### TIP-OFF

- Kansas enters the season ranked No. 3 in the preseason Associated Press top-25 poll. The Jayhawks have been ranked fifth or higher in each of the last seven preseason polls.
- KU has been ranked in each of the last 201 polls dating back to the 2008-09 season. The 201-consecutive weeks in the polls is the longest active streak in the nation.
- Kansas is the preseason favorite by the conference coaches to win the 2019-20 Big 12 title. The Jayhawks have been the pick of the conference 19 times in the 24-year history of the league.
- Kansas has won 29-straight exhibition games dating back to the 2012-13 season. Overall, KU is 88-9 in exhibition play, including 61-4 in Allen Fieldhouse.
- Senior Udoka Azubuike was named the Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year by the league's coaches. He is the ninth Jayhawk to claim preseason Big 12 honors as the top player and the seventh in the Bill Self era at Kansas.
- Sophomore Devon Dotson joined Azubuike on the league's preseason All-Big 12 team. Dotson was the league's top-scoring freshman and was an All-Big 12 Third Team selection last season.
- Both Azubuike and Dotson received votes for the Associated Press preseason All-America team. Kansas was the only school with two players picked on the 21-man list.
- KU went 17-0 in home games last season, including a 16-0 record in Allen Fieldhouse. KU has gone undefeated in Allen Fieldhouse 20 times, including seven seasons since 2007-08.
- Kansas' 21-game home court winning streak enters 2019-20 as the fourth longest active in NCAA Division I.
- KU is 11-0 all-time against FHSU, including 8-0 in exhibition contests.

## ABOUT KANSAS

Kansas returns three starters and eight letterwinners from last season's 26-10 team which opened the season No. 1 in the national polls, won the NIT Season Tip Off, finished 12-6 in the Big 12, reached the Big 12 Tournament title game and advanced to its NCAA record 30th-consecutive NCAA Tournament.

Senior center Udoka Azubuike was named the 2019-20 Preseason Big 12 Player of the Year by the conference coaches and was joined on the preseason all-league team by sophomore guard Devon Dotson. Azubuike played in just nine games in 2018-19 averaging 13.4 points and 6.8 rebounds per contest. Dotson started all 36 outings for KU and led KU in assists (127) and steals (49) while scoring 12.3 points per game.

Sophomore guard Ochai Agbaji started 16 of 22 games played last season and averaged 8.5 points and 4.6 rebounds per contest. Guard Marcus Garrett returns for his junior campaign. A lock down defender, Garrett averaged 7.3 points and 4.2 rebounds per contest in 2018-19.

Sophomore forward David McCormack (3.9 ppg, 3.1 rpg) is also back. He started the final 13 games of last season. Senior forward Mitch Lightfoot (2.4 ppg, 2.9 rpg) finished second on the team with 33 blocked shots in 2018-19.

Guard Isaiah Moss leads the newcomers as he is a graduate transfer from Iowa where he averaged 9.2 points per game in 2018-19 for the Hawkeyes.

Other top KU newcomers include freshman guards Chris Braun from Burlington, Kansas, freshman guard/forward Tristan Enaruna from Flevoland, Netherlands, and freshman forward Jalen Wilson from Denton, Texas.

## ABOUT FORT HAYS STATE

Located in Hays, Kansas, with an enrollment of 15,908, Fort Hays State opens the season at Kansas, and is competing in its first exhibition of the season. The Tigers are coached by Mark Johnson who is in his 359-172 in 18 seasons at FHSU.

Tabbed fourth in both the MIAA preseason coaches' and media polls, out of 14 teams, Fort Hays State returns two starters and four letterwinners from last season's 18-11 team which placed fourth in the league with a 12-7 record.

The Tigers actually have six returners to the squad, however, with only four were on the floor last year and two redshirts. Senior guard Aaron Nicholson is the top returning scorer from last year. He averaged 9.0 points per game and led the team in 3-point field goals made (45). Senior guard Devin Davis is the top scorer off the bench from last year after averaging 8.6 points per contest. Junior forward Jared Vitztum is the top returning rebounder as he pulled down 5.3 per game while scoring 7.3 points per game in 2018-19. Sophomore guard Nyjee Wright also returns after scoring 4.8 points per game last year.

