UCLA BASKETBALL - 2012-13 SEASON NOTES

Pac-12 regular-season champions, Pac-12 Tournament runner-up, NCAA Tournament appearance

UCLA AT A GLANCE

- UCLA advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the seventh time in 10 seasons.
- The Bruins earned a No. 6 seed in the NCAA Tournament, losing to No. 11-seed Minnesota, 83-63.
- The Bruins completed the Pac-12 regular season with a 13-5 conference record and first-place finish.
- UCLA lost to Oregon, 78-69, in the Pac-12 Tournament championship game on March 16 in Las Vegas.
- The Bruins compiled an 11-2 record in games decided by five points or fewer in 2012-13.
- Shabazz Muhammad and Larry Drew II both earned first-team All-Pac-12 Conference honors.
- Jordan Adams, UCLA's second-leading scorer, broke his right foot on March 15, missing the last two games.
- Larry Drew II ranked No. 4, nationally, in assists per game (7.4), and No. 7 in assist turnover ratio (2.98).
- Larry Drew II's 256 single-season assists rank third-most in Pac-12 history and first on UCLA's single-season list.
- Head coach Ben Howland secured career victory No. 400 in UCLA's 80-75 win over Arizona State on March 14.

FRESHMEN TALENT

UCLA's 2012-13 team feature a group of three freshman starters that concluded the 2012-13 season as three of UCLA's top four scorers. Shabazz Muhammad earned Pac-12 Co-Freshman of the Year honors and led UCLA with 17.9 ppg, the fourth-highest average among Pac-12 players. Jordan Adams averaged 15.3 ppg, opening his freshman campaign with four straight games over 20-plus points. Kyle Anderson finished the year as UCLA's leading rebounder (8.6 rpg), totaled eight double-doubles, and registered 9.7 ppg.

PAC-12 SUCCESS

The Bruins won their fourth Pac-12 regular-season title in the last eight years, clinching the conference title in outright fashion with a 61-54 victory at Washington on March 9. Later that day, Oregon lost at Utah by a 72-62 margin, allowing UCLA to assume sole possession of first place. UCLA advanced to the championship game of the Pac-12 Tournament the following weekend, dropping a 78-69 decision to Oregon in Las Vegas. The Bruins had erased double-digit second half deficits against Arizona State (March 14) and Arizona (March 15) in order to advance to the tournament's title game for the first time since winning the crown in 2008.

DREW TWO

Larry Drew II established UCLA's single-season assists record in 2012-13, recording 256 assists in 35 starts. Drew II scored a career-high 20 points in UCLA's 80-75 win over Arizona State in a first-round contest of the Pac-12 Tournament (March 14). Through UCLA's final 12 games, Drew II made 19 of 33 three-point field goal attempts (57.6 percent). Drew II scored in double figures in 10 games, including six of UCLA's last 11, and registered six games with at least 10 assists. Drew II sat out the 2011-12 season due to NCAA rules after transferring from North Carolina.

NOTES ON THE BRUINS

- Jordan Adams scored a team-leading 24 points, including 16 points in the second half, to help UCLA complete the season sweep of Arizona with a 66-64 victory in a Pac-12 semifinal (March 15) ... Adams suffered a broken right foot on the game's final play (on defense) and was sidelined for the remainder of the year.
- UCLA went 3-0 against Arizona for the second time in school history and for the first time since 2006 ... the Bruins have won five of their last seven games against the Wildcats.
- The Bruins overcame a 15-point deficit in the second half against Arizona State in the Pac-12 Tournament (March 14) and erased Arizona's 11-point lead with 11 minutes to play in the semifinals (March 15) to win, 66-64.
- Jordan Adams became UCLA's first freshman to score at least 20 points in a Pac-12 Tournament game (March 15) since the conference resumed its tournament in 2002 ... he scored 20-plus points 11 times during the season.
- The Bruins have won at least 25 games in five of the last eight seasons ... prior to head coach Ben Howland's arrival, UCLA had won 25 or more games in six of the previous 28 seasons (after John Wooden retired).
- UCLA's three freshman starters (Jordan Adams, Kyle Anderson, Shabazz Muhammad) accounted for 54.2 percent of UCLA's total points, 46.7 percent of the total rebounds and 42.7 percent of the total minutes.
- Ben Howland is one of five head coaches in Pac-12 history to have won at least 100 conference games and maintained a winning percentage above .650 (also John Wooden, Lute Olson, Jim Harrick, and Mike Montgomery).
- Larry Drew II logged 1243 minutes (averaging 35.5 mpg), the highest total by any UCLA player since 2008, when Russell Westbrook (1318) and Josh Shipp (1269) each logged over 1200 minutes.

PAC-12 RECORD BOOK

Larry Drew II finished the season ranking third on the Pac-12's single-season assist list after having totaled six assists in UCLA's 78-69 loss to Oregon in the Pac-12 Tournament title game (March 16). Earlier in the season, Drew II moved past former UCLA standout Pooh Richardson for the Bruins' single-season assists record. Richardson, a former NBA standout, totaled 236 assists as a senior in 1989.

RANKING UCLA

UCLA has gone 25-17 (.595) against ranked teams the last seven seasons (2006-07 through 2012-13). The Bruins went 11-2 against ranked teams in 2006-07, 7-2 versus ranked foes in 2007-08, 1-4 in 2008-09, 0-2 in 2009-10, 2-3 in 2010-11 and 0-2 in 2011-12. UCLA went 4-2 against ranked teams in 2012-13.

UCLA returned to the top of the AP poll's No. 1 spot for the first time in 12 years on Nov. 27, 2006. Prior to that ranking, UCLA was previously ranked No. 1 in the final AP poll of the 1995 season, the year in which UCLA captured its 11th NCAA Championship.

UCLA has gone 242-15 (.942) in 257 games when playing as the nation's No. 1-ranked team. The Bruins have gone 128-3 in 131 home games as the No. 1-ranked team. In all, UCLA has spent 134 weeks ranked No. 1 in the country (12 ahead of second-place Duke, 122).

GIVING AN ASSIST

Larry Drew II became UCLA's single-season assists leader during the Bruins' 61-54 victory at Washington on March 9 in the team's regular-season finale. Drew II, who hails from Encino, Calif., registered 256 assists as a senior, 20 ahead of Pooh Richardson's total of 236, a record previously established in 1989. Drew finished his senior season ranking third on the Pac-12's single-season assists list behind Ahlon Lewis and Jason Kidd.

