





For the first time since 1996, Dave Loos will enter the season with one title beside his name... Head Basketball Coach.

Loos stepped down as APSU athletics director in April to concentrate solely on being the Governors head basketball coach. It ended an almost unheard of reign in today's college athletics world of one person handling an athletics department's two most demanding positions.

For more than 16 years, Loos helped APSU thrive as both its head basketball coach and the Athletics Director. His double duties aptly pointed out the respect Loos garnered both on and off campus. He applied the same common-sense approach to his athletics director's duties that have been representative of his APSU basketball tenure.

What is even more remarkable is that Loos, who is in his 24th season as Gobs head coach, owns the mark for APSU's longest basketball coaching tenure—only 13 other Division I coaches have longer tenures at their respective schools—and is the program's all-time wins leader, surpassing Dave Aaron in 2006-07. To honor such achievement, then-outgoing president, Dr. Sherry Hoppe, at the behest of several longtime basketball supporters, named the basketball floor Dave Loos Court.

In addition, Loos was inducted into the Austin Peay Athletics Hall of Fame in Feb. 2008.

On Dec. 12, 2009, Loos became the league's all-time wins leader, passing Cal Luther (319) for most victories while coaching in the OVC. His achievement was honored with the establishment of the Dave Loos Scholarship, a graduate scholarship to be awarded to an aspiring coach.

Loos enters the season ranked 34th among active coaches for most victories.

Such success didn't happen by accident. Loos not only has elevated APSU's program to the pinnacle of OVC prominence, but has done it as well with the dignity and class so reflective of the reputation he built as an athlete and as a high school/college coach.

He is only the second APSU coach to lead the Gobs to an OVC regular-season and NCAA Division I tournament berth. His APSU teams have advanced at least to the OVC tourney semifinals in 13 of the last 18 years. That has sustained his reputation of elevating his club's play during February-March.

More impressively the Governors have been have sported nearly a 60 percent winning percentage during those 13 seasons, including six 20-win seasons and four OVC regular-season titles. In fact, the Gobs own 10 double-digit OVC wins seasons in the new millennium.

That underscores a Governors program that has possessed a .500 or better OVC record in 18 of the last 19 seasons.

That has resulted in Austin Peay winning the OVC tournament and gaining an NCAA tourney berth in 1996; APSU capturing a 1997 league co-championship—the first since 1977; shocking the league by winning both a regular-season co-championship and tourney title in 2003; posting an unprecedented 16-0 OVC campaign in 2004; winning the 2006-07 OVC regular-season title by a

convincing three games and repeating it in 2007-08 while advancing to the NCAA tournament. Loos is the only APSU coach to earn multiple OVC Coach of the Year honors, in 1990-91, 1996-97, 2002-03, 2003-04 and 2006-07.

In addition, the Governors, who have been in three NCAA tournaments under Loos, have appeared in post-season tournaments in four of the last seven years.

As a result, Loos has achieved one of his program's goals when he took over in 1990-91—the Governors reclaiming their spot among the OVC elite and annually competing for the title.

Loos became Austin Peay's 11th head men's basketball coach on July 14, 1990. The likeable veteran coach has proven to be a "perfect fit" for the APSU program.

In his initial season, not only did his Gobs produce a winning (15-14) season after a previous 10-19 campaign, they displayed an exciting style as well.

He became only the third Austin Peay coach to earn OVC Coach of the Year, the first to be recognized in his first Gobs' season.

He then began building his own program with young men who reflected their coach both on and off the court and represented the University with great class.

The Gobs struggled record-wise (11-17 and 7-20) the next two seasons as Loos was reinventing the soul of the program. The young 1993-94 team began 0-7 but finished strongly at 11-16. Picked to finish eighth in preseason polls, the Gobs battled for the title much of the season, finally settling for third.

Since then APSU has developed a rich tradition of excellence.

In 1994-95, the Gobs finished the regular-season at 12-15 but pulled two upsets in the OVC tournament before falling to Murray State when star forward Bubba Wells suffered a leg injury that later turned out to be a surgery-necessitating right leg

stress fracture.

In 1995-96, the Governors again peaked late. In February, the Gavs fashioned an 8-2 record, including six straight victories. APSU entered the NCAA tourney with a four-game win streak before losing to Georgia Tech.

