the John R. Wooden Awards Committee. Coach Calhoun received the award from the Los Angeles Athletic Club in April of 2005, becoming just the seventh recipient of the prestigious honor. The award honors college coaches who exemplify Coach John Wooden's high standards of coaching success and personal achievements. Previous

recipients of the Legends of Coaching Award include: Dean Smith, Mike Krzyzewski and Lute Olson.

In the summer of 2002, Jim Calhoun was selected as a member of the inaugural induction class to the New England Basketball Hall of Fame.

After directing Connecticut to both the 1999 and 2004 NCAA National Championships, Jim Calhoun was honored on separate occasions as the recipient of the Winged Foot Award from the New York Athletic Club, recognizing him as their National Coach of the Year. He also received the prestigious Victor Award as 1998-99 College Basketball National Coach of the Year and was the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District I Coach of the Year.

Born May 10, 1942 in Braintree, MA, Jim Calhoun and his wife Pat have two sons, James and Jeffrey. James and his wife Jennifer have two daughters, Emily (born 3/5/99) and Katie (born 12/29/00) and a son Samuel (born 6/8/03). Jeffrey and his wife Amy have three daughters Avery (born 1/26/02), Reese (born 4/7/03) and Peyton (born 3/26/05).

Tom Moore will enter his 12th season on the University of Connecticut basketball staff in the 2005-06 season.

In his four years on the recruiting trail for the Huskies, Moore has earned a national reputation as a superb recruiter and evaluator of talent. He is annually recognized by leading basketball experts as one of the nation's top assistant coaches and is regularly mentioned as a leading candidate for vacant head coaching positions.

Moore joined the UConn coaching staff prior to the 1994-95 season and in his 11 seasons associated with the Connecticut program the Huskies have compiled an overall record of 293-81, winning the 2004 and 1999 NCAA Championships, seven BIG EAST regular season titles, five BIG EAST tournament crowns, and earning 11 straight postseason national tournament bids.

A 1987 Boston University graduate, Moore was the head basketball coach at Worcester State (MA) College for five seasons before coming to UConn. He began his coaching career as assistant coach at Worcester State during the 1987-88 season. He spent the 1988-89 season as assistant coach at Assumption College before becoming the youngest head coach of a collegiate program in New England when, at age 24, he was named the Worcester State head coach prior to the 1989-90 season.

During his five seasons in charge of the Worcester State program, Moore compiled a record of 76-59, the winningest five-year period in the school's history.

In his second year as head coach, his 1990-91 club posted a 16-11 record, the winningest single-season at Worcester State in the previous 14 years. His 1992-93 club was named the region's Most Improved Team by the New England Basketball Coaches Association and that squad earned an ECAC tournament berth. The 1993-94 Worcester State team earned a spot in the NCAA Division III National Tournament. In addition to his role as head coach of basketball, Moore was an Assistant Athletic Director at Worcester State.

Moore, a graduate of St. John's High School in Shrewsbury, MA, has served as secretary-treasurer of the Worcester Coaches Association and has been a frequent lecturer at various summer camps throughout the country.

Moore and his wife, Eileen, live in Tolland and have three daughters, Elizabeth Rose, Catherine Grace and Caroline Mary.

George Blaney will enter his fifth season as a member of the Connecticut basketball staff in the 2005-06 season.

Blaney brings to the Connecticut staff more than 30 years of collegiate coaching experience. He was an All-New England college basketball standout at Holy Cross, scoring 1,012 points in his college career and leading the Crusaders to back-to-back 20-win seasons before graduating in 1961. Blaney was a fourth round selection of the New York Knicks in the 1961 NBA Draft and played during the 1961-62 season with the Knicks.

In the summer of 2003, Blaney was inducted as a member of the New England Basketball Hall of Fame.

Blaney began his coaching career as head coach at Hudson Catholic High School in Jersey City, NJ in 1965. He moved into the college coaching ranks two years later when he was named head coach at Stonehill (MA) College. After two seasons at Stonehill, Blaney spent three years as head coach at Dartmouth College before returning to his alma mater and coaching the Holy Cross program for the next 22 years.

