



Sophomore Rob Garrison




Freshman Curtis Kelly

21st Season at Connecticut 35th Season Overall

As he enters his 21st season as head coach at the University of Connecticut and his 35th year as a collegiate head coach, Jim Calhoun has unquestionably stood the test of time in establishing himself as perhaps the greatest program builder in college basketball history.

Jim Calhoun's coaching success story includes winning two NCAA National Championships (1999, 2004) at Connecticut, passing the elite 700-win plateau, and earning basketball's highest honor, election into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame as a member of the Class of 2005.

The beginning of what has become one of college basketball's greatest coaching achievements—transforming the University of Connecticut into one of the nation's elite programs—was launched in May of 1986 when Jim Calhoun was named head coach.

Twenty years later, UConn Basketball sits atop the college basketball landscape with a pair of NCAA National Championships, an NIT Championship, recognition as the most successful program in the history of the Big East Conference with a record-setting 16 league titles, and annual acknowledgement as one of America's truly outstanding college programs.

In addition, the Connecticut Basketball program is now led by a Hall of Fame coach.

In September of 2005, with some 60 of his former players in attendance, Jim Calhoun's four decade body of work as one of college basketball's greatest coaches was formally rewarded when the UConn coach was enshrined as a coach into the Basketball Hall of Fame.

Commenting on Jim Calhoun's phenomenal story of success at Connecticut, Syracuse coach Jim Boeheim, a fellow Class of 2005 Hall of Fame inductee, said, "Jim Calhoun has done as good a job as has ever been done in college basketball history in taking over a program that was at one level and taking it to a totally different place. A lot of coaches have been able to take good programs or even really good programs and keep them at that level or make them a little better, but Jim Calhoun has done something at Connecticut that I really don't think anybody has ever done any place else."

In April of 2004, Jim Calhoun cemented his place among the all-time collegiate coaching greats and as a future member of the Hall of Fame by leading UConn to the 2004 national title. In directing Connecticut to its second NCAA National Championship in a six-year span, Jim Calhoun became one of only two coaches to win multiple NCAA titles since the tournament field expanded to 64 teams in 1985.

On March 2, 2005, Jim Calhoun joined an elite club, becoming one of only 19 coaches in NCAA Division I basketball history to reach the 700-win plateau when UConn beat Georgetown, 83-64.

Within a six-day period in April 2005, Jim Calhoun was honored with two career awards. On April 4, 2005, the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame introduced Coach Calhoun as a Class of 2005 Hall of Fame enshrinee. On April 9, 2005, Coach Calhoun became just the seventh recipient of the prestigious John R. Wooden "Legends of Coaching Award" presented by the Los Angeles Athletic Club. Previous winners of the award include Hall of Fame coaches Dean Smith, Mike Krzyzewski and Lute Olson.

In 34 seasons as a head coach on the NCAA Division I collegiate level, Jim Calhoun's overall collegiate head coaching record is 733-314 (70.0% winning effort). That includes a 248-137 (64.4%) record in 14 seasons as head coach at Northeastern (MA) University and a 485-177 (73.3%) mark in 20 seasons at Connecticut.

In 2003-04, UConn began the season as the consensus No. 1 team in the nation and was one of only two teams to spend the entire season in the top ten en route to the program's second NCAA National Championship in a brief six-year span.

The exciting run to UConn's second national title also produced the Huskies' sixth Big East Tournament Championship. Connecticut would conclude the season with a final overall record of 33-6, the fifth 30-win season for Jim Calhoun as Connecticut head coach. In the six-game string of victories during the NCAA Tournament, UConn dominated its first four opponents by an average margin of 17.5 points per contest.

At the 2004 "Final Four" in San Antonio, UConn stormed from eight points down with less than three minutes left to upend Duke 79-78 in the national semifinals and the Huskies were in charge from start to finish in the national finals, leading Georgia Tech by as many as 25 before winning the NCAA Championship game 82-73 before 44,468 fans in the Alamodome.

The 2004-2005 UConn season saw one of the finest coaching performances in Jim Calhoun's distinguished career. The Huskies had to replace the No. 2 (Emeka Okafor) and No. 3 (Ben Gordon) selections in the NBA Draft Lottery while also overcoming the loss of the school's all-time assist leader (Talieq Brown). In addition, Coach Calhoun and the Huskies dealt with the adversity of two separate life-threatening illnesses to team members.

Despite those obstacles, Jim Calhoun and the Huskies finished the year 23-

8 while winning the school's ninth Big East Conference regular season title and record-setting 15th overall championship. UConn ended the season ranked in the National Top 20 for the 10th time in the past 12 years and advanced to national postseason tournament play for the 18th consecutive season, one of only four schools in the country to do so.

In 2005-06, Jim Calhoun led Connecticut to a sixth 30-win season (30-4 overall). UConn would earn its tenth BIG EAST Conference Regular Season title, advance to the NCAA Elite Eight for the seventh time in the past 17 years, and conclude the college basketball regular season ranked No. 2 in the nation by the Associated Press.

In his 20 seasons at Connecticut, Jim Calhoun has compiled a stunning 48-15 overall record in national postseason tournament competition (36-11 in NCAA play, 12-4 in NIT play). His 36 NCAA wins at UConn, all achieved in the past 17 years, far outdistances the entire total of four NCAA victories recorded at Connecticut before Coach Calhoun took over the Husky basketball program in the spring of 1986.

Jim Calhoun has led UConn to 14 NCAA bids in the past 17 years. Under Coach Calhoun's direction, UConn has never lost a NCAA First Round



game and UConn is a stunning 25-3 in NCAA First and Second Round competition since 1990. The Huskies have earned 11 NCAA Sweet 16 berths in the past 17 years, seven Elite Eight appearances, two NCAA Final Four trips and two National Championships.

Under Coach Calhoun, UConn has captured a league record 16 BIG EAST Championships, ten regular season crowns and six tournament titles. The Huskies are 28-14 in BIG EAST Tournament play under Calhoun.

Even before capturing the 2004 NCAA title, Connecticut basketball under head coach Jim Calhoun had achieved a unique "double", winning the 1999 NCAA Division I National Championships as well as the 1988 National Invitation Tournament (NIT) Championship.

On March 29, 1999, Coach Calhoun capped his remarkable transformation of the Connecticut basketball program when UConn won the 1999 NCAA Division I National Championship, beating heavily-favored Duke 77-74 in the title game at Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg, Florida.

The 1999 NCAA Championship completed a clean sweep in 1998-99 for the Huskies. UConn won both the regular season and tournament titles in the BIG EAST Conference. The Huskies were the No. 1 seed in the West Region of the NCAA Tournament and Connecticut ran off six straight NCAA victories to finish the year with a single-season school record 34 wins and claim the national championship.

UConn finished the 1998-99 season ranked No. 1 in the nation in the final USA Today/ESPN Top 25 poll and the Huskies repeated that No. 1 national ranking after

winning their second national championship at the conclusion of the 2003-2004 season.

Eleven years before winning the 1999 NCAA Championship, Jim Calhoun brought his first national title home to the Storrs campus as his Huskies claimed the 51st annual NIT title in March of 1988, beating Ohio State 72-67 in the championship game at Madison Square Garden. That initial championship took place in Jim Calhoun's second season as head coach at Connecticut.

When he arrived at Connecticut as the 17th head coach of men's basketball on May 15, 1986, Jim Calhoun immediately began to chart a new course for success. He promised to "do it the right way, with no short cuts". He noted he wanted to establish a program at UConn that would annually be called one of the top programs in the nation.

Mission accomplished.