LEADING THE WAY

The only senior on UCLA's roster in 2012-13, Larry Drew II had four shots in the game's final 35 seconds that helped UCLA take the lead or extend its advantage in a critical situation. His most clutch moment came on a fadeaway jump shot at the buzzer against Washington in Pauley Pavilion on Feb. 7, giving UCLA a 59-57 victory.

NOV. 13, 2012: With UCLA trailing 79-78 in the final 30 seconds of overtime, Drew II scored on a driving layup with 17 seconds to play allowing the Bruins to defeat UC Irvine, 80-79.

JAN. 10, 2013: Drew II drove to the basket as the shot clock expired, making a layup with nine seconds left in the game to help UCLA secure a 57-53 cushion at Utah and seal a critical Pac-12 road victory.

FEB. 7, 2013: After C.J. Wilcox drove to the basket and tied the game, 57-57, with 10 seconds to go, Drew II took the ball the length of the court and nailed a buzzer-beating jumper to lead UCLA past Washington, 59-57.

MARCH 9, 2013: UCLA led 57-54 in the final minute at Washington, and Drew II made a driving layup with 33 seconds to play, putting the Bruins ahead 59-54 as UCLA held on for a 61-54 victory.

ALL-PAC-12 SELECTIONS

Larry Drew II and Shabazz Muhammad earned first-team All-Pac-12 honors, and Kyle Anderson secured second-team All-Pac-12 acclaim. Muhammad was named Co-Freshman of the Year along with Arizona State's Jahii Carson. Muhammad, who ranked fourth in the Pac-12 in scoring (17.9 ppg), became the eighth player at UCLA to earn Pac-12 Freshman of the Year accolades. Muhammad and Anderson were named to the All-Pac-12 Freshmen Team, while Jordan Adams was chosen as an honorable mention All-Freshmen Team selection.

ELITE COMPANY: Shabazz Muhammad and Arizona State's Jahii Carson were named Pac-12 Co-Freshman of the Year. UCLA's past recipients include Pooh Richardson (1986), Don MacLean (1989), Baron Davis (1998), Jason Kapono (2000), Jordan Farmar (2005), Luc Richard Mbah a Moute (2006) and Kevin Love (2008).

LEADING THE WAY: Between the 15 total All-Pac-12 Team selections (10 first-team, 5 second-team), UCLA led the way among all Pac-12 programs with three selections. UCLA, Arizona and Colorado were the only programs to have two players represented as first-team All-Pac-12 selections.

CLOSE CALLS

The Bruins went 11-2 in games decided by five points or fewer this season. In 10 seasons under head coach Ben Howland, UCLA logged a 59-33 record (.641) in games decided by five points or fewer. During the regular season, UCLA's two greatest comeback wins took place against Texas (Dec. 8) and Missouri (Dec. 28). The Bruins trailed Texas by eight points (59-51) with 3:43 to play in regulation and took a 62-61 lead with 47 seconds left. UCLA was losing to Missouri by nine points (86-77) with 5:34 remaining in the second half before winning the game in overtime.

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS

UCLA went 4-2 against teams ranked in the top-25 this season (team ranked during week of game) and posted a 2-0 mark against top-10 opponents. This was the fourth season in Ben Howland's 10-year tenure that the Bruins earned at least two wins against top-10 teams – UCLA downed No. 7 Missouri (97-94, overtime) on Dec. 28 and knocked off No. 6 Arizona (84-73) on Jan. 24.

ADAMS' ACCOLADES

Freshman Jordan Adams ranked second on the team with 15.3 ppg, tied for the eighth-highest scoring average in the Pac-12 (third-best mark among Pac-12 freshmen). He scored in double figures in 25 games and recorded at least 20 points in 11 contests. Adams became the first freshman at UCLA to have scored 20+ points in each of his first four games (freshmen could not play varsity until 1972-73). He became UCLA's first player in any class to have opened a season with four straight games of 20+ points since 1990-91 (Don MacLean, six straight).

YOUNG SUCCESS

UCLA's trio of freshman starters – Jordan Adams, Kyle Anderson and Shabazz Muhammad – have accounted for 54.2 percent of the Bruins' total points (1412 of 2604) and for 46.7 percent of the team's total rebounds (596 of 1276). In addition, the freshman trio of starters has logged 42.7 percent of UCLA's total minutes (3031 of 7100). UCLA three freshman starters registered 55.8 of the Bruins' total steals (158 of 283).

FOUR IN A ROW

Freshmen Jordan Adams and Shabazz Muhammad each scored at least 20 points in four consecutive games during the 2012-13 season. Regardless of class, that feat had not been accomplished by any UCLA player since the 2004-05 season, when Dijon Thompson had four straight games of 20-plus points (Jan., Feb. 2005). Adams opened the 2012-13 season with four straight 20+ point performances and Muhammad achieved that feat in Dec. 2012.

UNCHARTED TERRITORY

Freshman Kyle Anderson finished three assists shy of a triple-double against Fresno State (Dec. 22), posting season-highs of 20 points and 17 rebounds that night. UCLA's only previous triple-doubles took place in Dec. 1995. Toby Bailey finished with 23 points, 10 rebounds and 10 assists against Stephen F. Austin on Dec. 18, 1995. Jelani McCoy tallied 15 points, 11 blocks and 10 rebounds against Maryland on Dec. 9, 1995.

INJURY REPORT

Freshman guard Jordan Adams broke the fifth metatarsal in his right foot on the final play of the game against Arizona (March 15) and missed UCLA's final two games. Junior forward Travis Wear missed two games (Feb. 23, Feb. 27) with a sprained right foot and returned against Arizona (March 2). Sophomore guard Nick Kazemi missed the entire season recovering from a sprained left MCL (sustained the injury on Oct. 26, 2012).

TOP SCORER

Shabazz Muhammad ranked fourth in the Pac-12 in scoring (17.9 ppg), having logged the highest scoring average at UCLA since 2004-05 (Dijon Thompson, 18.4 ppg). Muhammad's 17.9 ppg ranks ninth all-time on the Pac-12's freshman scoring list. The resident of Las Vegas, Nev., was one of five players in the nation to secure Freshman All-America honors from the USBWA. Muhammad scored in double figures in 31 of 32 games played.

