ENTERING THE SEMIFINALS-- The University of Connecticut is the No. 2 seed in the 2005 BIG EAST Tournament and comes off a 66-62 win over Georgetown in the quarterfinals Thursday night. UConn is 22-6 on the regular season and finished 13-3 in BIG EAST regular season play. The Huskies won their last nine league games of the season and have lost only once in the last 11 games.

IN THE BIG EAST TOURNAMENT-- UConn enters the 2005 BIG EAST Tournament Semifinals with a 29-19 all-time mark. The Huskies have won 18 of their last 21 tourney games, 21 of the last 25 BET Games and 23 of their last 28 in the championship. UConn is a six-time BIG EAST Tournament Champion, winning the title in 1990, 1996, 1998, 1999, 2002 and 2004. The Huskies have been the tourney runner-up three times, in 1995, 2000 and 2003. UConn is one of only two teams to play four games in the tournament, turning the trick in 2000. The Huskies are also the only team in league history to win both the Regular Season and Tournament titles in consecutive seasons (1997-98 and 1998-99). UConn is 28-12 under Jim Calhoun in the BIG EAST Tournament.

UConn AS THE NO. 2 SEED-- UConn is playing in the BIG EAST Tournament as a No. 2 seed for the fourth time in its history and third straight season and have a 9-1 record as a No. 2. The Huskies were the

No. 2 seed in the 1990 Tournament and captured its first title that season, beating Seton Hall, Georgetown and Syracuse en route to the championship. In 2003, UConn beat Seton Hall and Syracuse before falling to Pittsburgh in the title game. Last season, the Huskies beat Notre Dame, Villanova and Pittsburgh en route to the tourney title.

UConn vs. SYRACUSE IN THE TOURNEY-- UConn and Syracuse will meet for the ninth time in the BIG EAST Tournament with UConn holding a 5-3 advantage. The teams have met in the semifinals four times, with the Huskies holding a 3-1 advantage, winning the last three semifinal meetings, in 2003, 1999 and 1996. Syracuse beat UConn in the semifinals of the first ever BIG EAST Tournament in 1980.

UConn IN THE SEMIFINALS-- UConn will be making its 12th appearance in the semifinals of the BIG EAST Tournament and has a record of 9-2 in its 11 previous appearances. The Huskies have now advanced to the semifinals in ten of the last 12 tournaments.

UConn IN THE QUARTERFINALS-- With the win over Georgetown Thursday, UConn now has a record of 12-10 in quarterfinal games. The Huskies have won ten straight quarterfinal games, last losing in the quarterfinals in 1993 to Providence.

NOTING THE QUARTER WIN OVER GTOWN-- Marcus Williams recorded ten assists, the second highest for a UConn player in the tourney history. Tate George had 12 in 1987... Rashad Anderson returned to action at the 16:32 mark of the first half after missing seven games with a leg infection... Rudy Gay has now led the Huskies in scoring 20 times this season, leading the team... UConn ended the regular season with wins over Georgetown and Syracuse and will now play Georgetown and Syracuse in succession for the second straight week... UConn shot over 50% from the field for the sixth time in seven games.

15 YEARS AND 15 TITLES-- With its 13-3 league mark and share of the regular season title, UConn captured its 15th BIG EAST Championship in the last 15 years, dating back to March of 1990 and the 1989-90 Regular Season title, the school's first. The Huskies hold the league record for total championships with 15 and passed Syracuse for the most regular season titles with nine. UConn is tied with Georgetown for the most tournament titles with six apiece.

THREE HUSKIES EARN INDIVIDUAL AWARDS-- Three UConn players earned BIG EAST individual major awards at the Grand Hyatt Tuesday. Sophomore Josh Boone became the third Husky in league history to be named the BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year and it marked the third straight year a UConn player took the honor. Emeka Okafor was voted the best defender in the league the past two seasons. Donyell Marshall was the Defensive Player of the Year in 1993-94. Freshman

Rudy Gay shared the BIG EAST Rookie of the Year Award with Jeff Green of Georgetown, becoming the fifth UConn player to earn league rookie honors. He joins Khalid El-Amin (1997-98), Doron Sheffer (1993-94), Nadav Henefeld (1989-90) and Earl Kelley (1982-83). Sophomore Marcus Williams was the third in the trio of Husky award winners, sharing the BIG EAST Most Improved Player Award with Jared Dudley of Boston College. He is the first Husky to ever earn that award from the BIG EAST.

