### NCAA Tournament Notables for the University of Connecticut

- ⇒ UConn is a No. 1 seed for the fourth time... The Huskies are 11-2 as a No. 1 seed... UConn has been a No. 1 or No. 2 seed in 10 of 14 appearances under Jim Calhoun.
- ⇒ UConn is 4-3 all-time in the Wachovia Center, all coming against Villanova, and the Huskies are 8-3 under Jim Calhoun in NCAA Tournament play in BIG EAST arenas.
- ⇒ UConn has a record of 23-3 in the 1st and 2nd Rounds under Jim Calhoun and a record of 22-5 in its last seven NCAA appearances (98, 99, 00, 02, 03, 04, 05).

**ENTERING THE TOURNEY--** The Huskies of the University of Connecticut enter the 2006 NCAA Championship as the No. 1 seed in the Washington D.C. Region and have a record of 27-3 overall on the season, finishing 14-2 in BIG EAST regular season play. The Huskies will open play Friday at 7:25 p.m. in a first round contest against the No. 16 seed University at Albany. The Great Danes are the champions of America East and have a record of 21-10 on the year

**UConn in the NCAA Tournament--** UConn has a record of 37-24 in 26 NCAA Tournament appearances. The Huskies have won two National Championships, in 2004 and 1999, in the school's only two NCAA Final Four appearances. The Huskies have reached the NCAA Elite Eight seven times and the Sweet Sixteen 13 times in school history. UConn is 33-10 in the NCAA Tournament in 13 appearances under Jim Calhoun and were 4-14 in 13 appearances in the tourney prior to Calhoun's arrival in Storrs.

**19-4 in LAST SIX NCAA'S--** UConn has registered a 19-4 record in the last six appearances in the NCAA Tournament, dating back to its 6-0 run to the National Title in 1999. UConn reached the NCAA Second Round in 2000, reached the NCAA Elite Eight in 2002, advanced to the Sweet 16 in 2003 and went 6-0 again in 2004 en route to the school's second national title.

**23-3 IN 1st & 2nd RDS UNDER CALHOUN--** The Connecticut basketball program has posted a superb 23-3 record in NCAA First/Second Rounds competition in UConn's 13 tourney appearances under head coach Jim

Calhoun. UConn is a spotless 13-0 in NCAA First Round play under Coach Calhoun. The Huskies are 10-3 in NCAA Second Round matchups.

**27-1 VS. NO. 6-NO. 16--** Connecticut head coach Jim Calhoun has carved out a phenomenal 27-1 NCAA record while at UConn against teams seeded from No. 6 to No. 16 in the tournament field. The only loss came last season to No. 10 NC State in the NCAA second round in Worcester.

**19 STRAIGHT POST-SEASON BIDS--** The Connecticut basketball program is one of only FOUR schools (among 326 NCAA Division I institutions) to have advanced to national post-season tournament competition (NCAA or NIT) in each of the past 18 seasons (dating back to the 1987-88 season). Under the guidance of head coach Jim Calhoun, UConn has earned 13 NCAA bids (1990, 1991, 1992, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005) and five NIT bids (1988, 1989, 1993, 1997, 2001). The four institutions that have advanced to national post-season tournament play for the past 19 consecutive seasons include: Arizona, CONNECTICUT, Oklahoma and Temple.

**UConn VS. THE 2006 NCAA FIELD--** UConn is 12-3 against the 2006 NCAA Tournament during the 2005-06 season. The Huskies were 2-1 vs. Syracuse, 1-1 vs. Villanova, 0-1 vs. Marquette and 1-0 each vs. LSU, West Virginia, Arkansas, Pittsburgh, Indiana, Gonzaga, Seton Hall, Arizona and Georgetown.

**UConn VS. NON-CONFERENCE OPPONENTS--** The Huskies have compiled a 234-46 non-conference record under head coach Jim Calhoun in his 20 seasons. The Huskies have a record of 13-0 vs. non-BIG EAST foes this season.

**NCAA PLAY IN BIG EAST BUILDINGS--** For the 12th game under Jim Calhoun, UConn will take the court in NCAA Tournament competition in an arena that hosts BIG EAST regular season competition. The Huskies are 8-3 in such contests. In 2002, UConn won a pair of games at the MCI Center in Washington (home of Georgetown) and then split a pair of games in the Carrier Dome (home of Syracuse), falling to Maryland in the Elite Eight. In 1998, the Huskies won twice in the MCI Center, beating FDU and Indiana in the first two rounds of the tournament. In 1994, UConn fell to Florida in Miami Arena (home of Miami) in the Sweet 16. In 1990, UConn won a pair of games in the Hartford Civic Center (its own home arena) and then split a pair of contests at the Meadowlands (home of Seton Hall), losing to Duke in the Elite Eight.

**UConn IN PHILLY AND IN WACHOVIA--** UConn will play in Philadelphia in NCAA Tournament competition for the sixth time in the

2006 NCAA Tournament First Round. All five previous contests had taken place at the Palestra and the Huskies are 1-4 in those games. UConn last played in Philly in the NCAA Tournament on March 8, 1965, a 67-61 loss to St. Joseph's. Connecticut has a 4-3 all-time record in the Wachovia Center, with all of those contests coming in the regular season vs. Villanova. The Huskies lost to Villanova at the Wachovia Center this season, 69-64, on February 13. Jim Calhoun coached an NCAA Tournament game in Philadelphia in 1984 while at Northeastern, leading those Huskies past Long Island University, 90-87, in an opening round game on March 13, 1984 at the Palestra. Northeastern then lost in the first round to Virginia Commonwealth, 70-69, on March 16, 1984 at the Meadowlands.

**ROAD WARRIORS--** Since winning the first of its ten BIG EAST regular season titles 16 years ago, UConn has made a habit of taking care of business on the road in league play. The Huskies went 6-2 on the road in the league this season en route to a 14-2 mark and a share of the regular season title. Since the start of the 1989-90 season, UConn is 91-53 on the road in league play. Syracuse is the only other league team over the .500 mark during that span.

**HUSKIES PACE BIG EAST IN NCAA--** During the past 16 years (since the 1990 NCAA Championship), Connecticut has been the "best" of the Big East Conference in NCAA Championship play. UConn has won 33 NCAA games in the span starting with the 1990 tournament and continuing up into the 2005 tournament. Syracuse is second with 24 NCAA wins in that span while Georgetown has 11 NCAA wins followed by St. John's and Seton Hall with nine wins apiece.

**JIM CALHOUN SHINES IN POST-SEASON--** UConn head coach Jim Calhoun enters the 2006 NCAA Championship with a sparkling 76.3% winning percentage in 18 national post-season tournaments while coaching at Connecticut (45-14 overall; 33-10 in NCAA play, 12-4 in NIT play). That post-season winning percentage is higher than Coach Calhoun's overall winning percentage at Connecticut (482-176, 73.3%).

**UConn'S SEEDS UNDER JIM CALHOUN--** Connecticut's No. 1 seed in the Washington D.C. Region bracket of the 2006 NCAA Championship Tournament marks the 14th NCAA bid for UConn in Jim Calhoun's 20 years as head coach of the Huskies. Following are UConn's seedings in each of its 14 NCAA berths since 1990.

