Dave Loos, the Governors head basketball coach is in his eighth year as Austin Peay's athletics director. Loos was named to the post in May 1997 and took over the duties July 1 of that same year.

The dual role is almost unheard of in this day of college athletics—he is one of only three Division I college basketball coaches who also serve as athletes director. He will begin his 15th season as Austin Peay's head basketball coach in 2004-05.

His double duties aptly point out the respect Loos earned both on and off campus. His common-sense approach to athletics director's duties have been with the same diligence that have been so representative of his APSU basketball tenure.

That has resulted in Austin Peay winning the Ohio Valley Conference tournament and gaining an NCAA tourney berth in 1996; APSU capturing a 1997 league co-championship—the first since 1977, shocking the league by winning both a regular-season co-championship and tourney title in 2003 and posting an undefeated OVC campaign in 2004. Loos is the only APSU coach to earn multiple OVC Coach of the Year honors, in 1990-91, 1996-1997, 2002-03 and again in 2003-04, coming off an unprecedented 16-0 league campaign.

Loos not only has elevated APSU's program to the pinnacle of OVC prominence, but has done it as well with the dignity and class so reflective of the reputation he built as an athlete and as a high school/college coach.

He is only the second APSU coach to lead the Gobs to an OVC regular-season co-championship and NCAA Division I tournament berth. His APSU teams have advanced to at least the OVC tourney semifinals in 8 of the last 10 years. That has sustained his reputation of elevating his club's play during February-March, where the Gobs own a .679 winning percentage over the last 10 seasons.

The Gobs have owned a .500 record or better OVC record in each of the of the last

11 seasons and are second only to Murray State in winning percentage during that span.

As a result, Loos achieved one of his program's goals—the Governors reclaiming their spot among the OVC elite and annually competing for the title.

Loos became Austin Peay's 11th head men's basketball coach on July 14, 1990. The likeable 57-year-old has proven to be a "perfect fit" for the APSU program.

In his initial season, not only did his Gobs produce a winning (15-14) season after a previous 10-19 campaign, they displayed an exciting style as well.

The Gobs struggled record-wise (11-17 and 7-20) the next two seasons as Loos was reinventing the soul of the program. The young 1993-94 team began 0-7 but finished strongly at 11-16. Picked to finish eighth in preseason polls, the Gobs battled for the title much of the season, finally settling for third.

Since then APSU has developed a rich tradition of excellence.

In 1994-95, the Gobs finished the regular-season at 12-15 but pulled two upsets in the OVC tournament before falling to Murray State when star forward Bubba Wells suffered a leg injury that later turned out to be a surgery-necessitating right leg stress fracture.

In 1995-96, the Governors again peaked late. In February, the Gobs fashioned an 8-2 record, including six straight victories. APSU entered the NCAA tourney with a four-game win streak before losing to Georgia Tech.

A year later, the Governors finished 17-14 overall—with All-America forward Wells missing the season's first 12 games—but won six of their final eight games, including a four-game winning streak that helped clinch a regular-season OVC co-championship.

In 1997-98, the Gobs, despite a rebuilding season, ended the season with a surprising 17-11 record and a fourth-place OVC finish.

In 1998-99, the young Gobs finished in a third-place OVC tie, although the 11-16 mark ended the string of winning seasons at three.

A year later, the Govs ended 18-11. The 18 wins represented the most regular-season wins by the Govs since 1976-77.

APSU topped that record a year later with a 22-10 record—the Govs' first 20-win mark since 1986-87.

It was a 14-18 mark in 2001-02 as the Governors possessed only one senior. That returning group completely turned around those losing fortunes in 2002-03. In going 23-8, the Govs won 15 of their last 16 regular-season games to win a share of the OVC title, the OVC tourney championship and a trip to the NCAA tourney. The 23 wins represented the third most in school history.

But the 2003-04 season saw the Govs make a remarkable run through the OVC becoming only the fourth team in league history to go unbeaten in conference play. The Govs were just one of three teams in the country to finish league play without a loss.