FOUR HUSKIES EARN ALL-BIG EAST HONORS-- Four UConn performers were honored by the league when the All-BIG EAST teams were announced Monday. Sophomores Charlie Villanueva and Josh Boone were each named to the All-BIG EAST Second Team, while sophomore Marcus Williams was an All-BIG EAST Third Team selection. Freshman Rudy Gay is a unanimous member of the BIG EAST All-Rookie team.

UConn IN THE CHAMPIONSHIP GAME-- UConn has appeared in the championship game nine times in its history and has a record of 6-3 in the title game. UConn has appeared in seven title games in the past ten seasons. The Huskies have the third most appearances all-time in the title game, behind Syracuse (11) and Georgetown (10).

JIM CALHOUN IN MARCH-- Connecticut head coach Jim Calhoun has posted an impressive 19-year overall record of 87-34 (71.9%) in the month of March. During his tenure at UConn, Jim Calhoun's record in March is as follows: 15-9 in regular season play, 28-12 in Big East Tournament play, 32-9 in NCAA play, and 12-4 in NIT play.

JIM CALHOUN AT MSG-- Jim Calhoun will be coaching his 62nd game at Madison Square Garden as Connecticut's head basketball coach when the Huskies play Friday in the semifinals. In 19 years as head coach at UConn, Jim Calhoun and his Huskies have recorded an overall record of 39-22 in games played at MSG. UConn and Jim Calhoun have won seven championships at MSG—the 1988 NIT Championship, the 1990 BIG EAST Tournament Championship, the 1996 BIG EAST Tournament Championship, the 1998 BIG EAST Tournament Championship, the 1999 BIG EAST Tournament Championship, 2002 BIG EAST Tournament Championship and the 2004 BIG EAST Tournament Championship. Under coach Calhoun, UConn is 6-7 in 13 regular season games against St. John's University, 28-12 in BIG EAST Tournament games and 5-3 in NIT play in MSG (preseason and postseason NIT).

SCOUTING THE HUSKIES-- UConn is 22-6 on the year and 13-3 in the BIG EAST Conference, having won nine straight league games to capture a share of the regular season title. The Huskies feature five players in double figures, led by junior guard Rashad Anderson, who is averaging a team-leading 13.1 points after missing the final seven games of the regular season. Anderson returned to the court Thursday after fully recovering from an infection in his right leg. Sophomore Charlie Villanueva is averaging 13.0 points, 8.1 boards and 1.9 blocks and has ten double-doubles. He averaged 14.9 points and 9.0 boards in league games, leading the BIG EAST in rebounding. Sophomore center Josh Boone has recorded 11 double-doubles and is averaging 12.8 points and 8.5 rebounds, along with 3.0

blocks. Freshman Rudy Gay is the starter at the small forward spot and is averaging 11.9 points and 5.6 rebounds. Junior Denham Brown is averaging 11.1 points, returning to the starting lineup in the win at West Virginia on January 24 and hitting for nearly 14 points per game since his return to the first five. Sophomore point guard Marcus Williams (9.1 ppg, 8.1 apg) leads the BIG EAST in assists. Junior Hilton Armstrong (3.9 ppg, 3.6 rpg), junior forward Ed Nelson (2.9, 2.1), and freshman guard Antonio Kellogg (3.2 ppg, 2.3 apg) round out the regulars.

PICKING UP THE SLACK-- The Huskies were without leading scorer Rashad Anderson for seven games, but went 6-1 with several players making up the difference in Rashad's absence. Four of the five starters played above their season scoring average, while one is virtually the same. Charlie Villanueva was at 16.7 per game in Anderson's absence, up from 13.1 for the year. Denham Brown (15.6/11.1), Marcus Williams (13.7/8.9) and Rudy Gay (13.9/11.7) were also above their season averages in the seven-game stretch. Josh Boone (12.0/12.9) was slightly below his season average with Anderson out of the lineup.

LEADING THE LEAGUE-- A pair of Huskies led the league statistically over the course of the league game slate. Sophomore Marcus Williams was the runaway league champion in assists, 8.11 overall and 8.38 in league games. Sophomore Charlie Villanueva came on strong in league play to average 9.0 boards per game over the 16-game slate, leading the BIG EAST in rebounding. Sophomore Josh Boone was the overall games rebounding and blocked shot leader entering the BIG EAST Tournament.