OPENED IN DOUBLE-DIGITS

Freshman Shabazz Muhammad scored in double digits in each of his first 12 games at UCLA, becoming the first player to accomplish that feat since Kevin Love (2007-08) scored in double figures in all 38 games played as a freshman (missed the 13th game of the season). Muhammad and Love are the only players in head coach Ben Howland's 10-year tenure to have opened their UCLA career with at least seven consecutive double-digit efforts.

OFFENSE INTENDED

UCLA led the Pac-12 in scoring offense, logging 74.4 points per game. The Bruins ranked third among Pac-12 teams in conference contests with 70.8 points per game. UCLA compiled the third-best scoring margin in the Pac-12 (all games), outscoring the opposition by an average of 5.1 points per game. The Bruins ranked third in the Pac-12 in field goal percentage (45.1 pct) and finished first in assists per game (16.0 apg) and assist turnover ratio (1.4).

ON THE ROAD

UCLA went 10-7 in games played away from Pauley Pavilion, including a 6-3 mark in Pac-12 road games. Jordan Adams led UCLA with 17.0 ppg in all road/neutral site games and scored in double figures in each of the Bruins' nine Pac-12 road games. Shabazz Muhammad scored 16.1 ppg and added 4.5 rpg away from home. Larry Drew II recorded a team-leading 94 assists on the road (5.5 apg) in 17 road/neutral site games.

OFF THE BENCH

Norman Powell scored 10 points in each of UCLA's final two games, starting in place of the injured Jordan Adams in the Pac-12 Tournament title game and a second-round NCAA Tournament contest. He has played in all 68 games since the start of 2011-12. As a sophomore, he has averaged 6.1 ppg and 2.2 rpg, playing an average of 22.1 minutes per contest. Powell scored a career-high 27 points in UCLA's 100-70 win over James Madison (Nov. 15, 2012).

HEADED TO OVERTIME

UCLA went 3-1 in overtime contests in 2012-13, recording wins in overtime at home against UC Irvine, Missouri and Arizona State. The Bruins went gone 12-8 in overtime contests under head coach Ben Howland (2003-04 through 2012-13). UCLA has won five of its last seven overtime games. The Bruins last played a game into double overtime on Nov. 16, 2009 (season opener), losing at home to Cal State Fullerton, 68-65.

VERSATILE FRESHMAN

Freshman Kyle Anderson has logged eight of UCLA's 13 double-doubles. The 6-foot-9 product of Fairview, N.J., was the Pac-12's only player to rank in the top 10 in rebounding (6th, 8.6 rpg) and assists (6th, 3.5). Anderson averaged 9.7 points per game and compiled a 1.7 assist turnover ratio, the fifth-best mark among Pac-12 players. Anderson finished his freshman season ranking fifth in the Pac-12 in steals per game (1.8 spg).

CRASHING THE BOARDS: Kyle Anderson's total of 302 rebounds was the fourth-highest single-season total in 10 seasons under head coach Ben Howland. His 8.6 rpg average was the third-highest mark in the Howland Era.

A LOOK BACK

UCLA played 19 home games on the road in 2011-12 – 14 at the Los Angeles Sports Arena, four at the Honda Center (Anaheim, Calif.) and one exhibition game at Citizens Business Bank Arena (Ontario, Calif.). After winning the exhibition game in Ontario, the Bruins posted a 14-4 record at their local "home" venues, including a perfect 4-0 mark at the Honda Center in Anaheim. UCLA went 10-4 in games played at the Los Angeles Sports Arena.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

UCLA completed its first season of home contests back in Pauley Pavilion during the 2012-13 season, after the arena had undergone a 33-month, \$136 renovation. Originally opened in 1965, Pauley Pavilion is one of the nation's premier all-around collegiate facilities. While calling Pauley Pavilion home, the men's basketball program has won nine NCAA Championships and 22 conference titles. The Bruins have gone 652-102 (.865) in Pauley Pavilion in 47 seasons.

RECORD SETTING: UCLA's crowd of 13,727 against Arizona on March 2, 2013, set the single-game Pauley Pavilion attendance record (13,513 on Nov. 9, 2012 in the first game in "New" Pauley Pavilion). In the former configuration of Pauley Pavilion, the largest crowd had been 13,478 in a 73-69 win over Duke (Feb. 23, 1997).

NEW PAULEY PAVILION

The complete renovation of UCLA's historic arena, Pauley Pavilion, took 33 months and cost just under \$136 million. "New" Pauley Pavilion seats approximately 13,800 fans – 1,000 more than the "old" Pauley Pavilion. Other key features of the renovated facility include a custom-designed video board, additional LED hustle boards, major increases in restrooms and a wider variety of concession stands. Here are a few key features, at a glance:

- New Pauley Pavilion houses a 16-foot by 12-foot, LED, High Definition Daktronics Video board perched above center court with all four sides visible to fans ... in addition, there are LED hustle boards in each of the corners that track player statistics, as well as an LED ribbon board encircling the top of the arena.
- New Pauley Pavilion now has 154% more restrooms through the building, including on the event level.
- The pavilion's North side hosts a grand lobby that highlights the theme "Champions Made Here" as well as the multi-purpose Pavilion Club for game-day hospitality.
- Additional dining options include California Pizza Kitchen, Subway, Full Court Press Panini, Jamba Juice, Pavilion Market, Joe Brewin Coffee Stand, the outdoor South Plaza and traditional fare ... the arena also features a UCLA team store in the Northeast corner, operated by ASUCLA.
- New Pauley Pavilion includes nearly 100 monitors throughout the building, many of which are used to show the game telecast. Other monitors can be used as menu boards at numerous concession points.
- The renovation established 70,000 additional square feet of usable space than existed in the building's previous configuration. Additions include two state-of-the-art locker rooms with cherry wood lockers and adjacent lounge areas, a 24-seat film room, weight room and sports medicine room.

JERSEY RETIREMENTS

UCLA retired the jerseys of Jamaal Wilkes (No. 52), Reggie Miller (No. 31) and the late Don Barksdale (No. 11) earlier this season. These three standouts were inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame on Sept. 7, 2012. This marked the first year in which three Bruins had been inducted individually into the same class. Wilkes was honored during UCLA's game against Oregon State (Jan. 17), and Miller was recognized at halftime during the contest against USC (Jan. 30). Barksdale's jersey was retired at during UCLA's game against Washington (Feb. 7).

