**THE GAME--** Tonight's game features the Huskies of the University of Connecticut against the Orange of Syracuse University. UConn is 20-6 on the regular season, 12-3 in the BIG EAST, and comes off an 83-64 win over Georgetown Wednesday night. Syracuse is 24-5 overall, 11-4 in the league.

**JIM CALHOUN WINS #700--** The win over Georgetown Wednesday was UConn coach Jim Calhoun's 700th career coaching victory. He is the 19th coach in Division I Coaching History to reach the 700-win plateau. He is 700-308 in his 33rd season, 452-171 in 19 seasons at UConn and 248-137 in 14 seasons at Northeastern.

**A 700 MATCHUP--** The meeting of UConn's Jim Calhoun and Syracuse's Jim Boeheim Saturday will mark the 16th matchup in Division I Men's Basketball history

between coaches with 700 or more wins. Those games involve nine different coaches, including Bob Knight and Eddie Sutton, who make up ten of the previous 15 such games. This will be the fourth such matchup this season, with Sutton and Knight meeting twice and Mike Krzyzewski and John Chaney facing off as well. Knight also met Lou Henson twice as 700-win coaches, Sutton faced off with Jerry Tarkanian once and Tarkanian met Lefty Driesell in November of 1999 in the first ever meeting of 700-win coaches.

**LOOKING FOR 15 TITLES--** UConn enters today's game with Syracuse with a chance to capture its 15th BIG EAST Championship in the last 16 seasons, dating back to the 1989-90 Regular Season title, the school's first. The Huskies already hold the league record for total championships with 14. UConn is currently tied with Syracuse for the most regular season titles with eight each and is tied with Georgetown for the most tournament titles with six apiece.

**THE SERIES--** This is the 74th all-time meeting between UConn and Syracuse, with the Orangemen holding a 44-29 advantage in the series. UConn coach Jim Calhoun is 20-20 (20-17 at UConn) lifetime against Syracuse, while Syracuse coach Jim Boeheim has a 30-25 mark against UConn... Calhoun is 20-18 vs. Boeheim (0-1 while at Northeastern)... The Huskies took the first meeting of the year between the schools, 74-66, on February 7 at the Carrier Dome... This will be only the second time Syracuse has visited Gampel Pavilion. UConn took an 86-75 on January 23, 1995 in the first matchup. Ray Allen led the Huskies with 31 points, while Lawrence Moten has 22 for the Orangemen.

**SCOUTING THE HUSKIES--** UConn is 20-6 on the year and 12-3 in the BIG EAST Conference, having won eight straight league games. The Huskies feature five players in double figures, but are still without junior guard Rashad Anderson, who is averaging a team-leading 13.8 points and has missed the past five games. Anderson remains out indefinitely as he recovers from an infection in his right leg. Sophomore Charlie Villanueva is averaging 13.3 points, 7.9 boards and 1.9 blocks and has ten double-doubles. He is averaging 21.0 points and 8.0 boards over the last three games. Sophomore center Josh Boone has recorded 11 double-doubles and is averaging 13.0 points and 8.7 rebounds, along with 3.0 blocks. Freshman Rudy Gay is the starter at the small forward spot and is averaging 11.6 points and 5.9 rebounds. Junior Denham Brown is averaging 10.7 points, returning to the starting lineup in the win at West Virginia and hitting for nearly 14 points per game since his return to the first five. Sophomore point guard Marcus Williams (8.8 ppg, 8.0 apg) leads the BIG EAST in assists. Junior Hilton Armstrong (4.0 ppg, 3.8 rpg), junior forward Ed Nelson (2.8, 2.2), and freshman guard Antonio Kellogg (3.3 ppg, 2.3 apg) round out the regulars.

**HONORING THE SENIORS--** UConn will honor a pair of players who are

in their senior season as Husky performers. Senior Jason Baisch joined the Huskies as a practice player two years ago and worked his way to an integral part of the championship effort the past two seasons. Baisch was awarded a scholarship in January for his efforts. Senior Sami Ameziane joined the squad as a walk-on in preseason and has become a fan favorite in his short time with the program. Senior ceremonies will begin Saturday at approximately 3:45 p.m.