WINNING 13 GAMES IN THE LEAGUE-- UConn reached the 13-win mark in BIG EAST play for the seventh time in school history, extending a league standard for single season superiority. Syracuse, Georgetown and St. John's have each won 13 games in a league season four times, while Pittsburgh has done so three times. Boston College and Villanova have reached 13 wins twice, while Seton Hall and Miami have done so once.

WINNING TEN GAMES IN THE LEAGUE-- UConn surpassed the ten-win plateau in the BIG EAST for the 12th time in Jim Calhoun's 19 seasons at Connecticut and the third highest total ever among league coaches. Syracuse has reached the ten-win mark 19 times in 26 seasons under Jim Boheim and Georgetown hit ten wins in league play 13 of 20 seasons under John Thompson.

HITTING 20 WINS AGAIN-- UConn is currently 22-6 on the season, marking the 20th time in his career and 15th time in 19 seasons at UConn that head coach Jim Calhoun has cracked the 20-win mark. This is the eighth straight season that UConn has reached the 20-win mark, extending the longest such streak in school history, and is the 14th time in the last 16 years UConn have won 20 or more times. UConn had compiled eight 20-win seasons in 84 seasons before Coach Calhoun's 1987-88 team went 20-14 and won the NIT.

ANDERSON RETURNS-- Junior Rashad Anderson returned to the lineup in the quarterfinals vs. Georgetown after missing

seven games due to a skin abscess on his right leg and resulting infection. Anderson checked into Windham Hospital on Tuesday, February 8 with the skin abscess in the inner thigh area of his right leg. That infection was drained and he was transferred to Hartford Hospital on Thursday, February 10. Anderson spent time in the intensive care unit after he developed breathing difficulties as a result of the infection, but his condition gradually improved and he was released from the hospital on February 21. Anderson is the leading scorer for the Huskies at 13.8 points per game. Anderson was cleared to return to action on March 8.

A DIFFERENT DENHAM-- Denham Brown is now averaging 11.1 points on the year and has started 18 games overall, including the last 13. A closer look at the numbers shows a vastly different Denham in his games as a starter and his games as a reserve.

As a Starter-- 13.3 pts., 4.7 rebs., 50.0 fg%, 36.2 3fg%

As a Reserve-- 7.1 pts., 2.6 rebs., 28.9 fg%, 21.4 3fg%

MARCUS AMONG THE BEST-- Marcus Williams continues to establish himself in a short period of time as one of the best passers in UConn and BIG EAST annals. He currently **leads the BIG EAST and is No. 3 in the nation** in assists at 8.1 per contest. This season, he has established the UConn single game record for assists twice (16, vs. CCSU and Notre Dame) and the UConn single game BIG EAST record (16 vs. Notre Dame). He has registered double figure assists on six occasions. The 16 assists vs. ND is tied for the third most in BIG EAST history, behind only Sherman Douglas (22) and Dwayne Washington (18) of Syracuse. Williams has 296 career assists in 44 games, an impressive number, especially when put in perspective with some past Husky point guards. Williams reached the 250-assist mark in career game #39, faster than any other Husky in history. Tate George is the second quickest to 250, doing so in his 45th game. By comparison, Doron Sheffer took 48 games to reach 250, Taliek Brown took 52 games, and Khalid El-Amin needed 65 games.

LEADERS OF THE PACK-- UConn has been leading the country in a pair of team categories throughout the course of the season. The Huskies lead the nation in blocked shots and rebound margin. In 2003-04, UConn led the nation in field goal defense, rebound margin and blocked shots.

THE ANNUAL RITUAL CONTINUES-- UConn once again ranks among the national leaders in **field goal percentage defense, marking the eighth time in nine seasons that the Huskies are among the country's best in this category**. This season, UConn is No. 5 in the rankings of Feb. 28 (stats are updated every Tuesday) and is currently holding opponents to 38.0% from the field. UConn finished the year ranked No. 1 last season, holding opponents to 36.9%, the lowest ever for a Jim Calhoun-coached Husky team. UConn's best rankings prior to last season came in 1995-96, finishing No. 4 with a FG% defense of 38.6% and in 2002-03, when the Huskies finished ranked No. 4 in the country at 37.9%.

A HALFTIME LEAD HELPS-- UConn has piled up an impressive mark of 362-38 under Jim Calhoun when leading at

the half. The Huskies are 17-4 this season with a halftime lead and went 27-1 in 2003-04 en route to a national title. Over the past four seasons, UConn is 83-6 in games when taking a lead into halftime.