One collegiate basketball writer, authoring an article on Connecticut basketball for a national publication, said it best when he noted, "Bringing the UConn program to this point from where it was when he took over is nothing short of miraculous".

Jim Calhoun has registered numerous note-worthy achievements during his 20 years in charge of the basketball program at Connecticut.

In passing the 700-win plateau during the 2004-05 season, Jim Calhoun maintained his status as the winningest Division I coach in New England college basketball history. Coach Calhoun is also the winningest coach in both University of Connecticut (485 wins) and Northeastern University (248) history.

During the 2002-03 season, Jim Calhoun became only the third coach in BIG EAST history to reach the 200 victory plateau and his record in BIG EAST games is 248-130, second only to Jim Boeheim in the league's history.

Following the 2002-03 season, Jim Calhoun received the prestigious Metropolitan Award from the National Basketball Coaches Association (NABC). The award was presented at the NABC Convention at the 2003 NCAA Final Four in New Orleans. The award is given annually by the NABC on behalf of the National Invitation Tournament and the Metropolitan Intercollegiate Basketball Association and is presented for continued outstanding service for the advancement and betterment of college basketball. Previous winners of the award include Mike Tranchese, John Thompson, Dean Smith, Lou Carnesecca, Dave Gavitt, John Wooden, Adolph Rupp, Joe Lapchick and Phog Allen.

Jim Calhoun is the only coach in the history of the BIG EAST Conference to have been named BIG EAST Conference Coach of the Year four times. He earned his first BIG EAST Coach of the Year award in 1989-90 and also won the honor following the 1993-94, 1995-96 and 1997-98 seasons. John Thompson of Georgetown and Lou Carnesecca of St. John's each earned the prestigious honor three times.

In the summer of 2002, Jim Calhoun was selected as a member of the inaugural induction class to the New England Basketball Hall of Fame.

After directing Connecticut to both the 1999 and 2004 NCAA National Championships, Jim Calhoun was honored on separate occasions as the recipient of the Winged Foot Award from the New York Athletic Club, recognizing him as their National Coach of the Year. He also received the prestigious Victor Award as 1998-99 College Basketball National Coach of the Year and was the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District I Coach of the Year.

In March of 1990, at the conclusion of only his fourth season as head coach of the Huskies, Jim Calhoun was the consensus choice as the 1989-90 College Basketball National Coach of the Year. He guided UConn to a 31-6 overall record as the Huskies won both the BIG EAST regular season and tournament titles and advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight. He was named National Coach of the Year by five different organizations (Associated Press, United Press International, The Sporting News, CBS-TV Sports, Basketball Weekly).

As he enters the 2006-07 season, his 35th as a collegiate head coach, Jim Calhoun ranks No. 9 all-time in NCAA career victories with 39 (36-11 at Connecticut, 3-5 at Northeastern). Coach Calhoun is 39-16 in overall NCAA play (with two NCAA titles).

Jim Calhoun's overall career record for national postseason tournament competition is a remarkable 51-20 (39-16 in NCAA play, 12-4 in NIT play). He has coached in the NCAA Tournament 19 times and in the NIT five times (including winning the 1988 NIT title).

Much like his success at Connecticut, Jim Calhoun's performance as head coach at Northeastern (MA) University in Boston for 14 seasons was nothing short of sensational. He developed a program from Division II status to a nationally-recognized squad which became a perennial NCAA Division I tournament team. At NU, Jim Calhoun won 20 or more games in five of his last six seasons, chalked up a brilliant 135-47 record during that span, and earned five NCAA Division I tournament berths.

His final three years at Northeastern resulted in NCAA automatic bids each season and a three-year mark of 75-19.

At Northeastern, Jim Calhoun's teams averaged 17.9 wins per season. He was a three-time New England "Coach of the Year" and a three-time Kodak District I "Coach of the Year".

In leaving Northeastern in 1986, Coach Calhoun left perhaps the most talented team in the school's history, along with a first round NBA draft pick in senior Reggie Lewis, who later became captain of the Boston Celtics before his untimely death during the summer of 1993.

As was the case at Northeastern, Jim Calhoun's success at producing top-flight collegiate stars, who also excel at the professional basketball level, is an annual happening at Connecticut. A total of 24 former UConn stars that played for Coach Calhoun have been part of the National Basketball Association (NBA). They include: Clifford Robinson (New Jersey Nets/Golden State Warriors/Detroit Pistons/Phoenix Suns/Portland Trail Blazers), Tate George (New Jersey Nets), Chris Smith (Minnesota Timberwolves), Scott Burrell (New Jersey Nets/Chicago Bulls/Charlotte Hornets), Donyell Marshall (Cleveland Cavaliers/Toronto Raptors/Chicago Bulls/Utah Jazz/Golden State Warriors), Donny Marshall (New Jersey Nets/Cleveland Cavaliers), Kevin Ollie (Philadelphia 76ers/Cleveland Cavaliers/Seattle Sonics/Milwaukee Bucks/Indiana Pacers/Chicago Bulls/New Jersey Nets/Orlando Magic/Sacramento Kings/Dallas Mavericks), Ray Allen (Seattle Sonics/Milwaukee Bucks), Travis Knight (New York Knicks/Boston Celtics/Los Angeles Lakers), Doron Sheffer (Los Angeles Clippers), Richard Hamilton (Detroit Pistons/Washington Wizards), Khalid El-Amin (Chicago Bulls/Dallas Mavericks/Miami Heat), Jake Voskuhl (Charlotte Bobcats/Phoenix Suns/Chicago Bulls), Kevin Freeman (New Jersey Nets), Ricky Moore (Charlotte Hornets/Detroit Pistons), Caron Butler (Washington Wizards/Los Angeles Lakers/Miami Heat), Emeke Okafor (Charlotte Bobcats), Ben Gordon (Chicago Bulls), Charlie Villanueva (Milwaukee Bucks/Toronto Raptors), Hilton Armstrong (New Orleans/Oklahoma City Hornets), Josh Boone (New Jersey Nets), Denham Brown (Seattle Sonics), Rudy Gay (Memphis Grizzlies) and Marcus Williams (New Jersey Nets).

Fifteen of those 24 Connecticut stars are listed on NBA rosters in 2006-07 and three UConn players have been members of NBA Championship teams (Scott Burrell with the Chicago Bulls in 1998, Travis Knight with the Los Angeles Lakers in 2000, Richard Hamilton with the Detroit Pistons in 2004).

A former All-New England player at American International College in Springfield, MA, Jim Calhoun graduated from AIC in 1968 with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Sociology. At AIC, he lettered three years while leading the Yellow Jacket basketball team in scoring as a junior and senior. He captained his alma mater in his senior year and left the school as the fourth all-time leading scorer along with helping the school earn an NCAA Division II playoff berth. He is a member of the AIC Athletic Hall of Fame and in the summer of 1994 earned the prestigious distinction of being elected to serve as a member of the American International College Board of Trustees. In the spring of 2000, Jim Calhoun served as the main commencement speaker at AIC's 115th graduation exercises and received an honorary degree from his alma mater.

Jim Calhoun began his coaching career at AIC, serving as an assistant basketball coach from 1966-68. After one year as head coach of basketball at Old Lyme High School in Connecticut, and one year as head coach of Westport High School in Westport, MA, Jim Calhoun moved on to become head coach at Dedham High School in Massachusetts. He quickly rebuilt the program, fashioning a 21-1 record in 1971-72 and seeing his club advance to the State Division I semi-finals.