A year later, the Governors finished 17-14 overall—with All-America forward Wells missing the season's first 12 games—but won six of their final eight games, including a four-game winning streak that helped clinch a regular-season OVC co-championship.

In 1997-98, the Gavs, despite a rebuilding season, ended the season with a surprising 17-11 record and a fourth-place OVC finish.

In 1998-99, the young Gavs finished in a third-place OVC tie, although the 11-16 mark ended the string of winning seasons at three.

A year later, the Gavs ended 18-11. The 18 wins, at the time, represented the most regular-season wins by the Gavs since 1976-77.

APSU topped that mark in 1999-00 with a 22-10 record—the Gavs' first 20-win mark since 1986-87.

It was a 14-18 mark in 2001-02 as the Governors possessed only one senior. That returning group completely turned around those losing fortunes in 2002-03. In going 23-8, the Gavs won 15 of their last 16 regular-season games to win a share of the OVC title, the OVC tourney championship and a trip to the NCAA tourney. The 23 wins represented the third most in school history.

But the 2003-04 season saw the Gavs make a remarkable run through the OVC, becoming only the fourth team in league history to go unbeaten in conference play. The Gavs were just one of three teams in the country to finish league play without a loss.

Despite losing four senior starters, the Gavs were in the 2005 OVC regular-season

race until the final weekend and stunned Samford and top-seed Tennessee Tech in the OVC tourney before narrowly losing to Eastern Kentucky in the title tilt. The Gavs finished 9-7 in the OVC. APSU owned an 11-9 league mark in 2006 with a 17-14 overall mark with a young team.

In 2006-07, the Governors, despite having no seniors on the roster, overcame a slow start to finish at 21-12 overall, the third 20-win season during Loos's tenure. More importantly, the Gavs ran away with the OVC crown, going 16-4.


The 2007-08 season was even more remarkable. The odds-on choice to repeat as league champions, the Governors battle a much-improved league, yet finished with an identical 16-4 record and won the regular season by the same three-game margin. It was only the second time in OVC history that a team posted back-to-back 16-win seasons.

The Gavs' 24-11 overall record also tied the APSU mark for single-season wins, both overall and as a Division I program.

Beginning in 2008, the Governors have gone 19-14 (2008-09), 17-15 (2009-10), 20-14 (2010-11), 12-20 (2011-12) and 8-23 (2012-13). In addition to participating in the CBI three years ago, the Gavs appears in the 2009 CollegeInsider.com post-season tourney.

Loos has earned respect from peers for his coaching ability and the manner he directs the program, reflective in the fact he now is the only coach in OVC history to have as many as five "Coach of the Year" honors.

Loos came to APSU after four seasons as Memphis' top assistant. He joined Larry Finch in 1986 and helped direct his alma mater to an 85-43 record, including two NCAA tourney appearances and a Metro Conference tourney title during his



tenure.

Prior to joining Memphis State, Loos enjoyed four successful head-coaching seasons at Christian Brothers College in Memphis. He took over that program in 1982-83, and after an initial 16-14 season, recorded three straight 20-win campaigns. In 1985, CBC captured its first Volunteer State Athletic Conference crown, the VSAC tourney title and second place in the National Catholic Tournament.

For his efforts, he earned VSAC, NAIA District 24 and NAIA Area V Coach of the Year honors. He also was named the National Catholic Tournament Outstanding Coach.

Loos' move to CBC came after spending eight seasons as head coach at his prep alma mater, Mehlville High School in St. Louis. Taking over a program that previously had endured 11 straight losing seasons, Loos led his team to five winning campaigns, including a state tourney berth. He left



the school as its winningest coach.

The Missouri native played both basketball and baseball during his college days at Memphis State, where he was inducted into its athletic Hall of Fame in September 2002. Loos was the starting point guard for the 1968-69 Tigers, leading the team in minutes played. He also was an all-conference shortstop for the Tigers baseball team.

Upon completing his eligibility, he remained at

Memphis as an assistant in 1970. Following his graduation (1970), he officially began his coaching career as an assistant basketball and head baseball coach at CBC.

He and his wife, Phyllis, have four children, David, who broadcasts Gobs and Lady Gobs sports; Todd, who is in the music business; Brad, a former Gov who is associate head basketball coach at Central Missouri, and Nicole Peterson, a former dance team member who now is the APSU alumni director and serves as

Pom Squad advisor.