**UConn ON CBS--** During the past 17 seasons (since the 1989-90 season), the Connecticut basketball program has been televised nationally by CBS Sports a total of 100 times (52 during the regular season, 43 during the NCAA Championship, five in the Big East Tournament). UConn has compiled an overall record of 66-34 in those 100 games on CBS (33-10 in NCAA play, 3-2 in the Big East

Tournament, 30-22 in regular season play). There were five regular season CBS appearances in 2005-06 for the Huskies. UConn games on CBS this season were: a 67-66 win over LSU on January 7 in Hartford, an 88-80 win at Indiana on February 4, an 81-75 win at West Virginia on February 18, an 89-75 win on February 26 over Villanova in Storrs and an 84-80 win over Louisville on March 4 in Storrs.

**16 TITLES IN 16 YEARS--** With its 14-2 league record this season, UConn captured its 16th BIG EAST Championship in the last 16 years, dating back to the 1989-90 Regular Season title, the school's first. The Huskies extended their league record for total championships, hold the mark for the most regular season titles with ten and are tied with Georgetown for the most tournament titles with six apiece.

**IN THE POLLS--** For the 56th consecutive week (dating back to March 2003), UConn is a part of the National Top 25 rankings. The Huskies were (as of March 13) ranked No. 2 in the Associated Press Top 25 and No. 2 in the ESPN/USA Today Top 25. This is the second longest stretch of consecutive weeks in the polls for the Husky program. UConn was ranked for 77 straight polls from November 1997 through January 2001 and held a spot in the polls for 51 consecutive weeks from December 1993 through March of 1996.

**WHO'S NO. 1?--** UConn was No. 1 in the polls for the 24th week since 1998-99, ranking second only to Duke among Division I schools over that eight-season stretch. Duke has held the top spot for 48 weeks, UConn for 24 weeks, Arizona and Stanford for 16 weeks and

Illinois for 15 weeks. Since 1990, Duke (79 weeks) leads Kansas (32), UConn (25) and North Carolina (25) in No. 1 rankings.

**UConn AS THE NO. 1 TEAM--** During the week of March 6, for the seventh different time and 25th week total, the Huskies held the top position in the national Top 25. The Huskies have played 43 games in their history as the No. 1 team in the nation (25 total weeks), compiling a 36-7 record in those contests. UConn was the top-ranked team for two games in 1994-95 (1-1, 1 week), 17 games in 1998-99 (16-1, 10 weeks), two games in 1999-00 (1-1, 1 week), for 13 games in 2003-04 (11-2, three weeks and five weeks) and seven games this season (7-2, 4 weeks Jan. 23-Feb. 13; 5th week on Mar. 6). Broken down further, UConn is 18-2 at home as No. 1 (9-1 in Gampel, 9-1 in HCC), 15-2 on the road as the top-ranked team and 3-3 on a neutral court (2-3 in MSG, 1-0 at the United Center in Chicago).

**HITTING 25 WINS AGAIN--** With a record of 27-3 entering the NCAA Tournament, UConn and Jim Calhoun have reached the 25-win plateau for the tenth time during his tenure at UConn, all coming in the last 17 seasons. The UConn record for wins in a season had been 23 before Calhoun's 1989-90 squad went 31-6, the first of Coach Calhoun's ten 25-win teams to date.

**HITTING 20 WINS AGAIN--** UConn hit the 20-win plateau with its win over Indiana on February 4. This marks the 21st time in his career and 16th time in 20 seasons at UConn that head coach Jim Calhoun has cracked the 20-win mark. This is the ninth straight season that UConn has reached the 20-win mark, extending the longest such streak in school history, and is the 15th time in the last 17 years UConn has won 20 or more times. UConn had compiled eight 20-win seasons in 84 seasons before Coach Calhoun's 1987-88 team went 20-14 and won the NIT.

**HITTING THE 14-WIN MARK--** With the win over Louisville, UConn reached 14 BIG EAST wins for the sixth time in school history, an astounding number when compared to the rest of the league. Besides the six times UConn has reached 14 league wins, St. John's and Villanova are currently the only schools to reach that win total more than twice in its history, turning the trick three times each. Georgetown has reached 14 wins two times and Seton Hall and Syracuse have won 14 league games one time each. UConn reached at least the 13-win mark in BIG EAST play for the eighth time in school history, extending a league standard for single season superiority. Syracuse, Georgetown and St. John's have each won 13 games in a league season four times, while Pittsburgh and Villanova have done so three times. Boston College reached 13 wins twice, while Seton Hall and Miami have done so once.

**JIM CALHOUN IN MARCH AND BEYOND--** Connecticut head coach Jim Calhoun has posted an impressive 20-year overall record of 90-37 (70.9%) in the months of March and April. During his tenure at UConn, Jim Calhoun's record post-February is as follows: 17-9 in regular season play, 28-14 in Big East Tournament play, 33-10 in NCAA play, and 12-4 in NIT play.

**SUCCESSFUL SENIORS--** The current senior class of four-year Huskies have a record of 106-27 in their four years, winning three BIG EAST Regular Season titles, one BIG EAST Tournament title and the 2004 NCAA National Championship. The three four-year seniors (Rashad Anderson, Hilton Armstrong and Denham Brown) are establishing themselves among the most successful four-year classes in Husky basketball history. The UConn-best record for a four-year class is 114-24 for the 1998-99 senior class of Ricky Moore, Rashamel Jones, Antric Klaiber and E.J. Harrison. **AMONG THE NATIONAL LEADERS--** UConn ranks at the top of the statistical leaders in several categories among the nation's Division I schools. Through games of March 6, the Huskies were No. 1 in the nation in blocked shots, No. 1 in rebound margin, No. 2 in field goal percentage defense, No. 2 in scoring margin and No. 10 in scoring offense.

**THE BLOCK LEADER AGAIN--** UConn is the first school in NCAA history to lead the country in blocked shots for four straight seasons and, as of the national stats through March 6, the Huskies were on track to do so for a fifth year in a row, holding the No. 1 spot in the country once again. Connecticut is averaging 9.33 blocked shots per game, having blocked 280 shots in 30 games. The entire squad is contributing to the effort, with 12 different players recording at least one block. Senior Hilton Armstrong and junior Josh Boone lead the way, with 100 (3.3 bpg) and 66 blocks (2.2 bpg), respectively. Sophomore Rudy Gay is No. 3 on the squad with 48 blocks (1.7 bpg).

Over the past five seasons, UConn has averaged 8.9 blocks in 2004-05, 8.1 blocks in 2003-04, 7.7 blocks in 2002-03 and 6.9 blocks in 2001-02.

**A BIG EAST BLOCKS RECORD--** UConn totaled 19 blocked shots in the win over Notre Dame, breaking a BIG EAST record it had shared with Georgetown in the process. The Huskies had blocked 17 shots in a win over St. John's on February 5, 2005. The Hoyas had 17 rejections against Providence on February 22, 1989. The 19 total blocks also ties the UConn school record. The Huskies blocked 19 shots vs. Florida International on November 30, 2004.

**THE ANNUAL RITUAL CONTINUES--** UConn once again ranks among the national leaders in field goal percentage defense, marking the ninth time in ten seasons that the Huskies are among the country's best in this category. This season, UConn is No. 2 in the rankings of March 6 and is currently holding opponents to 37.3% from the field. The Huskies were ranked No. 3 in the nation in 2004-05 at 37.8%. UConn finished the year ranked No. 1 in 2003-04, holding opponents to 36.9%, the lowest ever for a Jim Calhoun-coached Husky team. UConn's best rankings prior to 2003-04 came in 1995-96, finishing No. 4 with a FG% defense of 38.6% and in 2002-03, when the Huskies finished ranked No. 4 in the country at 37.9%.