Entering his 15th Govs' coaching season, Loos has earned six "Coach of the Year" citations, four from his fellow OVC coaches and two from the Tennessee State Sportswriters Association.



He was named OVC "Coach of the Year" after his first APSU season (1990-91) in leading the Governors to a much-improved 15-14 record. He then began building his own program with young men who reflected their coach both on and off the court and represented the University with great class.

In addition, Loos has earned respect from peers for his coaching ability and the manner he directs the program, resulting in his first-season OVC coaching honor. He was only the third APSU coach to earn such an award, the first to be recognized in his first Govs' season.

Loos came to APSU after four seasons as Memphis' top assistant. He joined Larry Finch in 1986 and helped direct his alma mater to an 85-43 record, including two NCAA tourney appearances and a Metro Conference tourney title during his tenure.

Prior to joining Memphis State, Loos enjoyed four successful head-coaching seasons

at Christian Brothers College in Memphis. He took over that program in 1982-83, and after an initial 16-14 season, recorded three straight 20-win campaigns. In 1985, CBC captured its first Volunteer State Athletic Conference crown, the VSAC tourney title and second place in the National Catholic Tournament. For his efforts, he earned VSAC, NAIA District 24 and NAIA Area V Coach of the Year

honors. He also was named the National Catholic Tournament Outstanding Coach.

Loos' move to CBC came after spending eight seasons as head coach at his prep alma mater, Mehlville High School in St. Louis. Taking over a program that previously had endured 11 straight losing seasons, Loos led his team to five winning campaigns, including a state tourney berth. He left the school as its winningest coach.

The Missouri native played both basketball and baseball during his college days at Memphis State, where he was inducted into their Athletic Hall of Fame in September 2002. Loos was the starting point guard for the 1968-69 Tigers, leading the team in minutes played. He also was an all-conference shortstop for the baseball Tigers baseball team.

Upon completing his eligibility, he remained at Memphis State as an assistant in 1970. Following his graduation (1970), he officially began his coaching career as an assistant basketball and head baseball coach at CBC.


Loos is involved in many charitable events, including the NABC (National Association of Basketball Coaches) Coaches vs. Cancer Three-Point Attack.

He and his wife, Phyllis, have four children, David, who broadcasts Governors and Lady Govs sports; Todd, Brad, the former Gov who is an assistant basketball coach at Central Missouri, and Nicole, age 22, who formerly was a member of the school's dance team and now works in the University's Student Life Office. He and Phyllis have one grandchild William Daniel Loos, age two, son of David and Pam Loos.

Tony Collins is in his 15th season as a Governors assistant, his 14th under Dave Loos.

When Loos was named head coach in July 1990, he elected to retain Collins from the previous coaching staff. Loos was impressed with Collins' energy, his recruiting contacts and, in particular, his strong relationship with the players. He has been a part of two Ohio Valley Conference regular-season titles and two NCAA tourney teams.

In addition to recruiting, Collins also has on-floor coaching duties—in particular working with the Govs post players—and scouting responsibilities plus business-related duties, including organizing the team's travel arrangements.

Collins joined the Govs staff in 1989, moving over from the Lady Govs program after serving one season as an assistant. He came to APSU in 1988-89, joining former associate Jim Phillips as women's assistant.

The two became acquainted at Virginia State, when Phillips served as women's head coach and Collins played for the men's team. Collins, a 1979 Virginia State graduate, later served as a graduate assistant at his alma mater and later followed Phillips to Friends University, Wichita, Kan., serving as assistant men's coach in 1980.

Collins remained in Wichita in 1981, working toward his master's degree at Wichita State, before returning to coaching in 1982. He spent two seasons as women's assistant coach at Miami (Ohio) University.


After a stint in private business, he coached LaPlata's High School girls' basketball team to the 1987 Maryland state championship before moving to Fayetteville State (Fayetteville, N.C.) as an

assistant men's coach and Boys Club program director.

Collins, 44, has one daughter, Talea Danielle, age 11. He also has two sons, Anthony, 22, and Loren, 21. He enjoys traveling and fishing as hobbies as well as following the St. Louis Cardinals during the summer. He also is heavily involved in coaching girls' softball during the summer.