In October of 1972, he moved into the collegiate coaching ranks at Northeastern University in Boston. In the years to follow, the Northeastern Huskies would dominate the ECAC North Atlantic Conference under his guidance. Northeastern won the league's regular season championship four times and shared the top spot two other times in seven years of conference play. NU also won five of the seven league tournaments and Coach Calhoun's record against conference competition in his career at NU was 74-13. While at Northeastern, he was inducted into the NU Sports Hall of Fame.

In addition to his busy schedule as head coach of the Connecticut basketball program, Jim Calhoun and his family are heavily involved in a number of regional and national charitable and educational efforts.

In November of 1998, Jim Calhoun and his wife Pat began a wide-ranging commitment to the cardiology program at the University of Connecticut Health Center, establishing the Calhoun Cardiology Research Fund with a \$125,000 gift. In 1999, the Jim Calhoun Celebrity Classic Golf Tournament was launched and during the past seven years more than \$2.5 million has been raised in support of the Jim and Pat Calhoun Cardiology Research Endowment Fund.

In recognition of the dedication and commitment of Jim Calhoun and his family to cardiology research, the entire cardiology program at the University of Connecticut Health Center has been named the "Pat and Jim Calhoun Cardiology Center". A formal naming ceremony recognizing the on-going work of the Calhoun family was held in the spring of 2004.

Since 1999, the Jim Calhoun Holiday Food Drive has supported food assistance agencies that serve the State of Connecticut. Nearly \$1 million has been raised to help families in need throughout Connecticut and the food drive culminates each year with Jim Calhoun, his family, and his players personally delivering meals to hundreds of families in the Hartford area.

In both 2003 and 2004, Jim Calhoun served as celebrity host of Coaches versus Cancer events called "Hoops For Hope". The black-tie galas raised in excess of \$400,000 for the American Cancer Society.

For the past 13 years, Jim Calhoun has served as Honorary Chairman of the Juvenile Diabetes Foundation, helping generate in excess of \$4.5 million to fund diabetes research.

Jim and Pat Calhoun have a long-standing involvement with the Franciscan Life Center, counseling and education center operated in Meriden, CT by the Franciscan Sisters of the Eucharist. The Calhoun family has been involved annually in fund-raising activities by the Franciscan Sisters. Jim Calhoun has been honored with the "Saint Francis Award" for his dedication to Christian values and outstanding athletic achievements and in 1998 the

Franciscan Sisters dedicated an outdoor basketball area, "Calhoun's Court", in honor of the UConn head coach at the Franciscan Life Center in Meriden.

Coach Calhoun has also served as an Honorary Chairperson/Director for several other charitable programs including the Ronald McDonald House Kids Classic Golf Tournament, the Ray of Hope Foundation Golf Tournament, the Connecticut Children's Medical Center and Children's Miracle Network, and the "Character Counts" program in the state of Connecticut.

In 2004, Jim Calhoun was the first recipient of an award by the Swim Across The Sound Prostate Cancer Institute and he now serves as the Honorary Chairman for that group's fund-raising efforts.

In October of 2005, the University of Connecticut Alumni Association recognized Jim Calhoun's two decades of outstanding contributions at UConn by honoring Coach Calhoun with its "Honorary Alumni Award".

In the fall of 1999, Jim Calhoun completed work on a book. "Dare To Dream-Connecticut Basketball's Remarkable March To The National Championship" is a first person account by Coach Calhoun of his life as a college coach with specific focus on the 1998-99 season. Working with Coach Calhoun on the book was Leigh Montville, a former senior writer at Sports Illustrated and a UConn graduate.


A graduate of Braintree (MA) High School, Jim Calhoun was a three-sport letter winner in football, basketball and baseball. As a senior captain, he earned All-Bay State League honors in football and basketball. His hometown of Braintree has bestowed a singular honor on Coach Calhoun, naming outdoor basketball courts in a city facility "Calhoun Park". He continues to return to Braintree to speak and conduct basketball clinics for area youths.

Tom Moore is in his 13th season on the University of Connecticut basketball staff in the 2006-07 season and was promoted to the position of Associate Head Coach during the fall of 2005.

In his five-plus years on the recruiting trail for the Huskies, Moore has earned a national reputation as a superb recruiter and evaluator of talent. He is annually recognized by leading basketball experts as one of the nation's top assistant coaches and is regularly mentioned as a leading candidate for vacant head coaching positions.

Moore joined the UConn coaching staff prior to the 1994-95 season and in his 12 seasons associated with the Connecticut program, the Huskies have compiled an overall record of 323-85, winning the 2004 and 1999 NCAA Championships, eight BIG EAST regular season titles, five BIG EAST tournament crowns, and have earned 12 straight national postseason tournament bids.

A 1987 Boston University graduate, Moore was the head basketball coach at Worcester State (MA) College for five seasons before coming to UConn. He began his coaching career as assistant coach at Worcester State during the 1987-88 season. He spent the 1988-89 season as assistant coach at Assumption College before becoming the youngest head coach of a collegiate program in New England when, at age 24, he was named the Worcester State head coach prior to the 1989-90 season.

During his five seasons in charge of the Worcester State program, Moore compiled a record of 76-59, the winningest five-year period in the school's history.


In his second year as head coach, his 1990-91 club posted a 16-11 record, the winningest single-season at Worcester State in the previous 14 years. His 1992-93 club was named the region's Most Improved Team by the New England Basketball Coaches Association and that squad earned an ECAC tournament berth. The 1993-94 Worcester State team earned a spot in the NCAA Division III National Tournament. In addition to his role as head coach of basketball, Moore was an Assistant Athletic Director at Worcester State.

Moore, a graduate of St. John's High School in Shrewsbury, MA, has served as secretary-treasurer of the Worcester Coaches Association and has been a frequent lecturer at various summer camps throughout the country.



George Blaney was a fourth round selection of the New York Knicks in the 1961 NBA Draft and played during the 1961-62 season with the Knicks.

George Blaney is in his sixth season as a member of the Connecticut basketball staff in the 2006-07 season.

Blaney brings to the Connecticut staff more than 30 years of coaching experience. He was an All-New England college basketball standout at Holy Cross, scoring 1,012 points in his college career and leading the Crusaders to back-to-back 20-win seasons before graduating in 1961. Blaney was a fourth round selection of the New York Knicks in the 1961 NBA Draft and played during the 1961-62 season with the Knicks.

In the summer of 2003, Blaney was inducted as a member of the New England Basketball Hall of Fame.

Blaney began his coaching career as head coach at Hudson Catholic High School in Jersey City, NJ in 1965. He moved into the college coaching ranks two years later when he was named head coach at Stonehill (MA) College. After two seasons at Stonehill, Blaney spent three years as head coach at Dartmouth College before returning to his alma mater and coaching the Holy Cross program for the next 22 years.

While directing the Holy Cross program, Blaney led the Crusaders to three NCAA tournament berths, five invitations to the NIT, and a 357-276 overall record. Holy Cross posted seven 20-win seasons during Blaney's tenure as head coach.

In 1994, George Blaney joined the BIG EAST Conference and spent three seasons as head coach at Seton Hall. He departed the college coaching ranks to become Vice President of Basketball Operations for the International Basketball League in 1998. He remained in that post for two years before joining the University of Rhode Island as an assistant coach during the 2000-2001 season.

In 30 seasons as a collegiate head coach, Blaney posted an impressive overall record of 459-382.

During his coaching career, Blaney spent 12 years on the Board of Directors of the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and served as the organization's president in 1993-94. He has earned numerous honors including the 1996 Bob Cousy Humanitarian Award; 1994 Eastern Basketball Magazine's Man of the Year; 1990 Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference Coach of the Year; 1982 inductee into the Holy Cross Hall of Fame; 1981 inductee into the Hudson County Hall of Fame; 1980 U.S. Olympic Festival coach; 1977 Eastern Coach of the Year; and 1976 Hugh Greer Memorial New England Coach of the Year.