**SCOUTING THE HUSKIES--** UConn enters the NCAA Tournament at 27-3 overall and finished 14-2 in the BIG EAST Conference. The Huskies are led in scoring by sophomore **Rudy Gay** at 15.3 points per game. He also averages 6.7 rebounds, 2.2 assists, 1.8 steals and 1.7 blocks per contest. Senior **Rashad Anderson** is No. 2 on the team at 13.2 points per game. He is the all-time UConn leader in three-pointers made and is the nation's leading scorer among players without a start. Junior point guard **Marcus Williams** is averaging 10.7 points and 8.6 assists and has appeared in 19 games, starting 16. He has 61 assists in the last six games. Junior **Josh Boone** is averaging 10.6 points, 7.3 rebounds and 2.2 blocks in the frontcourt. Senior **Hilton Armstrong** is averaging 9.8 points, 6.7 rebounds and 3.3 blocks at the center spot. Senior **Denham Brown** is averaging 10.3 ppg overall, 19.0 in the last four games, and has started 16 games at the shooting guard spot. Freshman power forward **Jeff Adrien** is at 6.5 points and 5.3 rebounds. Freshman **Craig Austrie** has started 24 games at the guard spot and is averaging 3.4 points and 2.7 assists. The Huskies have nine different players who have started at least one game and have had 11 different players reach double figures in scoring this season.

**ARMSTRONG EARNS DEFENSIVE HONOR--** Hilton Armstrong was named the 2005-06 BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year, marking the fourth consecutive year that UConn has received the honor. Armstrong is averaging 9.8 points, 6.7 rebounds and 3.3 blocks (No. 5 in the country) in his senior campaign. He has moved into the top five in school history with his per game and total block (100) numbers, including a career-best nine blocks in the regular season finale against Louisville on March 4. Josh Boone was tabbed the conference Defensive Player of the Year in 2004-05, following back-to-back titles by Emeka Okafor in the 2002-03 and 2003-04

### BREAKING THE TOURNEY STREAK

The Huskies title win in the 2005 EA Sports Maui Invitational ended a lengthy streak. It had been nearly 50 years since the Huskies captured the title at an in-season tournament they did not host. That covered 23 straight trips to one tournament or another without bringing home the title. UConn captured the 1956 Orange Bowl Classic in Miami, defeating Miami, Stanford and Pittsburgh on successive nights.

seasons. Donyell Marshall was UConn's first recipient of the award, garnering the honor in 1993-94, the same year he was named the BIG EAST Player of the Year.

**SIX HUSKIES EARN BIG EAST RECOGNITION--** Six UConn players earned recognition when the league announced its All-BIG EAST teams Monday morning. Sophomore Rudy Gay was a unanimous selection to the All-BIG EAST First Team. He was one of four players to earn unanimous status. Senior Hilton Armstrong and junior Marcus Williams were each named to the All-BIG EAST Second Team. Williams was a third team pick last season. Senior Rashad Anderson and junior Josh Boone each earned All-BIG EAST Honorable Mention selection, while freshman Jeff Adrien rounded out the Husky honorees with his selection to the BIG EAST All-Rookie Team.

**SOPHOMORE RUDY GAY--** Sophomore Rudy Gay is averaging 15.3 points and 6.7 rebounds this season. He has been selected to the USBWA and ESPN.com All-American Second Teams and was a unanimous selection to the All-BIG EAST First Team. He is also a USBWA and NABC First Team All-District pick. He has reached the 20-point mark four times on the season and is also averaging 1.8 steals, 1.7 blocks and 2.2 assists per game. **He is the ONLY player in the country averaging 15+points, 6+rebounds, 2+assists, 1.5+steals and 1.5+blocks per game.** He has been named the BIG EAST Player of the Week twice this season. He has led the team in scoring 12 times, reached double figures 25 times and has six double-doubles on the year. Gay scored a career-best 28 points in the win over Arkansas at the Maui Invitational.

**TWO STEALS, TWO BLOCKS--** Rudy Gay is currently averaging 1.8 steals per game and 1.7 blocks per contest, putting him in rarified air for defensive players at UConn. No Husky has ever averaged 2.0 or more of both steals and blocks in a season, in fact, none has even come nearly as close as Gay is. Cliff Robinson in 1988-89 (1.8 stl., 1.4 blk.), Scott Burrell in 1990-91 (3.6 stl., 1.3 blk.) and Donyell Marshall in 1992-93 (1.4 stl., 2.1 blk.) are the only three Huskies to approach that defensive standard.

**SENIOR HILTON ARMSTRONG--** Senior Hilton Armstrong has emerged over the course of the 2005-06 season as one of the most improved players in the country, averaging 9.8 points, 6.7 rebounds and 3.3 blocks (No. 5 in the nation) in 27.3 minutes of play per game. He is the 2005-06 BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year. He earned selection to the USBWA All-District First Team and the All-BIG EAST and All-NABC Second Teams. Several performances in particular have been critical to the Husky success this season. In the regular season finale vs. Louisville, Armstrong totaled ten points and a career-best nine blocked shots. In the win over Villanova on February 26, Armstrong had nine points and totaled eight blocked shots to help hold

the Wildcats to 33.8% from the field. In the win over Notre Dame, Armstrong had 11 points, nine rebounds and seven blocked shots. He also provided the margin of victory by making both ends of a one-and-one with :46 left in the overtime. He had 15 points (7-of-8 shooting) in the win at West Virginia, five of his buckets coming on dunks. He scored 16 points and grabbed a team-high eight rebounds to key the Husky win on February 4 at Indiana. On January 28 at Providence, Armstrong scored 16 points and grabbed 12 rebounds to help the Huskies hold off the pesky Friars. On January 16 at Syracuse, Armstrong dominated the game despite scoring only two points. He almost single-handedly kept the Orange off the scoreboard, blocking eight shots and altering many others. He proceeded that effort at Syracuse by hitting for 19 points and six blocks vs. Georgetown, totaling 14 points, ten boards and six blocks in the win over Cincinnati and 11 points in the win over LSU, all in the second half. Hilton had a career-best 26 points in the win over Quinnipiac after recording an 11-point, 11-rebound, eight-block effort in the win over Stony Brook. He was named to the All-Tournament team at the Maui Invitational and had five blocked shots in the title game win over Gonzaga.

**SINGLE SEASON BLOCK LEADERS--** Hilton Armstrong is making a mark in 2005-06 on the UConn single season block list. Through 30 games, Armstrong is averaging 3.3 blocks per game (100 in 30 games). That ranks tied for No. 4 in per game average and his total of 100 puts him tied for No. 5 in the single season annals. Emeka Okafor holds the top three spots on the list for total and average, but Armstrong is within reach of Donyell Marshall in the No. 4 spot. Marshall had 111 blocks in 34 games in 1993-94 (3.3 average).

**SENIOR RASHAD ANDERSON--** Senior Rashad Anderson is second on the squad in scoring at 13.2 points per game. He is an All-BIG EAST Honorable Mention selection. He was named the BIG EAST Co-Player of the Week on December 26 (with Kevin Pittsnogle of West Virginia), the fourth weekly BIG EAST honor of his career. Anderson is shooting 41.2% from three-point range (No. 25 in the nation). He currently leads the nation in **scoring among players without a start**.