**UConn ON CBS--** During the past 16 seasons (since the 1989-90 season), the Connecticut basketball program has been televised nationally by CBS Sports a total of 92 times (46 during the regular season, 41 during the NCAA Championship, five in the Big East Tournament). UConn has compiled an overall record of 59-33 in those 92 games on CBS (32-9 in NCAA play, 3-2 in the Big East Tournament, 24-22 in regular season play). This is the fifth of five regular season appearances on CBS this season. UConn defeated Indiana on December 4 on CBS, lost at Notre Dame on January 30, lost to North Carolina on February 13 and won at Pittsburgh on February 26.

**THE HUSKIES IN GAMPTEL--** UConn has a record of 96-15 in Gampel Pavilion, 44-4 against non-conference opponents and 52-11 vs. BIG EAST competition. The Huskies have won 33 of their last 37 overall in Gampel. The four non-conference losses were to Detroit Mercy in 2001 NIT, Jackson St. in 1993 NIT, Florida St. in 1991-92 and NC State in 1990-91 and the Huskies have won 12 straight non-conference games at Gampel since the Detroit Mercy loss. UConn is 5-1 in Gampel this season, beating Buffalo, Florida International, Northeastern, St. John's and Georgetown and falling to Pittsburgh.

**PICKING UP THE SLACK--** The Huskies have been without leading scorer Rashad Anderson for six games, but have gone 5-1 with several players making up the difference in Rashad's absence. Four of the five starters are playing above their season scoring average, while one is virtually the same. Charlie Villanueva is at 18.0 per game in Anderson's absence, up from 13.3 for the year. Denham Brown (14.7/10.7), Marcus Williams (14.2/8.8) and Rudy Gay (13.5/11.6) are also above their season averages in the six-game stretch. Josh Boone (12.3/13.0) is slightly below his season average since Anderson left the lineup.

**GAY ROOKIE HONOR NUMBER FIVE--** For the fifth time during the course of the season and second consecutive week, Rudy Gay has been named the BIG EAST Rookie of the Week. Gay averaged 11.5 points in a 2-0 week for the Huskies. He scored a team-high 17 points in Saturday's 73-64 victory over Pittsburgh. Earlier in the week, the freshman forward contributed six points and seven boards in an 88-74 win over Notre Dame.

**HITTING TEN WINS AGAIN--** UConn is now 12-3 in league play, surpassing the ten-win plateau in the BIG EAST for the 12th time in Jim Calhoun's 19 seasons at Connecticut and the third highest total ever among league coaches. Syracuse has reached the ten-win mark 19 times in 26 seasons under Jim Boeheim (including 2004-05) and Georgetown hit ten wins in league play 13 of 20 seasons under John Thompson.

**HITTING 20 WINS AGAIN--** UConn is currently 20-6 on the season, nearing the 20-win plateau. This marks the 20th time in his career and 15th time in 19 seasons at UConn that head coach Jim Calhoun has cracked the 20-win mark. This is the eighth straight season that UConn has reached the 20-win mark, extending the longest such streak in school history, and is the 14th time in the last 16 years UConn have won 20 or more times. UConn had compiled eight 20-win seasons in 84 seasons before Coach Calhoun's 1987-88 team went 20-14 and won the NIT.

**ANDERSON REMAINS OUT OF LINEUP--** Junior Rashad Anderson remains out of the lineup in his continuing recovery from a skin abscess on his right leg and resulting infection. Anderson checked into Windham Hospital on Tuesday, February 8 with the skin abscess in the inner thigh area of his right leg. That infection was drained and he was transferred to Hartford Hospital on Thursday, February 10. Anderson spent time in the intensive care unit after he developed breathing difficulties as a result of the infection, but his condition gradually improved and he was released from the hospital on February 21. Anderson is the leading scorer for the Huskies at 13.8 points per game. Anderson has been cleared for physical activity, but his return to the lineup is still unknown.