JAMAAL WILKES: A three-year starter and two-time first-team All-America selection, Jamaal Wilkes helped lead UCLA to NCAA Championships in 1972 and 1973. He ranks in the top 30 on UCLA's all-time scoring and rebounding lists (No. 30 in career points, No. 21 in career rebounds). Wilkes starred as a 6-foot-7 forward for the Bruins from 1972-74 before enjoying a successful 12-year career in the NBA.

REGGIE MILLER: Among UCLA's greatest pure shooters, Reggie Miller starred at UCLA from 1984-87 and helped guide the Bruins to the 1985 NIT Championship (sophomore season). A first-round NBA Draft selection by the Indiana Pacers in 1987, Miller enjoyed a very strong 17-year NBA career, all with Indiana. He ranks tied for third on UCLA's all-time scoring list (2,095 points, alongside Jason Kapono).

DON BARKSDALE: A two-sport star at UCLA, Don Barksdale was the first African-American to earn All-America honors at UCLA (1947), the first to capture an Olympic basketball gold medal (1948), one of the first to break the NBA's color barrier (1951) and the first to play in the NBA All-Star Game. World War II limited his UCLA career to five basketball games in 1943, one full season (1946-47) and one track campaign (1946-47).

FREE THROW SHOOTER

Jordan Adams made 129 of 153 free throw attempts (84.3 pct), logging the third-best percentage in the Pac-12. Adams had a streak of 33 consecutive free throws made early in his freshman campaign (started Nov. 9, snapped Dec. 1). Adams' streak fell 10 short of the school record (43, Darren Collison in 2008-09).

MAKING HISTORY: Prior to Adams' 16-for-16 FT effort (11/13/12), no UCLA player had made 16 FTs in one game since Reggie Miller (17-for-17, vs. Arizona State, 1/16/86). Other recent top efforts have come from Darren Collison (13-for-13, vs. Oregon State, 1/26/08) and Arron Affalo (13-for-13, vs. Arizona, 2/4/06).

CONFERENCE RANK: Adams' 16-for-16 FT effort trails the Pac-12 record – John Block of USC made 21 of 21 free throws against Washington (2/1/66). His 16-for-16 effort is the best among Pac-12 players since Jan. 17, 2009 (Washington State's Taylor Rochestie went 16-for-16 vs. Stanford in Pullman, Wash.).

BEEN THERE, DONE THAT: As a senior in high school (2011-12) at Oak Hill Academy, Adams made 34 straight free throws during the first half of the season (over the course of 12 games), setting a school record for consecutive free throws made. His team finished the season with a 44-0 record.

PRESEASON PROJECTIONS

UCLA was picked to finish second in the Pac-12 standings, according to a preseason poll of media members. The Bruins trailed Arizona in the poll by one point and received 16 of 35 first-place votes. California, Stanford and Washington were selected third, fourth and fifth, respectively. The last time that the predicted winner captured the conference's regular-season crown was in 2009-10 (California). Last season, Washington won the conference's regular-season crown, while Colorado captured the Pac-12 Tournament title.

NOTES ON BEN HOWLAND

- In 10 seasons at UCLA, Howland spent over half his head coaching tenure at UCLA. He was announced as UCLA's head coach April 3, 2003, after four seasons as head coach at Pittsburgh.
- Since the Pac-12 expanded to 10 teams in 1978-79, only six coaches have coached at their schools for at least 10 seasons – Lute Olson (24/Arizona), Ralph Miller (19/Oregon State), Mike Montgomery (18/Stanford), Ernie Kent (13/Oregon), Ben Braun (12/California) and Lorenzo Romar (11th at Washington this year). Ben Howland became the seventh coach in that category.
- In 10 trips to the NCAA Tournament, Howland coached his teams to five "Sweet 16" appearances and three Final Four appearances (all with UCLA, from 2006-2008).
- Howland's 97 victories at UCLA from 2006 through 2008 stand as the highest three-year win total in school history. He became one of three coaches in NCAA Division I history to win at least 30 games in three consecutive seasons, joining Adolph Rupp (Kentucky, 1947-49) and John Calipari (2006-08).
- Howland has secured Conference Coach of the Year acclaim in three different leagues – 2006, Pac-10 at UCLA; 2002, Big East at Pittsburgh; and in 1997, Big Sky at Northern Arizona.
- Through 10 years as UCLA's head coach, Howland has helped produce 12 NBA Draft selections, the highest total among Pac-12 programs in that span. The Bruins' 12 draft selections rank among the top five, nationally (2004-12).

- Since 1948, UCLA stands as the all-time collegiate leader in NBA Draft selections with 108, ahead of Kentucky (106), North Carolina (101) and Duke (77).
- UCLA currently has 11 former players competing in the NBA, five of which were drafted in the first round.
- Russell Westbrook and Kevin Love were taken in back-to-back selections (No. 4, No. 5) in the first round of the 2008 NBA Draft by the Seattle SuperSonics and Memphis Grizzlies, respectively.
- Ben Howland has produced six first-round NBA Draft selections in nine seasons as UCLA's head coach – Jordan Farmer (2006), Arron Afflalo (2007), Russell Westbrook (2008), Kevin Love (2008), Jrue Holiday (2009) and Darren Collison (2009).
- Russell Westbrook helped the Oklahoma City Thunder win the 2012 NBA Western Conference title, guiding the team to a 47-19 (.712) regular-season record, the third-best mark among all 30 NBA teams.
- Kevin Love and Russell Westbrook both competed for the USA Men's Basketball Olympic Team over the summer, leading Team USA to the gold medal in London.
- Five former UCLA basketball players changed NBA teams over the summer – Arron Afflalo from Denver to Orlando, Trevor Ariza from New Orleans to Washington, Matt Barnes from the L.A. Lakers to the L.A. Clippers, Darren Collison from the Indiana Pacers to the Dallas Mavericks and Ryan Hollins from the Boston Celtics to the L.A. Clippers.

In 19 seasons as a collegiate head coach, Howland led his teams to 10 NCAA Tournament appearances and to the "Sweet 16" five times, including three consecutive trips at UCLA (2006-08).

GAME-BY-GAME RECAPS

Game No. 1 - November 9, 2012 Pauley Pavilion - Los Angeles, Calif. UCLA 86, Indiana State 59

Jordan Adams scored 21 points in his college debut and No. 13 UCLA defeated Indiana State 86-59 in its season opener on Friday night.