They also have nine grandchildren: William Daniel, Olivia Joy and Katie Grace, children of David and Pam Loos; Brady Jonathan, Rhyann Bailey and Charli Ann, children of Brad and Jennifer Loos, and Paxton David and Hudson Grant, son of Jake and Nikki Peterson, and Townes Henry Valentine, son of Todd and Jamie Valentine.

The 2008-09 Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year rejoined Austin Peay's basketball staff as assistant coach in 2010.

This is the second tenure Bret Campbell has served as an Austin Peay assistant. He was an assistant to Dave Loos and later associate head coach from 1992-99 as the Governors elevated into the OVC elite during his presence.

Campbell then went to UT Martin as head coach, beginning in 1999, until his resignation in Summer 2009 after leading the Skyhawks to their first-ever OVC regular-season title. In 2009-10, Campbell served as Director of Basketball Operations at Murray State.

Campbell joined an APSU staff that includes two former Govs players, Bubba Wells and Scott Combs, that he helped recruit and coach during the mid-1990s before he earned his first head-coaching assignment at UT Martin.

Campbell led the Skyhawks to their first Ohio Valley Conference championship in 2009 and their first National Invitation Tournament (NIT) appearance. The team posted a 14-4 league record that season and a 22-10 overall worksheet, the best overall record in school history and the most wins for UT Martin since playing as an NCAA Division I team. After winning a school-record 11 straight games, the Skyhawks cracked the CollegeInsider.com Mid-Major Top 25 Poll for the first time Feb. 23, 2009.

That season also saw UT Martin own the 11th highest attendance increase in the country, that average raising more than 1000 fans per game that the previous season.

Campbell led the Skyhawks to five consecutive OVC postseason tournaments; he recruited the Freshman of the Year or OVC Newcomer of the Year four times and recruited two-time OVC Player of the Year Lester Hudson.

Campbell went to UT Martin in March 1999, after serving nearly eight years at Austin Peay, including the 1995-96 season that saw the Governors captured the OVC tourney championship and appear in the NCAA tournament as well as the 1996-97 season where APSU captured a portion of the OVC regular-season title. He served as head coach for 292 games at UT Martin.

Prior to coming to Austin


Peay initially, Campbell served three seasons as a Central Florida assistant coach (1989-92). He served five seasons as recruiting coordinator under Joe Dean Jr., first at Birmingham Southern (1988-89) and then at Central Florida. Birmingham Southern won the 1990 NAIA title with players Campbell aided in recruiting.

A native of Anderson, Ind., he was captain of the 1979 Anderson High School state title runner-up team. He played college basketball at Valdosta State where he was a three-year starter at guard and served as team co-captain. He left Valdosta State as the program's all-time assists leader. After receiving his undergraduate degree in 1983, Campbell remained at the school as a graduate assistant for two years (1983-85).

He moved first to Kennesaw College from 1985-87 to initiate the school's intercollegiate basketball program before his next stop at Birmingham Southern.

Campbell has three children: daughter Caitlin, age 20, a student at Samford, and sons Cannon, age 17, and Carter, age 15.

The leading scorer in Austin Peay men's basketball history is now in his seventh season working with Governors players.

Charles "Bubba" Wells, the 1997 Ohio Valley Conference "Player of the Year" and two-time OVC "Male Athlete of the Year" who gained national attention for his miraculous return from a leg stress fracture, was hired in June 2005 as a full-time assistant.

Wells, who battled assorted leg problems throughout his college and pro careers, chose to take a different route with his basketball future—coaching. And he wanted to do it at the school where he built a reputation as not only one of the program's greatest players in history but as well in a conference where he was billed as one of the best during its 60-year existence.

Considered by many the most popular player in OVC history, Wells finished his career with 2,267 points—the first APSU player to reach 2,000 points—ranking him third all-time in the OVC. He was a three-time first-team All-OVC choice after being named the league's "Freshman of the Year" in 1993-94. Wells was the 1997 OVC "Player of the Year" and the 1996 and 1997 OVC "Male Athlete of the Year." He also was two-time Tennessee Sportswriters College Basketball "Player of the Year."