## THE SERIES

Kansas leads the overall series with Fort Hays State, 11-0, which includes a 8-0 record in exhibition contests. This series started in 1994 with the first two meetings, 1994 and 1998, being part of regular-season battles. The two teams have played exhibition contests every other season starting in 2005.

In the last meeting KU outdistanced Fort Hays State, 86-57, on Nov. 7, 2017, in Lawrence. Devonte' Graham led KU with 27 points. The first half had five lead changes and two ties before KU surged to a 38-33 halftime lead. Then-sophomore Udoka Azubuike just missed a double-double with 15 points on 6-of-8 shooting and nine rebounds. Then-freshman Marcus Garrett scored three points and pulled down seven rebounds. Other current Jayhawks who played in the game are: Mitch Lightfoot (16 minutes, three rebounds, no points), Chris Teahan (two minutes, no points)

## EXHIBITION HISTORY

Kansas is 88-9 in exhibition history and has won 29-straight exhibition contests dating back to Oct. 30, 2012. Last season, KU posted a 2-0 exhibition record with victories versus Emporia State and Washburn.

Kansas is 61-4 in exhibition contests played in Allen Fieldhouse. KU has won the last 50 exhibition games in Allen Fieldhouse beginning in 1994. With the 100-54 win versus Pitt State (10/31/17), Kansas has scored 100-plus points in 29 exhibition games, including 13 under head coach Bill Self. The Jayhawks are 56-2 in exhibition play in Self's 16 seasons at KU.

## Kansas is 0-0 all-time in games on Oct. 24 (0-0 including exhibitions)

Kansas has never played a men's basketball game on Oct. 24. Last season, KU opened the exhibition play defeating with a win over Emporia State on Oct. 25 in Lawrence. The earliest exhibition game in Kansas history occurred two seasons ago when KU opened the exhibition play defeating border rival Missouri, 93-87, in a hurricane relief fundraiser on Oct. 22, 2017. The game was hosted at Sprint Center in Kansas City.

### A KANSAS WIN WOULD...

Make Kansas 89-9 all-time in exhibition games ... Extend Kansas' home exhibition winning streak to 51 games dating back to the 1994 season ... Give KU its 30th-consecutive exhibition victory ... Make Kansas 12-0 against Fort Hays State, including 10-0 in exhibition games ... Improve Kansas head coach Bill Self to 57-2 in exhibition play while at KU, including 33-0 in Allen Fieldhouse ... Make KU 62-5 in exhibition games in Allen Fieldhouse.

### A KANSAS LOSS WOULD...

Break KU's 50-game home exhibition win streak, marking the first loss in an exhibition game in Allen Fieldhouse since a 93-82 loss to Australia on Nov. 9, 1993 ... Give Fort Hays State its first win against Kansas ... Make the KU-FHSU all-time series 11-1, including 9-1 in exhibition meetings ... Drop Bill Self to 56-3 in exhibition play while at Kansas, including 32-1 in Allen Fieldhouse ... Give KU a 61-5 record in exhibition play at Allen Fieldhouse and 88-10 all-time exhibition record.

### KANSAS NO. 3 IN PRESEASON ASSOCIATED PRESS POLL

For the seventh-consecutive season, Kansas men's basketball enters the preseason ranked fifth or higher as KU is No. 3 in the 2019-20 preseason Associated Press poll released Monday. Kansas has been ranked in the Associated Press polls for 201-consecutive weeks, which is the longest active streak in the nation.

Kansas received three first-place votes among the 65-member voting panel and trails Michigan State and Kentucky, respectively, in the 2019-20 preseason AP poll. Duke is No. 4 and Louisville fifth to round out the AP's top five.

Last season, Kansas entered the preseason ranked No. 1 nationally in the Associated Press poll for the third time in school history and ended at No. 17. The Jayhawks were ranked in the AP Top 10 for 12 weeks in 2018-19. In KU's 2018 Final Four run, the Jayhawks were preseason No. 4 by AP. Kansas was No. 3 in 2016-17, No. 4 in 2015-16 and No. 5 in 2014-15 and 2013-14. It is also the 10th time in the last 11 seasons that the Jayhawks have entered the season No. 7 or higher by the AP.