Adams, the school's first-ever signee out of vaunted Oak Hill Academy in Virginia, was 7 of 12 from the floor and had eight rebounds off the bench for the Bruins (1-0). Travis Wear added 17 points and his twin brother David Wear had 13 points and 10 rebounds.

This was the first game in New Pauley Pavilion, which opened after an 18-month, \$132 million renovation. A record 13,513 fans were in attendance for the Bruins' first game on campus since Feb. 26, 2011.

Justin Gant led the Sycamores (0-1) with 11 points, including scoring the first points in the renovated building on a 3-pointer. Indiana State was chosen to help re-open the arena because the Terre Haute, Ind., school is the only university besides UCLA where the John Wooden coached.

Both teams shot poorly to start the game, combining to miss their first eight shots. Eventually, the Bruins settled down and ran off eight straight points late in the half to lead 36-27 at the break. Adams came on strong in the second half, hitting two 3-pointers and another basket that stretched UCLA's lead to 56-36 midway through the half.

The Sycamores cut their deficit to 63-52 on a 16-7 run, including two 3-pointers by Lucas Eitel and another by Christian Smith, with 7:25 remaining. Manny Arop added 10 points for Indiana State, which hasn't won a season opener on the road since 1970 against Purdue, a streak of 14 losses in openers.

The Wear twins combined to run off nine straight points and extend the Bruins' lead to 72-55 as they ended the game on a 23-7 run.

Former stars Reggie Miller, Marques Johnson, Ed O'Bannon, Rod Foster, Don McLean and Lucius Allen, who scored the first points when Pauley opened in 1965, were introduced in a pre-game ceremony. A video highlighted historic moments in the arena's history with comments from Wooden.

Jordan Adams scored 26 points, making all 16 of his free throws, and No. 13 UCLA edged UC Irvine, 80-79, in overtime on Tuesday night in regional play of the Progressive Legends Classic.

Will Davis II missed two free throws with 2 seconds left in regulation that would have sealed the upset for the visiting Anteaters (1-1).

Daman Starring tied the game on a 3-pointer and Michael Wilder's 3 gave the Anteaters a 79-78 lead with 22 seconds to go in the extra session. But Larry Drew II's layup with 17 seconds kept the Bruins (2-0) perfect at New Pauley Pavilion.

Adams scored over 20 points for the second time in as many games. He became UCLA's first freshman to record at least 20 points in each of his first two collegiate games since Kevin Love accomplished the feat in Nov. 2007.

David Wear added 13 points and nine rebounds, and his twin brother Travis had 12 points and eight rebounds for the Bruins. They will host James Madison on Thursday night in their second regional game before moving on to the championship rounds next week in Brooklyn, N.Y.

Daman Starring found Alex Young for a 3-pointer with 54 seconds to go in regulation, putting the Anteaters up 67-65. David Wear's jumper hit the front of the rim before Adams made a pair of free throws to force overtime.

In overtime, Adams scored six points, making four free throws when UCLA twice clung to one-point leads.

Adams led UCLA in scoring for the second straight game, having scored 21 points in a season-opening win over Indiana State.

The Bruins started strongly only to let up and see their 12-point lead shrink to 36-34 at halftime. The Wear twins combined to score 12 in a row and push UCLA's lead to 19-10 before both teams went through cold stretches. The Anteaters missed on seven straight possessions and the Bruins missed four in a row.

Game No. 3 - November 15, 2012 Pauley Pavilion - Los Angeles, Calif. UCLA 100, James Madison 70

Norman Powell scored a career-high 27 points and Jordan Adams added 25 to lead the No. 13 UCLA men's basketball team past James Madison, 100-70, in New Pauley Pavilion on Thursday night.

UCLA (3-0) will return to action against Georgetown (2-0) in Brooklyn, N.Y., on Monday, Nov. 19, in the Progressive Legends Classic. The following night, the Bruins will face either No. 1 Indiana or Georgia, with both games being played at the Barclays Center.

Adams, who scored 21 in the Bruins' season opener last Friday, had 26 points against UC Irvine on Tuesday night. With his 25-point effort Thursday, he became the first UCLA freshman to have scored 20-plus points in each of his first three collegiate games.

UCLA led James Madison at halftime by a 63-29 margin, logging its highest point total in any half since scoring 64 in the first half of a victory against Cal State Fullerton on Dec. 13, 1997, in Pauley Pavilion.

The visiting Dukes did not reach double digits on the scoreboard until 10 minutes into the contest.

Rayshawn Goins led James Madison with 24 points, one off his career best. The Dukes traveled across the country to play their first game and fell to 0-4 against top-25 teams in season openers.

Adams scored 16 points in the first half when UCLA shot 68 percent and led 63-29. The Bruins were 6 of 7 from 3-point range and made 11 of 13 free throws while holding James Madison to 34 percent field-goal shooting.

The Dukes were 9 of 15 from the free-throw line and had 12 turnovers.

Larry Drew II had a career-high 12 assists and Kyle Anderson grabbed 12 rebounds playing with a bone contusion on his right wrist that he sustained against UC Irvine.

UCLA scored 100 points in a game for the first time since Dec. 15, 2009, when the Bruins defeated New Mexico State, 100-68, in Pauley Pavilion.

Game No. 4 – November 19, 2012 Barclays Center – Brooklyn, N.Y. Georgetown 78, UCLA 70

Jordan Adams scored 22 points and Shabazz Muhammad had 15 in his collegiate debut as the No. 11 UCLA basketball team lost to Georgetown, 78-70, in a semifinal contest of the Progressive Legends Classic at the Barclays Center.

Adams scored at least 20 points for the fourth consecutive game, as UCLA (3-1) lost for the first time this season.

Georgetown's Otto Porter Jr. had 18 points, 11 rebounds, five assists, five blocks and three steals to lead the Hoyas (3-0) past UCLA.

Porter was hit in the head 6 minutes into the Hoyas' season opener. He sat out the second game of the season and then came back with a flourish.

The Hoyas shot 54.5 percent for the game (30 of 55), including 60 percent in the second half (18 of 30).

Markel Starks had a career-high 23 points for the Hoyas, who will face No. 1 Indiana in Tuesday night's championship game. The Hoosiers beat Georgia 66-53.

The 6-foot-6 Muhammad, one of the most highly sought after high school players last season, was declared eligible by the NCAA on Friday and this was his first game.

Muhammad, a freshman from Las Vegas, Nev., finished with 15 points on 5-of-10 shooting and was 2 of 4 from 3-point range in 25 minutes of playing time.