Scott Combs begins his second season as full-time assistant status.

He was elevated to full-time duties in August 2002, but he long has been a member of the APSU basketball scene, beginning his eighth year with the program—three as a player, including one redshirt season, and now five as a coach. The move was a natural progression for Combs.

He came to APSU in 1996-97 as a player. Since then, he has been a fixture in the program, working his way up the coaching ladder.

Following his playing days, Combs assumed the role as administrative assistant while in graduate school in 1999-00.

A year later, he was elevated to the capacity of restricted coach—a coaching/teaching assistant who was not permitted to recruit off campus by NCAA rule.

In his current role, Combs helps in the daily operations of the program, working in all coaching aspects. He also serves as the program's recruiting coordinator.

A versatile front-liner who was known for his selfless play and other intangibles he brought to the floor, Combs played his final two seasons (1997-98) at APSU after transferring from Missouri, where he played his freshman (1994-95) and sophomore (1995-96) seasons. Combs sat out 1996-97 at APSU as a transfer redshirt.

After serving as a reserve guard and forward as a junior, Combs ended up being the Govs starting post player as a senior.

He averaged 6.8 points, shooting a team-best

54.8 percent from the floor, and 5.3 rebounds per game. His rebound totals ranked 14th in the OVC.



David Midlick, a former three-year letterman at Ole Miss who was a three-time Academic All-Southeastern Conference selection, is in his second season on Austin Peay's coaching staff.

The former Rebel outstanding perimeter shooter joined APSU a year ago as a part-time assistant. He also serves as team rehabilitation leader at the Montgomery County Nursing Home.

He proved valuable to the Governors last season not for his on-court coaching talents but his scouting expertise as well.

He came to Clarksville and Austin Peay after spending much of the last decade working as a physical therapist in the Greenville Miss., area. However, his passion for basketball and basketball coaching has remained with him since his days as an All-State basketball player at Christian Brothers High School in Memphis.

Twice he served as head boys basketball coach (1994-97, 1999-2003) at Washington High School while also handling the junior high team as well during much of that tenure. He also was head varsity girls coach from 1999-2002. In between his Washington tenures, he coached the varsity boys and girls and the junior varsity boys at Indianola Academy. He was North AAA Coach of the Year in 1996 and District I-AAA Coach of the Year in 1999.

Midlick enjoyed a strong career as a guard at Ole Miss, leading the team in free-throw and three-point percentage in 1989. In fact, he helped beat the Governors in 1990 by hitting a late shot in Dave Loos' first APSU season.

The Rebels were an National Invitational

Tournament participant in 1989 and an SEC tourney finalist a year later. He was Academic All-SEC from 1989-91 and was named to Who's Who Among College Students in 1991.

Midlick earned his way to Ole Miss after a stellar high school career. He led Christian Brothers to the 1987 Class AAA state championship, being named MVP of the tournament. He was a first-team UPI All-State selection as a senior and earned honorable mention Associated Press All-State. He also was chosen Memphis Best of the Preps Scholar Athlete of the Year in 1987.

Midlick received his bachelor's degree in biological science in 1991 and bachelor's degree in physical therapy from the University of Mississippi Medical Center in 1994.

He is married to the former Leslie Biddle. They have two sons, David, age 7, and Will, age 4.

Rhet Wierzba was a member of the most successful four-year senior class in Austin Peay history.

A three-season starter at guard for the Gobs, Wierzba is continuing his association with the Gobs program, serving as APSU's graduate assistant.

Wierzba, a co-captain a year ago, earned a reputation as the ultimate team player who became one of the OVC's top perimeter defenders with his hard-nosed approach.

He averaged 6.4 ppg for his career and left Austin Peay ranked in the Top 10 in career three-point field goals made, attempted and three-point field-goal percentage.

Wierzba also was named to 2002-03 Oneida Bingo and Casino Classic all-tournament team after scoring a career-high 26 points against Eastern Washington in the Green Bay, Wisc., tourney.