**THE BEST FROM THREE--** In the game at Villanova on February 13, Rashad Anderson became the all-time career leader for three-pointers made. Anderson has now connected on 265 career three's, surpassing Ben Gordon. He is a member of an exclusive group of only four other Huskies to reach the 200-three-pointer mark in their career. Anderson (265 career 3's) now headlines a group that includes Gordon (246), Chris Smith (242), Richard Hamilton (237) and Ray Allen (233). Anderson has also attempted more three's than any other player in UConn history, hoisting 686 from long range in his career.

**20 OFF THE BENCH--** Rashad Anderson has scored at least 20 points as a reserve in 11 games in his career. A total of ten reserve players in Jim Calhoun's 20 seasons have reached the 20-point mark in a game and Anderson is now alone in the top spot with his 11.

**DOUBLES OFF THE BENCH--** Before being held to five points in the win over Cincinnati on January 9, Rashad Anderson had reached double figures in 11 straight games off the bench, which matched the best such streak in the Jim Calhoun era at UConn. Phil Gamble reached double figures in 11 straight games off the bench in 1987-88. **Anderson has reached double figures 47 times in his career off the bench (including 24 times this year, No. 1 in the nation)**, which ranks second in UConn history. Gwynn hit for double figures 55 times off the bench in his Husky career, while Brian Fair turned the trick 36 times, rounding out the top three.

**JUNIOR MARCUS WILLIAMS--** Junior point guard Marcus Williams is averaging 10.7 points and 8.6 assists in 19 games this season. He was named to the All-BIG EAST Second Team. He has 61 assists in the last six games. He had the sixth triple-double in UConn history, the first-ever for a Husky in BIG EAST play, in the win over Notre Dame. He has reached double figures in 12 games and led the BIG EAST at 8.6 assists per game in league contests. **He has reached double figures in assists in seven games and has handed out nine assists in three other games.** He has six double-doubles. He returned to the Husky squad for the first time in 2005-06 in the game at Marquette on January 3. Williams was suspended by the University for the first semester for violations of the Student Code. He took classes during the semester, but was not permitted to participate in any team-related activities. He returned to practice on December 18 and has been practicing with the team since. Williams led the BIG EAST in assists in 2004-05 at 7.8 per game and was the 2004-05 BIG EAST Co-Most Improved Player.

**THE BEST BIG EAST PASSER--** Marcus Williams has established himself as one the best assist men in the history of the BIG EAST Conference. **His career average of 8.12 assists per league game is No. 1 in league annals**, easily outdistancing Sherman Douglas of Syracuse (6.98 per game, 1985-89). His season averages the past two seasons, each of which led the league, are each among the top six averages in league history. Mark Jackson holds the league mark of 9.38 (1985-86). Douglas averaged 8.81 in 1987-88 and also 8.56 in 1988-89. Williams tied that mark (8.56) this season. Omar Cook of St. John's is No. 5 at 8.44 in 2000-01, while Williams comes in at No. 6 with his 8.38 average in 2004-05.

**SENIOR DENHAM BROWN--** Senior Denham Brown is averaging 10.3 points through his 28 games played and **became the 39th player in UConn history to reach the 1,000-point mark for his career**, doing so in the win over Texas Southern. He comes off 20 points vs. Syracuse preceded by 17 points and 11 rebounds in the regular season finale vs. Louisville and is averaging 19.0 points in the last four games. He moved back into the starting lineup in the win at West Virginia. He was named to the All-Tournament team at the Maui Invitational. He currently has 1,213 career points (9.3 per game) and has played in 131 games as a Husky. Brown is averaging 4.5 rebounds and 1.3 assists in 2005-06. Brown has started 92 of his 131 career games to date.



**JUNIOR JOSH BOONE--** Junior Josh Boone is averaging 10.6 points, 7.3 rebounds and 2.2 blocks in starting 28 of 30 games at the power forward spot. He was an All-BIG EAST Honorable Mention selection. Boone is averaging 12.3 points and 11.3 rebounds over the last three games, including 13 rebounds and three blocked shots in the BIG EAST quarterfinal vs. Syracuse. He had 17 points and 15 boards in the win at South Florida and had 12 points, 14 rebounds and four blocked shots in the win over Notre Dame. He had a team-high 18 points in the win at West Virginia. Boone had a streak of 55 consecutive starts snapped when he came off the bench vs. Morehead State on December 23. He has seven double-doubles on the season and has reached double figures in rebounding a team-leading ten times on the year. Boone was the 2004-05 BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year and is No. 3 all-time at UConn in blocked shots with 219, trailing only Emeka Okafor (441) and Donyell Marshall (245).

**BOONE PASSES 900--** Junior Josh Boone recorded 17 points and 15 rebounds in the win over South Florida and in the process surpassed the 900-point plateau for his career as a Husky. Boone now has 927 points in 99 games, a 9.4 point per game average. He is averaging 10.6 points and 7.3 rebounds this season.

**FRESHMAN JEFF ADRIEN--** Freshman Jeff Adrien is the first Husky off the bench in the frontcourt and is averaging 6.5 points and 5.3 rebounds in 16.5 minutes off the bench. He was named to the BIG EAST All-Rookie Team. He had six points and seven rebounds in the win at South Florida and eight points and nine rebounds in the win over Villanova. He had six points and nine rebounds in the win at West Virginia, all three buckets coming on put-backs on the offensive glass. He had 12 points and eight boards in the win at Seton Hall. He had nine points in the win over Syracuse and he put together a standout performance in the win at Louisville, scoring nine points and grabbing 12 rebounds. He is shooting 59.5% from the field and has reached double figures in scoring six times this year. Adrien missed the game at Providence after being ejected from the game vs. St. John's due to a flagrant/fighting foul.

**FRESHMAN CRAIG AUSTRIE--** Freshman guard Craig Austrie has been solid at the point guard spot for the Huskies, starting 24 games and averaging 3.4 points and 2.7 assists. He had a UConn freshman record 14 assists in the win over Quinnipiac. He was superb in the Maui Invitational, including a 15-point performance in the win over Arizona. Austrie scored 13 of his 15 in the second half and did not miss a shot in the game, hitting all four of his field goals and all six of his free throws. He is the 13th freshman in the Jim Calhoun era at UConn to start the season opener and this marks the fifth time in six seasons that a freshman has cracked the season opening starting line-up. The list of freshmen to start the season opener includes: Josh Boone (03-04), Denham Brown (02-03), Emeka Okafor (01-02), Taliek Brown (00-01), Khalid El-Amin (97-98), Richard Hamilton and Jake Voskuhl (96-97), Doron Sheffer (93-94), Donyell Marshall (91-92), Scott Burrell (89-90), Rod Sellers (88-89) and Tate George (86-87).

**A HALFTIME LEAD HELPS--** UConn has piled up an impressive mark of 388-39 under Jim Calhoun when leading at the half. The Huskies have led at the half in 25 of 30 games this season and have won all 25. Over the past five seasons, UConn is 109-7 in games when taking a lead into halftime.

**BEST STARTS TO A SEASON--** UConn's 22-1 start this season was the third best start in school history. The 1995-96 Huskies started the season 24-1 and the 1998-99 squad began the season at 23-1. After this season's 22-1 start, the 1993-94 team (18-1) and 1991-92 team (16-1) round out the top five best starts in UConn basketball history.