SOPHOMORE JOSH BOONE-- Sophomore Josh Boone is averaging 12.8 points and 8.5 rebounds for the year, adding 3.0 blocks per game as well. He is an NABC and USBWA All-District First Team pick. He has 11 double-doubles on the year and has scored 20 or more points seven times this season. Josh had 21 points at Rutgers and before that, back-to-back double-doubles, including 16 points, 11 boards and four blocks in the game vs. North Carolina. He put together a 20-point performance in the win at Seton Hall on January 17, hitting on eight-of-eight from the field. He had four straight 20+ -point efforts in the wins over Rice, Central Connecticut, Sacred Heart and Quinnipiac to end the calendar year. Boone's 11 double-doubles in 2004-05 easily surpass his season total of three as a freshman in 2003-04. **Josh leads the BIG EAST in rebounding and field goal percentage.** Boone averaged 5.9 points and 5.8 rebounds a year ago.

BOONE IN THE BLOCKS-- Josh Boone registered nine blocks in the win over St. John's, a career-high for him, and a UConn record-tying performance in BIG EAST play. Emeka Okafor and Clifford Robinson each totaled nine blocks in the league game during their time as a Husky, Okafor on two occasions. The league record for blocks in a game is 12, held by Dikembe Mutombo of Georgetown. **Boone is averaging 3.0 blocks per game, good for No. 7 in the latest national rankings.**

SOPH. CHARLIE VILLANUEVA-- Sophomore Charlie Villanueva is averaging 13.0 points and 8.1 rebounds for the season, including ten double-doubles. He is an NABC All-District Second Team pick. He finished the regular season with 14 rebounds in the win over Syracuse and led the BIG EAST in rebounding at 9.0 in league games. He had 24 points in the win over Georgetown and had 14 points and 13 rebounds in the road win at Pittsburgh. He had 25 points in the win over Notre Dame and was named the BIG EAST Player of the Week on February 21, coming off 21 points and 11 rebounds in the win at Rutgers and a 22-point, ten-rebound effort in the win at Providence. He had 21 points in the win at Syracuse, adding ten rebounds and three steals. Villanueva was listed as a preseason candidate for both the John R. Wooden National Player of the Year award and the Naismith Player of the Year award. Villanueva is also an honorable mention AP All-America. He was a member of the 2003-04 BIG EAST All-Rookie team.

SOPH. MARCUS WILLIAMS-- Sophomore Marcus Williams is the starting point guard and **leads the BIG EAST and the Huskies in assists at 8.1 per contest.** He comes off a 14-point, 10-assist double-double in the BIG EAST quarterfinal win over Georgetown. He finished the regular season with 11 points and ten assists in the win over Syracuse. He had 17 points, 12 assists and nine rebounds in the win over Notre Dame. He had 15 points and 13 assists in the win at Providence and had a career-best 18 points vs. North Carolina. Marcus is

averaging nine assists per game over the last month, including 16 assists in the loss at Notre Dame on January 30, matching his UConn single game record. He had back-to-back then career-high point totals of 16 points at Oklahoma and 11 points at Georgetown. He also had eight assists and seven rebounds at Oklahoma. He had his first career double-double with ten points and ten assists in the win over Quinnipiac. He recorded 16 assists in the win over Central Connecticut, setting the UConn single game record in the process. The previous record of 14 had been achieved three times, by Kevin Ollie (twice, in 1995 and 1993) and by Earl Kelley (in 1985).

WILLIAMS FINDS THE SHOOTING TOUCH TOO-- Marcus Williams may be better known for his passing ability, but in recent weeks he has also displayed a much improved shooting touch from long range. **In the last 13 games, Williams has hit on 53.5% (23-of-43) from three-point range.** He was at 23.5% (4-of-17) after the first 15 games. For the season, Williams is now at 45.0% from three.

FRESHMAN RUDY GAY-- Freshman Rudy Gay moved into the starting lineup for the Rice game on December 19 and is currently fourth on the team in scoring at 11.9 points per game, while grabbing 5.6 rebounds. He has hit for double figures a team-leading 20 times during the year and comes off 17 points in his BIG EAST Tournament debut vs. Georgetown. He finished the regular season with 16 points in 19 minutes against Syracuse and a career-best 20 points in the win over Georgetown. Gay was the BIG EAST Co-Rookie of the Year and a five-time BIG EAST Rookie of the Week (February 28, February 21, February 7, January 3 and December 6).

