In today's college athletics world, it is hard to imagine one person handling an athletics department's two most demanding positions.

But Dave Loos has helped APSU thrive as both its head basketball coach and the Athletics Director. In fact, it is nearly unheard of in the world of NCAA athletics an athletics director also coaching, especially a sport as prominent as men's basketball.

What is remarkable is Loos, who is the dean of Ohio Valley Conference basketball coaches, also is the longest-serving athletics director at his university—he currently is in his ninth season.

His double duties aptly point out the respect Loos earned both on and off campus. His common-sense approach to athletics director's duties have been with the same diligence that have been so representative of his APSU basketball tenure. What is even more remarkable is that Loos, who begins his 17th season as Gobs head coach—and 20th overall, in 2006-07 will now own the mark for APSU's longest basketball coaching tenure. In fact, Loos entered the season needing just nine wins to become the program's all-time leader for victories.

And that didn't happen by accident. Loos not only has elevated APSU's program to the pinnacle of OVC prominence, but has done it as well with the dignity and class so reflective of the reputation he built as an athlete and as a high school/college coach.

He is only the second APSU coach to lead the Gobs to an OVC regular-season co-championship and NCAA Division I tournament berth. His APSU teams have advanced to at least the OVC tourney semi-finals in 9 of the last 12 years. Loos has sustained his reputation of elevating his club's play during February-March, where the Gobs own a .675 winning percentage over the last 11 seasons.

Loos has owned a .500 OVC record or better OVC in each of the of the last 13 seasons and are second in winning percentage during that span.

Loos has resulted in Austin Peay winning the Ohio Valley Conference tournament and gaining an NCAA tourney berth in 1996; APSU capturing a 1997 league co-championship—the first since

1977, shocking the league by winning both a regular-season co-championship and tourney title in 2003 and posting an undefeated OVC campaign in 2004. Loos is the only APSU coach to earn multiple OVC Coach of the Year honors, in 1990-91, 1996-97, 2002-03 and again in 2003-04 with an unprecedented 16-0 league campaign.

As a result, Loos achieved one of his program's goals—the Governors reclaiming their spot among the OVC elite and annually competing for the title.

Loos became Austin Peay's 11th head men's basketball coach on July 14, 1990. The likeable 59-year-old has proven to be a "perfect fit" for the APSU program.

In his initial season, not only did his Gobs produce a winning (15-14) season after a previous 10-19 campaign, they displayed an exciting style as well.

The Gobs struggled record-wise (11-17 and 7-20) the next two seasons as Loos was reinventing the soul of the program. The young 1993-94 team began 0-7 but finished strongly at 11-16. Picked to finish eighth in preseason polls, the Gobs battled for the title much of the season, finally settling for third.

Since then APSU has developed a rich tradition of excellence.

In 1994-95, the Gobs finished the regular-season at 12-15 but pulled two upsets in the OVC tournament before falling to Murray State when star forward Bubba

Wells suffered a leg injury that later turned out to be a surgery-necessitating right leg stress fracture.

In 1995-96, the Governors again peaked late. In February, the Goves fashioned an 8-2 record, including six straight victories. APSU entered the NCAA tourney with a four-game win streak before losing to Georgia Tech.

A year later, the Governors finished 17-14 overall with All-America forward Wells missing the season's first 12 games but won six of their final eight games, including a four-game winning streak that helped clinch a regular-season OVC co-championship.

In 1997-98, the Goves, despite a rebuilding season, ended the season with a surprising 17-11 record and a fourth-place OVC finish.

In 1998-99, the young Goves finished in a third-place OVC tie, although the 11-16 mark ended the string of winning seasons at three.

A year later, the Goves ended 18-11. The 18 wins represented the most regular-season wins by the Goves since 1976-77.

APSU topped that in 1999-00 with a

22-10 record the Goves' first 20-win mark since 1986-87.