**BEST STARTS IN THE LEAGUE--** UConn's 9-1 start to BIG EAST play ranked fifth in school history on the list of best starts to the conference portion of the schedule. The 1995-96 Huskies set the benchmark by which all league teams will be forever measured, starting the year 14-0 and finishing the season at 17-1 in BIG EAST play. The 1994-95 UConn squad started the year with 13 straight wins and peaked at 15-1 to notch the second best start. In 1998-99, UConn started BIG EAST play with 11 consecutive wins and got to 14-1 and the third best start. The 1993-94 team was 9-0 and then 12-1 to hold the No. 4 spot on the best team BIG EAST starts list.

**PERFECT AT HOME--** Connecticut recorded the fifth perfect home season in school history in 2005-06. UConn finished the year with a perfect 16-0 mark in the friendly confines of Gampel Pavilion (6-0) and the Hartford Civic Center (10-0) this season. The Huskies had compiled a perfect home record four previous times in school history, three under Jim Calhoun. The 1997-98 Huskies finished 17-0 at home, the best mark in school annals. A pair of Husky squads, 1993-94 and 1995-96, each registered a perfect 15-0 mark at home. In 1953-54, Hugh Greer and the Huskies finished 11-0 at home.

**PERFECTION IN HARTFORD--** With the win over Notre Dame on February 21, UConn finished at 10-0 this season in the Hartford Civic Center, the sixth time the Huskies have gone unbeaten in Hartford. The best UConn mark in the Civic Center is 12-0 in 1997-98. The Huskies have compiled a 9-0 mark three times, 2002-03, 1995-96 and 1994-95 and went 8-0 in Hartford in 1993-94. UConn finished 16-0 overall at home this season including its 6-0 mark in the Harry A. Gampel Pavilion in Storrs.

**PERFECT OUT OF THE LEAGUE--** For the third time under head coach Jim Calhoun, UConn completed its regular season non-conference schedule with a perfect record. The Huskies were 13-0 against non-conference competition, completing that slate with the win at Indiana on February 4. UConn was 9-0 in the regular season vs. non-conference foes in 1998-99 and also went 9-0 non-league in 1991-92. The Huskies have a record of 234-46 in non-conference games under Jim Calhoun, 189-32 during the regular season against non-BIG EAST schools.

**UNBEATEN THROUGH 11 GAMES--** For the fourth time in Jim Calhoun's 20 seasons at Connecticut, the Huskies were unbeaten through 11 games of the season. UConn's best start to open a season was 19-0 in 1998-99. The Huskies under Coach Calhoun started 15-0 in 1994-95 and 11-0 in 2005-06 and 1991-92. The 2005-06 Huskies did do something no other UConn team had ever done. This group of Huskies was the first to enter the month of January at 11-0. The 1998-99 squad was 10-0 entering the new calendar year. The 1997-98 team holds the distinction of most wins before January, starting 12-1 in the first two months.

**TEN HUSKY ALUMS ON 2005-06 NBA ROSTERS--** Ten former Husky performers for head coach Jim Calhoun have started the 2005-06 NBA season on active rosters: Ray Allen (Seattle), Caron Butler (Washington), Ben Gordon (Chicago), Richard Hamilton (Detroit), Donyell Marshall (Cleveland), Kevin Ollie (Philadelphia), Emeka Okafor (Charlotte), Clifford Robinson (New Jersey), Charlie Villanueva (Toronto) and Jake Voskuhl (Charlotte). With ten active players, UConn is No. 2 to only Duke's 11 active players. The Huskies are joined by Arizona, Kansas, Kentucky and North Carolina with ten NBA alums. **Clifford Robinson is also a noteworthy active performer, holding down the spot as the longest tenured active NBA player for the 2005-06 season.** Robinson is in his 17th season, topping Gary Payton, who is at 16 seasons.







The Huskies started the game quickly and held a 15-5 lead with 14:32 left to go as Villanueva scored five of UConn's first 15. The Knights then cut the lead to four points making it 17-13, as the went on a mini 8-2 run. That was as close as the would be for the rest of the first half as UConn opened up a 17 point lead, 42-26 in the closing moment on a Villanueva basket. UConn eventually led by 16 at half-time -- 47-31. Central Florida did not go away in the second half and stayed with the Huskies the whole way. The Knights cut the lead to under double digits with 4:44 to play on a basket by Kingsley Edwards to make it 68-60 Huskies. UConn got the lead back to 10-- 72-62 -- on a Villanueva basket with 2:10 to go. Williams made a pair of free throws for UConn with 1:45 to play that made it 74-65 UC but Central Florida then scored four of the game's next five points to cut the lead to four with 11 seconds to play -- the closest the Knights could get. Sophomore guard Rashad Anderson scored 18 of his game-high 22 points in the first half and connected for a career-high six three-point field goals -- again all in the first half -- as the second-seeded University of Connecticut men's basketball team defeated 15th-seeded Vermont by a 70-53 score at HSBC Arena in the first round of the Phoenix Regional of the 2004 NCAA Championship. Vermont, the America East Conference champion, got out to a quick start on the Huskies and scored the first seven points of the game. Anderson kept the Huskies in the game as he scored two three-point field goals in the first five minutes of the contest to make it 7-6, Catamounts. UConn eventually took the lead for good on another Anderson three-pointer with 11:05 to go in the half that made it 17-15, Huskies. Anderson's six treys set a UConn school-record for three-pointers made in an NCAA Tournament contest. Anderson connected on three more treys in the first half and the Huskies led at the intermission by a 37-27 count. UConn led by double digits the entire second half and opened up a 16-point lead, 49-33, with 13:49 left to play. Vermont cut the gap to 51-41 with 11:22 left to play but could get no closer. Three other Husky players joined Anderson in double figures as junior center Emeka Okafor had 15 points and 14 rebounds while senior guard Taliek Brown and junior guard Ben Gordon each added 14. With 4:12 to go in the game, Brown became the 36th player in Husky history to score 1,000 career points.

Juniors Emeka Okafor and Ben Gordon led four players in double-figures as the Connecticut men's basketball team advanced to the Sweet 16 of the 2004 NCAA Championship with a 72-55 romp over DePaul in the Second Round at the HSBC Arena in Buffalo, NY. Okafor notched his 22nd double-double of the season and 51st of his career scoring 10 points and grabbing down 12 rebounds. His 12 boards also propelled him to become UConn's all-time leader in NCAA Tournament play with 99 rebounds in nine games. Gordon scored 18 points on 3-of-7 shooting from three-point range and was 7-for-8 from the free throw line. DePaul missed its eight first shots of the game allowing UConn to jump out to an early 11-0 lead sparked by five points from Taliek Brown. Connecticut held a lead as large as 23 points (35-12) in the late going of the half, but late in the stanza the Blue Demons went on an 8-0 run to bring the score as close as 35-20. Connecticut went on to score the next four points and headed into halftime with a 39-20 advantage. In the first half, the Blue Demons shot only 27 percent from the field on 9-for-33 shooting, while Connecticut was 43 percent on 15-for-33 shooting. UConn's Denham Brown had a productive first half of play scoring nine points on 3-for-3 shooting in only 11 minutes played. The 20 points UConn held DePaul to in the first half was the least points scored by an opponent against the Huskies in NCAA Tournament action since March 11, 1967 when Boston College held a 14-13 edge. Denham Brown scored 12 points and made four of his six attempts from the free throw line. Taliek Brown finished with 13 points and four rebounds for the Huskies.