**THE ANNUAL RITUAL CONTINUES--** UConn once again ranks among the national leaders in field goal percentage defense, marking the eighth time in nine seasons that the Huskies are among the country's best in this category. This season, UConn is No. 5 in the rankings of Feb. 28 (stats are updated every Tuesday) and is currently holding opponents to 38.1% from the field. UConn finished the year ranked No. 1 last season, holding opponents to 36.9%, the lowest ever for a Jim Calhoun-coached Husky team. UConn's best rankings prior to last season came in 1995-96, finishing No. 4 with a FG% defense of 38.6% and in 2002-03, when the Huskies finished ranked No. 4 in the country at 37.9%.

**A DIFFERENT DENHAM--** Denham Brown is now averaging 10.9 points on the year and has started 15 games overall, including the last ten. A closer look at the numbers shows a vastly different Denham is his games as a starter and his games as a reserve.

*As a Starter-- 13.0 pts., 4.8 rebs., 51.0 fg%, 40.0 3fg%*

*As a Reserve-- 7.1 pts., 2.6 rebs., 28.9 fg%, 21.4 3fg%*

**MARCUS AMONG THE BEST--** Marcus Williams continues to establish himself in a short period of time as one of the best passers in UConn and BIG EAST annals. He currently leads the **BIG EAST** and is **No. 3 in the nation** in assists at 8.0 per contest. This season, he has established the UConn single game record for assists twice (16, vs. CCSU and Notre Dame) and the UConn single game BIG EAST record (16 vs. Notre Dame). He has registered double figure assists on six occasions. The 16 assists vs. ND is tied for the third most in BIG EAST history, behind only Sherman Douglas (22) and Dwayne Washington (18) of Syracuse. Williams has 276 career assists in 42 games, an impressive number, especially when put in perspective with some past Husky point guards. Williams reached the 250-assist mark in career game #39, faster than any other Husky in history. Tate George is the second quickest to 250, doing so in his 45th game. By comparison, Doron Sheffer took 48 games to reach 250, Taliek Brown took 52 games, and Khalid El-Amin needed 65 games.

**LEADERS OF THE PACK--** UConn has been leading the country in a pair of team categories throughout the course of the season. The Huskies lead the nation in blocked shots and rebound margin. In 2003-04, UConn led the nation in field goal defense, rebound margin and blocked shots.

**A HALFTIME LEAD HELPS--** UConn has piled up an impressive mark of 361-38 under Jim Calhoun when leading at the half. The Huskies are 16-4 this season with a halftime lead and went 27-1 in 2003-04 en route to a national title. Over the past four seasons, UConn is 82-6 in games when taking a lead into halftime.

**SOPHOMORE JOSH BOONE--** Sophomore Josh Boone is averaging 13.0 points and 8.7 rebounds for the year, adding 3.0 blocks per game as well. He has 11 double-doubles on the year and has scored 20 or more points seven times this season. Josh had 21 points at Rutgers and before that, back-to-back double-doubles, including 16 points, 11 boards and four blocks in the game vs. North Carolina. Boone is among the mid-season candidates for the Naismith National Player of the Year Award. He put together a 20-point performance in the win at Seton Hall on January 17, hitting on eight-of-eight from the field. He had four straight 20+-point efforts in the wins over Rice, Central Connecticut, Sacred Heart and Quinnipiac to end the calendar year. Boone's 11 double-doubles in 2004-05 easily surpass his season total of three as a freshman in 2003-04. **Josh leads the BIG EAST in rebounding and field goal percentage.** Boone averaged 5.9 points and 5.8 rebounds a year ago.

**BOONE IN THE BLOCKS--** Josh Boone registered nine blocks in the win over St. John's, a career-high for him, and a UConn record-tying performance in BIG EAST play. Emeka Okafor and Clifford Robinson each totaled nine blocks in the league game during their time as a Husky, Okafor on two occasions. The league record for blocks in a game is 12, held by Dikembe Mutombo of Georgetown. **Boone is averaging 3.0 blocks per game, good for No. 7 in the latest national rankings.**

**SOPH. CHARLIE VILLANUEVA--** Sophomore Charlie Villanueva is averaging 13.3 points and 7.9 rebounds for the season, including ten double-doubles. He comes off 24 points in the win over Georgetown and had 14 points and 13 rebounds in the road win at Pittsburgh. He had 25 points in the win over Notre Dame and was named the BIG EAST Player of the Week on February 21, coming off 21 points and 11 rebounds in the win at Rutgers and a 22-point, ten-rebound effort in the win at Providence. He had 21 points in the win at Syracuse, adding ten rebounds and three steals. Villanueva was listed as a preseason candidate for both the John R. Wooden National Player of the Year award and the Naismith Player of the Year award. Villanueva is also an honorable mention AP All-America. He was a member of the 2003-04 BIG EAST All-Rookie team.