He proved valuable off the court as well in the athletic department. He was selected president of the Student-Athlete Advisory Council for the year and then last spring earned the ultimate APSU athletic honor by being selected as the 2003-04 Joy Award recipient as the most valuable senior athlete.

In the classroom the Farmington, Ill., native perhaps was even more successful. Wierzba graduated summa cum laude with a 3.913 grade-point average as a business major and was named APSU's Male Scholar Athlete for a third straight year.

During Fall 2004, he was named recipient of

the OVC Scholar-Athlete Award, annually presented to only three conference male and female athletes.


Three times he received the OVC Medal of Honor for owning the highest GPA in his conference-sponsored sport. He also was a Rhodes and NCAA Post-Graduate scholarship nominee.

Corey Gipson's numbers will never explain the impact he had Austin Peay basketball during his two seasons as a player.

APSU is hoping he will have a similar impact as a Governors coach. Gipson has assumed the role as administrative assistant while completing his undergraduate work.

The Sikeston, Mo., native brought from Three Rivers Community College a defensive mind-set that quickly became contagious among his veteran Governors teammates. As a result, APSU developed into the Ohio Valley Conference's top defensive team in 2002-03 and 2003-04.

He personally set the tone from his point guard spot and his one-on-one match-ups with some of the OVC's top guards helped lead the Govs to their best-ever marks for total wins. During his junior season, Gipson, in fact, on 14 occasions held marquee offensive players to well-blow their respective averages.

Gipson averaged 8.4 points per game as a junior but was instrumental offensively in several key

contests. He had 19 points, including five three pointers, in the Govs 2002-03 season-opening upset of Memphis. He earned OVC "Player of the Week" for his efforts and was recognized by ESPN.com's Andy Katz.

A year ago, Gipson again was one of the Govs leaders in making it a second straight 20-win season and a 16-0 first-place OVC finish.

His scoring numbers slipped to 7.0 per game but the Govs defensive effort was even more intense.

Gipson came to APSU after three years at Three Rivers, where he sat out one season with a foot injury. There he played both shooting and point guard for Gene Bess. As a sophomore, he averaged 15.2 ppg while earning first-team all-conference and all-region.

As a senior prepster at Richland High School, Gipson was a Missouri Mr. Basketball nominee as a senior after averaging 30.9 points per game, earning him first-team All-State honors.

A health care management major, Gipson will complete his undergraduate work this fall.

Governors 2003-04 Review

When Austin Peay opened the 2003-04 season 3-7 against one of the nation's most difficult non-conference schedules, it didn't take long for the naysayers to push the panic button. In fact, a repeat of an Ohio Valley Conference title seemed more fantasy than possibility.

But in the second half of one of those preseason games, the final one against Kentucky, the Governors found the rhythm they had been missing. Trailing 26-12 at halftime, the Governors rallied in the final half to trail by just two, 53-51, with 3:54 left. The Gavs still trailed by three a minute later and had five opportunities to either tie the game or make it a one-point contest. Although it didn't happen, the Governors came out of the contest believing they had found the magic that enabled them to tie for the 2002-03 OVC crown.



Guard Anthony Davis was third-team All-OVC again a year ago.

Gipson said. "We went in playing them one at a time, with our focus on that team, that game."

The mature approach worked. One by one, the Gavs reeled off those five straight road wins, including an ESPN2 televised one at Morehead State, defending OVC co-champs.

"This team was all about chemistry, sharing the basketball and, of course, defense," APSU coach Dave Loos said.



Versatile forward Adrian Henning developed into a two-time first-team All-OVC performer.

How good was the defense? Well, the Gavs held the opposition to less than 60 points in the first four OVC contests. It was the first time since 1949-50 an APSU team had held opponents below 60 in four straight contests. The streak was "broken" when Morehead State scored 60 in the 70-60 decision.

From there the Gavs would embark on a OVC-history setting season.

The Gavs would become the first team in OVC history to post a

16-0 league mark. They would become only the fourth team in league history to finish unbeaten.

Both Adrian Henning and Josh Lewis were named first-team All-OVC, Henning for the second straight year.