Wells jersey (13) was retired Jan. 22, 1998 and he was inducted into the APSU Athletics Hall of Fame, Feb. 8, 2003 after being two-time APSU Outstanding Male athlete (1995-96, 1996-97) and the 1997 Joy Award recipient as the most valuable senior athlete.

As a senior he was named third-team Preseason All-America by Athlon Magazine and all-district by both the U.S. Basketball Writers Association and National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC). He was named to the Basketball Times All-South team. He also captured his second straight Tennessee Sportswriters College Basketball "Player of the Year" award.

As a sophomore, Wells averaged 19.3 ppg and followed that up with a 26.3 ppg (third in nation) in 1995-96, earning the OVC Tourney MVP in leading the Gobs to a crown and NCAA tourney appearance. Wells still owns several OVC tourney marks.

But it was his senior year that drew nationwide attention. He missed the season's first 12 games with a stress fracture in his left tibia, requiring surgery to place a tibial nail in the lower leg. He underwent similar surgery following the 1994-95 season, needing five months to rehabilitate.

However, this time the rehab process took less than five weeks and in his debut game, he scored 39 points in 28 minutes. As a result, the performance and the surgery were featured in "USA Today." He went on to become the nation's unofficial scoring leader (he did not have enough games played to qualify for the official title), averaging 31.7 ppg, scoring 30 or more points 11 times including three 40-point games. His 1996-97 scoring mark also broke the legendary James "Fly" Williams (29.5 ppg) mark for single-season scoring average. He was called the "best offensive player" among draft-eligible seniors by NBA draft guru Marty Blake.

His performance also caught the attention of "The Los Angeles Times" in a front-page story about "The Man of Steel" and segments on both CBS NCAA College Basketball "at the Half" and a seven-minute feature—the "Real Rod Man"—on NBC's "Today" show. He was named InfoSport: Basketball's 1996-97 National Comeback Player of the Year. Prior to the season, he was featured in The Sporting News, Sports Illustrated and the Dick Vitale College Basketball Yearbook.

For his career, Wells averaged 21.6 ppg, 7.1 rebounds while shooting 52 percent from the floor.

He was drafted by the Dallas Mavericks in the second round of the 1997 draft and played one season before being traded to the Phoenix Suns and then to the Chicago Bulls. A torn achilles tendon and other leg/groin injuries slowed his professional career, although he played in the Philippines and the Euro League in Greece for two seasons. He then played for the Harlem Globetrotters for two years.

Now Wells is using his playing experience, and his effervescent personality and ability to communicate with young people at the coaching level.

On the floor, Wells works with the post players—he was one of the nation's best post-up players during his APSU career. He also is involved with opponent scouting.

Off the floor, he was named APSU's "Outstanding Young Alumnus" in 2006.

In his free time, he likes to spend time with his family, playing golf, fishing and watching movies.

In August 2007, he married the former Tracee Jones, former head women's basketball coach at Tennessee State. The previous summer Wells served as a supporter to Jones on NBC's hit TV show, "Deal or No Deal."

Wells has one daughter, Alyiah, age 14, and one son, Chase Richard, age 3.

Corey Gipson, who helped lead Austin Peay to consecutive Ohio Valley Conference championships in 2002-03 and 2003-04, returned to his alma mater as assistant basketball coach in Summer 2012.

Back in Spring 2012, Gipson left UNC Greensboro for Furman after a head-coaching change was made at the North Carolina school. However, when APSU head coach Loos beckoned, the idea of returning to his alma mater and closer to home (Sikeston, Mo.) was just too appealing.

“What Corey said to me was when you leave skin somewhere that means something,” said Loos at the time of the hiring. “Those people who saw Corey play and compete know he definitely left some skin here. He played hard, he competed hard so he has a special feeling for this place. That goes a long way as far as what you are going to put into something.”

“The main attraction is there is no place like home,” Gipson said. “You never forget what home has done for you and the experiences you had at the place where you got your start. I often revert back to the experiences at Austin Peay and the success of the basketball program, making the NCAA run and the NIT run, going undefeated in the Ohio Valley Conference. I often revert to those feelings, those experiences, to get me through life.

“I feel like I have an obligation to the program. Even though I have been other places and my heart has been in those programs while working there, my heart always has been with Austin Peay.”