The Hoyas opened the second half on a 12-0 run - with Greg Whittington hitting two 3s - to take a 43-29 lead, their biggest of the game.

The Bruins (3-1) were within 59-53 on a 3-pointer by Norman Powell. But the Hoyas went on a 7-1 run that was capped by a hook shot by Nate Lubick with 6:17 to go. The Bruins did get within 77-70 on a 3 by Muhammad with 50 seconds to play.

Adams had 22 points to extend his UCLA record of a freshman scoring 20 or more points in every game to start his career.

Norman Powell led four players in double figures with 17 points and UCLA bounced back from an upset loss to beat Cal State Northridge, 82-56, in New Pauley Pavilion.

Kyle Anderson added 15 points and Larry Drew II registered a career-best 13 assists for the Bruins.

Travis Wear scored 14 points and Shabazz Muhammad rounded out UCLA's list of double digit scorers, logging 13 points and nine rebounds.

Stephan Hicks scored 11 points, and Landon Drew, the younger brother of Larry, added 10 points to lead Cal State Northridge (6-2), which fell to 1-7 against the Bruins in a series that began in 1992.

A dunk by Muhammad with 2:13 to go before halftime pushed UCLA's advantage to 14 points (at 38-24), the Bruins' largest first-half cushion in the ballgame.

The visiting Matadors never threatened in the second half after trailing 38-24 at halftime. UCLA opened the second half on a 13-2 run that extended its lead to 51-26. Jordan Adams and Powell hit consecutive 3-pointers, while Powell had two other baskets in the spurt.

The Bruins shot 62 percent from the floor in the second half and they outrebounded the Matadors 47-35 and scored 24 points off Northridge's 16 turnovers. UCLA's largest lead was 28 points with 4:26 remaining.

UCLA finished the game shooting at a 53.1 percent clip while holding CSUN to just 32.9 percent from the field. The Matadors went 5-of-26 from behind the 3-point line.

The Bruins made 18-of-29 shots in the second half (62.1 percent), as Powell recorded five of his game-high 17 points after halftime.

Jordan Adams scored 23 points, connecting on five of nine 3-pointers, as UCLA lost to San Diego State, 78-69, in the 19th annual John R. Wooden Classic at the Honda Center on Saturday night.

San Diego State's Jamaal Franklin scored 21 of his 28 points in the second half to help the Aztecs (5-1) win their fifth consecutive game, the first meeting between the two programs since 1991.

Xavier Thames added 19 points, including five 3-pointers, and DeShawn Stephens had 12 points after playing just five minutes because of a hip pointer in San Diego State's previous game against USC. The Aztecs had strong support and noisier fans in the announced crowd of 17,204.

Adams logged at least 20 points for the fifth time in eight games for UCLA, making 7-of-13 field goals in 28 minutes. Shabazz Muhammad added 16 points for the Bruins (5-3), who also received 10 points from Norman Powell and eight from Travis Wear. Larry Drew II finished with 11 assists and two turnovers.

Thames answered with two straight 3s and Franklin added another one to give the Aztecs the lead for good, 49-43.

The Bruins closed to 56-53 on Muhammad's first basket of the second half. The Aztecs outscored the Bruins 11-2, with Thames hitting their 11th 3-pointer and making two free throws in the spurt that gave San Diego State its largest lead at 67-55.

Game No. 9 – December 8, 2012 Reliant Stadium – Houston, Texas UCLA 65, Texas 63

Jordan Adams scored a game-high 18 points, including seven in the game's final 1:59, to lead UCLA past Texas, 65-63, in a non-conference meeting before 2,797 at Reliant Stadium on Saturday.

The Bruins (6-3) overcame a 59-51 deficit in the game's final 3:43, claiming a 62-61 advantage with 47.7 seconds left in regulation on a free throw by Shabazz Muhammad.

Saturday's game was played as part of a doubleheader featuring the women's teams from UCLA and Texas in the MD Anderson Proton Therapy Showcase at Reliant Stadium. The UCLA women's team defeated Texas, 62-42, earlier in the afternoon.

Muhammad finished with 16 points for UCLA, scoring in double figures for the sixth time in as many collegiate games. Kyle Anderson had 11 points and six rebounds, along with two assists, two steals and two blocks.

Texas (5-4) was led by Cameron Ridley's 14-point, 10-rebound effort. The Longhorns also received 13 points and eight rebounds from Javan Felix.

UCLA led throughout most of the first half and owned a 32-30 cushion at halftime. Texas claimed a 45-43 advantage with 11:30 to play in regulation and built its margin to eight points (59-51, at 3:43) before UCLA rallied in the game's final three minutes.

Adams keyed UCLA's late comeback, converting a pair of "old-fashioned" three-point plays at the 1:59 and 1:15 marks in the second half. Adams' six consecutive points erased a 61-55 deficit. Following Adams' free throw with 1:15 to play, Muhammad made one of two free throws with 47.7 seconds to play.

With the victory, UCLA evened the all-time series against Texas to 3-3. The Longhorns had won the previous three contests against UCLA, all within the last six seasons – in Dec. 2007, Dec. 2008 and Dec. 2011.

Shabazz Muhammad scored a career-high 25 points and UCLA rolled to a 95-53 victory over Prairie View A&M on Saturday night for its second straight win.

Fellow freshman Kyle Anderson added a career-best 16 points and 11 rebounds for the Bruins (7-3), who were playing their first game since winning by two points at Texas a week ago. Muhammad made all six of his free throws in UCLA's biggest margin of victory this season.

After a 7-7 tie to start, the Bruins controlled the rest of the game, leading by 23 at halftime and doubling that advantage in the second half.

Larry Drew II, who had nine assists, and Anderson hit consecutive 3-pointers for a 76-42 lead.

Prairie View's Josh Eleby was called for two flagrant fouls in the second half, with Adams and then Muhammad ending up on the floor as a result.

UCLA scored 11 unanswered points in the final 5:48 before coach Ben Howland sat the rest of his starters.

The Bruins scored 30 points off Prairie View's 18 turnovers and shot 56 percent from the field. They scored their second-most points of the season, trailing only the 100 they had in a win over James Madison.

Freshmen Adams and Muhammad have been UCLA's top scorers in nine of their 11 games. Muhammad was coming off a career-high 25 points against Prairie View A&M.

The Bruins led by 12 points in the first half, when they shot 54 percent. Adams scored 16 points, going 5 of 7 from the field.