Anthony Davis was named third-team all-league. Head coach Dave Loos was named OVC Coach of the Year for a second straight year. It was the fourth time he has earned the award, making him only the second coach to ever earn four coach-of-the-year citations. However, he is the first to do it at one school.

Along the way, he first earned his 200th APSU victory and then later his 300th college coaching win.

The Gavs perfect season, however, took a U-turn in the OVC championship game when Murray State derailed the Gavs bid for a second straight NCAA appearance, 66-60. The Governors, however, received their first-ever National Invitational Tournament bid and won APSU's first post-season game since 1987 with a 65-59 win against Belmont before bowing on the road at George Mason.

That was just one of many accomplishments by this group of Governors.



STREAK INTACT:

When the Govs defeated Belmont in the first-round NIT contest in the Dunn Center, it marked their 29th straight home win, the second longest Division I streak in the nation.

20-WIN SEASON: When they defeated Tennessee State, March 1, the Govs recorded their third 20-win season in the last four seasons. It was the 11th time in school history APSU has won 20 games. It is only the fifth time as a Division I program APSU has secured 20 regular-season victories, three of them coming under head coach Dave Loos.

BACK-TO-BACK?: With that win against Tennessee State to open OVC tourney play, the Govs had back-to-back 20-victory seasons (the Govs had 23 a year ago) for only the third time in school history. Previously, it occurred in 1959-60 (22) and 1960-61 (22) plus 1975-76 (20) and 1976-77 (24). It also is 11th time an APSU team has won 20 or more games.

ADDING UP: With the NIT win against Belmont, the 2002-03 and 2003-04 Governors basketball teams combined for 45 wins (23 in 2002-03, 22 this season), setting the mark for the most wins combined in consecutive seasons. Previously, the 1959-60 (22-5 wins) and the 1960-61 (22-9) teams along with the 1975-76 (20-7) and the 1976-77 (24-4) clubs won 44 games in back-to-back seasons.

SUCCESSFUL SENIORS: The Governors four-year seniors, Adrian Henning, Josh Lewis and Rhet Wierzba were a part of the most successful senior class in history with 81 wins in their four seasons combined. In addition, senior

point guard Corey Gipson, a transfer from Three Rivers Community College in Poplar Bluff, Mo., became the first multiple-season playing Governor to ever finish his home career unbeaten. The Govs were 27-0 in Dave Aaron Arena in two seasons with Gipson as their starting point guard.

LOOS ON THE SENIOR GOVS: "I was very happy for them to get an NIT bid," Loos said. "For them, with all the suc-

cess they have had here, it would have been a shame for them to not have played in the post-season. These seniors were a special group. They were a pleasure to coach. One thing you knew was they would always play hard—the effort was there every night.

"But in addition to what they did on the court, they are just as outstanding off the floor and in the classroom. I couldn't have been more proud in how they represented this program, this athletic department and this University. These are the type of people of whom are alumni should be proud."

POST-SCRIPT: The seniors impact was never more evident than at the annual APSU Athletic Banquet. Henning was named the school's Male Athlete of the Year

for his efforts in the Govs' two-year run atop the OVC standings. Meanwhile, guard Rhet Wierzba was chosen the Joy Award recipient as the University's Most Valuable Senior Athlete. Wierzba, an OVC Scholar-Athlete, also was named the department's Male Scholar-Athlete for a second straight year.

Wierzba, Henning and Lewis all have/had their opportunities to play professionally. Wierzba played both in Canada and Mexico during the summer before accept an APSU graduate assistant position. Henning, meanwhile, accepted a tryout for the Charlotte Bobcats Summer League team, while Lewis began his playing career overseas.



DUNN CENTER/DAVE AARON ARENA

The Winfield Dunn Center became home of the Governors and Lady Gobs indoor athletics in 1975 after ground was broken for the \$5.3 million, 9,000-seat structure in February 1973.