**SOPH. MARCUS WILLIAMS--** Sophomore Marcus Williams is the starting point guard and **leads the BIG EAST and the Huskies in assists at 8.0 per contest.** He had 17 points, 12 assists and nine rebounds in the win over Notre Dame. He had 15 points and 13 assists in the win at Providence and had a career-best 18 points vs. North Carolina. Marcus is averaging nine assists per game over the last month, including 16 assists in the loss at Notre Dame on January 30, matching his UConn single game record. He had back-to-back then career-high point totals of 16 points at Oklahoma and 11 points at Georgetown. He also had eight assists and seven rebounds at Oklahoma. He had his first career double-

double with ten points and ten assists in the win over Quinnipiac. He recorded 16 assists in the win over Central Connecticut, setting the UConn single game record in the process. The previous record of 14 had been achieved three times, by Kevin Ollie (twice, in 1995 and 1993) and by Earl Kelley (in 1985).

**WILLIAMS FINDS THE SHOOTING TOUCH TOO--** Marcus Williams may be better known for his passing ability, but in recent weeks he has also displayed a much improved shooting touch from long range. **In the last 11 games, Williams has hit on 52.9% (18-of-34) from three-point range.** He was at 23.5% (4-of-17) after the first 15 games. For the season, Williams is now at 43.1% from three.

**FRESHMAN RUDY GAY--** Freshman Rudy Gay moved into the starting lineup for the Rice game on December 19 and is currently fourth on the team in scoring at 11.6 points per game, while grabbing 5.9 rebounds. He has hit for double figures a team-leading 18 times during the year and is coming off a career-best 20 points in the win over Georgetown. Gay is a five-time BIG EAST Rookie of the Week (February 28, February 21, February 7, January 3 and December 6) and was voted the BIG EAST Preseason Rookie of the Year at Media Day in October.

**JUNIOR DENHAM BROWN--** Junior Denham Brown is averaging 10.7 points per game and has made a productive return to the starting lineup in the past 11 games, hitting for nearly 14 points per contest. He had 16 points in the win at Pittsburgh and back-to-back 18-point efforts in the wins over Notre Dame and at Rutgers. He had his first double-double of the season, scoring 14 points and adding ten rebounds at Providence. Brown has started more games in his career (71) than any current Husky and has reached double figures in 16 games this season. Brown has started 16 games this year.

**RASHAD NEARS 1,000--** Junior Rashad

Anderson has 985 career points and is nearing the 1,000-point plateau for his Husky career. Anderson, who is averaging 13.8 points per game, will look to become the 38th UConn player to crack the 1,000-point barrier when he returns to the Husky lineup. Anderson has come off the bench in his last five games after starting the first 15 games at the shooting guard spot. He has **hit on 16-of-34 (47.1%) three's over his past six games** after hitting on only 8-of-46 (17.4%) in the previous seven games.

**UConn IN BIG EAST PLAY--** The Huskies have compiled an all-time overall BIG EAST record of 270-194. Under Jim Calhoun, UConn is 232-126 in BIG EAST play and that total places Calhoun third among all-time winningest coaches in league history. Calhoun trails only Jim Boeheim (306) and John Thompson (232).

**STILL THE LEADERS OF THE BLOCK--** With the graduation of all-time shot block leader Emeka Okafor, the expectation could have been for the Huskies, who have led the nation in blocked shots as a team for three straight seasons, to fall off the pace a bit. After 26 games in 2004-05, that thought has proven to be way off the mark. UConn has blocked 241 shots (9.27 per game), including a school-record 19 shots in the win over Florida International on November 30 and 17 shots in the win over Quinnipiac on December 30. **UConn also set a new BIG EAST mark with 17 blocks in the win over St. John's.** UConn is the first school in NCAA history to lead the country in blocked shots for three straight seasons and is well on its way to a repeat. The wealth is spread out too, with 11 different players recording at least one block so far. Sophomores Josh Boone (78) and Charlie Villanueva (49), freshman Rudy Gay (49) and junior Hilton Armstrong (34) have led the