Shabazz Muhammad added 16 points and Travis Wear had 15 for the Bruins (11-3), who have won six in a row for the first time since the 2010-11 season when they had two such streaks and last made the NCAA tournament.

UCLA never trailed in the second half, when its biggest lead was 16 points. But the Golden Bears (8-5) rallied behind Allen Crabbe to close within four points with 6:33 to play.

Crabbe, the Pac-12's leading scorer, had 16 of his 21 points in the second half. Justin Cobbs added 12 points and Richard Solomon had 11 points and 10 rebounds. The Bears have lost two in a row and five of their last seven.

UCLA snapped a three-game skid against Cal, having been swept last season. The Bruins had scored at least 89 points in their previous four games, but the offense came in fits and starts against the Bears.

Cal rallied in the second half on runs of 6-0, 7-0 and 6-0 before Crabbe's layup drew the Bears to 61-57. From there, the Bruins ended the game on an 18-8 run while getting defensive stops on the other end. They made 11 of 14 free throws down the stretch, with Anderson hitting six.

Cal jumped out to a 6-0 lead when UCLA missed its first six shots and committed two turnovers to start the game.

The Bruins got back into it and took their first lead on a flurry of 3-pointers by Muhammad, Wear and Norman Powell. Cobbs' basket tied the game at 21-all before UCLA closed the half on a 17-7 run to lead 38-28. Powell scored five points and Wear had four in the spurt.

UCLA held California without a three-point basket for the first time since April 1, 2006, when the Bruins did not allow LSU to score a three-pointer in an NCAA Final Four semifinal contest.

Powell hit a 3-pointer and Anderson made two free throws to pull the Bruins within one with 3:30 to play, but they came no closer in front of 12,254, the second-largest crowd of the season at the newly renovated arena.

The Ducks led by four points early in the game, despite committing four turnovers and going 7 for 20 from the field in the first nine and a half minutes.

Larry Drew II played a steady game at the point, dishing out nine assists while turning it over twice. David Wear helped make up for the loss of twin brother Travis (head injury) in the second half, scoring 15 points with eight rebounds.

Kyle Anderson shook off effects of a flu that caused him to miss a day of practice this week, grabbing 12 rebounds to go with eight points. Jordan Adams, another player who missed practice due to illness, scored 15 points after fighting through cramps against Arizona.

Arizona (16-2, 4-2) has had a knack for pulling out comeback victories this season. But it didn't happen on Thursday.

After a miserable start at both ends against UCLA, the Wildcats never fully recovered, pulling no closer than four points after digging a huge opening hole.

Nick Johnson scored 23 points, Mark Lyons added 16 and Solomon Hill had 13 and 10 rebounds for the Wildcats, who went 5 for 24 from 3-point range and struggled to slow the Bruins.

Shabazz Muhammad scored a game-high 22 points as UCLA dropped a 75-71 decision in overtime to USC before 12,821 in Pauley Pavilion on Wednesday night.

Jio Fontan and Aaron Fuller scored 15 points each for the visiting Trojans, who ended a four-game UCLA winning streak in the crosstown series.

Eric Wise added 12 points and 11 rebounds, J.T. Terrell and Byron Wesley each had 10 points for the USC (9-13, 4-5 Pac-12), which held the Bruins to 38 percent shooting while snapping a two-game losing streak.

Travis Wear, who returned after missing one game because of a concussion, added 16 points and Jordan Adams had 13 for the Bruins.

UCLA (16-6, 6-3) lost for the third time in its last four games. The Bruins trailed by 15 points early in the second half and played from behind until Adams hit a jumper with 30 seconds left in regulation to tie the game, 65-65, forcing overtime.

In the extra session, Adams' layup gave UCLA a 69-67 lead, its first since 6:49 of the first half. Fontan hit a 3-pointer before Muhammad's basket put UCLA back in front 71-70. Wesley answered for USC with a jumper that gave the Trojans a 72-71 lead. Travis Wear fouled Ari Stewart, who made both free throws for a 74-71 lead with 11 seconds left. Muhammad missed a 3-pointer and then Adams committed his first foul with 4 seconds left, sending Fontan to the line where he sealed the victory.

Playing in Pauley Pavilion, the Bruins moved out to a 21-15 lead to open the first of two regular-season meetings between the rivals. USC dominated the final 7:16 of the half with a 23-9 run that gave the Trojans a 38-30 halftime lead. Fuller scored 11 points in the spurt.

Drew II's buzzer-beating shot helped UCLA (17-6, 7-3 Pac-12) snap a two-game skid and remain one game behind first-place Arizona in the Pac-12 standings.

Shabazz Muhammad scored a game-high 22 points as UCLA's only player to finish in double figures. Drew II had nine points, six assists and five steals in a team-high 36 minutes.

UCLA's win helped the Bruins remain in a three-way tie for second place in the crowded Pac-12 standings. Sporting a 7-3 conference mark, UCLA rests in second place with Oregon and Arizona State.

Jahii Carson scored 22 points, Gilling tied his career high with six 3-pointers and finished with 18 points, and Carrick Felix had 16 points and a career-high 18 rebounds for the Sun Devils (20-9, 9-7).

The Bruins controlled overtime, outscoring ASU 9-4. They have won three straight and five of six.

UCLA led 67-62 before Arizona State ran off six straight points, taking a 68-67 lead on Carson's free throw that completed a three-point play after he was fouled by Adams.

Adams answered with a 3-pointer that put the Bruins back in front, 70-68, with 1:24 to play. But Drew turned the ball over and Gilling found Carson on the break for the tying layup with 39 seconds to go.

After a timeout, David Wear missed the go-ahead jumper for UCLA with six seconds left. Carson snagged the defensive rebound, dribbled furiously down the court and put up a jumper that hit the rim as regulation expired.

The Sun Devils beat UCLA by 18 points last month in the desert and led much of the game, but they couldn't complete their first sweep of UCLA since 2008-09. They have lost two in a row and four of five.

UCLA forward Travis Wear missed his second straight game with a right foot injury. He will likely return for Saturday's game against Arizona.

Shabazz Muhammad scored a game-high 18 points and Kyle Anderson added 17 points to lead UCLA past No. 11 Arizona, 74-69, before a record crowd of 13,727 in Pauley Pavilion on Saturday night.