Junior guard Ben Gordon scored a game-high 20 points and three other Huskies scored in double-figures as the No. 2 seed University of Connecticut men's basketball team trounced Vanderbilt 73-53 in Regional Semifinal action of the NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Championship in Phoenix, Ariz. The Husky defense neutralized Vanderbilt's all-time leading scorer Matt Freije in the first half as the senior forward scored only three points on 1-for-9 shooting including 0-for-4 from behind the arc, and the Huskies built a commanding 45-27 lead at the half. However, the Commodores would not lie down and mounted an 18-7 run, which drew the Commodores to within seven, 52-45, with 12:00 minutes remaining in regulation. Sophomore wing Rashad Anderson answered with a back-breaking 3-pointer just ten seconds later to spark a decisive 8-0 Husky run and Vandy was unable to threaten again. Gordon was one rebound shy of a double-double and also dished out four assists in the victory. Junior All-American Emeka Okafor dropped in 12 points and snared 10 boards for the 23rd double-double of the season and 52nd of his illustrious career. Senior point guard Taliek Brown continued his strong play in the tournament with a 12-point, four-rebound performance. Anderson was a catalyst to the Husky offense once again, as he scored 15 points on 5-of-11 shooting. In a 1:40 second span midway through the first half, Anderson scored eight points as UConn began to distance itself from Vanderbilt. The Huskies led 8-7 with 15:00 remaining in the first half, but charged out to a 25-8 lead at the 9:20 mark on the strength of a 17-1 run. UConn took its largest lead of the half, 45-23, with :50 remaining on a pair of Gordon free throws.

### MARCH 27, 2004 WEST REGIONAL FINAL CONNECTICUT 87, ALABAMA 71 AMERICA WEST ARENA PHOENIX, AZ

Regional Most Valuable Player Ben Gordon scored 36 points and sophomore guard Rashad Anderson added a career-high 28 as the University of Connecticut men's basketball team defeated Alabama by an 87-71 score in the final of the Phoenix Region in the 2004 NCAA Championship as the Huskies advanced to the Final Four in San Antonio. Gordon was named to the all-region team along with Anderson and junior center Emeka Okafor. That team was rounded out by the Alabama duo of Chuck Davis and Kennedy Winston. Anderson was six-of-nine from three-point field goal range in the game as his six treys - five of them in the first half - were a career high. Gordon was four-of-seven from three-point range and tied the UConn career record for three-pointers made, which is currently held by Chris Smith with 242 (1989-92). The first six minutes of the game were evenly played as UConn, the second seed in the region, led by a 10-8 score with 14:04 left to go on a Gordon three-pointer. The Huskies opened up their first double-digit lead of the contest on an Anderson three-pointer that made it 23-13 UConn with 11:27 left in the half. Alabama was the eighth seed in the Phoenix region. UConn dominated the rest of the first half as the Huskies closed with a 15-2 run that made it 53-29 Huskies at halftime - its largest lead of the game at that time. The 53 points were the most that the Crimson Tide had surrendered in a first half all season. Alabama could not put a run together in the second half as UConn led by as many as 25 points in the second stanza.


### APRIL 3, 2004 NATIONAL SEMIFINAL CONNECTICUT 79, DUKE 78 ALAMO DOME SAN ANTONIO, TX

Junior All-America Emeka Okafor scored all 18 of his points after halftime and scored five points in a decisive 12-0 run late in the game to propel the University of Connecticut to a 79-78 victory over Duke in the 2004 NCAA national semifinals before a crowd of 44,417 at the Alamodome. The Huskies trailed 75-67, with 3:28 to play after Duke's Chris Duhon made a pair of free throws and continued to trail by eight as Okafor missed the front end of a one-and-one with 3:15 left to play. UConn then began their game-winning streak as sophomore guard Rashad Anderson made a three-pointer with 2:40 left to play. On Connecticut's next possession, Duhon fouled Gordon, and Gordon responded by connecting on both free throws, to make it 75-72 Duke with 2:07 to go. Okafor then scored five of the Huskies' final seven points of the game including a short jumper with 1:18 to play and then a lay-up with 26.2 seconds to play giving UConn its first lead since midway through the first half. Anderson made two free throws with 11.6 seconds to play, and Okafor iced the win with one of two free throws with 3.2 seconds to play. Anderson finished with 14 points and freshman power forward Josh Boone scored nine points and yanked down a game-high 14 rebounds. The Huskies, who had won their first four tournament games by an average of 17.5 points per contest, again stormed out of the gates quickly. UConn led 15-4 six minutes into the game as freshman forward Charlie Villanueva hit a three-pointer with 15:11 to go and a layup with 14:05 to go to give UConn its biggest lead.


### APRIL 5, 2004 NATIONAL FINAL CONNECTICUT 82, GEORGIA TECH 73 ALAMO DOME SAN ANTONIO, TX

Junior Emeka Okafor scored 24 points and junior guard Ben Gordon added 21 as the University of Connecticut won its second NCAA championship in men's basketball with an 82-73 victory over Georgia Tech before a crowd of 44,468 at the Alamodome. Okafor, named the Final Four's Most Outstanding Player, was dominant inside against the Yellow Jackets making 10 of 17 field goal attempts and yanking 15 rebounds. He was joined on the 2004 NCAA Final Four team by teammates Gordon and sophomore guard Rashad Anderson and by Georgia Tech's Luke Schenscher and Will Bynum. The Huskies steadily built their lead throughout the first half -- outscoring Georgia Tech, 30-14, over the half's final 13 minutes. UConn was able to increase its 41-26 halftime lead to as many as 25, at 58-33, during the second half. UConn continued its pattern of jumping out to quick leads throughout the 2004 NCAA Tournament, leading 9-4 as Anderson and Gordon hit three-pointers just 3:35 into the contest, but Georgia Tech inched back to take their only lead of the game of 12-11 with 13:41 to play before intermission on a basket by Clarence Moore. Okafor scored to give UConn the lead right back less than a minute later and the Huskies never trailed again. Since the NCAA tournament bracket expanded to 64 teams in 1985, Connecticut becomes just the third school - joining Kentucky and Duke - to win multiple championships. The victory gives UConn head coach Jim Calhoun a 35-14 record all-time in NCAA tournament games - including a 32-9 record at UConn.

The victory improves Head Coach Jim Calhoun's record in NCAA first round games to a remarkable 11-0 at UConn and enhances Connecticut's record to 22-9 on the year while BYU finishes the season at 23-9. With the game tied, 26-26, at the half, UConn looked to put BYU away early in the second half. The Huskies scored the first four points of the second half and mounted a 20-6 run capped off by a Ben Gordon three-pointer at the 11:50 mark to take their largest lead of the game at 46-32. The Cougars answered the bell as they held UConn scoreless for the next 4:30 and put together a 9-0 run to shrink the Husky lead to five at 46-41. BYU stepped up the defensive intensity, holding the Huskies without a field goal for 10:43 and crept to within two points, 50-48, with 2:16 left in the contest. Gordon broke the drought with a floater in the lane at the 1:07 mark to put the Huskies up six, and UConn was able to hold on with solid free-throw shooting in the second half making 14-of-18 attempts in the final period. UConn enjoyed an excellent defensive stretch, limiting the Cougars to ten points in the final 8:04 of the first half and the first 3:45 of the second half. UConn's overall defensive effort was decisive, holding BYU to just 11.8% shooting from beyond the arc (2-for-17) and 31.3% for the game (20-for-64).