Gipson quickly made an impact on the Governors program, his personality and drive—a characteristic from his basketball playing days—reflected in APSU’s 2013-14 recruiting class. It was representative of his rise in the men’s basketball coaching profession.

Gipson was named to the UNCG staff as an assistant coach on June 20, 2009 and a year later was elevated to associate head coach. A strong recruiter, Gipson earned his promotion to associate head coach mainly due to his exceptional recruiting skills. Along with being the program’s top recruiter, Gipson worked with the frontcourt players in 2011-12.

Gipson earned both his bachelor’s and master’s degrees from Austin Peay,

earning the first in 2004 and completing his graduate work in 2005. He also earned an associate’s degree from Three Rivers Community College in Poplar Bluff, Mo., before transferring to Austin Peay.

Before arriving at UNCG, he spent four seasons on the staff at Division II Virginia State University in Petersburg, Va. He coordinated the Trojans’ recruiting efforts for head coach Tony Collins, APSU’s longtime assistant coach who had recruited Gipson out of junior college.

As a player at Austin Peay, Gipson was a two-year starter at point guard, helping the Gobs become the top defensive team in the Ohio Valley Conference in 2002-03 and 2003-04. The Gobs went 45-18 in his two seasons—Gipson never lost a home game in two seasons, the Gobs going 27-0 over that timeframe.

He averaged 7.7 points, 2.1 assists and 2.3 rebounds per game during his career. He also made 94 three pointers in his career, shooting 34.1 percent from three-point range.

In his first game with Austin Peay, he led the way with 19 points as the Gobs upset Memphis to begin a run that ended in an NCAA tournament appearance. They were a perfect 16-0 in the OVC during his senior season. The Gobs were upset in the OVC finals that year, but earned a spot in the NIT, downing Belmont in the opening round and nearly knocking off George Mason – just two years before the Patriots’ Final Four run.

A native of Sikeston, Mo., Gipson was a Missouri Mr. Basketball nominee as a senior at Richland High School, averaging 30.9 points per contest. He earned all-state honors that season.

Hasse played in only 19 games in 2012-13. He initially injured his back in the Govs' Jan. 19 contest at home against Eastern Illinois. He sat out three straight games before playing three minutes against Tennessee State, Feb. 7, and re-aggravating the injury. He sat out the next three games before again re-aggravating the injury during shoot-around prior to the SIUE game, Feb. 16. Hasse made brief appearances in the Govs' final two games of the 2012-13 season.

The Naperville, Ill., native finished his junior campaign averaging 1.0 ppg and 1.4 rpg. He scored a season-high seven points against High Point in late December and grabbed a season-best three rebounds in APSU's home loss to Murray State, Jan. 12.

Hasse, who is special education major, has a desire to enter coaching after college.

Off the floor, Hasse has been involved heavily in SAAC, serving as President for the 2013-14 year.

He is a three-time member of the Athletics Director's Honor Roll, including once on the Dean's List. He was a member of the OVC Commissioner's Honor Roll for the 2012-13 year.

DUNN CENTER/DAVE AARON ARENA

When you say Austin Peay and the Dunn Center, opposing Ohio Valley Conference basketball players cringe...and rightfully so.

The Dunn Center has been one of the top mid-major playing venues in the south for several years and has continued to evolve into the most intimidating basketball facility in the Ohio Valley Conference.

In the last 15 seasons, the Governors have captured 80 percent of their home encounters, including back-to-back undefeated seasons in 2002-03 and 2003-04. In total, APSU has enjoyed 11 double-digit home winning seasons in that span.

The Winfield Dunn Center became home of the Governors and Lady Gobs indoor athletics in 1975 after ground was broken for the \$5.3 million, 9,000-seat structure in February 1973.

The 132,000 square-foot complex, officially named the Winfield Dunn Health and Physical Education Building and Convocation Complex in honor of Governor Dunn, is a dominating edifice with 78 feet separating the top of the building from its maplewood playing surface. The Dunn Center replaced the Memorial Gymnasium, affectionately called "The Little Red Barn," which served as the Governors homecourt from 1952 until the Dec. 1, 1975 tip-off.

On Jan. 16, 1988, the basketball arena was named Dave Aaron Arena in honor of the school's former athletics director, football coach and then all-time winningest basketball coach.