It was a 14-18 mark in 2001-02 as the Governors possessed only one senior. After returning group completely turned around those losing fortunes in 2002-03. In going 23-8, the Goves won 15 of their last 16 regular-season games to win a share of the OVC title, the OVC tourney championship and a trip to the NCAA tourney. The 23 wins represented the third most in school history.

But the 2003-04 season saw the Goves make a remarkable run through the OVC, becoming only the fourth team in league history to go unbeaten in conference play. The Goves were just one of three teams in the country to finish league play without a loss.

Despite losing four senior starters, the Goves were in the 2005 OVC regular-season race until the final weekend and stunned Samford and top-seed Tennessee Tech in the OVC tourney before narrowly losing to Eastern Kentucky in the title contest. The Goves finished 9-7 in the OVC.

The Governors owned an 11-9 league mark a year ago with a 17-14 overall mark with a young team.

Loos has earned six "Coach of the Year" citations, four from his fellow OVC coaches and two from the Tennessee State Sports-



writers Association.

He was named OVC "Coach of the Year" after his first APSU season (1990-91) in leading the Goves to a much-improved 15-14 record. He then began building his own program with young men who reflected their coach both on and off the court and

represented the University with great class.

In addition, Loos has earned respect from peers for his coaching ability and the manner he directs the program, resulting in his first-season OVC coaching honor. He was only the third APSU coach to earn such an award, the first to be recognized in his first Govs season.

Loos came to APSU after four seasons as Memphis's top assistant. He joined Larry Finch in 1986 and helped direct his alma mater to an 85-43 record, including two NCAA tourney appearances and a Metro Conference tourney title during his tenure.

Prior to joining Memphis State, Loos enjoyed four successful head-coaching seasons at Christian Brothers College in Memphis. He took over that program in 1982-83, and after an initial 16-14 season, recorded three straight 20-win campaigns. In 1985, CBC captured its first Volunteer State Athletic Conference crown, the VSAC tourney title and second place in the National Catholic Tournament.

For his efforts, he earned VSAC, NAIA District 24 and NAIA Area V Coach of the Year honors. He also was named the National Catholic Tournament Outstanding Coach.



Loos's move to CBC came after spending eight seasons as head coach at his prep alma mater, Mehlville High School in St. Louis. Taking over a program that previously had endured 11 straight losing seasons, Loos led his team to five winning campaigns, including a state tourney berth.

He left the school as its winningest coach.

The Missouri native played both basketball and baseball during his college days at Memphis State, where he was inducted into its athletic Hall of Fame in September 2002. Loos was the starting point guard for the 1968-69 Tigers, leading the team in minutes played. He also was an all-conference short-stop for the Tigers baseball team.


Upon completing his eligibility, he remained at Memphis as an assistant in 1970. Following his graduation (1970), he officially began his coaching career as an assistant basketball and head baseball coach at CBC.

He and his wife, Phyllis, have four children, David, who broadcasts Governors and Lady Govs sports; Todd, who is in the music business; Brad, the former Gov who is an assistant basketball coach at Central Missouri, and Nicole, who formerly was a member of the school's dance team and works in sports marketing at the College of Charleston.

He and Phyllis have two grandchildren William Daniel, age 4, and Olivia Joy, age 1, children of David and Pam Loos.

Scott Combs begins his 11th season with the Austin Peay basketball program, his fifth as full-time assistant.

He came to APSU in 1996-97 as a player. Since then, he has been a fixture in the program, working his way up the coaching ladder.

Following his playing days, Combs assumed the role as administrative assistant while in graduate school. He and former high school and Govs teammate Joe Sibbitt were the first recipients of the Leon Bibb Hall of Fame Scholarship in 1999-00. In that role he served as the program's video coordinator along with helping in all day-to-day operations. He also served as administrative assistant to the athletics director that year.

A year later, he was elevated to assistant coach and has played an integral part in the Govs successes since, which has seen the Govs record 20 or more wins in three of the last five years and back-to-back OVC championships. The 2002-03 team advanced to the NCAA tournament while the 2003-04 club won a game in the NIT. Also during his coaching tenure APSU captured the 2000 Top of the World Classic championship.