## JIM CALHOUN HEADLINES HALL OF FAME FINALISTS

SPRINGFIELD, Mass. (February 20, 2005)-- Coach Jim Calhoun, who has directed the University of Connecticut basketball program to two NCAA Division I National Championships in the past six years, highlights a list of 16 finalists for election into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame Class of 2005 will be announced on Monday, April 4, at a news conference in St. Louis prior to the NCAA Division I National Championship. Finalists on the Hall of Fame ballot need to receive a minimum of 18 votes from the 24-member Honors Committee in order to be inducted. The Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts will induct the Class of 2005 during ceremonies September 8-10, 2005.

"As I said last year when told that I was a finalist for the Basketball Hall of Fame, I am very proud and deeply humbled," said Jim Calhoun.

"The Naismith Hall of Fame is the ultimate destination for a basketball coach," added Calhoun. "I love the game of basketball and I've spent by entire life playing and coaching in New England in the shadow of the Hall of Fame."

"The phenomenal team successes we've had over the years, the championships we've won, and the wonderful young men I've been fortunate enough to coach, have been a source of great personal pride for me," said Calhoun. "But, there has been no greater recognition personally than to be told I am a Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame finalist."

**PLENTY OF WINS--** Since the start of the 1997-98 season, the Connecticut basketball program has averaged 27.6 victories per season. In that span, UConn has won 214 games and lost only 58, a superb winning percentage of 78.7%.

**20 OFF THE BENCH--** Junior Rashad Anderson has connected for 20 points in a game three times this season off the bench, including the wins over Villanova and St. John's, and has now turned the trick six times in his career. A total of ten reserve players in Jim Calhoun's 19 seasons have reached the 20-point mark in a game. The other players in this group are Brian Fair (9 times in his career), Ben Gordon (5 times), Ray Allen (4 times), Johnnie Selvie (4 times), Phil Gamble (3 times), John Gwynn (2 times), Charlie Villanueva (1 time) and Rashamel Jones (1 time).

**REBOUNDING RECORDS--** Husky rebounding marks are taking a beating so far this season, as UConn is leading the country and out-rebounding opponents by 12.0 boards/game through 26 contests (No. 1 in the country). The Huskies have only been outrebounded in two games this season (Jan. 22 vs. Pittsburgh & Feb. 5 vs. St. John's). UConn grabbed 31 offensive rebounds in the win over Rice, surpassing the previous Jim Calhoun Era-best of 30 it had in the win over Northeastern. In the win over Northeastern. UConn had 74 total boards on the night, also a UConn best under coach Calhoun. The previous high for total rebounds by a Calhoun team was 72, vs. Central Connecticut on December 27, 1991. UConn had twice before grabbed 29 rebounds on offensive end, vs. Seton Hall on March 2, 1996 and vs. Southern Connecticut on December 23, 1989.

**A GAME WITHOUT A THREE--** The win over Seton Hall on January 17 was unique in that it marked only the fourth regular season game since the beginning of Jim Calhoun's second season at UConn that the Huskies had a game in which they did not hit a three-pointer. The Huskies have played three postseason games in that stretch without a three also. The last regular season game without a three was November 29, 1990 at Yale, a 49-48 UConn win. The last time overall before Monday night's 0-for-6 effort vs. the Pirates was March 18, 2001, a 67-61 NIT loss to Detroit Mercy. In a remarkable contrast, UConn has made at least one three in 607 of 614 games the past 18 seasons, but in Jim Calhoun's first season, 1986-87, UConn went without a three in 8-of-28 games and five of those games did not even attempt a three-pointer.