Born November 12, 1939, Blaney and his wife, Maryellen, have two daughters and three sons, along with five grandchildren.






Andre LaFleur was a prime recruit for then-Northeastern head coach Jim Calhoun and played for Coach Calhoun for three seasons.

Andre LaFleur is in his third season as an assistant coach and his sixth year on the UConn Basketball staff in 2006-07. He spent three seasons as the Director of Basketball Operations before moving into the assistant coaching role beginning with the 2004-05 campaign.

LaFleur is a graduate of Northeastern University where he was one of the nation's premier point guards. A native of Los Angeles and a product of Governor Dummer Academy in South Byfield, Mass., he was a prime recruit for then-Northeastern head coach Jim Calhoun in a class that included Wes Fuller and Reggie Lewis.

The impact of that freshman class at Northeastern was instantaneous. The Huskies romped through their conference schedule with a perfect 14-0 mark and an overall record of 27-5. They won the ECAC North Atlantic title and went on to the NCAA Tournament. This pattern continued throughout his career as every year the Huskies won the league crown and went on to the NAAs. From the 1983-84 season through LaFleur's senior year of 1986-87, the team boasted a conference record of 60-6 and an overall record of 102-26. During one stretch, the Huskies won 38 consecutive home games.



LaFleur played 4405 minutes in 128 consecutive games - more minutes and more games than any other Northeastern player, past or present. LaFleur scored 1143 career points, graduating as the 10th all-time leading scorer in NU history and he is a member of the Northeastern Hall of Fame. He registered 89 steals as a senior and 252 for his career, both still Northeastern records. His total of 894 career assists set a new NCAA record in 1988 and he still ranks 12th in NCAA history. As a junior and senior, LaFleur was named All-Conference, while serving as a tri-captain with Fuller and Lewis. As a freshman, he made the conference All-Rookie Team.

LaFleur was a fifth-round draft pick of the Houston Rockets in 1987 and lasted until the team's final cut of the preseason. He then played and coached professionally in Australia and overseas for 11 seasons. After completing his professional career, Andre took a position as School Sports Coordinator for the Sydney City Basketball Association.

Born March 22, 1965, Andre, and his wife Alana reside in Manchester and have two sons, Adonis and Adrian.

Patrick Sellers is in his third season as the Director of Men's Basketball Operations at the University of Connecticut in 2006-07. Sellers came to Connecticut after spending the 2003-04 season as an assistant coach at the University of Massachusetts, where he served as a recruiter and was instrumental in the development of the UMass frontcourt.

Patrick is the older brother of former Husky standout and team captain Rod Sellers, who played at UConn from 1989-1992.

Sellers moved to UMass from his alma mater, Central Connecticut State University, where he spent four seasons with head coach Howie Dickenman, a former UConn assistant coach. Patrick helped the Blue Devils to NCAA Tournament appearances in 2000 and 2002, winning the Northeast Conference Regular Season and Tournament Championship in both of those seasons. During his time as an assistant coach at Central Connecticut, his responsibilities included recruiting, inside player development, scouting and assisting with on-court practices. He also served as a co-director of the Howie Dickenman Basketball School.

Prior to his time at Central Connecticut State, Sellers served as the head coach at St. Thomas Aquinas High School in New Britain, Conn. In his first season as the varsity head coach in 1998, Sellers led the Saints to a Northwest Conference Championship. His team also made back-to-back appearances in the state playoffs during the 1998 and 1999 seasons. Sellers originally joined the basketball staff at St. Thomas Aquinas in 1994 as the junior varsity coach and an assistant under head coach Jerry DeGregorio.

A 1991 graduate of Central Connecticut State with a bachelor's degree in accounting, Sellers served as the Blue Devils captain during his senior season, and was named East Coast Conference Defensive Player of the Year in 1991. He led the team in rebounding in both his junior and senior seasons, finishing his career with 581 rebounds. He played professionally in Europe in the British Basketball League during the 1992-93 season.



The 2005-06 University of Connecticut men's basketball team finished the season with an overall record of 30-4 and a national ranking of No. 2 in the Final Associated Press National Top 25 and No. 4 in the Final ESPN/USA Today National Top 25. The Huskies captured a share of the BIG EAST Regular Season Championship, the tenth league title in school history and the 16th overall title (regular season or tournament), both totals extending BIG EAST records that UConn already holds. It also marks the fifth straight season that UConn captured either a regular season or tourney title, extending another league standard in Husky possession.

For the 19th straight season, UConn advanced to national postseason play and compiled a winning record. The Huskies are one of only four teams to advance to postseason consecutively in that span, and are among a group of only seven schools with a winning record streak as long as 19 seasons. UConn made its 11th trip to the NCAA Sweet 16 under head coach Jim Calhoun and the Huskies advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight for the seventh time under Calhoun.

Off the court issues would impact the roster and line-up for the early portion of the schedule. Junior Marcus Williams and freshman A.J. Price were both suspended by the University for violations of the University Student Code of Conduct. Both individuals were suspended from any involvement with the program, Williams for the first semester and Price for the entire academic year. Williams would miss the first 11 games of the season due to the suspension and would not be permitted to practice with the squad until December 18. The Huskies would start the year ranked No. 2 in the ESPN/USA Today poll and No. 3 in the AP Poll, but the first two months of the season would be an adjustment without Williams in the lineup.

The season started with a trip to the west coast and a season opening contest at Pepperdine. The game would be a stop-over en route to Hawaii for the EA Sports Maui Invitational. For the Huskies, it was an opportunity to throw their freshman point guards (Craig Austrie and Rob Garrison) into the fire of competition. The match-up with the Waves was a struggle for much of the first 30 minutes. UConn led by as many as 12 in the first half and stretched the lead out to 14 early in the second half. Pepperdine cut the deficit to as little as five points with under 12 minutes to go, but the Huskies responded with a 13-2 run in the final six minutes and registered a 75-56 season opening triumph. Josh Boone (18 pts., 12 reb.) and Rudy Gay (15 pts, 10 reb.) each posted a double-double on the evening.

The field at the Maui Invitational was the strongest in the history of the event and would prove by season's end to feature six NCAA Tournament squads of the seven Division I teams that competed. The opener for the Huskies would be the Razorbacks of Arkansas. Rudy Gay exploded for a career-best 28 points on the night, while Denham Brown added 21 points. The Huskies led throughout the contest, jumping out by as many as 13 points in the first half and as many as 17

points with under 12 minutes to play. Arkansas responded with an 18-4 run to cut the UConn lead to three with just over five minutes to play. The Huskies would finish strong though, as Gay scored eight points and added an assist in the final five minutes to help UConn post a 77-68 win.

The Maui semifinals featured a match-up of two of the sport's winningest coaches in Jim Calhoun and Lute Olson, and UConn and Arizona played a game that was equal to the billing. The contest between the No. 3 Huskies and the No. 9 Wildcats played out much like the first two for UConn. The Huskies led through all of the first half and into the second, enjoying a lead of as much as ten points in the first half. Once again, the lead would shrink, and on this night disappear, but only for a brief moment. Arizona went on a 16-6 run at the start of the second half to take a one-point lead and eventually led by as many as three, 55-52, with 7:14 to play. UConn responded on this occasion with a devastating 15-1 burst to take a 67-56 advantage with 2:47 to go and went on to a 79-70 win and advanced to the title game. Brown was again huge in the victory, scoring 17 points, while Craig Austrie had 15 points in only his third collegiate contest, including six-of-six shooting from the line in the final minute to clinch the win.