With the triumph, UConn advances to the Sweet 16 for the ninth time in eleven NCAA Tournament appearances under Head Coach Jim Calhoun and improves to 23-9 on the season while Stanford finishes its season at 24-9. Stanford led at halftime by a 44-40 count and the Huskies took the lead for the first time in the second half when Ben Gordon connected on a three pointer with 16:56 left to play, making it, 49-47, Huskies. Stanford then opened up a three point lead on two different occasions, but the Huskies took the lead for good, 58-56, on Emeka Okafor's jumper with 13:25 remaining. Freeman also grabbed a career-high 15 rebounds. The game, which featured 11 ties and 6 lead changes, was tied at 55 with six minutes remaining before Freeman gave the Huskies the lead for good with two free throws at the 5:29 mark. Gonzaga came as close as one at 63-62 with 36 seconds left on an off balance three-pointer by guard Quentin Hall, but Connecticut scored the final four points to clinch the victory and the Final Four berth. Connecticut managed the victory despite shooting 37% from the field and failing to make a three point shot. Hamilton was named the Region's Most Outstanding Player and was joined by Freeman and Moore on the All-Region Team.

Hamilton was joined in double figures by sophomore Khalid El-Amin, who had 18 points and also dished out six assists. Senior Ricky Moore again proved to be a huge factor defensively, holding vaunted Ohio State guard Scoonie

Penn to just eleven points on 3-13 shooting from the field. UConn never trailed in the second half after holding a slim, one-point halftime lead at 36-35. The Huskies opened the second half with a 15-6 run that created a 51-41 advantage with just under twelve minutes to play. The Buckeyes made a run but were unable to get closer than three the rest of the way. The win set a new single season victory record for the Huskies at 33 and marked the 19th straight time Connecticut has defeated a Jim O'Brien coached-team, dating back to 1988.

### MARCH 29, 1999 NCAA NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP CONNECTICUT 77, DUKE 74 TROPICANA FIELD ST. PETERSBURG, FL

West Region winner Connecticut defeated East Region champs Duke 77-74 in a game that saw 14 ties and eight lead changes to give the Huskies a national championship in the school's first ever visit to the Final Four. The Huskies came back from a halftime deficit for the tenth time during the season without a loss, trailing 39-37 at the intermission in this case. Senior Ricky Moore kept the Huskies in the game during the first half, scoring all 13 of his points in his most explosive offensive half of the season. All American Richard Hamilton and sophomore Khalid El-Amin both picked up the slack in the second half, Hamilton scoring 16 of his game-high 27 points and El-Amin 10 of his 12. The Huskies managed to shoot 52.5% from the field for the game, one of just two teams to top the 50% mark against Duke during the whole year. The stifling UConn defense held the prolific Duke offense to just 41.1% shooting, the lowest mark in the 39-game season for the Blue Devils. The Huskies once again pulled away after facing a 53-53 deadlock, never trailing again after grabbing a 55-53 edge. The Huskies fittingly sealed the victory with a defensive stop by Moore on Duke guard Trajan Langdon, who dribbled the ball off his knee as time expired. The Huskies finished the season with a 34-2 record. Hamilton was named the Most Outstanding Player at the Final Four and was joined on the All-Final-Four team by teammates Khalid El-Amin and Ricky Moore.





### 34th Season Overall

Now in his 20th season as head coach at the University of Connecticut and his 34th year as a collegiate head coach, Jim Calhoun has unquestionably stood the test of time in establishing himself as perhaps the greatest program builder in college basketball history.

Jim Calhoun's coaching success story includes winning two NCAA National Championships (1999, 2004) at Connecticut, passing the elite 700-win plateau, and earning basketball's highest honor, election into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame as a member of the Class of 2005.

The beginning of what has become one of college basketball's greatest coaching achievements—transforming the University of Connecticut into one of the nation's elite programs—was launched in May of 1986 when Jim Calhoun was named head coach.

Twenty years later, UConn Basketball sits atop the college basketball landscape with a pair of NCAA National Championships, an NIT Championship, recognition as the most successful program in the history of the Big East Conference with a record-setting 16 league titles, and annual acknowledgement as one of America's truly outstanding college programs.

In addition, the Connecticut Basketball program is now led by a Hall of Fame coach.

In September of 2005, with some 60 of his former players in attendance, Jim Calhoun's four decade body of work as one of college basketball's greatest coaches was formally rewarded when the UConn coach was enshrined as a coach into the Basketball Hall of Fame.

On March 2, 2005, Jim Calhoun joined an elite club, becoming one of only 19 coaches in NCAA Division I basketball history to reach the 700-win plateau when UConn beat Georgetown, 83-64.

In his 20 seasons at Connecticut, Jim Calhoun has compiled a stunning 45-14 overall record in national postseason tournament competition (33-10 in NCAA play, 12-4 in NIT play). His 33 NCAA wins at UConn, all achieved in the past 16 years, far outdistances the entire total of four NCAA victories recorded at Connecticut before Coach Calhoun took over the Husky basketball program in the spring of 1986.

Jim Calhoun has led UConn to 14 NCAA bids in the past 17 years, including five straight appearances. Under Coach Calhoun's direction, UConn has never lost a NCAA First Round game and UConn is a stunning 23-3 in NCAA First and Second Round competition since 1990. The Huskies have earned ten NCAA Sweet 16 berths in the past 16 years, six Elite Eight appearances, two NCAA Final Four trips and two National Championships.

Under Coach Calhoun, UConn has captured a league record 16 BIG EAST Championships, ten regular season crowns and six tournament titles. The Huskies are 28-14 in BIG EAST Tournament play under Calhoun.

Even before capturing the 2004 NCAA title, Connecticut basketball under head coach Jim Calhoun had achieved a unique "double", winning the 1999 NCAA Division I National Championships as well as the 1988 National Invitation Tournament (NIT) Championship.

Jim Calhoun is the only coach in the history of the BIG EAST Conference to have been named BIG EAST Conference Coach of the Year four times. He earned his first BIG EAST Coach of the Year award in 1989-90 and also won the honor following the 1993-94, 1995-96 and 1997-98 seasons. John Thompson of Georgetown and Lou Carnesecca of St. John's each earned the prestigious honor three times.

Now in his 34th season as a collegiate head coach, Jim Calhoun ranks No. 9 all-time in NCAA career victories with 36 (33-10 at Connecticut, 3-5 at Northeastern). Coach Calhoun is 36-15 in overall NCAA play (with two NCAA titles).

Jim Calhoun's overall career record for national postseason tournament competition is a remarkable 48-19 (36-15 in NCAA play, 12-4 in NIT play). He is coaching in the NCAA Tournament for the 19 time and has coached in the NIT five times (including winning the 1988 NIT title).



# TOM MOORE

**Associate  
Head Coach**

**12th Season  
at UConn**

Tom Moore is in his 12th season on the University of Connecticut basketball staff in the 2005-06 season and was promoted to the position of Associate Head Coach during the fall of 2005.

In his four years on the recruiting trail for the Huskies, Moore has earned a national reputation as a superb recruiter and evaluator of talent. He is annually recognized by leading basketball experts as one of the nation's top assistant coaches and is regularly mentioned as a leading candidate for vacant head coaching positions.

Moore joined the UConn coaching staff prior to the 1994-95 season and in his 12 seasons associated with the Connecticut program, the Huskies have compiled an overall record of 320-84, winning the 2004 and 1999 NCAA Championships, eight BIG EAST regular season titles, five BIG EAST tournament crowns, and have earned 12 straight national postseason tournament bids.