**HUSKIES GO 3-1 ON THANKSGIVING TOUR OF LONDON--** UConn spent Thanksgiving week in England, playing four exhibition games against teams in the British Basketball League. The team arrived in London on Sunday, November 21 and returned home on Saturday, November 27. The Huskies split a pair of games with London Towers, the current league leaders. UConn lost 95-89 on Tuesday and beat Towers 88-74 on Thursday. Connecticut beat Milton Keynes on Wednesday by a score of 120-74 and concluded the trip Friday night with an 87-71 win over 2004 BBL Champion Brighton. Leading the way for the Huskies on the trip was freshman Rudy Gay. He started all four games and averaged 15.5 points and 6.5 rebounds. He cracked the 20-point mark in two of the four games. Juniors Denham Brown and Rashad Anderson also had a stellar trip, each averaging 14.5 points. Sophomore Josh Boone averaged 12.8 points and 6.5 rebounds, including a 22-point, 13-rebound performance in the win over London Towers. Sophomore Marcus Williams led the team in assists on the trip with 35 in four games.

**IN THE NATIONAL POLLS--** UConn remains a regular in the national rankings. The Huskies have now been ranked in the Top 25 for 37 consecutive polls, the third longest such streak in UConn basketball history. Connecticut has been in the weekly polls for 52 of the last 56 rankings over the past three seasons.

**THE BIG EAST IN 2005-06--** The Presidents of The BIG EAST Conference institutions have approved all recommendations by the league's athletic directors relating to the structure of men's and women's basketball beginning in the 2005-06 academic year. The approvals were made at the Presidents' annual meeting held in Philadelphia on Nov. 9. The recommendations include maintaining a 12-team postseason conference championship tournament and a one-division regular season structure. The men's and women's teams will continue to play 16-game regular season league schedules. In 2005-06, the BIG EAST will include 16 schools. The new members will be: University of Cincinnati, DePaul University, University of Louisville, Marquette University and University of South Florida. While the tournament format will be the same for the men and women, the formula for regular season scheduling will be different. The men's teams will play 13 opponents with three repeat matchups to reach 16 league games. The women's teams will meet each opponent once and have one repeat opponent. BIG EAST men's teams have captured the last two NCAA crowns and three of the last six. BIG EAST women's team have won the last five NCAA titles. The BIG EAST conducts its men's championship at Madison Square Garden in New York. The women's championship is played at the Hartford Civic Center in Hartford, Conn. For regular season scheduling, the conference office will determine prior to each season which matchups will be repeated.

**A LEGEND OF COACHING--** UConn head coach Jim Calhoun has been named the 2004-05 recipient of the prestigious John R. Wooden Legends of Coaching Award, to be presented on April 9, 2005 in Los Angeles. Previous winners include Dean Smith, Mike Krzyzewski, Lute Olson and Roy Williams.

**THE DEFENDING CHAMPS--** UConn won its second NCAA National Championship in 2004, finishing the season with a 33-6 overall mark. The Huskies were the BIG EAST Tournament Champions and captured the NCAA title by winning their six tourney games by an average margin of over 13 points per game. Connecticut is one of only three schools (Kentucky, Duke) to have captured two NCAA Championships since the field expanded to 64 teams in 1985.

**BIG EAST COACHES TAB HUSKIES NO. 2--** UConn was the No. 2 choice of league coaches in the BIG EAST preseason poll. Syracuse was the top choice of the league coaches, who could not vote for their own squad. The Orange received 119 points and nine first place votes. The Huskies had 106 points and two first place votes, while Pittsburgh had 100 points and the final first place vote. Notre Dame (88 pts.) was fourth, Boston College was fifth (78 pts.), Providence sixth (69 pts.), Villanova seventh (59 pts.), Seton Hall eighth (56 pts.), West Virginia ninth (43 pts.), Rutgers tenth (42 pts.), Georgetown 11th (21 pts.) and St. John's rounded out the poll in 12th place (11 pts.).

**A TRIO OF BIG EAST HONOREES--** UConn freshman Rudy Gay was named the BIG EAST Preseason Rookie of the Year in a vote of league coaches. Junior Rashad Anderson and sophomore Josh Boone were each named to the Preseason All-BIG EAST Second Team. Gay is the second straight Husky to earn the preseason rookie honor, joining Charlie Villanueva from a year ago. Anderson is UConn's returning scoring leader and Boone was an All-BIG EAST Rookie pick in 2003-04.