Waiting in the championship game were the Bulldogs of Gonzaga, the nation's No. 8-ranked team and the winner of an epic three-overtime struggle with Michigan State the night before, featuring 43 points from All-American Adam Morrison. It was a title game that turned out to be a fitting conclusion to one of the greatest in-season tournaments in the history of college basketball.

The first half featured eight lead changes and two ties. The Huskies led by as many as four and trailed by as many as four, eventually settling for a 33-31 halftime advantage. UConn asserted itself a bit more in the early going of the second half, breaking out to a seven-point advantage in the first seven minutes and eventually leading by as many as eight points, 58-50, on a pair of free throws by Jeff Adrien with 7:19 to play. The 'Zags whittled into the lead, cutting their deficit to three with under two minutes to play and hitting five straight from the free throw line in the final two minutes to eventually tie the score at 63-63 with six seconds to play. The Huskies immediately inbounded the ball and threw it ahead to Denham Brown just on the UConn side of midcourt. He dribbled calmly and quickly to the corner in front of the Husky bench and sank a ten-foot one-hander over Morrison and J.P. Batista with one second remaining to give the Huskies at 65-63 victory. The win was the first for Connecticut in an in-season tournament in nearly 50 years, dating back to the 1956 Orange Bowl Classic. UConn had done so by defeating top ten opponents on back-to-back nights and getting contributions from up-and-down the roster. Denham Brown and Hilton Armstrong each earned a spot on the All-Tournament team as a result of their efforts.

The return home would see the Huskies close out the calendar year with seven straight non-conference opponents, none of which ended up posing much of a threat, but several of which featured a story line of some sort. UConn defeated Army, Texas Southern, UMass, New Hampshire, Morehead State, Stony Brook and Quinnipiac in succession, running its record to 11-0 to end December. In the win over Texas Southern, UConn scored 113 points, the first of three times during the month it would top the century mark. The Huskies also blocked 17 shots in the win over the Bobcats, starting the squad well on its way to once again leading the nation in that category. The win over UMass helped to somewhat erase the memory of last season's last second loss at the hands of the Minutemen. The visit by Morehead State on December 23 was an offensive explosion unlike any the Huskies have ever had on their home court. The 129 points set a school record for points at home and the margin of victory was only two points off the school mark. Rashad Anderson put together the best offensive performance of his career, scoring 33 points and hitting on an astounding 7-of-7 from three-point range. Only Ray Allen and Ben Gordon had ever hit for more three's in a game at UConn and no Husky had ever been perfect on seven or more from long range. Wrapping up the calendar year, the Huskies hosted Stony Brook and former captain and assistant coach Steve Pikiell, who was in his first season as the head coach of the Seawolves. The 2005-06 Huskies became the first UConn squad to enter January with an 11-0 mark, surpassing the 10-0 record of the 1998-99 team.

The month of January brought the return of Marcus Williams and also the beginning of competition in the new BIG EAST Conference. The league slate would start in Milwaukee against one of five new conference members, Marquette. For the Huskies, it would prove to be a night to forget. Steve Novak had a career-night for the Golden Eagles, scoring 41 points and grabbing 16 rebounds. The 41 points was the second highest total by a UConn-BIG EAST opponent and were more than enough to put the first blemish on the Husky record for the season as Marquette took a 94-79 decision.

Bouncing back from the loss at Marquette would not be easy. The next two Husky contests would be played at the Hartford Civic Center, but the nationally-televised contests against LSU and Cincinnati would each prove to be a battle. The Tigers came to town as hard luck losers in four contests on the year, but quickly jumped out to a 14-point first half advantage to put the Huskies and the home crowd on their heels. UConn shot the ball poorly throughout but battled back in the second half behind the strong play of Hilton Armstrong (all 11 points in the second half) and Rudy Gay (19 points and eight boards). In the end, the Huskies had just enough and held on for a 67-66 victory over a LSU team that would eventually show the country just how good a win this had been.

Two nights later, Cincinnati came to town with a 13-2 mark and a road win over the same Marquette team that had handled UConn less than a week earlier. Again, Armstrong was the key for the Huskies. He totaled 14 points, ten boards and six blocked shots and UConn dominated the boards, 52-32, en route to a definitive 70-59 victory over the No. 25-ranked Bearcats.

A win over Georgetown moved the Husky record to 14-1, 2-1 in the league. Next up would be a trip to the Carrier Dome for a showdown with the No. 20-ranked Orange. UConn would leave no doubt

from the opening tip in this one. The Huskies scored the first 12 points of the game and then followed with a 19-0 run to lead by as many as 23 points in the first half. The lead would grow to as many as 24 points in the second half and the Orange battled much of the half just to get the deficit to single digits. They succeeded in the final minute, but the final score of 88-80 was obviously not indicative of the Husky dominance of the first 30 minutes of the contest. Jim Calhoun watched the final four minutes of the contest from the locker room after feeling light-headed and dehydrated near the end of the second half.

UConn then traveled to Freedom Hall for its first ever contest at Louisville. A Freedom Hall-record crowd of 20,091 would see a stellar Husky effort, especially in crunch time. Jeff Adrien was solid off the UConn bench, scoring nine points and grabbing 12 rebounds and getting a big put-back dunk in a game-deciding 10-2 run midway through the second half. Marcus Williams was also solid, registering 15 points on the game and eight points and three assists in the final eight minutes to help hold off the Louisville surge.

The win over Louisville allowed the Huskies to move into the No. 1 spot in the national polls for the sixth time in school history. A home win over St. John's and a road triumph at Providence both followed and setup a showdown with No. 9-ranked Pittsburgh at Gampel Pavilion to finish the month of January. The game was everything that followers of the BIG EAST had come to expect from the top two teams in the league over the past five seasons. The Huskies came out inspired by the on-campus crowd and used 14 first half points by Rudy Gay to take a nine-point halftime lead. The Panthers immediately cut the lead to two points out of the half, riding the back of big man Aaron Gray, who finished the night with 23 points and 12 boards. But in

the end, Gay made the big play. Pitt had cut the lead to one, 72-71, and had the ball with under a minute to play with a chance to take the lead. Instead, Gay stole the ball from Ronald Ramon and went the length of the floor for a layup and was fouled. He made the freebie to put the Huskies up by four, 75-71, and Williams hit 5-of-6 free throws down the stretch to hold off any further comeback by the Panthers.

The month of February brought the final non-conference match-up of the regular season, as the Huskies traveled to Bloomington to take on the No. 22-ranked Hoosiers of Indiana. The Hoosiers came out firing and used a 12-4 run midway through the first half to open up a nine-point advantage. With the deficit still at nine, 31-22, with 6:49 to play in the half, UConn put together an unbelievable stretch of basketball over the next 13 minutes. The Huskies outscored the home squad by a count of 41-12 over that span, turning the deficit into a 20-point lead, 63-43, with 13:50 to play. Rudy Gay led the assault, totaling 19 points and 12 rebounds and paced six Huskies in double figures on the afternoon's 88-80 victory.