While directing the Holy Cross program, Blaney led the Crusaders to three NCAA tournament berths, five invitations to the NIT, and a 357-276 overall record. Holy Cross posted seven 20-win seasons during Blaney's tenure as head coach.

In 1994, George Blaney joined the BIG EAST Conference and spent three seasons as head coach at Seton Hall. He departed the college coaching ranks to become Vice President of Basketball Operations for the International Basketball League in 1998. He remained in that post for two years before joining the University of Rhode Island as an assistant coach during the 2000-2001 season.

In 30 seasons as a collegiate head coach, Blaney posted an impressive overall record of 459-382.

During his coaching career, Blaney spent 12 years on the Board of Directors of the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and served as the organization's president in 1993-94. He has earned numerous honors including the 1996 Bob Cousy Humanitarian Award; 1994 Eastern Basketball Magazine's Man of the Year; 1990 Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Coach of the Year; 1982 inductee into the Holy Cross Hall of Fame; 1981 inductee into the Hudson County Hall of Fame; 1980 U.S. Olympic Festival coach; 1977 Eastern Coach of the Year; and 1976 Hugh Greer Memorial New England Coach of the Year.

Blaney and his wife, Maryellen, have two daughters and three sons, along with five grandchildren.



ANDRE LaFLEUR ASSISTANT COACH

*5th Season
at Connecticut*

Andre LaFleur will enter his second season as an assistant coach and his fifth year on the UConn Basketball staff in 2005-06. He spent three seasons as the Director of Basketball Operations before moving into the assistant coaching role for the 2004-05 campaign.

LaFleur is a graduate of Northeastern University where he was one of the nation's premier point guards. A native of Los Angeles and a product of Governor Dummer Academy in South Byfield, Mass., he was a prime recruit for then-Northeastern head coach Jim Calhoun in a class that included Wes Fuller and Reggie Lewis.

The impact of that freshman class at Northeastern was instantaneous. The Huskies romped through their conference schedule with a perfect 14-0 mark and an overall record of 27-5. They won the ECAC North Atlantic title and went on to the NCAA Tournament. This pattern continued throughout his career as every year the Huskies won the league crown and went on to the NAAs. From the 1983-84 season through LaFleur's senior year of 1986-87, the team boasted a conference record of 60-6 and an overall record of 102-26. During one stretch, the Huskies won 38 consecutive home games.

LaFleur played 4405 minutes in 128 consecutive games - more minutes and more games than any other Northeastern player, past or present. LaFleur scored 1143 career points, graduating as the 10th all-time leading scorer in NU history and he is a member of the Northeastern Hall of Fame. He registered 89 steals as a senior and 252 for his career, both still Northeastern records. His total of 894 career assists set a new NCAA record in 1988 and he still ranks 12th in NCAA history. As a junior and senior, LaFleur was named All-Conference, while serving as a tri-captain with Fuller and Lewis. As a freshman, he made the conference All-Rookie Team.

LaFleur was a fifth-round draft pick of the Houston Rockets in 1987 and lasted until the team's final cut of the preseason. He then played and coached professionally in Australia and overseas for 11 seasons. After completing his professional career, Andre took a position as School Sports Coordinator for the Sydney City Basketball Association.

Andre, 39, and his wife Alana, reside in Vernon. Andre also has a nine-year-old son, Adrian.

Patrick Sellers completed his first season as the Director of Men's Basketball Operations at the University of Connecticut in 2004-05.


Patrick is the older brother of former Husky standout and team captain Rod Sellers, who played at UConn from 1989-1992.

His team also made back-to-back appearances in the state playoffs during the 1998 and 1999 seasons. Sellers originally joined the basketball staff at St. Thomas Aquinas in 1994 as the junior varsity coach and an assistant under head coach Jerry DeGregorio.

A 1991 graduate of Central Connecticut State with a bachelor's degree in accounting, Sellers served as the Blue Devils captain during his senior season, and was named East Coast Conference Defensive Player of the Year in 1991. He led the team in rebounding in both his junior and senior seasons, finishing his career with 581 rebounds, still good for 10th on the all-time list.