Several improvements and modifications have taken place over the years, including the most recent upgrades of a new scoreboard equipped with a new high definition (HD) videoboard for the 2013-14 season. It is a fully integrated sports solution that includes a control system to operate and integrate the displays of video replays plus a package of many custom animations, including sponsored game elements and crowd interaction plus much more. That new technology helped replace the video screens that were installed in Fall 2004.

In addition, new table with LED technology helps generate revenue while aesthetically reducing clutter, giving sponsors exclusive, and colorful, vivid advertising messages.

Also, the floor lighting has been replaced to allow fans to better see Lady Gobs and Governors events and also accommodate photography needs. An elevator was installed in the late 1990s to better accommodate the handicapped.

But in Fall 2004, some major upgrades occurred, with new cushioned telescopic seating on the lower level east and west north end-zone areas.

In Summer 2007, it was announced more renovations and upgrades would take place, with new telescopic cushioned seating being added to the second level.

In addition, former President Sherry Hoppe announced the playing surface would be named "Dave Loos

Court." The floor itself had an even newer look to in the 2012-13 season as the complete floor was replaced with one the finest maple hardwood surfaces in the Mid-South.

The Dunn Center is home of Governors basketball and Lady Gobs volleyball and basketball. It also serves as a multipurpose practice facility for track, baseball and softball indoor workouts.

APSU's athletic offices are located in the Dunn Center with the exception of tennis and baseball. The men and women's tennis office are located in the Governors Tennis Center, behind the right field fence at Lady Gobs softball field.

In Winter 2004, the Governors baseball offices were moved to the former home of the student newspaper, The All-State, to be closer to Raymond C. Hand Park.

The Dunn Center also houses the University's training facility as well as the sports information offices along with marketing/promotions office.

It also is home to the David P. Roe Academic Services Center, constructed in 2006 and located on the second level's south end. The north end continues to house the Governors Club, Austin Peay's booster club. In fact, the Governors Club also uses the third level for many of its booster-club activities, including pre-game and halftime hospitality during the basketball season.

Austin Peay athletics also work out in the newly renovated weight room, conveniently located in the Dunn Center's lower level south end. They also have access to dressing rooms, also subject to major renovations in Summer/Fall 2004.

Entering the facility's front lobby, visitors are impressed by the Hall of Fame area, honoring APSU's greatest former athletes, administrators and supporters.

Stepping just inside the Dunn Center one can look to both ends of the arena to observe APSU's retired jerseys.

CENTURY GAMES

With the return of the shot clock and the three-point shot in the past two decades, 100-point games have been on the upswing in college basketball.

For Austin Peay, in fact, the cycle took a definite swing with four 100-point games in 1986-87, the Govs winning three of them; five in 1987-88, APSU winning just one, and six in 1988-89, the Govs winning five.

With a change of coaches, also involved a style change during 1990-91. Dave Loos' team played in six 100-point games. The Govs scored the most single-game points in Dunn Center history with a 122-96 win against Milligan. APSU and Morehead State set a Dunn Center mark for combined points scored (237) in the Govs' 124-113 double-overtime loss. Morehead also set an arena mark for most points scored by the opposition.

In 1991-92, the Govs participated in five 100-point games. The two wins came back to back, a 102-100 decision against Morehead State and 103-97 verdict against SEC foe Mississippi State. In total, Loos' Govs have played in 29 games in which at least one team scored 100 points, including the 2007-08 season's 104-82 loss at Memphis and the Governors 121-116 triple overtime defeat at Southeast Missouri.

Over the years, the Govs have been involved in 124 games where at least one team scored 100 points, with 13 of those both clubs scoring 100 or more. Austin Peay has won 58 of the century games. Of the 13 which both teams scored 100 or more, the Govs are 5-8. The Dunn Center/Dave Aaron Arena has held 33 100-point contests, with APSU holding a 29-4 edge.

Only one century-mark game occurred while Austin Peay was a junior college, and Freed-Hardeman won that one, 104-30, during the 1934-35 season. An opponent of the 100-point mark was David Aaron (1946-62), who purposely passed up scoring opportunities to avoid his team hitting the century figure and causing opposition possible embarrassment. The long-time successful coach was forced into the situation during the 1958-59 season when Harry Gallatin made his college coaching debut for Southern Illinois. The Govs won the game 106-100 in Memorial Gymnasium ("Little Red Barn").