Blowout wins over Syracuse and at Seton Hall would run UConn's record to 22-1 overall and 9-1 in the BIG EAST, setting up an ESPN Big Monday showdown at No. 4-ranked Villanova on February 13. The game was played in front of a crowd of 20,859 at the Wachovia Center. That attendance figure set a new record for the largest crowd to see a college basketball game in the state of Pennsylvania. UConn strung together a 15-0 run over the end of the first half and the beginning of the second half to open up a 12-point lead, 45-33. Villanova missed eight straight shots during the Husky run. The Wildcats responded with a 22-4 run over the next seven minutes to retake the lead at 55-49 with 9:19 to play. Villanova made their final seven three-point attempts in the contest, after starting 2-for-12. Villanova led 66-56 with 3:58 to play, but the Huskies rallied to within 67-64 after Marcus Williams hit a short runner in the lane with 31.8 seconds to play. After Villanova's Mike Nardi missed the front-end of a one-and-one, the Huskies had a chance to tie but Ray picked up a loose ball, was fouled and salted away the game with two free throws with 2.2 seconds remaining, giving the Wildcats the 69-64 decision.

UConn would face a tough bounce back with a contest at No. 11-ranked West Virginia. The Mountaineers made eight of their first ten shots in the game and led by a score of 18-13 with 13:40 to go until the

19 STRAIGHT POST-SEASON BIDS

The Connecticut basketball program is one of only FOUR schools (among 326 NCAA Division I institutions) to have advanced to national post-season tournament competition (NCAA or NIT) in each of the past 19 seasons (dating back to the 1987-88 season). break. The Huskies turned it up a notch at both ends, forcing West Virginia to miss 11 of its next 12 attempts and outscoring WVU 13-3 over the next eight minutes to take a 26-21 lead with 5:32 to go until halftime. The Huskies used an 8-0 spurt in the final four minutes to expand the lead to eight, 35-27, with 2:08 to go. The Mountaineers responded with six straight points of their own before a Hilton Armstrong dunk in the final seconds provided the three-point difference heading into the respective locker rooms. The Huskies came out firing to start the second half, hitting its first seven shots and going 10-of-13 from the floor. The Mountaineers matched UConn's pace, hitting an identical 10-of-13 shots to start the period, causing a see-saw battle for much of the first 13 minutes of the second half. The Huskies jumped out to as big as an eight-point lead, 53-45, with 14:31 to play, but West Virginia would not go away, getting the deficit back to one-point, 64-63, with 6:09 to go in the contest. Again, the Huskies responded and this time were able to deliver the knockout blow. The dagger, as it had so many times before, was delivered by Rashad Anderson. A Kevin Pittsnogle three had gotten WVU within three, 75-72, with 1:17 to play. But Anderson calmly took a pass from Marcus Williams in the corner in front of his own bench and buried a three of his own with 54 seconds to go, getting the lead back to six and punctuating a quality road win.

UConn would return home for three of the final four games of the season and started that stretch with a contest against the Irish of Notre Dame. The Huskies seemed to have the game well in hand, leading 58-41 with 15:49 to play in regulation, but Colin Falls scored 12 points in a 25-2 Notre Dame run over nine minutes to put the Irish ahead, 66-60 with 6:54 remaining. The Huskies battled back, however, as Josh Boone hit back-to-back lay-ups to draw UConn to within two, at 69-67. After Rick Cornett put Notre Dame back up four, the Huskies held the Irish without a point over the last 3:43 of regulation. Rudy Gay hit a jumper with 57 seconds to play setting the stage for Marcus Williams, who followed a Gay miss with a good put back with nine seconds to go to knot the contest. Falls' three-pointer at the buzzer was no good. The overtime was a sluggish affair, as each team only made one basket. Gay put UConn ahead 73-71, with 1:41 to go in overtime, but Rob Kurz drilled a three to put the Irish ahead 21 seconds later. Rashad Anderson missed a three-pointer on UConn's next possession, but Armstrong grabbed the rebound and was fouled by Kurz. Armstrong made both free throws, and the Huskies forced two misses and UConn earned the hard-fought 75-74 win. Williams was spectacular throughout the contest, registering season-high totals of 18 points, 13 assists and 10 rebounds. Armstrong had 11 points, nine rebounds and accumulated seven of Connecticut's season-high 19 blocked shots. The 19 rejections tied the school record and set a new standard for blocks in a BIG EAST game.

Next up was another showdown with Villanova, this time in the friendly confines of Gampel Pavilion. Denham Brown set a career-high for scoring and teamed with Rashad Anderson to combine for 40 points to lead the No. 3-ranked Huskies to a resounding 89-75 victory over No. 2-ranked 'Nova. Connecticut used sizzling shooting in the second half to open up a tight affair. The Huskies shot 68



BREAKING THE TOURNEY STREAK

The Huskies title win in the 2005 EA Sports Maui Invitational ended a lengthy streak. It had been nearly 50 years since the Huskies captured the title at an in-season tournament they did not host. That covered 23 straight trips to one tournament or another without bringing home the title. UConn captured the 1956 Orange Bowl Classic in Miami, defeating Miami, Stanford and Pittsburgh on successive nights.

percent (15-of-22) from the field after intermission. Villanova led 54-53 with 10:44 remaining before the Huskies scored the game's next nine points. Rudy Gay and Marcus Williams sandwiched a set of two made free throws around a big three-pointer by Anderson, before Jeff Adrien finished the run with an acrobatic jumper in the lane. The Wildcats got no closer than seven the rest of the way. Brown made 8-of-13 field goal attempts and was successful on half of his four three-point tries in perhaps his best performance in a Connecticut uniform. Anderson made five of seven from downtown. The win improved the Huskies' record to 25-2, and sent their conference mark to 12-2 and gave UConn a share of the BIG EAST Conference lead. The Wildcats, who had an 11-game win streak snapped, drop to 22-3 overall, 12-2 in the league.

The Huskies traveled to South Florida for the next-to-last regular season tilt and scored the first 18 points of the contest en route to a 66-53 victory. The Bulls would make things interesting in the second half, battling back to within three points, 45-42, with 9:29 to play, but the Huskies methodically got the lead back to double figures and closed out the victory.

Next it was the regular season finale against Louisville and Senior Day at Gampel Pavilion. Denham Brown, one of seven Huskies playing their final home game at Connecticut, scored 17 points and made the crucial steal in the game's final minute to help UConn hold off the Cardinals, 84-80. Connecticut had rallied from an early second-half six-point deficit to take a six-point lead of their own with 7:42 to play on two free throws by Brown. However, the Cardinals refused to go away quietly, rallying to lead 71-69 on a pair of free throws by Taquan Dean with 4:01 remaining. The Huskies forged ahead by five, at 78-73 on the strength of two hoops by senior Rashad Anderson. Yet again, the Cardinals rallied, tying the contest on two free throws by Juan Palacios with 54 seconds to go. After Marcus Williams made two free throws with 48 seconds to go, Brown stole a pass from Dean, and Williams made four more free throws to salt away the game. The Huskies completed an unbeaten home season with an unblemished 16-0 record, their first since going 17-0 in 1997-1998.

With its 14-2 league record this season, UConn captured its 16th BIG EAST Championship in the last 16 years, dating back to the 1989-90 Regular Season title, the school's first. The Huskies extended their league record for total championships, holding the mark for the most regular season titles with ten and are tied with Georgetown for the most tournament titles with six apiece.