A 1987 Boston University graduate, Moore was the head basketball coach at Worcester State (MA) College for five seasons before coming to UConn. He began his coaching career as assistant coach at Worcester State during the 1987-88 season. He spent the 1988-89 season as assistant coach at Assumption College before becoming the youngest head coach of a collegiate program in New England when, at age 24, he was named the Worcester State head coach prior to the 1989-90 season.

During his five seasons in charge of the Worcester State program, Moore compiled a record of 76-59, the winningest five-year period in the school's history.

In his second year as head coach, his 1990-91 club posted a 16-11 record, the winningest single-season at Worcester State in the previous 14 years. His 1992-93 club was named the region's Most Improved Team by the New England Basketball Coaches Association and that squad earned an ECAC tournament berth. The 1993-94 Worcester State team earned a spot in the NCAA Division III National Tournament. In addition to his role as head coach of basketball, Moore was an Assistant Athletic Director at Worcester State.

Moore, a graduate of St. John's High School in Shrewsbury, MA, has served as secretary-treasurer of the Worcester Coaches Association and has been a frequent lecturer at various summer camps throughout the country.

Born May 12, 1965, Moore and his wife, Eileen, live in Tolland and have three daughters, Elizabeth Rose, Catherine Grace and Caroline Mary.



# GEORGE BLANEY

**Assistant

at UConn**

George Blaney is in his fifth season as a member of the Connecticut basketball staff in the 2005-06 season.

Blaney brings to the Connecticut staff more than 30 years of collegiate coaching experience. He was an All-New England college basketball standout at Holy Cross, scoring 1,012 points in his college career and leading the Crusaders to back-to-back 20-win seasons before graduating in 1961. Blaney was a fourth round selection of the New York Knicks in the 1961 NBA Draft and played during the 1961-62 season with the Knicks.

In the summer of 2003, Blaney was inducted as a member of the New England Basketball Hall of Fame.

Blaney began his coaching career as head coach at Hudson Catholic High School in Jersey City, NJ in 1965. He moved into the college coaching ranks two years later when he was named head coach at Stonehill (MA) College. After two seasons at Stonehill, Blaney spent three years as head coach at Dartmouth College before returning to his alma mater and coaching the Holy Cross program for the next 22 years.

While directing the Holy Cross program, Blaney led the Crusaders to three NCAA tournament berths, five invitations to the NIT, and a 357-276 overall record. Holy Cross posted seven 20-win seasons during Blaney's tenure as head coach.


In 1994, George Blaney joined the BIG EAST Conference and spent three seasons as head coach at Seton Hall. He departed the college coaching ranks to become Vice President of Basketball Operations for the International Basketball League in 1998. He remained in that post for two years before joining the University of Rhode Island as an assistant coach during the 2000-2001 season.

In 30 seasons as a collegiate head coach, Blaney posted an impressive overall record of 459-382.

During his coaching career, Blaney spent 12 years on the Board of Directors of the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and served as the organization's president in 1993-94. He has earned numerous honors including the 1996 Bob Cousy Humanitarian Award; 1994 Eastern Basketball Magazine's Man of the Year; 1990 Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Coach of the Year; 1982 inductee into the Holy Cross Hall of Fame; 1981 inductee into the Hudson County Hall of Fame; 1980 U.S. Olympic Festival coach; 1977 Eastern Coach of the Year; and 1976 Hugh Greer Memorial New England Coach of the Year.

Born November 12, 1939, Blaney and his wife, Maryellen, have two daughters and three sons, along with five grandchildren.





# ANDRE LaFLEUR

## Assistant Coach

### 5th Season at UConn

Andre LaFleur is in his second season as an assistant coach and his fifth year on the UConn Basketball staff in 2005-06. He spent three seasons as the Director of Basketball Operations before moving into the assistant coaching role beginning with the 2004-05 campaign.


LaFleur is a graduate of Northeastern University where he was one of the nation's premier point guards. A native of Los Angeles and a product of Governor Dummer Academy in South Byfield, Mass., he was a prime recruit for then-Northeastern head coach Jim Calhoun in a class that included Wes Fuller and Reggie Lewis.

The impact of that freshman class at Northeastern was instantaneous. The Huskies romped through their conference schedule with a perfect 14-0 mark and an overall record of 27-5. They won the ECAC North Atlantic title and went on to the NCAA Tournament. This pattern continued throughout his career as every year the Huskies won the league crown and went on to the NAAs. From the 1983-84 season through LaFleur's senior year of 1986-87, the team boasted a conference record of 60-6 and an overall record of 102-26. During one stretch, the Huskies won 38 consecutive home games.

LaFleur played 4405 minutes in 128 consecutive games - more minutes and more games than any other Northeastern player, past or present. LaFleur scored 1143 career points, graduating as the 10th all-time leading scorer in NU history and he is a member of the Northeastern Hall of Fame. He registered 89 steals as a senior and 252 for his career, both still Northeastern records. His total of 894 career assists set a new NCAA record in 1988 and he still ranks 12th in NCAA history. As a junior and senior, LaFleur was named All-Conference, while serving as a tri-captain with Fuller and Lewis. As a freshman, he made the conference All-Rookie Team.

LaFleur was a fifth-round draft pick of the Houston Rockets in 1987 and lasted until the team's final cut of the preseason. He then played and coached professionally in Australia and overseas for 11 seasons. After completing his professional career, Andre took a position as School Sports Coordinator for the Sydney City Basketball Association.

Born March 22, 1965, Andre, and his wife Alana reside in Manchester and have two sons, a newborn Adonis and a ten-year-old, Adrian.



# PATRICK SELLERS

## Director of Men's Basketball Operations

### 2nd Season at UConn

Patrick Sellers is in his second season as the Director of Men's Basketball Operations at the University of Connecticut in 2005-06.

Sellers came to Connecticut after spending the 2003-04 season as an assistant coach at the University of Massachusetts, where he served as a recruiter and was instrumental in the development of the UMass frontcourt.

Patrick is the older brother of former Husky standout and team captain Rod Sellers, who played at UConn from 1989-1992.


Sellers moved to UMass from his alma mater, Central Connecticut State University, where he spent four seasons with head coach Howie Dickenman, a former UConn assistant coach. Patrick helped the Blue Devils to NCAA Tournament appearances in 2000 and 2002, winning the Northeast Conference Regular Season and Tournament Championship in both of those seasons. During his time as an assistant coach at Central Connecticut, his responsibilities included recruiting, inside player development, scouting and assisting with on-court practices. He also served as a co-director of the Howie Dickenman Basketball School.

Prior to his time at Central Connecticut State, Sellers served as the head coach at St. Thomas Aquinas High School in New Britain, Conn. His team also made back-to-back appearances in the state playoffs during the 1998 and 1999 seasons. Sellers originally joined the basketball staff at St. Thomas Aquinas in 1994 as the junior varsity coach and an assistant under head coach Jerry DeGregorio.

A 1991 graduate of Central Connecticut State with a bachelor's degree in accounting, Sellers served as the Blue Devils captain during his senior season, and was named East Coast Conference Defensive Player of the Year in 1991. He led the team in rebounding in both his junior and senior seasons, finishing his career with 581 rebounds. He played professionally in Europe in the British Basketball League during the 1992-93 season.