The 132,000 square-foot complex, officially named the Winfield Dunn Health and Physical Education Building and Convocation Complex in honor of Governor Dunn, is a dominating edifice with 78 feet separating the top of the building from its maplewood playing surface. The Dunn Center replaced the Memorial Gymnasium, affectionately called "The Little Red Barn," which served as the Governors homecourt from 1952 until the Dec. 1, 1975 tip-off.

On Jan. 16, 1988, the basketball arena was named Dave Aaron Arena in honor of the school's former athletics director, football coach and all-time winningest basketball coach.

Several improvements and modifications have taken place in recent years, including the addition of new scoreboards. Also, the floor lighting has been replaced to allow fans to better see Lady Gobs and Governors events and also accommodate photography needs. An elevator was installed in the late 1990s to better accommodate the handicapped.

But in Fall 2004, some major upgrades occurred, with new cushioned telescopic seating on the lower level east and north end-zone areas. In addition, two new state-of-the-art indoor Light Emitting Diode (LED) large display screens were hung in the southeast and northwest corners. It is a fully integrated sports solution that includes a control system to operate and integrate the displays of video replays plus a package of many custom



animations, including sponsored game elements and crowd interaction plus much more.

The Dunn Center is home of Governors basketball and Lady Gobs volleyball and basketball. It also serves as a multipurpose practice facility for track, baseball and softball indoor workouts.

The Dunn Center also houses the University's training facility where trainers Chuck Kimmel, Joni Johnson and Karen Lovell administer treatment and rehabilitate injured athletes. It also is home to the athletic department's academic services located on the west upper level. In fact, a new Academics Services Center soon will be constructed at the Dunn Center's north end zone area, underneath the reserved seating area.

Austin Peay athletics also work out in the newly renovated weight room, conveniently located in the Dunn Center's lower level south end. They also have access to air-conditioned dressing rooms, also subject to major renovations in Summer/Fall 2004.

Entering the facility's front lobby, visitors are impressed by the Hall of Fame area, honoring APSU's greatest former athletes, administrators and supporters.

APSU's athletic offices are located in the Dunn Center with the exception of tennis, which is located in the Governors Tennis Center, and rifle, which is located in the ROTC Armory. Both facilities are in close proximity to the Dunn Center. In Winter 2004, the Governors baseball offices were moved to the former home of the student newspaper, The All-State, to be closer to Raymond C. Hand Park.





With the return of the 45-second clock and the three-point shot in the past decade, 100-point games have been on the upswing in college basketball.

For Austin Peay, in fact, the cycle took a definite swing with four 100-point games in 1986-87, the Govs winning three of them; five in 1987-88, APSU winning just one, and six in 1988-89, the Govs winning five.

With a change of coaches, also involved a style change during 1990-91. Dave Loos' team played in six 100-point games. The Govs scored the most single-game points in Dunn Center history with a 122-96 win against Milligan. APSU and Morehead State set a Dunn Center mark for combined points scored (237) in the Govs' 124-113 double-overtime loss. Morehead also set an arena mark for most points scored by the opposition.

In 1991-92, the Govs participated in five 100-point games. The two wins came back to back, a 102-100 decision against Morehead State and 103-97 verdict against SEC foe Mississippi State. In total, the Govs have played in 26 games in which at least one team scored 100 points, including last season's 106-83 win against Lee and a

107-100 double overtime loss to Eastern Illinois.

Over the years, the Govs have been involved in 119 games where at least one team scored 100 points, with 12 of those both clubs scoring 100 or more. Austin Peay has won 58 of the century games. Of the 12 which both teams scored 100 or more, the Govs are 5-7. The Dunn Center/Dave Aaron Arena has held 33 100-point contests, with APSU holding a 29-4 edge.

Only one century-mark game occurred while Austin Peay was a junior college, and Freed-Hardeman won that one, 104-30, during the 1934-35 season. An opponent of the 100-point mark was David Aaron (1946-62), who purposely passed up scoring opportunities to avoid his team hitting the century figure and causing opposition possible embarrassment. The long-time successful coach was forced into the situation during the 1958-59 season when Harry Gallatin made his college coaching debut for Southern Illinois. The Govs won the game 106-100 in Memorial Gymnasium ("Little Red Barn").