The Huskies would travel to New York as the No. 1 seed in the BIG EAST Tournament and have a bye in the first round of the tourney. Their quarterfinal opponent would turn out to be Syracuse, a team that UConn had beaten twice during the regular season. The Huskies trailed at the half by a score of 39-28 after shooting a dismal 27.6% from the field. The Orange ran off the first ten points of the game and held Connecticut without a field goal for nearly seven minutes to start the contest. UConn missed its first eight shots from the field, but stayed in the game in the early moments from the free throw line and pulled to within one point at

10-9 after Williams made a lay-up for the first Husky bucket from the field with 13:04 remaining in the half. UConn trailed by as many as 14 points (49-35) in the second half, but used an 11-2 run to get the deficit to five at 51-46 with just under 13 minutes to play. The Orange responded with a 6-1 burst to get their lead back to ten, 57-47. The lead was still ten at 62-52 with 7:42 to play when the Huskies would make their next and best charge of the contest. A 9-3 spurt, capped by a Gay dunk, cut the Orange lead to 65-61 with just under six minutes to play. Hilton Armstrong made a pair of free throws to cut the deficit once again to two points, at 65-63, with a little more than five minutes to go in the contest and went to the line again less than a minute later for a pair that tied the score at 65-65 with 5:09 to go to set up the exciting finish. Connecticut rallied to take a 74-71 lead after Brown made a pair of free throws with 11.2 seconds remaining in regulation. Syracuse in-bounded the ball to Gerry McNamara and he weaved his way down court and drilled a three-pointer with 5.5 seconds remaining to tie the score. Williams' game-winning attempt from the lane was no good at the buzzer. The Huskies scored the first two points of overtime on a pair of free throws by Denham Brown. After Syracuse tied the game, Josh Boone put the Huskies back ahead with a pair of free throws. But the Huskies were held scoreless until Brown made back-to-back three-pointers 10 seconds apart late in the extra session. Marcus Williams missed a short jumper in the lane as time expired in overtime as the Orange took an 86-84 decision. Brown led the Huskies with 20 points, including the two huge three-pointers in overtime. Williams finished with 17 points and had 11 assists to record his seventh double-double of the campaign.

Despite the early exit in New York, the Huskies regular season standout performance was rewarded with a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament. UConn advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the fifth straight season and would open competition against the Great Danes of Albany at the Wachovia Center in Philadelphia. It was a game that looked like history in the making for most of the night and, unfortunately for the Huskies, they were on the wrong end of history. Albany led for much of the game, and after Rudy Gay hit the second half's first basket, the Great Danes scored the game's next 13 points to lead 43-33 with 14:26 remaining. Albany extended their lead to 12, at 50-38 with 11:34 to go, but Connecticut, led by Marcus Williams and Denham Brown, roared back in the game. Josh Boone started the Huskies off with a short jumper, before Williams and Brown combined to score 10 of UConn's next 12 points. The Huskies took their first lead since halftime on Williams straight-away three-pointer with 5:49 to go. Hilton Armstrong made a three-point play (his first points of the game) with 4:56 remaining, and Williams followed with another dagger three and the Huskies had finally secured the win. UConn had used a furious 34-9 rally to end the game, coming back to defeat Albany, 72-59.

A first-ever meeting with Kentucky was next for Connecticut. Rudy Gay and Marcus Williams were the catalysts as the Huskies held off a late Kentucky rally. UConn led 81-74 with 1:50 to play after freshman Craig Austrie drove through the Wildcat press for a lay-up. Patrick Sparks, who was outstanding all game for Kentucky, finishing with 19 of his 28 points after intermission, drilled a three-pointer to bring Kentucky to within four. After a UConn shot clock violation, Sheray Thomas made a lay-up to bring the Wildcats within a bucket at 81-79 with 52.5 seconds to play. Williams made both free throws after two Kentucky fouls, sandwiched around a Bobby Perry follow to put UConn ahead 83-79, with 29.4 to play. Perry had another follow hoop, but Gay secured the win with two charity tosses and the Huskies held on, 87-83. UConn led by 13 points on four different occasions in the first half before settling for a 43-31 lead at the intermission. The Huskies used a 17-4 run to break an 8-8 tie and forge a 25-12 lead with 10:21 left in the half. Rashad Anderson was the key to the Husky run, hitting four three-pointers in a span of just over five minutes of play. He finished with 14 points in the half after going scoreless in the first round win over Albany.

The win over Kentucky sent UConn on to the Sweet 16 for the 11th

time under Jim Calhoun. It would be a match-up of Huskies in the Washington, D.C. Regional Semifinal, as No. 5 seeded Washington would be the opponent. A pair of cinderellas rounded out the regional, with No. 11 George Mason and No. 7 Wichita State facing off in the other regional semi. The game with Washington would be a classic. Rashad Anderson hit a long three-pointer with 1.8 seconds left in regulation to force overtime and UConn made all eight extra-session free throws to earn a wild 98-92 victory. Connecticut trailed by six, 78-72, with 1:55 to play in regulation after Washington's Jamaal Williams drilled a three-pointer. Senior Josh Boone made one of two free throws with 1:16 to go to bring the Huskies within five. After Washington's Mike Jensen missed a three-pointer, Anderson swished a three off of a pretty pass from Marcus Williams with 34 seconds remaining to make the score 78-76 Washington. Justin Dentmon made two free throws for Washington, but Williams raced the length of the floor and was fouled on his successful field goal -- and made the ensuing free throw to complete the old-fashioned three-point play to bring UConn to within one with 11 seconds to go. Brandon Roy made two free throws with 7.9 seconds to go setting up Anderson's heroics. Connecticut never trailed in the extra session taking early leads on baskets by Williams and Anderson. Hilton Armstrong made several big plays in the overtime period, blocking a Roy lay-up, hitting a big lay-up with 1:13 to play and swishing two free throws with 24.4 seconds to go. Williams had a spectacular offensive game for UConn. He scored a career-high 26 points and was a perfect 11-for-11 from the line. He also had a game-best eight assists. He was joined in double figures by five teammates. UConn trailed by as many as 11 points in the early going of the second half, but strung together a 17-6 run over a seven-minute span to tie the score at 57-57 with 11:40 to play in the contest. Anderson was key in the run, hitting back-to-back three's, while Gay scored six points in the run. Washington took advantage of another barrage of UConn turnovers to start the second half, as six miscues in the first five minutes of the half led to an eight-point edge. UW led by 11 after scoring the six points of the half, making the score 51-40, with 18:24 left in regulation. The lead was eight, 53-45, with 13:48 to go when Roy picked up his third foul and then a double technical foul with Gay that was Roy's fourth foul. Roy went to the bench and UConn went on its game changing run.

Seemingly, the regional final with George Mason would have a hard time topping the drama of two nights before. Remarkably, it would. Denham Brown, whose reverse lay-up at the end of regulation forced overtime, missed a three-pointer at the buzzer in the extra session as George Mason upset Connecticut, 86-84. Connecticut almost made a second consecutive miracle comeback win. The Huskies trailed by four, at 74-70 with 17.6 seconds to play, before All-Region performer Marcus Williams made a runner in the lane. After George Mason's Tony Skinn missed the front-end of a one-and-one, Brown drove under the basket and made a twisting shot to force the extra period. George Mason scored the first points of overtime on a basket by Will Thomas and never trailed again. The Huskies had one chance to win the contest after Jai Lewis missed two free throws with 6.1 seconds to go. Brown took a pass, stepped back and barely missed a three-pointer at the buzzer that would have given the Huskies the victory. The Huskies were led by Rudy Gay, who scored 20 points, and scored nine straight points midway through the second half when UConn was struggling to score. Gay joined Williams on the All-Region team. Jeff Adrien gave the Huskies a huge lift off of the bench with 17 points and seven rebounds. He made seven of eight field goal attempts, in setting his career-high in scoring. Williams was his usual solid self, scoring 13 points and dishing out 11 assists to register his seventh double-double of the season in just 23 games. Brown finished with 11 points for UConn. The Patriots made up a nine-point halftime deficit in the first 7:27 of the second half, tying the game at 49-all on a three-pointer by Folarin Campbell. The remainder of the half was a see-saw affair as the lead changed hands 10 times before George Mason was able to eke out four different four-point leads, the last of which, at



74-70, set up the late-game heroics by Brown.