In 2002, Combs was elevated from a restricted coaching role into full-time status. In his current role, Combs helps in the daily operations of the program, working in all coaching aspects, in particular with player development, monitoring academic progress and scouting opponents. He also serves as the program's recruiting coordinator.

In addition, each June he serves as the director of the Dave Loos Basketball Camps.

A versatile front-liner who was known for his selfless play and other intangibles he brought to the floor, Combs played his final two seasons (1997-99) at APSU after transferring from Missouri, where he played his freshman (1994-95) and sophomore (1995-96) seasons. He was named honorable mention Big 8 all-Academic while at Missouri. In addition, he was a member of a Missouri squad that played in the 1995 NCAA tournament after beating Indiana the Tigers lost to eventual national champion UCLA on a last-second shot and the 1996 NIT.

The Indianian is one of the select few who has played and coached in both the

NCAA and NIT tournaments.

Combs sat out 1996-97 at APSU as a transfer redshirt. After serving as a reserve guard and forward as a junior, Combs ended up being the Govs starting post player as a senior. He averaged 6.8 points, shooting a team-best 54.8 percent from the floor, and 5.3 rebounds per game. His rebound totals ranked 14th in the OVC.

On the floor, Combs earned CoSIDA District IV Academic All-District as a senior, when he posted a 4.0 GPA. He also served as president of the Student Athlete Advisory Council (SAAC).


Combs graduated in 1997 with bachelor's degrees in mathematics and education. He began his graduate work while completing his final season of eligibility, earning his master's in Sports Administration.

A Lebanon, Ind., native, he starred at Paoli High School, scoring a school record 1958 points, ranking him 31st all-time in the state. He was voted runner-up Indiana Mr. Basketball in 1994 and was selected to play on the prestigious Indiana All-Star team. His prep career followed an AAU one that saw him voted All-American six times.

In addition to coaching, Combs formerly served as a physical education teacher (2000-02) at St. Mary's Catholic School. He and former Govs teammate Mike Head, now a local prep coach, held local summer basketball camps in addition to working APSU camps. Currently, he serves as co-SAAC advisor.

Combs is married to the former Casey Jenkins, who is Internet Manager at Jenkins and Wynne-Ford-Lincoln-Mercury-Honda. He enjoys playing cards, water sports, playing the piano and golfing in his free time.

□ e leading scorer in Austin Peay men's basketball history is back on campus.

Charles "Bubba" Wells, the 1997 Ohio Valley Conference "Player of the Year" and two-time OVC "Male Athlete of the Year" who gained national attention for his miraculous return from a leg stress fracture, was hired in June 2005 as a full-time assistant.

Wells, who battled assorted leg problems throughout his college and pro careers, chose to take a different route with his basketball future—coaching. And he wanted to do it at the school where he built a reputation as not only one of the program's greatest players in history but as well in a conference where he was billed as one of the best during its nearly 60-year existence.

Considered by many the most popular player in OVC history, Wells finished his career with 2,267 points—the first APSU player to reach 2,000 points—ranking him third all-time in the OVC. He was a three-time first-team All-OVC choice after being named the league's "Freshman of the Year" in 1993-94. Wells was the 1997 OVC "Player of the Year" and the 1996 and 1997 OVC "Male Athlete of the Year." He also was two-time Tennessee Sportswriters College Basketball "Player of the Year."

Wells jersey (13) was retired Jan. 22, 1998 and he was inducted into the APSU athletics Hall of Fame, Feb. 8, 2003 after being two-time APSU Outstanding Male athlete (1995-96, 1996-97) and the 1997 Joy Award recipient as the most valuable senior athlete.

As a senior he was named third-team Preseason All-America by Athlon Magazine and all-district by both the U.S. Basketball Writers Association and National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC).

He was named to the Basketball Times All-South team. He also captured his second straight Tennessee Sportswriters College Basketball "Player of the Year" award.