JUNIOR DENHAM BROWN-- Junior Denham Brown is averaging 11.1 points per game and has made a productive return to the starting lineup in the past 13 games, hitting for 13.7 points per contest. He finished the regular season with a season-high 21 points in the win over Syracuse. He had 16 points in the win at Pittsburgh and back-to-back 18-point efforts in the wins over Notre Dame and at Rutgers. He had his first double-double of the season, scoring 14 points and adding ten rebounds at Providence. Brown has started more games in his career (73) than any current Husky and has reached double figures in 18 games this season. Brown has started 18 games this year.

DENHAM CRACKS 900 AND 100-- With 10 points in the win over Georgetown, Denham Brown now has 911 career points (9.1 per game) and played in his 100th game as a Husky. Brown has started 73 of his 100 games to date and the Huskies have a record of 78-22 in his career, winning two BIG EAST Regular Season titles, one BIG EAST Tournament title and the 2004 NCAA National Championship.

RASHAD NEARS 1,000-- Junior Rashad Anderson has 985 career points and is nearing the 1,000-point plateau for his Husky career. Anderson, who is averaging 13.8 points per game, will look to become the 38th UConn player to crack the 1,000-point barrier when he returns to the Husky lineup. Anderson has come off the bench in his last seven games after starting the first 15 games at the shooting guard spot. He has

hit on 16-of-35 (45.7%) three's over his past seven games after hitting on only 8-of-46 (17.4%) in the previous seven games.

UCONN IN BIG EAST PLAY-- The Huskies have compiled an all-time overall BIG EAST record of 272-194. Under Jim Calhoun, UConn is 234-126 in BIG EAST play and that total places Calhoun third among all-time winningest coaches in league history. Calhoun trails only Jim Boeheim (307) and John Thompson (232).

STILL THE LEADERS OF THE BLOCK-- With the graduation of all-time shot block leader Emeka Okafor, the expectation could have been for the Huskies, who have led the nation in blocked shots as a team for three straight seasons, to fall off the pace a bit. After 28 games in 2004-05, that thought has proven to be way off the mark. UConn has blocked 254 shots (9.1 per game), including a school-record 19 shots in the win over Florida International on November 30 and 17 shots in the win over Quinnipiac on December 30. **UConn also set a new BIG EAST mark with 17 blocks in the win over St. John's.** UConn is the first school in NCAA history to lead the country in blocked shots for three straight seasons and is well on its way to a repeat. The wealth is spread out too, with 11 different players recording at least one block so far. Sophomores Josh Boone (81) and Charlie Villanueva (51), freshman Rudy Gay (50) and junior Hilton Armstrong (35) have led the block party to this point.

PLENTY OF WINS-- Since the start of the 1997-98 season, the Connecticut basketball program has averaged 27.6 victories per season. In that span, UConn has won 216 games and lost only 58, a superb winning percentage of 78.8%.

20 OFF THE BENCH-- Junior Rashad Anderson has connected for 20 points in a game three times this season off the bench, including the wins over Villanova and St. John's, and has now turned the trick six times in his career. A total of ten reserve players in Jim Calhoun's 19 seasons have reached the 20-point mark in a game. The other players in this group are Brian Fair (9 times in his career), Ben Gordon (5 times), Ray Allen (4 times), Johnnie Selvie (4 times), Phil Gamble (3 times), John Gwynn (2 times), Charlie Villanueva (1 time) and Rashamel Jones (1 time).

REBOUNDING RECORDS-- Husky rebounding marks are taking a beating so far this season, as UConn is leading the country and outrebounding opponents by 11.8 boards/game through 28 contests (No. 1 in the country). The Huskies have only been outrebounded in two games this season (Jan. 22 vs. Pittsburgh & Feb. 5 vs. St. John's). UConn grabbed 31 offensive rebounds in the win over Rice, surpassing the previous Jim Calhoun Era-best of 30 it had in the win over Northeastern. In the win over Northeastern, UConn had 74 total boards on the night, also a UConn best under coach Calhoun. The previous high for total rebounds by a Calhoun team was 72, vs. Central Connecticut on December 27, 1991. UConn had twice before grabbed 29 rebounds on offensive end, vs. Seton Hall on March 2, 1996 and vs. Southern Connecticut on December 23, 1989.