The tremendous team success that UConn achieved in 2005-06 also resulted in many individual accolades for several Huskies.

First on the list of honorees was Rudy Gay. Gay was a consensus All-American selection, the sixth player in UConn history to earn consensus All-American recognition. He earned First Team honors from the NABC and the Rupp Award, and was one of four finalists for the Naismith National Player of the Year award. He earned Second Team All-America selection by the Associated Press, USBWA and ESPN.com. He was named to the All-BIG EAST, All-NABC and All-USBWA First Teams. He also earned a spot on the 2006 NCAA Washington, D.C. Regional All-Tournament team. He led the Huskies in scoring at 15.2 points per game and also averaged 6.4 rebounds, 2.1 assists, 1.8 steals and 1.6 blocks per contest. On April 17, Gay gave up his final two years of eligibility and entered the 2006 NBA Draft. Gay appeared in 64 games in his two seasons, scoring 870 points, an average of 13.6 per contest.

Rashad Anderson finished his Husky career with championships, records and more wins than all but two senior classes in UConn history, but he will be remembered most as the greatest clutch shooter in the annals of Connecticut Basketball. His clutch shooting legend was cemented in Husky lore on March 24, 2006 in the NCAA Sweet 16 win over Washington. Rashad hit a pair of three-pointers in the final 36 seconds of regulation, including the game-tying bucket with 1.8 seconds left in the contest. As a senior, Rashad was the nation's top sixth man, leading the country in scoring without a start while averaging 12.8 points per contest. Rashad finished his four-year career with 1,432 points, ranking No. 15 on the all-time Husky scoring list. His 276 career three-pointers are the most in UConn history, passing Ben Gordon, Ray Allen, Richard Hamilton and Chris Smith during his senior year to take over the top spot. During the course of his career, Anderson received several individual accolades. He was a 2005-06 BIG EAST Honorable Mention selection, a 2004-05 NABC All-District pick, and was a 2004 NCAA Final Four All-Tournament team and 2004 NCAA Phoenix Regional All-Tournament team honoree. Anderson leaves UConn as the all-time three-point leader in NCAA Tournament games, including a single-tournament record 21 three's in UConn's 2004 championship run. He also earned BIG EAST Player of the Week honors four times in his career.

The story of Hilton Armstrong is what college basketball used to be about. A little known recruit comes to school, bides his time behind more heralded teammates and continues to work hard and wait for his moment. Four years later, that player's opportunity arrives and he makes the most of it. Armstrong played in 131 games in his career at UConn, but will be remembered most for the final 34, when as a senior in 2005-06, he became one of the best defensive players in the country and one of the top all-around big men in Husky history. Hilton was named the 2005-06 BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year, becoming the fourth straight UConn player to take home the honor and joining Josh Boone, Emeka Okafor and Donyell Marshall as UConn winners of the prestigious recognition. He averaged 3.2 blocked shots per game, ranking among the top five in the nation and led the BIG EAST in blocks at 4.3 per league game. In addition to his defensive honor, Hilton was also selected to the USBWA All-District First Team and the All-BIG EAST and NABC All-District Second Teams. He had also started out his senior season in fine style, earning a spot on the Maui Invitational All-Tournament team after helping the Huskies to the tourney title.

Denham Brown finished his career with his best season as a Husky and, from beginning to end, he made big plays and big shots that will be remembered by Husky fans forever. As a senior in 2005-06, Denham was at his best in the biggest moments. In November, Denham hit the game-winning basket in UConn's win over Gonzaga, giving the Huskies the title at the Maui Invitational. It was UConn's first in-season tournament title in 50 years and Brown was the key, averaging 15.7 points and earning a spot on the All-Tournament team. In March, Denham was there for a big shot again. In the NCAA Elite Eight vs. George Mason,

Denham made a basket as time expired at the end of regulation to force overtime. Despite the eventual loss, it will go down as one of the most memorable shots in UConn history. Denham totaled 1,267 career points, putting him No. 25 in all-time UConn history. His 135 career games ranks No. 3 all-time. As a senior, Denham averaged 10.7 points and finished the year by reaching double figures in eight straight contests. He averaged 13.5 points in the NCAA Tournament.

On April 7, junior Josh Boone entered the NBA Draft, although he refrained from hiring an agent and retained the ability to return to UConn. On June 5, Boone decided to remain in the draft and give up his final year of eligibility. Boone has appeared in 103 games in his three seasons as a Husky and has averaged 9.3 points, 7.0 rebounds and 2.2 blocked shots in that time. He has been a part of a Husky program that has gone 86-18 in three seasons, capturing two BIG EAST Regular Season titles, one BIG EAST Tournament title and the 2004 NCAA National Championship. Boone was the 2004-05 BIG EAST Defensive Player of the Year.

On April 25, junior Marcus Williams announced that he would forego his final year of eligibility and enter the NBA Draft. Williams appeared in 70 games in his three seasons at UConn and is the all-time assist per game leader in the history of the BIG EAST Conference. He averaged 9.0 points and 7.3 assists in his career at Connecticut. As a junior in 2005-06, Williams averaged 12.3 points and 8.6 assists, appearing in 23 games. He averaged 20.0 points and 8.8 assists in the NCAA Tournament, earning a spot on the NCAA Washington, D.C. Regional All-Tournament team. He totaled seven double-doubles and one triple-double on the year, while handing out eight or more assists in 16 of 23 games. His all-time assist average of 8.1 in BIG EAST games is easily No. 1 in conference history, surpassing Sherman Douglas of Syracuse, who averaged 7.0 assists per game in his career. Williams overall average of 7.3 assists is No. 1 all-time at UConn, outdistancing Doron Sheffer's 5.5 assist per game total. Williams also holds the UConn single game assist record, totaling 16 assists at Notre Dame on January 30, 2005 and vs. Central Connecticut on December 22, 2004. Williams led the BIG EAST in assists as a sophomore and as a junior and finished No. 3 in the nation as a sophomore in 2004-05. His total of 8.6 per game in 2005-06 was enough to rank him No. 1 in the country, but he did not play in enough games to qualify for the NCAA statistics.

The University of Connecticut became the first school in the history of the NBA to have five players selected in the first two rounds of the draft and for the first time in school history, the Huskies had four players selected in the First Round. Sophomore Rudy Gay and senior Hilton Armstrong were each selected in the lottery portion of the First Round, while junior Marcus Williams and junior Josh Boone were also selected in the First Round. Senior Denham Brown was taken with the 40th pick in the second round by the Seattle Sonics. The 2006 NBA Draft was held at the Theatre at Madison Square Garden on June 28. Gay was selected with the No. 8 pick by the Houston Rockets and then traded to Memphis for Shane Battier. Armstrong went to the New Orleans/Oklahoma City Hornets with the No. 12 selection. Williams was taken with the No. 22 pick by the New Jersey Nets and Boone was taken with the No. 23 selection, also by New Jersey. Brown went in the second round, with the 40th pick, to the Seattle Sonics. UConn becomes only the third school in NBA history to have four players selected in the First Round of the draft, joining Duke (1999) and North Carolina (2005). The five draftees are the most in school history, surpassing the three Husky picks in 1996 and 1982. UConn has now had a total of 21 players drafted under head coach Jim Calhoun, 14 of those in the first round and nine lottery selections. The lottery duo of Gay and Armstrong gives UConn nine total lottery selections in the past 12 years and marks the second time in three years that Connecticut has had a pair of lottery picks. Emeka Okafor and Ben Gordon each went in the lottery in 2004. Including Charlie Villanueva in 2005, UConn has had five lottery selections in the past three drafts.