**WHITE LEAVES PROGRAM--** University of Connecticut sophomore forward Marcus White (Chicago, IL) has left the basketball program, it was announced by Head Coach Jim Calhoun Monday, December 13. "Marcus has decided to leave the basketball program and will withdraw from the University at the conclusion of the final exam period." The fall semester final exam period concludes Saturday. "We wish Marcus the best in whatever he decides to do in the future," concluded Calhoun. White subsequently enrolled at Purdue to start the second semester. White appeared in 32 games in his Husky career over three seasons, including all five games this season. He played in 23 games off the bench

## A.J. PRICE TO REMAIN SIDELINED BUT RETURN TO CLASSES

University of Connecticut freshman men's basketball player **A.J. Price** returned to classes beginning January 18, but will not see action on the basketball court during the 2004-05 season. A.J. underwent a cerebral angiogram on Tuesday, January 4 at Brigham & Women's Hospital under the care of Dr. Arthur Day, M.D.. The angiogram confirmed the previous suspicions of Dr. Day, that A.J. has a vascular abnormality known as an Arteriovenous Malformation (AVM). -- Arteriovenous malformations (AVM's) are masses of abnormal blood vessels which grow in the brain. They consist of a blood vessel "nidus" or nest through which arteries connect directly to veins, instead of through the elaborate collection of very small vessels called capillaries. Some people are born with the nidus, but as the years go by, it tends to enlarge as the great pressure of the arterial vessels can not be handled by the veins that drain out of it. This causes a large collection of worm-like vessels to develop or malform into a mass capable of bleeding at some future time.-- Dr. Day, A.J. and the Price family have decided on a course of treatment known as radiosurgery. Radiosurgery is when a focused beam of radiation is used to start the process of eliminating the malformation and that process then continues over time. The Radiosurgery took place successfully on February 9. It can take a number of months for an AVM to resolve after radiosurgery. For that reason, A.J. will not be participating with the basketball team in practice or games until follow-up studies show resolution of the AVM. A.J. suffered an intracranial hemorrhage on October 4 and was rushed to Hartford Hospital. Price left Hartford Hospital on October 18 and returned to the Storrs campus prior to the start of the UConn regular season.

**NINE HUSKY ALUMS START 2004-05 IN NBA--** UConn was third among Division I schools with a total of nine alums playing at the NBA level to start the 2004-05 season. Kentucky leads the way with 13, Duke has ten, UConn has nine and Arizona, Kansas, North Carolina and UCLA have eight each. The nine former Husky performers for head coach Jim Calhoun to have begun the 2004-05 NBA season on active rosters are: Ray Allen (Seattle), Caron Butler (LA Lakers), Ben Gordon (Chicago), Richard Hamilton (Detroit), Donyell Marshall (Toronto), Kevin Ollie (Philadelphia), Emeka Okafor (Charlotte), Clifford Robinson (Golden State) and Jake Voskuhl (Phoenix). Hamilton became the third Husky alum to capture an NBA Championship ring, with the Pistons in 2003-04. Scott Burrell won a title with the Chicago Bulls in 1998 and Travis Knight earned one in 2000 with the Los Angeles Lakers. Okafor was the NBA Eastern Conference Rookie of the Month for the month of November and December and he and Gordon have been selected to play in the Rookie Challenge Game on February 18 in Denver. Gordon was named the Eastern Conference Rookie of the Month for January. The nine former Husky stars are earning more than \$43 million in 2004-2005.



In the midst of his 19th season at the University of Connecticut, head basketball coach Jim Calhoun, a two-time NCAA National Champion and two-time Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame Finalist, has steadily built UConn basketball into one of the elite major college programs in the nation.

The move toward national prominence for the University of Connecticut basketball program began in May of 1986 when Jim Calhoun was named head coach.

Nineteen years later, UConn Basketball sits atop the college basketball landscape with a pair of NCAA National Championships, an NIT Championship, 14 BIG EAST Conference titles, and annual recognition as one of America's truly outstanding college programs.

For the second consecutive year, Jim Calhoun is a finalist for election to the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. In 2004, Jim Calhoun was also one of 16 finalists for election in the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame, narrowly missing a rare first ballot election. Despite the near miss, Coach Calhoun cemented his place among the all-time collegiate coaching greats and as a future member of the Hall of Fame by leading the Huskies to the 2004 national title. In directing the Huskies to their second NCAA National Championship in the past six seasons, Jim Calhoun became only the second coach to win multiple NCAA titles since the tournament field expanded to 64 teams in 1985.