Under 17th-year and Hall of Fame head coach Bill Self, this is the 14th time that Kansas enters the season ranked seventh or higher in the Associated Press preseason poll and historically, the No. 3 ranking marks the 22nd time since the 1992-93 season that Kansas will enter the season seventh or higher.

Kansas will potentially play seven regular-season games against teams ranked in the AP preseason poll, including two in the top 10: No. 1 Michigan State (potential Maui Invitational), No. 4 Duke, No. 10 Villanova, No. 11 Texas Tech (twice), and No. 16 Baylor (twice).

### AZUBUIKE'S, DOTSON'S PRESEASON HONORS GROW

Kansas senior Udoka Azubuike and sophomore Devon Dotson have received numerous preseason honors heading into the 2019-20 season. On Oct. 22, the Associated Press listed the KU duo as receiving votes when it announced its preseason All-America

men's basketball team. A total of 21 players were recognized in the preseason announcement, voted on by a 65-member media panel. Kansas was the only school with two players listed.

Last week, Azubuike was named the Preseason Big 12 Player of the Year and Preseason All-Big 12 by the conference coaches. He was also named one of 20 on the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Center of the Year watch list. Dotson joined Azubuike on the Preseason All-Big 12 team and was one of 20 on the Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year watch list.

Azubuike played in nine games in 2018-19 before an injury sidelined him for the season. The 7-foot-0, 270-pound center from Delta, Nigeria, averaged 13.4 points and 6.8 rebounds while shooting 70.5 percent from the field last season. As a sophomore in leading Kansas to the 2018 Final Four, Azubuike led the nation with a 77.0 field goal percentage, which ranks second-best for a season in NCAA history and set the KU and Big 12 single-season records. He averaged 13.0 points and 7.0 rebounds while being named an All-Big 12 Third Team selection. Azubuike is a two-time Academic All-Big 12 selection.

As a freshman, Dotson (6-foot-2, 185) started every game for Kansas in 2018-19 and ranked 12th in the Big 12 in scoring at 12.3 points per game. The Charlotte, N.C., guard was a member of the 2019 All-Big 12 Third Team and the league's all-freshman team. Dotson also ranked sixth in the conference in assists (3.5), 11th in field goal percentage (48.2), tied for ninth in steals (1.4) and ninth in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.6). He averaged 15.7 points, 4.0 rebounds and 4.3 assists in leading KU to the Big 12 Tournament title game and was named to the event's all-tournament team.

### PRESEASON STARTING FIVE

Kansas is well represented on the Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame's Starting 5 awards released Oct. 14-18. Of the five awards announced, which consisted of 20 candidates per category, Kansas is listed on two of the watch lists. Sophomore guard Devon Dotson is up for the Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year Award for the second straight season. Senior center Udoka Azubuike for the Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Center of the Year Award, also for the second-consecutive year.

Historically, Kansas has had numerous student-athletes named as candidates and finalists, including last year with Dedric Lawson for the Karl Malone Power Forward of the Year Award. Cousy finalist. In 2017, Frank Mason III was the recipient of the Bob Cousy Point Guard of the Year Award.

### 2018-19, TOUGHEST SLATE IN THE NCAA

In 2018-19, the NCAA Evaluation Tool ("NET") showed that, not only did the Jayhawks endure the strongest schedule in the nation, but tallied some of the more impressive wins among the 353 teams in Division I. Kansas's strength of schedule ranked No. 1 in the final NET breakdown, with the Jayhawks playing opponents that had an average NET ranking of 54th, a figure that led the nation.