Muhammad helped UCLA (22-7, 12-4 Pac-12) clinch the victory by making a pair of free throws with nine seconds to play in the second half, and UCLA swept the regular season series against the Wildcats (23-6, 11-6) for the first time since the 2007-08 season.

Saturday night's victory before national television audience on ESPN moved UCLA into a first-place tie with Oregon in the Pac-12. Both the Bruins and Ducks are 12-4 in conference action with two games remaining on their regular season schedules.

Anderson scored 15 of his 17 points in the first half and finished with seven rebounds and three assists.

Arizona's Grant Jerrett finished with 14 points, while Mark Lyons totaled 13 points in a team-leading 31 minutes.

Honored prior to the game as the team's lone senior student-athlete on "Senior Night," Larry Drew II totaled 14 points and nine assists in his final home game.

Drew II added nine assists, pushing his season total to 227, the second-highest single-season mark in school history.

UCLA led at halftime by a 40-36 margin and led by as many as 14 points twice in the second half.

Arizona cut UCLA's advantage to 59-54 after a three-pointer from Nick Johnson and a free throw from Jordin Mayes with 9:05 to play. UCLA led by 11 points - 70-59 - with 4:12 left in regulation before the Wildcats used a 7-0 scoring run to close the gap to 70-66 with 1:35 remaining.

Grant Jerrett nailed consecutive three-point baskets at the 1:35 and 1:10 marks, reducing UCLA's lead to just three points (72-69). After Mark Lyons missed a jump shot with 10 seconds to play, Muhammad grabbed the rebound and was fouled, converting both free throw attempts.

Jordan Adams scored 18 points and Shabazz Muhammad added 14 as UCLA (22-8, 12-5 Pac-12) dropped a 73-61 decision at Washington State in a Pac-12 contest on Wednesday night before 4,268 at Beasley Coliseum.

Washington State (12-18, 3-14 Pac-12) snapped a 19-game losing streak to UCLA, dating back to 1993. The Cougars claimed a 25-4 lead in the game's first 12 minutes.

Brock Motum led the host Cougars with 20 points and 11 rebounds, while Royce Woolridge added 19 points. Washington State snapped a nine-game losing streak with Wednesday night's win.

Washington State limited UCLA to 39 percent shooting from the field after having claimed a 35-24 lead by halftime. The Bruins made just one of their first 10 shots in the opening minutes of the game but closed the first half on a 20-10 scoring run after having made six of their last 13 shots.

UCLA had won its eight previous contests against Washington State, who entered the game in last place in the Pac-12 standings.

Washington State outrebounded UCLA by a 46-23 margin, picking up 21 of their 46 rebounds on the offensive glass.

The Bruins did not score their second field goal until the 10:26 mark in the first half, snapping a 6:01 scoreless drought as they trailed, 19-4.

Motum finished the game shooting 7-for-18 with 20 points in 40 minutes.

UCLA's Shabazz Muhammad nailed a three-pointer with 17:19 left in regulation, reducing Washington State's cushion to 37-31. The Bruins never got closer than six points of the Cougars. Muhammad finished 4-of-19 shooting from the field, including 2-of-11 from three-point range.

The Bruins will close the regular season at Washington on Saturday, March 9. Game time is 11 a.m. Saturday's Pac-12 contest will be televised by CBS.

Shabazz Muhammad scored a game-high 21 points and Jordan Adams added 17 as No. 23 UCLA clinched the Pac-12 Conference regular-season title with a 61-54 win at Washington before 8,747 at Alaska Airlines Arena.

The Bruins (23-8, 13-5) secured their fourth regular-season crown under 10th-year head coach Ben Howland, landing the conference title in outright fashion after Oregon lost at Utah, 72-62.

UCLA won for the first time at Washington since Jan. 2004, snapping an eight-game losing streak against the Huskies in Seattle.

Muhammad scored 14 of his team-leading 12 points in the second half as the Bruins overcame a four-point deficit in the final five minutes.

Scott Suggs led Washington with 14 points, connecting on 6-of-10 shots.

With the contest tied, 52-52, with 4:18 to play, Muhammad made one of two free throws at the 2:51 mark to put the Bruins ahead by one point. Muhammad returned to the foul line with 2:33 left and made a pair of free throws, pushing UCLA's cushion to 55-52.

Adams drew a foul with 1:14 left and made both free throw attempts to put ahead, 57-52. After Shawn Kemp, Jr. scored on a slam dunk, trimming the Bruins' margin to 57-54, Larry Drew II cut to the hoop and made a driving layup with 33 seconds remaining to put UCLA ahead, 59-54.

Drew II finished the game with seven points and a team-leading six assists, pushing his season assist total to a new single-season school record of 239 (surpassing Pooh Richardson's 236-assist total from 1989).

Washington led by as many as seven points early in the first half and entered halftime ahead, 31-30.

UCLA opened the second half using a 10-2 run to secure a 40-33 margin. But Washington rallied, tying the contest 45-45 with 8:58 to play in regulation.

The Bruins were blown out by the Sun Devils in Tempe and needed overtime to escape with a win at Pauley Pavilion.

Arizona State needed overtime to hold off Stanford in its tournament opener, but seemed the fresher team early in the quarterfinals, breaking down the Bruins off the dribble and getting the ball inside.

Shabazz Muhammad scored a team-leading 20 points as UCLA lost to Minnesota, 83-63, in a second-round NCAA Tournament game on Friday evening at the Frank Erwin Center.

Minnesota was led by Andre Hollins' 28 points, as the Golden Gophers (21-12) advanced to a third-round matchup against Florida. Austin Hollins scored 16 points for No. 11-seed Minnesota.

Even the conference title was dampened, however, when Jordan Adams, whom Howland described as his team's best all-around player, was lost to a broken ankle in the Pac-12 Tournament.

UCLA looked disjointed on offense and Muhammad his first seven shots in the first half. The freshman from Las Vegas, Nev., finished with a team-leading 20 points.

UCLA also got into foul trouble when forwards Travis Wear and Tony Parker both picked up three fouls in the first half. That robbed the Bruins of some much-needed muscle under the basket against the physical Gophers.

Austin Hollins scored 11 in the first half and his third 3-pointer pushed the Gophers to a 33-19 lead. UCLA pulled to 35-25 by halftime.

Muhammad got more involved in the second with seven quick points and UCLA pulled within five when Norman Powell made a 3-pointer. The Gophers responded with consecutive 3-pointers from Andre Hollins from opposite corners to push the lead back to 11.