In his 33rd season as a head coach on the NCAA Division I collegiate level, Jim Calhoun's overall collegiate head coaching record is 700-308 (69.4% winning effort). That includes a 248-137 (64.4%) record in 14 seasons as head coach at Northeastern (MA) University and a 452-171 (72.5%) mark in his 19th season at Connecticut.

In 2003-04, UConn began the season as the consensus No. 1 team in the nation and was one of only two teams to spend the entire season in the top ten en route to the program's second national title. UConn finished the 2003-2004 season with a 33-6 overall record.

Coach Calhoun has reached several milestones during the past two seasons in addition to being a Hall of Fame finalist. On March 2, 2005, UConn defeated Georgetown to make Coach Calhoun the 19th coach in Division I history to reach the 700-win plateau. He also reached 450 wins at UConn in the victory over Notre Dame on February 21. During the 2003-04 season, he notched his 650th career win vs. Sacred Heart and registered his 400th career victory at UConn in the season opener vs. Yale. With the win over Syracuse on February 2, Coach Calhoun passed John Wooden to move into the top 20 on the NCAA All-Time Division I Coaching Wins list and currently stands in 19th place in NCAA history.

En route to its second NCAA title in 2004, UConn advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the 12th time under Coach Calhoun, making the program one of only five schools to advance to national postseason play for the last 17 consecutive seasons.

In his 18 seasons at Connecticut, Jim Calhoun has compiled a stunning 44-13 overall record in national postseason tournament competition (32-9 in NCAA play, 12-4 in NIT play). His 32 NCAA wins at UConn, all achieved in the past 15 years, far outdistances the entire total of four NCAA victories recorded at Connecticut before Coach Calhoun took over the Husky basketball program in the spring of 1986.

Jim Calhoun has led UConn to 12 NCAA bids in the past 15 years. Under Coach Calhoun's direction, UConn has never lost a NCAA First Round game and UConn is a stunning 22-2 in NCAA First and Second Round competition since 1990. The Huskies have earned ten NCAA Sweet 16 berths in the past 15 years, six Elite Eight appearances, two NCAA Final Four trips and two National Championships.

Under Coach Calhoun, UConn has captured a league record 14 BIG EAST Championships, eight regular season crowns and six tournament titles. The Huskies are 27-12 in BIG EAST Tournament play under Calhoun.

Jim Calhoun is the only coach in the history of the BIG EAST Conference to have been named BIG EAST Conference Coach of the Year four times. He earned his first BIG EAST Coach of the Year award in 1989-90 and also won the honor following the 1993-94, 1995-96 and 1997-98 seasons. John Thompson of Georgetown and Lou Carnesecca of St. John's each earned the prestigious honor three times.

In the summer of 2002, Jim Calhoun was selected as a member of the inaugural induction class to the New England Basketball Hall of Fame.

After directing Connecticut to both the 1999 and 2004 NCAA National Championships, Jim Calhoun was honored on separate occasions as the recipient of the Winged Foot Award from the New York Athletic Club, recognizing him as their National Coach of the Year. He also received the prestigious Victor Award as 1998-99 College Basketball National Coach of the Year and was the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District I Coach of the Year.

In October of 2004, Jim Calhoun was named winner of the 2005 "Legends of Coaching Award" from the John R. Wooden Awards Committee. Coach Calhoun will receive the award from the Los Angeles Athletic Club in April of 2005, becoming just the seventh recipient of the prestigious honor. The award honors college coaches who exemplify Coach John Wooden's high standards of coaching success and personal achievements. Previous recipients of the Legends of Coaching Award include: Dean Smith, Mike Krzyzewski and Lute Olson.

Born May 10, 1942 in Braintree, MA, Jim Calhoun and his wife Pat have two sons, James and Jeffrey. James and his wife Jennifer have two daughters, Emily (born 3/5/99) and Katie (born 12/29/00) and a son Samuel Patrick (born 6/8/03). Jeffrey and his wife Amy have two daughters Avery (born 1/26/02) and Reese (born 4/7/03).