- Kansas has 2,274 all-time victories, second most in NCAA Division I history (Kentucky - 2,291).
- From the 2008-09 season to the present (11 seasons) Kansas has held 377 of its 405 opponents under 50 percent shooting.
- KU has held opponents to fewer than 100 points in 592 of its last 594 games. The last team to score 100 on Kansas in a 40-minute game was Oklahoma (100-78) on Feb. 27, 1990.
- Kansas has been ranked in the Associated Press top-25 poll for 200-consecutive weeks (as of 3/18/19). The next closest active streak is North Carolina at 100-straight weeks ranked. KU's current stretch began on Feb. 2, 2009.
- The Jayhawks have won 20 of their last 22 regular-season games against AP top-10 teams. Under Bill Self, KU is 40-20 against top-10 opponents, a figure that includes postseason play.
- KU has won at least 12 league games for 19-straight years, which is the longest active streak in the nation.
- Kansas won its 1,100th all-time conference game with a 72-67 win against Oklahoma State (3/2/19). The Jayhawks won their 300th Big 12 game vs. Oklahoma (2/19/18).
- Each KU senior class since 1986-87 has won at least 100 games.
- Kansas has won 25 or more games in each of its last 14 seasons, an NCAA DI record.
- Kansas is the only team in the Big 12 to have a .500 winning percentage or better series record against every conference foe.
- Kansas is first in the conference in wins with a 314-70 record in Big 12 regular-season games. Texas is next at 233-151. Including the league postseason championship, Kansas is tops at 360-82, while Texas is second at 258-174.
- KU is the only Big 12 school to have won a regular-season championship with two different coaches (Roy Williams and Bill Self).
- Under Bill Self, Kansas is 128-8 (94.1 percent) in Big 12 home games: 8-0 in 2004, 7-1 in 2005, 7-1 in 2006, 7-1 in 2007, 8-0 in 2008, 8-0 in 2009, 8-0 in 2010, 7-1 in 2011, 9-0 in 2012, 8-1 in 2013, 9-0 in 2014, 9-0 in 2015, 9-0 in 2016, 8-1 in 2017, 7-2 in 2018 and 9-0 in 2019.
- Under Bill Self, Kansas has experienced only one regular-season conference sweep by a Big 12 opponent. In 111 regular-season Big 12 home-and-home series during the Self era, Kansas has 73 sweeps, 37 splits and has been swept once.

The Jayhawks also collected some impressive wins during this gauntlet of a schedule, claiming 12 wins against teams in "Quadrant 1" (Home 1-30, Neutral 1-50, Away 1-75). KU was one of only seven teams in the nation with 12 or more Quad 1 wins in 2018-19.

### PRESEASON BIG 12 POLL

For the ninth-straight season and 19th time in the 24-year history of the league, Kansas tops the men's basketball Big 12 Coaches Preseason Poll. The Jayhawks received eight of a possible nine first-place votes by the coaches in 2019-20 poll. The coaches were not allowed to vote for their own team.

KU has won 18 outright or shared Big 12 regular-season championships in the previous 23 years since the inception of the league in 1996-97. Included was an NCAA-record 14 consecutive from 2005-18. KU's 61 overall conference titles is also an NCAA record.

Historically, the other 18 times Kansas has been named the preseason favorite, the Jayhawks won the Big 12 regular-season on 15 occasions. This includes the first preseason poll in 1996-97 in which only a media poll was conducted.

### BORDER SHOWDOWN TO REIGNITE

Kansas Athletics announced Oct. 21 that an agreement has been made with the University of Missouri to reignite the Border Showdown rivalry that will feature six men's basketball games, with the first matchup slated for next season on December 12, 2020 at Sprint Center in Kansas City. Until 2012, the Border

Showdown was known as the longest continuous rivalry west of the Mississippi River.

The Kansas-Missouri basketball series dates back to 1907, when the Jayhawks and Tigers met on back-to-back days in Lawrence on March 11-12, both MU wins. Those contests were the first of 269 meetings between the border rivals over the next 105 years, with the Jayhawks building a 174-95 edge in the all-time series. Kansas is 89-33 at home vs. Missouri, including 42-14 in Allen Fieldhouse, 65-53 in Columbia and the series is tied at 4-4 in Mizzou Arena.



