About the event and roles:

Model Westminster Parliament follows Wellington region's tradition of opening up new avenues of civics education to students of our greater region. High School students will simulate the inner workings of Westminster to debate contentious issues that affect society. Namely working through the passage of law from bill to statute.

Volunteers will learn important organisational skills through this committee, including working within budgets, managing relationships with external parties and creating educational content and strategies. These skills transfer well both in terms of further volunteer work and professional development.