As a sophomore, Wells averaged 19.3 ppg and followed that up with a 26.3 ppg (third in nation) in 1995-96, earning the OVC Toumey MVP in leading the Govs to a championship and NCAA tournament appearance. Wells still owns several OVC tournament records.

But it was his senior year that drew nationwide attention. He missed the season's first 12 games with a stress fracture in his left tibia, requiring surgery to place a tibial nail in the lower leg. He had undergone similar surgery following the 1994-95 sea-

son, needing five months to rehabilitate.

However, this time the rehab process took less than five weeks and in his debut game, he scored 39 points in 28 minutes. As a result, the performance and the surgery were featured in "USA Today." He went on to become the nation's unofficial scoring leader (he did not have enough games played to qualify for the official title), averaging 31.7 ppg, scoring 30 or more points 11 times including three 40-point games. His 1996-97 scoring mark also broke the legendary James "Fly" Williams (29.5 ppg) mark for single-season scoring average. He was called the "best offensive player" among draft-eligible seniors by NBA draft guru Marty Blake.

His performance also caught the attention of the Los Angeles Times in a front-page story about the "Man of Steel" and segments on both CBS NCAA College Basketball "at the Half" and a seven-minute feature "the Real Rod Man" on NBC's "Today" show. He was named InfoSport: Basketball's 1996-97 National Comeback Player of the Year. Prior to the season, he was featured in the Sporting News, Sports Illustrated and the Dick Vitale College Basketball Yearbook.

For his career, Wells averaged 21.6 ppg, 7.1 rebounds while shooting 52 percent from the floor.

He was drafted by the Dallas Mavericks in the second round of the 1997 draft and played one season before being traded to the Phoenix Suns and then to the Chicago Bulls. A torn achilles tendon and other leg/groin injuries slowed his professional career, although he played in the Philippines and the Euro League in Greece for two seasons.

He then played for the Harlem Globetrotters the last two years.

Now Wells is using his playing experience, and his effervescent personality and ability to communicate with young people, at the coaching level.

On the floor, Wells works with the post players—he was one of the nation's best post-up players during his APSU career.

Wells has one daughter, Alyiah, age five. In his free time, he likes to spend time with his daughter, playing golf, fishing



and watching movies.

He recently was named APSU's "Outstanding Young Alumnus."

He also served as a supporter recently on NBC's hit TV show, "Deal or No Deal."

Boyd Copeland is in his first season with the Governors basketball program after a three-season stalwart playing career at Georgia State. He is serving as graduate assistant.

His basketball duties will include film exchange, office duties and on-floor assistance.

The Chattanooga native played in all 87 games at guard during his three-year career at Georgia State with 55 starts. He left the program sixth all-time in school history with 288 assists.

In fact, his three-year season totals were 649 points scored, 344 rebounds, 288 assists, 99 steals and 16 blocked shots. Copeland scored in double-figures 29 times. He recorded three or more assists in 46 games.

As a senior, he led the team in assists (105), ranking seventh in the CAA in that category. After leading the team in rebounding as a junior, he came back to finish second in rebounding (4.3 rpg) in 2005-06. Copeland also was third in scoring (8.8), with 14 double-figure scoring game.

He scored a season-high 18 points in a season-opening CAA win against Delaware. He also produced 17 points, with 12 rebounds and six assists in a game later that season and had nine assists in a contest

at Towson. He flirted with a triple-double game vs. Louisiana-Lafayette, finishing with 10 points, nine assists and eight rebounds.

His final game at Georgia State saw him score 11 points in an overtime CAA tourney loss to George Mason, who advanced to the NCAA Final Four.

Copeland's junior season saw him lead the team in three categories: assists (111), rebounds (151) and steals (38). Boyd also averaged 9.8 points per game (283 scored). He played as a reserve at point guard as a sophomore.

As a freshman, Copeland started for 15-11 Chattanooga State and averaged 12.4 points per game.

Copeland was a Class AAA All-State pick at Red Bank. He led the city in assists per game, while setting Red Bank's all-time school record for scoring. Copeland lettered four years for Coach Scott Cook at Red Bank.