### WHAT TO LOOK FOR IN 2019-20

- Kansas has won 21-straight home games and enters the season No. 4 on the active home court winning streak. Last year, KU went 17-0 at home, including 16-0 in Allen Fieldhouse. Buffalo and Tennessee are tied for the NCAA Division I lead at 26, with Gonzaga at 22 and Kansas at 21. Nevada is fifth at 18.
- The 2019-20 Jayhawks are looking to put the finishing touches on the winningest decade in program history. KU enters the season with a 304-66 record during the 2010s. The .822 win percentage this decade trails only the run in the 1990's that saw the Jayhawks win 82.7 percent of its games at 286-60.
- Kansas has won five straight in-season tournaments after claiming the 2018 NIT Season Tip-Off last season in Brooklyn, N.Y. Included in the run was the 2015 Maui Jim Maui Invitational, an event KU will compete in Nov. 25-27, in Lahaina, Hawaii.
- Kansas ranks second all-time in wins with 2,274. The Jayhawks are 26 victories from No. 2,300.
- Kansas is 788-113 all-time in Allen Fieldhouse and is 12 shy from win No. 800 in the historic venue.
- KU head coach Bill Self has a 473-106 record in 16 seasons at Kansas. He is 27 wins shy of 500 while at KU.
- Overall, Self is 680-211 in 26 seasons as a head coach, 20 shy of 700 all-time wins.
- Senior center Udoka Azubuike has a career field goal percentage of 74.4. The current KU career field goal percentage record is 62.0 percent by Mark Randall (1987, 89-91). The Big 12 career field goal percentage record is 63.7 by Ricardo Ratliffe of Missouri (2010-12).
- Senior Mitch Lightfoot enters the season tied for 20th on the KU career blocked shots list with 98. He is 49 blocks from the KU top 10.
- Senior transfer Isaiah Moss is 94 points from 1,000 for his career. In three seasons at Iowa, Moss accumulated 906 points.

- Bill Self was named the eighth coach in Kansas basketball history on April 21, 2003.
- In September 2017, Self was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in Springfield, Massachusetts.
- Self won his 600th career game on Dec. 6, 2016, with KU's 105-62 win against UMKC. He became the 46th coach in NCAA Division I to accomplish the feat and the ninth fastest.
- While at Kansas, Self has won a national championship, a KU- and NCAA-record 14-straight regular-season Big 12 Conference titles and eight league tournament championships.
- At Kansas, Self has won more regular-season league titles (14) than he has home losses (13) in Allen Fieldhouse. With KU's win versus Siena (11/18/16), Self became the winningest coach in Allen Fieldhouse, posting his 207th victory in the venue.
- In his first trip to the Final Four in 2008, Self's team won the title. Self is one of 11 active coaches in NCAA Division I to have won a national title. Kansas' 14-straight conference titles (2005-18) is the longest streak in NCAA Division I history.
- In Self's first 15 seasons at Kansas, he has coached 11 NBA Lottery selections including Andrew Wiggins and Joel Embiid, the No. 1 and No. 3 overall selections in the 2014 NBA Draft. Wiggins was the second-ever Jayhawk to go No. 1 with the other being Danny Manning in 1988.
- Self has guided his teams to 21-straight 23-win seasons dating back to 1998-99.
- Self's teams have won 18 league crowns in the last 21 years. His teams have never finished lower than third in the conference.
- Kansas' four-straight 30-win seasons from 2009-10 to 2012-13 are the most consecutive 30-win seasons in NCAA history (note: Memphis did it from 2006-09 yet later vacated the 2008 season).
- Self was the head coach for Team USA's U18 team that competed and won gold at the 2018 FIBA Americas Championship held in St. Catherines, Canada, in the summer of 2018.
- Self is one of five coaches in NCAA Division I history to have led three different teams - Tulsa, Illinois and Kansas - to the NCAA Elite Eight, including seven times with KU (2004-07-08-11-12-16-17). The other coaches are: Gene Bartow, John Calipari, Rick Pitino and Eddie Sutton.
- A 1985 graduate of Oklahoma State, Self began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Kansas in 1985-86 under head coach Larry Brown. He then returned to his alma mater as an assistant for seven seasons under coaches Leonard Hamilton and Eddie Sutton. His first head coaching job was at Oral Roberts in 1993-94, then Tulsa (1997-98), Illinois (2000-03) and Kansas (2003-present).
